We ask that tickets and working space be requested as far in advance as possible, as there is limited space in our press box and we desire to serve each and every one of you to the very best of our ability.

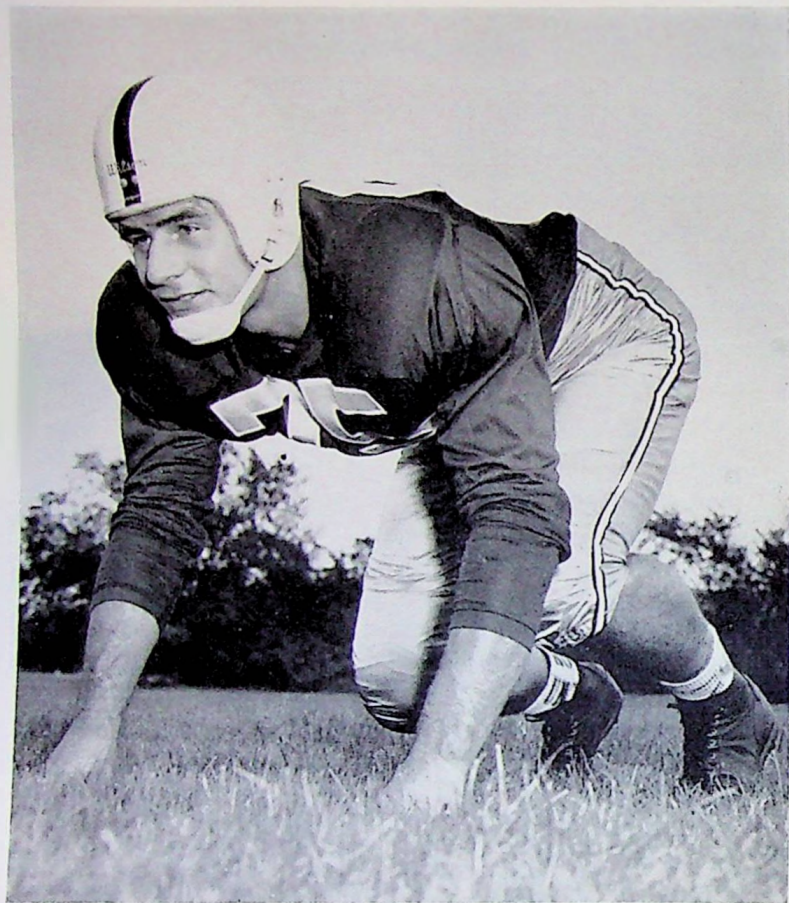
Direct wire and radio set-ups should be requested at least a week prior to the game.

A Word From Coach Al Kelley..

"The 1955 season offers a real and interesting challenge to Brown football. With Captain Jim McGuinness the only returning regular we face problems of great magnitude at all positions except tackle and halfback. An almost complete void of experience in most positions present considerations that are of difficult and perplexing proportion. A vast rebuilding program is in order and it is with eagerness that we look forward to the job ahead.

"The 1955 team will be built, of course, on a sophomore foundation. The line will be fitted to All-Ivy tackle McGuinness; the backfield keyed to Archie Williams, a fine halfback reserve last season. The quarterback responsibility so ably filled the past three seasons by Pete Kohut, will fall to one of three senior reserves.

"The end squad, which was completely decimated by the loss of Josephson, Bianowicz and Bartuska (a rugged and effective trio last season) is bolstered by the conversion of tackle Richard Borjeson. Sophomores Fran Carullo and Jack Kleiderlein may well be serious contenders.

"The tackle slot is our strongest position. In addition to lettermen McGuinness and Jim Cerasoli, sophomore candidates Gil Robertshaw, Jim Mello and Dick Riley will furnish adequate and comfortable depth. The guard and center positions will be completely rebuilt.

"Our T formation backfield is pretty well set at the halfback slots where lettermen Archie Williams, Don Thompson and Bill Cronin return. Sophomores Joe Mituski and Jon Jensen will add depth. The fullback position, vacated by All-Ivy Vin Jazwinski, is strictly up for grabs as is the all-senior battle for the quarterback slot.

"The coming season should see an Ivy League featuring fiercely competitive and highly interesting football. The League on a whole will be up and it is my earnest hope that the Brown Bear will have something to say about the new champion."

THUMBNAIL SKETCHES OF RETURNING LETTERMEN

BALOGH, DOMENIC, Quarterback — Although overshadowed during the past two years by Pete Kohut's brilliant generalship, Dom is a tested and capable performer. Last year he completed sixteen out of twenty-two passes for a net gain of 265 yards. His completion percentage of 55% was the best of the quarterback squad. His accuracy will keep the opposing defenses loose and should provide a foil for the running of Williams and Thompson. Nine

BENCE, RICHARD, End — As a sophomore last year Dick saw limited service in five games. Although the Cornwall, New York end is the highest in his group (165 lbs.), his speed and pass-catching ability will make him a strong contender for a starting berth.

BORJESON, RICHARD, End — The third Borjeson in six years at Brown started out in the family tradition as a tackle. Last year Al Kelley shifted Dick over to end. A six foot junior weighing 190 lbs., he should play a lot of football this fall.

CAROLAN, RICHARD, Center — With the center spot left wide open by the graduation of Mike Reilly and Charlie Brown, Dick should play a lot of football for Brown this season. As the pivotman on the freshman team last year he alternated with Ed Fletcher. His high school coach at Brookline High School was Harry Downes, one of Boston College's all-time centers.

CERASOLI, JAMES, Tackle — Jim spelled John O'Brien at left tackle last season and gained valuable experience. His speed and reactions fit him well for Bob Pflug's "pursuit" type of line play. Standing 5' 10" and packing a solid 195 lbs., he will be a strong anchor in the Bruin line. He played high school football in Clairton, Penna.

CREWS, RICHARD, Guard — One of the three members of the guard squad from Pennsylvania, Dick played for Abington High School before coming to Brown. Last year he had little opportunity to see service because of a veteran line. As a junior he will be battling for the left guard spot along with Larry Kalesnik.

CRONIN, WILLIAM, Halfback — Bill is the only three sports man on the squad. The Newton, Massachusetts product is captain of the 1956 Bruin baseball team and is a fast-skating wing on the hockey team. His versatility extends to football also for he played both ~~Fullback and quarter~~ ~~back~~ last year. Because of several backfield injuries early last season, Bill played nearly the entire game in the thrill packed 24-26 Ivy League game in the Yale Bowl. Fullback + half-back

FRAZIER, RUSSELL, End — A 6' 2", 190 lb. junior from Yonkers, New York, Jim has been given the nod by Coach Kelley for an early season starting assignment at right end. Although he played only a total of twenty-three minutes in five games last year, he caught the eye of end coach, Matt Bolger, who regards the former Gerion High School player as a fine prospect.

FUSCO, RICHARD, Center — Dick's experience last year was largely restricted to Junior Varsity activity. This season he may well make the long jump to the position of starting center. He is 5' 9" and weighs 185 lbs. He played high school football in his home town of Aliquippa, Pennsylvania.

KALESNIK, LAWRENCE, Guard — Co-captain of the freshman team and an outstanding guard on a superior freshman line last season, Larry should break into the lineup frequently this fall. He played on the Williston Academy eleven in 1953 and makes his home in Springfield, Massachusetts.

LOHR, JAMES, Guard — Jim, a 6', 190 lb. center from Somerset, Pennsylvania has won his varsity letter for two years. His experience should prove a definite asset and stabilizing influence to the younger and greener members of the line squad.

McGUINNESS, JAMES, Tackle — Captain of the 1955 Brown eleven, Jim last season was a bulwark of an unusually strong line. An outstanding student, he was selected on the All Ivy League Academic Football Team last December. A fine leader and a capable performer he will supply the experience in an otherwise untested line. He played football before coming to town at Rumson High School in New Jersey.

MINNERLY, ROBERT, Fullback — A high school teammate of Russ Frazier at Gorton High School, Yonkers, New York, Bob ranked second to Archie Williams in average rushing last season. In nine attempts he gained 56 yards for an average of 6.2. He covers a 5' 11" frame with 180 lbs.

RILEY, RICHARD, Tackle — Dick is another of the fine sophomore line-men that Al Kelley is pinning his hopes on. Only eighteen years old, he is 6' 0" and is one of the biggest men on the squad at 205 lbs. He formerly played for Lowell, Massachusetts, High School.

ROBERTSHAW, GILBERT, Tackle — Gil is one of the few Rhode Island boys on the squad. He received his early football tutoring from Tom Eccleston, '32, at Burrillville High School. After a year at Tabor Academy he entered Brown and was outstanding in a big aggressive freshman line last year.

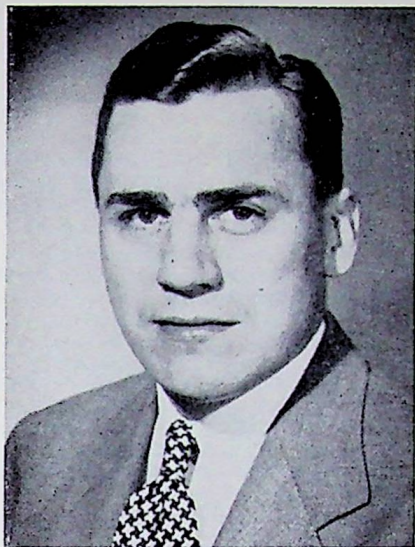
THOMPSON, TOMMY, Halfback — Tommy was severely hampered by injuries for most of last season, but at the close of the year he thrilled Brown rooters with several flashy runs reminiscent of his performance as a sophomore when he led the Bruins in scoring, rushing and pass receiving. He stands 5' 7", weighs 150 lbs. and lives in Newton, Massachusetts.

WILLIAMS, ARCHIE, Halfback — Ivy League leader in rushing last year, Archie should have another great season. He averaged 6.9 yards in rushing, scored 6 TDs and totaled 284 yards in punt and kickoff returns. He will also be pressed into service as a punter on occasions. Archie stands 5' 11", weighs 165 lbs. and lives in Springfield, Massachusetts.

The Brown Coaching Staff

ALVA E. KELLEY, *Head Coach*—Is in his fifth season as head coach of the Bruins.

A native of Natrona Heights, Pa., Kelley is a graduate of Cornell with the Class of 1941. An end for three seasons with the Big Red, he was named to the Associated Press All-Eastern team in 1939 and the following year received honorable mention on several All-American elevens.

As an undergraduate, the Brown coach not only was skilled as an athlete, but as a scholar as well. An honor graduate of Cornell's School of Mechanical Engineering, he was elected to Tau Beta Pi, the engineering honorary fraternity, his junior year.

After graduating from Cornell, he entered the U. S. Army, and for the next five years served as an officer in the Ordnance Department. It was during his last year in the Army that he started out on his coaching career. In addition to his Army duties at Watervliet Arsenal, he was allowed to coach the football team at La Salle Military Academy at nearby Troy.

Kelley returned to his Alma Mater following his discharge from the service and for the next four seasons served as end coach. He left Ithaca in the spring of 1950 to accept the position of line coach at Yale and a year later came to Brown.

His teams at Brown have an over-all record of 13 wins, 21 losses and 2 ties.

MILTON J. PIEPUL, Backfield Coach—Backfield coach of Big Green teams for the past eleven years, Milt Piepul has gained a reputation for developing the smooth ball-handling, quick-starting backfields that are an integral part of Tuss McLaughry's T attack. A great offensive fullback and crushing line-backer at Notre Dame for four years, Piepul captained the Irish in 1910. After a year of professional football with the Detroit Lions, Piepul coached football and basketball at Cathedral High School, Indianapolis, before coming to Dartmouth as backfield coach under Earl Brown in 1913. A careful, painstaking workman, Piepul demands nothing less than perfection from his pupils. This has paid off in recent years with some of the East's smoothest working backfield units.

MATTHEW J. BOLGER, JR., End Coach—Matt was brought to Brown by Al Kelley in 1951 as end coach. After a year on the varsity staff he took over the direction of the Freshman Team in 1952 as an emergency measure. The team won five and lost none. A one time end at Notre Dame and Cornell, he is a graduate of the latter institution with the Class of 1948. During the war he served as a pilot with the Marine Air Corps and for a time played football for the Iowa Pre-Flight team. Before coming to Brown he coached the line at St. Benedict's Prep and later held a similar position at Upsala.

ALEX F. NAHIGIAN—The only holdover from the staffs of Rip Engle and Gus Zitrides, Alex Nahigian is expected to return to his duties as coach of the junior varsity team. For the past three seasons, Nahigian taught the varsity backs defensive football. Well respected for his coaching ability, he is a graduate of Holy Cross, where he played football until an injury sidelined him his sophomore year. However, he continued to star in athletics although he no longer could play football. An outfielder on the Crusader baseball team for three seasons, he captained the team his senior year.

L. STANLEY WARD, *Freshman Coach*—Stan Ward joined the Brown staff last season taking on the duties as freshman football coach and varsity basketball coach. A graduate of Canisius College, 1942, Stan is Brown's first full time basketball coach since the '30's. His first coaching position was at Suffield Academy, Suffield, Connecticut, where he was quite successful in basketball. Ward served in the Army from 1943 to 1946, and after a five-year tour of duty at Suffield, he joined the staff at the University of Connecticut.

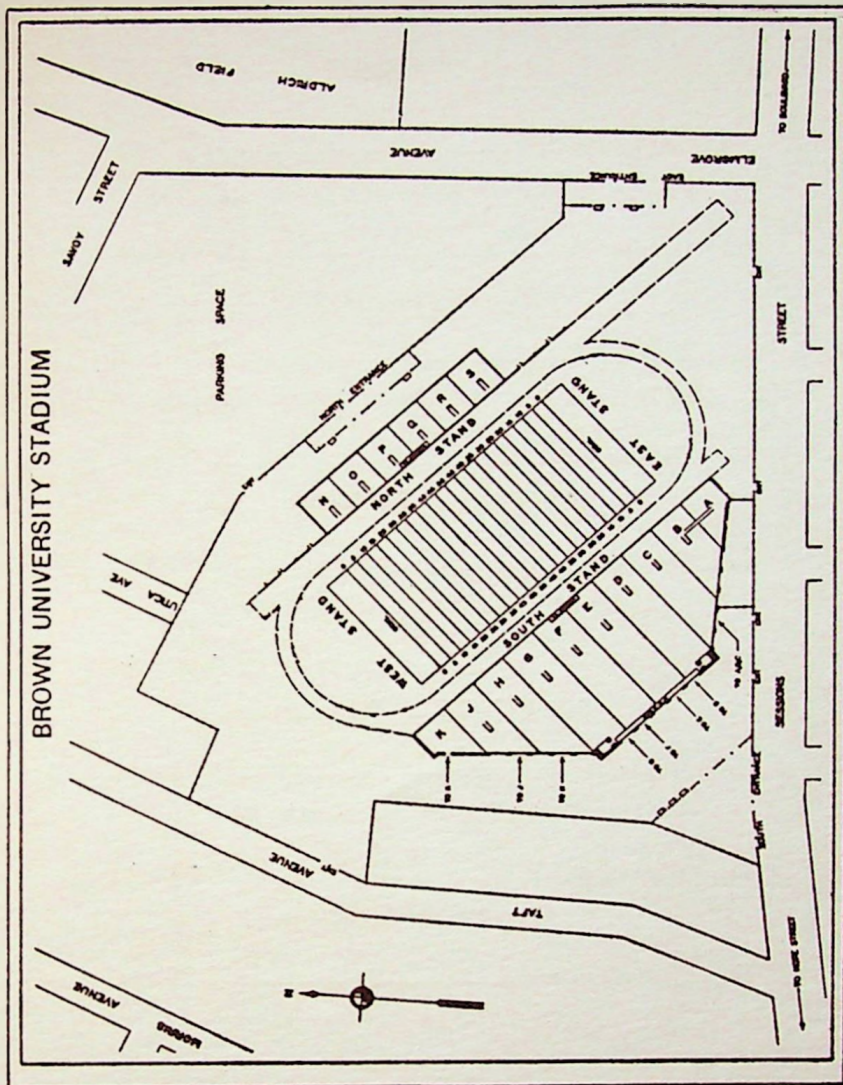
