ABOUT BOBECK

Nick Bobeck coaches the Bronchos in his seventh season leading his alma mater. Bobeck is 36-40 overall through six seasons. The UCO alum has led the Bronchos into three bowl games in four seasons. He led UCO to an 8-4 record in 2014 and an appearance in the Mineral Water Bowl and followed that up with a 7-5 record in 2015 with a win in the Live United Bowl over longtime rival Southwestern Oklahoma State. This past December, Bobeck guided the Bronchos to a 38-31 win over another former conference foe, Tarleton State, in the inaugural Corsicana Bowl.

AT A GLANCE

UCO enters the game 6-3 overall and in league play and the Bronchos are on a four-game win streak. Northeastern State is 0-9 on the season. The battle for the Presiden't Cup trophy dates back to 1915 but the teams began playing for the physical trophy in 1998. UCO has won 11 of 20 matchups since '98 including each of the last four. The Bronchos own a 48-27-2 all-time lead in the series. UCO won the first nine meetings from 1915-33 and recorded shutouts in each win.

SHUTOUT STREAK

Speaking of shutouts, Central Oklahoma has shutout each of the past two opponents. The Bronchos beat Washburn 34-0 in Edmond two weeks ago and beat Missouri Southern 31-0 last week in Joplin. It's the first time since 1979 that Central has recorded back-to-back shutouts. That year, the eventual NAIA national runners-up shutout each of its first three opponents.

NO FLY ZONE

UCO's defense has turned a page this season, becoming one of the toughest to score against in the passing game. Central has allowed only six passing touchdowns in eight games and a meager three passing TDs in eight of its nine games. It's been a over a month since the Bronchos last gave up a score through the air - Sept. 29 against Northwest Missouri. Central's 181 passing yards allowed per game ranks second in the MIAA and 33rd in Division II.

DEFENSE

Colton Lindsey leads the Central defense from the middle linebacker position with 70 tackles this season. He had a team-high 100 tackles last year as a junior. The Norman, Okla. native also has two interceptions, a fumble forced and a fumble recovered. He knocked a ball loose last Saturday against Missouri Southern that teammate **O'Shay Harris** scooped up and ran 70 yards for a touchdown. Harris is the team's second leading tackler at 56 stops. He also has an interception, five pass breakups, a fumble forced and a fumble recovered.

CLAY3k

Clay McKenzie yard-by-yard continues to add up the milestones at Central Oklahoma. The sixth-year senior running back from Callisburg, Texas now has 3,115 career rushing yards, eighth all-time at Central. He also has 41 career rushing touchdowns, third-most in school history. McKenzie crossed the 3,000-yard mark on his third carry in a 34-0 win over Washburn. He scored the game's second touchdown to reach his 40th TD. McKenzie also ranks fourth in career all-purpose yards (3,874) and fourth in career scoring (255 points).

PITCH & CATCH

Will Collins leads the Broncho passing game this season, boasting a crisp 70 percent completion rate heading into Saturday's game. Collins is 65-92 on the season with 849 yards and five touchdowns since moving into the starting rotation four weeks ago. He also has 96 rushing yards and two scores in the ground game. **Dustin Basks** has been the prime target for the Bronchos whoever is taking snaps. The junior receiver has 50 catches this season for 669 yards and five touchdowns. Mekail Hall has come on strong late and now has 27 catches for 378 yards. Central as a team has 16 passing touchdowns.

SCOUTING THE RIVERHAWKS

Northeastern State comes into this week's game averaging 12.3 points per game. The Riverhawks average 242 yards per game, 76 on the ground and 166 in the pass game. **Craig Davis** has a team-high 379 rushing yards this season, 4.6 per carry, and has three of the team's five rushing touchdowns. **Boo McKnight**, 39 carries for 115 yards, has the other two scores in the ground game. **Jake Pruitt** has a team-high 795 passing yards and two TDs. **Cade Yeager** (488 yards) and **Jay Baker** (209 yards) also each have two passing touchdowns. **Ryheem Brummitt** is the team leader with 559 yards receiving on 36 catches. He has three touchdown grabs. **Jean Bazlie** (74 tackles) and **Courtland Clark** (72) are the team leaders on the defense. NSU had picked off seven passes this season with **Ja'len Evans** and **Jordan Prince** each having two.

UP NEXT

Central Oklahoma wraps up the 2018 regular season next weekend in Edmond with a showdown against rival-in-the-making Emporia State. Kickoff is set for 2 p.m. Central won 53-52 last season in Edmond, storming back from down 15 points in the final three minutes of the game to win on a 2-point conversion in the final minute.

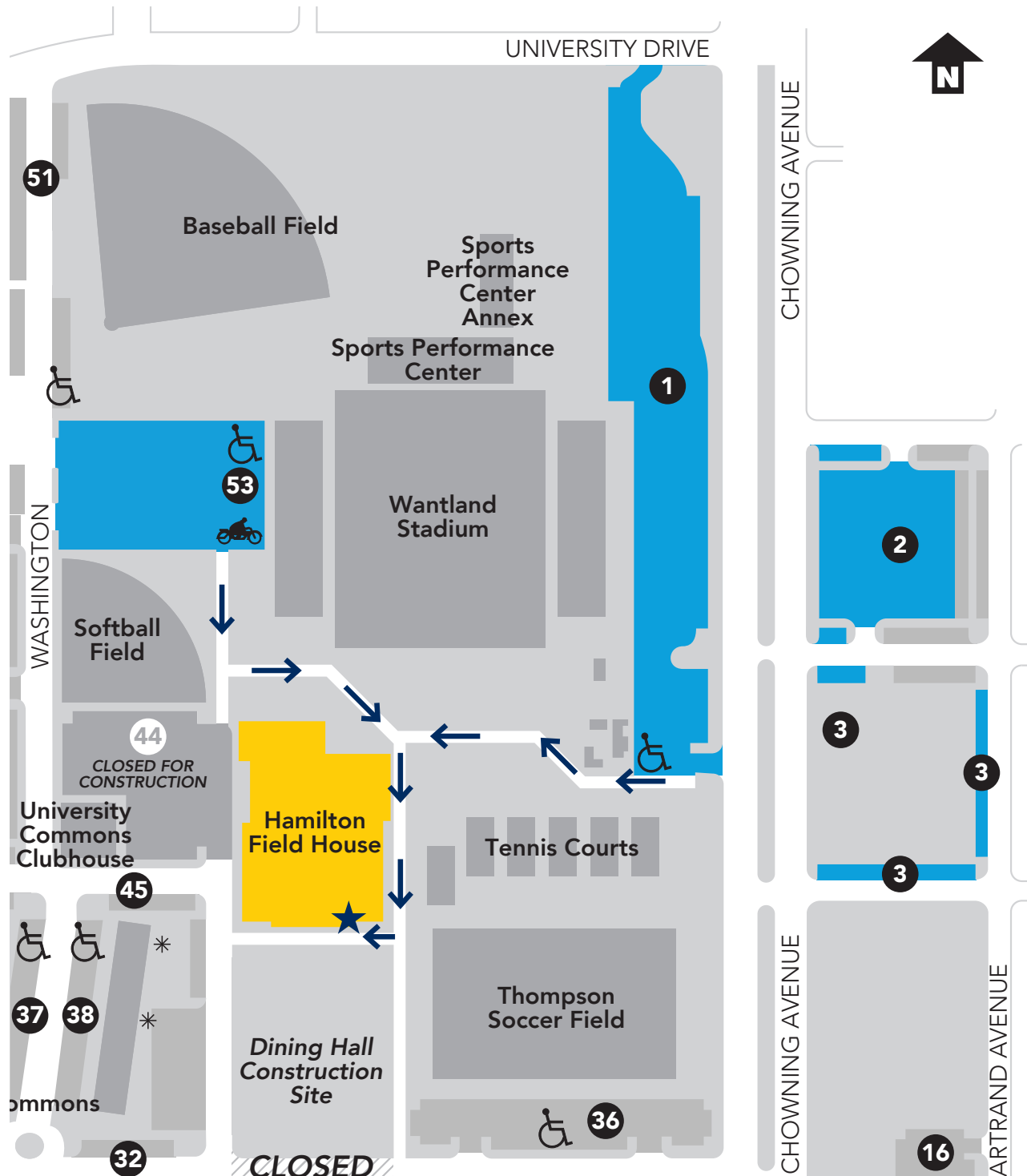
