The Ball State women's basketball team played well defensively at home against Purdue Thursday night holding the Boilermakers to only 37 percent shooting from the field but couldn't get a shot to fall. The Cardinals struggled to a season-low 23 percent from floor in a 58-42 loss to the Big Ten Boilermakers at Worthen Arena. Ball State is now looking to rebound from the loss when it travels to Oakland University Sunday at 3 p.m. Both teams enter Sunday's matchup with a 5-3 overall record.

In Thursday's contest, Ball State went without a 3-point field goal until the final minutes of the game when junior forward Moriah Monaco drained a pair. She extended her tea's streak to 110 consecutive games with a made 3-pointer dating back to March 2013.

Sunday's contest against Oakland will mark only the third time these two schools' have met. The Cardinals won their last meeting over the Golden Grizzlies by a score of 75-50 in Worthen Arena on Dec. 6, 2014. Prior to that game, Ball State had not played Oakland since the 1998-99 season. The Cardinals suffered a 77-71 loss to the Golden Grizzlies that year at the Liberty Lady Flames Classic in Lynchburg, Va., under the direction of former head coach Robyn Markey.

• After seven games, four different Cardinals are averaging in double figures in scoring, led by junior forward Moriah Monaco at 15.3 points per game. Senior center Renee Bennett (15.0), sophomore guard Destiny Washington (10.6) and senior guard Jill Morrison (10.6) are also averaging double figures each contest.

• Sophomore Carmen Grande has dished out 64 total assists so far this season, she is averaging 8.7 assists per game which ranks second nationally. Grande registered a career-high 13 assists this season against North Carolina A&T (11/23) and Chicago State (12/1).

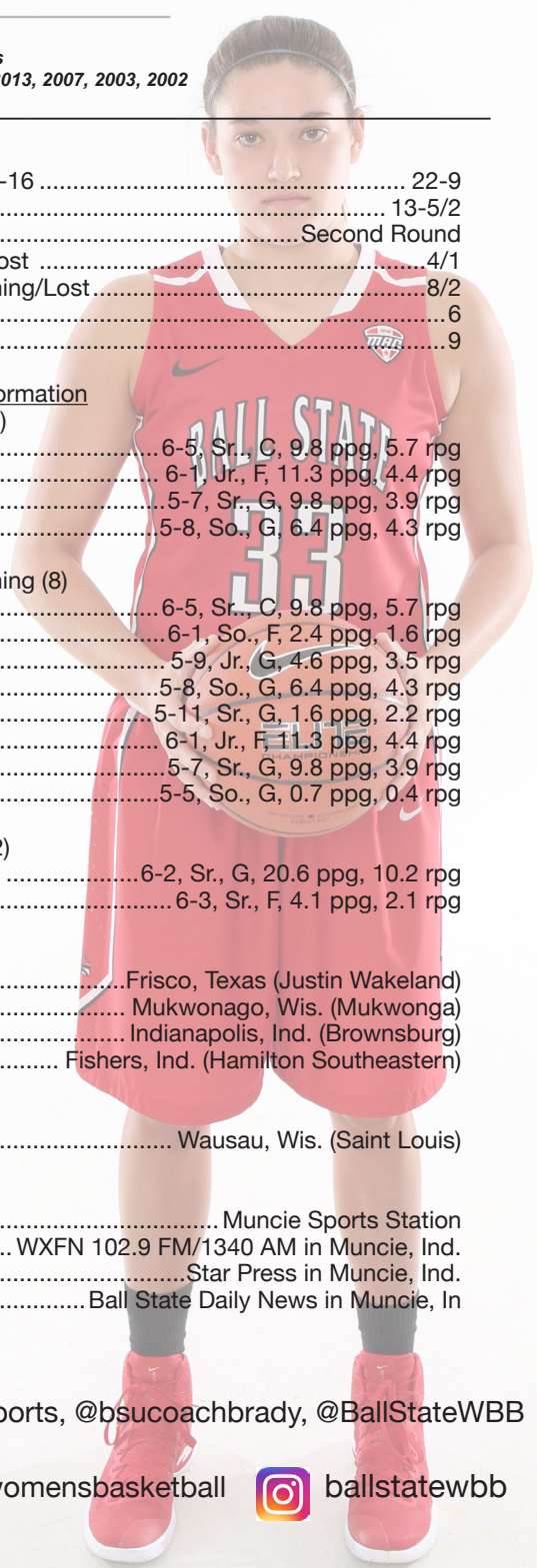

CARDINAL OF THE WEEK



Sophomore guard Destiny Washington led the Cardinals to two wins this week over Chicago State and in-state rival Butler, after averaging a double-double with 17.5 point per game off of 12-of-23 shooting (.739) and 10.0 rebounds. Washington collected her second double-double of the season after a career best performance in points (18.0) and rebounds (12.0) against the Cougars. Her hot shooting hand also helped Ball State to its best field goal percentage of the season (59.4) against Chicago State. She then wrapped up last week's competition Sunday after leading the Cardinals to a 74-50 victory over in-state rival Butler. She registered 17 points and pulled down eight rebounds against the Bulldogs helping Ball State improve to 5-2 on the year.

Sallee Knows How To Win: Head Coach Brady Sallee is the only head coach in program history to have four consecutive winning seasons — 17-16 (2012-13), 18-17 (2013-14), 17-14 (2014-15) and 21-8 (2015-16).

43 Seasons Of Women's Basketball At Ball State: This is the 43rd season in Ball State women's basketball history. The Cardinals are 507-621 (.448) and 260-318 (.448) in the Mid-American Conference.

The Cardinals Remain Efficient From The Floor: Last season Ball State was more efficient from the floor than its opponents in 22 of the Cardinals 32 games. The Cardinals field goal percentage for 32 games was .419 while Ball State's opponents were held to .368. The Cardinals are continuing the trend this season after shooting .451 percent for eight games while holding their opponents to .346 from the floor.

Best Non-Conference Showing In a Decade: The Cardinals had their best non-conference showing last season since the 2006 season after posting an 8-3 non-conference record so far this season Ball State is 5-3.

Still Outscoring Opponents In Worthen Arena: The Ball State women's basketball team out-scored its opponents by 177 points at John E. Worthen Arena last season, which is an average of 10.4 points per game. The Cardinals shot .443% from the field at home, while limiting opponents to .372%. Ball State also out-rebounded opponents 594-491 at home last season, including a 392 to 314 on the defensive glass. The Cardinals are continuing that trend at home in 2016-17 and is out-rebounding their opponents, 45.2 to 35.2 while out-scoring their opponents by 82 points (75.5 per game).

Starting The Season On the Right Foot: After winning their season opener on Friday, Nov. 11 the Cardinals finally broke a 10-year losing streak. Prior to that Ball State had not won their season opener since the 2006-07 season, under the direction of former Ball State head coach Tracy Roller, when the Cardinals earned a 62-58 victory at Big Ten foe Michigan, Nov. 13 2006.

Rebound That Basketball: Senior center Renee Bennett's back-to-back double doubles to start the year is the first time a Cardinal has accomplished the feat since former Cardinal Emily Maggert in 2009, that year Maggert started with three double-doubles.

She Shoots She Scores: Junior forward Moriah Monaco opened the season with a 24-point performance against Arkansas-Pine Bluff (11/11) which marks the most points scored by a Cardinal in a decade. Lisa Rusche chipped in a game-high 23 points against Kentucky in Worthen Arena in 2006.

Sophomore Sensation: Sophomore guard Destiny Washington has been a great addition to the Ball State women's basketball team this season. Washington, an Indiana native, has recorded two double-doubles, scoring a season-high 18 points against Chicago State (12/01) and is averaging 10.6 points and 7.6 rebound for the Cardinals this season.

What's Next: The Ball State women's basketball team will take a week break for finals before hosting Lipscomb Sunday, Dec. 18 at 2 p.m. in Worthen Arena. Ball State has faced Lipscomb only twice in program history, with the Cardinals winning both of those meetings. The Cardinals defeated the Bisons on their home court last season by a score of 72-60 on Dec. 11. This will be the first visit to Worthen Arena for Lipscomb.

Ball State Basketball Signs Three NLI's:

Oshlynn Brown (Chillicothe, Ohio/Chillicothe), Maliah Howard-Bass (Columbus, Ind./Columbus North) and Sara Price (Warren, Ohio/Howland) have each signed a NLI to play basketball at Ball State, starting in the 2017-18 season.

"I am so excited about these three young ladies and their futures at Ball State," said Sallee. "They all fill very specific needs for us immediately and I feel will make an impact from day one. Most importantly, they are great people, from great families. They will wear our jersey with the pride that it demands!"

Oshlynn Brown a 6-1 center from Chillicothe, Ohio enters her senior season with 700 career points and 832 rebounds. She is projected to be the first player in program history to reach 1,000 points and rebounds her last season as a Cavalier. Brown received All-Ohio second team honors as a junior. She is a two-time all league first team selection and two-time first team all district honoree.

"We are excited to add such a high level athlete to our program," said Sallee. "Osh was made to play at Ball State. She competes on every single possession, rebounds furiously and is a nightmare for opponents in the open floor. She has the versatility as a forward that you need to compete at the highest of levels."

Maliah Howard-Bass a 5-9 guard from Columbus North, had a breakout junior season, averaging 18.6 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. As a junior, Howard-Bass was chosen IBCA/Subway Underclass Supreme 15, Indiana Coaches of Girls Sports Association All-State honors, first-team all-state, first-team all-conference and Associated Press All-State honorable mention. Entering the 2016-17 season Howard-Bass ranked fourth in 3-pointers (86), 11th in points (918), and 11th in steals (176). As a junior, Howard-Bass was an Indiana Core All-Star.

"Maliah is simply one of the best players in the state," said Sallee. She plays for a special high school program at Columbus North and competes at the highest of levels in the summer with the Indy Gym Rats. She is a do-it-all guard. She can shoot it, drive it and pass it...simply a playmaker that we are pumped to have in our program."

The second player from the state of Ohio that will join the Cardinals next season is Sara Price from Howland High School. Price is a 6-1 guard/forward who plays both basketball and softball for the Tigers. Last season Price averaged 21.7 points and 9.8 rebounds while shooting 44.6 percent from the floor. She currently ranks fifth in school history for points (1,178) and needs 334 points to be the all-time leading scorer at Howland. Price earned All-Ohio honors, First Team all league and all county along with most valuable player as a junior.

"Sarah's ability to score is special," said Sallee. "She can stretch defenses with her 3-point prowess and you add that along with her length and athleticism, she will fit perfectly into our system. Her versatility will allow her to play multiple positions for us. We are very excited to have Sarah in a Ball State uniform for the next four years.

Basketball Runs In The Family: Junior Moriah Monaco grew up around the game of basketball, she is the niece of current West Virginia men's basketball coach Bob Huggins who is in his eighth season with the Mountaineers. Huggins is a native of Gnadenhutten, Ohio and was also the head coach for current Mid-American Conference member Akron for five seasons. Monaco is a native of Dover Hills, Ohio and attended Dover Hills High School.

Picked Second Again: The Ball State women's basketball team has been picked second for the fourth straight season in the Mid-American Conference Preseason Poll.

One of Five: Ball State was one of five Mid-American Conference teams that participated in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (Akron, Central Michigan, Eastern Michigan, Ohio) and one of two teams (IUPUI) from the state of Indiana. Ball State was also one of five MAC schools that went undefeated at home in non conference action last season.

Home Sweet Home: John E. Worthen Arena has been very good to the Cardinals for the past decade. Ball State has a record of 114-58 (.656) at Worthen Arena from 2004-present. From 2009-present, the Cardinals own a 46-23 MAC record when playing at home during conference action. Brady Sallee is 27-11 at home during league play. This season the Cardinals are currently 3-1 in John E. Worthen Arena.

Against The State of Michigan: Ball State is 19-7 against Michigan schools during head coach Brady Sallee's first three seasons after beating Detroit Mercy (twice), Western Michigan (seven times), Eastern Michigan (six times) and Central Michigan (four times). Ball State faces Oakland University this season in non-conference action on Dec. 11 in Rochester, Mich.

Sallee Earns 200th Career Win: Ball State head women's basketball coach Brady Sallee reached his 200th career win at Bowling Green, Jan. 16, 2016. Sallee currently owns a 215-169 (.558) career record. Sallee owns a 77-56 (.557) record at Ball State and ranks second all-time in wins. Former head coach Tracy Roller (2001-08) ranks first with a 118-73 record.

Brady Ball: Head Coach Brady Sallee plays one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the Mid-American Conference year in and year out. Sallee's first season the Cardinals played Illinois State which had played in the post season Women's National Invitation Tournament. In 2013-14, Sallee faced six teams in non-conference action that were postseason participants in 2012-13. Louisville and Purdue both went to the NCAA Tournament that season, while Auburn, Western Kentucky and Wyoming played in the Women's National Invitation Tournament and Detroit in the Women's Basketball Invitational. The 2014-15 non-conference schedule featured six more teams that had also reached postseason play in 2013-14, Louisville, Purdue and Western Kentucky participated in the NCAA Tournament, while Charlotte and Duquesne played in the Women's National Invitation Tournament and Evansville in the Women's Basketball Invitational. Last season Ball State took on Western Kentucky who was an NCAA participant in 2014-15. This season Ball State will play Auburn, NC A&T and Purdue all who played in the NCAA tournament and Western Kentucky was in the postseason WNIT.

Did You Know:

- Under the direction of fifth year Ball State head women's coach Brady Sallee the Cardinals have had three 1,000 point scorers; Nathalie Fontaine (2,166), Brandy Woody (1,071) and Shelbie Justice (1,067).

A Look Back At Last Season

- Ball State head women's basketball coach Brady Sallee guided the Cardinals to a 22-10 ledger in 2015-16.

- Last year marked only the fifth time in program history Ball State had a 20+ win season, helping make Sallee the only head coach in program history with four consecutive winning seasons --- 17-16 (2012-13), 18-17 (2013-14), 17-12 (2014-15) and 22-9 (2015-16).

- Three members of the Ball State women's basketball team were honored by the Mid-American Conference for its annual post-season awards. For the third straight season, former Cardinal Nathalie Fontaine was named First Team All-MAC, while senior guard Jill Morrison was selected Third Team All-MAC for the second time in her career and sophomore guard Carmen Grande earned a spot on the MAC All-Freshman Team. It marked the fifth time Ball State has placed at least three players on All-MAC squads in the same season, with the four other being 2014-15, 2008-09, 2007-08 and 1982-83.

- Nathalie Fontaine ended her career as the Cardinals' career leader in points (2,166), games started (130), minutes played (4,320) and free throws made (541). She ranks second in program history for games played (130) and field goals made (805) and sixth for blocked shots (69). Fontaine finished third in rebounds (985).

- Nathalie Fontaine was voted the 2016 Mid-American Conference Player of the Year and was named MAC West Division Player of the Week seven times in 2015-16.

- Junior Moriah Monaco scored a career best 28 points at Eastern Michigan (2/27/16) which included eight three point baskets. The eight 3's were a career best and tied for second-highest single-game total in program history. She was second on the team in scoring last season after averaging 11.3 points per contest.

- Ball State women's basketball team advanced to the second round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament for the first time since the 2012-13 season after pulling off a 77-72 upset over Big Ten foe Iowa.

- Ball State made its fourth straight WNIT appearance and seventh overall. The Cardinals have advanced to the second round in four times (2002, 2003, 2013 & 2016). The furthest the Cardinals have gone was in 2013 under head coach Brady Sallee, that year Ball State made it to the Final 16 after knocking off Minnesota (54-51) and Northern Iowa (53-48), then lost at Kansas State (48-60).

MUNCIE, Ind. – Behind a season-high 29-point performance from junior Nathalie Fontaine, the Ball State women's basketball team defeated Oakland 75-50 Saturday in Worthen Arena.

"It was a really good win for us, I think from watching Oakland on film they had my attention with some of the things they do and they've got some players that again you watch them on film and they can really make you look a little silly," Ball State head women's basketball coach Brady Sallee said. "I thought we were really good defensively which is evident from their shooting percentage. In the second half clearly we had a little bit more resolve to come out and be the bigger, tougher and stronger basketball team."

With the win the Cardinals evened their overall record to 3-3, while the Golden Grizzlies fell to 3-4 on the season.

In a game the Cardinals never trailed, Ball State's defense limited Oakland to .275 percent shooting from the field, including a 21 percent mark from three-point range.

Ball state scored the first basket of the game 47 seconds into the contest on a Fontaine basket and led for the remaining 39:03 of the contest.

Oakland managed an 8-0 run to cut Ball State's lead to two (15-13) with 7:05 on the clock in the first half, but Ball State put together its own run to go back up by nine (25-16) after Moriah Monaco nailed her second three pointer of the half. The Golden Grizzlies made it a two-point ball game at 25-23 with just over a minute remaining in the half, but a layup from freshman Brionna Simond gave Ball State the 27-23 advantage over Oakland at intermission.

Fontaine opened the second half with a quick basket which sparked a 16-5 scoring spree to put the Cardinals up by 15 (43-28) with just over 14 minutes left to play in the ball game. Oakland would come to within eight (46-38) at the 11:08 mark but that was as close as the Golden Grizzlies would get the remainder of the way.

Fontaine led all scorers in the game with 29 points plus tallied a game-high 13 rebounds and a team-best five assists. Monaco and Jill Morrison added 13 points apiece.

The Ball State women's basketball team will continue non-conference action when it travels to Butler Saturday for a 7 p.m. tipoff in Hinkle Fieldhouse.

Jeff Tungate: Jeff Tungate was named the head coach for the women's basketball team on July 16, 2013 and just finished his second season at the helm. He had spent the previous six seasons as the associate head coach for the men's basketball program and completed his ninth season overall with the Golden Grizzlies. In 2014, Tungate received the inaugural Oakland Athletics Coach of the Year award. During Tungate's third season in 2015-16, Oakland ranked first in the league in field goal percentage 42.7%, second in the league in scoring 75.4 ppg and third in 3-point percentage 32.7%. With the win at Vermont (Dec. 30), the Golden Grizzlies concluded the non-conference regular season with an 8-3 record which tied the 2004-05 and 2008-09 teams for the best non-conference winning percentage (72.7%) to begin a season in the Division I era.

About Oakland: The Golden Grizzlie are 5-3 on the season, and are on a one-game win streak. In its last action, Oakland beat North Dakota State, 95-66, on Dec. 5. The Golden Grizzlies have competed this season against two schools' the Cardinals have or will face this season. Oakland played Central Michigan on Nov. 22 which resulted in an 70-67 overtime loss for the Golden Grizzlies. The Golden Grizzlies also played Chicago State on Nov. 29 and defeated the Cougars, 80-60. Both games were played on the road.

Scoring Leaders: Taylor Jones is one of four players averaging double figures, tallying 17.5 points per contest while Taylor Gleason isn't far behind averaging 14.0 points per game. Sha'Keya Graves adds 11.4 points per game and Hannah Little scores 10.6 a game.

FIFTH YEAR AT BALL STATE

A new era in Ball State women's basketball began May 10, 2012, when Brady Sallee was named the 11th head coach in program history.

Sallee who enters his fifth season at Ball State in 2016-17, has made program history by guiding the Cardinals to four straight postseason Women's National Invitation Tournament appearance. He directed the Cardinals to a 22-10 ledger in 2015-16 which marks only the fifth time in program history Ball State has had a 20+ win season. Sallee is also the only head coach in program history to have four consecutive winning seasons --- 17-16 (2012-13), 18-17 (2013-14), 17-12 (2014-15) and 22-9 (2015-16).

Sallee owns a 215-169 career head coach record, including a 136-109 mark in eight seasons at Eastern Illinois.

The 2015-16 season saw Ball State clinch its third automatic bye in four years into the Mid-American Conference Tournament, as the Cardinals entered as the third seed.

After earning a berth in the postseason WNIT, the Cardinals advanced to the second round of the tournament for the first time since the 2012-13 season by pulling off a 77-72 upset at Big Ten foe Iowa.

For the third straight season, senior forward Nathalie Fontaine was named First Team All-MAC, while junior guard Jill Morrison was selected Third Team All-MAC for the second time in her career. Freshman guard Carmen Grande also earned a spot on the MAC All-Freshman Team. This marks the fifth time Ball State has placed at least three players on All-MAC squads in the same season, with the four other being 2014-15, 2008-09, 2007-08 and 1982-83. Fontaine was also named MAC Player of the Year and earned honorable mention All-American by the Associated Press. She ended her career as the program's all-time leading scorer (2,166 pts).

The 2014-15 season saw Sallee help the Cardinals clinch the MAC West Division title outright for the first time since the 2008-09. Ball State earned a bye as the second seed in the 2015 MAC Tournament and advanced straight to the semifinals, where it lost to No. 6 seed Eastern Michigan 75-65. The Cardinals made their third consecutive appearance in the WNIT, traveling to Middle Tennessee.

In 2013-14, Sallee guided the Cardinals to a thrilling run to the 2014 Mid-American Conference Tournament championship game. The Ball State women's basketball team went on to make its second-straight trip to the 2014 Women's National Invitational Tournament and fifth overall in program history.

The Cardinals became postseason eligible by winning seven of its final eight games en route to advancing to the MAC Tournament

championship game for the first time since winning it all in 2009. In the semifinals of the MAC Tournament, Ball State scored a thrilling 73-55 win over 25th-ranked and top-seeded Bowling Green. The Cardinals then lost to No. 3 Akron 79-68 in the title game.

Ball State had a seven-game winning streak heading into the MAC Tournament championship game, including tournament wins over No. 12 seed Kent State, No. 9 Northern Illinois, No. 4 Buffalo and No. 1 Bowling Green. Ball State was only the third team to win four games and the first team to play five in a single MAC Tournament. The Cardinals were also just the third No. 5 seed in league history to compete in the MAC Tournament title game.

Sallee led the Cardinals to an 18-17 overall record in 2013-14, with the 18 wins being the most in a season since the 2008-09 squad went 26-9.

In his first year at Ball State, Sallee helped the Cardinals reach the Final 16 of the 2013 Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT) with a roster featuring just seven healthy players over the final 11 games, and as few as six at one point in the season. The Cardinals ended the 2012-13 season with a 17-16 overall record. After a few bumps and bruises in the first half of his debut season, Sallee helped Ball State post one of the most dramatic turnarounds in Mid-American Conference history as the Cardinals earned the No. 2 seed in the MAC Tournament with a 12-4 league mark. Under Sallee's tutelage, Ball State improved eight games from its 4-12 MAC mark in 2011-12, which ties as the biggest MAC turnaround in the last 20 years. Sallee also became just the second coach in program history to start MAC play 8-1 in his or her first season.

Thanks to its strong effort in the last half of the regular season, which saw the Cardinals knock off eventual MAC Tournament Champion Central Michigan twice, Ball State earned its fourth appearance in the WNIT and first since the 2006-07 season.

Sallee's Cardinals then pulled off one of the biggest upsets in the tournament with a hard-fought, 53-48 first-round victory at Big Ten foe Minnesota. Ball State continued its tournament run by knocking off Northern Iowa, 51-48, at Worthen Arena to win two WNIT games for the first time in program history.

For their efforts, freshman guard Nathalie Fontaine was named the MAC Freshman of the Year while senior guard Shanee' Jackson was voted the MAC Sixth Player of the Year. Fontaine also earned recognition on the All-MAC Second Team and MAC All-Freshman team, while junior guard Brandy Woody was selected to the All-MAC Third Team.

Under his tutelage the EIU women's basketball program set a school record for free throws made in a season (595, 2009-10) and made three pointers (180, 2008-09) while also scoring 2,736 points as a team in 2009-10 which was the third most in school history.

Academically his student-athletes excelled in the classroom, as they earned four consecutive OVC Academic Achievement Awards along with posting the highest percentage of players on the Commissioner's Honor Roll from 2007-10. His teams have ranked nationally among women's basketball programs with high grade-point averages earning the seventh-best team GPA in 2007-08 with a 3.475. The Panthers also ranked ninth in 2008-09 and tenth in 2006-07.

Before his tenure at Eastern Illinois he was the top assistant at East Carolina in 2002-03. From 1996-2002 he helped Kent State, a fellow member of the Mid-American Conference, to five regular-season MAC Championships and three tournament titles. The Golden Flashes participated in the NCAA Tournament four of his seven years while posting a combined record of 155-56. He also was an assistant coach at Idaho State in 1994-95.

A native of Lexington, Ky., Sallee played collegiate baseball at Thomas More College from 1989-92. While at Thomas More, he served as a student assistant with the women's basketball team. Sallee earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1993.

Sallee and his wife Mandy have three children -- Avery, Taryn and Drew.

In her first season as a coach, she helped guide the Cardinals to their four straight post-season Women's National Invitation Tournament appearance along with an upset over Big Ten foe Iowa in the first round beating the Hawkeyes by a score of 77-72. The Cardinals ended the season with a 22-10 ledger which marks only the fifth time in program history Ball State has had a 20+ win season.

Prior to Ball State, Adams spent the last two seasons as the head coach at Howard University. Prior to becoming the head coach at Howard, Adams spent five seasons as an assistant at Northwestern University.

At Northwestern, Adams was named defensive coordinator in 2012-13 and offensive coordinator in 2011-12. She helped the Wildcats to the 10th best turn around season in 2009 and was ranked fourth among BCS schools. Adams also played an intricate role in the Wildcats back-to-back Women's National Invitation Tournament appearances (2009-10 and 2010-11). She also helped in the player development of two First Team All-Big Ten Conference student-athletes, one Third Team All-Big Ten honoree and one Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection.

Prior to arriving at Northwestern, Adams coached at American University where she was responsible for all aspects of recruiting. She also was involved in the development of post players and the point person for academic affairs and external relations within the basketball program.

Adams, a standout player at the University of Arkansas, began her coaching career in 2004 as an assistant at Lon Morris Junior College in Jacksonville, Texas, before taking a similar position at North Carolina A&T State. She spent two years with the Aggies in Greensboro, N.C., before making the move to Washington D.C.

As a student-athlete at Arkansas, Adams was a member of the 1997-1998 Final Four team and the 1998-99 WNIT Championship team.

A native from East Chicago, Indiana, where she attended Central High School, Adams was ranked as one of the top five post player in the country by BlueStar and was a member of the 1995 Indiana All-Star team.

Ryan Patterson, a familiar face to the Mid-American Conference, came to Ball State after spending the 2011-12 season at Kent State as an assistant coach. He will begin his fifth season as an assistant coach for the Cardinals basketball team. Patterson's primary focus is working with the guards.

Last year, Patterson assisted Ball State to its fourth straight post-season Women's National Invitation Tournament appearance where the Cardinals knocked off Big Ten foe Iowa by a score of 77-72. Ball State ended the season with a 22-10 ledger which marks only the fifth time in program history the Cardinals have had a 20+ win season.

In his third season, Patterson helped the Cardinals become postseason eligible after clinching the MAC West Division title outright for the first time since 2008-09. Ball State also competed in its third straight post-season Women's National Invitation Tournament, making Sallee the only head women's basketball coach in program history to achieve such a goal.

In 2013-14, Patterson helped guide the Cardinals to a thrilling run to the 2014 Mid-American Conference Tournament championship game, the Ball State women's basketball team made its second-straight trip to the 2014 Women's National Invitational Tournament and fifth overall in program history.

The Cardinals became postseason eligible by winning seven of its final eight games en route to advancing to the MAC Tournament championship game for the first time since winning it all in 2009. In the semifinals of the MAC Tournament, Ball State scored a thrilling 73-55 win over 25th-ranked Bowling Green. The Cardinals then lost to No. 3 Akron 79-68 in the title game.

Ball State had a seven-game winning streak heading into the MAC Tournament championship game, including tournament wins over No. 12 seed Kent State, No. 9 Northern Illinois, No. 4 Buffalo and No. 1 Bowling Green. Ball State is only the third team to ever win four games and the first team to ever play five in a single MAC Tournament. The Cardinals were also just the third No. 5 seed in league history to compete in the MAC Tournament title game.

In his first season at Ball State, Patterson assisted with the Cardinals run to the Final 16 of the 2013 Women's National Invitation Tournament with a roster featuring just seven healthy players over the final 11 games, and as few as six at one point in the season.

Patterson also helped Ball State post one of the most dramatic turnarounds in Mid-American Conference history as the Cardinals earned the No. 2 seed in the MAC Tournament with a 12-4 league mark.

Before joining the Golden Flashes staff in 2011-12, he was the associate head coach at the Findlay from 2004-11. Patterson also had coaching stints at West Liberty State College (2002-04) where he served as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's basketball programs.

He began his coaching career on Kent State's staff in 2000, where he helped the Golden Flashes to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances (2001 & 2002) which included advancing to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight in 2002 along with a No. 12 national ranking. Out of the five programs Patterson has coached, four of them have competed in post season play.

Patterson earned his bachelors at Malone College in 1999 and a master degree from Kent State in 2002.

McDonald-Spencer enters her second season as an assistant coach for the Cardinals in 2016-17. In her first season as a coach, she helped guide the Cardinals to their four straight post-season Women's National Invitation Tournament appearance along with an upset over Big Ten foe Iowa in the first round beating the Hawkeyes by a score of 77-72. The Cardinals ended the season with a 22-10 ledger which marks only the fifth time in program history Ball State has had a 20+ win season.

Prior to her promotion, McDonald-Spencer served as the director of women's basketball operations at Ball State for the last five seasons. She was a standout guard for the Ball State women's basketball team from 2006-10. McDonald-Spencer helped the Cardinals to the most successful season in school history in 2008-09 when the Cardinals won the MAC Championship, the MAC Tournament title and earned the school's first ever berth in the NCAA Tournament.

In 2008-09, Ball State tallied a 26-9 overall record, won the MAC with a 14-2 mark and defeated Tennessee 71-55 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. McDonald ended her career eighth on the school's all-time scoring list (1,353), first in three pointers made (323), first all-time in games started (126), minutes played (4,180), three point field goal attempts (799), games played (127) and most three pointers made in a game with nine. She also holds the three point MAC record with 323. McDonald earned MAC Honorable Mention this season and she was a recipient of Academic All-MAC.

"Audrey has truly paid her dues and earned this opportunity," Sallee said. "There was never a thought about anyone else for this position. She bleeds Ball State cardinal and white and will continue to represent our program with the same passion and heart she did as a player and director of operations. Audrey has proven herself and there is no doubt she is ready to take the next step in her career."

McDonald is married to Paul Spencer and has two children -- Hadley and Hudson.

MUNCIE, Ind. - Thursday was just one of those nights for the Ball State women's basketball team.

The Cardinals played well enough defensively, limiting Purdue to 37 percent shooting. They held a slight advantage on the glass and in the turnover column.

But they simply could not get a shot to fall. Ball State struggled to a season-low 23 percent from the floor in a 58-42 loss to the Big Ten's Boilermakers at Worthen Arena.
