#### Storylines

► The winner of Saturday's game will claim the MAC West Division Championship and a spot in the Dec. 18 MAC Championship Game against Buffalo at Ford Field in Detroit. Ball State is seeking its first division crown and title game appearance since 2008.

► The Cardinals are riding a four-game winning streak for the first time since 2013 and are the only MAC West Division team undefeated (4-0) against divisional foes this fall.

► Ball State will honor 22 seniors in a Senior Day ceremony prior to Saturday's game. They are DL Chris Agyemang, OLB Christian Albright, SAF Brett Anderson II, OL Curtis Blackwell, SAF Bryce Cosby, WR Antwan Davis, OLB Anthony Ekpe, LS Joseph Greenwood, WR Justin Hall, RB Caleb Huntley, WR Isaac James-Gray, DL James Jennette III, TE Dylan Koch, WR Hassan Littles, CB Antonio Phillips, QB Drew Plitt, FB Cody Rudy, OL Kaleb Slaven, P Nathan Snyder, ILB Jaylin Thomas, OL Anthony Todd and SAF J.T. Wahee.

► Redshirt senior QB Drew Plitt, back-to-back MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week recipient, has thrown for 670 yards and accounted for eight total touchdowns over the past two weeks. The MAC's second-leading passer with 1,425 yards, Plitt threw for a season-high 366 yards last week at Central Michigan to go with four TDs passing and one rushing.

► College football's active leader with 242 career catches, senior WR Justin Hall is three away from breaking Ball State's career record held by KeVonn Mabon (244 from 2012-16). He passed Dante Ridgeway (238 from 2002-04) last week at CMU (*Career lists on p. 8*).

► Ball State's defense has surrendered fewer points each week than the previous week this season, most recently posting season bests for points (20), total yards (342) and passing yards (188) allowed in last week's win at Central Michigan.

► This week, Ball State faces the challenge of defending the nation's sixth-highest scoring team. Western Michigan, which averages 44.6 points per game, is coming off its first loss of the season, a 53-42 setback to Eastern Michigan. The Broncos feature QB Kaleb Eleby, the nation's leader in passing efficiency (212.7) and yards per completion (19.3). He is second nationally in points responsible for per game (24), while WR D'Wayne Eskridge ranks second in the country in receiving (128.8) and all-purpose (223.8) yards per game.

## SERIES NOTES

► BSU and WMU are both playing for a berth in the MAC Championship Game. The last time the Cardinals reached the title game, the team defeated Western Michigan in the regular season finale to get there. The year was 2008. Ball State entered the game unbeaten at 11-0 overall and 7-0 in the MAC. Western Michigan was 9-2 and 6-1 in the MAC and also had division championship hopes.

The Cardinals won the game 45-22 behind three rushing touchdowns from MiQuale Lewis, touchdowns passing and rushing from Nate Davis, and a Trey Lewis interception return touchdown. BSU, coached by Brady Hoke, polished off a perfect regular season, reaching a high of No. 12 in the BCS standings and the AP poll on the way to the MAC Championship Game.

► One of the defining wins of the **Mike Neu** era at Ball State so far came in Western Michigan's most recent visit to Muncie in 2018. The Cardinals defeated the Broncos 42-41 in overtime.

QB **Drew Plitt**, then a redshirt sophomore, threw three touchdown passes, while LB **Jimmy Daw** and SAF **Bryce Cosby**, also sophomores at the time, combined for the game-winning tackle on the final play when WMU went for a 2-point conversion and the win after matching BSU's touchdown in overtime.

Starting with that game, Ball State has won nine of its past 14 league games (9-5). Entering that game, the Cardinals had won three of their previous 23 (3-20).

Ball State stormed back from a 21-10 halftime deficit and held a three-point advantage with under four minutes to play, but Western Michigan scored on its final drive to secure a 35-31 win ... BSU registered 203 of its 261 rushing yards in the second half, and Caleb Huntley finished with 120 for the game ... WMU ran for 382 yards on the night and converted 10-of-16 third downs to keep drives alive (2-for-2 on fourth downs) ... BSU's Malik Dunner returned the second-half kickoff 100 yards for his second career kickoff return touchdown ... The Cardinals took the lead on a Drew Plitt QB sneak on the next possession ... From there, the two teams traded leads the rest of the night with WMU capturing the final advantage with just 1:05 remaining on Levante Bellamy's third touchdown of the game.

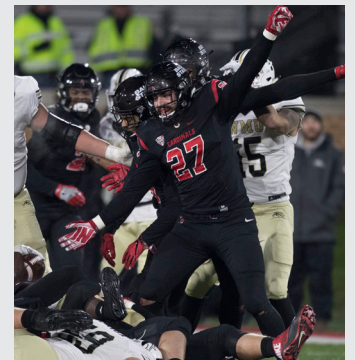

**WREAKING HAVOC IN THE BACKFIELD**

►► BSU has racked up 23 tackles for loss, including nine sacks, over the past two games. The Cardinals' 12 TFLs against Toledo were their most against a MAC opponent since Nov. 24, 2006 against Kent State (13). BSU added 11 more TFLs last week at Central Michigan. Fourteen different BSU players have been involved in a TFL over the past two weeks.

**HUNTLEY'S STREAK ON HOLD**

►► Senior RB **Caleb Huntley**, who has missed the past two games to injury, has the FBS' longest active streak of 100-yard rushing games with a school-record seven straight. He also has a seven-game touchdown streak (13 TDs in that stretch). Fourth nationally with 145.7 yards per game, Huntley needs 98 yards to become the seventh back in BSU history with 3,000.

**PICKING UP THE SLACK**

►► With Huntley sidelined, redshirt sophomore **Tye Evans** and redshirt junior **Will Jones** have largely handled the running back duties. Evans ran for a career-high 101 yards at Toledo (when Jones was also sidelined), and Jones ran for a touchdown last week at Central Michigan. BSU's streak of eight straight games with a 100-yard rusher (seven for Huntley, one for Evans) came to an end at CMU.

**WINNING THE CLOSE ONES**

►► Nine of Ball State's past 13 games, including four of five this season, have been decided by a touchdown or less.

Ball State is 3-1 in one-score games this year with wins in each of the past three of those games. All four have been decided late. Miami scored with 10 seconds left to defeat the Cardinals, 38-31, in the opener. BSU scored with 6 seconds left to beat Eastern Michigan by the same score the following week. Ball State recovered NIU's attempted onside kick with 44 seconds left to seal a 31-25 victory in week three. And the Cardinals forced a fumble with 1:04 left and Toledo in BSU territory to hold off the Rockets, 27-24, in week four.

The Cardinals were 2-3 in one-score games last fall. In three of Ball State's four MAC losses last fall -- at Western Michigan, vs. Central Michigan and at Kent State -- the Cardinals' opponent scored the go-ahead points with 1:05 or less remaining. BSU lost those three games by a combined eight points.

**PLITT THRIVING IN YEAR TWO AS FULL-TIME STARTER**

►► QB **Drew Plitt** is now in his second year as the full-time starter. The former Wing-T quarterback in high school accounted for five total touchdowns last week at Central Michigan. His four touchdown passes brought his career total to 43, tying BSU head coach **Mike Neu** for fifth in school history (*career lists on p. 8*). Plitt surpassed 5,000 career passing yards this season against NIU.

The team's fourth-string QB as a redshirt freshman in 2017, Plitt was forced into action with three starts that year because of injuries. He was the backup in 2018, again starting three games, before taking over the reins full time in 2019 and directing the MAC's top offense.

Now a Johnny Unitas Golden Arm and Manning Award candidate, Plitt was second in the MAC in passing yards per game (243.2) in 2019.

**H(ALL) PURPOSE**

► Senior WR/KR **Justin Hall** ranks seventh among all FBS players in all-purpose yards per game (192.0), despite getting only one kickoff return opportunity over the past three weeks as teams have kicked away from him. Four of the top seven players on that list are from the MAC. Hall has 445 receiving yards, 159 rushing yards and 256 total return yards ...

**BREAKOUT GAME FOR MCGAUGHY**

► Redshirt freshman WR **Jalen McGaughy** recorded his first collegiate receptions Saturday at Central Michigan, and they came in chunks. McGaughy had catches of 27, 39 and 34 yards, the last two of which went for the first touchdowns of his career. With 100 yards on his three catches, McGaughy became the fourth BSU player to reach the century mark for receiving yards in a game this season (Davis, Hall, Tyler).

**TOUCHDOWN TYLER**

► Junior WR **Yo'Heinz Tyler** has registered at least one touchdown reception in four straight games and has seven TDs in his past six games dating back to last season. Tyler had his third career two-touchdown game Nov. 28 at Toledo.

**QUITE A TRIO**

► Ball State features three of the top 5 pass catchers in the MAC this season in senior **Justin Hall** (34 receptions, 2nd), junior **Yo'Heinz Tyler** (29, 4th) and grad **Antwan Davis** (26, 5th). They have combined for 89 of the Cardinals' 110 receptions this year (80.9 percent), though QB **Drew Plitt** has found a season-high seven different receivers in each of the past two games, including TE **Dylan Koch** last week for his first career touchdown.

**BRANDON IS BACK**

► Redshirt junior ILB **Brandon Martin**, who sustained a season-ending injury in the 2019 opener, is back on the field this season. He was named last week to the watch list for the Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Award. Martin ranks second in the MAC in solo tackles with 34 and ranks third in total tackles with 58. Martin ranks ninth nationally with 11.6 tackles per game.

**TOP TACKLERS IN THE MAC**

► Senior ILB **Jaylin Thomas**, who has registered double-digit tackles in all but one game this fall, is the MAC's active leader in career tackles with 261. Senior SAF **Bryce Cosby** is second with 253.

**MAC SACK LEADER**

► Grad OLB **Anthony Ekpe**, in his first season at BSU, leads the MAC with 5.0 sacks. Ekpe has two strip-sacks on the season, one at Miami and one to seal the Cardinals' win at Toledo, and also leads the league in forced fumbles with two.

**GETTING PICKY**

► Ball State, which led the MAC with 15 interceptions and 24 total takeaways last season, has registered four interceptions in the past three weeks after going the first two without one.

CB **Amechi Uzodinma II** had the first against Northern Illinois on a 71-yard pick-six. It was BSU's first touchdown on an interception return since Charlie Todd against Liberty in 2010. Senior SAF **Bryce Cosby** added a pick at Toledo, while grad SAF **J.T. Wahee** and senior SAF **Brett Anderson II** each had one at Central Michigan.

Cosby and Uzodinma each own seven career interceptions, tied for second-most among active MAC players behind only Toledo's Delonte Hood (9). Wahee and CB **Antonio Phillips** are next on that list with six each (Wahee had five in his career at Norfolk State).

**NEW COACHING FACES**

• Two new full time assistant coaches are on this year's staff – **Joey Hecklinski** (QBs) and **Josh Zidenberg** (Passing Game Coordinator/DBs). Hecklinski was a graduate assistant for BSU last fall. Zidenberg worked with defensive coordinator **Tyler Stockton** at Western Illinois in 2018. He was the special teams coordinator/safeties coach at William & Mary in 2019.

## OFFENSIVE LINE ADJUSTMENTS

» Senior RT **Curtis Blackwell** (30) and redshirt senior LT **Kaleb Slaven** (22) had combined for 52 of the returning 57 starts among the BSU starting offensive line entering the season.

C **Anthony Todd**, RG **Jaylen Turner** and LG **Joseph Boggs** are in their first season as full-time starters. Against EMU, redshirt freshman **Porter Haught** made his first career start in place of an injured Slaven, and true freshman **Ethan Crowe** filled in briefly at center with his first career snaps.

## GRAD TRANSFERS MAKE PRESENCE FELT ON DEFENSE

» BSU welcomed three all-league graduate transfers on defense in DL **Chris Agyemang** (Sacred Heart, NEC), SAF **J.T. Wahee** (Norfolk State, MEAC) and OLB **Anthony Ekpe** (Rice, C-USA).

Ekpe made his presence felt in his BSU debut against Miami with 3.0 tackles for loss, including 2.0 sacks, and one forced fumble. Wahee had five tackles, 1.0 TFL and one pass breakup that night.

Agyemang, who has started all five games on the defensive line, was accomplished enough at Sacred Heart to earn a spot on Phil Steele's Preseason All-MAC Third Team without having played a down in the league.

## YOUNG KICKERS MAKING IMPACT

» The Cardinals have turned to redshirt freshman **Jack Knight** and true freshman **Jacob Lewis** to handle the kicking duties this fall.

Knight hit a game-tying 47-yard field goal with 1:08 left in his debut at Miami and has made seven of his past nine attempts after missing his first two of the season.

Lewis' 11 touchbacks are already more than Ball State recorded all of last season (nine). His five touchbacks in his debut at Miami were the most by a BSU kicker since Scott Secor had six against Akron in 2014. Lewis also connected on a 51-yard field goal against Eastern Michigan in his first collegiate attempt.

## EXPERIENCED PUNTER

» Senior P **Nathan Snyder** ranks fifth in the MAC in punting with a 42.0-yard average. Snyder already has five punts of 50 yards or longer in 14 attempts this season.

## DEFENDING THE STALK

» Ball State retained the Bronze Stalk rivalry trophy with the Nov. 18 victory over Northern Illinois. The teams have played for the Bronze Stalk every year since 2008. The Cardinals won the trophy that first season, but NIU won it 10 straight years before BSU took it back last season.

## GOT THE CORNERS COVERED

» In **Antonio Phillips** and **Amechi Uzodinma II**, Ball State was one of only three FBS programs to return two all-conference cornerbacks in 2020. The others were LSU and Boise State.

Uzodinma led the MAC last year with five interceptions, while Phillips had four. Both players were named to the watch list for this year's Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to the nation's top defensive back. Phillips is also a candidate for a pair of national defensive player of the year awards, the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Chuck Bednarik Award.

## WELCOME BACK

» BSU welcomed back 45 letterwinners and 15 position starters from a team that finished 5-7 (4-4 MAC) last fall. Of its 10 All-MAC selections (the most since 2013), BSU returned six -- OL **Curtis Blackwell**, WR **Justin Hall**, RB **Caleb Huntley**, CB **Antonio Phillips**, ILB **Jaylin Thomas** and CB **Amechi Uzodinma II**. Ball State's offense led the MAC in both scoring (34.8 ppg) and total offense (463 ypg) last fall. In 2020, the Cardinals' roster features the nation's active career receptions leader in **Justin Hall** (242), the MAC's second-leading active rusher in **Caleb Huntley** (2,902 yards) and the league's top returning passer in **Drew Plitt** (243.2 ypg in 2019).

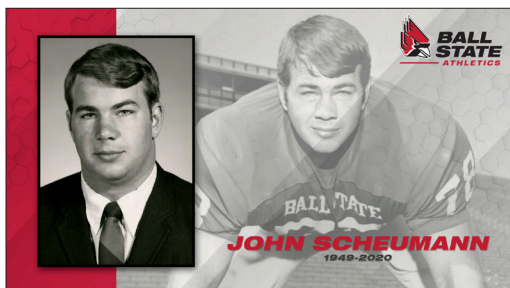
**REMEMBERING MR. SCHEUMANN**

» Ball State lost a distinguished benefactor and former letterwinner with the October passing at age 71 of John Scheumann who, along with his wife June, is the namesake of Scheumann Stadium.

The Scheumanns provided the \$4 million lead gift in the 2005 to "Drive to Distinction: The Ball State Stadium Campaign" for major stadium renovations.

They also provided the lead gift for the Scheumann Family Indoor Practice Facility, scheduled to open in the summer of 2021, and generously contributed to the Fisher Football Training Complex and the original turf field at what is now the Briner Sports Complex.

A defensive back from 1969-70 and co-founder of the Crossmann Communities homebuilding company, Scheumann was honored with the Ball State Distinguished Alumni Award in 1998 and the President's Medal of Distinction in 2010.

**GAINBRIDGE FIELD AT SCHEUMANN STADIUM**

» Starting with last season, the field inside Scheumann Stadium now bears the Gainbridge logo in recognition of company executive and Ball State alumnus, Dan Towriss, '94. The playing surface is known as Gainbridge Field at Scheumann Stadium.

Towriss provided a generous gift toward the construction of the Scheumann Family Indoor Practice Facility. Gainbridge is a member of Group 1001, an insurance holding company with \$36 billion in combined managed assets and a mission to help investors grow and protect their savings.

**BACK AT IT**

» The MAC Council of Presidents, on the recommendation of the Medical Advisory Panel, voted unanimously on Sept. 25 to resume the fall season. The season was originally postponed on Aug. 8 -- just three days into Ball State's fall camp -- because of concerns surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic. The Cardinals' six opponents in the revised, conference-only schedule include their five fellow West Division teams and Miami.

» Ball State is playing its 96th season of football and its fifth under head coach **Mike Neu** who quarterbacked the Cardinals to the Mid-American Conference championship in 1993 as the league's player of the year.

**SCHEUMANN FAMILY INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY**

» Ball State broke ground in the spring of 2020 on the Scheumann Family Indoor Practice Facility on the south end of Scheumann Stadium.

The 84,000 square-foot facility will feature a field-turf surface measuring 360 feet by 160 feet and regulation-sized competition field with a ceiling height of 65 feet. Retractable netting, batting cages and storage will provide the necessary amenities for BSU teams to conduct training.

The anticipated opening date for the \$15-million building is Summer 2021.

## Head Coach Mike Neu

Ball State University welcomed back one of its own as Mike Neu was named the head coach for the Cardinals football program in January of 2016. Neu played collegiate football at Ball State where he was named 1993 Mid-American Conference Offensive Player of the Year.

Neu has nearly 20 years of coaching experience with stops in the National Football League (NFL), Division I FBS football and the arena leagues.

The Cardinals have made several strides forward under Neu's leadership with the 2019 campaign the most memorable thus far. Ball State reclaimed the Bronze Stalk Trophy from Northern Illinois for the first time since 2008 with a come-from-behind 27-20 win over the Huskies in early October. The Cards then capped the year by knocking off eventual MAC champion Miami to earn the Red Bird Rivalry Trophy, 41-27.

Ball State's offense was statistically the most explosive in the conference last fall. The Cardinals led the MAC in scoring (34.8 points per game) and total offense (463 yards per game). On defense, BSU forced turnover after turnover all year. The 24 forced turnovers were the most in the conference and ranked 15th nationally.

Ten Cardinals came away with All-MAC accolades following the 2019 season, the most for a Ball State team since 2013. Over Neu's four seasons as head coach, 23 players have been recognized on an all-league team. The football team also placed a league-high 20 players on the Academic All-MAC list last fall. Fifteen of those 20 Cardinals were making a return appearance to that list.

Before returning to Ball State, Neu spent the 2014 and 2015 seasons as the quarterbacks coach for the NFL's New Orleans Saints. In 2014 under Neu's guidance, quarterback Drew Brees was selected to his franchise-record eighth Pro Bowl as a Saint. Brees led the league in completions (456), tied for first in passing yardage (4,952), ranked second in completion percentage (69.2) and tied for fifth in touchdown passes (33). In 2015, Brees once again led the NFL in passing yardage (4,870) while ranking second in completion percentage (68.3) and completions (428).

Neu, a native of Indianapolis, Indiana,



started 38-of-41 games at quarterback in his four seasons at Ball State (1990-93). He was honored with the MAC's Vern Smith Award as the league's most valuable player and the MAC Offensive Player of the Year award as a senior. That year, Neu and the Cardinals went 8-3-1 overall and 7-0-1 in league action to capture the MAC championship. In one of his greatest games as a collegiate quarterback, Neu threw for a Ball State record 469 yards

and completed 28-of-40 passes against Toledo in 1993 to help the Cardinals rally from a 30-3 deficit and record the largest comeback in Ball State history, a 31-30 Homecoming victory.

Neu played professionally in the Canadian Football League and Arena Football League (AFL) from 1995-97 before beginning his coaching career in 1998 with the AFL's Nashville Kats. In 2000, Neu was named head coach for the first time as he took over the Arena Football 2's (AF2) Augusta Stallions. He led that organization to a conference title in 2000 with a 14-4 record and was named the AF2 Coach of the Year.

In 2001 and 2002, Neu worked with the AFL's Carolina Cobras. He served as the offensive coordinator in 2001 and was promoted to head coach in 2002. During his stint as head coach, Neu led the team to the quarterfinals of the AFL playoffs, including the team's first playoff win.

Neu then spent four years as head coach of the AFL's New Orleans VooDoo. There, he compiled a 33-31 record and earned 2004 AFL Coach of the Year honors. During his first season at the helm, Neu led the team to a franchise-best 11-5 record, a division title and a playoff berth.

From 2008-12, Neu worked on the New Orleans Saints' player personnel staff. He then spent the 2012 and 2013 seasons with Tulane as the quarterbacks coach. In 2013, Neu helped guide Tulane to a 7-6 overall record and its first postseason appearance in 11 years – the 2013 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

Neu received his bachelor's degree in sport administration from Ball State in 1994 and served as a graduate assistant coach for the Cardinals during the 1994 season. He was inducted into the Ball State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2004.

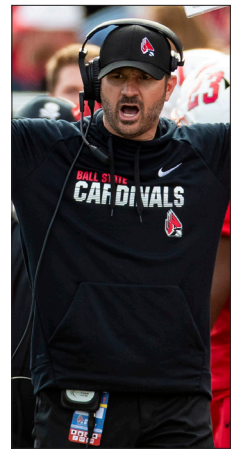

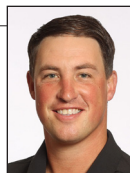

The 2020 edition of the Red Bird Rivalry went into the final seconds as Ball State and Miami traded big plays in a nationally-televised season opener. Miami had the last highlight, scoring the go-ahead touchdown with 10 seconds left to edge BSU 38-31.

With the game tied at 31, Ball State forced a stop and started a potential game-winning drive at its own 27-yard line with 42 seconds left in regulation. But Miami's Ryan McWood deflected a Drew Plitt pass and hauled it in, returning the ball to the 5-yard line. Moments later, Miami found the end zone to seal the game in the final seconds.

"We've worked a lot of scenarios like that in practice where it's a tight game and you have to go down and deliver, and we didn't (tonight)," head coach Mike Neu said. "That's what's difficult to swallow. We didn't get it done. I told the team afterwards, we have to own it. We can't let that determine the rest of our season."

The final sequence in the game came after a thrilling comeback by Ball State. The Cardinals trailed 31-21 when they got an 18-yard touchdown run by Caleb Huntley with 7:06 left to make it 31-28. BSU's defense stood strong and the Cardinals regained possession with 4:04 left in the game. Plitt moved the Cardinals down the field, setting up a clutch 47-yard field goal from Jack Knight that tied the game at 31 with 1:08 to go.

Huntley and Justin Hall each scored two touchdowns for the Cardinals, who were playing for the first time in 340 days. Huntley ripped off a 45-yard score in Ball State's first possession after halftime and had the 18-yarder in the fourth quarter. Ball State led 14-10 at halftime thanks to a pair of scores by Hall, who ran 11 yards for a touchdown early in the game and scored on a 66-yard catch-and-run from Plitt in the second quarter.

Hand it to Huntley. That was the formula as Ball State racked up 326 yards on the ground and 536 of total offense in a 38-31 win over Eastern Michigan. Caleb Huntley finished with a career-high 204 yards on 34 carries and three touchdowns -- including the game-winning score in the final seconds -- to lift the Cardinals to a win in their home opener.

The win was nearly an exact opposite of last week's season opener, a 38-31 road loss at Miami where the winning touchdown was scored with 10 seconds left. The Cardinals bounced back from that to earn a key win with the start of MAC West Division play.

"When the guys came in last Thursday, the focus was great. The energy was great. The attitude was great. I'm really proud to see their hard work pay off," head coach Mike Neu said. "It was a battle. The game ebbs and flows, and the one thing we make crystal clear here is, 'We've got your back.'"

Ball State fell behind 21-7 in the second quarter as dual threat quarterback Preston Hutchinson ran for two scores and threw a touchdown pass late in the first quarter.

The comeback started with EMU leading 24-13 when Huntley ran through and over defenders for a 13-yard touchdown with 4:34 left in the third quarter. Tyler caught a 2-point conversion from Plitt to make it a 24-21 game. The Cardinal defense then forced two stops before BSU took a 28-24 lead on a 33-yard score from Plitt to Tyler. The Cardinals extended the lead to 31-24 on a 33-yard field goal by Jack Knight, who made both of his attempts alongside a 51-yarder from Jacob Lewis.

Eastern Michigan tied the game at 31-all on a short run by Hutchinson that was set up by a 71-yard pass play. Huntley and the Cardinals went to work after that and drove for the winning score.

The Bronze Stalk trophy will look good for another year in BSU's Fisher Football Training Complex. Ball State wore down visiting Northern Illinois 31-25, keeping the rivalry trophy in Muncie. The Cardinals won 27-20 at NIU last season.

"I'm just proud of the way the guys answered the bell in the second half," BSU head coach Mike Neu said. "We knew we had to go play a four-quarter game. No matter what would've happened in any previous play or previous quarter or half, we just needed to go play, battle, fight, scratch and claw, and the guys did that."

Perhaps the biggest play of the game came in the second quarter with Ball State trailing 14-7 and NIU threatening. Amechi Uzodinma II picked off a pass and ran it 71 yards for a touchdown to tie the game heading into halftime.

Caleb Huntley, one of the nation's top performers last week when he rushed for 204 yards and three touchdowns versus Eastern Michigan, took over after having only 19 yards at halftime. Huntley carried six times on the Cardinals' go-ahead drive, scoring a 3-yard touchdown with 5:12 left on the third-quarter clock. Ball State would lead for the rest of the game.

"The defense kept battling and battling and battling, and then we got that pick six," Neu said. "You could just feel the momentum shift there on the sideline. You could just feel the added punch that we needed."

Huntley, who entered the week third in the nation in yards per game, continued his dominance on the ground with 103 yards and a score against NIU. It was his seventh consecutive effort of 100 yards or more, which set a school record.

BSU extended its lead to 28-14 after Yo'Heinz Tyler made two big plays. Tyler took a Drew Plitt pass 64 yards to the NIU 13 and then was rewarded with the touchdown moments later. NIU answered with a scoring drive, but Ball State tacked on a 33-yard field goal from Jack Knight with 2:20 left in the game to lead 31-22. NIU added a late field goal and tried an onside kick in the final moments, but BSU was able to ice the game and retain the rivalry trophy.

Ball State needed a big-time play to finish a road win, and Anthony Ekpe delivered. Ekpe's strip sack with less than a minute left in the game stopped a rally by host Toledo and allowed BSU to finish off a 27-24 win, the Cardinals' third straight.

"I'm really proud of our guys; I'm proud of the effort, and I'm proud of the fight," head coach Mike Neu said. "More than anything else, what matters is we're leaving the Glass Bowl here 1-0 on the weekend. And we're not done. It'll be a great ride back home to Muncie, and we'll continue to work. It's on the next one."

Ball State dominated early and never trailed. The Cardinals led 17-0 early in the second quarter and extended that to 24-3 after Yo'Heinz Tyler caught his second touchdown of the day. The score was 24-9 after three quarters before Toledo began to rally at the end of the game.

UT scored 15 unanswered points in 2:57 of game time and then had a potential game-winning drive in the final minute. The Rockets, with their backup quarterback in the game, advanced into Ball State territory before Ekpe knocked the ball free from Carter Bradley. Bryce Cosby, who also had an interception, recovered the fumble to clinch the win.

Ekpe's play capped the best defensive effort for Ball State this season. The Cardinals had 12 tackles for loss, four sacks and two takeaways while holding Toledo to just 42 yards rushing. Neu called the effort "championship-level defense." Christian Albright made three tackles behind the line of scrimmage, including two sacks, and he also forced a fumble.

Playing without star running back Caleb Huntley, the Cardinals ran up 447 yards of offense. Drew Plitt passed for 304 yards and two touchdowns to Yo'Heinz Tyler and also ran for a score. The Cardinals went to Justin Hall through the air and on the ground for 151 yards from scrimmage. Tye Evans gained 101 yards on 25 carries while taking on the bigger role in the backfield.

Ball State maintained control of its own destiny with a 45-20 victory at Central Michigan. The Cardinals will host Western Michigan with the MAC West Division title and a spot in the league championship game on the line.

"It's coming on the road like this and playing our best football when it mattered," head coach Mike Neu said of his pride in the performance. "We knew what was at stake, to stay in the winners' bracket, and the credit goes to our players; the credit goes to the seniors."

Quarterback Drew Plitt threw for 366 yards and accounted for five total touchdowns on the day as the Cardinals ran their winning streak to four games. BSU has now won six of its past seven visits to Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Ball State bottled up the Central Michigan offense for most of the afternoon, limiting the Chippewas to 215 yards through three quarters while building a 38-14 lead. The Cardinals registered five sacks and four takeaways (two on special teams), including second-half interceptions from J.T. Wahee and Brett Anderson II.

Offensively, the Cardinals displayed what is becoming an embarrassment of riches. Justin Hall and Antwan Davis were their normal selves, combining for 13 catches. And Yo'Heinz Tyler caught a touchdown pass for the fourth straight game.

On top of that, redshirt freshman Jalen McGaughy hauled in his first three career passes, two of them for long touchdowns, and tight end Dylan Koch scored his first career touchdown. McGaughy's three catches totaled 100 yards.

The Cardinals played without running back Caleb Huntley for the second straight game, with Will Jones and Tye Evans splitting the load in the backfield. Jones ran for a score, while Evans led the ground attack with 64 yards.

On the heels of a quality defensive performance against Toledo, Ball State turned in another one. Of CMU's 215 yard through the first three quarters, 120 of them came on two scoring plays.
