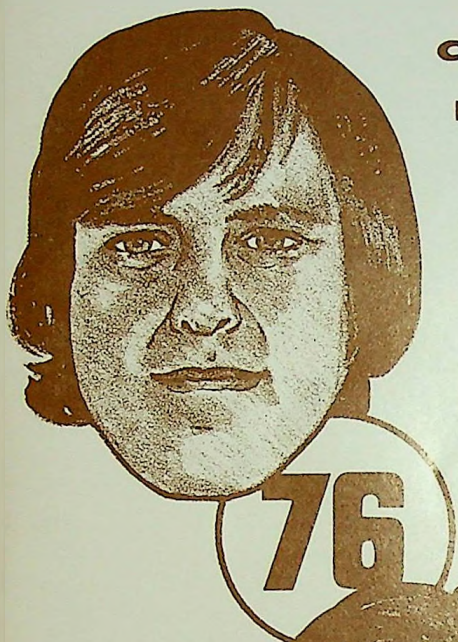


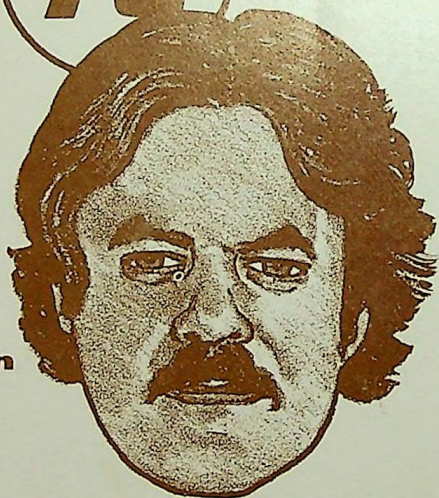

A BROWN UNIVERSITY PROFILE

"It was not an accident that Brown University was founded under the leadership of the Baptists...During four decades of the 18th century, no fewer than twelve colleges were established...Most of these institutions were controlled by religious bodies: Harvard and Yale by the Congregationalists; the College of New Jersey [Princeton] by the Presbyterians; the University of Pennsylvania, King's College [Columbia] and William and Mary College by the Episcopalians; Rutgers College by the Reformed Dutch Church. It was natural that the Baptists also should desire a college of their own."

History of Brown University 1764-1914
W.C. Bronson

Founded in 1764 in Warren, R.I. as Rhode Island College, the nation's seventh and New England's third oldest college, the school was moved to Providence in 1770. Its name was changed that year to Brown University in recognition of the contributions of Nicholas Brown.

Brown maintains a strong tradition of dedication to both undergraduate and graduate education in the humanities, arts, and sciences. While the University's two centuries of existence have involved constant expansion and diversification of academic programs to encompass expanding spheres of knowledge, these changes have been accomplished with an overriding concern for the importance of sustaining an environment of scholarship and community with the growing university.

Brown today has a one-to-ten faculty-student ratio and offers its undergraduates opportunities to study with first rate faculty who also teach at the graduate level. A recent development of major significance at Brown was the initiation in 1969 of a liberalized New Curriculum which offered the student the opportunity to design and control the pattern of his or her undergraduate education. Considered at the time one of the most flexible and progressive academic programs to be found at any major university in the country, the New Curriculum was the result of three years of discussion and debate among students, faculty, and University officials.

In 1973 the University accepted the first freshman class into its new seven-year medical program. Brown's is the first full-fledged medical school in the state of Rhode Island.

ATHLETIC STAFF

ROBERT A. SEIPLE

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Robert Seiple, an outstanding two sport athlete during his undergraduate days at Brown, was appointed athletic director in June, 1975. Prior to that he had served for three years as assistant athletic director and also helped as an assistant football coach during the fall.

A 1965 graduate of Brown, Seiple starred in both football and lacrosse for the Bruins. Twice he was named to the All-Ivy team as an end and during his senior year he was chosen to the All-East team and was named Brown's Most Valuable

Player. He captained the 1965 lacrosse team and earned All-New England honors that year.

After receiving an AB degree in American Literature, Seiple worked in the Brown Admission Office before joining the Marine Corps in 1966. His service time included over 300 combat missions in Vietnam. He then spent two years in private business before returning to Brown in 1971, again a member of the admissions office. In 1972 he was named assistant AD.

ARLENE GORTON

ASSOCIATE A.D.

Brown's associate athletic director and chairman of the Department of Physical Education, Arlene Gorton, is a 1952 graduate of Pembroke College (now part of Brown). After receiving her Master's Degree in Education from the University of North Carolina in 1954, she joined the staff at Connecticut College as a physical education instructor. In 1962 she returned to her alma mater. She served as chairman of the women's Physical Education Department prior to being named to her present position in 1973.

RICHARD "RICH" SARDELLA

ASST. A.

Rich Sardella, a 1969 graduate of Bryant College, has been with Brown since 1970 when he was appointed ticket manager a position he still holds. In 1973 he was named assistant to the athletic director. The Jersey city, NJ native was an outstanding second baseman in his schoolboy days and in 1969 served as freshman baseball coach at Bryant.

JOHN PARRY

ASST. A.D.

John Parry, a 1965 graduate of Brown, joined the Bruin staff as assistant A.D. in the summer of 1975. Parry was an outstanding football player during his undergraduate career. Upon graduation he held six school records and an equal number of Ivy League marks, all set as a receiver. In 1973 he was named to the All-time Ivy League team. A football teammate of current A.D. Bob Seiple, Parry also lettered in basketball and lacrosse. From Brown he went on to earn a Master's degree in 1967 from Pennsylvania's Wharton Graduate School of Finance and Commerce.

John was a graduate assistant football coach at Penn in 1965-66. In the spring he is Brown's JV Lacrosse Coach.

BRUIN COACHING STAFF

JOHN ANDERSON

HEAD COACH

Ursinus '54



When Brown University chose John Anderson as its new head football coach in 1973, they selected a man with previous Ivy League coaching experience who had already shown he was a winner by turning around the program he was then responsible for.

Anderson had just turned Middlebury College's floundering football program around in four short years. He was given the same task at Brown, a challenge he met head on and with the success all had hoped he would attain.

The always positive 1954 graduate of Ursinus College spent ten years in the high school coaching ranks, followed by five years as a collegiate assistant and then four years at Middlebury.

A native of Carlisle, Pennsylvania, Anderson and his wife Marjorie have three children, Kurt, who is now attending Williams College, Jill and Scott.

Anderson's high school coaching career included a stint under Joe Yukica at Central Dolphin High in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, followed by two head coaching positions, the first at Selensgrove (A) High, the second at Cumberland Valley High in Mechanicsburg, PA.

He began his college coaching career at another Ivy League school, Dartmouth, where he spent one year as freshmen coach and three seasons as offensive line coach under Bob Blackman. Following his stint with the Big Green, he moved on to Boston College, where he worked as defensive line coach for one year under Joe Yukica.

Then, in 1969, he moved to Middlebury, Vermont, taking over the Panther's football program. In the five previous seasons before his arrival, Middlebury had won 11 games. His first year as head coach wasn't spectacular, 2-6. The foundation was set, however, for future success. From there the program shot upward, with a 5-3 record in his second year, followed the third year by a 6-2 mark, then an unbelievable, undefeated campaign, 8-0.

Anderson is a very intense coach, one who believes the game is played for the players, not the coaches. He takes great pride in the progress and accomplishments of his players. He believes strongly in the young men who play football at Brown and in the program that has been established.

On his coaching philosophy, Anderson offers this: "Wherever I've coached, I've always tried to stay close to the players. All young men at the college level have problems at some time or other. I'm concerned about those problems and will want to try and solve them. On the field, I go by a structured practice schedule. Everything has to be bang-bang. But off the field, I don't like a ri-

gid atmosphere. It's counter-productive.

"The two men I coached under, Bob Blackman and Joe Yukica, liked to play the wide open game and I do too. Putting in the flourishes during the week can help make the game a bit more fun for the kids. And on Saturday afternoons an offense that includes the razzle-dazzle can put pressure on the opponent's defenses and put fans in the stands.

"Being unpredictable on defense is just as important. We do a lot of moving, stunting, blitzing and jumping around. We definitely are not predictable." Anderson coached defenses, however, have been predictable in their consistently high national rankings each year.

Anderson inherited a club at Brown that had won but one of 18 games the previous two years. While an Ivy League title wasn't his goal the first year, a winning season was.

Not since 1964 had the Bruins finished with a record above .500, but Anderson wasted no time, bringing the Bruins home with a 4-3-1 mark in his first year. A step in the right direction, he said.

In 1974 Anderson and his squad entered the season with high hopes. Not one to duck a question, he admitted he thought Brown would be a factor in the Ivy League. Five games into the season and with only one win, Anderson said, "We are so close, this team could win the first four."

Looking more like a prophet than a coach, Anderson's prediction was right on the money, with the Bruins winning their final four, all against league opponents, a feat no Brown team had ever before achieved.

Included in the wins was a stunning 10-7 win at Harvard over the heavily favored Crimson before a regional TV audience. For his team's upset, Anderson was named by UPI as the national Coach of the Week.

Anderson's third year moved him even closer to an Ivy League title. Coupled with four wins at the close of the 1974 season, the Bruins, ran off three more league wins and a tie before falling to Harvard in the Ivy League showdown late in the season. His Bruins finished 6-2-1 overall and 5-1-1 in the Ivy League, just one-half game out of first and by far Brown's best showing ever against league members.

Anderson was honored twice last year for his efforts. He was named by broadcasters and writers as Rhode Island's Coach of the Year and the New England Officials Association honored him at their annual dinner.

WILLIAM "BILL" RUSSO

OFFENSIVE LINE

Brown '69

Bill Russo first joined the Bruin coaching staff as a part time assistant following graduation in 1969. In 1971 he was promoted to a full-time position. For three years [1970-72] he was defensive coordinator for the freshmen program. In 1972 he took charge of the Bruin scouting program. Working with Jack Duffy [head of Brown's computer program], Russo put the entire scouting program on computer.

A native of Glasgo, Conn., Russo is an alumnus of Griswold High, where he captained the football team his senior year to the state championship while being named to the all-league team. During his sophomore season at Brown, Russo played offensive guard. As a junior and senior, he was a standout linebacker.

Russo, who holds a karate brown belt, was a dean's list student, majoring in philosophy at Brown. He was a member of the committee that formulated the school's new curriculum. He enjoys weight lifting and training [in charge of Brown's weight training program], plays bridge and chess and likes to camp. He is married to the former Susan Fowler.

ANDY TALLEY

BACKFIELD

S. Conn '67

Andy Talley joined the Bruin football staff in 1973, following stints in both the high school and collegiate ranks. He spent four years at Middlebury College as backfield coach prior to moving to Brown. He shared a major responsibility in developing the Panther's potent offensive attack operated by head coach John Anderson. When Anderson took the head job at Brown, it was only natural for him to bring Talley to the Bruin campus.

A native of Bryn Mawr, Penn., and a 1961 graduate of Haverford High, Talley was an All-Delaware County selection in football and played in the Delaware County all-star game. He starred for four years at Southern Connecticut State College as a defensive back. During that span the Owls were Eastern Football Conference champs twice, 1965 and 1966.

Talley remained at Southern Connecticut after graduation and in 1970 obtained his Master's degree in physical education. During those years he was backfield coach and head wrestling coach at Simsbury High in Simsbury, Conn. His wrestlers won the North-West Sectional title in 1968, for which he was nominated for Connecticut Coach of the Year honors. In two seasons, Simsbury football teams won 16, lost two.

Prior to joining the staff at Middlebury, Talley also spent a year as secondary coach at Springfield College while doing graduate work. He is married to the former Arlene Zitney, a former junior gymnastics champion from Connecticut. The Talleys have one son, Josh.

DAVID "DAVE" RITCHIE

LINEBACKERS

Cincinnati '62

Before joining the Bruin staff in 1973, Dave Ritchie was an assistant coach and outstanding recruiter at the University of Cincinnati. During his stint with the Ohio school he coached linebackers and defensive tackles.

Ritchie, who holds both a B.S. [1962] and Master's degree [1971] in Education from Cincinnati, grew up in New Bedford, Mass. He played for New Bedford High three years [1952-54], earning all-county quarterback honors. Completing his secondary schooling at Withrow High in Cincinnati, he was an All State fullback choice in 1955. He also played fullback and linebacker at Cincinnati and twice was the Missouri Valley Conference playing champion [1959-60]. He also attended Greenbrier Military Academy for a year before entering college.

Ritchie became assistant coach at Greenbrier (Lewisburg, WV) in 1962. Four years later he took over as head coach and in three years his teams compiled an 18-6-2 record. He was named the 1968 Coach of the Year in West Virginia. In 1969 he left Greenbrier to join the Cincinnati staff as an assistant. He is married to the former Sharon Kaye Francia and they have three children, Phyllis Anne, Susan Elizabeth and Davey.

JOSEPH "JOE" WIRTH

DEFENSIVE LINE

W. Virginia '60

Joe Wirth joined Brown's staff in 1973 following coaching assignments at Colgate, Holy Cross and two high schools in his native Pittsburgh, Penn. In addition to his football coaching duties, Wirth has been wrestling coach since 1974.

After receiving a bachelor's degree in physical education from West Virginia, Wirth spent four years as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach at South Hills Catholic High in Pittsburgh.

In 1964, he returned to his alma mater, North Catholic High, as head football coach, and won the Catholic Championship in 1965.

He joined the collegiate coaching ranks in 1968 when he was named defensive coordinator and line coach at Holy Cross. While with the Crusaders, he coached their wrestling team for one season. In 1969 he joined the football staff at Colgate, where he also was defensive coordinator and Line coach.

After graduating from high school in 1952, Wirth played semi-pro football in the Greater Pittsburgh League before entering the Army in 1954. Married to the former Carole Johnson, the Wirths have six children, Tom, Joe, David, Colleen, Carolyn and Gretchen.

MIKE GOLDBERGER

SECONDARY

Middlebury '72

Mike Goldberger came to Brown in 1973 after starring for three seasons on John Anderson's Middlebury College teams as a defensive back. He was team captain in 1971 and also an outstanding pitcher and outfielder.

During his first two seasons at Brown he was assistant freshmen coach. In 1975 he joined the varsity staff, coaching the receivers for one season before taking over as secondary coach in 1976. He is also an assistant varsity baseball coach, having spent two years guiding the Bruin frosh, 1974 and 1975.

The Westbury, New York native attended W.T. Clarke High, where he earned all-league football honors and also lettered in basketball and baseball. After graduating in 1968, he moved on to Middlebury where he received his bachelor's degree in history while lettering four years.

After graduating from the Vermont college, Goldberger taught math for a year at Vermont reform school and also coached part time at his alma mater.

ANDY DZURINKO

ENDS-LINEBACKERS

Bucknell '65

Andy Dzurinko joined Brown's football staff in 1976 after five very successful seasons as the defensive coordinator at Williams College.

A native of Pennsylvania, Dzurinko attended high school in Monessen and later graduated from Bucknell University (1965). He played on Bucknell's 1964 club that won the Lambert Cup and earned All-Middle Atlantic Conference and All-East first team honor as a senior. During his three varsity seasons he played both linebacker and offensive guard and he has been chosen to the Bison's All-Time great football team.

His coaching experience started as a graduate assistant at Pittsburgh in 1968 and 1969. During that time he earned a Master's Degree in secondary education. In 1971 he received his certification in secondary counseling from Duquesne University.

Before moving on to Williams for the 1971 season he coached at Moon School District in Coraopolis, Pennsylvania for one season. At Williams he coached the defensive line and linebackers and in the five seasons he was with the Ephmen, they won 34 of 40 games, including nine shutouts. Only once did opponents average more than 13 points per game for a season.

He is married to the former Mary Frances Evich and the Dzurinko's have two children, Dara Anne and Christopher George.

JOHN PARRY

RECEIVERS

Brown '65

Assistant Athletic Director John Parry handles Brown's receivers, using the expertise he gained as a two-time All-Ivy end. At one time Parry held most of Brown's game, season and career passing records, along with several Ivy League marks. His 96 receptions during the 1962-63-64 seasons is still a career mark and he is listed three times in Brown's list of one-season "bests" for yards gained. He also earned varsity letters in basketball and lacrosse and in 1973 was named to the All-Time Ivy League football team. Parry was named to the Brown staff in 1975.

ADAM CRAVEN

FRESHMEN COACH

Penn State '52

Adam Craven joined Brown's staff in 1976 after eight years as head coach at Frederick High in Maryland. His college career included two years of junior college football, where he was twice honored with all-conference honors, and then two years at Penn State.

Craven was a member of Rip Engle's first Penn State football team after the latter had moved from Brown to the Pennsylvania college in 1950. After graduating from Penn State, he returned to Storer Junior College for two years. His clubs posted a 13-4 mark and each year led the EIAC in defense.

From there he moved to Charles Town, West Virginia, where he coached at Page Jackson High, then on to Douglas High in Leesburg, Virginia. His Page High teams won three Tri-State Athletic Union titles and at Douglas, he won two Northern Virginia championships.

Craven took over the coaching reins at Frederick High in 1968. Twice his clubs won the Tri-State championship, first in 1968 and again in 1973. Two members of that 1968 club are now playing in the NFL, Chuck Foreman with Minnesota and Bill Cravin with Cleveland. He also coached Brown's Mike Sherman '76.

FRANK GEORGE

HEAD TRAINER

Head trainer at Brown since 1966, Frank George was elected president of the National Athletic Trainers Association in May, 1974, and re-elected to a second term in 1976. A 1962 graduate of UMass, he is the first trainer from the East Coast to be elected president in the 25 year history of the NATA. George is a native of Boston and also holds a certificate of physical therapy from Boston Univ.

In 1976 he served as a trainer for the USA Olympic Team at Innsbruck and also lectured in Japan as a guest of the country.

The Bruins were fourth in rushing offense (1163). In scoring, the Bruins were first, averaging 28.1 ppg, just ahead of Harvard and well ahead of the other six teams. Brown finished fourth in scoring defense, allowing its opponents an average of 18.1 ppg. The Bruins scored 24 TD's, one less than leader Harvard, but more than made up the difference with ten field goals, a total only equalled by Princeton.

On defense, the Bruins allowed an average of 316 ypg, ranking fifth. While the Bruins rushing defense was third, only two teams gave up more yards in the air than did Brown.

The Bruins finished third in team punting (35.4), fourth in team punt returns (6.5), seventh in team kickoff returns (18.0).

Brown's Roll of Honor

NATIONAL HALL OF FAME

JOHN W. HEISMAN, '91

An outstanding football and baseball player at Brown from 1887 to 1889, John William Heisman became one of the leading coaches and a dominant personality in intercollegiate football during the ensuing 45 years until his death in 1936. After obtaining his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania, he launched a football coaching career at Oberlin College that extended through a long series of successes at Akron, Alabama Poly, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Penn, Washington and Jefferson, and Rice. He did much to "open up" the game by use of the forward pass and the shifting line. At Georgia Tech, where he coached for 16 years, his teams of 1915-16-17 won 25 straight and piled up 1,129 points to their opponents' 61. After retiring from coaching, he became Physical Director of the Downtown Athletic Club of New York. He was one of the founders and first president of the Touchdown Club. In his honor, the Downtown A.C. established the Heisman Trophy, which is presented annually to the outstanding collegiate football player in the nation. Born in Cleveland, Oct. 23, 1869, he died on Oct. 3, 1936.

DeORMOND [Tuss] McLAUGHRY

A 55-year association with football as player, coach and administrator was duly acknowledged in December, 1962, when Tuss McLaughry was inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hall of Fame. From the day he played his first football game at Sharon, Pa., High School in 1907, Tuss and football were inseparable, except for distinguished service in World War II. A standout player at Michigan State and Westminster, he began his coaching career at the latter college in 1915. He coached four years at Amherst, 1922-25, and his last team there was the highest scoring team in the history of the Little Three. He then moved to Brown, where he guided the famed Iron Men of 1926 to the only undefeated season in the school's history. His 1928 and 1932 teams lost only one game. Before leaving Brown for Dartmouth in 1941, he had the pleasure of coaching his son, John. Later at Dartmouth another son, Bob played for him. His 1948 and 1949 teams were the first in Dartmouth's history to win six major games. He coached East squads in the San Francisco Shrine game four times, the New York All-Star Game in 1940 and the Chicago All-Star Game in 1947. After retiring from coaching in 1954, Tuss continued to serve the American Football Coaches Association as secretary-treasurer. He died in 1975.

FREDERICK DOUGLAS [Fritz] POLLARD, '16

Probably the greatest player ever to perform for Brown, and ranked as one of the greatest black players ever to perform in college ranks, Fritz Pollard was the star of Brown's 1915 team which played in the first official Rose Bowl game [1916], and the '16 team which compiled an 8-1 record and ranks among the University's best. Walter Camp, whose All-American selections are regarded as the last word for the era he covered, ranked Pollard as "one of the greatest runners these eyes have ever seen." In 1916 he scored all three touchdowns as Brown handed Yale its lone defeat of the season, 21-6, and scored two and set up the other in the 21-0 victory against Harvard. Born in Chicago January 27, 1894, Pollard presently resides in New York City.

EDWARD NORTH ROBINSON, '96

If any man deserves recognition as "the father of Brown football," it is Edward North Robinson. His influence spans more than a quarter of a century — from 1892, when he entered Brown and helped put the game on a sound basis as an undergraduate, to 1925 when he wound up an illustrious coaching career that covered 24 seasons at his alma mater. He won nine letters in his playing days, four in football. But more important was his activity in helping the grid game take root when baseball was THE sport at Brown. He served three separate terms as head coach, the last covering 16 years, and won 140 games against 82 losses and 12 ties at a time when Eastern football was undisputedly the nation's best, and Brown was often called upon to meet the top grid powers with undermanned forces.

Born in Lynn, Mass. on October 15, 1873, he died on March 10, 1945. His coaching record at Brown follows:

LIAM EARL SPRACKLING, '12

Brown's only three-time All-American, the 150-pound Sprackling is rated by many as the finest all-around football player in the school's history. As a quarterback he could beat a team in many ways. One of the game's most successful pioneers with the forward pass, he threw 10 touchdown aerals, a figure exceeded only seven times by Bruin passers since 1911. In addition, he was a brilliant runner, a heady field general and an adept field-goal kicker. He kicked three field goals against Yale in 1910. He owns the Brown record for most yards gained on kickoff returns in a single game with 147 against the Carlisle Indians in 1909. His three Brown teams won 21 games, lost 8 and tied 2. The Cleveland, Ohio, native was selected on Walter Camp's All-American teams in 1909-10-11 and in 1964 became the sixth man connected with Brown football to be elected to the National Hall of Fame. He is now retired from his postion as president of the Anaconda Wire and Cable Company.

W. WALLACE WADE, '17

A member of the 1915 Brown team that played Washington State in the first Rose Bowl game on Jan. 1, 1916, Wally Wade earned a place among the great coaches of American intercollegiate football during an illustrious career that spanned 40 years. After serving his apprenticeship as a high school coach and an assistant at Vanderbilt, he took over the head coaching reins at Alabama in 1923 and built the Crimson Tide into a major football power, winning 61 of 74 games and taking three of his teams to the Rose Bowl. Moving to Duke Univerisity in 1931, he sent two Blue Devil squads to the Rose Bowl and compiled a record of 110 victories, 36 losses and 10 ties through 1950, when he retired to become the Commissioner of the Southern Conference. In addition to his achievements in the field of coaching, he distinguished himself in service during two World Wars. He interrupted his tenure at Duke at the age of 53 to serve as a lieutenant colonel in the artillery during World War II, taking part in several major battles in the European Theatre. Wally was born in Trenton, Tennessee on June 15, 1892. Now retired from his Southern Conference post, he operates his 120-acre livestock farm near Durham, N.C.

CHARLES "RIP" ENGLE

The latest member of Brown's football family inducted into the Hall of Fame is Charles "Rip" Engle, head coach of the Bruin gridiron teams from 1944 through 1949 and then head mentor at Penn State until his retirement in 1966. Engle was inducted January, 1973. Recognized as one of the top coaches in his profession, Engle guided Brown to a 28-20-4 record in six years, including marks of 7-2-0 and 8-1-0 his final two seasons. His success at Penn State, where he compiled a 104-48-4 record, was amazing. He guided Penn State to post-season Bowl appearances almost every season, or so it seemed, and he coached in all-star games too numerous to mention. Engle learned his football under the old master, Dick Harlow, while at Western Maryland. He graduated in 1930 and moved into the high school ranks, where he coached at Waynesboro High [Pennsylvania] for 11 years. He joined the Bruin staff in 1942 as an assistant to Neil "Skip" Stahley and when the latter entered the Navy, Engle was appointed head coach.

THE IRON MEN

Beside being the only undefeated team in Brown history, earned even greater fame as the "Iron Men," so-called because the starting 11 played 60 minutes without substitution on consecutive weeks against Yale and Dartmouth, and well into the fourth quarter against Harvard later in the season. They lost their chance for an undefeated-untied season in the last game when Colgate earned a 10-10 deadlock. The team was ranked among the top 10 nationally. Its members were Captain Hal Broda and Thurston Towle, ends; Ed Kevorkian and Paul Hodge, tackles; Lou Farber and Orland Smith, guards; Charles Considine, center; Red Randall, quarterback; Dave Mishel and Ed Lawrence, halfbacks; and Al Cornsweet, full-back.

BROWN IN FIRST ROSE BOWL

Since the late 1940's, Rose Bowl participants have been representatives of the Pacific-8 and Big Ten Conferences. It has not always been so, however. It was under Ed Robinson, a graduate in 1896 and for many years head coach, that Brown journeyed westward in 1915 to play in the first Tournament of Roses New Year's Day classic at Pasadena, CA.

The Bruins were chosen as the Eastern representative after posting a 5-3-1 mark. Those losses came via a 7-0 setback to Amherst and 6-0 to Syracuse, a 16-7 loss to Harvard and a scoreless game with Trinity. Brown outscored its opponents 167-32 that year, defeating URI 38-0, Williams 33-0, Vermont 46-0, Yale 3-0 and much heralded Carlisle 39-3.

In that first game, played January 1, 1916, Brown, with its brilliant Fritz Pollard, was apposed by the powerful team of Washington State. It came up mud on that day memorial in Brown gridiron history and Pollard was unable to cut loose as he had been accustomed to do on Eastern gridirons. WSU won, 14-0, but to Brown always will belong the distinction of having been the first Eastern team to play in the Rose Bowl.

BRUIN OUTLOOK '76

A quick glance at Brown University's vital football statistics for the coming season, lettermen and starters returning, might lead one to surmise the Bruins will have it a little tougher than a year ago, when they were second in the Ivy League.

While some might hold that opinion with good reason, head coach John Anderson isn't sure that will be the case. The Bruins, Anderson believes, may be equal to the 1975 team, if things go right, that is. There are some question areas, to be sure. The offensive line and secondary are big question marks as Anderson prepares for the 1976 season. Brown will operate a more versatile offense and should have more depth at almost every position, but the offensive line and secondary give Brown an unknown factor yet to be proven in game action.

"Each succeeding freshmen group has been stronger," Anderson states of the last three recruiting seasons. "That means, in most cases, our younger people are equal to or better than the upper classmen. The end result this year should be a squad with more overall talent than a year ago, even though we lack the large number of returning starters most people look at."

Heading the list of returnees is All-American candidate Bob Farnham (5-10, 175, senior), the nation's leading pass receiver last year and an All-East first team selection. Farnham, a sure-handed and versatile performer who also returns kicks for the Bruins, averaged over six receptions per game last year and in the process of making 56 receptions for 701 yards, set several records.

Joining Farnham on offense will be co-captain and All-Ivy first team pick Mike Prairie (6-2, 235, senior) at center, flanker Charlie Watkins (5-10, 165, junior), and guard George Caraberis (6-2, 215, senior).

Senior Paul Michalko (5-11, 180) will have the inside track as the number one quarterback. Michalko earned that spot as a sophomore, but a shoulder separation put him out of action in his first start. Then last year Bob Bateman dropped in for one season after Vermont dropped football and he edged Michalko out. Michalko is an excellent runner who will give the Bruins an option oriented attack, but he also has a very strong arm.

Letterman John Andersen (6-2, 190, senior) also returns at quarterback, and the Bruins will be bolstered by at least two sophomore signal callers. Elsewhere in the backfield, Watkins will have more opportunities to use his speed than a year ago. He is one of six lettermen ball carriers back. They include junior fullback Francis Jamiel (5-11, 215), junior flanker Joe Mixie (6-1, 195), and halfbacks Seth Morris (5-10, 190, junior) and Wally Shields (5-10, 200, junior). However, Anderson warns, none of the backs at this time have a guaranteed starting position.

Up front, in addition to Farnham, Caraberis and Prairie, the Bruins have five returning lettermen. Tight end Fred Polacek (6-3, 215, senior) is back, as are guards Rich Riddle (6-2, 255, senior) and Steve Lloyd (6-0, 240, senior), plus tackles Steve Narr (6-3, 230, junior) and John Gaddis (6-4, 235, senior).

On defense, the Bruins will be strong at ends with the return of starters Scott Nelson (6-1, 215, senior) and Mike Sherman (6-1, 200, senior), plus part-time starter Attilio Cecchin (6-2, 195, junior). Bob Miller (6-0, 230, senior) is back at one tackle spot and Kevin Rooney (6-3, 230, junior), who was quite probably the best tackle on the team last year at the close of the season, is back, along with Kevin Webb (6-2, 235, junior), also a strong lineman. Mike Wallace (6-0, 230, senior) saw a lot of action at middle guard and he also returns.

Brown returns three junior linebackers who earned letters playing behind the three senior starters last year. They are Lou Cole (5-11, 220), Ke Phelps (6-1, 215) and Jeff Van Ribbink (6-2, 195). Cole, who started on couple of occasions last year and saw almost as much action as the starters, is a definite honors candidate.

In the secondary Anderson expects to make some adjustments. The upcoming sophomore group should give the Bruins some much needed talent in a couple of key areas.
