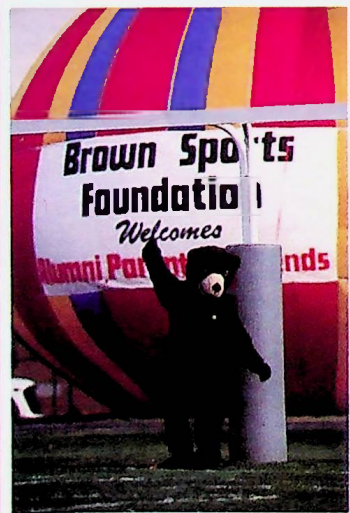
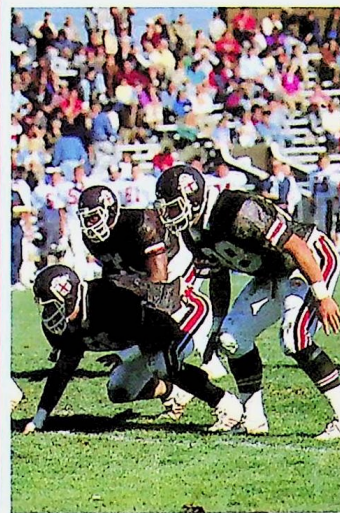
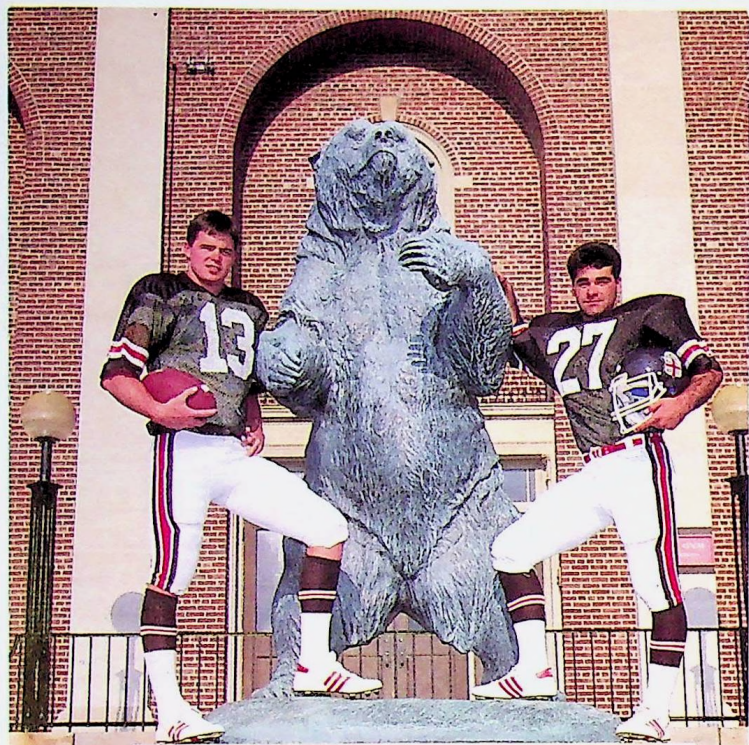

Press Information

Directions to Brown Stadium:

From 95 North or South, take the 195 East exit toward Cape Cod. Exit at Gano Street and turn right at the end of the ramp. Gano automatically becomes Tabor Ave. Follow Tabor until the four way stop at Lloyd Avenue and turn right. Go one block and turn left onto Elmgrove Avenue. Brown Stadium will be on the left hand side across from Marvel Gymnasium.

Credentials:

Please make all press and photo requests at least a week in advance. Tickets and parking passes can be mailed with one week's notice. If not, tickets only can be picked up at the Will Call Window at the Sessions Street entrance. Press requests should be directed to:

Radio Broadcasts:

Radio stations should make arrangements with the sports information office at least a full month in advance. Brown has installed one phone line which can be rented by a visiting station. Requests for that line will be honored on a first-come, first served basis. Installation information for extra lines can be obtained through New England Telephone at 401-274-8150.

Brown Football is covered by the *First Sports Network*. FSN is made up of flagship station 1450 WKRI along with 1380 WNRI, 1370 WKFD, 990 WEAN and 1230 WERI. Frank Carpano is the voice of Brown's play-by-play with Gary Cohen adding the color commentary.

Press Box Services:

Pre-game notes, flip cards and programs are available one hour before gametime in the press box. Play-by-Play, halftime, final, individual and team statistics are available immediately following the game both in the press box and in Marvel Gym. Game stories can be filed from the Sports Information Office in Marvel. Brown has one Xerox telecopier which will be available to the press in the Sports Information Office.

Post-Game Procedures:

Both Brown and the visiting teams dress in the basement of Marvel Gym. Coach Rosenberg and the visiting coach as well as players will be available for interviews about 15 minutes after the game in an interview area on the first floor. The locker rooms will be open to the media following the interviews.

ABOUT BROWN UNIVERSITY . . .

Brown University is located in the City of Providence, the capital of Rhode Island, at the head of Narragansett Bay. The main campus of the University is on College Hill in a residential area overlooking the center of the city. Brown is a coeducational Ivy League school where one of the most innovative and flexible curricula in the nation combines with over two hundred years of New England tradition to form an academic community of intellectual depth and social diversity.

The history of Brown reaches back over more than two centuries and tells of a university constantly undergoing change. Brown was established with a charter from the Colony's General Assembly in 1764 as the seventh college in America, and the third in New England.

In September 1765, the first men registered at the college, then known as Rhode Island College and located in Warren, Rhode Island. In 1770 the school was moved to a hill in Providence and in 1804 its name was changed to Brown University in recognition of the contributions of Nicholas Brown. In the 1880's graduate courses were first offered and the Graduate School was established in 1927.

Women were first admitted in 1891 when the Women's College in Brown University was established. In 1928 that division was renamed Pembroke College and for many years the women had a separate campus and extracurricular life while participating in classes with the men and earning Brown degrees. The two undergraduate colleges were merged in July 1973.

The Faculty

465 full-time professors, 60 visiting and adjunct professors. As a university-college with one faculty for all students from freshmen to Ph.D. and M.D. candidates, Brown offers the class size and student faculty ratio (11:1) of a small college.

The Curriculum

Brown's Curriculum, designed jointly by students and faculty during the late 1960's, involves each student in the design of his or her own academic program.

Other than guidelines within each of the 70 standard concentrations, no specific courses are required, and there are no distribution requirements. The large number of interdisciplinary courses and programs widens the choices available to students and encourages exploration outside of a student's field of concentration. Independent study is encouraged, as is the design of independent concentrations.

In addition, freshmen have the option of taking *Modes of Thought* seminars. These small seminars, built around topics of special interest from "Utopia" to "Biological Timekeeping," offer the opportunity to work closely with other students and a professor or graduate student in areas which extend beyond a single discipline.

Degrees Offered

Bachelor of Arts in 70 areas of Humanities, Social Sciences, Mathematics, Engineering, and Natural and Physical Sciences.

Bachelor of Science in Applied Mathematics, Aquatic Biology, Biochemistry, Biology, Biophysics, Chemistry, Computer Science, Engineering, Geological Sciences, Physics, Psychology and Pure Mathematics.

Medical Education Program for 60 well-qualified freshmen who may combine un-

dergraduate and medical studies in an eight year continuum. Students may earn an A.B. or Sc.B degree and the M.D. degree.

Facilities

The University library system contains more than 3,000,000 items including bound volumes, periodicals, maps, sheet music and manuscripts, and procures more than 60,000 items each year. The John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Library serves as the primary humanities and social sciences resource center and contains a group of computer terminals open for student use. The fourteen-floor Science Library houses the University's collection of science books and periodicals: open stacks in these libraries provide easy access to bound volumes.

Other libraries on campus include the John Hay (special collections, rare books and manuscripts), the John Carter Brown (early Americana), the Annmary Brown Memorial (world-famous collection of incunabula), and the Pembroke Campus Library, which features a "new books" section.

Brown also offers over 600 laboratories for both research and instruction as well as approximately 90 computer terminals located around the campus for student use.

The Haffenreffer Estate, 15 miles from main campus, offers 475 acres occupying a mile of shorefront and houses the University's anthropology museum.

Activities

Brown students are involved in over 130 organizations reflecting their wide variety of interests. From a daily campus newspaper to special interest groups such as the Outing Club, Brown students can choose to participate in any number of political, athletic, service, social, dramatic, recreational, and ethnic activities.

Many Brown students do volunteer service either while in attendance in the college or by taking time away from the campus. To encourage such service the University, with a gift from the C.V. Starr Foundation, has established a program of special fellowships for students who have engaged in full-time volunteer public service.

ATHLETICS AT BROWN

Brown University offers an exciting athletic program which includes 15 men's and women's varsity sports.

For Men ...

Football, soccer, cross country, water polo, ice hockey, basketball, wrestling, indoor track, swimming, baseball, tennis, lacrosse, golf, crew and outdoor track.

For Women ...

Soccer, volleyball, cross country, field hockey, basketball, ice hockey, swimming, gymnastics, squash, indoor track, lacrosse, tennis, softball, crew and outdoor track.

In addition, the University offers a number of club sports, and a wide range of intramural and physical education activities.

PHILOSOPHY ON ATHLETICS

Philosophically, Brown believes that its athletic programs should represent the same level of excellence found in any other area of the University. Excellence in athletics, however, has not been achieved at the expense of the student-athlete. The absence of night meetings, spring practice, athletic dorms and athletically related financial aid all suggest that a proper educational perspective has been maintained. Since the common denominator in this balance is excellence, you can expect to find the same dedication and expertise of the classroom, as well as the demands, manifesting themselves on the playing field. This assures success in both areas.



BRUNO - BROWN'S MASCOT

The birth date of the Brown Bear is January 20, 1904, when he was introduced to the university by Senator Theodore Francis Green, Class of '87.

"The Brown Bear is truly American and, most important of all, he embodies and suggests those qualities we want to emphasize," the Senator wrote. "While somewhat unsociable, he is good-natured and clean. While courageous and ready to fight, he does not look for trouble for its own sake, nor is he blood-thirsty. He is not one of a herd but acts independently. He is intelligent and capable of being educated (if caught young enough!). Remember, an athlete can make Phi Beta Kappa. Furthermore, the bear's color is brown; and its name is Bruno."

Bear cub mascots appeared on the sidelines at Brown games for many years. They were presented to the University by an animal farm, and their care and feeding was entrusted to the Brown Key organization.

The live bear mascot was replaced by a costumed bear in 1963.

A RECORD OF SUCCESS

According to responses received by Brown's deans for the class of 1968, approximately

- 30% pursue graduate or professional study immediately
- 60% pursue graduate or professional study within five years of graduation
- 93% of those applying to law school gained admission last year
- 91% of those applying to medical school gained admission last year
- 100% of those applying to business school gained admission last year

BROWN UNIVERSITY SPORTS FOUNDATION

In addition to guaranteeing Brown's financial support for athletes in the future via endowment funds, the Sports Foundation will make possible ever-increasing annual funding to provide exposure for Brown teams and to continually enhance the overall qualities of athletics at the University.

Donations in the first four years have already helped establish a \$3,500,000 endowment, provide \$1,250,000 to the Athletic Department for immediate program enhancement of our 30 varsity and 12 club sports and \$425,000 to the University for budget relief. Listed below are just a few of the Sports Foundation's additional accomplishments:

- the publication and dissemination of *Brown Sports*, an all-sports newsletter.

- establishment and expansion of a Donor Recognition Program.

- creation of "Fields of Concentration," a special film on Brown athletics to help with cultivation and recruiting.

- support of international and national team travel such as Men's Ice Hockey to China, Women's Basketball to Ireland, Men's Crew to Henley, Women's Field Hockey to Holland, Men's Rugby to Scotland, and upcoming trips — Men's Track to Oxford-Cambridge, Women's Ice Hockey to Switzerland, Men's Baseball to Bologna.

- fundraising for the Olney-Margolies Athletic Center and placement of the Brown Seal on the building.

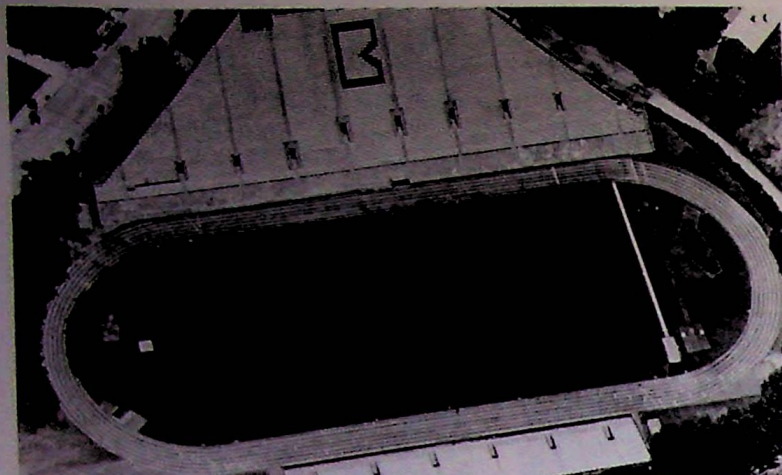

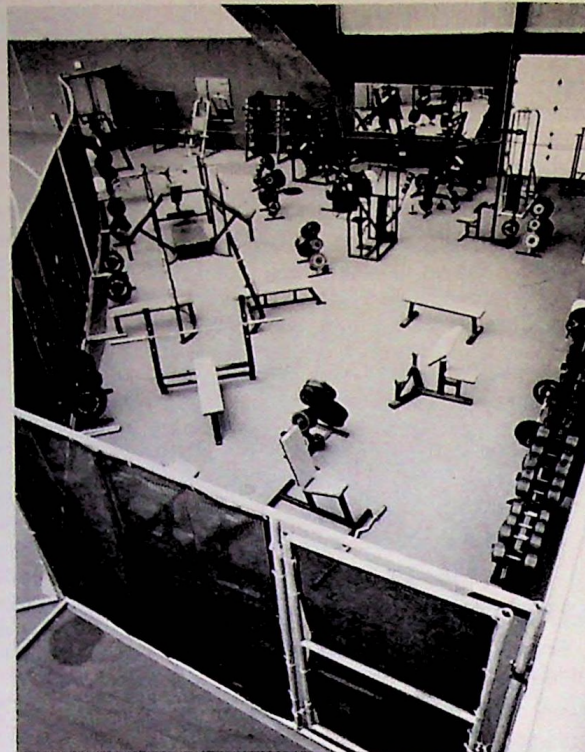


The Geo-Chem Green provides a casual setting for the exchange of ideas.

Dedicated in 1925, the home field of Brown football was built by subscription. New seating was installed in 1978. The current capacity is 20,000.



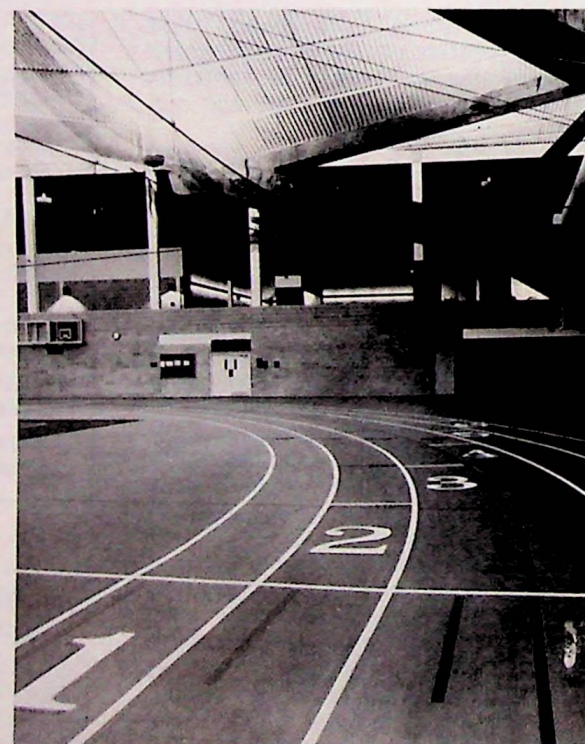
"IRON CITY"

BROWN UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATORS

HOWARD R. SWEARER PRESIDENT



Howard R. Swearer, a 53-year-old political scientist and former president of Carleton College in Northfield, Minnesota, was named

president of Brown University in August of 1976 and assumed office in January of 1977. He is the 15th president in Brown's 223-year history.

Raised in Wichita, Kansas, Swearer received his B.A. with high honors from Princeton's Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs in 1954, his M.A. (1956) and Ph.D. (1960) from Harvard and his LL.D. from Princeton (1977).

Swearer came to Carleton from the Ford Foundation, where he served as program officer in the international division (1967) and program officer in charge, European and international affairs (1968-70). In those capacities, he was responsible for a multi-million dollar international scholar-exchange program.

From 1960 to 1967, Swearer taught in the political science department of the University of California at Los Angeles. While at U.C.L.A., Swearer directed U.C.L.A.'s Peace Corps training programs for Nigeria, Chile, Ecuador, and Ethiopia, and was chairman of a statewide committee on Peace Corps activities. In 1964, he served as acting director of the university's Russian and East European Studies Center.

Prior to joining the U.C.L.A. faculty, Swearer was an American Political Science Association Congressional Fellow (1959), and served as a lieutenant in the U.S. Army (1957-58).

PRESIDENT HOWARD SWEARER ON ATHLETICS — "I am very optimistic about the kind of athletic program we offer in the Ivy League. We are trying to maintain a balanced athletic program for men and women which fits into the total educational process. The fact that a large portion of athletic expenses are paid by the general college budget is a telling factor and explains our interest in, and commitment to, a well-rounded athletic program.

"We like to have winning teams, but this cannot overshadow other important objectives of the University — the most important of which is that every student can test his or her interests and abilities, develop skills, and gain knowledge and values, which will be of use to them in their lifetime."

JOHN C. PARRY ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



John C. Parry now directs the athletic program in which he once was a co-captain and All-Ivy football player as well as a letterwinner in basketball and lacrosse. His name still dots the Brown record pages as a leading receiver for the Bears in 1962, '63 and '64. The 44-year-old administrator became Brown University's director of athletics in January of 1979. He oversees 30 men's and women's varsity sports and an extensive intramural, physical education and recreational program.

One of Parry's major concerns as director has been providing the best available facilities for Brown athletes. He was instrumental in the design and construction of Brown's Olney-Margolies athletic center which was dedicated in the fall of 1981. Last summer, a state-of-the-

art tuned track from California Products was installed in that facility. This summer, athletic projects included a new outdoor track at Brown Stadium, as well as new lights at Stevenson Field and Meehan Auditorium. The past two years, he has also actively pursued the sale of Marvel Gym to facilitate the construction of a new eight million dollar gymnasium. That structure will complete the complex at Aldrich-Dexter adjacent to the main campus.

An active member in both regional and national affiliations, Parry served as President of the ECAC last year and also chaired the NCAA men's lacrosse committee. He has also been a member of the ECAC Executive Council and Chairman of the ECAC Finance Committee. Parry is also an advisor for the weekly I-AA Football national poll.

Following his 1965 graduation with a degree in economics, Parry earned his master's in business administration in 1967 from the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton Graduate School. While at Penn he served as assistant coach of the freshman football and lacrosse teams and completed his six-year service in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve.

Parry spent the next eight years in the data processing field, first as a marketing representative for IBM, then vice-president and co-founder of Instant Data Inc., a Philadelphia-based computer services firm.

In 1975, he returned to Brown as assistant athletic director and two years later was elevated to associate director. During those years he had responsibilities in scheduling, team travel, admissions, eligibility, and as an assistant football and lacrosse coach.

A native of Marcellus, N.Y., Parry is a graduate of Marcellus Central High School where he lettered in football, basketball, baseball and track. He, his wife Anne Brodhead Parry, and their two children, Alyson and Jennifer, reside in Barrington, R.I. Alyson is a member of Brown's class of '91.

JOHN PARRY ON THE BROWN STUDENT/ATHLETE — "Bright ... articulate ... questioning ... skilled young men and women. Some harbor dreams of professional athletics but when they do, at least they hedge their chances by securing the best education possible. Brown is a happy place ... our athletes host visiting prospects and the feedback is mostly positive."

On Brown Athletics — "Brown is an exciting upbeat place to be. We are committed to athletic programs for all ... recreational, instructional, intramural and intercollegiate. Close to 80% of the Brown Community participate in one or more of the above programs ... The intercollegiate program is broad-based; 15 varsity sports for men and 15 varsity sports for women."

On Coaching in the Ivy League — "The Ivy League is the toughest intercollegiate league in the country to coach in. We ask our coaches to compete on a Division I level with no scholarships and no control over admission decisions and they do it. Players play on a completely voluntary basis; when skilled players decide to concentrate on their studies there is no retribution or penalty involved. When players have a late class, they miss practice; studies are the number one priority and we recruit using that as a positive."

ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATORS

ARLENE GORTON Associate Athletic Director

Arlene E. Gorton, who has served on the Brown athletic staff since 1961, is responsible for the physical education and intramural programs, the Brown sports camp for children, and assisting John Parry in athletic policy making.



Gorton, a 1952 graduate of Brown, earned her master's degree in education in 1954 from the University of North Carolina.

She then joined the staff at Connecticut College as a physical education instructor until 1961 when she returned to her alma mater as chairperson of the Women's Physical Education Department. In 1973 Gorton became Assistant Athletic Director and in 1975 was appointed to her present position of Associate Director.

She was awarded a full professorship in June 1978 and is only the second person in Pembroke and Brown athletic history to achieve that rank. Gorton serves on numerous faculty and athletic committees and was listed in *Who's Who In America* in 1984.

RICH SARDELLA Associate Athletic Director

Richard C. Sardella joined the Brown Athletic Department in 1970 as ticket and business manager. In 1973, he was named assistant athletic director and on July 1, 1977 he was elevated to associate athletic director.



Sardella administers the athletic budget, co-ordinates the use of facilities, the summer program, the men's team scheduling and travel responsibilities.

Sardella earned his bachelor of science degree in marketing in 1969 from Bryant College, and served as freshman baseball coach at Bryant that year. A native of Jersey City, he now resides in Newport, R.I.

JOAN TAYLOR Assistant Athletic Director

Joan W. Taylor has been a member of the Brown athletic staff since 1969. After being promoted to the position of Assistant Athletic Director in July, 1978, she has been responsible for NCAA and Ivy Eligibility and shares in team scheduling and travel responsibilities along with general administrative duties. She is also secretary of the Brown Hall of Fame Selection Committee. Taylor served as head women's tennis coach for eight years, guiding the team to an overall record of 69 wins and 28 losses.



A native of Bristol, Ct., Taylor attended Springfield College (Mass.) where she competed in field hockey, volleyball and tennis while earning her Bachelor of Science degree in physical education in 1961.

She, her husband John, and two children, Steven and Janet, live in Barrington, R.I.

ED BARRY Manager of Support Services

Edward J. Barry, Jr. was appointed Manager of Support Services in 1980 after having served as Promotions Officer at Brown since 1976. He coordinates and manages all field services including game preparation and is also involved with facility scheduling. In addition, he continues to direct the promotions of Brown athletics.



Barry graduated from Brown in 1952 and spent 23 years in marketing positions with the Bell System. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Brown Hockey Association and is President of the Brown Hall of Fame Selection Committee. He and his wife Alice live in Charlestown.

JEAN ELLIOTT Director of Sports Information

Jean M. Elliott was appointed sports information director in May of 1984 after having served as assistant director for a year.

Before joining Brown, Elliott directed sports information duties at Salisbury State College for two years where she also received her Master's of Education with an English concentration. She earned her undergraduate degree in Sports Journalism and Publicity from Western Maryland College.



Elliott competed in a number of sports in college. She was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and served as captain of both the softball and basketball teams.

Elliott is an active member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and Words Unlimited. She has also served as chairman and secretary of the Ivy League SIDs. She is single and resides in Providence.

BRIAN O'FRIEL Asst. Dir. of Sports Information

Brian C. O'Friel joined the Brown athletic department in August 1984 as the assistant director of sports information. He is involved in all aspects of the sports information program for the Brown's 30 varsity teams.



Prior to coming to Brown, O'Friel served as a full-time intern in the Dartmouth College sports information office. A 1981 graduate of Providence College, he earned a B.S. in business administration. In the spring of 1983 he was awarded an M.S. in Sports Science from Indiana University of Pennsylvania with a concentration in sports journalism. At IUP he served as a graduate assistant to the SID, working specifically in media relations and statistics.

O'Friel is an active member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), ECAC-SIDA and Words Unlimited. He is single and resides in Providence.

Frank George has been the head trainer at Brown since 1966. In May, 1974 he was elected president of the National Athletic Trainers Association and was re-elected in 1976 to serve a second term. A 1962 graduate of the University of Massachusetts, he was the first East Coast trainer to be elected president in the 28-year history of the NATA.

Following graduation from UMass, George received his certificate of physical therapy from Boston University. In 1970 he received his NATA certification.

During his undergraduate years at Massachusetts he served as student trainer for three years. He was football trainer at Medford (Mass.) High in 1962 and staff physical therapist of Fitzsimmons General Hospital from 1964-66.

George, a native of Boston, served as a trainer for the USA Olympic Team at Innsbruck in 1976 and also lectured in Japan as a guest of the country. In 1980 he was a supervisor of athletic trainers for the Winter Olympic Games at Lake Placid. He is also associate editor of the Year Book of Sports Medicine and chairman of the NATA scholarship committee.

Frank and his wife Lynn have four children: Lynn, John, Karen and Christopher. Lynn graduated from Brown in 1987, John is a senior on the football team and Chris is a freshman this fall.

Brown Debuts With 21-7 Win Over Yale

Junior quarterback Mark Donovan threw touchdown passes of 71 and 10 yards to senior Dave Fielding and scored a third on a one-yard bootleg as he led Brown to a 21-7 victory over Yale in the season opener for both teams.

Donovan completed 17 of 28 passes for 256 yards and two TDs as he turned in the best opening day passing performance by a Brown quarterback in the program's 107-year history. For his efforts, he received the Coca-Cola Golden Helmet from the Boston Sports writers and an ECAC Honor Roll Mention.

Linebackers Brian Murphy and Tyler Wolfram paced the Bruin defense with nine and six tackles, respectively. Defensive end Jeff Garrison put intense pressure on the Hill quarterbacks throughout the game.

Big Play Bears Batter Rams

Three touchdown passes by Mark Donovan were among five big plays that lifted Brown to a 27-7 victory over the University of Rhode Island. The junior quarterback connected with senior Dave Fielding for scores from 63 and 44 yards, and found senior Mark Daly from 28 yards away for his third TD of the game.

Two big gainers on the ground complemented the big plays through the airways. Tailback Jamie Simone rambled 32 yards to the URI 28 to set up the Daly touchdown pass. Sophomore Lane Wood galloped 47 yards from the Brown 21 to the Ram 32, which set up a Bruin field goal.

Brown kicker Alex Kos connected on a career long 44-yarder in the contest and also converted on a 42 yard boot.

The defense shined again, limiting the Rams to 242 yards in total offense, including only 10 yards rushing for the game. Defensive end Jeff Watts led the Bruins

with two quarterback sacks, two tackles for loss, and six other stops.

Brown maintained its perfect record with a 24-10 victory over Princeton at Palmer Stadium.

The Bruins scored on their first three possessions of the game and never looked back. Mark Donovan and Dave Fielding combined on a 55-yard scoring play in the first series. Next, Alex Kos connected on a 38-yard field goal to cap the second drive. Then, Greg Solomon and Tommy Smith teamed-up for a 25-yard halfback option score on Brown's third possession of the day.

Princeton opened the third period with a 38-yard field goal but an eight-yard touchdown punt by tailback Lane Wood early in the fourth quarter put the game out of reach. The Tigers recorded their only TD of the game on the ensuing series.

It was a game that was billed as an early season battle for the Ivy title. For Brown, however, the vibes were wrong and the biorhythms were off. At the end of the afternoon nightmare, Penn emerged with a defiant 34-0 victory.

The ground game of the Quakers seemed unstoppable as Rich Comizio and Chris Flynn each topped the 100-yard plateau, and the team as a whole gained 326 on the ground. It was the Penn passing attack however, which accounted for the three first half touchdowns.

Brown Sees Red

The big play that advanced Brown through the first three weeks disappeared for the second consecutive week as Cornell tripped Brown, 27-9, in Ithaca.

Taking advantage of good field position, the Big Red took the early lead on a 22-yard scoring pass. Brown cut the deficit to four with a 38-yard field goal by Alex Kos but a one-yard run by Jeff Johnston capped a 48-yard scoring drive to give Cornell a 14-3 halftime edge.

The Bruins opened the second half with a drive from their own 19 to the Cornell 22 when the big play occurred, the turning point. Mark Donovan, who tied a Brown record for completions in a game with 21, threw a weak pass from in the grasp of a defender which was intercepted and returned 74 yards for a Big Red touchdown.

Donovan teamed up with Kalron Bigby for a 32-yard scoring play, but it was not enough to prevent the Bruins from losing their second straight game.

Holy Cross Upends Brown

Brown scored on its first possession of the game but could not hold the advantage as Holy Cross edged the Bruins, 22-7, before a Parents' Day crowd at Brown Stadium.

Mark Donovan directed the Bruins 78-yards on the opening series for a touchdown to account for the only score of the day for Brown. Lane Wood, who had his best game as a Bruin, plunged over from one-yard out for the touchdown.

The Bruins held strong on Holy Cross' first possession, but a superb punt left the Bruins stranded at the one yard line. A sack of Donovan in the end zone for a safety proved to be the turning point in the contest as the offense became ineffective.

Brian Murphy led the Bruin defense with nine solo tackles, seven assists and one interception in the contest.

Heisman Trophy candidate Gordie Lockbaum, a two-way player for the Cross, lived up to his billings as he rushed for 78 yards, including two touchdowns, and collected 114-yards in receiving on nine catches.

Mark Donovan threw three touchdown passes and an opportunistic Brown offense converted four Harvard turnovers into points as the Bruins defeated the Crimson, 31-19, in a post-Halloween contest at Harvard Stadium. It was Brown's first win over Harvard this decade.

Harvard took an early 14-0 lead before the Bruins began their assault. Donovan connected with Dave Fielding on a 10-yard scoring play and Alex Kos added a 30-yard field goal to cut the deficit to four by halftime.

An explosive third quarter keyed the Brown victory. Donovan scored from nine yards out on a fourth and one situation and then teamed up with Kelron Bigby and Peter Zidlicky for scoring plays of 27 and 66 yards, respectively.

Defensively, George Reilly and Greg Kyllish were honored by the ECAC and Ivy League for their performances as the pair in the defensive secondary teamed up for 22 tackles and two fumble recoveries.

Despite a record-setting performance by Dave Fielding and the first 100-yard rushing game of the season by a Brown running back, the Bruins only managed a 21-21 tie against Dartmouth.

Fielding set the single-season touchdown reception record, after snagging scores of 10 and 44 yards from Mark Donovan.

Brown amassed 236 yards on the ground in the game, as Sam Falcone led the attack with 140 yards on 28 carries in his first start of the season.

The game was marred by missed field goals, failed PATs and turnovers, as both teams racked-up yardage but could not convert at the end of sustained drives. Alex Kos connected on field goals of 29 and 40 yards but missed two as well, including a 41-yarder with 13 seconds to play. Donovan also saw limited action after being shaken up on a two-point conversion.

Position Analysis: THE OFFENSE

"The return of the quarterback and the running backs are strengths where you want to have your strengths," commented head coach John Rosenberg. "We have the talent available to fill the overall picture, which may involve some position changes."

Quarterback: Senior Mark Donovan, a second team All-Ivy pick, returns to the offensive controls for the Bruins in 1987 and also serves as co-captain. Strong and steady, the 6'4, 200 pound signal caller completed over 50 percent of his passes last year en route to covering 1777 yards worth of stadium real estate. His 15 aerial touchdowns set a school record for most passing TDs in a season and a 71 yard scoring strike to Dave Fielding against Yale ranks as sixth longest in school history. John Shapiro, also a senior, is Donovan's understudy but look for his speed and height to surface in more playing time at wide receiver. Danny Clark is a promising sophomore whose talent could make quite an impact.

Specialty: Senior Alex Kos is capable of handling both the punting and kicking chores for the Bruins. Kos averaged 33 yards per punt last year and scored 48 points. In two years, he is a perfect 28x28 in the extra point department and he has good range for field goals with a long of 44 yards. This year, junior John Vidmar will probably take over the punting department. He booted 12 times last year, averaging 34.0 yards.

HEAD COACH JOHN ROSENBERG



John Rosenberg, 41, begins his fourth season as head coach after leading the Bruins to their first back-to-back winning campaigns since the 1979-80 seasons. Since coming to Brown from the Philadelphia Stars of the United States Football League in 1983, Rosenberg has compiled a 14-13-2 career record including a 12-8-1 mark in the Ivy League.

In his first season at Brown, Rosenberg

posted a 4-5 record with a 4-3 Ivy mark, not bad for a transition year. In 1985, the Bruins bested the .500 mark with a 5-4-1 record as the fruits of recruiting began to make an appearance. Brown registered four Ivy League shutouts that season and ranked as the League's top offensive and defensive squad. Last season saw continued development of the program as depth started to show itself on both sides of the line of scrimmage. The Bruins posted another 5-4-1 record, with three of the four setbacks coming from Top-20 caliber tams. Brown finished third in the Ivy League with a 4-2-1 record. The outlook for 1987 is positive as Brown continues to reap good-sized and talented candidates.

"John is articulate, exceptionally knowledgeable on all levels of football and knows what coach-player communication is all about," commended Athletic Director John Parry. "He understands the place of football in an intercollegiate athletic program and the value of an education."

Rosenberg, the 16th coach in the 107-year history of Brown football, served as the defensive backfield coach for the Philadelphia Stars prior to his arrival at Brown and was a major reason the Stars reached the USFL Championship game in 1983. During his year-long stay with the Stars, the defensive unit was rated as one of the best in the USFL. It led the league in scoring defense, turnover ratio, interceptions and rushing defense.

Before that, Rosenberg spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Penn State. He had his first association with the Nittany Lions in 1970-71, serving under Joe Paterno

'50 as a part-time assistant while finishing his Masters degree. He received his M.Ed. in counseling from PSU in the spring of 1970. He then went to Villanova where he was defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for two years before turning to State College in 1974. Rosenberg served as Penn State's recruiting coordinator from 1975-76, coached the outside linebackers in 1977 and then took over as the defensive backfield coach in 1978. He held that post through State's National Championship season of 1982.

John Rosenberg is an outstanding football coach, an outstanding person and a great motivator," lauded coach Paterno. "He added a great deal to our program at Penn State."

Born in Washington, D.C., Rosenberg attended Newton North High School in Massachusetts where he played three years of varsity football and baseball. He then attended Harvard where he graduated in 1967 with a B.A. degree in social psychology. Rosenberg was a linebacker and a defensive back for Head Coach John Yovicsin from 1964-66. He then served as assistant freshman coach of the Crimson in 1967 before moving to the University of Pittsburgh where he was a part-time assistant coach and assistant director of financial aid for the next two years.

Having played football at Harvard, Rosenberg has a thorough understanding of the demands placed on student-athletes in the Ivy League. It is this understanding combined with his exceptional football knowledge and experience that make him ideal for the Brown program.

Rosenberg directs the sideline in a way that may be strangely reminiscent of a previous Brown era. After all, Rosenberg's mentor, Joe Paterno, ultimately learned his football from Rip Engle. Engle commanded the Bruin sideline from 1944-49 before moving to Penn State. Paterno not only played for Engle at Brown but gleaned much insight into the game as he assisted Engle for 16 years at Penn State during which the Nittany Lions compiled a 104-48-4 record. In turn, Rosenberg assisted Paterno for 12 years, helping Penn State to a 108-24-0 mark.

Coach Rosenberg on Selected Topics

Ivy League Players

"The most rewarding aspect of coaching is the quality of the players, particularly here at Brown. They are bright, creative, and achievement oriented. They are a pleasure to be around."

Ivy League Football

"Football in the Ivy League is more purely a melting pot. It's the boy whose parents are paying for his education and the boy who is receiving financial aid, teaming together to make a block. There's no background, no ethnicity, no social or economic labels; just two individuals striving together on a shared cause."

Philadelphia Stars Experience

"That year was an enlightening and enjoyable experience. Carl Peterson put together a great organization. He is very intelligent and knows how to do his job. Jim Mora is a great coach. He has all the right personal qualities and has done a marvelous job of assimilating his many years of experience as an assistant coach."

Working Under Joe Paterno

"Joe is very demanding. I learned a great deal about hard work, self-discipline, and toughness from being around him. He is also a man of great vision. He sees and seeks the fullest potential of a person or situation. He is always one step ahead."

Building a Great Football Team

"The difference between a good and a great football team is the offensive line. A dominant offensive line is the most controlling factor in a football game. You can defend one or two great skill position players."

Planning

"It is important to have a plan for everything. Game plan, practice plan, season plan, program plan."

Enthusiasm

"I'm not a rah-rah, lots of noise coach, either for myself or the team. But I am enthusiastic. There is a difference between enthusiasm and excitement. Enthusiasm is an inspired state, it may be quiet and low-key, or ebullient and noisy. It is there naturally. Excitement is something that is added on or put out. It is noise or outer form."

Focusing

"I believe in concentration on the present moment, I call it focusing. The past is gone and the future is unavailable to us. In the context of a football program that means one game at a time, and one play at a time. Play as hard as you can on each down, because that is all that you can do anything about right now."

Responsibility

"The college years are very transitional. You come from a very programmed existence of High School and family and end up going out in the world to be a self-reliant individual. It is important along the way to develop responsibility, to fulfill the agreements that you choose to make. If you say you're going to do something, do it. If you have an appointment at 3:00, be there at 3:00."

Self-Determination

"I believe in taking the responsibility for your own existence. Be in charge. Be at the cause of your existence rather than at its effect."

BROWN OFFENSIVE COACHING STAFF

PETER GIUNTA - Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks



Peter Giunta, the only remaining member of John Rosenberg's original staff, will serve as the offensive coordinator and quarterback coach for the 1987 season.

Giunta directed the quarterbacks a year ago, after spending his first two seasons coaching the tight ends and wide receivers.

He tutored Mark Donovan to a record-setting season in 1986, as

the Bruin quarterback completed 120 of 239 passes for 1777 yards, the second highest passing yardage total in Brown football history, and a school-record 15 touchdown aeriols.

"Peter has done an excellent job over the past three years," said Rosenberg, "and I feel he has the technical background and knowledge that is necessary to coordinate our offense."

Prior to coming to Brown, Giunta spent three years at Penn State coaching tight ends, directing the offensive scouting and handling several phases of the kicking game. He also served as Penn State's liaison with professional scouts.

A 1977 graduate of Northeastern University, Peter earned a B.S. degree in physical education. Following graduation, he worked three years as an assistant coach at Swampscott (Mass.) High School and as a physical education teacher at Salem (Mass.) High before moving to Penn State, where he earned a master's degree in physical education.

Peter and his wife, Cindy, reside in Barrington with their daughter, Christina and son, John.

ART SEYMORE - Running Backs



Art Seymore, former offensive backfield coach at Colgate University, joins the Brown staff as running back coach for the 1987 season.

Seymore coached two seasons at Colgate where he worked with Kenny Gamble, who led the NCAA I-AA in rushing and all-purpose running. Before joining the Red Raiders in 1985, he directed the tight ends and wide receivers at

Lafayette College for a year.

"We're pleased to have a coach of Art's calibre," said Head Coach John Rosenberg. "He has outstanding collegiate credentials as a player at the University of Maryland, and has coached at other outstanding academic institutions."

A 1974 graduate of Maryland, Seymore earned a B.S. degree in business and management. A three-year tailback for the Terrapins, he carried for a school-record 221 times his sophomore season while gaining 945 yards. After an injury-plagued junior season, he gained 420 yards as a senior. He was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 1973 and played for the New York Jets a year later during the NFL player strike.

Art spent nine years in private business before getting into coaching. He is single and resides in Providence.

MIKE WESTON - Offensive Line



Mike Weston enters his fourth season with the Brown coaching staff and his third as offensive line coach for the Bruin varsity. He also serves as the Bruin strength coach.

A former player in the USFL, Weston served as the offensive line coach for the Brown freshman team during his first year in Providence.

Weston graduated from Adrian College (Mich.) with a

B.A. degree in business administration and speech communication. He added a Master of Arts and Education degree from Wayne State University in 1983 with a specialization in sports administration.

He was a member of the Michigan Panthers USFL Championship team in 1983 and was an offensive guard and center with the Chicago Blitz in 1984.

"Mike's experience in pro football has provided him an excellent background in current techniques and fundamentals," said Rosenberg. "His coaching of the offensive line has demonstrated his ability to teach what he has learned."

Mike is single and lives in Providence.

TONY MARCIANO - Tight Ends



Tony Marciano, the tight end and kicking game coordinator at Southern Methodist University for the past six seasons, joins the Brown University coaching staff as tight end coach for the 1987 season.

While with the Mustangs, he worked with All-Southwest Conference tight end Rickey Bolden, now a member of the Cleveland Browns, and All-SWC kicking specialist Eddie Garcia,

who has played with several NFL teams.

Prior to going to SMU, Marciano served as head strength and conditioning coach and assistant football coach at Texas Christian University from 1979-80. While at TCU, he served as head coach of the Horned Frogs junior varsity program, as well as assistant offensive line coach.

Marciano has also been an assistant at Dunsmore (Pa.) High School, and at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, where he coached the offensive line.

LOU FERRARI – Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers

Charles Gibbons, the offensive line coach at Rogers High School in Newport, R.I., for the past 27 years, has joined the Brown coaching staff for the 1987 campaign. He will work with the freshman offensive line and assist Mike Weston with the varsity linemen.

"Charlie adds a dimension of experience and maturity to our freshman program," said Brown Head Coach John

His brother, Ted, is a former assistant football and track coach at Brown, and is now the head coach of track and a football assistant at Washington University in St. Louis.

DEANE SWANSON - Freshman Defensive Coach



Deane Swanson, an assistant football coach at East Greenwich High School for the past 10 years, has joined the Brown University coaching staff as a defensive assistant for the freshman team.

"Deane has an excellent understanding of the student athlete," said Brown Head Coach John Rosenberg, "and he will be a valuable asset to our freshmen."

During his ten years at East Greenwich, the team posted an impressive 61-11-1 record. In addition, EGHS won state titles in his final three years. He progressed gradually from a freshman assistant to defensive coordinator.

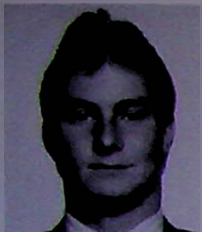

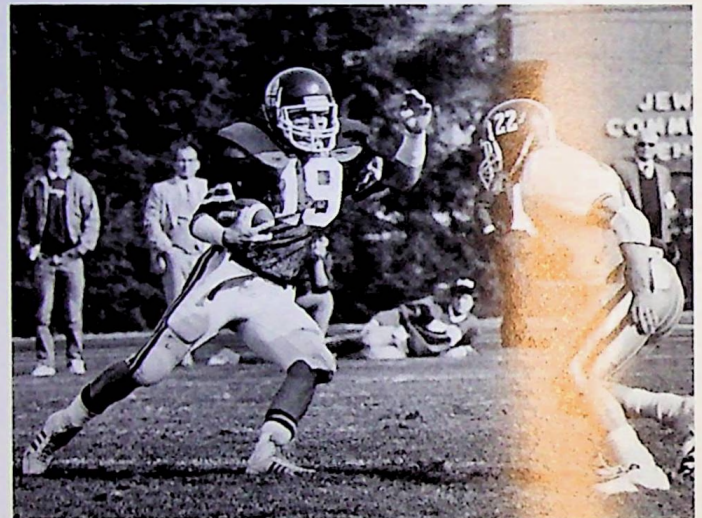



- Nov. 13, 1878 — Brown plays its first game of intercollegiate football travelling to Amherst to do battle with the Lord Jeffs.
- Nov. 24, 1895 — In first meeting with Dartmouth at Outing Park, Springfield, Mass. Brown wins, 20-4.
- Nov. 29, 1894 — The first Thanksgiving Day game in Brown's history, a 20-4 victory over MIT at Adelaide Park, Providence.
- 1894 Season — Paced by its first set of touchdown twins, William Burr Hopkins and Charles D. Millard, Brown finishes the season 10-4 and is ranked fifth in the nation.
- 1896 Season — Brown may not have had the best team in the country, but it did have the richest manager — John D. Rockefeller, Jr. '97.
- Nov. 6, 1898 — Willie Richardson kicks first Brown field goal in 16-5 victory over the Newton A.C.
- 1899 Season — Brown moves into its new football home on Camp Street. Called Andrews Field after former Brown president, Benjamin Andrews, the field remained Brown's football home through the 1924 season.
- Nov. 30, 1899 — In its first intersectional game, Brown meets the University of Chicago at Marshall Field on Thanksgiving Day.
- Oct. 18, 1902 — Capt. Tom Barry scores all Brown's points on TD runs of 50 and 31 yards and on a 28-yard field goal as Bruins beat Penn for the first time, 15-6, at Franklin Field.
- Nov. 25 1905 — The bear makes its first appearance as a Brown mascot at the Dartmouth game in Hanover.
- Sept. 29, 1906 — The forward pass was legalized for the 1906 season and QB Vic Schwartz threw the first pass for Brown in the opener against New Hampshire.
- Nov. 24, 1906 — Halfback Johnny Mahew scored twice on spectacular runs in 23-0 victory over Dartmouth and becomes first Bruin named to Walter Camp's All-American first team.
- Sept. 26, 1908 — QB Bill Sprackling completes first Brown TD pass, a 40-yarder to end Spike Dennie.
- Nov. 5, 1910 — Sprackling has the greatest day of any Brown back in leading Brown to 21-0 victory over Yale. He kicked three field goals and accounted for 456 yards.
- Jan. 1, 1916 — Brown meets Washington State in first official Rose Bowl game.
- Nov. 18, 1916 — Fritz Pollard has two TDs and gains 140 yards rushing in leading Brown to 21-0 victory over Harvard and earning first team All-American honors from Walter Camp.
- Oct. 24, 1925 — Brown Stadium is dedicated during Brown-Yale game before 27,300.
- Oct. 23, 1926 — The Brown Iron Men team is born as 11 starters play full 60 minutes in 7-0 victory over Yale at Yale Bowl.
- Nov. 25, 1926 — Close to 30,000 see Brown end the season undefeated after battling Colgate to 10-10 tie on Thanksgiving Day morning at Brown Stadium.
- 1932 Season — Brown's Cinderella team meets previous undefeated opponent eight straight weeks, defeating URI, Springfield, Yale, Tufts, Harvard, Holy Cross, and Columbia before losing Thanksgiving morning to undefeated, untied, and unscored-upon Colgate before 33,000, the largest home crowd in Brown history.
- Nov. 24, 1938 — In a Turkey Day thriller, Shrine Hall scores 27 points in leading Brown to a 36-27 victory over Columbia and its star, Sid Luckman.
- Oct. 10, 1942 — Junior Halfback Bob Margarita sets an all-time Brown record with 233 yards rushing in 28-21 victory over Columbia and its star, Paul Governelli.
- Nov. 24, 1949 — Trailing 26-7 with 17 minutes left, Brown rallies to crush Colgate, 41-26, Thanksgiving morning on the running and passing of Joe Paterno.
- Oct. 4, 1958 — With fullback Paul Choquette rushing for 113 yards, Brown beats strong Yale team, 35-29.
- Oct. 13, 1973 — Using rollout quarterback Dennis Coleman the first half and passing quarterback Pete Beatrice after intermission, Brown befuddles Yale, 34-25, for Coach Anderson's first victory.
- November, 1976 — Brown defeats Harvard, Dartmouth, and Columbia in the final three games to gain a share of the Ivy League title.
- Nov. 5, 1977 — Ruben Chapa's 32-yard field goal with 9 seconds left gives Brown 13-10 victory over Dartmouth at Hanover.
- 1978 Season — Centennial Anniversary.
- Nov. 4, 1978 — Rick Vilella snares two point conversion pass from Mark Whipple in final minutes as Brown comes from behind to nip Harvard, 31-30, in Cambridge.
- Oct. 20, 1979 — The Bruins put together near flawless game while beating high flying Cornell, 28-7, at Brown Stadium.
- 1980 Season — Bruins beat Princeton, Cornell and Columbia for eighth straight year under John Anderson.
- Nov. 5, 1983 — The Bruins battle national power Penn State before a Brown record crowd of 75,000.
- Sept. 21, 1984 — Keiron Bigby sets or ties five NCAA records with three interceptions for 216 yards and two touchdowns. The 27-14 victory over Yale marked John Rosenberg's debut as head coach.

JOHN W. HEISMAN, '91

A name synonymous with quality football, John William Heisman attended Brown from 1887 to 1889 and became one of the leading coaches and a dominant personality in intercollegiate football during the ensuing 45 years until his death in 1936. After obtaining his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania, he launched a football coaching career at Oberlin College that extended through a long series of successes at Akron, Alabama Poly, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Penn, Washington and Jefferson, and Rice. He did much to "open up" the game by use of the forward pass and the shifting line. At Georgia Tech, where he coached for 16 years, his teams of 1915-16-17 won 25 straight and rolled up 1,129 points to their opponents' 61. After retiring from coaching he became Physical Director of the Downtown Athletic Club of New York and was one of the founders and first president of the Touchdown Club. In his honor, the downtown A.C. established the Heisman Trophy, which is presented annually to the outstanding collegiate football player in the nation. Born in Cleveland, Oct. 23, 1869, he died on Oct. 3, 1936.

DeORMAND (Tuss) McLAUGHRY

A 55-year association with football as player, coach and administrator was duly acknowledged in December, 1962, when Tuss McLaughry was inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hall of Fame. From the day he played his first football game at Sharon, Pa. High School in 1907, Tuss and football were inseparable, except for distinguished service in World War II. A standout player at Michigan State and Westminster, he began his coaching career at the latter college in 1915. He coached four years at Amherst, 1922-25, and his last team there was the highest scoring team in the history of the Little Three. He then moved to Brown, where he guided the famed Iron Men of 1926 to the only undefeated season in the school's history. His 1928 and 1932 teams lost only one game. Before leaving Brown for Dartmouth in 1941, he had the pleasure of coaching his son, John. Later at Dartmouth another son, Bob played for him. His 1948 and 1949 teams were the first in Dartmouth's history to win six major games. He coached East squads in the San Francisco Shrine game four times, the New York All-Star Game in 1940 and the Chicago All-Star Game in 1947. After retiring from coaching in 1954, Tuss continued to serve the American Football Coaches Association as secretary-treasurer. He died in 1975.

FREDERICK DOUGLAS (Fritz) POLLARD '16

Probably the greatest player ever to perform for Brown and ranked as one of the greatest black players ever to perform in college ranks, Fritz Pollard was the star of Brown's 1915 team which played in the first official Rose Bowl game (1916), and the '16 team which compiled an 8-1 record and ranks among the University's best. Walter Camp, whose All-American selections are regarded as the last word for the era he covered, ranked Pollard as "one of the greatest runners these eyes have ever seen." In 1916 he scored all three touchdowns as Brown handed Yale its lone defeat of the season, 21-6, and scored two and set up the other in the 21-0 victory against Harvard. Born in Chicago January 27, 1894, Pollard died May 11, 1986.

EDWARD NORTH ROBINSON, '96

If any man deserves recognition as "the father of Brown football," it is Edward North Robinson. His influence spans more than a quarter of a century - from 1892 when he entered Brown and helped put the game on a sound basis as an undergraduate, to 1925 when he wound up an illustrious coaching career that covered 24 seasons at his alma mater. He won nine letters in his playing days, four in football. Robinson is credited with helping the grid program take root when baseball was THE sport at Brown. He served three separate terms as head coach, the last covering 16 years, and won 140 games against 82 losses and 12 ties at a time when Eastern football was undisputedly the nation's best, and Brown was often called upon to meet the top grid powers with undermanned forces.

WILLIAM EARL SPRACKLING, '12

Brown's only three-time All-American, the 150-pound Sprackling is rated by many as the finest all-around football player in the school's history. As a quarterback he could beat a team in many ways. One of the game's most successful pioneers with the forward pass, he threw 10 touchdown aeriels, a figure exceeded only seven times by Bruin passers since 1911. In addition, he was a brilliant runner, a heady field general and an adept field-goal kicker. He kicked three field goals against Yale in 1910. He owns the Brown record for most yards gained on kickoff returns in a single game with 147 against the Carlisle Indians in 1909. His three Brown teams won 21 games, lost 8 and tied 2. The Cleveland, Ohio native was selected on Walter Camp's All-American teams in 1909-10-11 and in 1964 became the sixth man connected with Brown football to be elected to the National Hall of Fame. Born in Cleveland, Ohio on September 6, 1890, he died on March 27, 1980.

W. WALLACE WADE, '17

A member of the 1915 Brown team that played Washington State in the first Rose Bowl game on Jan. 1, 1916, Wally Wade earned a place among the great coaches of American intercollegiate football during an illustrious career that spanned 40 years. After serving his apprenticeship as a high school coach and an assistant at Vanderbilt, he took over the head coaching reins at Alabama in 1923 and built the Crimson Tide into a major football power, winning 61 of 74 games and taking three of his teams to the Rose Bowl. Moving to Duke University in 1931, he sent two Blue Devil squads to the Rose Bowl and compiled a record of 110 victories, 36 losses and 10 ties through 1950, when he retired to become the Commissioner of the Southern Conference. Wally made the cover of Time Magazine on Oct. 25, 1937, and the stadium at Duke was named in his honor on Sept. 30, 1967. In addition to his achievements in the field of coaching, he distinguished himself in service during two World Wars. He interrupted his tenure at Duke at the age of 53 to serve as a lieutenant colonel in the artillery during World War II, taking part in several major battles in the European Theatre. Wally was born in Trenton, Tennessee on June 15, 1892. He died Oct. 6, 1986 at the age of 94.

CHARLES A. "RIP" ENGLE

The latest member of Brown's football inducted into the Hall of Fame is Charles "Rip" Engle, head coach of the Bruin gridiron teams from 1944 through 1949 and then head mentor at Penn State until his retirement in 1966. Engle was inducted January, 1973. Recognized as one of the top coaches in his profession, Engle guided Brown to a 28-20-4 record in six years, including marks of 7-2-0 and 8-1-0 his final two seasons. His success at Penn State, where he compiled a 104-48-4 record, was amazing. He guided Penn State to post-season Bowl appearances almost every season, or so it seemed, and he coached in all-star games too numerous to mention. Engle learned his football under the old master, Dick Harlow, while at Western Maryland. He graduated in 1930 and moved into the high school ranks, where he coached at Waynesboro High (Pennsylvania) for 11 years. He joined the Bruin staff in 1942 as an assistant to Neil "Skip" Stahley and when the latter entered the Navy, Engle was appointed head coach. Engle passed away in 1983.

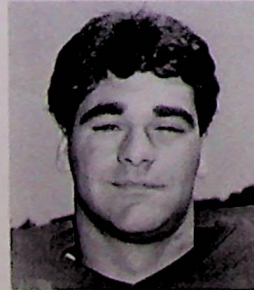

BROWN IN FIRST OFFICIAL ROSE BOWL — 1916

Since the late 1940's, Rose Bowl participants have been representatives of the Pacific-10 and Big Ten Conferences. It has not always been so, however. It was under Ed Robinson, a graduate of 1896 and for many years head coach, that Brown journeyed westward in 1915 to play in the first Tournament of Roses New Year's Day classic at Pasadena, California.

The Bruins were chosen as the Eastern representatives after posting a 5-3-1 mark. Those losses came via a 7-0 setback to Amherst and 6-0 to Syracuse, a 16-7 loss to Harvard and a scoreless game with Trinity. Brown outscored its opponents 167-32 that year, defeating URI 38-0, Williams 33-0, Vermont 46-0, Yale 3-0 and much heralded Carlisle 39-3.

In that first game, played January 1, 1916, Brown, with its brilliant Fritz Pollard, was opposed by the power team of Washington State. It came up mud on that day memorial in Brown gridiron history and Pollard was unable to cut loose as he had been accustomed to do on Eastern gridirons. WSU won, 14-0, but to Brown always will belong the distinction of having been the first Eastern team to play in the Rose Bowl.

THE 1926 IRON MEN OF BROWN

Beside being the only undefeated team in Brown history, the 1926 team earned even greater fame as the "Iron Men," so-called because the starting 11 played 60 minutes without substitution on consecutive weeks against Yale and Dartmouth, and well into the fourth quarter against Harvard later in the season. They lost their chance for an undefeated-untied season in the last game when Colgate earned a 10-10 deadlock. The team was ranked among the top nationally. Its members were Captain Hal Broda and Thurston Towle, ends; Ed Kevorkian and Paul Hodge, tackles; Lou Farber and Orland Smith, guards; Charles Considine, center; Red Randall, quarterback; Dave Mishel and Ed Lawrence, halfbacks; and Al Cornsweet, fullback.



THE IVY CHAMPIONS OF 1976

For 50 years, Brown fans had heralded the undefeated Iron Men of 1926. But in 1976, there was another celebration as the Bruins won a share of the Ivy League title (with Yale) for the first time ever. Ranked throughout the season as one of the top defensive teams in the nation, Brown's defensive unit was a major factor in early wins over Yale, URI and Princeton. The offense came on strong, though and sparked the Bruins to an 8-1 overall record and a 6-1 Ivy slate. The offense broke eight Brown team season marks with quarterback Paul Michalko setting two game records and split end Bob Farnham surpassing two career highs.

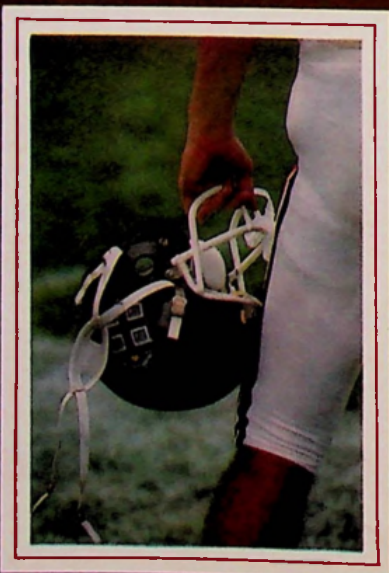
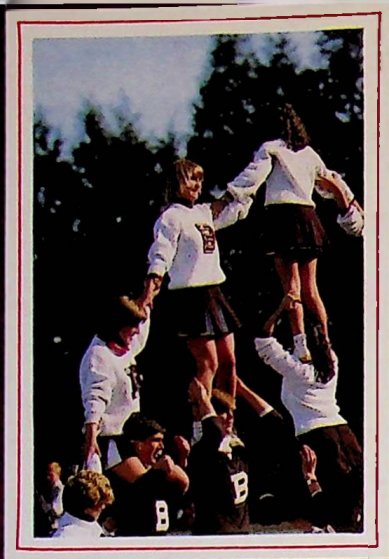
