## Game #7: Brown Takes On Penn at Franklin Field

**BROWN (1-5, 0-3 Ivy) vs. PENN (2-4, 0-3 Ivy)**

**Saturday, November 2, 2019; 1:00 pm**  
**Franklin Field; Philadelphia, Pa.**

**Radio: WPRV-AM 790 (Scott Cordischi and John Anderson P'11, P'18)**

**Brown's Record:** The Bears (1-5, 0-3 Ivy) were unable to hold onto a late lead and fell to Cornell, 37-35, on a Big Red Field goal with nine seconds remaining. Bears' junior QB EJ Perry threw for 372 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another 91 yards to account for 463 yards of total offense, sixth best in Brown football history.

**Penn's Record:** The Quakers (2-4, 0-3 Ivy) lost a 46-41 shootout to Yale at the Yale Bowl. Quakers quarterback Nick Robinson threw for a career high 395 yards and three touchdowns, while Ryan Cragun made 13 catches for 208 yards, both career highs. Penn has earned wins over Lafayette (28-24) and Sacred Heart (38-24), with losses to #20 Delaware (28-27), Dartmouth (28-15) and Columbia (44-6).

**Brown vs. Penn- The 88<sup>th</sup> Meeting:** Brown and Penn have met 87 times, dating back to 1895, with the Quakers holding a 61-24-2 series lead. Last year, Penn earned its fourth straight win over the Bears, 13-7, playing in a classic New England Nor'easter with winds gusting up to 50 miles-per-hour. Brown had won the previous two games over the Quakers (2013 & 2014), including a 21-13 decision in 2014 at Franklin Field, its first in Philadelphia since 2008.

**Bear Facts:** QB EJ Perry '21 leads the nation in total offense with 350.7 yards per game. His 512 yards of total offense vs. URI was second only to Michael Dougherty's '09 538 total yards vs. Holy Cross in 2008...Brown's 426 passing yards vs. URI are the most since 2015 when Brown threw for 438 yards vs. Rhode Island... The Bears are averaging 143.2 rushing yards per game through six games after averaging 65.1 yards per game in 2018...Wide receivers Jakob Prall '20 and Demitri Jackson '20 each made seven catches vs. Cornell... 11 different Brown players made receptions vs. URI and 10 vs. Holy Cross... LB Jason Medeiros '22 made seven tackles vs. Cornell, leads the Bears in tackles (34) and ranks 1st in the Ivy League with two interceptions... P Dawson Goepferich '20 ranks second in the Ivy League with a 42.0 yards per punt average...RB Omari Garry scored a touchdown on his first career carry, a one yard run vs. Cornell.

**Fast and Faster:** Head coach James Perry has developed a dynamic and fast style of offense that translates into points on the scoreboard. In two years as head coach at Bryant, Perry's squad averaged 30.3 points per game his first year and 32.5 points per game in 2018, scoring a school record 56 points in its final game against Howard. His 2013 offense at Princeton set league records for points (43.7) and yards (511.6) per game.

**EJ Perry Leads Nation In Total Offense:** Junior quarterback **EJ Perry** (Andover, MA) has emerged as one of the top FCS quarterbacks in the nation, leading the nation in total offense with 350.7 yards per game. He accounted for 463 yards of total offense vs. Cornell (372 passing, 91 rushing) and threw three touchdowns. He also ranks ninth in the nation in completions (24.67 per game). Perry tossed touchdown passes of 37 and 21 yards vs. Princeton. He threw two touchdown passes (8, 57) vs. Holy Cross, passing for 237 yards and running for 47 yards. Perry accumulated 512 total yards against Rhode Island, including 420 passing yards (three TD's) and 92 yards on the ground. His 512 yards of total offense ranks second in Brown football history, second to Michael Dougherty's 538 total yards vs. Holy Cross in 2008. He excelled in Brown's season opening win over Bryant, being named the STATS FCS National Offensive Player of the Week, Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week and the Gold Helmet Award recipient as the New England Player of the Week. Perry accounted for five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) and 410 yards of total offense against the Bulldogs in his Brown debut. Perry passed for 183 yards, completing 21-of-32 passes, and three touchdowns, and ran for another 227 yards and two touchdowns, including a 94-yard touchdown run, the second longest rushing play in Brown football history. His 227 rushing yards are the eighth most in the Brown record book and most ever for a Brown quarterback. Only Mark Kachmer's 95-yard run vs. Yale at the Yale Bowl in 2011 is longer than Perry's 94-yard TD scamper. A transfer from Boston College, who saw action in five games for the Eagles last season, threw for 162 yards vs. Harvard, completing 17-of-27 passes. The Massachusetts high school state record holder for single season touchdown passes (47), Perry threw for 98 yards with 12 completions against Clemson in 2018. In Brown's two-quarterback system, junior quarterback **Michael McGovern** (St. Louis, MO) completed 2-of-2 passes for 17 yards vs. Bryant and 1-of-2 passes vs. Harvard. He led the Ivy League with 220.20 passing yards per game in 2018, while throwing eight touchdown passes. McGovern will also see considerable action. Expect the Bears to have multiple QB's on the field at the same time.

**Jackson Shares Brown Lead In Receptions:** Senior **Demitri Jackson** (Nashua, NH) is tied for the Brown team lead with 24 catches for 213 yards and two TD's. Jackson hauled in seven passes for 67 yards and a TD vs. Cornell. He eclipsed his 2018 season reception total with eight catches for 76 yards and his first career TD reception (four yards) vs. Bryant. Jackson had four receptions for 33 yards vs. Rhode Island and four catches for 19 yards vs. Holy Cross.

**Plowing the Road:** The Bears return four of five starters to the offensive line, led by senior tackle and All-Ivy selection **Phil Lynch** (Milton, MA). Senior **Nick Allsop** (North Easton, MA) returns at guard, junior tackle **Chad Broome-Webster** (Orlando, FL) at tackle and senior **Toby Okwara** (Charlotte, NC) at center. Senior **James Carnevale** (North Andover, MA) and junior **Tucker Barnes** (Hahira, GA) have also emerged as top linemen.

**Boylan at Wide Receiver:** Junior **Scott Boylan** (Bakersfield, CA) has 20 catches for 288 yards and a team high five touchdown receptions. Boylan made five catches vs. Cornell and hauled in a 29 yard TD reception. He had a big day vs. Holy Cross with five receptions for 97 yards, including touchdown catches of eight and 57 yards. He caught two touchdown passes vs. Bryant (four and five yards), had two catches vs. Harvard and three receptions vs. URI, after making 30 catches for 355 yards in 2018.

**Gemmell on Receiving End of Andover Connection:** Junior **Dan Gemmell** (Andover, MA) is a receiving favorite of Bears QB EJ Perry with the duo playing together at Andover High School. His 20 receptions ranks third on the Brown team. He made four catches for 72 yards vs. Cornell and paced the Bears with four receptions for 53 yards vs. Harvard. Gemmell also made three catches for 29 yards vs. Bryant. He had five receptions for 64 yards and a 21-yard TD vs. Princeton.

**Pyne – Second In Brown Tackles:** Bears' senior outside linebacker **Brendan Pyne** (Bradenton, FL) registered eight tackles vs. URI, including five solo stops, and had seven tackles vs. Holy Cross. His 33 trackles rank second on the Brown team and ranks 16th in the Ivy League. Pyne registered five tackles, including one for a loss vs. Cornell. He made four tackles vs. Bryant and five tackles, including one for a loss, vs. Harvard. Pyne led the Ivy League in solo tackles (48) in 2018 and is the Ivy League's returning leader with 8.4 tackles per game. He registered a career-high 14 tackles vs. Columbia and 10 tackles vs. Cornell and Yale.

**Bak On Top:** Junior free safety **Davis Bak** (Tampa, FL) ranks fourth on the Brown team with 26 total tackles, including 13 solo stops. He had a team high 10 tackles vs. Bryant and six tackles vs. Harvard. He ranked seventh on last year's team with 38 tackles overall.

**Pierre – Brown sack Leader:** Senior **Elijah Pierre** (Rockland, MA) has earned a starting role on the inside and responded by leading the Bears with 2.5 quarterback sacks and is second with 4.5 tackles for loss. He made three tackles for loss and a quarterback sack vs. Bryant. Pierre made four tackles, including a QB sack vs. Harvard. He made 13 tackles a year ago.

**Prall Catching On:** Senior **Jakob Prall** (Tipp City, OH) is tied for the team lead with 24 receptions for 345 yards. Prall came up with seven catches for 73 yards and a touchdown vs. Cornell. He caught five passes for a season high 112 yards and a 37-yard touchdown reception vs. Princeton. He hauled in five passes for 111 yards vs. URI and came up with three catches vs. Harvard. He also had four receptions vs. Holy Cross. Prall registered 25 catches for 394 yards and two touchdowns in 2018.

**The Kicking Game:** Senior **Dawson Goepferich** (Holt, MO) returns to the lineup after handling most of the kick-off duties a year ago. Goepferich connected on 5-of-5 extra points and punted once for 41 yards vs. Bryant, and booted a 25-yard field goal vs. Holy Cross. He also connected on a 30-yard field goal vs. Princeton and a 35-yard boot vs. Cornell. Goepferich ranks second in the Ivy League with a 42.0 yards per punt average.

**Logie at Tight End:** Senior tight end **Emerson Logie** (New Canaan, CT) is an integral part of the offense with 17 catches for 177 yards. Logie made four catches vs. Cornell. He excelled vs. URI with five receptions for 87 yards, including a 32-yard reception and made three grabs vs. Holy Cross.

**The Running Game:** After an injury-ridden season in the offensive backfield, the Bears look to capitalize on a talented rushing attack in the new offense. Sophomore **Allen Smith** (Westerville, OH) has run for 324 yards and five touchdowns. Smith rushed for a career high 109 yards vs. Princeton, his first career 100-yard rushing game. He paced the Bears with 80 rushing yards vs. Harvard, including a 22-yard touchdown scamper. Smith had three touchdowns vs. Rhode Island, with TD receptions of five and two yards, and a three yard TD run. He led the Bears in rushing in 2018 with 175 yards, despite missing four games. Senior **Andrew Bolton** (Troy, NY), who ran for 90 yards last season, scored on a two-yard run vs. Holy Cross.

**Head Coach James Perry:** Bears' head coach **James Perry '00** has returned to his alma mater to lead the Brown football program. He's been able to find success throughout his career, posting a 23-7 record as a three-year starter at quarterback at Brown and throwing for an Ivy League record 9,294 career yards. He led the Bears to their first Ivy title in 23 years (1999), while being named the Ivy League Player of the Year and Bulger Lowe Award winner as the outstanding player in New England. He was named the Ivy League's Player of the Week an Ivy record nine times throughout his career. As the quarterbacks coach at Brown, Perry earned an Ivy Championship ring in 2008. He also won Ivy League titles as Off. Coordinator at Princeton in 2013 and 2016. He comes to Brown from Bryant where he was the head coach for two years.

**Hoecht Anchors Defensive Front:** Two-year team captain defensive tackle **Michael Hoecht** (Oakwood, OH) registered 1.5 quarterback sacks vs. URI, while making five tackles overall. Hoecht has six tackles for loss to lead the Brown team, ninth best in the Ivy League, and his 28 tackles overall are third on the Brown team. He made a team high nine tackles vs. Holy Cross, including two for a loss, and had four tackles vs. Princeton. His 15 career sacks are tied with James Develin '10 for fourth place on Brown's all-time list. He registered four tackles and earned a sack vs. Bryant and had three tackles, including two for a loss against Harvard. Hoecht led the Bears with four quarterback sacks in 2018 and his 69 total tackles were third on the Brown team and 10<sup>th</sup> in the Ivy League. Hoecht had 6.5 tackles for loss overall last year.

**Medeiros Leads Bears Defense** Sophomore **Jason Medeiros** (Rehoboth, MA) leads the Brown team with 34 tackles, 12<sup>th</sup> best in the Ivy League. He registered seven tackles vs. Cornell, including two fourth down stops and made eight total hits vs. Holy Cross. Medeiros, who intercepted his second pass of the season vs. Princeton with a 19 yard return, preserved Brown's win over Bryant with an interception at the goal line as time expired, returning it 10 yards before sliding down to end the game. He also had six total tackles against the Bulldogs and added four tackles, including one for a loss vs. Harvard. Medeiros registered 46 tackles in significant field action in 2018.

**Impact Freshmen Make The Grade:** Several Brown freshmen are contributing to this year's squad. DB **Cooper DeVeau** (Foxboro, MA) led the Bears with eight solo tackles against URI and ranks second on the Brown team with 26 total tackles. WR **Hayes Sutton** (Norcross, GA) has 12 receptions for the season, and made a career high five catches for 62 yards vs. URI. Freshman FS **Josh Ofili** (Katy, TX) played a key role in Brown's win over Bryant with four tackles, including two for a loss and a sack. He has 22 tackles on the season. DB **Joseph Shell** (Frederick, MD) has 19 tackles on the season. He had five tackles vs. Cornell and registered seven tackles vs. URI. Shell also had four vs. Princeton and three vs. Holy Cross. LB **Malcolm Brunson** (Plainville, NJ) led the Bears with seven tackles vs. Princeton and has 21 tackles on the season.

**Team Leaders:** Defensive tackle **Michael Hoecht '20** (Oakwood, OH) and offensive lineman **Nick Allsop '20** (North Easton, MA) have been voted team captains. Hoecht is the third player in Brown history to captain the Bears for two seasons, joining **Marcus Fuller '15.5** and **Kyle Newhall-Caballero '12** as two-year captains.

**Bears In The NFL:** Brown has two of its former players on NFL team rosters once again in 2019. Fullback **James Develin '10**, an engineering concentrator and defensive end at Brown, enters his seventh season with the New England Patriots. A Pro Bowl selection in 2017, Develin is the New England Patriots' starting fullback for four of the last five years, including the 2014, 2016 and 2018 Super Bowl Championship teams. **Zak DeOssie '07** is a two-time Pro Bowl selection and two-time Super Bowl Champion (2007, 2011) for the New York Giants. Coming into the 2019 season, DeOssie is the 2nd-longest tenured Giants player, behind Eli Manning.

**ESPN+ Broadcast Talent:** Calling Brown's five home games on ESPN+ are former ESPN, ABC and NBC Sports broadcaster **Allen Bestwick**, who will call the play, and ABC6 Sports Anchor **Nick Coit**, who will provide the analysis.

**Game 1: Brown at Bryant****Saturday, September 21, 2019****Smithfield, R.I.**

The James Perry era opened the 2019 season with an offensive explosion as Brown earned a 35-30 win over Bryant behind junior quarterback EJ Perry's five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) and 410 yards of total offense on a hot and humid day at Beirne Stadium.

The heart-stopping game ended when Bears' sophomore linebacker Jason Medeiros intercepted a Bryant pass at the goal line to preserve the five-point victory on the final play of the game.

Perry also made his Brown debut at quarterback and the BC transfer didn't disappoint. Perry passed for 183 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another 227 yards and two touchdowns, including a 94-yard touchdown run, the second longest rushing play in Brown football history. His 227 rushing yards are the eighth most in the Brown record book and most ever for a Brown quarterback.

On the receiving end, senior Demetri Jackson was Perry's favorite target, hauling in eight passes for 76 yards and a four-yard touchdown. Junior Scott Boylan caught three passes, including touchdown grabs of four and six yards, while senior LJ Harriott and junior Dan Gemmell caught three passes each.

Defensively, senior Elijah Pierre had three tackles for a loss of nine yards, including a quarterback sack. Junior Davis Bak paced the Bears' defense with 10 tackles, while sophomore safety Clayton Perrin had eight tackles, including five solo stops.

Bryant quarterback Kory Curtis, an Ohio State transfer, passed for 404 yards and two touchdowns, completing 35-of-55 passes.

The Bulldogs got on the scoreboard first with a field goal on their first possession for an early 3-0 lead.

The Bears answered with 27 seconds left in the quarter when Perry threw his first career Brown touchdown, a four-yard touchdown throw to Boylan to give the Bears a 7-3 advantage.

Bryant pulled ahead, 10-7, when Curtis connected on a nine yard scoring strike to Hunter Hill with 6:41 left in the half.

Perry gave Brown the lead at halftime, 14-10, when he scored on a one-yard run with 40 seconds left in the second quarter.

Jackson got into the scoring column when he hauled in a four-yard touchdown pass from Perry on Brown's opening possession of the second half, giving the Bears a 21-10 advantage.

The Bulldogs got back in the game on their first series of the half, with Isaac McCray scoring on a six-yard run to trail, 21-17, with 3:58 left in the third quarter.

Curtis' two-yard touchdown run gave the Bulldogs their first lead since the opening quarter, 24-21, with 12:58 left in the game.

Perry put the Bears back on top, 28-24, on his third touchdown toss of the day, this time a six-yard strike to Boylan at the 9:49 mark of the fourth quarter.

The Bears' junior quarterback then exploded for a 94-yard touchdown run to seemingly put the game out of reach, 35-24. Only Mark Kachmer's 95-yard run vs. Yale at the Yale Bowl in 2011 is longer than Perry's 94-yard TD scamper.

Bryant made it interesting at the end with Curtis throwing a 26-yard touchdown pass to Hill with 3:17 remaining and driving the Bulldogs down to the Bears' 14 yard line with two final throws into the end zone.

**Game 2: Brown at Harvard****Friday, September 27, 2019****Boston, MA**

Brown started out strong with an early 7-0 lead, but Harvard came storming back with 42 unanswered points on its way to a 42-7 win over the Bears in an Ivy League game Friday evening before a crowd of 10,088 at Harvard Stadium.

"Hats off to Harvard, who is a terrific football team," said Brown head coach James Perry. "We practice and play hard, but, other than the first series, didn't run the ball well. We tried running in critical moments that didn't work. We'll get better."

Bears sophomore tailback Allen Smith rushed for 80 yards, including a 22-yard touchdown run. Junior quarterback EJ Perry had little time to throw all day and completed 17-of-27 passes for 162 yards. Junior Dan Gemmell paced the Brown wide receivers with four catches for 52 yards, while seniors Jakob Prall and Livingstone Harriott made three catches each.

Junior defensive end Ryan Putman intercepted a pass and registered three tackles overall. Junior Elijah Pierre registered four tackles and had a quarterback sack, while senior Michael Hoecht had two tackles for a loss.

Lightning struck early for the Bears when Smith accounted for all the yardage in Brown's opening 75-yard drive, first on a 53-yard run and then 22 more yards into the end zone for a touchdown to lift the Bears to a 7-0 advantage.

Harvard answered late in the opening quarter to tie the game, 7-7, on a 12-yard pass play from Jake Smith to Cody Chrest. The Crimson scored twice more before the end of the half to grab a 21-7 lead at halftime.

After Harvard opened the half with an 89-yard scoring drive and scored first in the fourth quarter for a 35-7 advantage. A late fourth quarter Crimson score accounted for the final score.

**Game 3: URI at Brown      Governor's Cup      Saturday, October 5, 2019      Providence, R.I.**

Brown battled back from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to take a four-point lead midway through the quarter, but Rhode Island scored a late touchdown to earn its first win of the season, 31-28, in the 104<sup>th</sup> Governor's Cup game at Brown Stadium.

Bears' junior quarterback EJ Perry threw for 420 yards and ran for another 92 yards, accounting for 512 yards of total offense, the second highest total in Brown football history. He completed 32-of-52 passes, including touchdown passes of five, 25 and two yards.

Sophomore tailback Allen Smith accounted for three touchdowns - one on the ground and two receiving. Senior Jakob Prall made some big plays, making five catches for 111 yards, while senior Emerson Logie made five receptions for 87 yards. Freshman Hayes Sutton caught five passes for 62 yards, while senior Demitri Jackson pulled in four passes.

Defensively freshman Cooper DeVeau and senior Brendan Pyne made eight tackles each. Senior Michael Hoecht had five tackles and 1.5 quarterback sacks and now has 15 career sacks, tied for fourth place on Brown's all-time list with James Develin '10, now with the New England Patriots.

"That was an incredible game," said Brown head coach James Perry. "We practiced well all week and knew the game would come down to the last seconds. If we can maintain that effort we'll be a really good team. We played hard and aggressively, and it's a good reflection of where we are as program."

Rhode Island quarterback Vito Priore had a big day for the Rams, completing 31-of-44 passes for 389 yards and three touchdowns. Isaiah Coulter registered 12 catches for 172 yards and a touchdown, while Aaron Parker had seven receptions for 94 yards and two touchdowns.

Brown struck first, driving 61 yards in eight plays with Perry connecting on a five-yard touchdown pass to Smith, giving the Bears a 7-0 lead with 9:53 left in the opening quarter. Perry connected on 5-of-6 passes on the drive, including a 32-yard shuffle pass to Logie.

The Rams tied the game, 7-7, when Priore tossed an 18-yard touchdown pass to Coulter with 3:48 left in the quarter. Priore connected on a nine-yard scoring pass to Parker on the Rams' first possession of the second quarter to lift Rhode Island to a 14-7 advantage.

Perry's second touchdown pass went to Spencer Hemmingway, a 25-yard strike in the back of the end zone, to tie the game, 14-14, with 3:14 left in the half.

A late Rams' field goal, a 34-yard boot by C.J. Carrick, gave URI a 17-14 lead at intermission.

Rhode Island extended its lead to 24-14 early in the third quarter on a seven-yard run by Zoe Bryant.

Smith got the Bears back in the game with a three-yard touchdown run by Smith on the second play of the fourth quarter to trail 24-21. The three-yard touchdown run capped an 81-yard scoring drive with the big play a 46-yard pass play from Perry to Prall.

Brown grabbed a 27-24 lead on another 81-yard drive with Perry tossing a two-yard touchdown pass to Smith with 8:20 remaining in the game.

Rhode Island went back up by three points, 31-28, on a 63-yard drive with Priore tossing a 14-yard touchdown pass to Parker with 5:43 left on the clock.

**Game 4: Holy Cross at Brown****Saturday, October 12, 2019****Providence, R.I.**

Two high scoring offensive teams got together at Brown Stadium Saturday afternoon with Holy Cross (3-3) coming out on top of a 47-31 decision over Brown (1-3) in the Bears' final non-league game of the season.

"This was a hard fought game against a good Holy Cross team playing at a high level," said Brown head coach James Perry. "We had a lot of missed opportunities, and turned the ball over too many times. I expect a good week of practice and look forward to getting back to Ivy play next week."

Bears' junior quarterback EJ Perry threw for 237 yards and rushed for another 47 yards, completing 25-of-49 throws. He connected on touchdown passes of eight and 57 yards, both to junior wide receiver Scott Boylan who finished with five receptions for 97 yards. Seniors Jakob Prall and Demetri Jackson caught four passes each.

Brown sophomore Allen Smith scored a one-yard touchdown run and rushed for 45 yards overall, while senior Andrew Bolton scored on a two-yard run, rushing for 18 yards overall.

Senior tackle Michael Hoecht paced the Bears' defense with nine tackles, including eight solo stops and two tackles for loss. Junior Izayah Powell, making his first appearance of the season, and sophomore Jason Medeiros chipped in with eight tackles each.

For the Crusaders, quarterback Connor Degenhardt threw for 315 yards and four touchdowns, completing 20-of-33 passes. Crusaders wide receiver Spencer Gilliam caught 10 passes for 128 yards and two touchdowns.

Holy Cross capitalized on an early Brown turnover, taking a 7-0 lead on a 21-yard run by Domenik Cozier at the 11:49 mark.

Smith's one-yard touchdown came on the heels of a 25-yard run by Perry to even the score, 7-7, with 8:35 left in the opening quarter. Holy Cross kicker Derek Ng booted field goals of 34 and 25 yards to put the Crusaders up, 13-7, after one quarter.

Bolton responded by plowing into the end zone from two yards out to lift Brown to a 14-13 advantage with 12:45 left in the half, Brown's last lead of the game.

Consecutive touchdown catches by the combo of Ayir Asante from Degenhardt, the first a 69 yard grab and the second a five yard catch, lifted Holy Cross to a 27-14 advantage.

Brown senior Dawson Goepferich booted a 25-yard field goal on the last play of the half to trail, 27-17, at intermission.

Holy Cross scored on its first possession of the second half for a 34-17 lead, with Degenhardt tossing four-yard scoring strike to Gilliam.

The wide-open shootout continued when the Bears drove 74 yards on nine plays, with Boylan pulling down an eight-yard touchdown reception to trail 34-24.

The Crusaders relentless rushing attack continued with Peter Oliver scoring on a two-yard run up the middle for a 41-24 Holy Cross lead with 11:49 remaining in the game. Oliver finished with a game high 88 yards.

A 57-yard scoring strike from Perry to Boylan with 10:51 left to play got the Bears back in the game, trailing 41-31.

Degenhardt and Gilliam combined for a 72-yard pass play for a 47-31 Holy Cross advantage with nine minutes left to account for the final score.

**Game 5: Princeton at Brown****Saturday, October 19, 2019****Providence, R.I.**

Princeton quarterback Kevin Davidson threw five touchdowns to lead the Tigers to a record-setting 65-22 Ivy League win over Brown at Brown Stadium Saturday afternoon.

A wide open first half had the two teams combine for 70 points with Princeton holding a 51-19 lead at intermission.

"Princeton is a really good team, who played well today," said Brown head coach James Perry. "We've made great strides as a program. The lessons we learned today will turn into success down the road. Today's score is not indicative of the progress our program has made."

Bears quarterback EJ Perry completed 21-of-42 passes for 296 yards, throwing touchdown passes of 37 and 21 yards. Sophomore tailback Allen Smith ran for a season high 109 yards on 15 carries and two touchdowns, putting together his first career 100-yard rushing game.

Senior wide receiver Jakob Prall had a big day with five catches for 112 yards and a touchdown, while senior Dan Gemmell made five receptions for 64 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, sophomore Jason Medeiros intercepted his second pass of the season for the Bears. Freshman Malcolm Brunson registered a team high seven tackles, including five solo stops. Freshman Harrison Ochs also made five solo tackles.

Davidson completed 27-of-37 passes for 379 yards and five touchdowns. The Bears defense had few answers for Tigers' wide receiver Jacob Birmelin, who had 12 catches for 186 yards and two touchdowns.

The Tigers accumulated 634 yards of total offense, while Brown had 400 total yards.

Brown drove 75 yards for a touchdown on the first series of the game with Perry tossing a 37-yard scoring strike to Prall to lift the Bears to an early 6-0 lead. Perry connected on 5-of-7 passes for 71 yards in the series.

Princeton answered on its first series, with Tavish Rice booting a 24-yard field goal to trail 6-3, with 9:27 left in the opening quarter.

Two quick Princeton touchdowns, the second with 2:00 left in the first quarter, lifted the Tigers to a 17-6 lead.

Undeterred, Brown scored on the opening play of the second quarter, a one-yard touchdown by Smith to trail 17-12. Following a Medeiros interception, Brown stalled at the Tigers' four yard line.

Princeton quickly responded with two more touchdowns for a 31-12 advantage.

Perry tossed a 21-yard touchdown pass to Gemmell to get the Bears back in the game with 6:48 left in the half to trail, 31-19.

The Tigers kept up the offensive pressure with two additional scores for a 51-19 lead at the half.

The relentless Princeton squad came out in the second half and scored on its first possession, a 39-yard pass play from Davidson to Dylan Classi for a 58-19 advantage.

Dawson Goepferich booted a 30-yard field goal with 8:17 remaining in the quarter to trail 58-22.

Davidson's fifth TD pass, a fourth quarter 40-yard strike to Zach Kelly, accounted for the final score.

**Game 6: Brown at Cornell****Saturday, October 26, 2019****Ithaca, N.Y.**

Nickolas Null booted a 41-yard field goal with nine seconds remaining to lift Cornell to a 37-35 come-from-behind win over Brown in an Ivy League game at Schoellkopf Field.

The high-scoring game had the two teams combine for 991 total yards, with the Bears accounting for 521 yards and Cornell 470 total yards.

Bears' quarterback EJ Perry accounted for 463 yards of total offense, passing for 372 yards and running for another 91 yards. He completed 32-of-48 passes and threw touchdown passes of 29, five and nine yards. His 463 total yards rank sixth in Brown history.

Senior wide receiver Jakob Prall made seven catches for 73 yards and a touchdown, while senior Demetri Jackson also had seven receptions for 67 yards and a touchdown. Junior wide receiver Scott Boylan had a touchdown to go with his five catches for 89 yards.

Sophomore linebacker Jason Medeiros paced the Bears defense with nine tackles, while Josh Ofili had five solo tackles and senior Brendan Pyne had five total tackles, including one for a loss. Junior defensive end Jarred Daul made two tackles for loss.

Big Red quarterback Richie Kenney threw for 332 yards and a touchdown, completing 23-of-35 passes. SK Howard rushed for a game high 121 yards and two touchdowns on 21 carries.

Cornell opened the scoring with a 38-yard field goal by Null on the opening possession of the game for a 3-0 lead.

Brown took the lead when Perry connected on a 29-yard touchdown pass to Boylan in the back of the end zone with 6:27 remaining in the opening quarter. The two-point conversion failed, keeping the score 6-3.

Null's second field goal of the game, this time a 29-yard boot, tied the game, 6-6 late in the first quarter.

Cornell regained the lead, 13-6, on a 12-yard touchdown pass from Kenney to John Fitzgerald at the 9:21 mark of the second quarter.

Perry attempted a pooch punt near midfield, but the kick was blocked by the Big Red, picked up by Cornell's Howard, who ran 46-yards for a touchdown and a 20-6 Big Red lead.

The Bears needed a lift and got one in the form of a 98-yard touchdown drive late in the half. Taking over at its own two-yard line, Perry drove the Bears 98-yards in 10 plays, capped off with a three-yard scoring pass to Prall with four seconds remaining in the half to trail 20-12.

At the outset of the second half, Brown inched closer, 20-18, with a 75-yard scoring drive, capped off by a one-yard touchdown run by freshman Omari Garry on his first collegiate run from scrimmage. The big play in the drive was a 33-yard pass play from Perry to freshman Wes Rockett.

Cornell answered immediately with a 75-yard drive of its own with Howard running into the end zone from seven yards out for a 27-18 Big Red advantage.

Undaunted, Brown drove 75-yards once again to pull to within two points, 27-25, on a one-yard touchdown run by sophomore Allen Smith with 4:35 left in the second quarter. The wide open third quarter continued with Cornell's Howard scoring on a 40-yard run with five seconds left in the quarter for a 34-25 lead.

The Bears drew to within two points, 34-32, when Perry connected on a nine yard touchdown pass to Jackson with 6:58 left in the game. Bears' senior kicker Dawson Goepferich kicked the go-ahead field goal, a 35-yard boot, with 4:17 remaining, giving Brown a 35-34 advantage.
