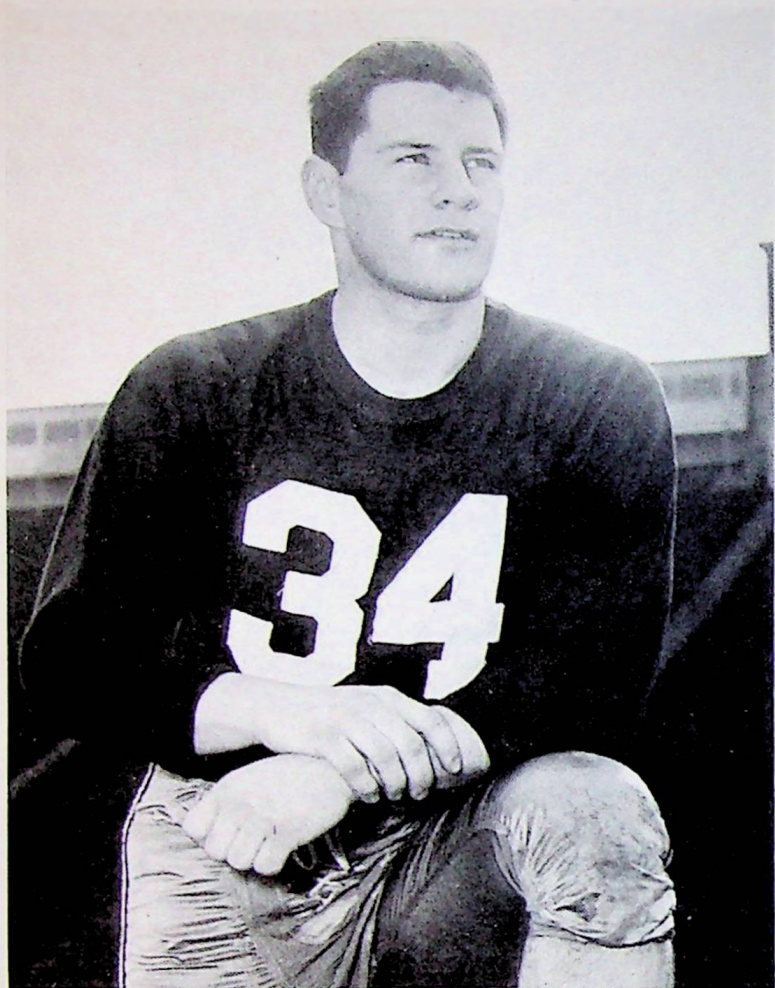
## THE PRESS BOX

## *Coach Al Kelley Says . .*

"It is always difficult for a coach of football to predict in April what he might expect to take place in October, if only for the reason that he is dealing with the frailty of human beings. Of recent years the problem has taken on new and increasingly more complex considerations. Foremost, of course, is the compounded effect of the new substitution rule without spring practice.

"In running head-on into these restrictive rulings, the recovery of Brown football is in for another 'slowdown.'

"Brown men are hoping that the '53 team will make a definite move for higher recognition, but fail to appreciate the impact of the new substitution rule upon a small squad endowed with few players of known two-way ability.

"Among our returning lettermen I can see at best only ten or eleven boys seemingly capable of the two-way game.

"While it is reassuring to remember our undefeated Frosh, I cannot help but recall my dilemma with last fall's inexperienced Sophomores laboring without benefit of spring practice. That was two platoon football, too. I remember back to my playing days when only an occasional sophomore broke the old two-way line-ups.

"Our success next fall hinges first, upon what real quality is found among that small nucleus of potential two-way lettermen and second, the replacement depth available from the Frosh ranks. Our greatest hope is improvement over our '52 record."

## THUMBNAIL SKETCHES OF THE RETURNING LETTERMEN

**RONNIE ABDOW, End** — Ron is in his third season as a Bruin varsity end and has been a letter winner for the past two seasons. A resident of Worcester, Massachusetts, he played football for Worcester Academy before he enrolled at Brown. He probably will work from the right side of the line again this season.

**CHARLIE BROWN, Center** — Charlie backed up the line for the most of last season and probably was the biggest surprise of the year. He was outstanding in the Princeton game and on the strength of his performance during the latter part of last season, he has earned the pre-season spot of Brown's first-string center. A one-time resident of Waban, he now lives in Wellesley, Massachusetts.

**DON COTTEY, Quarterback** — Don is at his best when he is playing the defensive safety position. An All-Ivy selection two years ago, he couldn't quite reach that peak last season because of a heavy academic schedule. Last season he also saw some service as a quarterback. A letter winner for the past two seasons, he is a pre-dental student. He makes his home in Sandusky, Ohio.

**JIM COUKOS, Guard** — Jim saw a good deal of duty as Maurie Matteodo's stand-in last season, and while he was considered an offensive player, he has the ability to go both ways. An all-around athlete, he also was a member of the Brown baseball squad. A resident of Lynn, Massachusetts, he attended New York Military Academy before he matriculated at Brown.

**JIM FUNCK, End** — Jim came out for the varsity mid-way in September last fall and developed into a first-string end before the middle of the season. A varsity letter winner last season, he is eligible for two more years of football. He is a native of Camp Hill, Pennsylvania.

**JIM GORHAM, Halfback** — Jim has been a member of the Bruin varsity for the past two seasons. With the advent of the new substitution rule, he probably will be limited to brief service during his senior year, since most of his previous action was spent at a defensive halfback berth. A one-time high school quarterback, he is the possessor of two varsity letters. His home is in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

**GERRY HAVERTY, Fullback** — Captain of the 1953 team, Gerry has been a member of the Brown backfield for the past two seasons. Versatile in his movement, he plays either at fullback or at one of the halfback positions. He is capable of playing both ways and is the leading candidate for the fullback berth this fall. He makes his home in West Hartford, Connecticut.

**CHUCK HAYES, Linebacker** — Chuck has played varsity football for Brown for the past two seasons. A letter winner last season, he saw most of his service as a linebacker. Because he is a specialist, he probably will see limited duty backing up the line this fall. A graduate of the Harvard School in Chicago, he calls the Windy City his home town.

**BRUCE HUNT, Guard** — Bruce was a linebacker for the most of last season, but now that he must go both ways, he will see considerable service offensively as a guard. A letter winner last season, he has been up with the varsity for two years. A resident of Bridgewater, Massachusetts, he attended that town's high school before he came to Brown.

**CHUCK JUDKINS, Linebacker** — Chuck is one of four Worcester, Massachusetts, athletes aspiring to a varsity berth this fall. A member of the football team for the past two seasons, he won his letter as a linebacker last season. He can double as a center, however, and might fill in at that position this fall. He has also played basketball at Brown and two years ago won a varsity letter for his participation in that sport.

**SANDY KESSARIS, Halfback** — An outside runner, Sandy couldn't break loose during the early going last fall. But once the line began to hold for him, he salvaged enough yardage to make several All-New elevens. One of the best liked members of the team, he should experience his best season this fall. A varsity letter winner for two seasons, he was Brown's leading ground gainer in 1951. The only married player on the squad, he makes his home in Beverly, Massachusetts.

**PETE KOHUT, Quarterback** — It took Pete most of last season to find himself, but once established, he performed extremely well for a sophomore quarterback. He played his best game against Harvard and connected on eight of eleven passes, three of which went for touchdowns. Pete lists Ambridge, Pennsylvania, as his home town.

**EV PEARSON, Halfback** — Ev started out as a defensive back last season, but before the end of the campaign, he had become Brown's best offensive threat. Averaging 4.6 yards per carry, he was the team's leading ground gainer. Only a junior, he should have little difficulty maintaining his position as a first-string halfback. He lives in nearby Pawtucket.

**FRED PENDLETON, Placement Kicker** — Tabbed "Fred the Pendulum" by the local scribes, Fred Pendleton of Harrisville, R. I. has been kicking points after touchdowns for the Bruins for the past two seasons. The possessor of an educated toe, the Brown kicker made good on eleven of thirteen tries last season, while the year before, he connected on sixteen of eighteen attempts.

**LEVI THOMAS, Fullback** — Levi was sidelined for all of his sophomore year with a broken ankle. Last year, however, he was back in action and before the end of the season had earned the starting assignment at fullback. He is a leading contender for that position again this season. His home is in West Orange, New Jersey.

**IRV VALKYS, Tackle** — Irv played both ways as a tackle last season, his first year up with the varsity. A native of Palisades Park, New Jersey, he got his start in football at Leonia High School. A letter winner last season, he still has two years of eligibility.

## THUMBNAIL SKETCHES OF THE 1952 FRESHMAN AND OTHERS EXPECTED TO PLAY WITH THE VARSITY IN 1953

**JIM McGUINNESS, Tackle** — Co-captain of the freshman club last fall, Jim probably was the team's best lineman. He has a fine build for a tackle and no doubt will break into the varsity lineup before the end of the season. He is a resident of Rumson, New Jersey.

**JOHN O'BRIEN, Tackle** — Coach Al Kelley expects to convert this one-time center into a tackle. An outstanding linebacker and a top-notch blocker, John centered Cheshire's undefeated team of three seasons ago. He played freshman football two years ago but did not play with the varsity last season. He lives in nearby Rockland, Massachusetts.

**MIKE REILLY, Center** — Two years ago, Mike was considered an outstanding prospect for a varsity berth. Out of action last season, he will have to go all out to match the strides of Charlie Brown, who now holds the number one rating. A resident of Yonkers, New York, he is a graduate of Gorton High School.

**JIMMY SMITH, Guard** — Out of action last season, Jimmy was an outstanding member of Brown's freshman team of two seasons ago and is considered a likely candidate for a varsity berth this fall. A native of Johnston, Pennsylvania, he played football for four seasons at Ferndale High School and captained the team in his senior year.

**TOMMY THOMPSON, Halfback** — Called "the Zipper" by his teammates, Tommy Thompson was the leading scorer on last season's undefeated freshman eleven. His initials, "T. D.," are an indication of his output last season, for he certainly was the production king when it came to scoring touchdowns. He accounted for fourteen of the freshman team's twenty-one touchdowns. A versatile athlete, he also is an exceptional hockey player. He makes his home in Newton, Massachusetts.

**ARCHIE WILLIAMS, Halfback** — Archie played both ways for Brown's freshman team last fall and should have little trouble moving up to the varsity. He has plenty of speed for an offensive player and is a capable defensive back. An all-around athlete, he also was a member of the Brown freshman basketball and baseball teams. He comes from Springfield, Massachusetts.

## *The Brown Coaching Staff*

ALVA E. KELLEY, *Head Coach*—  
In his third season as director of Brown's football fortunes. Al Kelley should experience his best year as a head coach. That statement should be qualified with, "barring the unforeseen."

Hampered by the lack of adequate reserves the past two seasons, Kelley was forced to utilize what he had in the way of material to the best advantage. He succeeded in upsetting Yale his first season as head coach and last year brightened what had appeared to be Brown's poorest year in football with an unprecedented win over Harvard.

Now that he has some material, he must face the new substitution rule. But it must be a source of personal pleasure with him to know that he can hold scrimmages this season without worrying whether or not he will be able to field a team for the Saturday game.

A native of Natrona Heights, Pa., Kelley is a graduate of Cornell with the Class of 1911. An end for three seasons with the Big Red, he was named to the Associated Press All-Eastern team in 1939 and the following year received honorable mention on several All-American elevens.

As an undergraduate, the Brown coach not only was skilled as an athlete, but as a scholar as well. An honor graduate of Cornell's School of Mechanical Engineering, he was elected to Tau Beta Pi, the engineering honorary fraternity, his junior year.

After graduating from Cornell, he entered the U. S. Army and for the next five years served as an officer in the Ordnance Department. It was during his last year in the Army that he started out on his coaching career. In addition to his Army duties at Watervliet Arsenal, he was allowed to coach the football team at LaSalle Military Academy at nearby Troy.

Kelley returned to his Alma Mater following his discharge from the service and for the next four seasons served as end coach. He left Ithaca in the spring of 1950 to accept the position of line coach at Yale and a year later came to Brown.

## ASSISTANTS

**J. ROBERT PFLUG, Line Coach**—Bob Pflug came to Brown following a distinguished high school coaching career at Bradford, Pa. A graduate of Grove City College in 1928, he spent 19 years at Bradford High School as a teacher-coach and had seven undefeated and untied football teams. Prior to coaching at Bradford, he spent four years as head coach at Knox (Pa.) High School. His high school teams compiled a record of 125 wins, 30 losses, and 5 ties over a twenty-three year span. He has directed the Brown linemen for the past two seasons.

**VICTOR H. FUSIA, Backfield Coach**—Vic Fusia is in his third season as backfield coach. One of Manhattan's outstanding backs during the middle thirties, he also was a member of the school's track, basketball, and boxing squads. In football he was an All-American mention in 1936 and in 1937 was selected to the All-East team. Following his graduation, he was a member of an American football team that toured France. He was in the United States Navy for four years during World War II and was discharged with the rank of Lieutenant. After his release from the service, he coached at Rankin (Pa.) High School and later was the coach of Indiana High School.

**MATTHEW J. BOLGER, JR., End Coach**—Matt Bolger is expected to return to the varsity staff as end coach this season, although at this writing no one has been named to replace him as freshman coach. Bolger took over the freshman reins last fall and directed the team to an undefeated season. He served as end coach his first year at Brown. A one time end at Notre Dame and Cornell, he is a graduate of the latter institution with the Class of 1948. During the war he served as a pilot with the Marine Air Corps and for a time played football with the Iowa Pre-Flight team. Before coming to Brown he coached the line at St. Benedict's Prep and later held a similar position at Upsala.

**ALEX NAHIGIAN**—The only holdover from the staffs of Rip Engle and Gus Zitrides, Alex Nahigian is expected to return to his duties as coach of the junior varsity team. Since Brown did not have the personnel for a JV team the past two seasons, Nahigian taught the varsity backs defensive football. Well respected for his coaching ability, he is a graduate of Holy Cross, where he played football until an injury sidelined him his sophomore year. However, he continued to star in athletics although he no longer could play football. An outfielder on the Crusader baseball team for three seasons, he captained the team his senior year.

## A HISTORY OF BROWN UNIVERSITY

Brown University was founded in 1761 in Warren, Rhode Island. Then known as Rhode Island College, it was the seventh college in America and the third in New England. In 1770 the institution was moved to Providence, and University Hall was built on College Hill, now the historic residential section of the city.

During the Revolutionary War the College was closed, and University Hall was used as a barracks and hospital for American and French troops. In 1790 President George Washington visited the College, received an honorary degree, spoke in an assembly, and in the evening, with Thomas Jefferson and other members of his party, viewed the illumination of University Hall from the College Green.

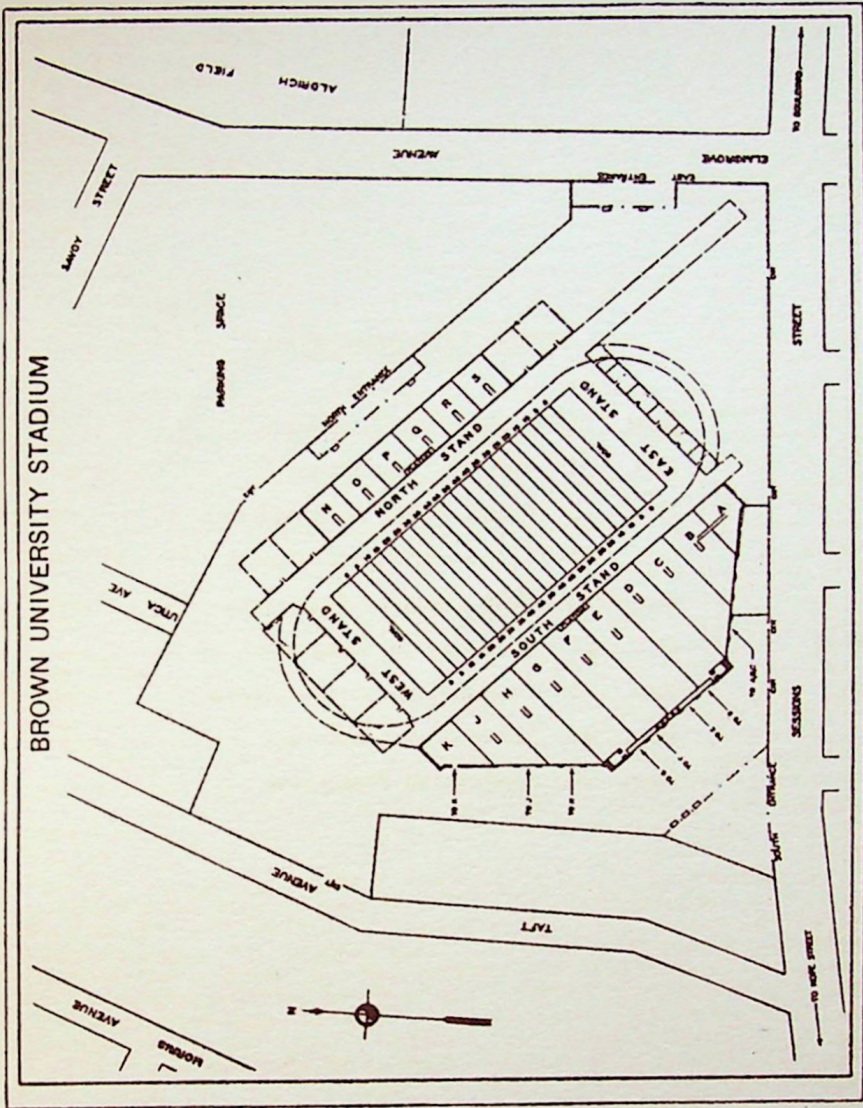
In 1801 Nicholas Brown, of the Class of 1786, made a substantial gift to the College in recognition of which its name was changed to Brown University. As a result of his generosity Hope College (1882), a dormitory, and Manning Hall (1835), originally library and chapel (now a lecture hall), were built.

Through the remainder of the nineteenth century Rhode Island Hall (now geology and philosophy), Rogers Hall (now classrooms), Slater Hall (a dormitory), Wilson Hall (mathematics and physics), Sayles Hall (chapel and classrooms) and several other buildings were added to the campus. During this period, under the leadership of such outstanding presidents as Francis Wayland and E. E. Benjamin Andrews, the College enrollment grew from less than 100 to more than 700. Pembroke College, the undergraduate college for women, was doubled, and the material resources of the University were multiplied many times.

Since 1900 the remainder of the buildings have been built, including, notably, the John Carter Brown Library (world famous collection of early Americana), Faunce House (the student union, for which funds were generously provided by John D. Rockefeller, Jr., of the Class of 1897), the Metcalf Chemical Laboratories, the John Hay Library (approximately 700,000 volumes, named for John Hay, of the Class of 1858, secretary to Abraham Lincoln and later Secretary of State), the Stadium and Marvel Gymnasium, and Hegeman, Caswell, Littlefield Maxey and Brunonian Halls (dormitories). Although graduate degrees had been awarded since 1887, the Graduate School was formally established in 1927, and by 1941, in spite of constantly more selective entrance requirements, the undergraduate men's enrollment had increased to 1400.

The physical facilities of the University have been considerably expanded under the guidance of Dr. Henry M. Wriston, president since 1937. A Housing and Development Campaign realized some \$10,000,000 to be spent on new buildings. Whitehall, a modern classroom building, was erected in 1946 and Andrews Hall, a Pembroke dormitory, was ready for occupancy in 1947. The biggest development of all was the residential quadrangle dedicated this past June. With accommodations for 877 men, the quadrangle, including the refectory capable of feeding over 2,000 at one sitting, occupies a two-block area south of the main campus. It is expected that the enrollment of undergraduate men will continue to be in the vicinity of 2,000.
