ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATION

ROBERT "BOB" SEIPLE

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Robert Seiple was appointed Brown Athletic Director in June, 1975. He had served as assistant director for the three previous years.

During his undergraduate days at Brown, Seiple distinguished himself as a member of both the football and lacrosse teams. Brown's most valuable player in 1964, Seiple was twice selected for All-Ivy League teams as an end, and during his senior season he was chosen for the All-East squad. In 1965, he captained the Bruin lacrosse team and earned All-New England honors that spring.

After receiving his degree in American literature in 1965, Seiple worked in the Brown admissions office. In 1966 he entered the Marine Corps and served in more than 300 combat missions in Vietnam.

After his release from military service, Seiple entered private business for two years. In 1971 he rejoined the Brown admissions office, and a year later he was named assistant athletic director. Seiple has also served as a Bruin assistant football coach.

Bob, his wife Margaret Ann, and their three children, Chris, Amy and Jessie, live in Barrington, Rhode Island.

ARLENE GORTON

ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

Arlene Gorton has served on the Brown athletic staff since 1962. She is responsible for the physical education and women's athletic programs.

Following her graduation from Pembroke College (now part of Brown) in 1952, she attended the University of North Carolina and earned her Master's degree in education in 1954. Gorton then joined the staff at Connecticut College as a physical education instructor.

She returned to her alma mater in 1961 as chairman of the Women's Physical Education Department. In 1973 Gorton was appointed assistant athletic director and in 1975 she was elevated to her present position.

She is single and lives in Providence.

JOHN PARRY

ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

John Parry, a 1965 graduate of Brown, joined the Bruin athletic staff in the summer of 1975 as assistant athletic director. On July 1, 1977, he was promoted to associate athletic director. Parry is responsible for the scheduling and travel of male intercollegiate programs. In addition, he serves as liaison between the NCAA offices and the Brown admissions, financial aid and alumni offices.

During his intercollegiate days, Parry was an exceptional football player. At the time he graduated he held six school and Ivy League pass receiving records. A teammate of athletic director, Bob Seiple, he also lettered in basketball and lacrosse. In

1973, Parry was named to the All-Time Ivy League football team and in 1975, he was inducted into the Brown Hall of Fame.

Parry holds a Master's degree from the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School. He and his wife, Ann, have two children, Alyson and Jennifer, and they reside in Barrington, R. I.

RICHARD "RICH" SARDELLA

ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Richard Sardella, a 1969 graduate of Bryant College, joined the Brown athletic department in 1970 as ticket and business manager, a position he still holds. In 1973, Sardella was named assistant athletic director and on July 1, 1977, he was promoted to associate athletic director.

Sardella administers the athletic budget and coordinates the use of facilities, the summer program and the sale of tickets.

Sardella was an outstanding schoolboy second baseman in his native Jersey City, New Jersey. During 1969, he served as freshmen baseball coach at Bryant College.

Sardella has a Bachelor of Science degree in marketing. He is single and resides in Providence.

FRANK GEORGE

HEAD TRAINER

Frank George has been the head trainer at Brown since 1966. In May, 1974 he was elected president of the National Athletic Trainers Association and was re-elected in 1976 and currently serving a second term. A 1962 graduate of the University of Massachusetts, he is the first East Coast trainer to be elected president in the 25-year history of the NATA.

George, a native of Boston, holds a certificate of physical therapy from Boston University. In 1976 he served as a trainer for the USA Olympic Team at Innsbruck and also lectured in Japan as a guest of the country.

He and his wife Lynn have four children: Lynn Ann, John, Karen and Christopher. The George's reside in Cumberland, R.I.

1977 FOOTBALL OUTLOOK

Last season Brown won a share of the Ivy League title for the first time since the League was formed in 1955. Now the Bruins face the challenge of replacing several key players as they attempt to repeat as Ivy Champs in 1977.

"Considering depth, talent and size, this is a better football team than last year's," said head coach John Anderson, "but the league has improved so much, we may have trouble equalling or improving our record."

Paul Michalko, an All-East and All-Ivy quarterback, has graduated. His prospective replacements are talented juniors Mark Whipple and Marty DeFrancesco who saw limited action in 1976. Their passing skills are untested in varsity competition.

Record-setting wide receiver, Bob Farnham, has departed but Brown coach John Anderson has Farnham's younger brother Mark among his wide receiver candidates. The returning veterans are potential All-Ivy picks, split end Joe Mixie and flanker Charlie Watkins.

Anderson's offensive unit also features the top three rushers of a year ago: seniors Wally Shields, Seth Morris and co-captain Billy Hill (each accumulated 500 yard rushing), plus three exceptional sophomores Jo Jo Jamiel, Marty Moran and E Ponko, the running backs on a fine freshmen team.

The offensive line is the most talented since Anderson's arrival from Middlebury in 1973. Junior Mike Knight, who saw considerable action last year, will replace graduated All-New England center, Mike Prairie. Seniors Rich Riddle and Dave Field are the returning veterans at the guards while the tackle positions should be filled by second team All-Ivy Steve Narr and Bob Forster. Junior Chuck Bryson is the likely starter at tight end.

Defensively, Brown lost five starters including All-Ivy linebacker Scott Nelson and All-New England defensive end Mike Sherman but a number of lettermen give the Bruins excellent depth.

Returning starter and co-captain Lou Cole, an all-honors candidate at linebacker, leads an experienced unit which includes halfbacks Luke Gaffney and Ron Brown, tackles Kevin Rooney and Kevin Webb, end Attilio Cecchin, and middle guard Mike Lancaster. Mike Barnes, who started as a sophomore, rejoins the defensive backfield after a year's absence.

The kicking game remains intact with second team All-Ivy choice, punter Tom Thurow, and placekicker Ruben Chapa. Chapa's job will be challenged by newcomer Tad Barrows, who connected on a 42-yard field goal as a freshman.

Up from the successful (4-2) freshmen team are standouts OT John Sinnott, MG Jay Hickey, OG Matt Quigley, DE Mike Michuda, and TE Scott Kidger.

All told, the picture in Providence looks encouraging with strong sophomores supporting a number of key upperclassmen. Barring major surprises, 1977 should be another fine season for New England Coach of the Year, John Anderson.

JOHN ANDERSON

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Ursinus '54



Brown football fans have always been believers but until John Anderson came along winning was just a distant memory. Four years ago, even the most enthusiastic Bruin supporter could not have fantasized what Anderson has accomplished since he came to Providence. As good a prophet as he is a coach, Anderson talked about winning on an August day in 1973 when he addressed his first group of incoming freshmen: "By the time you're seniors, you'll be members of an Ivy Championship team."

Anderson then began a carefully charted course which ended with Brown sharing the Ivy League championship with Yale in 1976. Winners at last, Brown had finally won a title for the first time since league competition was formerly established in 1955.

Anderson's success at Brown has been an extension of a positively planned coaching career. When he accepted his first head collegiate coaching position at Middlebury College, he faced the challenge of rebuilding a team which had won just seven games in five years. Over four years, the Panthers steadily improved until Middlebury finished with an 8-0 season in 1972. Anderson's overall record at the Vermont school was 21-11.

When he came to Brown in 1973, John Anderson found a football program in trouble. The Bruins had won just one of their previous 18 games. In that first year he removed the Bruins from the ranks of the losers. Anderson's squads have been 4-3-1, 5-4, 6-2-1 and finally in 1976, 8-1, with a share of the Ivy League championship.

That second year, 1974, wasn't as long as the record reflects. Five games into the season, Brown had won only one game. Pressed by a questioner, Anderson noted, "We are so close, this team could win the final four." Anderson's prediction was absolutely right. The Bruins won four straight, all against league opponents, an accomplishment greater than any previous Brown team. Those victories included a 10-7 regionally televised upset of Harvard. For his team's play in that game, UPI named Anderson the National Coach of the Week.

In Anderson's third year, his team moved closer to an Ivy League title. Finishing with four consecutive wins in 1974, Brown ran off three straight victories in 1975 before losing to Harvard in a critical league showdown. The 5-1-1 Ivy League record, just one-half game behind champion Harvard, was, at the time, Brown's finest finish ever in league competition. That is, until 1976 when John Anderson's Brown football team made its own special piece of Ivy League history.

Anderson originally began his college coaching career at Dartmouth, where he spent one year as freshmen coach and three seasons as offensive line coach under Bob Blackman, now head coach at Cornell. He then moved on to Boston College where he worked as defensive line coach for one year under Joe Yukica.

Prior to his college coaching, Anderson spent seven years on the high school level in western Pennsylvania, close to his hometown of Carlisle. That high school career included a stint under Joe Yukica at Central Dolphin High in Harrisburg, followed by two head coaching positions, Selensgrove Pa. High and Cumberland Valley High in Mechanicsburg.

A 1954 graduate of Ursinus College, Anderson and his wife Marjorie have three children. The oldest, Kurt, is a junior at Williams College where he competes in foot-

ball as a tight end and hockey as a winger. The Anderson's only daughter, Jill, will enter Skidmore College this fall as a freshman, while nine-year-old Scott is at home attending school in East Greenwich, Rhode Island.

While at Brown, the Rhode Island and the New England sportswriters have twice named Anderson Rhode Island and New England Coach of the Year. Last season UPI also named Anderson New England Coach of the Year.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Brown '69

Bill Russo joined the Bruin coaching staff as a part-time assistant following his graduation from Brown in 1969. In 1971, he was promoted to a full-time position. For three years (1970-72), Russo was defensive coordinator for the freshmen program. In 1972, he took charge of Bruin scouting and coordinated the entire scouting program on computer with Jack Duffy, head of Brown's computer program.

A native of Glasgo, Connecticut, Russo is an alumnus of Griswold High where he captained a state championship football team in his senior year and was named to the all-league team.

At Brown Russo played offensive guard as a sophomore. In his final two seasons he switched to defense and became a standout linebacker.

Russo, an undergraduate philosophy major, was a member of the committee which formulated Brown's new curriculum. He enjoys weightlifting, directs Brown's weight training program, and holds a brown belt in karate.

Away from football Russo plays bridge, chess and enjoys camping. He and his wife, Susan Fowler Russo, live in Providence.

ANDY TALLEY

OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

So. Conn. '67

Andy Talley joined the Bruin football staff in 1973 after coaching in both the high school and collegiate ranks. He spent four years at Middlebury College as backfield coach prior to moving to Brown. He shared a major responsibility in developing the Panthers' potent offensive attack operated by head coach John Anderson. When Anderson took the head job at Brown, it was only natural for him to bring Talley to the Bruin campus.

A native of Bryn Mawr, Penna., and a 1961 graduate of Haverford High, Talley was an All-Delaware County selection in football and he played in the Delaware County all-star game. He starred for Connecticut State College as a defensive back. During that span the Owls were Eastern Football Conference champs twice, in 1965 and 1966.

Talley remained at Southern Connecticut after graduation and in 1970 obtained his Master's degree in physical education. During those years he was backfield coach and head wrestling coach at Simsbury High in Simsbury, Conn. His wrestlers won the North-West Sectional title in 1968 and, in two seasons, his football teams won 16 and lost two.

Prior to joining the staff at Middlebury, Talley also spent a year as secondary coach at Springfield College. He and his wife, Arlene Zitney Talley, a former Connecticut junior gymnastics champion, have one son, Josh. They reside in Lincoln, R.I.



DAVID "DAVE" RITCHIE

LINEBACKERS

Cincinnati '62

Before joining the Bruin staff in 1973, Dave Ritchie was an assistant coach and outstanding recruiter at the University of Cincinnati. During his stint with the Ohio school he coached linebackers and defensive tackles.

Raised in New Bedford, Mass., Ritchie played football three years and was an all-county quarterback for New Bedford High School. He spent his final inter-scholastic season in Cincinnati at Withrow High School and was selected as an All-State fullback in 1955.

After a year at Greenbrier Military Academy, Ritchie enrolled in the University of Cincinnati. He played fullback and linebacker for the Bearcats, and was twice the Missouri Valley Conference punting champion.

Ritchie earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Education at Cincinnati in 1962, and then began his coaching career at Greenbrier. After four years as an assistant he assumed the head coaching job. Ritchie compiled an 18-6-1 record as head man at Greenbrier, earning West Virginia Coach of the Year honors in 1968.

He rejoined the University of Cincinnati staff as an assistant coach in 1969. While serving at Cincinnati, Ritchie earned his Master's degree in education.

Ritchie and his wife, Sharon Francia Ritchie, have three children: Phyllis Anne, Susan Elizabeth and Davey. They live in Barrington, R.I.

JOSEPH "JOE" WIRTH

DEFENSIVE LINE

W. Virginia '60

Joe Wirth joined Brown's staff in 1973 following coaching assignments at Colgate, Holy Cross and two high schools in his native Pittsburgh, Pa. In addition to his football coaching duties, Wirth has been Brown's wrestling coach since 1974.

After receiving a Bachelor's degree in physical education from West Virginia, Wirth spent four years as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach at South Hills Catholic High in Pittsburgh.

In 1964, he returned to his alma mater, North Catholic High, as head football coach, and won the Catholic Championship in 1965.

He joined the collegiate coaching ranks in 1968 when he was named defensive coordinator and line coach at Holy Cross. While with the Crusaders, he coached their wrestling team for one season. In 1969, he joined the football staff at Colgate, where he also was defensive coordinator and line coach.

After graduating from high school in 1952, Wirth played semi-pro football in the Greater Pittsburgh League before entering the Army in 1954. He and his wife Carole Johnson Wirth, have six children: Tom, Joe, David, Colleen, Carolyn, and Gretchen. Tom is a defensive lineman on the Brown freshmen team. They reside in Barrington, R.I.



MICHAEL "MIKE" GOLDBERGER

SECONDARY
Middlebury '72

Mike Goldberger came to Brown in 1973 after starring for three seasons as a defensive back on John Anderson's Middlebury College teams. He was Middlebury's captain in 1971.

Goldberger was an assistant freshmen football coach during his first two seasons at Brown. In 1975 he joined the varsity staff and then in 1976 Goldberger took over the secondary.

During the past two springs Goldberger has served as assistant varsity baseball coach, after spending previous seasons directing the freshmen baseball program.

As a native of Westbury, N.Y., Goldberger was an exceptional schoolboy athlete at W.T. Clarke High. He earned all-league honors in football and lettered in basketball and baseball.

At Middlebury, Goldberger was an outfielder/pitcher and received letters in both baseball and football while earning a Bachelor's degree in history.

After graduation, he taught math at a Vermont youth correctional center and coached part-time at Middlebury. Goldberger recently married Kathy McDevitt and they reside in Barrington, R.I.

ANDREW "ANDY" DZURINKO

ENDS-LINEBACKERS
Bucknell '65

Andy Dzurinko joined Brown's football staff in 1976 after five very successful seasons as the defensive coordinator at Williams College.

A native Pennsylvanian, Dzurinko attended high school in Monessen and graduated from Bucknell University in 1965. He played on Bucknell's 1964 team which won the Lambert Cup. He earned All-Middle Atlantic Conference and All-East first team honors as a senior. During his three varsity seasons Dzurinko played both linebacker and offensive guard. He is a member of the Bison's All-Time great football team.

Dzurinko's coaching experience began as a graduate assistant at Pittsburgh in 1968 and 1969. During that time he earned a Master's degree in secondary education. In 1971 he received his certification in secondary counseling from Duquesne University.

Before moving on to Williams for the 1971 season he coached at Moon School District in Coraopolis, Pa. for one season. At Williams he coached the defensive line and linebackers and in the five seasons he was with the Ephmen, they won 34 of 40 games, including nine shutouts. Only once did opponents average more than 13 points per game for a season. Andy and his wife, Mary Frances Evich, have two children, Dara Anne and Christopher George. They live in Providence, R.I.

RECEIVERS

Brown '65

Associate Athletic Director, John Parry, coaches Brown's receivers imparting the expertise he gained as a two-time All-Ivy end. At one time Parry held most of Brown's game, season, and career passing records, along with several Ivy League marks. Parry still ranks among the top ten in single game and season receiving marks. He also earned varsity letters in basketball and lacrosse and in 1973 was named to the All-Time Ivy League football team. Parry was named to the Brown staff in 1975 after working with IBM for three years.

While he earned his master's degree at the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania, Parry was a graduate assistant football coach at Penn in 1965 and 1966. He and his wife, Ann, have two daughters, Alyson and Jennifer, and they live in Barrington, R.I.

Penn State '52

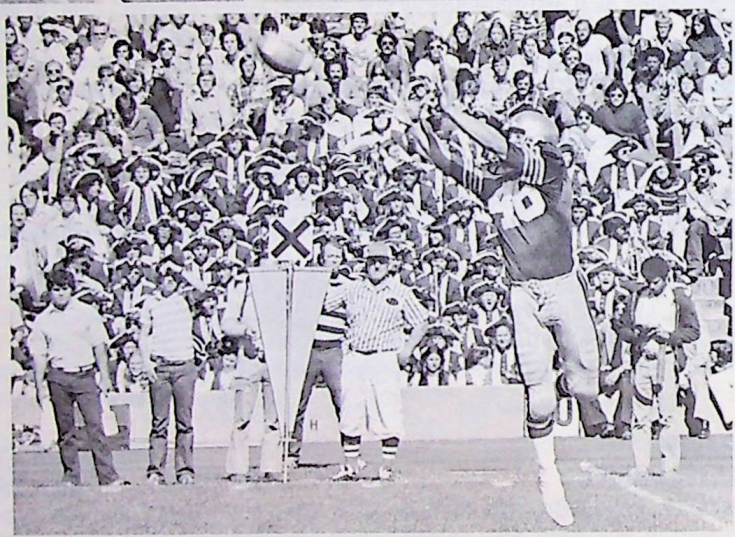
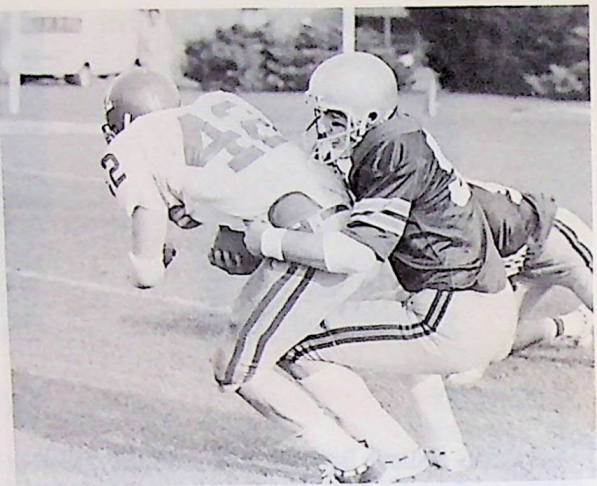
Adam Craven joined Brown's staff in 1976 after eight years as head coach at Frederick High in Maryland. His college career included two years of junior college football, where he twice received all-conference honors, and then two years at Penn State.

Craven was a member of Rip Engle's first Penn State Football team after Engle had moved from Brown to the Pennsylvania college in 1950. After graduation from Penn State, Craven returned to Storer Junior College as head coach for two years. His teams posted a 13-4 mark and each year led the Eastern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in defense.

From Storer he moved to Charles Town, West Virginia where he coached at Page Jackson High, then on to Douglas High in Leesburg, Virginia. His Page High teams won three Tri-State Athletic Union titles and at Douglas, he won two Northern Virginia championships.

In 1968 Craven took over the coaching assignment at Frederick High. Twice his clubs won the Tri-State championship, first in 1968 and again in 1973. Two members of that 1968 club are now playing in the NFL, Chuck Forman with Minnesota and Bill Cravin with Cleveland. Craven also coached Brown's Mike Sherman '76.

He, his wife Ruth and three children: Adam, Jr., Bill and Melissa, live in Providence.

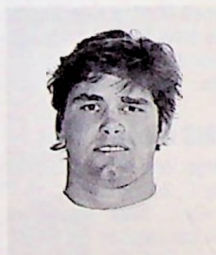

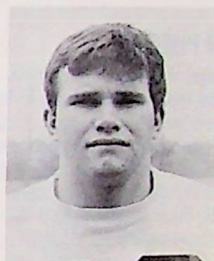

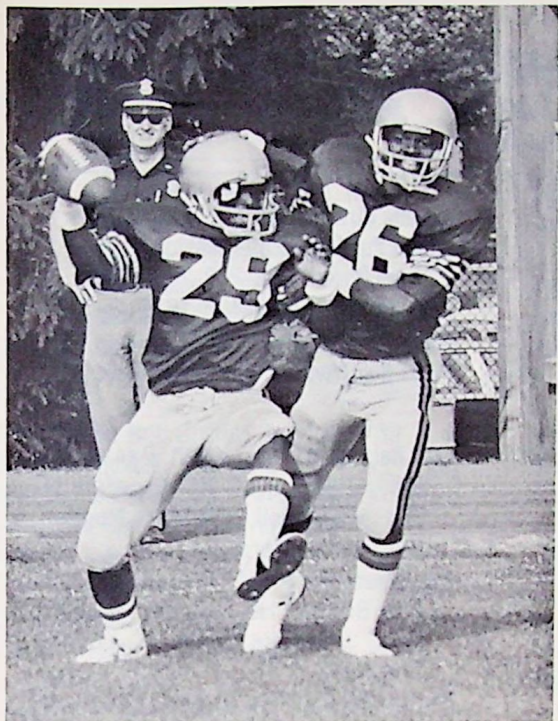

Brown's Roll of Honor

NATIONAL HALL OF FAME

JOHN W. HEISMAN, '91

An outstanding football and baseball player at Brown from 1887 to 1889, John William Heisman became one of the leading coaches and a dominant personality in intercollegiate football during the ensuing 45 years until his death in 1936. After obtaining his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania, he launched a football coaching career at Oberlin College that extended through a long series of successes at Akron, Alabama Poly, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Penn, Washington and Jefferson, and Rice. He did much to "open up" the game by use of the forward pass and the shifting line. At Georgia Tech, where he coached for 16 years, his teams of 1915-16-17 won 25 straight and rolled up 1,129 points to their opponents' 61. After retiring from coaching he became Physical Director of the Downtown Athletic Club of New York and was one of the founders and first president of the Touchdown Club. In his honor, the Downtown A.C. established the Heisman Trophy, which is presented annually to the outstanding collegiate football player in the nation. Born in Cleveland, Oct. 23, 1869, he died on Oct. 3, 1936.

DeORMOND (Tuss) McLAUGHRY

A 55-year association with football as player, coach and administrator was duly acknowledged in December, 1962, when Tuss McLaughry was inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hall of Fame. From the day he played his first football game at Sharon, Pa., High School in 1907, Tuss and football were inseparable, except for distinguished service in World War II. A standout player at Michigan State and Westminster, he began his coaching career at the latter college in 1915. He coached four years at Amherst, 1922-25, and his last team there was the highest scoring team in the history of the Little Three. He then moved to Brown, where he guided the famed Iron Men of 1926 to the only undefeated season in the school's history. His 1928 and 1932 teams lost only one game. Before leaving Brown for Dartmouth in 1941, he had the pleasure of coaching his son, John. Later at Dartmouth another son, Bob played for him. His 1948 and 1949 teams were the first in Dartmouth's history to win six major games. He coached East squads in the San Francisco Shrine game four times, the New York All-Star Game in 1940 and the Chicago All-Star Game in 1947. After retiring from coaching in 1954, Tuss continued to serve the American Football Coaches Association as secretary-treasurer. He died in 1975.

FREDERICK DOUGLAS (Fritz) POLLARD, '16

Probably the greatest player ever to perform for Brown, and ranked as one of the greatest black players ever to perform in college ranks, Fritz Pollard was the star of Brown's 1915 team which played in the first official Rose Bowl game (1916), and the '16 team which compiled an 8-1 record and ranks among the University's best. Walter Camp, whose All-American selections are regarded as the last word for the era he covered, ranked Pollard as "one of the greatest runners these eyes have ever seen." In 1916 he scored all three touchdowns as Brown handed Yale its lone defeat of the season, 21-6, and scored two and set up the other in the 21-0 victory against Harvard. Born in Chicago January 27, 1894, Pollard presently resides in New Rochelle, N. Y.

EDWARD NORTH ROBINSON, '96

If any man deserves recognition as "the father of Brown football," it is Edward North Robinson. His influence spans more than a quarter of a century — from 1892, when he entered Brown and helped put the game on a sound basis as an undergraduate, to 1925 when he wound up an illustrious coaching career that covered 24 seasons at his alma mater. He won nine letters in his playing days, four in football. But more important was his activity in helping the grid game take root when baseball was THE sport at Brown. He served three separate terms as head coach, the last covering 16 years, and won 140 games against 82 losses and 12 ties at a time when Eastern football was undisputedly the nation's best, and Brown was often called upon to meet the top grid powers with undermanned forces.

Born in Lynn, Mass. on October 15, 1873, he died on March 10, 1945. His coaching record at Brown follows:

WILLIAM EARL SPRACKLING, '12

Brown's only three-time All-American, the 150-pound Sprackling is rated by many as the finest all-around football player in the school's history. As a quarterback he could beat a team in many ways. One of the game's most successful pioneers with the forward pass, he threw 10 touchdown aeriols, a figure exceeded only seven times by Bruin passers since 1911. In addition, he was a brilliant runner, a heady field general and an adept field-goal kicker. He kicked three field goals against Yale in 1910. He owns the Brown record for most yards gained on kickoff returns in a single game with 147 against the Carlisle Indians in 1909. His three Brown teams won 21 games, lost 8 and tied 2. The Cleveland, Ohio, native was selected on Walter Camp's All-American teams in 1909-10-11 and in 1964 became the sixth man connected with Brown football to be elected to the National Hall of Fame. He is now retired from his position as president of the Anaconda Wire and Cable Company and lives in Beverly Hills, Calif.

W. WALLACE WADE, '17

A member of the 1915 Brown team that played Washington State in the first Rose Bowl game on Jan. 1, 1916, Wally Wade earned a place among the great coaches of American intercollegiate football during an illustrious career that spanned 40 years.

After serving his apprenticeship as a high school coach and an assistant at Vanderbilt, he took over the head coaching reins at Alabama in 1923 and built the Crimson Tide into a major football power, winning 61 of 74 games and taking three of his teams to the Rose Bowl. Moving to Duke University in 1931, he sent two Blue Devil squads to the Rose Bowl and compiled a record of 110 victories, 36 losses and 10 ties through 1950, when he retired to become the Commissioner of the Southern Conference. In addition to his achievements in the field of coaching, he distinguished himself in service during two World Wars. He interrupted his tenure at Duke at the age of 53 to serve as a lieutenant colonel in the artillery during World War II, taking part in several major battles in the European Theatre. Wally was born in Trenton, Tennessee on June 15, 1892. Now retired from his Southern Conference post, he operates his 120-acre livestock farm near Durham, N.C.

CHARLES "RIP" ENGLE

The latest member of Brown's football family inducted into the Hall of Fame is Charles "Rip" Engle, head coach of the Bruin gridiron teams from 1944 through 1949 and then head mentor at Penn State until his retirement in 1966. Engle was inducted January, 1973. Recognized as one of the top coaches in his profession, Engle guided Brown to a 28-20-4 record in six years, including marks of 7-2-0 and 8-1-0 his final two seasons. His success at Penn State, where he compiled a 104-48-4 record, was amazing. He guided Penn State to post-season Bowl appearances almost every season, or so it seemed, and he coached in all-star games too numerous to mention. Engle learned his football under the old master, Dick Harlow, while at Western Maryland. He graduated in 1930 and moved into the high school ranks, where he coached at Waynesboro High (Pennsylvania) for 11 years. He joined the Bruin staff in 1942 as an assistant to Neil "Skip" Stahley and when the latter entered the Navy, Engle was appointed head coach. Engle now lives in University Park, Pa.

THE IRON MEN

Beside being the only undefeated team in Brown history, the 1926 team earned even greater fame as the "Iron Men," so-called because the starting 11 played 60 minutes without substitution on consecutive weeks against Yale and Dartmouth, and well into the fourth quarter against Harvard later in the season. They lost their chance for an undefeated-untied season in the last game when Colgate earned a 10-10 deadlock. The team was ranked among the top 10 nationally. Its members were Captain Hal Broda and Thurston Towle, ends; Ed Kevorkian and Paul Hodge, tackles; Lou Farber and Orland Smith, guards; Charles Considine, center; Red Randall, quarterback; Dave Mishel and Ed Lawrence, halfbacks; and Al Cornsweet, fullback.

BROWN IN FIRST ROSE BOWL

Since the late 1940's, Rose Bowl participants have been representatives of the Pacific-8 and Big Ten Conferences. It has not always been so, however. It was under Ed Robinson, a graduate in 1896 and for many years head coach, that Brown journeyed westward in 1915 to play in the first Tournament of Roses New Year's Day classic at Pasadena, CA.

The Bruins were chosen as the Eastern representative after posting a 5-3-1 mark. Those losses came via a 7-0 setback to Amherst and 6-0 to Syracuse, a 16-7 loss to Harvard and a scoreless game with Trinity. Brown outscored its opponents 167-32 that year, defeating URI 38-0, Williams 33-0, Vermont 46-0, Yale 3-0 and much heralded Carlisle 39-3.

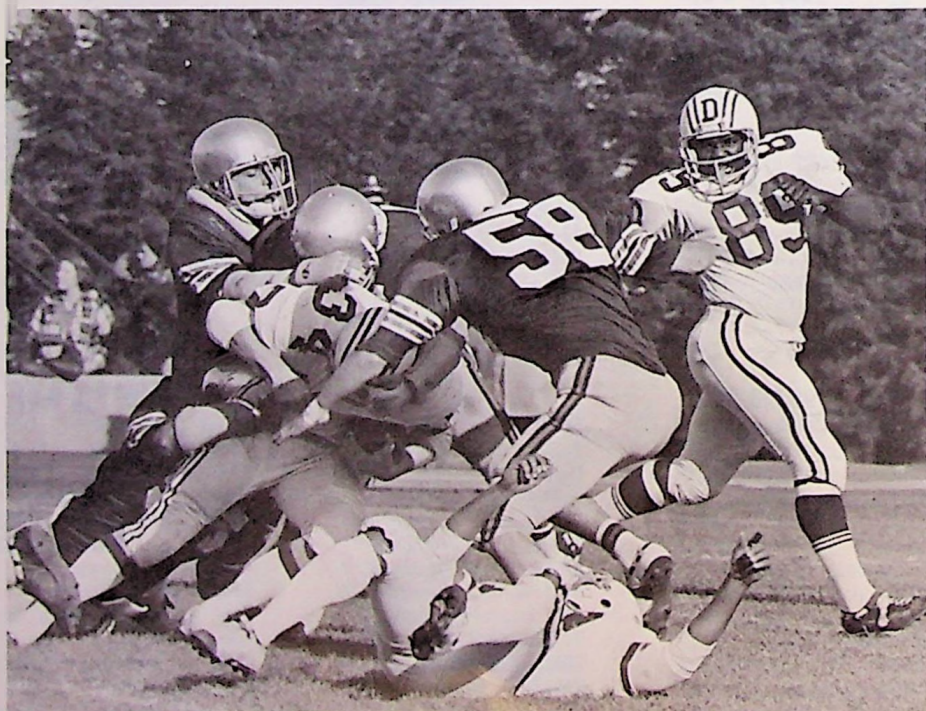

THE UNIVERSITY

Brown University, located in Providence, Rhode Island, is a coeducational Ivy League school where one of the most innovative and flexible curricula in the nation combines with over two hundred years of New England tradition to form an academic community of intellectual depth and social diversity.

Founded in 1764 in Warren, R.I. as Rhode Island College, the nation's seventh and New England's third oldest college, the school was moved to Providence in 1770. Its name was changed that year to Brown University in recognition of the contributions of Nicholas Brown.

Women were first admitted in 1891 when the Women's College in Brown University was established. In 1928 that division was renamed Pembroke College and for many years the women had a separate campus and extracurricular life while participating in classes with the men and earning Brown degrees. The two undergraduate colleges were merged in July 1971.

Brown maintains a strong tradition of dedication to both undergraduate and graduate education in the humanities, arts and sciences. While the University's two centuries of existence have involved constant expansion and adaptation of academic programs to encompass expanding spheres of knowledge, these changes have been accomplished with an overriding concern for the importance of sustaining an environment of scholarship and community with the growing university.

Brown today has a one-to-ten faculty-student ratio and offers its undergraduates opportunities to study with first rate faculty who also teach at the graduate level. A development of major significance at Brown was the initiation in 1969 of a liberalized New Curriculum which offered the student the opportunity to design and control the pattern of his or her undergraduate education. Considered at the time one of the most flexible and progressive academic programs to be found at any major university in the country, the New Curriculum was the result of three years of discussion and debate among students, faculty and University officials.

In 1974 the University accepted the first freshman class into its new seven-year medical program. Brown's is the first full-fledged medical school in the state of Rhode Island.
