OPENING DRIVE

NOTES TO KNOW

- The Lions fell to No. 24/25 Harvard, 26-6, on Saturday to fall a game behind first place in the Ivy League standings.
- First-year cornerback Carter McCray earned Ivy League Rookie of the Week honors for the second consecutive week.
- Columbia's defense has allowed the fewest points in the Ivy League (17.5 PPG), which also puts them 10th in FCS. The Lions lead the conference in passing defense, holding opponents to 205.9 yards per game.
- Individually, Hayden McDonald leads the Ancient Eight with four interceptions and is No. 3 nationally in interceptions per game. Carter McFadden ranks No. 5 in FCS and leads the Ivy League in passes defended (13).

HARVARD LEFTOVERS

- Marcus Libman posted his second career 100-yard receiving game and first since 2022.
- First-year quarterback Caleb Sanchez made his collegiate debut in the fourth quarter, going 3-for-5 with 69 yards.
- Three players posted double-figure tackles (Charlie Newton - 14, Jack Smiechowski - 10, Carter McCray - 10)
- Columbia fell to 0-3 when not forcing a turnover.

A COLUMBIA WIN WOULD...

- Clinch a winning season overall and in Ivy League play.

TEAM NOTES

INJURY BUG HITS THE LIONS

Columbia has lost six starters to season-ending injuries. It began with defensive tackle Owen Thomas in the opening game against Lafayette. Two weeks later, two-time All-Ivy League defensive end Justin Townsend suffered his injury against Princeton. Left tackle Ryan Carr exited the game at Penn and will not return this season. Starting quarterback Chase Goodwin went down in week six against Dartmouth, while linebacker Rocco Milia and center Mark Chapman were injured against Yale on November 1.

TAKING NOTICE

Columbia has received votes in a top 25 poll five times this season in both the AFCA Coach's Poll and Stats Perform Media Poll. The Lions earned nine votes in the November 4 Coach's Poll. On September 23, the Lions were selected as the Stats Perform National FCS Team of the Week and received votes in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll after their win over No. 14 Lafayette. It marked the first time the program received votes in a poll since the 2017 season when it finished 8-2 overall and 5-2 in the Ivy League.

SERIES HISTORY

Columbia and Brown will meet for the 88th time in a series that dates back to 1902. The Bears are 54-31-2 all-time against the Lions. However, Columbia is 5-2 in the last seven meetings.

The last three matchups have all been decided by six points, with the previous two needing overtime to determine a winner.

BROWN AT A GLANCE

BROWN'S STATUS

- Brown is coming off a 56-34 loss to Yale. The Bears totaled 459 yards of offense, with 343 of those yards coming via the passing attack. Quarterback Jake Wilcox took sole possession of second place on Brown's all-time passing yards list (6,858).
- James Perry is in his sixth season leading the Bears after playing and graduating from Brown in 2000. Before his tenure at Brown began, Perry served as offensive coordinator at Princeton and head coach at Bryant.
- Brown's offense leads the Ivy League in yards per game (425.8), passing yards (2,245), and total yards (3,406). Jake Wilcox is fifth in the nation in completions per game (25.3) and second in the Ivy League in passing yards (2,137). Mark Mahoney is tied for fifth in the Ivy League in receiving touchdowns (5).
- Brown's defense is third in the Ivy League in sacks (15) and Caleb Moorhead is third in the Ivy League in TFLs (9.5).

JON POPPE

PATRICIA & SHEPARD ALEXANDER HEAD COACH OF FOOTBALL
FIRST SEASON
WILLIAMS '07

Jon Poppe was named Columbia's Patricia and Shepard Alexander Head Coach of Football in December of 2023. Poppe, who served on Columbia's staff under Al Bagnoli from 2015-17 and spent the 2023 season as head coach at Union College, becomes the 22nd coach in program history.

In his first year at the helm of Union, Poppe guided the Garnet Chargers to a 10-2 mark and the second round of the NCAA Division III Tournament. He coached 15 student-athletes to All-Liberty League honors and helped Union post 32.6 points per game on offense while holding opponents to 11.4 to rank No. 8 in the nation.

Poppe brings over a decade of coaching experience in the Ivy League. In addition to his time at Columbia, he had two stints with Harvard (2011-14, 2017-22) as secondary and special teams coach, where his units were consistently among the best in the country at the NCAA Division I Football Championship Series (FCS) level.

In 2022, his units ranked third in the FCS in blocked punts and fourth in blocked kicks during the 2022 season. He was recognized by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston as the FBS/FCS Assistant Coach of the Year in 2021 after helping the Crimson defensive unit lead the nation in rushing defense and rank third in interceptions. In 2019, Harvard led the FCS in blocked kicks (9) and blocked punts (7) while ranking in the top 20 nationally in punt return defense and net punting.

The Harvard secondary also enjoyed great success under Poppe's leadership. The defensive unit ranked among the top five in the country in rushing defense in each of his last two campaigns, while the Crimson ranked eighth in the FCS in interceptions during the 2021 season.

During his time at Columbia, Poppe led the secondary and served as recruiting coordinator, where he helped bring in a pair of nationally ranked recruiting classes. In 2017, the Lions went 8-2 and finished second in the Ancient Eight, the best season for the program since 1996. Columbia's defense led the league with 13 interceptions and was second in points allowed (17.5 per game). Poppe's secondary unit led the Ivy League in pass defense in 2016 and 2017 and coached seven defensive backs to All-Ivy League honors in his three years at Columbia.

Before his first stop in Cambridge, he spent one season as the assistant secondary coach at Holy Cross in 2010. He began his collegiate coaching career at the Division III level, serving as a graduate assistant coach for two years at Springfield College (2008-09) after one year as an intern assistant coach at King's (Pa.) College (2007).

Poppe is a 2007 graduate of Williams College, spending three seasons as a starter in the secondary. As a senior, he was named an All-East Region honoree from Don Hansen's Football Gazette and a first-team All-NESCAC pick in helping the Ephs to an undefeated 8-0 season.

FIRST(S) OF MANY

- Jon Poppe's five wins this season are the most for a first-year head coach at Columbia since Norries Wilson went 5-5 in 2006. One more victory would be the most for a rookie head coach since Charles F. Crowley in 1925.
- Poppe earned a road win faster than any head coach in program history after the Lions' 24-6 win at Wagner in Poppe's just second away contest.
- Earlier this season, he became the first Columbia coach to win his debut since Norries Wilson in 2006 and the first to win an Ivy League opener since Bob Schoop in 2003.

LIONS SHINE IN PRIMETIME

Columbia earned its first-ever home victory on a non-Saturday with its 13-10 win over Yale on November 1. The Lions improved to 10-19 all-time when playing night games and 4-9 on Fridays. Columbia has been featured in primetime five consecutive seasons in the Ivy League's spotlight ESPN games and in eight of the last nine overall.

PHILADELPHIA FREEDOM

The Lions snapped a 12-game losing streak, which dated back to 1996, at Franklin Field after its 23-17 triumph over the Quakers on October 19. Columbia broke a similar streak at Harvard in 2022 after a 21-20 victory in Cambridge to end another 12-game skid that stood since 1995.

STATEMENT WIN

Columbia's season-opening victory over No. 14/18 Lafayette was the first win over a ranked opponent since a 19-0 victory at Dartmouth in 2021. The win over the Leopards was the first ranked win for the program at home since a 16-13 victory over No. 23 Harvard in 2003, and the first win over an opponent in the top 15 since 1995 after the Lions defeated No. 13 Penn, 24-14.

NON-CONFERENCE ROARING

Columbia went 2-1 in non-conference games and 19-5 in its last 24 non-conference contests. The Lions have gone a perfect 3-0 four times in the previous six years and have not been under .500 against non-conference opponents since 2016.

PASSALACQUA NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY

Senior defensive lineman Pat Passalacqua was selected as a semifinalist for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy on September 25. The award is named after former Columbia football player and head coach William "Bill" Campbell '62CC. It is awarded by the National Football Foundation to the American college football player with the best combination of academics, community service, and on-field performance. It is considered by many to be the "Academic Heisman" and nicknamed as such. Passalacqua, an Industrial Engineering & Operations Research major, is a two-time captain and has started the Lions' last 28 games as a defensive tackle.

STARTING ON THE RIGHT FOOT

Columbia has won six of its last seven season openers, dating back to 2017 and is 3-0 when debuting at home in that span.

SUPER SENIORS

Columbia has 12 student-athletes who opted to take a semester off to return for a "fifth season," which is tied with Yale for the most in the Ivy League. The group includes a pair of two-time all-conference selections, Joey Giorgi and William Hughes, and 2023 first-teamer Anthony Roussos. Eleven of the 12 were either starters or listed on the two-deep last season. They have been a part of 21 victories in their three-plus seasons with Columbia.

The Ivy League does not grant red shirts or permit graduate students to participate in varsity athletics, so to preserve eligibility, student-athletes must temporarily withdraw from school for a semester to retain their undergraduate status.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Linebacker CJ Brown and defensive lineman Patrick Passalacqua return as team captains for the 2024 season. Brown and Passalacqua are the first duo to ever serve on the leadership committee in back-to-back years. Both are three-year starters, with Brown as a linebacker and Passalacqua as a defensive tackle. Last year, Passalacqua was the first junior to be named a team captain since Alex Gross '11CC in 2009.

40TH ANNIVERSARY OF WIEN STADIUM

The 2024 season marks the 40th anniversary of the Columbia football team playing at Wien Stadium. This year's season opener was one day shy of the actual anniversary of the first game at the venue, played on September 22, 1984, against Harvard. Columbia has won 69 games in 193 contests in that span. The stadium is named after Lawrence A. Wien, 1925CC, 1928LAW, a former Columbia trustee, prominent philanthropist, lawyer and entrepreneur who donated \$3 million to the project before his passing in 1988. In October 2007, Columbia dedicated the playing field at Lawrence A. Wien Stadium to Robert K. Kraft Field in honor of Robert Kraft' 63CC, owner of the New England Patriots and Chairman and CEO of the Kraft Group.

ANY GIVEN SUNDAY

A pair of 2021 graduates earned practice squad spots on NFL rosters this season. Defensive back Jordan Colbert is currently with the Miami Dolphins, while running back Dante Miller is with the New York Giants. Miller made the active roster for New York's games at Seattle and against Cincinnati. Colbert forced a fumble and made 10 tackles in three preseason games. In a pair of preseason appearances, Miller averaged 4.2 yards per carry (26 touches).

MUST SEE TV

Columbia has partnered with SportsNet NY (SNY) to televise two games, the Lions' season opener against Lafayette on Sept. 21 and the season finale against Cornell on Nov. 23. Columbia will be featured on the regional sports leader for the seventh consecutive year. With a total distribution of nearly 11 million homes, SNY is available to viewers throughout New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, and Northeastern Pennsylvania for a regional reach of 8.0 million households. Combined with national coverage on DIRECTV, Verizon FiOS, and AT&T U-Verse, SNY's total distribution is 11 million homes. SNY is the official television home of the New York Mets, New York Jets, and all things New York sports. As New York's local sports TV coverage leader, SNY delivers the most comprehensive access to all of the Tri-State area's professional and collegiate sports teams through several nightly sports and entertainment programs.

GAME NOTES: OFFENSE

WHAT CANTY DO?

Wide receiver Bryson Canty has emerged as a Bushnell Cup finalist contender after having a solid senior campaign.

- Canty's seven touchdowns are second in the Ivy League and No. 20 in the nation heading into week nine.
- Despite missing the majority of the Princeton game and the entire contest at Wagner, he has 537 receiving yards, which is fifth in the Ancient Eight. His 76.7 receiving yards per game put him No. 30 in FCS.
- He is No. 10 on Columbia's all-time list for receiving yards with 1,438 and is 151 away from jumping into the top five.
- Canty is up to 14 career receiving touchdowns, which ties him for fifth in program history.
- He was named Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week on September 23 after catching six passes for 95 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

TURNAROUND SEASON

The Lions are beating last year's average by 42 percent (267.9 YPG). Columbia has scored 30 points twice this season after not hitting that mark once in 2023 and has three 200+ yard rushing games, which surpassed last year's mark of two. In the passing game, Columbia has 13 passing touchdowns, which more than doubles the previous season's total (24) and has more passing yards through eight games than last year (1,389 - 2023, 1,703 - 2024).

COLE AS ICE

Junior quarterback Cole Freeman has appeared in all eight games, making three starts. When Chase Goodwin was healthy, Freeman served as a dual threat in short-yardage situations. He has seven touchdown passes and is completing 53.5 percent of his passes for 755 yards. He has rushed for 199 yards and added three more touchdowns on the ground. Freeman joined the Lions after two seasons at Northwestern, where he started two games for the Wildcats in the 2022 season.

GROUND AND POUND

After being held without a rushing touchdown the first two weeks, the Lions have scored seven times on the ground in their last six games from five different rushers. All three of Columbia's primary running backs (Joey Giorgi, Malcolm Terry II and Griffin Johnson) are averaging more than 5.0 yards per carry on the season.

LONG DRIVES

The Lions have gotten the job done in various ways this season, whether by consuming time of possession or driving nearly the length of the field for scores.

- Columbia is holding the ball for an average of 30:24 per game.
- A key to that has been converting on third down, which Columbia is doing at a 47.3 percent clip, which leads the conference and No. 11 in FCS.
- Columbia has two 95+ yard drives this season, both leading to touchdowns. On their game-winning drive in the fourth quarter against Yale, the Lions marched 96 yards on eight plays for a 44-yard TD catch by Bryson Canty. The Lions had a 98-yard scoring drive in the second quarter against Georgetown, capped by a 43-yard TD grab by Edan Stagg. It marked the longest drive yardage-wise for the program since a 99-yard possession against Princeton in 2016. It's the first time the Lions have ever had a drive of that distance.
- Columbia ate up 38:17 of clock in the win over Princeton and have had three drives lasting longer than 6:00 this season, all of which have led to scores.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Senior Joey Giorgi is among Columbia's all-time rushing leaders in a pair of categories. Giorgi averages 68.1 rushing yards per game, putting him second for players who have played in at least 15 games. Giorgi is also third on the Lions' career rushing list with 1,840 yards and is 212 shy of jumping into second place. He became the Lions' first running back to post back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since Dante Miller in 2021 after going off for 157 yards in the win over Princeton and 111 at Wagner. He was named Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week on October 7 and currently is fourth in the conference with 543 rushing yards on the season.

MALCOLM UP THE MIDDLE

Senior running back Malcolm Terry is providing a good punch for the Lions in the backfield thus far. He is averaging 5.4 yards per carry and has broken off runs of more than 20 yards in four games, with a long of 53 against Lafayette.

BAD NEWS ON GOODMAN

Sophomore quarterback Chase Goodwin will miss the remainder of the season due to injury. He went 4-1 as a starter and was leading the Ivy League in completion percentage (66.7 percent) at the time of his injury. He became the first Lion to throw for over 300 yards in a game since 2017 after racking up 334 with a pair of touchdowns at Penn on his way to Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week honors. The native of Houston, Texas, saw action in five games last season, serving as the Lions' short-yardage QB. He completed 2-of-2 passes for 15 yards in a relief appearance against Dartmouth.

SHUFFLING ON THE LINE

The Lions came into the season with three offensive linemen who started all 10 games last year. Junior center Mark Chapman, an honorable mention All-Ivy selection last year, has been replaced by junior James Lill in the starting lineup since November 1. Nik Winzer has stepped in for the injured Ryan Carr the past three games at left tackle. Senior left guard John Iannuzzi, junior right tackle Noah Jordan and senior left guard Pat Colicchio have been the mainstays for all eight contests. The group has helped the Lions rush for over 200 rushing yards three times, all of which were victories.

CALLING THE PLAYS

Columbia's new offensive coordinator, Seitu Smith, is no stranger to the Ivy League. After coaching stops at Yale and Dartmouth, he played at Harvard, where he was a wide receiver and kick returner. Smith has won six Ivy League titles as a player or coach.

GAME NOTES: DEFENSE

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Columbia's defense has shown off its depth during another season when it has been among the best in the nation. The Lions have six different players with 30 or more tackles, nine with more than one tackle for a loss, seven with sacks, and six who have forced at least one turnover. Against Harvard, three players posted double-figure tackles (Charlie Newton—14, Jack Smiechowski—10, Carter McCray—10).

SAY HAYDEN

Senior defensive back Hayden McDonald leads the Ivy League with four interceptions this season. He picked off a pair of passes, including a key pick in the red zone in the second quarter, and had seven takedowns in the win over Princeton to earn Ivy League Defensive Player of the Week honors on October 7. McDonald's 51 tackles put him second on the team.

INSTANT IMPACT

Columbia has seen a pair of first-years see steady action in 2023. Defensive lineman Keller Patterson had a sack and played 32 snaps after replacing an injured teammate against Lafayette to earn Ivy League Rookie of the Week honors. In his collegiate debut, Cornerback Carter McCray entered the starting lineup at Penn and has been named Ivy League Rookie of the Week two weeks in a row. McCray has 17 tackles with three pass breakups in four contests.

CARTER'S CORNER

Senior defensive back Carter McFadden is right behind his teammate McDonald with three interceptions. Lined up against nearly every team's top receiver, he has 13 passes defended (interceptions plus pass breakups), which leads the conference and is No. 5 in FCS with 1.6.

THE ROUSSOS WAY

Anthony Roussos posted his third double-figure tackle game of the season after he recorded 12 in the win over Yale on November 1. He is up to 59 tackles this year, which is No. 5 in the Ivy League. Roussos led the charge for the Columbia defense with 93 total tackles on his way to first-team All-Ivy League honors in 2023. He also tacked on 10.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Roussos posted double-figure tackles five times and ranked No. 10 in the country with an average of 5.7 solo tackles per game. His older brother, Mike, was an All-American and three-time All-Ivy League kick returner for Columbia, who graduated in 2021.

ROCCO'S MODERN LIFE

Through seven games, linebacker Rocco Milia has 49 tackles (No. 9 in Ivy League), including 4.0 behind the line of scrimmage. He posted a season-high 11 tackles against Dartmouth but will miss the remainder of the season due to injury.

TOWNSEND TO MISS REST OF 2024

Senior defensive lineman Justin Townsend suffered a season-ending injury in week three against Princeton. He continued to have success against the Tigers with a sack and two tackles before going down. Townsend is coming off his second consecutive All-Ivy League campaign. He led the conference with 7.5 sacks a season ago, which was the fifth-highest single-season total for the program. His 14.5 career sacks rank fourth in program history.

GUESS WHO'S BACK?

Columbia came into the season returning nine of its 11 defensive starters from one of the top defenses in the FCS last season. Two-year starters Pat Passalacqua and Justin Townsend are all back on the defensive line, which should also be boosted by the return of Ben Corniello, who was injured much of last season and is one of Columbia's top rush stoppers, along with James Knox, who had 26 tackles in 2023. The trio of CJ Brown, Anthony Roussos and Rocco Milia started all 10 games last year. Additionally, both safeties Aaron Brebnor and Hayden McDonald will be joined by corner Carter McFadden in the defensive backfield.

GAME NOTES: SPECIAL TEAMS

BE MERRY

Sophomore placekicker Hugo Merry set a program record by making 11 straight field goals, surpassing the old mark of eight set by Oren Milstein in 2016. He has also converted on 31 consecutive PATs dating back to the end of the 2023 season, which is five shy of setting another Columbia benchmark. Merry is 10-of-12 on field goals this season, has the second most makes in the Ivy League, and ranks No. 8 in program history for most field goals (18) in under two seasons with the Lions. As a rookie, Merry made eight field goals. Five of those were between 40 and 49 yards, and he set a long of 45.

BILLY BIG FOOT

William Hughes continues to post his name all over the Columbia record books. Against Dartmouth, he set a new record with an 80-yard punt, surpassing the old mark of 77. It was the longest punt in the Ivy League this season and third longest in FCS. He is currently Columbia's all-time leader in yards per punt. He is averaging 42.7 yards per attempt, which beats Cameron Nizialek's previous mark (41.3). Hughes is coming off his second consecutive All-Ivy League selection in 2023. He led the Ivy League and was No. 6 in the country in punting, averaging 44.0 yards per punt. He boomed 13 punts over 50 yards, including his season-long 71-yarder against Marist, the fifth-longest in program history. Hughes has the knack for pinning opponents deep, with 16 punts inside the 20 last season..

CAN'T GET CARTER

Carter McFadden has been a weapon for Columbia in both punt and kickoff returns over the last three seasons. McFadden is currently No. 2 in the Ivy League, averaging 12.6 yards per punt return. In 2023, the senior ranked in the top 30 nationally in punt returns (10.2/att. - No. 20) and kickoff returns (23.4/att. - No. 26).

BAKER BLOCKS IT

Junior Ayden Baker blocked a key PAT in the first quarter of the Lafayette game. The defensive lineman showed off his hops and got a piece of the ball to keep Columbia in front 10-6 in the early stages of the game and halt the Leopards' momentum.

MAC ATTACK

New special teams coordinator Garrett McLaughlin should have no issue keeping up with the tradition of Columbia's special teams play, which has been a strength of the program since 2015. McLaughlin's units shined in 2023 at New Hampshire, leading the nation with five blocked punts and ranking No. 1 in the CAA in kickoff (24.17) and punt (18.37) return yardage. McLaughlin was named a 2022 'Special Teams Coach on the Rise' by Our Coaching Network for his work with special teams.

BILL CAMPBELL '62CC '64TC

A four-year student-athlete, William "Bill" Campbell '62CC '64TC captained the 1961 Ivy League Championship football team, which was inducted into the Columbia Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010, and earned All-Ivy League accolades as a senior. In 1963, Bill and a group of football and rugby alumni founded the Old Blue Rugby Club. He returned to Columbia to coach the Columbia Football team for six seasons between 1974 and 1979.

After his coaching stint, Campbell embarked on a legendary career. He was vice president at J. Walter Thompson, an advertising agency based in New York, and then moved on to become general manager of consumer products for Kodak Europe. After Kodak, he joined Apple Computer in 1983, and rose to the level of executive vice president; he went on to found and served as president and CEO of Claris Corporation, a spin-off software developing company created and owned by Apple in 1990. Campbell assumed his role as chairman of Intuit, the maker of Quicken, QuickBooks, and Turbo Tax, in 1998 and served as its CEO until 2000. As an executive, Campbell's marketing and strategic acumen helped build Claris, Apple, and Intuit alike into remarkable Silicon Valley success stories. Later, his advisory roles as a director at Apple, Google, and others established him as the "Coach of Silicon Valley."

He joined the University Trustees in 2003 and was named Chair just two years later. He led the University through one of the most dynamic eras in its history – one that included the planning and groundbreaking of the new Manhattanville campus, the opening of the University's Global Centers, the successful completion of the record-setting Columbia Campaign and The Columbia Campaign for Athletics: Achieving Excellence, the creation of the Columbia Alumni Association and many more initiatives.

In 2009, recognizing his influence and love of the game of football, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame announced that its highest honor, the former Draddy Trophy, sometimes referred to as the "academic Heisman," would be renamed the William V. Campbell Trophy.

Because of his tremendous leadership and passion for Columbia Athletics, the University dedicated the Campbell Sports Center in his honor in October 2013.

In fall 2014, the athletics program retired uniform number 67 – the number Campbell wore as an offensive lineman and linebacker for the 1961 Ivy League Champions – for all 31 of Columbia's varsity teams.
