HOLIDAY FOOD DRIVE

Brown will hold the MEGA Disposal Holiday Food Drive as part of the Turkey Tip-Off with all proceeds benefitting Good Neighbors Soup Kitchen, Food Pantry, and Day Shelter in East Providence, R.I. Fans that bring a non-perishable food item will be eligible for a \$5 ticket – an offer that is good for all six games at the Turkey Tip-Off as well as the Brown men's basketball game vs. Bryant on Sunday at 6:00 p.m. MEGA Disposal-branded donation bins will be located in the lobbies of both the Pizzitola Sports Center and the Nelson Fitness Center. Good Neighbors accepts all non-perishable food items with a preference for the following high-demand items: tuna, canned chicken, peanut butter, jelly, cereal, and shelf-stable milk. MEGA Disposal will deliver all donations to Good Neighbors at the conclusion of the food drive.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

Brown was selected to finish fifth in the 2018-19 Ivy League Women's Basketball Preseason Media Poll. Defending league champion Princeton took the top spot in the poll with 14 first-place votes and 133 total points. Penn followed in second with two first-place votes and 107 total points while Harvard (one first-place vote, 104 points) and Yale (89 points) rounded out the top half of the poll. Brown (66), Dartmouth (55), Columbia (30), and Cornell (28) filled out the fifth through eighth slots, in order.

VETERAN FEEL

Brown returns 87 percent of its scoring and 76 percent of its rebounding from a season ago as the Bears bring back seven of their top eight scorers and six of their top seven rebounders from last season.

FAB FOUR

The four members of Brown's senior class – **Mary Butler** (Bangor, Maine), **Shayna Mehta** (San Francisco, Calif.), **Erika Steeves** (Montreal, Quebec), and **Taylor Will** (Arlington Heights, Ill.) – have combined for 335 games played, 244 games started, 3,301 points, 1,199 field goals made, 363 3-pointers made, 535 free throws made, 1,547 rebounds, 584 assists, 400 steals, 132 blocks, and 8,616 minutes played over their careers.

FOUR OF A KIND WITH AN ACE

Over the course of their careers, the quintet of seniors **Shayna Mehta** (San Francisco, Calif.), **Erika Steeves** (Montreal, Quebec), **Taylor Will** (Arlington Heights, Ill.), and **Mary Butler** (Bangor, Maine) and junior guard **Justine Gaziano** (Natick, Mass.) has combined for 390 games played, 296 games started, 4,254 points, 1,537 field goals made, 454 3-pointers made, 729 free throws made, 1,758 rebounds, 657 assists, 436 steals, 144 blocks, and 10,473 minutes played. As a unit, the group has started all five games this season and has made 16 starts together all-time.

BACK-TO-BACK ALL-IVY HONOREES

Last winter guard **Shayna Mehta '19** (San Francisco, Calif.) earned Second Team All-Ivy, and guard **Justine Gaziano '20** (Natick, Mass.) gained Honorable Mention All-Ivy, becoming the first pair of Brown teammates to garner All-Ivy in back-to-back seasons since Sarah Hayes '06 and Holly Robertson '05 both collected All-Ivy accolades in the 2003-04 and 2004-05 seasons. Both Mehta and Gaziano earned Second Team All-Ivy in the 2016-17 season. At the end of the 2017-18 regular season, Mehta ranked second in the Ivy League in points per game (18.5), second in 3-pointers made per game (2.8), and third in steals per game (2.2) while Gaziano ranked third in the Ancient Eight in points per game (17.9), first in free throw percentage (.872), third in field goal percentage (.486), and fifth in 3-pointers per game (1.9).

THREE STRAIGHT WINNING SEASONS

After going 15-13 overall in 2015-16, 17-13 in 2016-17, and 15-12 in 2017-18, Brown posted three straight winning seasons for the first time since registering four straight seasons above .500 from 2002-06.

FROM DOWNTOWN

Senior guard **Shayna Mehta** (San Francisco, Calif.) scored a career-high 34 points on 12-of-20 field goals and 6-of-9 3-pointers at Holy Cross (Nov. 18). She scored over 30 points for the third time in her career and went over 20 points for the 24th time. She tied her career high with 12 field goals made and connected on five or more 3-pointers in a game for the 14th time in her career. With her 34 points, Mehta now has 1,388 career points, moving into fifth place on Brown's all-time list and passing Liz Turner '98 (1,358 points) and Sarah Hayes '06 (1,377 points). She now has 206 career made 3-pointers, climbing to second all-time at Brown and 10th all-time in Ivy League history, passing Lauren Clarke '14 (203 career 3-pointers) on both lists. Earlier in November, she became the third student-athlete in program history and 11th student-athlete in Ivy League history to make 200 career 3-pointers with a pair of triples at Boston University (Nov. 12).

RECORDS WATCH

Senior guard **Shayna Mehta** (San Francisco, Calif.) continues to make her way up the charts in the Brown record book. Mehta currently ranks fifth at Brown in career points (1,388), second in career 3-pointers made (206), and eighth in career field goals made (508). Also, on Brown's career 3-pointers made list, senior forward **Erika Steeves** (Montreal, Quebec) stands in seventh (105), and junior guard **Justine Gaziano** (Natick, Mass.) sits ninth (91).

ON THE FAST BREAK

As a team last year, Brown led the Ivy League in points per game (75.3), while ranking second in 3-point field goals made per game (8.1), defensive rebounds per game (29.1), and blocks per game (5.37). The Bears scored at least 70 points in 19 games and eclipsed 80 points 11 times.

START YOUR ENGINES

Brown opened its 46th season of women's basketball on Nov. 6, and the Bears have now registered a 20-26 record all-time in season openers. Brown has won its last five openers and six of its last seven season debuts. Beginning last year with a 12-1 record, Brown established its best start in program history through 13 games. At 10-1 through 11 games, the Bears began 2015-16 with their best start since 1973-74. Brown opened the 2015-16 season at 5-0 for the first time in school history before falling at Manhattan.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS

The Bears notched a 12-1 mark in non-conference contests this past year, tying for the second-most non-conference wins in school history and giving the Bears double-digit non-league wins for the sixth time. In 2016-17, the team tallied a 10-6 non-conference record as Brown posted its fifth-most non-conference wins in program history. With a 12-2 mark in non-conference contests in 2015-16, Brown finished second in program history for non-conference victories in a season. The Bears went 13-2 in non-league games in 1974-75 and notched 11 such wins in 1973-74 and 1975-76.

MEHTA ECLIPSES 1,000 POINTS

Senior guard **Shayna Mehta** (San Francisco, Calif.) became the 20th 1,000-point scorer in program history and the fifth student-athlete in program history to score 1,000 points before her senior year with a 28-point effort at Colgate on Dec. 10, 2017. She netted her 1,000th point on a corner 3-pointer with 6:14 to play against the Raiders. She became the program's first 1,000-point scorer since Jordin Alexander '16, and the program's first player to score 1,000 points before her senior year since Vita Redding '99.

PERIMETER DUO

Brown carries two of the Ivy League's top-three scorers in senior guard **Shayna Mehta** (San Francisco, Calif.) and junior guard **Justine Gaziano** (Natick, Mass.). Gaziano ranks second in the Ivy League in points per game (19.8) while Mehta stands third in the conference with 19.6 points per game. Combined, the pair has accounted for 120 career double-figure scoring games and 46 games with 20 or more points. Last season, the duo combined for 22 20-point games, helping Brown post a 20-point scorer in 23 of 27 games, including six contests with two 20-point scorers.

REACHING TRIPLE DIGITS

Brown set a program record for points against a Division I opponent in its 102-77 win over Sacred Heart on Dec. 6, 2017. The Bears scored over 100 points against a Division I team for the first time in school history. Brown crossed the century mark for the first time in a 114-28 win over Division III Mount Ida on Nov. 19, 2015 and reached the plateau in a 100-79 win over Johnson & Wales on Jan. 5, 2018. The Bears' previous scoring high against a Division I opponent came in a 98-88 win over Princeton on Jan. 13, 2017. Against SHU, Brown trailed 32-13 at the 8:29 mark of the second quarter before outscoring the Pioneers, 89-45, over the remainder of the game.

BACK-TO-BACK OCEAN STATE TIP-OFF CHAMPIONSHIPS

Brown won its second straight Ocean State Tip-Off Tournament title in 2017 as the Bears defeated host Providence College in the semifinals (Dec. 2), 64-59, and topped Bryant University, 72-60, in the championship game (Dec. 3). Guard **Justine Gaziano '20** (Natick, Mass.) earned Tournament MVP honors while guard **Taylor Will '19** (Arlington Heights, Ill.) gained All-Tournament Team accolades. The Bears won the inaugural event in 2016 behind victories over Rhode Island in the semifinals and Providence in the championship game. Since the start of the 2015-16 season, Brown has posted an 8-2 record against Division I opponents from the state of Rhode Island.

MEHTA ON THE MARK

Guard **Shayna Mehta '19** (San Francisco, Calif.) scored a then career-high 33 points and set a single-game program record with nine made 3-pointers in the Bears' game against No. 20 California on Nov. 19, 2017. Mehta hit 9-of-15 shots from 3-point distance and earned Ivy League Player of the Week honors on Nov. 20. She came within one 3-pointer of tying the Ivy League record for made 3-pointers in a single game and posted her second career game with 30 or more points.

HISTORY MADE BEYOND THE ARC

Against No. 20 California on Nov. 19, 2017, Brown set single-game program records for 3-pointers made (16) and 3-pointers attempted (41), shooting 39.0 percent from distance in the contest. In the first quarter alone, the Bears connected on 7-of-17 shots (41.2 percent) from behind the arc.

MEHTA DATA

Senior guard **Shayna Mehta** (San Francisco, Calif.) ranks third in the Ivy League in points per game (19.6), first in steals per game (3.0), third in field goals made (34), and fourth in 3-pointers made per game (2.0). Mehta scored a career-high 34 points, hitting 12-of-20 field goals and 6-of-9 3-pointers at Holy Cross (Nov. 18). She opened the year with 16 points and 10 rebounds vs. CCSU (Nov. 6) for her eighth career double-double. Mehta netted 23 points with seven rebounds at Boston University (Nov. 12) and compiled 13 points and six rebounds vs. UNH (Nov. 15). Last season, she ranked second in the Ivy League in points per game (18.5), second in 3-pointers made per game (2.8), and third in steals per game (2.2). Last year in Ivy League play, she averaged 17.4 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. For her career, she has scored in double figures 72 times, netted 20 or more points 24 times, eclipsed 30 points three times, and totaled eight double-doubles. A 2017-18 Academic All-Ivy selection, she has earned Second Team All-Ivy accolades in each of the last two years and collected Ivy League All-Tournament Team honors in 2016-17. She unanimously won the Ivy League Rookie of the Year award in 2015-16.

GAZIANO THE GO-TO

Junior guard **Justine Gaziano** (Natick, Mass.) ranks second in the Ivy League in points per game (19.8) and first in field goals made (37). She posted her second career double-double with a season-high 29 points and 11 rebounds vs. UNH (Nov. 15). Gaziano netted 23 points on 8-of-15 shooting with six rebounds at Holy Cross (Nov. 18). She opened the year with 27 points and eight rebounds vs. CCSU (Nov. 6) and netted 13 points at Bryant (Nov. 8). Last year, Gaziano ranked third in the Ivy League in points per game (17.9), first in free throw percentage (87.2), fifth in 3-pointers per game (1.9), and third in field goal percentage (48.6). In Ivy League play last winter, she scored 17.5 points per game, shot 49.4 percent from the field, and 44.6 percent from downtown. For her career, Gaziano has scored in double figures in each of 48 games, netted 20 or more points 22 times, and eclipsed 30 points three times. She has earned All-Ivy honors in each of her first two seasons, taking Honorable Mention in 2017-18 and Second Team in 2016-17.

STEEVES ANCHORS FRONT COURT

Senior forward **Erika Steeves** (Montreal, Quebec) has averaged 7.0 points and 5.6 rebounds per game on the year. She scored a season-high 14 points with eight rebounds vs. UNH (Nov. 15), totaled eight points and six boards a Holy Cross (Nov. 18), and grabbed a team-high eight rebounds at Bryant (Nov. 8). She scored 11.1 points per game last season, while ranking second in the Ivy League in defensive rebounds per game (6.4) and seventh in rebounds per game (7.4). In Ivy play, she averaged 9.4 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. For her career, she has totaled 15 double-doubles, scored in double figures 46 times, and eclipsed 20 points six times. She returns as one of the Bears' most experienced frontcourt players and earned a spot on the Ivy League All-Tournament Team in 2016-17.

BREAD AND BUTLER

Senior forward **Mary Butler** (Bangor, Maine) has played in all 90 games since the start of the 2015-16 season, the only Bear to do so. She has averaged career highs in points per game (4.6), rebounds per game (5.2), assists per game (2.2), and minutes per game (31.2) this season. She opened the year with eight rebounds, five points, and four assists vs. CCSU (Nov. 6) and totaled six points and six boards at Holy Cross (Nov. 18). Last winter she averaged 3.2 points, 3.6 rebounds, and 15.6 minutes per game for the season. In Ivy play a year ago, Butler posted 3.2 points and 3.6 rebounds per game in 16.6 minutes per contest. She adds to Brown's experience in the frontcourt and earned Ocean State Tip-Off All-Tournament Team honors as a sophomore.

LAST TIME OUT: BROWN 89, HOLY CROSS 85

WORCESTER, Mass. – Senior guard **Shayna Mehta** scored a career-high 34 points, hitting 12-of-20 field goals and 6-of-9 3-pointers, to lead Brown University women's basketball to an 89-85 win over Holy Cross on Sunday afternoon at the Hart Center.

Trailing 83-80 with 3:15 to play, the Bears (3-2) outscored the Crusaders (1-2), 9-2, down the stretch in a game that saw 10 ties and eight lead changes, including seven ties and six lead changes in the second half.

Mehta (San Francisco, Calif.) scored over 30 points for the third time in her career and went over 20 points for the 24th time. With her 34 points, Mehta now has 1,388 career points, moving into fifth place on Brown's all-time list and passing Liz Turner '98 (1,358 points) and Sarah Hayes '06 (1,377 points). Her 34 points tied for the seventh most in a single game in Brown history.

She now has 206 career made 3-pointers, climbing to second all-time at Brown and 10th all-time in Ivy League history, passing Lauren Clarke '14 (203 career 3-pointers) on both lists. Mehta added four assists and three steals on Sunday.

Junior guard **Justine Gaziano** (Natick, Mass.) netted 23 points on 8-of-15 field goals and 3-of-6 shots from 3-point distance, while grabbing six rebounds. She registered her third 20-point game of the season and 22nd of her career.

Senior guard **Taylor Will** (Arlington Heights, Ill.) totaled a season-high 15 points, six rebounds, four assists, and three steals. She connected on 2-of-5 shots from behind the arc. Senior forward **Erika Steeves** (Montreal, Quebec) posted eight points, six rebounds, and three assists.

WILL POWER

Senior guard **Taylor Will** (Arlington Heights, Ill.) has averaged 9.6 points and 4.6 rebounds per game, while ranking second in the Ivy League in steals per game (2.8) this season. She netted a season-high 15 points with six rebounds at Holy Cross. Will scored 12 points and hit 2-of-5 3-pointers vs. UNH (Nov. 15) after charting eight points and seven rebounds at Bryant (Nov. 8). She returned to the Brown lineup in the season opener vs. CCSU (Nov. 6) after missing the majority of last season due to a knee injury she sustained on Dec. 22, 2017. In the opener, she posted nine points and a career-high seven steals vs. CCSU (Nov. 6). Through Brown's first 11 games last year, Will ranked fifth in the Ivy League with 17.0 points per game, fifth in field goal percentage (48.3), fourth in assists per game (3.9), third in steals per game (2.6), and fourth in free throw percentage (77.6). She scored in double figures in all 11 games in which she played last season and netted over 20 points in each of three games. For her career, she has scored in double figures 33 times and netted 20 or more points six times. She took a major step forward in her development from her freshman to her sophomore season pushing her scoring from 1.7 points per game as a rookie to 12.3 points per game as a sophomore – an increase of 10.6 points per game.

GREEN AT THE FIVE

Junior **Haley Green** (Salem, Va.) has provided the Bears a presence at center, averaging 3.2 points, 2.6 rebounds, and 11.2 minutes per game on the year. She tallied six points and three rebounds at Boston University (Nov. 12) and grabbed five boards at Holy Cross (Nov. 18).

DOMINIQUE DISTRIBUTES

Sophomore guard **Dominique Leonidas** (Stone Mountain, Ga.) stepped up her level of play during Ivy League competition last year as she posted 5.9 points, 2.0 rebounds, 2.1 assists, and 20.0 minutes per game. Overall for her rookie season, she averaged 17.6 minutes, 4.1 points, 2.5 assists, and 2.2 rebounds per game. During a three-game span from Feb. 10-17, Leonidas tallied 15.3 points per game and shot 63.3 percent (19-of-30) from the floor.

NON-LEAGUE WINNING STREAK

During non-league play last winter, Brown went on a 10-game winning streak from Nov. 24 to Jan. 5, marking the second double-digit win streak in program history. The Bears posted one other double-digit win streak during a school-record 13-game stretch from Jan. 23 to Mar. 5 during the 1992-93 season.

STEEVES SCORES SECOND-MOST POINTS

Forward **Erika Steeves '19** (Montreal, Quebec) scored 38 points – the second-highest single-game total in school history – in Brown's 100-79 win over Johnson & Wales on Jan. 5, 2018. She netted 8-of-10 shots from 3-point distance, marking the second-most made 3-pointers in a game in program history. Her 14 made field goals tied for the fourth most in a contest in the Brown record book. Her 38-point effort helped the Bears score 100 or more points for the second time on the season and for the third time in program history.

SUMMER WELL SPENT

During the summer of 2018, junior guard **Justine Gaziano** (Natick, Mass.) spent 30 days in Samoa through a Brown University Royce Sport and Society Fellowship. During her time in Samoa, Gaziano explored the athletic experiences of a select group of high performing female athletes with an emphasis on how sociocultural attitudes towards female athletes have impacted their experiences. Also this past summer, sophomores **McKenna Dale** (Storrs, Conn.) and **Dominique Leonidas** (Stone Mountain, Ga.) and assistant coach **Sara Binkhorst** volunteered in Kenya with the non-profit Play BOLD, assisting with sport clinics, classroom education, and infrastructural projects. In the summer of 2017, senior forward **Erika Steeves** (Montreal, Quebec) spent 23 days traveling through China, studying the market for amateur and professional basketball there through a Royce Fellowship for Sport and Society while during that same summer senior guard **Shayna Mehta** (San Francisco, Calif.) spent 18 days in Chennai, India with Crossover Basketball and Scholars Academy, using basketball as a vehicle to impact the education rates of marginalized communities there.

THE LAST FAIRFIELD MEETING

• **Fairfield 49, Brown 34** -- Nov. 13, 2012

FAIRFIELD, Conn. - Fairfield's Katie Cizynski earned a double-double with 14 points and 13 rebounds to lead the women's basketball team to a 49-34 victory over the Bears on Tuesday evening at Alumni Hall. The loss drops Brown to 1-1 on the young season, while Fairfield improves to 1-1.

Brown, led by **Sheila Dixon's** (Schenectady, N.Y.) 15 points and six rebounds, got off to a slow start as Fairfield tallied the first five points of the game. The Bears, trailing 9-5 just six minutes into the half, allowed Fairfield to go on a 15-3 run over a four-minutes span to take a 24-8 advantage.

Junior **Jordin Juker** (Boise, Idaho) broke the silence with a layup with 10:05 remaining in the first half, and a 3-pointer by **Ellise Sharpe** (Tipp City, Ohio) cut the deficit to 10. However, the Stags closed out the stanza on a 6-2 run to head into halftime with a 33-19 lead.

Despite shooting just 23 percent in the second half, Brown picked up its defensive pressure and was able to hold the Stags to 16 second-half points.

THE FAIRFIELD SERIES HISTORY

Brown and Fairfield have met seven times with the Bears trailing the Stags in the all-time series, 1-6. In a series that dates to Dec. 3, 1983, Brown last topped Fairfield on Nov. 18, 2005.

SCOUTING THE STAGS

Fairfield brings a 2-1 record into the weekend with wins over Richmond (58-40) and LIU Brooklyn (71-43) and a loss at Xavier (48-35). Katie Armstrong leads the Stags with 15.3 points per game while Khadidiatou Diouf has added 9.7 points and 6.7 rebounds per game. Last season, Fairfield went 13-17 overall and 10-8 in Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference play.

Sarah Behn, the Elizabeth F. Turner '98 Coaching Chair for Women's Basketball, enters her fifth season as the head coach at Brown University in 2018-19, having taken over the reins of the program as the ninth head coach in team history on May 21, 2014.

During the 2017-18 season, Behn and the Bears won their second straight Ocean State Tip-Off Tournament title and began the year with a program-best 12-1 start. The Bears finished above .500 for the third straight year with a 15-12 overall record and set program records for points against a Division I opponent (102) and for single-season team free throw percentage (.752). Both Shayna Mehta '19 and Justine Gaziano '20 earned

All-Ivy honors for the second straight year while Mehta became Brown's 20th 1,000-point scorer.

In 2016-17, Behn guided Brown to an appearance in the inaugural Ivy League Tournament and to a spot in the Women's Basketball Invitational, gaining the program's first-ever win in a national postseason tournament. Brown set single-season program records for games played (30), points (2,169), field goals made (779), 3-pointers made (226), and free throw percentage (.739) while winning the inaugural Ocean State Tip-Off Tournament.
