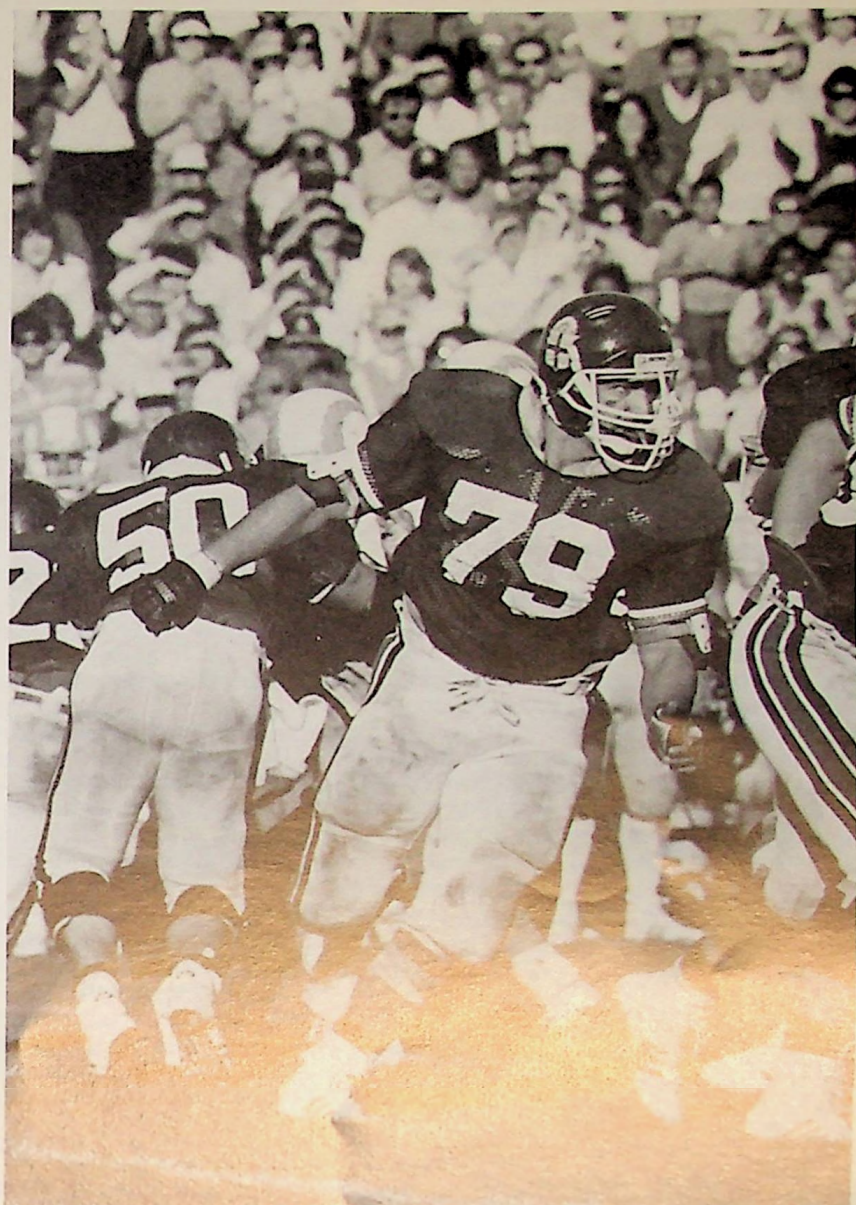

The 1986 Brown University Football Media Guide is dedicated to the memory of John F. "Jay" Barry '50. The founder and member of Brown's Hall of Fame, editor of the *Brown Football Association Newsletter* in the 1960s and '70s, noted Sports historian, author of *Gentlemen Under the Elms* and *A Tale of Two Centuries* and long-time friend to Brown football died on December 13, 1985, after a four year battle with cancer. The Brown press box, which is named in his honor, will greatly miss the presence of Jay, who missed but one game in Brown Stadium since World War II.

ABOUT BROWN UNIVERSITY . . .

Brown University is located in the City of Providence, the capital of Rhode Island, at the head of Narragansett Bay. The main campus of the University is on College Hill in a residential area overlooking the center of the city. Brown is a coeducational Ivy League school where one of the most innovative and flexible curricula in the nation combines with over two hundred years of New England tradition to form an academic community of intellectual depth and social diversity.

The history of Brown reaches back over more than two centuries and tells of a university constantly undergoing change. Brown was established with a charter from the Colony's General Assembly in 1764 as the seventh college in America, and the third in New England.

In September 1765, the first men registered at the college, then known as Rhode Island College and located in Warren, Rhode Island. In 1770 the school was moved to a hill in Providence and in 1804 its name was changed to Brown University in recognition of the contributions of Nicholas Brown. In the 1880's graduate courses were first offered and the Graduate School was established in 1927.

Women were first admitted in 1891 when the Women's College in Brown University was established. In 1928 that division was renamed Pembroke College and for many years the women had a separate campus and extracurricular life while participating in classes with the men and earning Brown degrees. The two undergraduate colleges were merged in July 1974.

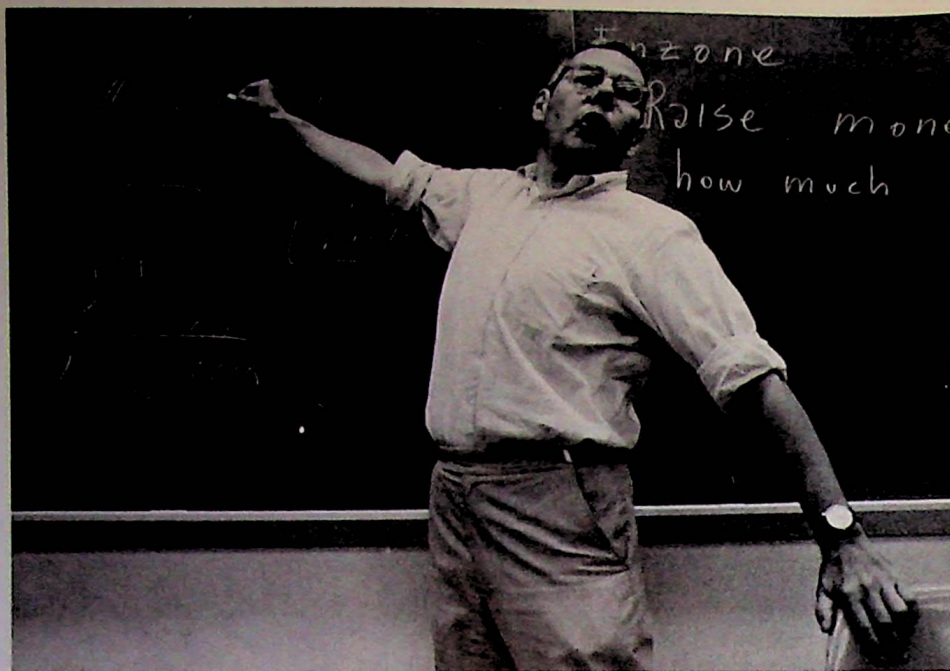

The Faculty

465 full-time professors, 60 visiting and adjunct professors. As a university-college with one faculty for all students from freshmen to Ph.D. and M.D. candidates, Brown offers the class size and student faculty ratio (11:1) of a small college.

The Curriculum

Brown's "New Curriculum," designed jointly by students and faculty during the late 1960's, involves each student in the design of his or her own academic program.

Other than guidelines within each of the 70 standard concentrations, no specific courses are required, and there are no distribution requirements. The large number of interdisciplinary courses and programs widens the choices available to students and encourages exploration outside of a student's field of concentration. Independent study is encouraged, as is the design of independent concentrations.

In addition, freshmen have the option of taking *Modes of Thought* seminars. These small seminars, built around topics of special interest from "Utopia" to "Biological Timekeeping," offer the opportunity to work closely with other students and a professor or graduate student in areas which extend beyond a single discipline.

Degrees Offered

Bachelor of Arts in 70 areas of Humanities, Social Sciences, Mathematics, Engineering, and Natural and Physical Sciences.

Bachelor of Science in Applied Mathematics, Aquatic Biology, Biochemistry, Biology, Biophysics, Chemistry, Computer Science, Engineering, Geological Sciences, Physics, Psychology and Pure Mathematics.

Medical Education Program for 60 well-qualified freshmen who may combine undergraduate and medical studies in an 8

year continuum. Students may earn an A.B. or Sc.B degree and the M.D. degree.

Bachelor of Arts/Master of Science (combined degree program).

Facilities

The University library system contains more than 3,000,000 items including bound volumes, periodicals, maps, sheet music and manuscripts, and procures more than 60,000 items each year. The John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Library serves as the primary humanities and social sciences resource center and contains a group of computer terminals open for student use. The fourteen-floor Science Library houses the University's collection of science books and periodicals; open stacks in these libraries provide easy access to bound volumes.

Other libraries on campus include the John Hay (special collections, rare books and manuscripts), the John Carter Brown (early Americana), the Annmary Brown Memorial (world-famous collection of incunabula), and the Pembroke Campus Library, which features a "new books" section.

Brown also offers over 600 laboratories for both research and instruction as well as approximately 90 computer terminals located around the campus for student use.

Brown's 50 acres of sports areas include the football stadium, gymnasium, hockey rink, Olympic-size swimming pool, squash and handball courts, saunas, an outdoor all-weather track, 14 tennis courts and numerous playing fields. A new sports complex houses basketball, tennis, and volleyball courts

as well as a 6-lane, 200-meter flat track. This multi-level facility also features a 26,000 square-foot support facility of weight-training and locker rooms in addition to a roof-top artificially surfaced playing field.

The Haffenreffer Estate, 15 miles from main campus, offers 475 acres occupying a mile of shorefront and houses the University's anthropology museum.

Activities

Brown students are involved in over 130 organizations reflecting their wide variety of interests. From a daily campus newspaper to special interest groups such as the Outing Club, Brown students can choose to participate in any number of political, athletic, service, social, dramatic, recreational, and ethnic activities.

Many Brown students do volunteer service either while in attendance in the college or by taking time away from the campus. To encourage such service the University, with a gift from the C.V. Starr Foundation, has established a program of special fellowships for students who have engaged in full-time volunteer public service.

ATHLETICS AT BROWN

Brown University offers an exciting athletic program which includes 15 men's and women's varsity sports.

For Men ...

Football, soccer, cross country, water polo, ice hockey, basketball, wrestling, indoor track, swimming, baseball, tennis, lacrosse, golf, crew and outdoor track.

For Women ...

Soccer, volleyball, cross country, field hockey, basketball, ice hockey, swimming, gymnastics, squash, indoor track, lacrosse, tennis, softball, crew and outdoor track.

In addition, the University offers a number of club sports, and a wide range of intramural and physical education activities.

PHILOSOPHY ON ATHLETICS

Philosophically, Brown believes that its athletic programs should represent the same level of excellence found in any other area of the University. Excellence in athletics, however, has not been achieved at the expense of the student-athlete. The absence of night meetings, spring practice, athletic dorms and athletically related financial aid all suggest that a proper educational perspective has been maintained. Since the common denominator in this balance is excellence, you can expect to find the same dedication and expertise of the classroom, as well as the demands, manifesting themselves on the playing field. This assures success in both areas.

BRUNO - BROWN'S MASCOT



The birth date of the Brown Bear is January 20, 1904, when he was introduced to the university by Senator Theodore Francis Green, Class of '87.

"The Brown Bear is truly American and, most important of all, he embodies and suggests those qualities we want to emphasize," the Senator wrote. "While somewhat unsociable, he is good-natured and clean. While courageous and ready to fight, he does not look for trouble for its own sake, nor is he blood-thirsty. He is not one of a herd but acts independently. He is intelligent and capable of being educated (if caught young enough!). Remember, an athlete can make Phi Beta Kappa. Furthermore, the bear's color is brown; and its name is Brown."

Bear cub mascots appeared on the sidelines at Brown games for many years. They were presented to the University by an animal farm, and their care and feeding was entrusted to the Brown Key organization.

The live bear mascot was replaced by a costumed bear in 1963.

A Record of Success

According to responses received by Brown's deans for the Class of 1985, approximately

- 45% pursued graduate or professional study immediately
- 93% of those applying to law school gained admission
- 91% of those applying to medical school gained admission
- 100% of those applying to business school gained admission

BROWN UNIVERSITY SPORTS FOUNDATION

Brown University, in a major commitment to the future of its athletic programs, has created the Brown University Sports Foundation, the purpose of which is to endow all athletic teams. This pioneer approach — the direction of the future — for support of its sports program demonstrates Brown's commitment to excellence in all its endeavors — excellence in academics and excellence in athletics.

PRESIDENT HOWARD SWEARER



Howard R. Swearer, a 52-year-old political scientist and former president of Carleton College in Northfield, Minnesota, was named president of Brown University in August of 1976 and assumed office in January of 1977. He is the 15th president in Brown's 222-year history.

Raised in Wichita, Kansas, Swearer received his B.A. with high honors from Princeton's Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs in 1954, his M.A. (1956) and Ph.D. (1960) from Harvard and his LL.D. from Princeton (1977).

Swearer came to Carleton from the Ford Foundation, where he served as program officer in the international division (1967) and program officer in charge, European and international affairs (1968-70). In those capacities, he was responsible for a multi-million dollar international scholar-exchange program.

From 1960 to 1967, Swearer taught in the political science department of the University of California at Los Angeles. While at U.C.L.A., Swearer directed U.C.L.A.'s Peace Corps training programs for Nigeria, Chile, Ecuador, and Ethiopia, and was chairman of a statewide committee on Peace Corps activities. In 1964, he served as acting director of the university's Russian and East European Studies Center.

Prior to joining the U.C.L.A. faculty, Swearer was an American Political Science Association

Congressional Fellow (1959), and served as a lieutenant in the U.S. Army (1957-58).

He is currently a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, and is a member of the Board of Directors of Textron, Inc. and a member of the Board of Directors for A Better Chance, Inc. He is also a member of the NCAA Select Committee on Athletic Problems and Concerns in Higher Education.

Swearer and his wife, Janet Baker Swearer, have three sons.

PRESIDENT HOWARD SWEARER ON ATHLETICS — "I am very optimistic about the kind of athletic program we offer in the Ivy League. We are trying to maintain a balanced athletic program for men and women which fits into the total educational process. The fact that a large portion of athletic expenses are paid by the general college budget is a telling factor and explains our interest in, and commitment to, a well-rounded athletic program.

"We like to have winning teams, but this cannot overshadow other important objectives of the University — the most important of which is that every student can test his or her interests and abilities, develop skills, and gain knowledge and values, which will be of use to them in their lifetime."

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR JOHN PARRY



John C. Parry now directs the athletic program in which he once was a co-captain and All-Ivy football player and a letter-winner in basketball and lacrosse. The 43-year-old administrator became Brown University's director of Athletics in January of 1979. He oversees 30 men's and women's varsity sports and an extensive intramural, physical education and recreational program.

One of Parry's major concerns as director has been providing the best available facilities for Brown athletes. Just this summer, a state of the art tuned indoor track from California Products was installed in Brown's Olney-Margolies athletic center. Parry was instrumental in the design and construction of that award-winning building which was dedicated in the fall of 1981. Since then, he has actively pursued the sale of Marvel Gym to facilitate the construction of a new gymnasium. That structure would complete the complex at Aldrich-Dexter adjacent to the main campus.

An active member in both regional and national affiliations, Parry will serve as President of the ECAC this year and will also chair the NCAA men's lacrosse committee. He has been a member of the ECAC Executive Council and Chairman of the ECAC Finance Committee for three years. Parry is also an advisor for the weekly I-AA Football national poll.

Following his 1965 graduation with a degree in economics, Parry earned his master's in business administration in 1967 from the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton Graduate School. While at Penn he served as assistant coach of the freshman football and lacrosse teams and completed his six-year service in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve.

Parry spent the next eight years in the data processing field, first as a marketing representative for IBM, then vice-president and co-founder of Instant Data Inc., a Philadelphia-

based computer services firm.

In 1975, he returned to Brown as assistant athletic director and two years later was elevated to associate director. During those years he had responsibilities in scheduling, team travel, admissions, eligibility, and as an assistant football and lacrosse coach.

A native of Marcellus, N.Y., Parry is a graduate of Marcellus Central High School where he lettered in football, basketball, baseball and track. He, his wife Anne Brodhead Parry, and their two children, Alyson and Jennifer, reside in Barrington, R.I.

John Parry on the Brown Student/Athlete — "Bright...articulate...questioning...skilled young men and women. Some harbor dreams of professional athletics but when they do, at least they hedge their chances by securing the best education possible. Brown is a happy place...our athletes host visiting prospects and the feedback is mostly positive."

On Brown Athletics — "Brown is an exciting upbeat place to be. We are committed to athletic programs for all...recreational, instructional, intramural and intercollegiate. Close to 80% of the Brown Community participate in one or more of the above programs... The intercollegiate program is board-based; 15 varsity sports for men and 15 varsity sports for women."

On Coaching in the Ivy League — "The Ivy League is the toughest intercollegiate league in the country to coach in. We ask our coaches to compete on a Division I level with no scholarships and no control over admission decisions and they do it. Players play on a completely voluntary basis; when skilled players decide to concentrate on their studies there is no retribution or penalty involved. When players have a late class, they miss practice; studies are the number one priority and we recruit using that as a positive."

JOHN PARRY '65 ... His name still dots the Brown record pages as a leading receiver for the Bears in 1962, 1963 and 1964. He ranks second in career pass receptions with 96 and fifth in yards receiving with 1,190 yards. Parry also rates among the top ten Brown receivers of all time in the single game and season categories of receptions and yards receiving. See pages 66 and 67 for details.

ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATORS

ARLENE GORTON

Associate Athletic Director



Arlene E. Gorton, who has served on the Brown athletic staff since 1961, is responsible for the physical education and intramural programs, the Brown sports camp for children, and assisting John Parry in athletic policy making.

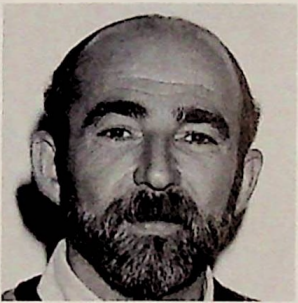
Gorton, a 1952 graduate of Brown, earned her master's degree in education in 1954 from the University of North Carolina.

She then joined the staff at Connecticut College as a physical education instructor until 1961 when she returned to her alma mater as chairperson of the Women's Physical Education Department. In 1973 Gorton became Assistant Athletic Director and in 1975 was appointed to her present position of Associate Director.

She was awarded a full professorship in June 1978 and is only the second person in Pembroke and Brown athletic history to achieve that rank. Gorton serves on numerous faculty and athletic committees and was listed in *Who's Who In America* in 1984.

RICH SARDELLA

Associate Athletic Director



Richard C. Sardella joined the Brown Athletic Department in 1970 as ticket and business manager. In 1973, he was named assistant athletic director and on July 1, 1977 he was elevated to associate athletic director.

Sardella administers the athletic budget, co-ordinates the use of facilities, the summer program, the men's team scheduling and travel responsibilities.

Sardella earned his bachelor of science degree in marketing in 1969 from Bryant College, and served as freshman baseball coach at Bryant that year. A native of Jersey City, N.J., he now resides in Newport, R.I.

JOAN TAYLOR

Assistant Athletic Director



Joan W. Taylor has been a member of the Brown athletic staff since 1969. After being promoted to the position of Assistant Athletic Director in July, 1978, she has been responsible for NCAA and Ivy Eligibility and shares in team scheduling and travel responsibilities along with general administrative duties. She is also secretary of the Brown Hall of Fame Selection Committee. Taylor served as head women's tennis

coach for eight years, guiding the team to an overall record of 69 wins and 28 losses.

A native of Bristol, Ct., Taylor attended Springfield College (Mass.) where she competed in field hockey, volleyball and tennis while earning her Bachelor of Science degree in physical education in 1961.

She, her husband John, and two children, Steven and Janet, live in Barrington, R.I.

ED BARRY

Manager of Support Services



Edward J. Barry was appointed Manager of Support Services in 1980 after having served as Promotions Officer at Brown since 1976. He coordinates and manages all field services including game preparation and is also involved with facility scheduling. In addition, he continues to direct the promotions of Brown athletics.

Barry graduated from Brown in 1952 and spent 23 years in marketing positions with the Bell System. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Brown Club of Rhode Island, the Brown Football Association and the Brown Hockey Association. He is President of the Brown Hall of Fame Selection Committee and is also President of the class of '52. He and his wife Alice live in Charlestown.

JEAN ELLIOTT

Director of Sports Information



Jean Elliott was appointed sports information director in May of 1984 after having served as assistant director for a year.

Before joining Brown, Elliott directed sports information duties at Salisbury State College for two years where she also received her Master's of Education with an English concentration. She earned her undergraduate degree in Sports Journalism and Publicity from Wash-

ern Maryland College.

Elliott competed in a number of sports in college. She was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and served as captain of both the softball and basketball teams.

Elliott is an active member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), serving on the Publicists for Women's Sports Committee. She is a member of Words Unlimited and last year served as President of the Ivy League SIDs. She is single and resides in Providence.

BRIAN O'FRIEL

Assistant Director of Sports Information



Brian O'Friel joined the Brown athletic department in August 1984 as the assistant director of sports information. He is involved in all aspects of the sports information program for the Bears' 30 varsity teams.

Frank George has been the head trainer at Brown since 1966. In May, 1974 he was elected president of the National Athletic Trainers Association and was re-elected in 1976 to serve a second year. A 1962 graduate of the University of Massachusetts, he was the first East Coast trainer to be elected president in the 28-year history of the NATA.

Following graduation from UMass, George received his certificate of physical therapy from Boston University. In 1970 he received his NATA certification.

During his undergraduate years at Massachusetts he served as student trainer for three years. He was football trainer at Medford (Mass.) High in

1962 and staff physical therapist of Fitzsimmons General Hospital from 1964-66.

George, a native of Boston, served as a trainer for the USA Olympic Team at Innsbruck in 1976 and also lectured in Japan as a guest of the country. In 1980 he was a supervisor of athletic trainers for the Winter Olympic Games at Lake Placid. He is also associate editor of the Year Book of Sports Medicine and chairman of the NATA scholarship committee.

Frank and his wife Lynn have four children: Lynn, John, Karen and Christopher. Lynn and John are both attending Brown.

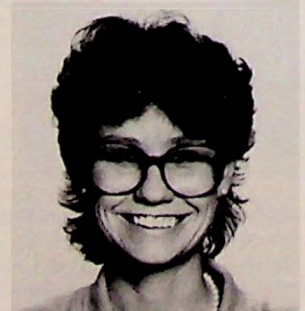

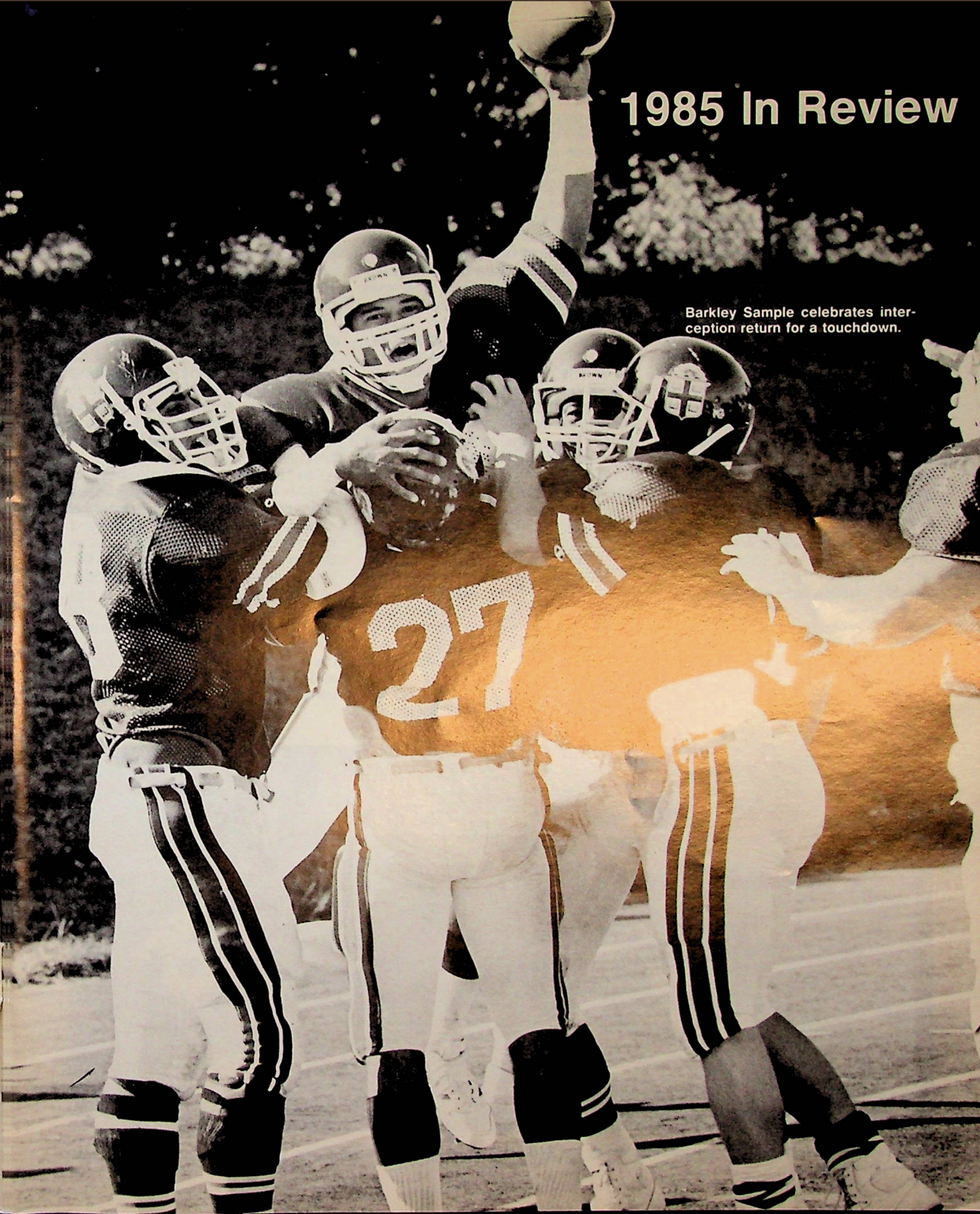

1985 In Review

1985 CAPSULE REVIEW

In the opinion of many Ivy football followers, the best team in the League in 1985 finished fourth. Brown, which posted a 4-3 Ivy slate and a 5-4-1 overall record, was that fourth place team. Statistically, the Bruins ranked first in team offense and also ranked number one in team defense. Brown also led the Ivies in scoring defense, allowing just 52 points in seven League encounters. Posting four shutouts, the Bruins lost three Ivy games by a total of 12 points: a conversion, a field goal and a touchdown away from an Ivy title.

Brown opened the season with a narrow 10-9 loss at Yale where the Bruins were foiled twice in the final 1:37 to prevent a come from behind victory. First a two-point conversion try was unsuccessful and then on the final play of the game a 52-yard field goal try fell short.

The Bruins showed their potential in the next outing as they pulled a major upset with a 32-27 win over the University of Rhode Island. A defense led by sophomore Walt Cataldo, who made two interceptions, stymied the Rams, the nation's seventh ranked team in Division I-AA at season's end. Jamie Potkul led the offense with 115 yards rushing, earning his first of three Ivy League Player of the Week honors.

Princeton became Brown's first

whitewash victim, 17-0. The defense held the Tigers to five first downs for the game and only 133 yards in total offense. Potkul rambled to weekly honors again with 155 yards on the ground and one touchdown.

Brown travelled to Penn the following week, coming away on the downside of a 17-14 result. The Quakers, which would win their fourth straight Ivy title in 1985, hit a field goal with two seconds remaining to put the loss on the Bruin slate.

Brown returned home to meet Cornell and chalked up another shutout, 22-0. The defense was again outstanding as it pushed the Big Red back to a net of negative 30 yards rushing and 128 yards in total offense. The offensive hero was Chris Ingerslev who tied an Ivy League record with five consecutive field goals. Steve Kettelberger passed for 221 yards while Jamie Simone and Jim Kurp, replacing an ailing Potkul, excelled on the rushing attack.

The Bruins tied Holy Cross, 20-20, in its next game. Ingerslev continued his hot streak connecting on four more field goals, setting a New England record with nine consecutive successful boots.

Against Harvard, the Bruins dominated the game but couldn't come up with the knockout punch as the Crimson escaped with a 25-17 victory. A

154-yard day by Potkul was offset by four turnovers deep in Brown territory which Harvard converted into points.

If the game was only 30 minutes long, Brown would have been victorious at Richmond. The Spiders tallied 29 second half points, however, to overcome the Bears' 13 first half points. The game was particularly costly since quarterback Kettelberger was lost for the year.

The next week, Brown got back on track in Hanover. The Bruins blanked Dartmouth, 22-0. Potkul rushed for 158 yards while the Bear defense held the Big Green to 171 yards in total offense. Keiron Bigby made his debut at quarterback but was knocked out of the game late in the first half.

The 1985 campaign concluded with a 34-0 win over Columbia. Potkul played one of the finest games of his career, rushing for 198 yards and scoring two touchdowns. He became Brown's first single season 1,000-yard rusher and first career 2,000-yard runner. Ingerslev kicked a pair of field goals to set single season and career field goal records. The Brown defense recorded its fourth shutout, the most since the 1930 campaign, and limited the Lions to only 120 yards in total offense for the game.



Gang tackles were not uncommon last season as the Bears' defense sported four shutouts, pacing the League in team and scoring defense.

HEAD COACH JOHN ROSENBERG



John Rosenberg, 40, begins his third season as head coach after leading the Bruins to their first winning season in five years. Since coming to Brown from the Philadelphia Stars of the United States Football League in December of 1983, Rosenberg

has compiled a 9-9-1 record including an 8-6 mark in the Ivy League. Brown registered four Ivy League shutouts last season and ranked as the League's top offensive and defensive squad.

In his first season at Brown, Rosenberg posted a 4-5 record with a 4-3 Ivy mark, not bad for a transition year. Last year, the Bruins bested the .500 mark with a 5-4-1 record as the fruits of recruiting began to make an appearance. The outlook for 1986 is also positive as Brown continues to reap good-sized and talented candidates.

"John is articulate, exceptionally knowledgeable on all levels of football and knows what coach-player communication is all about," commended Athletic Director John Parry. "He understands the place of football in an intercollegiate athletic program and the value of an education.

Rosenberg, the 18th coach in the 107-year history of Brown football, served as the defensive backfield coach for the Philadelphia Stars prior to his arrival at Brown and was a major reason the Stars reached the USFL Championship game in 1983. During his year-long stay with the Stars, the defensive unit was rated as one of the best in the USFL. It led the league in scoring defense, turnover ratio, interceptions and rushing defense.

Before that, Rosenberg spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Penn State. He had his first association with the Nittany Lions in 1970-71, serving under Joe Paterno '50 as a part-time assistant while finishing his Masters degree. He received his M.Ed.

in counseling from PSU in the spring of 1970. He then went to Villanova where he was defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for two years before turning to State College in 1974. Rosenberg served as Penn State's recruiting coordinator from 1975-76, coached the outside linebackers in 1977 and then took over as the defensive backfield coach in 1978. He held that post through State's National Championship season of 1982.

John Rosenberg is an outstanding football coach, an outstanding person and a great motivator," lauded coach Paterno. "He added a great deal to our program at Penn State."

Born in Washington, D.C., Rosenberg attended Newton North High School in Massachusetts where he played three years of varsity football and baseball. He then attended Harvard where he graduated in 1967 with a B.A. degree in social psychology. Rosenberg was a linebacker and a defensive back for Head Coach John Yovicsin from 1964-66. He then served as assistant freshman coach of the Crimson in 1967 before moving to the University of Pittsburgh where he was a part-time assistant coach and assistant director of financial aid for the next two years.

Having played football at Harvard, Rosenberg has a thorough understanding of the demands placed on student-athletes in the Ivy League. It is this understanding combined with his exceptional football knowledge and experience that make him ideal for the Brown program.

Rosenberg directs the sideline in a way that may be strangely reminiscent of a previous Brown era. After all, Rosenberg's mentor, Joe Paterno, ultimately learned his football from Rip Engle. Engle commanded the Bruin sideline from 1944-49 before moving to Penn State. Paterno not only played for Engle at Brown but gleaned much insight into the game as he assisted Engle for 16 years at Penn State during which the Nittany Lions compiled a 104-48-4 record. In turn, Rosenberg assisted Paterno for 12 years, helping Penn State to a 108-24-0 mark.

Coach Rosenberg on Selected Topics

Ivy League Players

"The most rewarding aspect of coaching here is the quality of the players, particularly here at Brown. They are bright, creative, and achievement oriented. They are a pleasure to be around."

Ivy League Football

"Football in the Ivy League is more purely a melting pot. It's the boy whose parents are paying for his education and the boy who is receiving financial aid, teaming together to make a block. There's no background, no ethnicity, no social or economic labels; just two individuals striving together on a shared cause."

Philadelphia Stars Experience

"That year was an enlightening and enjoyable experience. Carl Peterson put together a great organization. He is very intelligent and knows how to do his job. Jim Mora is a great coach. He has all the right personal qualities and has done a marvelous job of assimilating his many years of experience as an assistant coach."

Working Under Joe Paterno

"Joe is very demanding. I learned a great deal about hard work, self-discipline, and toughness from being around him. He is also a man of great vision. He sees and seeks the fullest potential of a person or situation. He is always one step ahead."

Building a Great Football Team

"The difference between a good and a great football team is the offensive line. A dominant offensive line is the most controlling factor in a football game. You can defend one or two great skill position players."

Planning

"It is important to have a plan for everything. Game plan, practice plan, season plan, program plan."

Enthusiasm

"I'm not a rah-rah, lots of noise coach, either for myself or the team. But I am enthusiastic. There is a difference between enthusiasm and excitement. Enthusiasm is an inspired state; it may be quiet and low-key, or exuberant and buoyant. It is there naturally. Excitement is something that is added on or put out, it is noise or outer form."

Focusing

"I believe in concentration on the present moment. I call it focusing. The past is gone and the future is unavailable to us. In the context of a football program that means one game at a time, and one play at a time. Play as hard as you can on each down, because that is all that you can do anything about right now."

Responsibility

"The college years are very transitional. You come from a very programmed existence of High School and family and end up going out in the world to be a self-reliant individual. It is important along the way to develop responsibility, to fulfill the agreements that you choose to make. If you say you're going to do something, do it. If you have an appointment at 3:00, be there at 3:00."

Self-Determination

"I believe in taking the responsibility for your own existence. Be in charge. Be at the cause of your existence rather than at its effect."

TOM GROOM — Assistant to the Head Coach/Running Backs



Tom Groom begins his third season as the Brown running back coach and second as the assistant to the head coach. He coached Jamie Potkul, the Bruins' all-time leading rusher, the past two seasons.

A highly respected assistant football coach at Maryland from 1972 to 1982, Groom served as offensive backfield coach when the Terrapins played in the Peach Bowl (1973), Liberty Bowl (1974), Gator Bowl (1975), Cotton Bowl (1977), Hall of Fame Classic (1977), Sun Bowl (1978) and Tangerine Bowl (1980).

In 1982-83, Groom tutored the defensive line at Marshall University, and previous to his stay at Maryland, he had been an assistant coach at the University of Colorado and West Point.

"Tom and I have coached against each other while I was at Penn State and he was at Maryland, and have worked together at many summer camps," said head coach John Rosenberg. "I always felt he was one of the finest fundamental teachers in college football. My feelings have only been reinforced by our working together here at Brown."

Groom is a graduate of Virginia Polytechnic Institute where he played varsity football for three seasons and captained the 1966 Liberty Bowl team. He holds a B.S. in business administration and also served as an officer in the Army from 1969-71.

A West Virginia native, Tom and his wife Patty reside in Warwick. Tom has two children: Tommy is a junior at the University of Maryland and Gina is a senior at South River High School.

PETER GIUNTA — Quarterbacks



Peter Giunta begins his third season with the new assignment of working with the quarterbacks after coaching the tight ends and receivers in his first two years.

Prior to coming to Brown, Giunta spent three years at Penn State coaching tight ends, directing the offensive scouting and handling several phases of the kicking game. He also served as Penn State's liaison with scouts from the NFL and USFL.

"Peter and I worked together on the National Championship staff and I found him to be a hard-working, thorough young coach," said Rosenberg. "He is also very intelligent and has an excellent grasp of the kicking game. His ties to the Boston area have been a big help to our recruiting program."

Giunta attended Northeastern University from 1974-77 and played football for four years. He graduated in 1977 with high honors and a B.S. degree in physical education. Following graduation he was an assistant coach at Swampscott (Mass.) High School for three years and a physical education teacher at Salem (Mass.) High before moving to Penn State.

During his years at Penn State he worked on his Master's degree in physical education. Peter and his wife Cindy have a daughter named Christine.

MIKE WESTON — Offensive Line



Mike Weston enters his third season with the Brown coaching staff and his second as offensive line coach for the Bruin varsity. He also served as the Bruin strength coach.

A former player in the USFL, Weston served as the offensive line coach for the Brown freshman team during his first year in Providence.

Weston graduated from Adrian College (Mich.) with a B.A. degree in business administration and speech communication. He added a Master of Arts and Education degree from Wayne State University in 1983 with a specialization in sports administration.

He was a member of the Michigan Panthers USFL Championship team in 1983 and was an offensive guard and center with the Chicago Blitz in 1984. Weston coached the offensive and defensive lines for a season at Utica Ford High School in Sterling Heights, Mich.

"Mike's experience in pro football has provided him an excellent background in current techniques and fundamentals," said Rosenberg. "His coaching of the offensive line has demonstrated his ability to teach what he has learned."

DENNY MARIE — Receivers



Denny Marie will direct the Brown receivers this Fall after serving as the defensive coordinator with the freshman team in 1985.

Marie came to Brown from Trinity (Conn.) College where he coached the offensive backfield, special teams, defensive ends and outside linebackers during a three year tenure. Prior to that, he spent seven years at the Coast Guard Academy where he worked with the defensive secondary, the quarterbacks and receivers, and the junior varsity program.

A Roger Williams College graduate who attended the University of Rhode Island for three years, Marie has also coached high school and semi-pro football. He has served on the staff of the Joe Namath Football Camp for 13 years and met Bruin head coach John Rosenberg there.

"Denny has been a positive addition to our staff," said Rosenberg, "and will do an outstanding job with our receivers."

Denny and his wife Peg reside in Warwick.

JOHN TOWNSEND — Defensive Line



John Townsend enters his third season as defensive line coach for the Bruins.

Beginning his 15th year as a college coach, Townsend has had considerable coaching experience in colleges throughout the East and Midwest. He has coached at two Big 10 schools, serving as defensive line coach at Indiana and offensive line coach at Illinois. He has also assisted at Illinois State and Central Michigan.

Townsend also has previous Ivy League experience, tutoring the defensive line at Dartmouth from 1975-77. He also coached linebackers at Morgan State for two seasons.

"John's combination of Ivy League experience and Big 10 experience are a perfect blend for our situation at Brown," said Rosenberg. "He has done an outstanding job coaching our defensive line."

A graduate of Morehouse College in Atlanta, Townsend earned his M.A. in Physical Education at Illinois State University in 1973.

A native of Chicago, John and his wife Barbara have two sons, Jason and Derek. John is currently involved with the Fox Point boys' baseball program and he is also a board member of the Nathan Bishop Middle School parent-teacher organization.

STEVE REESE — Linebackers



Steve Reese, former recruiting coordinator and defensive coordinator at Columbia, joins the Brown coaching staff this season as the linebacker coach and recruiting coordinator.

Reese coached one season at Columbia under Jim Garrett and had been retained by current head coach Larry McElreavy for the 1986 season before deciding to move to Providence. The New Philadelphia, Ohio native served as defensive secondary coach at Princeton for two seasons before joining Columbia for the 1985 campaign.

"Steve has outstanding experience in the Ivy League both as a coach and as a recruiter," said Head Coach John Rosenberg.

Steve and his wife Kathleen have a daughter Heather Aileen who was born in April.

RON BROWN — Defensive Backs/Assistant to the Athletic Director



Ron Brown, a 1979 graduate of Brown University who served as head freshman coach in 1983, handles the defensive backs. In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Brown will develop and coordinate a program designed to reach a diverse group of students, parents, educators, and coaches, with information about Brown University, the college in general, and the proper balance between academics and athletics. He will also be involved in the Brown alumni organization.

"Ron is a fine coach, who as an alumnus and former player, understands and represents the University in the very best ways possible," Rosenberg remarked.

Brown is handling familiar territory. He ranks as one of the greatest defensive backs in Brown's history. During his career with the Bruins, he had seven interceptions in his first two seasons, then none as a senior when opponents threw away from him. He had 115 tackles in his career and was ranked as "the best safety I've ever had," by former head coach John Anderson. In 1985, Brown was inducted into the Brown Sports Hall of Fame.

Brown signed contracts with several professional teams after graduation and was a defensive backfield coach of the New Jersey Rams semi-pro football team.

A Native of Vineyard Haven, Mass., he earned his A.B. degree in sociology with an emphasis on medicine and public health. He went on to grad school at Columbia, getting his M.P.H. in 1982 in health administration with specialization in health education. He also served as a program fund raiser for the Columbia Alumni Association from 1980 to 1982.

Ron is married to Molvina Carter of San Diego, California.

Phillips left Brown after only a year to become the defensive coordinator at Virginia Military Institute. He moved to Marshall University at the close of the 1985 season as a member of the defensive staff before deciding to return to Providence.

Brown could very well be the up and coming team of the Ivy League under the direction of Head Coach John Rosenberg. In his second year at the helm, Rosenberg produced Brown's first winning season (5-4-1) in five years and posted a 4-3 Ivy mark. All of those wins were shutouts with the other victory a particularly sweet triumph over cross-state rival University of Rhode Island, a second straight NCAA playoff team which finished seventh in the nation last year. The encouraging news for 1986 is that 32 lettermen return, including 11 starters.

"This can be a very good football team. There are more good players with stronger competition for positions than we've had in our two previous seasons. The players have worked very hard to develop their individual ability levels. Although we have to make a few important position decisions, overall we have more depth and more experience and hopefully a positive carryover from last season."



Larry Carbone completed 10 of 18 passes and collected 213 yards against Cornell in 1979.

- Nov. 13, 1878** — Brown plays its first game of intercollegiate football travelling to Amherst to do battle with the Lord Jeffs.
- Nov. 24, 1895** — In first meeting with Dartmouth at Outing Park, Springfield, Mass. Brown wins, 20-4.
- Nov. 29, 1894** — The first Thanksgiving Day game in Brown's history, a 20-4 victory over MIT at Adelaide Park, Providence.
- 1894 Season** — Paced by its first set of touchdown twins, William Burr Hopkins and Charles D. Millard, Brown finishes the season 10-4 and is ranked fifth in the nation.
- 1896 Season** — Brown may not have had the best team in the country, but it did have the richest manager — John D. Rockefeller, Jr. '97.
- Nov. 6, 1898** — Willie Richardson kicks first Brown field goal in 16-5 victory over the Newton A.C.
- 1899 Season** — Brown moves into its new football home on Camp Street. Called Andrews Field after former Brown president, Benjamin Andrews, the field remained Brown's football home through the 1924 season.
- Nov. 30, 1899** — In its first inter-sectional game, Brown meets the University of Chicago at Marshall Field on Thanksgiving Day.
- Oct. 18, 1902** — Capt. Tom Barry scores all Brown's points on TD runs of 50 and 31 yards and on a 28-yard field goal as Bruins beat Penn for the first time, 15-6, at Franklin Field.
- Nov. 25, 1905** — The bear makes its first appearance as a Brown mascot at the Dartmouth game in Hanover.
- Sept. 29, 1906** — The forward pass was legalized for the 1906 season and QB Vic Schwartz threw the first pass for Brown in the opener against New Hampshire.
- Nov. 24, 1906** — Halfback Johnny Mahew scored twice on spectacular runs in 23-0 victory over Dartmouth and becomes first Bruin named to Walter Camp's All-America first team.
- Sept. 26, 1908** — QB Bill Sprackling completes first Brown TD pass, a 40-yarder to end Spike Dennie.
- Nov. 5, 1910** — Sprackling has the greatest day of any Brown back in leading Brown to 21-0 victory over Yale. He kicked three field goals and accounted for 456 yards.
- Jan. 1, 1916** — Brown meets Washington State in first official Rose Bowl game.
- Nov. 18, 1916** — Fritz Pollard has two TDs and gains 140 yards rushing in leading Brown to 21-0 victory over Harvard and earning first team All-American honors from Walter Camp.
- Oct. 24, 1925** — Brown Stadium is dedicated during Brown-Yale game before 27,000.
- Oct. 23, 1926** — The Brown Iron Men team is born as 11 starters play full 60 minutes in 7-0 victory over Yale at Yale Bowl.
- Nov. 25, 1926** — Close to 30,000 see Brown end the season undefeated after battling Colgate to 10-10 tie on Thanksgiving Day morning at Brown Stadium.
- 1932 Season** — Brown's Cinderella team meets previous undefeated opponent eight straight weeks, defeating URI, Springfield, Yale, Tufts, Harvard, Holy Cross, and Columbia before losing Thanksgiving morning to undefeated, untied, and unscored-upon Colgate before 33,000, the largest home crowd in Brown history.
- Nov. 24, 1938** — In a Turkey Day thriller, Shrine Hall scores 27 points in leading Brown to a 36-27 victory over Columbia and its star, Sid Luckman.
- Oct. 10, 1942** — Junior Halfback Bob Margarita sets an all-time Brown record with 233 yards rushing in 28-21 victory over Columbia and its star, Paul Governelli.
- Nov. 24, 1949** — Trailing 26-7 with 17 minutes left, Brown rallies to crush Colgate, 41-26, Thanksgiving morning on the running and passing of Joe Paterno.
- Oct. 4, 1958** — With fullback Paul Choquette rushing for 113 yards, Brown beats strong Yale team, 35-29.
- Oct. 13, 1973** — Using rollout quarterback Dennis Coleman the first half and passing quarterback Pete Beatrice after intermission, Brown befuddles Yale, 34-25, for Coach Anderson's first victory.
- November, 1976** — Brown defeats Harvard, Dartmouth, and Columbia in the final three games to gain a share of the Ivy League title.
- Nov. 5, 1977** — Ruben Chapa's 32-yard field goal with 9 seconds left gives Brown 13-10 victory over Dartmouth at Hanover.
- 1978 Season** — Centennial Anniversary.
- Nov. 4, 1978** — Rick Vilella snares two point conversion pass from Mark Whipple in final minutes as Brown comes from behind to nip Harvard, 31-30, in Cambridge.
- Oct. 20, 1979** — The Bruins put together near flawless game while beating high flying Cornell, 28-7, at Brown Stadium.
- 1980 Season** — Bruins beat Princeton, Cornell and Columbia for eighth straight year under John Anderson.
- Nov. 5, 1983** — The Bruins battle national power Penn State before a Brown record crowd of 75,000.
- Sept. 21, 1984** — Keiron Bigby sets or ties five NCAA records with three interceptions for 216 yards and two touchdowns. The 27-14 victory over Yale marked John Rosenberg's debut as head coach.

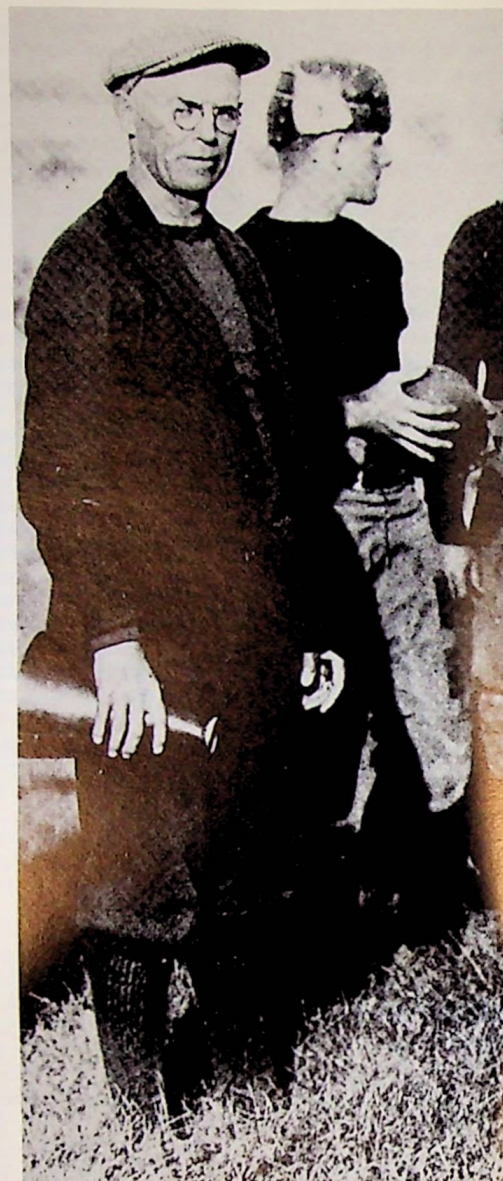


Don Colo is the Bruin who has served the longest stint in the pro ranks (1950-58).

JOHN W. HEISMAN, '91

A name synonymous with quality football, John William Heisman attended Brown from 1887 to 1889 and became one of the leading coaches and a dominant personality in intercollegiate football during the ensuing 45 years until his death in 1936. After obtaining his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania, he launched a football coaching career at Oberlin College that extended through a long series of successes at Akron, Alabama Poly, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Penn, Washington and Jefferson, and Rice. He did much to "open up" the game by use of the forward pass and the shifting line. At Georgia Tech, where he coached for 16 years, his teams of 1915-16-17 won 25 straight and rolled up 1,129 points to their opponents' 61. After retiring from coaching he became Physical Director of the Downtown Athletic Club of New York and was one of the founders and first president of the Touchdown Club. In his honor, the downtown A.C. established the Heisman Trophy, which is presented annually to the outstanding collegiate football player in the nation. Born in Cleveland, Oct. 23, 1869, he died on Oct. 3, 1936.

DeORMAND (Tuss) McLAUGHRY

A 55-year association with football as player, coach and administrator was duly acknowledged in December, 1962, when Tuss McLaughry was inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hall of Fame. From the day he played his first football game at Sharon, Pa. High School in 1907, Tuss and football were inseparable, except for distinguished service in World War II. A standout player at Michigan State and Westminster, he began his coaching career at the latter college in 1915. He coached four years at Amherst, 1922-25, and his last team there was the highest scoring team in the history of the Little Three. He then moved to Brown, where he guided the famed Iron Men of 1926 to the only undefeated season in the school's history. His 1926 and 1932 teams lost only one game. Before leaving Brown for Dartmouth in 1941, he had the pleasure of coaching his son, John, later at Dartmouth, another year. Bob played for him. His 1948 and 1949 teams were the first in Dartmouth's history to win six major games. He coached East squads in the San Francisco Bowl game four times, the New York All-Star Game in 1940 and the Chicago All-Star Game in 1947. After retiring from coaching in 1954, Tuss continued to serve the American Football Coaches Association as secretary-treasurer. He died in 1975.

FREDERICK DOUGLAS (Fritz) POLLARD '16

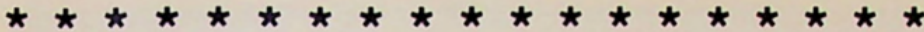
Probably the greatest player ever to perform for Brown and ranked as one of the greatest black players ever to perform in college ranks, Fritz Pollard was the star of Brown's 1915 team which played in the first official Rose Bowl game (1916), and the '16 team which compiled an 8-1 record and ranks among the University's best. Walter Camp, whose All-American selections are regarded as the last word for the era he covered, ranked Pollard as "one of the greatest runners these eyes have ever seen." In 1916 he scored all three touchdowns as Brown handed Yale its lone defeat of the season, 21-6, and scored two and set up the other in the 21-0 victory against Harvard. Born in Chicago January 27, 1894, Pollard died May 11, 1986.

EDWARD NORTH ROBINSON, '96

If any man deserves recognition as "the father of Brown football," it is Edward North Robinson. His influence spans more than a quarter of a century - from 1892 when he entered Brown and helped put the game on a sound basis as an undergraduate, to 1925 when he wound up an illustrious coaching career that covered 24 seasons at his alma mater. He won nine letters in his playing days, four in football. Robinson is credited with helping the grid program take root when baseball was THE sport at Brown. He served three separate terms as head coach, the last covering 16 years, and won 140 games against 82 losses and 12 ties at a time when Eastern football was undisputedly the nation's best, and Brown was often called upon to meet the top grid powers with undermanned forces.

WILLIAM EARL SPRACKLING, '12

Brown's only three-time All-American, the 150-pound Sprackling is rated by many as the finest all-around football player in the school's history. As a quarterback he could beat a team in many ways. One of the game's most successful pioneers with the forward pass, he threw 10 touchdown aeriels, a figure exceeded only seven times by Bruin passers since 1911. In addition, he was a brilliant runner, a heady field general and an adept field-goal kicker. He kicked three field goals against Yale in 1910. He owns the Brown record for most yards gained on kickoff returns in a single game with 147 against the Carlisle Indians in 1909. His three Brown teams won 21 games, lost 8 and tied 2. The Cleveland, Ohio native was selected on Walter Camp's All-American teams in 1909-10-11 and in 1964 became the sixth man connected with Brown football to be elected to the National Hall of Fame. Born in Cleveland, Ohio on September 6, 1890, he died on March 27, 1980.

W. WALLACE WADE, '17

A member of the 1915 Brown team that played Washington State in the first Rose Bowl game on Jan. 1, 1916, Wally Wade earned a place among the great coaches of American intercollegiate football during an illustrious career that spanned 40 years. After serving his apprenticeship as a high school coach and an assistant at Vanderbilt, he took over the head coaching reins at Alabama in 1923 and built the Crimson Tide into a major football power, winning 81 of 74 games and taking three of his teams to the Rose Bowl. Moving to Duke University in 1931, he sent two Blue Devil squads to the Rose Bowl and compiled a record of 110 victories, 36 losses and 10 ties through 1950, when he retired to become the Commissioner of the Southern Conference. Wally made the cover of Time Magazine on Oct. 25, 1937, and the stadium at Duke was named in his honor on Sept. 30, 1967. In addition to his achievements in the field of coaching, he distinguished himself in service during two World Wars. He interrupted his tenure at Duke at the age of 53 to serve as a lieutenant colonel in the artillery during World War II, taking part in several major battles in the European Theatre. Wally was born in Trenton, Tennessee on June 15, 1892. Now retired from his Southern Conference post, he operates his 120-acre livestock farm near Durham, N.C.

CHARLES A. "RIP" ENGLE

The latest member of Brown's football inducted into the Hall of Fame is Charles "Rip" Engle, head coach of the Bruin gridiron teams from 1944 through 1949 and then head mentor at Penn State until his retirement in 1966. Engle was inducted January, 1973. Recognized as one of the top coaches in his profession, Engle guided Brown to a 28-20-4 record in six years, including marks of 7-2-0 and 8-1-0 his final two seasons. His success at Penn State, where he compiled a 104-48-4 record, was amazing. He guided Penn State to post-season Bowl appearances almost every season, or so it seemed, and he coached in all-star games too numerous to mention. Engle learned his football under the old master, Dick Harlow, while at Western Maryland. He graduated in 1930 and moved into the high school ranks, where he coached at Waynesboro High (Pennsylvania) for 11 years. He joined the Bruin staff in 1942 as an assistant to Neil "Skip" Stahley and when the latter entered the Navy, Engle was appointed head coach. Engle passed away in 1983.

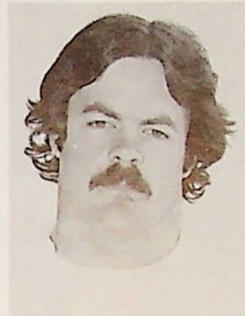

A Salute to Brown's Anniversary Squads

THE 1926 IRON MEN OF BROWN

Beside being the only undefeated team in Brown history, the 1926 team earned even greater fame as the "Iron Men," so-called because the starting 11 played 60 minutes without substitution on consecutive weeks against Yale and Dartmouth, and well into the fourth quarter against Harvard later in the season. They lost their chance for an undefeated-untied season in the last game when Colgate earned a 10-10 deadlock. The team was ranked among the top nationally. Its members were Captain Hal Broda and Thurston Towle, ends; Ed Kevorkian and Paul Hodge, tackles; Lou Farber and Orland Smith, guards; Charles Considine, center; Red Randall, quarterback; Dave Mishel and Ed Lawrence, halfbacks; and Al Cornsweet, fullback.



THE IVY CHAMPIONS OF 1976

For 50 years, Brown fans had heralded the undefeated Iron Men of 1926. But in 1976, there was another celebration as the Bruins won a share of the Ivy League title (with Yale) for the first time ever. Ranked throughout the season as one of the top defensive teams in the nation, Brown's defensive unit was a major factor in early wins over Yale, URI and Princeton. The offense came on strong, though and sparked the Bruins to an 8-1 overall record and a 6-1 Ivy slate. The offense broke eight Brown team season marks with quarterback Paul Michalko setting two game records and split end Bob Farnham surpassing two career highs.

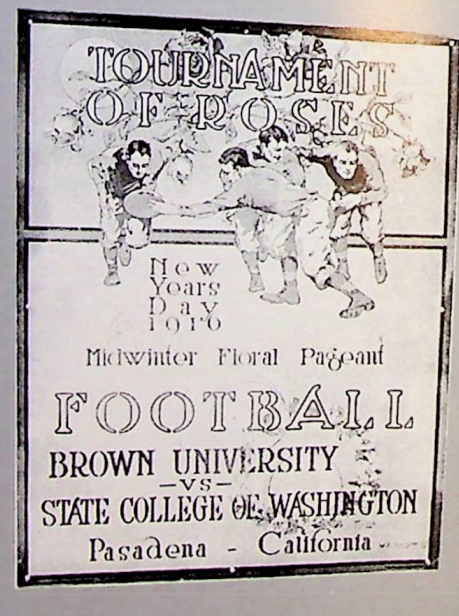
BROWN IN FIRST OFFICIAL ROSE BOWL — 1916

Since the late 1940's, Rose Bowl participants have been representatives of the Pacific-10 and Big Ten Conferences. It has not always been so, however. It was under Ed Robinson, a graduate of 1896 and for many years head coach, that Brown journeyed westward in 1915 to play in the first Tournament of Roses New Year's Day classic at Pasadena, California.

The Bruins were chosen as the Eastern representatives after posting a 5-3-1 mark. Those losses came via a 7-0 setback to Amherst and 6-0 to Syracuse, a 16-7 loss to Harvard and a scoreless game with Trinity. Brown outscored its opponents 167-32 that year, defeating URI 38-0, Williams 33-0, Vermont 46-0, Yale 3-0 and much heralded Carlisle 39-3.

In that first game, played January 1, 1916, Brown, with its brilliant Fritz Pollard, was opposed by the power team of Washington State. It came up mud on that day memorial in Brown gridiron history and Pollard was unable to cut loose as he had been accustomed to do on Eastern gridirons. WSU won, 14-0, but to Brown always will belong the distinction of having been the first Eastern team to play in the Rose Bowl.

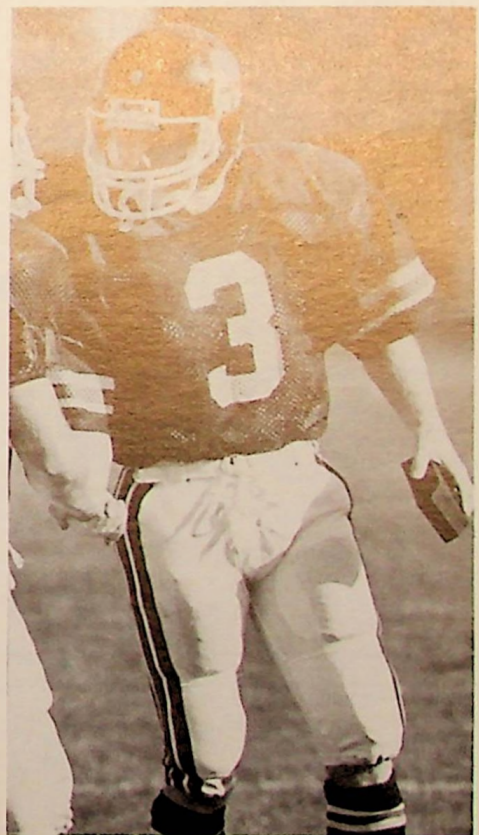

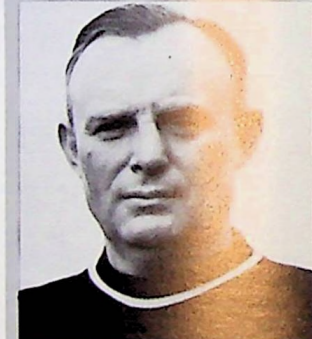

DIRECTIONS TO BROWN STADIUM
