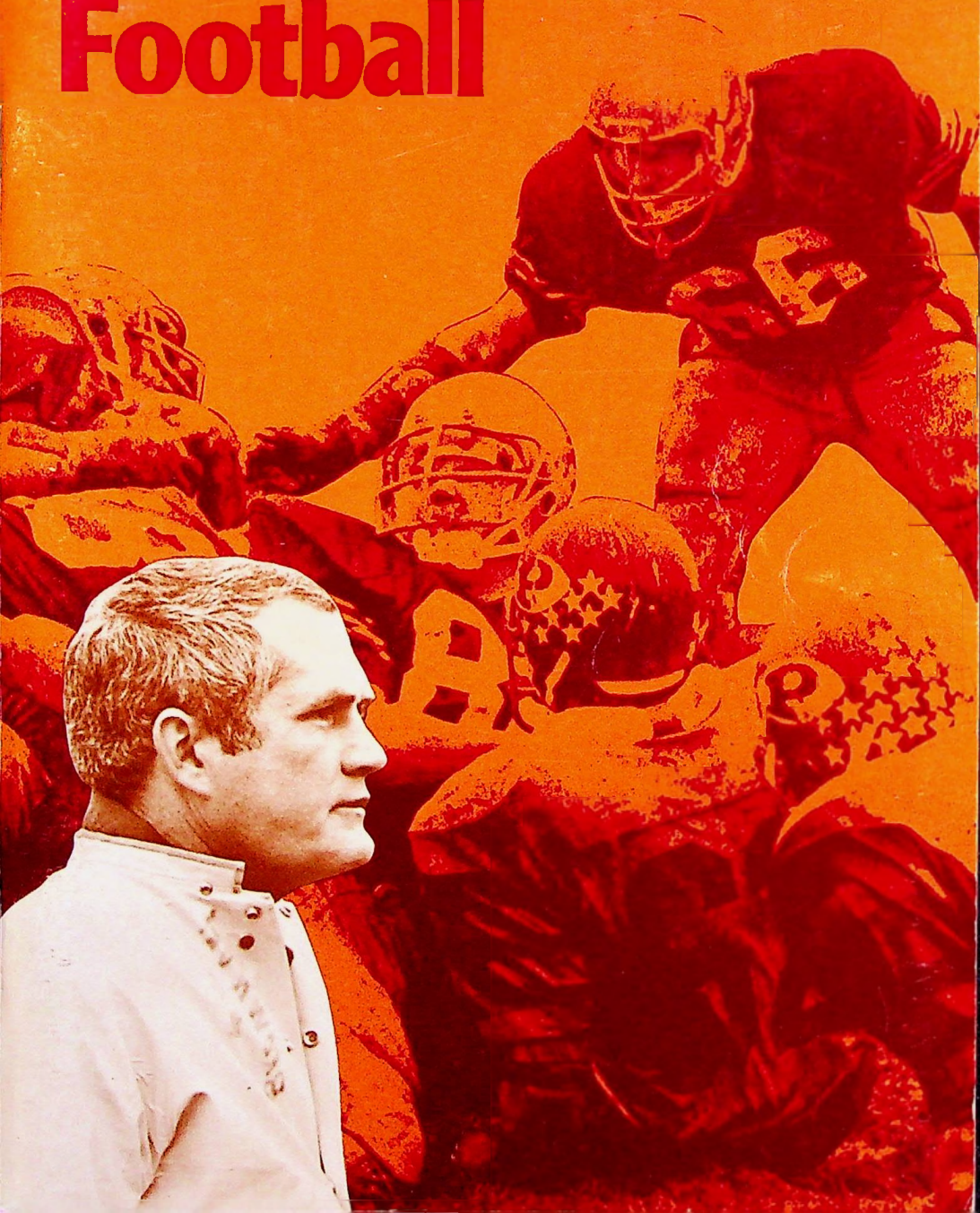

ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATION

JOHN PARRY / ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



John C. Parry now directs the athletic program in which he once was an outstanding record-holding receiver and an exceptional lacrosse player. The 35-year-old administrator became Brown University's Director of Athletics, January 5, 1979. He oversees a program of 30 men's and women's teams and athletic facilities which are among the finest in the country.

In his football playing days at Brown, Parry broke six school and Ivy League pass receiving records. That type of athletic achievement earned him a place on the All-Time All-Ivy Football Team (1956-72). He also lettered in lacrosse.

Following his 1965 graduation with a degree in economics, Parry earned his master's in business administration in 1967 from the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton Graduate School. While at Penn he also served as assistant coach of the freshmen football and lacrosse teams and completed his six-year service in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve.

Parry spent the next eight years in the data processing field, first as a marketing representative for IBM, then vice-president and co-founder of Instant Data, Inc. and finally with the Intel Corporation.

In 1975, he returned to Brown as Assistant Athletic Director and two years later was elevated to Associate Director. During those years he had responsibilities in scheduling, team travel, recruiting, admissions, eligibility, and fund raising. He served as an assistant football and lacrosse coach, tournament director of the 1976 NCAA Lacrosse Championship, and in 1978 head freshman football coach.

A native of Marcellus, N.Y., Parry is a graduate of Marcellus Central High School where he lettered in football, basketball, baseball and track and field. He, his wife Anne Brodhead Parry, and two children, Alyson and Jennifer, reside in Barrington, R.I.

ARLENE GORTON / ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

Arlene E. Gorton, who has served on the Brown athletic staff since 1961, is responsible for the physical education, intramural and women's athletic programs, the Brown sports camp for children, and assisting John Parry in athletic policy making.

Gorton, a 1952 graduate of Pembroke College (now part of Brown), earned her master's degree in education in 1954 from the University of North Carolina. She then joined the staff at Connecticut College as a physical education instructor until 1961 when she returned to her alma mater as chairperson of the Women's Physical Education Department. In 1973 Gorton became Assistant Athletic Director and in 1975 was appointed to her present position of Associate Director.

Her most notable achievement was full professorship awarded in June 1978. She is only the second person in Pembroke and Brown physical education history to achieve that rank.

Gorton is a native of Pawtucket, R.I. and resides in Warwick, R.I.

RICH SARDELLA / ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Richard C. Sardella joined the Brown athletic department in 1970 as ticket and business manager. In 1973, he was named Assistant Athletic Director and on July 1, 1977 he was elevated to Associate Athletic Director.

Sardella administers the athletic budget, coordinates the use of facilities, the summer program and the sale of tickets. He also shares in team scheduling and travel responsibilities.

Sardella earned his Bachelor of Science degree in marketing in 1969 from Bryant College. He served as freshmen baseball coach at Bryant during 1969. A native of Jersey City, N.J., he now resides in Providence.

JOAN TAYLOR / ASSISTANT ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Joan W. Taylor has been a member of the Brown athletic staff since 1969. After being promoted to the position of Assistant Athletic Director in July, 1978, she has been responsible for team scheduling and travel along with general administrative duties. As head women's tennis coach for the past eight years, she guided the team to an overall record of 69 wins and 28 losses. She now serves as assistant coach of both the men's and women's program under head coach Bill Cullen.

A native of Bristol, Ct., Taylor attended Springfield College (Mass.) where she competed in three sports, field hockey, volleyball and tennis, and earned her bachelor of Science degree in physical education in 1961.

She, her husband John, and two children, Steven and Janet, live in Barrington, R.I.

FRANK GEORGE / HEAD TRAINER

Frank George has been the head trainer at Brown since 1966. In May, 1974 he was elected president of the National Athletic Trainers Association and was re-elected in 1976 to serve a second term. A 1962 graduate of the University of Massachusetts, he was the first East Coast trainer to be elected president in the 25-year history of the NATA.

George, a native of Boston, holds a certificate of physical therapy from Boston University. In 1976 he served as a trainer for the USA Olympic Team at Innsbruck and also lectured in Japan as a guest of the country.

He and his wife Lynn have four children: Lynn Ann, John, Karen and Christopher. The George's reside in Cumberland, R.I.

1979 Football Outlook

Brown should again be a top contender for the Ivy League football title in 1979. Under seventh-year coach John Anderson the Bruins have claimed first place once (1976) and second place three times. Last year, after a rash of pre-season injuries to would-be starters, Brown lost its first two games but went on to finish with a 6-3 record overall and 5-2 in Ivy play for second place (tied with Yale). Those injuries forced a number of sophomores into early action, but now they have the experience to maintain Brown's success.

Anderson's primary concern will be the replacement of graduated quarterback Mark Whipple, a poised leader who ably called his own plays and directed Brown to the first spot in league total offense (368 yds. per game). The top two candidates are juniors Larry Carbone and Scott Dumont who have little varsity experience. Between the two of them, just one pass has been thrown in varsity competition; that one by the left-handed Carbone. Both are talented however, and each has better running ability than Whipple.

The rest of the backfield is in excellent shape with experienced fullbacks Marty Moran (Sr) and Steve Curtin (Jr), and tailbacks Rick Vilella (Jr) and JoJo Jamiel (Sr). Moran and Vilella started every game last season while Jamiel and Curtin, now healthy, were hampered by illness and injury. In just his first varsity year, Vilella led the team in rushing and broke the Brown single-season record of yards gained with 735 (150 carries, 4.9 avg.). Moran, one of the finest fullbacks in the league, averaged 4.7 yards per carry and amassed 575 yards as the second leading rusher. These four quality ballcarriers along with newcomers David Sims and Wayne Singleton give Brown extremely talented depth at running back.

The receiving corps returns an exceptionally talented split end, Mark Farnham, who is among the nation's best wide receivers. Now approaching his final year the 5'9" Farnham may erase school records held by his brother Bob ('77). Junior Kurt Staeudle and soph Mike Campbell will be waiting in the wings. Senior Charlie Boucher will fill the flanker spot vacated by grad Marty DeFrancesco.

Though the offensive line will miss 6'4" guard Bob Forster (All-America honorable mention), it has the size and depth to be equally as strong as last year. Leading that group is senior captain and All-Ivy tackle John Sinnott the largest man on the squad, 6'4", 27' pounds, and perhaps one of the league's best pro prospects. Junior Jon McCabe (6'4", 245 who started immediately as a sophomore, will hold down the left tackle position. Returnin starter, Gerry Deitchman and backups Lloyd Bunting (6'4", 240) and Chris Barsanti (6'3' 240) will all be looking for playing time. Since two-year starting center Mike Knight has graduated, highly-touted guard Matt Quigley (6'3", 240) could replace him or backup Dave Vachalek (6'2", 225) and newcomer Mark Dolan (6'2", 225) may challenge for the job.

Returning starter, senior Scott Kidger (6'6", 245) gives Anderson excellent size and talent at tight end.

The defensive personnel are in better shape with a year's experience behind them. Last season four sophs were thrown into action immediately and proved themselves in a short time. Three of them filled linebacker spots. Most notable is John Woodring whom, at this early stage, Anderson calls "the best linebacker in Brown history." With juniors John Prassas and Mike Audie, an outside linebacker who shared time with grad Mike Barnes, they help form the best linebacking group at one time.

Reviewing the defensive line, Anderson looks for more improved play. Everyone but All-Ivy tackle Mike Lancaster returns along with end Tom Thurow, who missed last year. His position mate, Don Place, starting tackle Rock Tate and reserve John Rooney, and middle guard and senior captain Jay Hickey are back. Hickey, second-team All-Ivy, turned in exceptional performances last season.

The most critical defensive area for adjustment is the secondary where all three two-year starters are gone. In preparation for the exodus of All-Ivy safety Ron Brown, Luke Gaffney and Dick Galvin, a number of Bruins were called in for playing time, especially safety Chris Weir and halfbacks Mike Kachmer and Tony Mancini. Up from the freshman team is Ken Newcomer considered one of the best players on that squad.

The punting game should be better since Thurow is back. He was second team All-Ivy two years ago. Carbone is also capable of handling the punting chores as he did a year ago, despite a shoulder injury. Experienced senior Tad Barrows and soph Bob Granfors are the kicking specialists.

So if the quarterback and the defensive secondary personnel adjust quickly, Brown will be in quest of another Ivy Title.



John W. Anderson, the fifteenth head coach in the 100 year history of Brown football, arrived on College Hill in 1973. Ever since then, Brown teams have successfully erased former records, accrued new honors and established themselves as annual Ivy League title contenders.

Anderson now ranks 17th among the nation's active college football coaches with his overall collegiate record of 57 wins, 26 losses and two ties for a 68.2 percentage. His record at Brown 36-15-2, 69.8 percentage, is the best of any Brown football coach.

Anderson and his staff have directed Brown to six consecutive winning seasons, the longest string since 1937-43. Additionally, a Brown game has been chosen six straight years to be aired on regional television.

Anderson's success at Brown has been an extension of a positively planned coaching career. When he accepted his first collegiate coaching position at Middlebury College, he faced the challenge of rebuilding a team which had won just eleven games in five years. Over four years, the Panthers steadily improved until Middlebury finished with an 8-0 season in 1972. Anderson's overall record at the Vermont school was 21-11.

When he came to Brown, John Anderson found a football program in trouble. The Bruins had won just one of their previous 18 games. In that first year he removed the Bruins from the ranks of the losers. Anderson's squads have been 4-3-1, 5-4, 6-2-1, and finally in 1976, 8-1, with a share of the Ivy League championship, a first since the league was formalized in 1955. The past two seasons the Bruins were in contention for the title until the very end and finished second both years with 7-2 and 6-3 overall records.

Anderson's second year, 1974, wasn't as long as the record reflects. Five games into the season, Brown had won only one game. Pressed by a questioner, Anderson noted, "We are so close, this team could win the final four." Anderson's prediction was absolutely right. The Bruins won four straight, all against league opponents, an accomplishment greater than any previous Brown team. Those victories included a 10-7 regionally televised upset of Harvard. For his team's play in that game, UPI named Anderson the National Coach of the Week.

In Anderson's third year, his team moved closer to an Ivy League title. Finishing with four consecutive wins in 1974, Brown ran off three straight victories in 1975 before losing to Harvard in a critical league showdown. The 5-1-1 Ivy League record, just one-half game behind champion Harvard, was, at the time, Brown's finest finish ever in league competition. That is, until 1976 when John Anderson's Brown football team made its own special piece in Ivy League history.

Anderson began his college coaching career at Dartmouth, where he spent one year as freshmen coach and three seasons as offensive line coach under Bob Blackman, now head coach at Cornell. He then moved on to Boston College

where he worked as defensive line coach for one year under Joe Yukica, now head coach at Dartmouth.

Prior to his college coaching, Anderson spent seven years on the high school level in western Pennsylvania, close to his hometown of Carlisle. That high school career included a stint under Joe Yukica at Central Dauphin High in Harrisburg, followed by two head coaching positions, Selensgrove (Pa.) High and Cumberland Valley High in Mechanicsburg.

A 1954 graduate of Ursinus College, the 46-year-old Anderson and his wife Marjorie have three children: Kurt, a graduate of Williams College where he competed in football and hockey, Jill, a junior at Skidmore College, and 11-year-old Scott who attends school in East Greenwich, Rhode Island.

While at Brown, the Rhode Island and the New England sportswriters have twice named Anderson Rhode Island and New England Coach of the Year. In 1976, UPI named him New England Coach of the Year. Birthdate: 1-6-33

JACK CHARNEY / OFFENSIVE LINE / Springfield '64



Jack Charney was hired in May, 1978 to oversee the offensive line. Before he came to Brown, Charney had spent four years (1974-77) as defensive coordinator at American International College (Mass.) and six years (1968-73) as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator at Norwich University. While at the Vermont school he taught physical education and attained an assistant professorship. In addition to college coaching, Charney was an assistant coach for three years (1964-66) at Pulaski High School in New Britain Ct. In 1967 he coached his alma mater's freshman team.

A 1964 graduate of Springfield, Charney has a B.S. and a Master's degree in physical education. In his undergraduate days, he played both fullback and linebacker for Springfield.

A native of Rome, N.Y., Charney attended Rome Free Academy. He, his wife Donna Simpkins Charney, and two children, Eric and Jason Kornberg by her former marriage, live in Cumberland, R.I. Birthdate: January 13, 1942.

RAY TELLIER / OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD / UConn '73



Ray Tellier joined the Brown staff as receivers coach in May, 1978 after spending one year as defensive backfield coach at Boston University. A 1973 graduate of the University of Connecticut, Tellier quarterbacked the Huskies to the Yankee Conference Championship his junior year.

After earning a B.S. degree in physical education, he spent a year at UConn as graduate assistant coach before moving to Dartmouth for one year.

Then Tellier went to Wabash College (Ind.) to coach the offensive backs and receivers for head coach Frank

Navarro, now at Princeton.

A native of New Haven, Ct., Tellier attended Notre Dame High School and played football for his dad, coach Ray Tellier Sr. Tellier was named first team All-State quarterback after directing Notre Dame to two 9-1 seasons.

Ray is married to Susan Cooke Tellier and they reside in Lincoln, R.I. Birthdate: June 10, 1951.

JAY MILLER / RECEIVERS / Brigham Young '76



Jay Miller, an NCAA record-holder as a wide receiver, became a member of the staff in May, 1979. He will serve as assistant coach of the receivers and will be largely responsible for recruiting efforts in the far west.

Before coming to Brown, Miller, a native of San Jose, Calif., spent a few months of spring football as a part-time assistant coach at the University of Colorado under head coach Chuck Fairbanks.

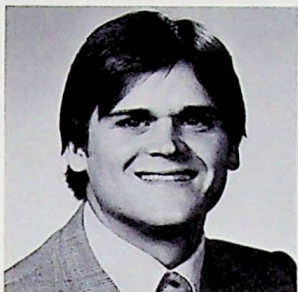
Prior to Colorado, Miller worked for two years as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Brigham Young University. While a sophomore there (1973) he led the nation in pass receiving with catches for 1181 yards. That type of accomplishment earned him All-America recognition and a unanimous All-Western Athletic Con-

ference selection. He still holds the NCAA Division 1A All-Time record for most pass receptions in a game. Against the University of New Mexico, he caught an incredible total of 22 passes for 263 yards.

Miller also had an outstanding high school career at Lynbrook High. He was All-State and played in the North-South California Shrine game.

Miller was graduated in 1976 with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education and has credits toward his Master's degree. He and his wife, Kathy Norris Miller live in the Providence area. Birthdate: November 27, 1954

JERRY PETERCUSKIE / DEFENSIVE ENDS / Boston College '75



Jerry Petercuskie became defensive ends coach in August, 1978. He had spent the previous two years as a part-time assistant coach at Penn State.

A 1975 graduate of Boston College, Petercuskie played offensive center. He had been a first team all-state selection as linebacker and center for Holliston High School in Mass. In addition to captaining the football team, he played basketball, baseball and golf in high school.

Petercuskie's dad, John, is an assistant coach with the Cleveland Browns and also held assistant jobs at Dartmouth, Boston College and Princeton. His brother, John Jr., was a linebacker at Boston College (1974) and his brother Gary, was a three-year starting safety at Penn State (1978) and signed as a free agent with Tampa Bay.

Prior to working with the Nittany Lions, Petercuskie spent one year at Trenton State as a part-time coach. He has a Bachelor of Science degree in modern and physical education (psychology major) and in 1976, he earned his Master's degree in counseling education from Penn State. He is single and resides in the Providence area. Birthdate: July 8, 1952.

JOE WIRTH / DEFENSIVE LINE / W.Virginia '60



Joe Wirth joined Brown's staff in 1973 following coaching assignments at Colgate, Holy Cross and two high schools in his native Pittsburgh, Pa. In addition to his football coaching duties, Wirth has been Brown's wrestling coach since 1974. Since he has been at Brown, the football team has been ranked nationally in defensive statistics for the past few years.

After receiving a Bachelor's degree in physical education from West Virginia, Wirth spent four years as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach at South Hills Catholic High in Pittsburgh.

Important Dates in Brown Football

- Nov. 13, 1878 — Brown plays its first game of intercollegiate football, travelling to Amherst to do battle with the Lord Jeffs
- Nov. 24, 1894 — In first meeting with Dartmouth at Outing Park, Springfield, Mass. Brown wins, 20-4
- Nov. 29, 1894 — The first Thanksgiving Day game in Brown's history, a 20-4 victory over MIT at Adelaide Park, Providence
- 1894 Season — Paced by its first set of touchdown twins, William Burr Hopkins and Charles D. Millard, Brown finishes the season 10-4 and is ranked fifth in the nation.
- 1896 Season — Brown may not have had the best team in the country, but it did have the richest manager — John D. Rockefeller, Jr. '97.
- Nov. 6, 1898 — Willie Richardson kicks first Brown field goal in 16-5 victory over the Newton A.C.
- 1899 Season — Brown moves into its new football home on Camp Street. Called Andrews Field after former Brown president, Benjamin Andrews, the field remained Brown's football home through the 1925 season.
- Nov. 30, 1899 — In its first intersectional game, Brown meets the University of Chicago at Marshall Field on Thanksgiving Day.
- Oct. 18, 1902 — Capt. Tom Barry scores all Brown's points on TD runs of 50 and 31 yards and on a 28-yard field goal as Bruins beat Penn for the first time, 15-6, at Franklin Field.
- Nov. 25, 1905 — The bear makes its first appearance as a Brown mascot at the Dartmouth game in Hanover.
- Sept. 29, 1906 — The forward pass was legalized for the 1906 season and QB Vic Schwartz threw the first pass for Brown in the opener against New Hampshire
- Nov. 24, 1906 — Halfback Johnny Mahew scored twice on spectacular runs to 23-0 victory over Dartmouth and becomes first Bruin named to Walter Camp's All-America first team.
- Sept. 26, 1908 — QB Bill Sprackling completes Brown first TD pass, a 40-yarder to end Spike Dennie.
- Nov. 5, 1910 — Sprackling has the greatest day of any Brown back in leading Brown to 21-0 victory over Yale. He kicked three field goals and accounted for 456 yards.
- Jan. 1, 1916 — Brown meets Washington State in first official Rose Bowl game.
- Nov. 18, 1916 — Fritz Pollard has two TDs and gains 140 yards rushing in leading Brown to 21-0 victory over Harvard and earning first team All-America honors from Walter Camp.
- Oct. 24, 1925 — Brown Stadium is dedicated during Brown-Yale game before 27,000.
- Oct. 23, 1926 — The Brown Iron Men team is born as 11 starters play full 60 minutes in 7-0 victory over Yale at Yale Bowl.
- Nov. 25, 1926 — Close to 30,000 see Brown end the season undefeated after battling Colgate to 10-10 tie on Thanksgiving Day morning at Brown Stadium.
- 1932 Season — Brown's Cinderella team meets previous undefeated opponent eight straight weeks, defeating URI, Springfield, Yale, Tufts, Harvard, Holy Cross, and Columbia before losing Thanksgiving morning to undefeated, untied, and unscored-upon Colgate before 33,000, the largest home crowd in Brown football history.
- Nov. 24, 1938 — In a Turkey Day thriller, Shine Hall scores 27 points in leading Brown to a 36-27 victory over Columbia and its star, Sid Luckman.
- Oct. 10, 1942 — Junior Halfback Bob Margarita sets an all-time Brown record with 233 yards rushing in 28-21 victory over Columbia and its star, Paul Governelli.
- Nov. 24, 1949 — Trailing 26-7 with 17 minutes left, Brown rallies to crush Colgate, 41-26, Thanksgiving morning on the running and passing of Joe Paterno.
- Oct. 4, 1958 — With fullback Paul Choquette rushing for 113 yards, Brown beats strong Yale team, 35-29.
- Oct. 13, 1973 — Using rollout quarterback Dennis Coleman the first half and passing quarterback Pete Beatrice after intermission, Brown befuddles Yale, 34-25, for Coach Anderson's first victory.
- November 1976 — Brown defeats Harvard, Dartmouth, and Columbia in the final three games to gain a share of the Ivy League title.
- Nov. 5, 1977 — Ruben Chapa's 32-yard field goal with 9 seconds left gives Brown 13-10 victory over Dartmouth at Hanover.
- 1979 Season — Centennial Anniversary

BROWN'S ROLL OF HONOR National Hall Of Fame

JOHN W. HEISMAN, '91

An outstanding football and baseball player at Brown from 1887 to 1889, John William Heisman became one of the leading coaches and a dominant personality in intercollegiate football during the ensuing 45 years until his death in 1936. After obtaining his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania, he launched a football coaching career at Oberlin College that extended through a long series of successes at Akron, Alabama Poly, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Penn, Washington and Jefferson, and Rice. He did much to "open up" the game by use of the forward pass and the shifting line. At Georgia Tech, where he coached for 16 years, his teams of 1915-16-17 won 25 straight and rolled up 1,129 points to their opponents' 61. After retiring from coaching he became Physical Director of the Downtown Athletic Club of New York and was one of the founders and first president of the Touchdown Club. In his honor, the Downtown A.C. established the Heisman Trophy, which is presented annually to the outstanding collegiate football player in the nation. Born in Cleveland, Oct. 23, 1869, he died on Oct. 3, 1936.

DeORMAND [Tuss] McLAUGHRY

A 55-year association with football as player, coach and administrator was duly acknowledged in December, 1962, when Tuss McLaughry was inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hall of Fame. From the day he played his first football game at Sharon, Pa., High School in 1907, Tuss and football were inseparable, except for distinguished service in World War II. A standout player at Michigan State and Westminster, he began his coaching career at the latter college in 1915. He coached four years at Amherst, 1922-25, and his last team there was the highest scoring team in the history of the Little Three. He then moved to Brown, where he guided the famed Iron Men of 1926 to the only undefeated season in the school's history. His 1928 and 1932 teams lost only one game. Before leaving Brown for Dartmouth in 1941, he had the pleasure of coaching his son, John. Later at Dartmouth another son, Bob played for him. His 1948 and 1949 teams were the first in Dartmouth's history to win six major games. He coached East squads in the San Francisco Shrine game four times, the New York All-Star Game in 1940 and the Chicago All-Star Game in 1947. After retiring from coaching in 1954, Tuss continued to serve the American Football Coaches Association as secretary-treasurer. He died in 1975.

FREDERICK DOUGLAS [Fritz] POLLARD '16

Probably the greatest player ever to perform for Brown, and ranked as one of the greatest black players ever to perform in college ranks, Fritz Pollard was the star of Brown's 1915 team which played in the first official Rose Bowl game (1916), and the '16 team which compiled an 8-1 record and ranks among the University's best. Walter Camp, whose All-American selections are regarded as the last word for the era he covered, ranked Pollard as "one of the greatest runners these eyes have ever seen." In 1916 he scored all three touchdowns as Brown handed Yale its lone defeat of the season, 21-6, and scored two and set up the other in the 21-0 victory against Harvard. Born in Chicago January 27, 1894, Pollard presently resides in New Rochelle, N.Y.

EDWARD NORTH ROBINSON, '96

If any man deserves recognition as "the father of Brown football," it is Edward North Robinson. His influence spans more than a quarter of a century — from 1892 when he entered Brown and helped put the game on a sound basis as an undergraduate, to 1925 when he wound up an illustrious coaching career that covered 24 seasons at his alma mater. He won nine letters in his playing days, four in football. But more important was his activity in helping the grid take root when baseball was THE sport at Brown. He served three separate terms as head coach, the last covering 16 years, and won 140 games against 82 losses and 12 ties at a time when Eastern football was undisputedly the nation's best, and Brown was often called upon to meet the top grid powers with undermanned forces.

Born in Lynn, Mass. on October 15, 1893, he died on March 10, 1945. His coaching record at Brown follows:

WILLIAM EARL SPRACKLING, '12

Brown's only three-time All-American, the 150-pound Sprackling is rated by many as the finest all-around football player in the school's history. As a quarterback he could beat a team in many ways. One of the game's most successful pioneers with the forward pass, he threw 10 touchdown aeriels, a figure exceeded only seven times by Bruin passers since 1911. In addition, he was a brilliant runner, a heady field general and an adept field-goal kicker. He kicked three field goals against Yale in 1910. He owns the Brown record for most yards gained on kickoff returns in a single game with 147 against the Carlisle Indians in 1909. His three Brown teams won 21 games, lost 8 and tied 2. The Cleveland, Ohio, native was selected on Walter Camp's All-American teams in 1909-10-11 and in 1964 became the sixth man connected with Brown football to be elected to the National Hall of Fame. He is now retired from his position as president of the Anaconda Wire and Cable Company and lives in Beverly Hills, Calif.

W. WALLACE WADE, '17

A member of the 1915 Brown team that played Washington State in the first Rose Bowl game on Jan. 1, 1916, Wally Wade earned a place among the great coaches

of American intercollegiate football during an illustrious career that spanned 40 years. After serving his apprenticeship as a high school coach and an assistant at Vanderbilt, he took over the head coaching reins at Alabama in 1923 and built the Crimson Tide into a major football power, winning 61 of 74 games and taking three of his teams to the Rose Bowl. Moving to Duke University in 1931, he sent two Blue Devil squads to the Rose Bowl and compiled a record of 110 victories, 36 losses and 10 ties through 1950, when he retired to become the Commissioner of the Southern Conference. In addition to his achievements in the field of coaching, he distinguished himself in service during two World Wars. He interrupted his tenure at Duke at the age of 53 to serve as a lieutenant colonel in the artillery during World War II, taking part in several major battles in the European Theatre. Wally was born in Trenton, Tennessee on June 15, 1892. Now retired from his Southern Conference post, he operates his 120-acre livestock farm near Durham, N.C.

CHARLES "RIP" ENGLE

The latest member of Brown's football family inducted into the Hall of Fame is Charles "Rip" Engle, head coach of the Bruin gridiron teams from 1944 through 1949 and then head mentor at Penn State until his retirement in 1966. Engle was inducted January, 1973. Recognized as one of the top coaches in his profession, Engle guided Brown to a 28-20-4 record in six years, including marks of 7-2-0 and 9-1-0 his final two seasons. His success at Penn State, where he compiled a 04-48-4 record, was amazing. He guided Penn State to post-season Bowl appearances almost every season, or so it seemed, and he coached in all-star games too numerous to mention. Engle learned his football under the old master, Dick Harlow, while at Western Maryland. He graduated in 1930 and moved into the high school ranks, where he coached at Waynesboro High (Pennsylvania) for 11 years. He joined the Bruin staff in 1942 as an assistant to Neil "Skip" Stahley and when the latter entered the Navy, Engle was appointed head coach. Engle now lives in University Park, Pa.

THE IRON MEN

Beside being the only undefeated team in Brown history, the 1926 team earned even greater fame as the "Iron Men," so-called because the starting 11 played 60 minutes without substitution on consecutive weeks against Yale and Dartmouth, and well into the fourth quarter against Harvard later in the season. They lost their chance for an undefeated-untied season in the last game when Colgate earned a 10-10 deadlock. The team was ranked among the top 10 nationally. Its members were Captain Hal Broda and Thurston Towle, ends; Ed Kevorkian and Paul Hodge, tackles; Lou Farber and Orland Smith, guards; Charles Considine, center; Red Randall, quarterback; Dave Mishel and Ed Lawrence, halfbacks; and Al Cornsweet, fullback.

BROWN IN FIRST OFFICIAL ROSE BOWL

Since the late 1940's, Rose Bowl participants have been representatives of the Pacific-8 and Big Ten Conferences. It has not always been so, however. It was under Ed Robinson, a graduate in 1896 and for many years head coach, that Brown journeyed westward in 1915 to play in the first Tournament of Roses New Year's Day classic at Pasadena, CA.

The Bruins were chosen as the Eastern representative after posting a 5-3-1 mark. Those losses came via a 7-0 setback to Amherst and 6-0 to Syracuse, a 16-7 loss to Harvard and a scoreless game with Trinity. Brown outscored its opponents 167-32 that year, defeating URI 38-0, Willilams 33-0, Vermont 46-0, Yale 3-0 and much heralded Carlisle 39-3.

In that first game, played January 1, 1916, Brown, with its brilliant Fritz Pollard, was opposed by the powerful team of Washington State. It came up mud on that day memorial in Brown gridiron history and Pollard was unable to cut loose as he had been accustomed to do on Eastern gridirons. WSU won, 14-0, but to Brown always will belong the distinction of having been the first Eastern team to play in the Rose Bowl.

THE UNIVERSITY

Brown University, located in Providence, Rhode Island, is a coeducational Ivy League school where one of the most innovative and flexible curricula in the nation combines with over two hundred years of New England tradition to form an academic community of intellectual depth and social diversity.

Founded in 1764 in Warren, R.I. as Rhode Island College, the nation's seventh and New England's third oldest college, the school was moved to Providence in 1770. Its name was changed that year to Brown University in recognition of the contributions of Nicholas Brown.

Brown today has a one-to-ten faculty-student ratio and offers its undergraduates opportunities to study with first rate faculty who also teach at the graduate level. A development of major significance at Brown was the initiation in 1969 of a liberalized New Curriculum which offered the student the opportunity to design and control the pattern of his or her undergraduate education. Considered at the time one of the most flexible and progressive academic programs to be found at any major university in the country, the New Curriculum was the result of three years of discussion and debate among students, faculty and the University officials.

In 1974 the University accepted the first freshman class into its new seven-year medical program. Brown's is the first full-fledged medical school in the state of Rhode Island.

Women were first admitted in 1891 when the Women's College in Brown University was established. In 1928 that division was renamed Pembroke College and for many years the women had a separate campus and extracurricular life while participating in classes with the men and earning Brown degrees. The two undergraduate colleges were merged in July 1971.

Brown maintains a strong tradition of dedication to both undergraduate and graduate education in the humanities, arts and sciences. While the University's two centuries of existence have involved constant expansion and adaptation of academic programs to encompass expanding spheres of knowledge, these changes have been accomplished with an overriding concern for the importance of sustaining an environment of scholarship and community with the growing university.
