

### School Nickname

"Bronchos" was the nickname selected for Central Oklahoma in 1922 by Mrs. C.W. Wantland, wife of long-time UCO football coach C.W. Wantland. The name was chosen from a number of suggestions for the name of UCO's football team and became the nickname for all athletic teams at the school.

Mrs. Wantland was made an honorary member of the Letterman's Club as a result of selecting the nickname, becoming the first woman admitted to that organization.

### School Colors

Bronze and blue were chosen as Central Oklahoma's school colors early in the fall of 1895 by school president Edmund Dandridge Murdaugh. The first public display of the bronze and blue was in Guthrie when a student represented UCO in the first oratorical contest ever held in Oklahoma.



# The Coaches



# Head Coach

# Bob Hoffman

**B**ob Hoffman was named head men's basketball coach at Central in August 2019 and enters his fifth season leading the University of Central Oklahoma men's basketball program in 2023-24. One of the winningest coaches in college basketball history, Hoffman has added to his legacy with a resurgence of Broncho basketball.

Hoffman led Central Oklahoma to the 2021-22 MIAA regular season title - the first since joining the league in 2012 - and he was named MIAA Coach of the Year following the regular season. He guided the team to the MIAA Men's Basketball Championship semifinals before earning an at-large bid to the 2022 NCAA Division II national tournament. UCO made its 18th national tournament appearance in 2022 and the 13th since joining Division II.

Hoffman followed that up with another NCAA Division II national tournament appearance in 2022-23 as the Bronchos finished second in the MIAA regular season, made an appearance in the MIAA Basketball Championship finals, and earned an at-large bid to the national tournament. UCO went 26-6 this past season. The 26 wins rank third most in school history for any single season.

Central went 24-7 in 2021-22, including a stout 14-2 record at Hamilton Field House. The Bronchos knocked off eventual national champion Northwest Missouri at Hamilton in January, setting the stage for the run to the conference title. Hoffman coached four All-MIAA selections.

Hoffman led the Bronchos back to the MIAA tournament in his first season following a one-year absence from the postseason for UCO. Central went 11-17 in the regular season, 8-11 in league play, and drew the eighth-seed in the tournament before falling in the first round.

The Bronchos went 13-11 in 2020-21 and made the MIAA Tournament for the second season in a row under Hoffman's coaching. Central finished fifth in the league standings with a 12-10 record, then went on the road and beat Missouri Southern at their place in the conference tourney. UCO fell to eventual national champ Northwest Missouri in the MIAA Championship Semifinals.

Hoffman has a career record of 681-377.

Hoffman came to UCO from Mercer, where he led the Bears of Macon, Ga. to 209 wins in his 11-year stint there. He has coached at multiple levels, winning an NAIA national championship as a women's head coach, winning nearly 250 games as an NAIA men's head coach, assisting at the Division I level, and leading teams in the ABA and the NBA's Development League.

An Oklahoma City native, Hoffman played his high school basketball at Putnam City High School in the early 1970s. He then moved on to play collegiately at Oklahoma Baptist in Shawnee, Okla., where he would spend the next four years scoring more than 1,000 points. To this day,

Hoffman still ranks among the all-time scoring leaders for the Bison.

Hoffman accepted his first head coaching job at Piedmont High School and coached there from 1982-86 while simultaneously attending graduate school at Central Oklahoma, earning his master of education in 1985.

After working with OBU as an assistant coach for a couple years, he took his first head coaching position at the college level at Southern Nazarene in 1987.

At SNU, Hoffman averaged 29 wins per season, going 88-16 in a three-year stretch. He took a program that never had a winning season and won a national championship in 1989, earning Sooner Athletic Conference, District 9, and NAIA Coach of the Year honors for his efforts.

Hoffman then returned to Shawnee to become the head coach at his alma mater and would soon leave a mark on the program still remembered today.

Now a member of the OBU Athletics Hall of Fame, Hoffman led the Bison from 1990-99 and won 243 games along the way. He led OBU to the national tournament six times and had three teams win 30 or more games. The Bison finished second in the national tournament in 1993 and 1997, while finishing third in 1994. He reached the Sweet 16 in 1996 and the Elite Eight in 1999.

Hoffman was named SAC Coach of the Year in 1993, 1996, and 1997. He was the District 9 Coach of the Year again in 1993, and earned National Coach of the Year honors for the second time in his career in 1993.

He moved on from OBU in 1999 to Texas Pan American and won 68 games there over the next five seasons. He guided the program to its first winning season in over ten years, and its first tournament victory over 15 years while also helping UTPA to its first ever national ranking.

After spending a few seasons as an assistant coach at Oklahoma, and leading the American Basketball Association's Arkansas Aeros and the NBA Development League's Rio Grande Valley club, Hoffman would move to Mercer University in Georgia and again, leave his mark on a program.

Hoffman won 209 games at Mercer from 2008-19, including 119 conference games. He led the Bears to its first ever NCAA Tournament win in 2014 - a major upset of Duke in the opening round of March Madness. And he also became the first coach in NCAA history to win a tournament game in all four Division I postseason tournaments in a four-year span.

Hoffman directed Mercer to six postseason appearances over the past seven seasons. He was named Atlantic Sun Coach of the Year three times during his tenure at Mercer.

Hoffman was awarded the FCA John Lotz National Basketball Coach of the Year in 2014.

## Assistant Coaches



### Matt Mossman

Matt Mossman joined the UCO men's basketball coaching staff in 2021 and has helped guide the Bronchos to back-to-back national tournament appearances.

He spent his first season as the second assistant and was named a full-time assistant men's basketball coach in 2022.

Mossman spent the 2021-22 season in a part-time assistant coaching role, helping the Bronchos win the MIAA regular season championship. UCO won 24 games, won the league title for the first time since joining the MIAA in 2012, and returned to the NCAA tournament for the first time in over 10 years.

In 2022-23, Mossman helped Central win 26 games, the third-most in school history. The Bronchos finished second in the MIAA and were runners-up in the MIAA Basketball Championship before earning another at-large bid to the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Championship for the second year in a row. The Bronchos have a 50-13 record since Mossman joined the staff.

Mossman, from Norman, is an Oklahoma graduate and has been affixed in programs with the Sooners and at Randall University in Moore.



### Derek Tunstall

Derek Tunstall enters his second year with the Central Oklahoma men's basketball program serving as an assistant coach. The Mustang, Oklahoma native assists with the bigs on the floor, and also helps out in scouting, recruiting, and operations off the floor.

Tunstall went to Mustang High School and played basketball there before graduating in 2017. He's a Southern Nazarene alum with a finance degree (2020).

While in college, Tunstall had the chance to be an assistant coach at Mustang High School from 2018-21. He then joined the Oklahoma City University staff as an assistant in 2021-22.

Tunstall helped Central Oklahoma to a 26-6 season in 2022-23. The Bronchos finished second in the MIAA and runners-up in the MIAA tournament before making it to the NCAA tournament first round.

Tunstall is also pursuing his Master of Business Administration while working at UCO.



### Callen Haydon

Callen Haydon joined the Central Oklahoma coaching staff in 2023 as an assistant coach. The former Broncho standout, record holder, and All-MIAA point guard works in player development for UCO.

Haydon spent three years at Central (2020-23) after the El Reno High School product transferred from Connors State College following his junior college tenure.

Haydon led Central Oklahoma to the 2022 MIAA Basketball regular season championship with an 18-4 record in the league. It was the first league title for the Bronchos since joining the MIAA in 2012.

Haydon averaged 15.0 points per game during his career that spanned 61 games. He was a 49.4 percent field-goal shooter and a 42.8 percent 3-point shooter. Haydon also logged an 89.3 career free-throw percentage mark and averaged 5.5 assists per game for his career.

His name appears in the Central Oklahoma record book several times. Haydon has single game records for best 3-point field-goal percentage (100 pct., 5-for-5) and best free-throw percentage (100 pct., 10-for-10). He set a single season record for free-throw percentage in 2021-22, making 114 of 124 attempts from the line during the season for a 91.4 percent mark.

Haydon's 13 assists against Newman in 2021-22 are the fifth-most in any game by a Broncho. And his 182 assists that season are the fourth-most in any season by a Broncho.

Haydon earned All-MIAA honors in 2020-21 (Third Team) and 2021-22 (Second Team).



## Season Outlook

**C**entral Oklahoma tips off the 2023-24 season as a fortified contender in the rugged MIAA, a national tournament squad, and with preseason recognition in the Top 25, setting up another exciting year for the Bronchos. UCO was tabbed No. 9 in the NABC Preseason Top 25.

Central Oklahoma, under the direction of its fifth-year head coach Bob Hoffman, enters the new season coming off back-to-back national tournament appearances. The Bronchos won the MIAA in 2022 and finished runners up in 2023. From last year's squad, there are eight returning lettermen paired with eight newcomers.

Hoffman has 681 career victories at the college level, with 593 wins as a men's head coach. He's won 74 at UCO in his first four seasons, including 50 in the last two years.

"We are excited to get the season started," UCO head men's basketball coach Bob Hoffman said. "We start with the Small College Basketball Hall of Fame Classic, which is a great event, and we are very fortunate to be invited to play in it. We'll see what our team can do when the ball goes up and hopefully, we can play well and get off to a good start.

"This year's team has a good mix of guys that have been here, know what it takes be successful, and they know what we're trying to accomplish," Hoffman said. "The new guys are talented. They're going to have to learn what it's like to play college basketball and understand how hard it is to win in the MIAA. But I like our guys, and they have a lot of talent."

Central Oklahoma averaged 73.8 points per game last season and only allowed 60.8 per contest, one of the best marks in the country. The Bronchos shot 45.2 percent overall, 34.9 percent from 3-point range, and 76.3 percent from the free-throw line. UCO averaged 7.1 made 3-pointers per game and 16.7 made free-throws per game.

Leading the way for Central Oklahoma this season is fourth-year junior guard Jaden Wells. The Hurst, Texas native averaged 16.5 points per game last season in addition to 4.5 rebounds and 1.4 steals per game. Wells is one of the best shooters in the country. He had a 43.5 overall field-goal percentage, a 42.6 3-point percentage, and an 84.1 free-throw percentage in 31 games played.

Wells led the NCAA in free-throw percentage in 2022 and led the MIAA in 3-point percentage last season. The fourth-year junior guard has scored 1,214 points in his career and ranks 24th in UCO history. He also ranks second in school history with 226 career made 3-pointers. Wells is a career 89.1 percent free-throw shooter and is in line to be the all-time leader at UCO in that category too.

Fifth-year senior Jalyn Turner, as well as juniors Preston Aymond, Luke Haasl, and Danquez Dawsey headline the returning Bronchos and also round out a veteran starting lineup for UCO. Mike Quick Jr., Ben Averitt, and

Gunner Korstjens are also back and give UCO experience off the bench.

Turner has played in 115 of 116 games for the Bronchos over the last four years. With 74 wins and two national tournament appearances, the forward has been consistently steady in a role player position and provides vast experience and leadership for the Bronchos. Turner averaged 3.7 points and 2.1 rebounds per game last season and has been at those numbers for his entire career.

Aymond is another fourth-year junior. After one year in junior college, the big man came to UCO and has helped the Bronchos win 50 games over the last two seasons and make back-to-back national tournament appearances. Aymond averaged 7.5 points and 4.6 rebounds per game last year. He is a 44.0 percent shooter that also had nearly one block per game.

Haasl is another fourth-year junior with one year in the program at UCO. The towering big man led the MIAA in blocks a year ago and is a contender for defensive player of the year. Haasl averaged 5.8 points and 4.3 rebounds per game in his first year with the Bronchos. He is a 60.4 percent shooter that turned back 42 shots a year ago.

Dawsey is a true, third-year junior that went from reserve minutes to a starting role in a hurry. He is now aimed at making another jump and showcase his talents this season. Dawsey is a scoring guard that averaged 6.6 points per game last season. He shot 42.8 percent overall, 41.1 percent from behind the arc, and 72.3 percent from the free-throw line. The speedy and athletic point guard had 54 total assists last season and is looking to boost that number in 2023-24.

Quick Jr. made his collegiate debut a year ago with the Bronchos and the athletic guard averaged 2.5 points per game in 27 appearances. Averitt, also a sophomore this winter, averaged 2.1 points per game in 27 appearances. Korstjens played in nine games as a redshirt freshman for Central last season.

Majok Majouk and Israel Hart both transferred to UCO. Majouk comes to Central from Southwest Minnesota State and the 6-foot-10 sophomore is ready to provide rim protection for the Bronchos as well as rebounding and some offensive output. He averaged 6.9 points and 4.8 rebounds as a redshirt freshman in Minnesota and had 29 blocked shots. Hart spent the last two seasons at Seminole State College and the junior college transfer will sit out this year at UCO.

Evan Barber, Parker Hannah, Jarreth Ingram, Connor Newton, Caiden Punt, and Matthew Willenborg are all true freshmen looking to find their roles with the Bronchos. The depth and talent Hoffman has with this year's recruiting class gives Central plenty to look forward too. The freshman bunch is a mix of bigs and guards that provide a lot of different skillsets for the Bronchos.

## Hamilton Field House



Central Oklahoma plays its home basketball games inside Hamilton Field House, which opened its doors on Jan. 8, 1965 when the UCO men's team downed intrastate rival Northeastern State 64-52.

Hamilton Field House was renamed from Broncho Field House on May 1, 1993 in honor of long-time UCO coach and athletic director Dale Hamilton, who helped design the building in the 1960s.

The facility underwent extensive renovation before the 2001-02 season, with new chairback seats installed around

floor level. A new floor was installed following the 2019-20 season, the first such upgrade since the building was erected in the 1960s.

Hamilton Field House is also the home facility for the women's basketball program, as well as the volleyball and wrestling teams and numerous other events, including the university's graduation ceremonies, are also held in the building.

The Bronchos have an all-time record of 487-195 (.714 win percentage) in 58 seasons of basketball at Hamilton Field House.





## National Tournament History

Central Oklahoma has qualified for the national tournament 18 times during its 90+ year history – five in NAIA and 13 in NCAA Division II. The Bronchos have an all-time record of 18-17 in national tournament games and have made four Elite Eight appearances – 1961 and 1964 in NAIA, 1992 and 2008 in Division II.

**1937-38:** UCO earned its first-ever national tournament in 1938, opening the NAIA meet with a 43-34 win over Arkansas Teachers before being eliminated by Ambrose (Iowa), 38-36, in the second round.

**1938-39:** The Bronchos made a repeat trip to the NAIA National Tournament in 1939, but were ousted by Manchester (Ind.), 53-50, in the first round.

**1958-59:** UCO ended a 20-year national tournament drought in 1959 with its third NAIA appearance. The Bronchos defeated Kentucky State 72-65 in the opening round before being knocked out by Pacific Lutheran, 68-57.

**1960-61:** UCO had a stellar showing in the 1961 NAIA National Tournament, knocking off St. Norbert (80-73) and Illinois Wesleyan (84-52) to make its first-ever Elite Eight appearance before falling to Georgetown (Ky.) 84-83 in the quarterfinals.

**1963-64:** Central Oklahoma made it back to the Elite Eight again in 1964 in its final NAIA National Tournament appearance. UCO routed Cedarville (95-40) and Pacific Lutheran (84-72) before bowing to Carson-Newman, 61-55 in the quarterfinals.

**1991-92:** UCO ended a 28-year national tournament drought and made a big splash in its first-ever NCAA Division II national tournament in 1992, beating Missouri Western (100-96 in OT) and Washburn (132-114) to win the South Central Regional and make it to the Elite Eight. The Bronchos lost a thrilling 127-124 overtime decision to Bridgeport (Conn.) in the quarterfinals.

**1992-93:** UCO hosted the South Central Regional for the first time, but lost to Washburn 92-88 in the first round. The Bronchos ended the season with a 116-109 triumph over Missouri Southern in the third-place game.

**1994-95:** The Bronchos followed a first-round bye in the South Central Regional with a 94-88 win over Mississippi College before dropping a close 117-112 decision to Central Missouri in the finals.

**1996-97:** UCO was the No. 1 seed in the South Central Regional, but was upset by Pittsburg State 90-84 in the first round of the national tournament.

**1997-98:** UCO came up short in a stirring run at the South Central Regional. The high-scoring Bronchos clipped Texas A&M-Commerce (107-103) and Missouri Western (109-101) to make the finals before falling to host West Texas A&M, 105-101 and finish a 25-7 season.

**2002-03:** UCO's first playoff appearance in five years ended with a 78-67 loss to Northeastern State in the first round of the South Central Regional.

**2004-05:** The Bronchos routed Washburn 84-66 in the first round of the South Central Regional before losing to host Texas A&M-Commerce 81-73 in the semifinals.

**2005-06:** UCO qualified for the national tournament for the second straight year, but lost a 75-68 first-round decision to Tarleton State 75-68.

**2007-08:** UCO capped off its best-ever season with its first Elite Eight appearance since 1992. The Bronchos captured the South Central Regional title with three tough wins, edging Fort Hays State 65-64 in the first round, rallying past Northwest Missouri 73-59 in the semifinals and nipping Tarleton State 77-76 in the finals. UCO's 28-6 season ended with a 106-104 double-overtime loss to Augusta State in the quarterfinals.


**2008-09:** The Bronchos made their fourth national tournament appearance in five years and were eliminated in the first-round by Dallas Baptist, 89-75.

**2009-10:** UCO's third consecutive Division II national tournament showing ended with an 80-64 loss to Fort Hays State in the first round of the South Central Regional.

**2010-11:** UCO hosted the South Central Regional for the first time since 1993 and opened with a 79-70 overtime thriller over Texas A&M International. The Bronchos beat Fort Hays State 81-69 before dropping a 73-66 decision to Midwestern State.

**2021-22:** Central Oklahoma made its long-awaited return to the national tournament after winning the MIAA regular season title. UCO earned an at-large bid as the No. 6 seed in the Central Region, and lost to Upper Iowa in the First Round, 91-74.

**2022-23:** Central Oklahoma returned to the national tournament for the second time in as many years. The Bronchos were regular season runners-up in the MIAA and finished in the same position in the conference tournament, falling in the championship game. UCO went to Maryville, Mo. for the Central Regional and lost in the first round to Minnesota Duluth, 62-56.

## Edmond

Edmond is located in the heart of Oklahoma, just north of the state capital in Oklahoma City, and has a population of over 90,000 as one of the fastest growing cities in the state.

Edmond has the best of both worlds, including easy access to the city with just enough distance to maintain a close-knit community atmosphere.

The city offers outstanding hotels, nostalgic shopping areas and conveniently located attractions for your enjoyment. Known for its outstanding golf courses, Edmond has hosted some of the most exciting PGA and celebrity events in the past two decades at world-famous Oak Tree Golf Club.

Edmond is the fastest growing, most economically dynamic city in Oklahoma. Thriving technology firms, diverse retail and commercial opportunities and small corporate office headquarters have enhanced its reputation as the affluent residential suburb to the metropolitan area.

There are many more activities in Edmond, with a variety of music, art, theatre, water and sporting events that make for spectacular family fun.

Heard on Hurd is a monthly festival where Downtown Edmond is transformed into an exciting mix of food trucks, family-friendly excitement and music that has become one of the premier, socially engaging events in the area.

Edmond also boasts one of the best Fourth of July fireworks shows in the country. More than 125,000 people attend the event. LibertyFest has been previously chosen by CNN and USA Today as one of the top 10 places to be in America on July 4.

Another Edmond attraction is Lake Arcadia. Home to the Center for Outdoor Adventure Recreation, Lake Arcadia offers trails for running, hiking, and cycling, as well as 1,820 surface acres for boating, skiing, kayaking, and fishing, and 26 miles of shoreline for more fun.



## Oklahoma City

The largest city in the state, Oklahoma City borders Edmond to the south and sits at the crossroads of I-35, I-40 and I-44, leaving OKC with more than 130 miles of federal and interstate highways.

More than 1.3 million people call metro Oklahoma City home.

The City, as it is commonly referred to around the state, offers numerous things to do on any given day of the week – or year for that matter. Whether it is sports, music, art, or just getting outside on a nice day, OKC offers it all.

Chesapeake Energy Arena in downtown Oklahoma City is not only home to the NBA's Oklahoma City Thunder, but it also hosts concerts year-round, as well as other events such as pro wrestling, bull riding and more.

Bricktown, the central hub of entertainment in downtown, is home to Bricktown Ballpark, where the Oklahoma City Dodgers – Triple-A affiliate to MLB's L.A. Dodgers – play ball. The ballpark also hosts high school games, collegiate tournaments, as well as concerts of its own.

There is plenty more to do, especially on the booming, Oklahoma River.

The UCO rowing team calls the river home and has a state-of-the-art boathouse on the river to prove it. Visitors can also enjoy the Riversport Adventure District, where you can challenge yourself through a white-water rapids course, zip line across the river, or bungee jump among other fun activities.



There are also five lakes in the greater OKC metro area that offer ample fun including fishing, running or cycling trails and swimming.

There are also more than a dozen golf courses to choose from.

Along with art museums, a science museum, and many more, there is always something to do in OKC.


The Adventure District is just 10 minutes from UCO and offers many fun things to do.

## Administration



### President, Todd G. Lamb

Todd G. Lamb became the University of Central Oklahoma's 22nd president July 1, 2023, marking a new chapter in a distinguished career that spans public service, statewide elected office, private law practice and business ownership. In his role leading Oklahoma's metropolitan university, President Lamb ensures the Central team remains focused on educating students through transformative learning and meeting the critical workforce needs of our state and nation.

President Lamb champions a commitment throughout campus to what he has coined "The B.R.O.N.C.H.O. Way" – Being Reflective of Our Neighborhood, Community, History and Oklahoma. This commitment connects the university mission and values to relevant action that ensures accessibility to a quality university education for students.

Born in Enid, Oklahoma, President Lamb earned his bachelor's degree from Oklahoma State University, also attending classes at UCO during his undergraduate pursuit. He earned a Juris Doctor from Oklahoma City University.

Early in his career, Lamb was a special agent with the U.S. Secret Service. He was appointed to the Joint Terrorism Task Force and was assigned to portions of the 9/11 investigation. He also served on details protecting President Bill Clinton and President George W. Bush.

Following his tenure with the U.S. Secret Service, President Lamb worked on the staff of U.S. Sen. Don Nickles. He was elected to the Oklahoma State Senate in 2004, where he represented portions of Edmond and northwest Oklahoma City. He rose to the position of majority floor leader during his senate tenure.

President Lamb was elected as the lieutenant governor of the state of Oklahoma, a position he held from 2011 to 2019. During his time in elected office at the Oklahoma State Capitol, he served in a number of leadership roles, focusing on educational, financial and commerce matters. He also was the recipient of the Oklahoma State Regents Distinguished Service Award for his dedication to strengthening higher education in Oklahoma.

Upon reentering the private sector in 2019, he was involved in a number of private business ventures, including the practice of law, focusing on business and governmental matters.

President Lamb's diverse background in government, law, financial management and industry is helping guide UCO into the future as a leading university in career readiness.

President Lamb has been married to his wife, Monica, for 28 years. A longtime educator, she most recently taught at Cashion Public Schools. Monica stepped away from the classroom to commit herself to serving UCO students, faculty and staff as the university's first lady. The Lambs have two children.



### Director of Athletics, Stan Wagnon

Stan Wagnon is the University of Central Oklahoma's director of athletics, becoming the ninth director in the school's more than 125-year athletic history in August 2020.

Wagnon made his return to Central following a four-year stint as commissioner of the Sooner Athletic Conference, serving that post from July 2016 to August 2020. Prior to that, Wagnon held the same position at the Lone Star Conference, spending 11 years there within the conference's administration and as commissioner.

An Edmond native, Wagnon earned his bachelor's degree in journalism/public relations from Central in 1995. He also holds a master's of education from Midwestern State University. His father (Skip) served as director of athletics from 1986-2003 following a 15-year stint as head athletic trainer.

Wagnon returns to UCO after a 25-plus year career in athletics. After working in the UCO sports information office as a student, Wagnon had stints in the same role at Midwestern State, where he received his master's degree, and Tarleton State.

Wagnon moved from Tarleton to the NCAA Division II's Lone Star Conference office and eventually served as commissioner. He spent 11 years in that role before moving to the same post at the NAIA's Sooner Athletic Conference.

At the Lone Star Conference, Wagnon's most noteworthy accomplishment was creation of the Lone Star Football Festival, held annually at Arlington's AT&T Stadium, home of the NFL's Dallas Cowboys. The event generated nearly a half-million dollars back to the conference office.

Throughout his career, Wagnon has emerged as a national leader in intercollegiate athletics. He has served as Chair of the NCAA Division II Nominating Committee and the NCAA Men's Basketball Regional Advisory Committee. He also served on committees for the D2CCA and College Sports Information Directors of Association (CoSIDA).

Wagnon is married (Jill) and has three children (Abby, Macy, and Knox).

## Administration

### Chuck Bailey - Senior Strategic Advisor



Chuck Bailey moved into the position of Senior Strategic Advisor in August 2020 following a brief stint as interim athletic director, for which he served from May 1, 2020 through the end of August.

Bailey came to UCO in 1984 as an assistant football coach. He helped lead the Bronchos to two Lone Star Conference championships and four NCAA Division II playoff appearances during his coaching tenure.

Bailey assumed the additional responsibilities of Director of Football Operations in 2003 and served both roles until moving into athletic administration in 2006. He served as Assistant Athletic Director for Operations before becoming Senior Associate Athletic Director in 2007.

Bailey left UCO to become the District Athletic Director for Mustang Public Schools in 2009 where he served until retiring in 2016. He returned to UCO in 2017 as Development Director for Athletic Scholarships and contributed in that capacity for two years before his service as interim director and now advisor.

Bailey is married (Crystal) and has two children (Burke and Brylee).



### Jeremy Rogers - Senior Associate Athletic Director

Jeremy Rogers, a native of Medford, Oklahoma, serves as Senior Associate Athletic Director at Central Oklahoma.

Joining the department in November 2012, Rogers served the compliance department in an assistant role before moving to Director of Athletic Compliance and Legal Affairs, overseeing all aspects of the crucial facet of the department, in 2020. He was named Senior Associate Athletic Director in July 2021, continuing to lead the efforts of the compliance department while adding oversight of the internal operations of the athletic department. Rogers also oversees operations in athletic training, strength & conditioning, ticketing, and facilities.

Rogers has been heavily involved in projects, committees, forums, and the like both inside the university as well as on the national stage. He holds positions in charge of student-athlete development and the Student Athlete Advisory Committee, he is Deputy Title IX coordinator and a member the University's Behavioral Assessment Team (BAT). And he has sport oversight of the men's golf, women's track & field and cross country, and wrestling programs.

A member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA), Rogers is also involved with the National Association of Academic and Student-Athlete Development Professionals (N4A), College Athletic Business Management Association (CABMA), and National Association of Athletics Compliance (NAAC) serving on the association's DII Reasonable Standards Committee.

Rogers serves on the NCAA Division II Coaching Enhancement Grant Committee which is designed to provide financial assistance to the division's member schools that are committed to enhancing ethnic minority and gender representation in newly created assistant coaching positions for any NCAA-sponsored sport. He is also a representative of the NCAA Eligibility Advisory Group which provides support and feedback on content and functionality to the NCAA Eligibility Center.

Rogers was a member of the Southern Nazarene University football team (two-year starter) and earned all-conference honors at tight end. He received his Bachelor's degree in Sport Management from SNU in 2007.

Rogers went on to earn his Juris Doctor from the University of Oklahoma College of Law in 2012. While at OU he worked as an intern for the Athletic Compliance Department and Office of Legal Counsel. Rogers is licensed to practice law in the state of Oklahoma and is a member of the Oklahoma Bar Association.

Jeremy is married (Rachel) and they have four children (Mason, Norah, Sophie, and Lane).



### Melissa Paul, Assistant A.D., Finance, SWA

Melissa Paul enters her sixth year at the University of Central Oklahoma and enters her fourth year in the role of Assistant Athletic Director for Business and Senior Woman Administrator (SWA).

Paul spent two years serving as an assistant registrar at Central and also helped out as a volunteer assistant coach for the softball program in 2020. She moved into her current role during the summer of 2020 and has spent the last three years serving in that capacity, overseeing the financial operations of the department. As SWA, she serves as the lead female voice of the department and works with the female student-athletes. Paul created the Women's Leadership Council where each sport works together for growth and professional development.

Paul played softball collegiately at Division I Marist and later served as head coach for her alma mater. She coached at Marist from 2002-06, leading the Red Foxes to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championship and their first-ever national tournament appearance in her final season. Melissa then spent seven years as assistant coach at Missouri, helping lead the team to a 288-89 record in that span. The Tigers made three straight appearances in the Women's College World Series and Paul mentored three All-America selections while coaching the team's outfielders.

Paul went to Division II West Florida as assistant coach in 2013 before taking over the head coaching reigns the following season. She put together a 138-83 record in four seasons at UWF and led the Argos to three Division II national tournament appearances.

West Florida won 40-plus games twice under Paul's guidance, including a school-record 46 in 2017 when the Argos captured the South Region title in qualifying for the Division II Softball Championship.

### **Chandler Short, Assistant A.D. Corporate Sales & Marketing**

Chandler Short joined the University of Central Oklahoma in February 2022 as the Assistant Athletic Director for Corporate Sales and Marketing.

The Texas native comes to UCO after spending the last six years at McPherson College in McPherson, Kansas. She joined McPherson in 2017 and was promoted to assistant athletic director and senior woman administrator in 2018, then was promoted again to director of athletics in March 2020.

Short graduated from McPherson in 2015 with a Bachelor of Science. She played women's basketball and tennis for the Bulldogs during her time there. She then attended the University of Oklahoma and received her master's degree in higher education and intercollegiate athletics administration in 2017.

Short is currently pursuing her doctorate in higher education from Southern Methodist University.

A native of Edgewood, Texas, Short oversees UCO's corporate sales program and the marketing efforts of the department and its 14 varsity sports.



### **Samm Chavez, Assistant A.D. Academics & Student Support Services**

Samm Chavez was promoted to Assistant Athletic Director for Academics and Student Support in July of 2022 after spending the previous three years as manager of financial aid for the department.

Chavez supports student-athletes in their academic journey to graduation by connecting services and supports like the BELL (Broncho Education Learning Lab), Academic Advisement, Career Development, CCWB (Center for Counseling and Well Being) and more, so students can be best equipped to see success in the classroom.

She also monitors grades throughout the semester, works with the BELL to plan for learning facilitators (tutors) to be present in the Sports Performance Center's Mike Ciskowski Academic Center for student athletes, along with planning and delivering outreach to students. Chavez assists in coordinating the annual Academic Awards Banquet, and advises first-year freshman student-athletes to support students in discovering a major and classes that help them begin their college career focused and driven in the classroom.

Chavez works with the athletic department in the creation and execution of a cohesive and comprehensive student athlete development program that aligns with the department's vision and mission.

Chavez is active in service both at UCO and off campus. She is involved in the Faculty/Staff mentor for Hispanic Success Initiative (2018-Present), Latino Faculty & Staff Association (2018-Present), Treasurer for Latino Faculty & Staff Association (2022 – Present), Leadership UCO (2021-2022), and Latino Leadership OKC (Feb 2022 – Present).

Chavez received her Bachelor of Science in Education – Special Education Mild/Moderate Disabilities from UCO in 2013 and her Master of Education – Adult & Higher Education, Student Personnel from UCO in 2019.

She is a native of Mustang, Oklahoma and graduated from Mustang High School in 2007.

## Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association

**C**entral Oklahoma enters its 12th year as a member of the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association.

The MIAA, a 14-member conference of NCAA Division II institutions in Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska and Oklahoma, was first organized in 1912 as the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Over the past 100 years, the MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA schools have won 54 NCAA team championships and over 300 individual national championships.

The MIAA currently conducts championships in nine sports for both men and women.

For the men, champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, baseball, tennis, golf, and wrestling. The MIAA crowns champions in bowling, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track & field.

The MIAA turned a new page on July 1, 1992, when the NCAA Division II conference changed its name from the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association to the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association.

The decision to make the change originated in 1989, when Pittsburg State and Washburn became the first schools outside the state of Missouri to gain membership in the MIAA.

The conference was first organized in 1912 with 14 member institutions. Of those original members, Central Missouri and Northwest Missouri still remain a part of the MIAA.

The first change in membership came in 1924, when the MIAA reorganized to include only the five regional Missouri state colleges: Central Missouri, Truman (at the time known as Northeast Missouri State), Northwest Missouri, Southeast Missouri State and Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State).

Over the next 56 years, three schools joined the membership: Missouri School of Mines (later Missouri-Rolla) in 1935, Lincoln in 1970 and the Missouri-St. Louis in 1980.

Ken Jones became the first full-time commissioner of the MIAA in 1981 and would be in the position for 16 years, retiring in 1997. Ralph McFillen succeeded Jones, serving 10 years before his retirement in 2007.

Jim Johnson succeeded McFillen in July of that year and served as commissioner until September of 2010, when Dr. Bob Boerigter took over. Mike Racy is the current commissioner and began in January of 2017 following Boerigter's retirement.

Southwest Baptist brought membership back to eight schools



in 1986, before the major expansion of the conference in 1989. Pittsburg State, Washburn, Missouri Southern and Missouri Western began competition in the 1989-90 season.

Southeast Missouri State left the MIAA following the 1990-91 season and was replaced by Emporia State in the 1991-92 season.

Missouri-St. Louis departed the MIAA in 1996, Missouri-Rolla left in 2005 and Lincoln forfeited its membership in 1999. Fort Hays State joined the MIAA in 2006, Nebraska-Omaha entered the league in 2008 and Lincoln re-joined the conference in 2010.

UCO, Lindenwood, Nebraska-Kearney and Northeastern State all become league members with the start of the 2012-13 academic year.

Nebraska-Omaha left the league in 2011 and Truman State did the same in 2013.

Southwest Baptist, which had not competed in football in the MIAA since 2014, and Lindenwood, departed the MIAA altogether in 2019. Lincoln, who like SBU had been competing as associate members without football, returned to fill the void left by Lindenwood to keep the MIAA with 12 football playing schools.

Newman (Kan.) and Rogers State (Okla.) also joined the league in 2019 to give the MIAA 14 total schools. Newman had been an associate member in wrestling.
