BISON NOTES

BUCKNELL AT A GLANCE

- Bucknell concludes its four-game home-stand on Saturday, Oct. 4 at noon as it takes on Saint Francis at Christy Mathewson Memorial Stadium. The game will serve as the Bison's Homecoming Game.
- This is the first time since the Bison's Patriot League Championship season of 1996, that there will be four home games in a row.
- The Bison are coming off of a tight 30-23 win over Saint Francis that came down to the final minute of the game where Brad Gerken made a touchdown saving and game ending interception in the endzone to secure a Bison victory.
- The Bison have had one Patriot League Player of the Week this season: Zachary Corra (Rookie of the Week, 9/15).
- The Bison were picked to finish fourth in the 2025 Preseason All-Patriot League Poll.
- Alongside Ralph Rucker IV (PL OPOTY) and Tariq Thomas (PL ROTY), the Bison are returning two other Patriot League First Team selections in return specialist TJ Cadden and special teams standout Sam Milligan. Bucknell also returns two Patriot League Second Team selections in offensive lineman and 2024 Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year, John Ohnegian and punter Matt Schearer.
- The Bison are entering their seventh season under head coach Dave Cecchini in 2025. Cecchini was voted the Patriot League Dick Biddle Coach of the Year during the 2021 campaign for leading the Bison to a spot in the first-ever Patriot League Championship game following the abbreviated season, Cecchini's team is coming off a record setting season where the squad broke 13 individual records, seven team records and scored the most single-season points in program history.
- Bucknell returned a total of 65 players from the 2024 season and lost 34 athletes from the roster.
- The Bison welcomed 40 newcomers this season, including 32 freshmen. The additional eight players came from the transfer portal.
- The Bison welcomed a host of new faces to the staff during the offseason; offensive coordinator Drew Folmar, tight ends coach P.J. Barr, defensive line coach Kentwan Balmer, running backs coach Jerome Smith, wide receivers coach Sam Costantino, linebackers and special teams coach Chase Murdock and Strength and Conditioning Coach Tim Warren.
- Bucknell's 2025 captains are second-time captain and offensive lineman John Ohnegian, fifth-year quarterback Ralph Rucker IV, senior punter/kicker Matt Schearer and senior cornerback Terian Williams II.

A BISON WIN WOULD...

- Improve Bucknell's record to 4-2 on the season.
- Give the Bison their first win over Richmond in program history.
- Improve Bucknell's record against Richmond to 1-3.
- Improve the Bison's 2025 home record to 3-1 in their four-game home stand.

INSIDE THE 2025 SCHEDULE

- This is the 140th season of football at Bucknell. The Bison played their first-ever game in 1883 and have been playing a consistent schedule since 1887.
- Bucknell is scheduled to play 12 games for just the fourth time in program history. The Bison will host six games and have six games on the road.
- Bucknell opened the 2025 season with back-to-back away games at Air Force and Marist before going on a four-game home stand.
- Senior Night will take place on Sept. 27 against Saint Francis at 6 p.m. and Homecoming will be the final game of the homestand on Oct. 4 against Richmond at 12 p.m.
- Bucknell's home opener was on Sept. 13 against VMI. The Bison then started Patriot League play against Lehigh on Sept. 20 at home, which was Bucknell's Family Weekend game.
- After its home stand, Bucknell will head on the road for two games against Lafayette and Cornell.
- The final four games of the season will all be against conference opponents. Bucknell will host Georgetown on Oct. 25, travel to Fordham on Nov. 8, take on Holy Cross at home on Nov. 15 and then end the season at Colgate on Nov. 22.

UP NEXT

- Bucknell will head back on the road after a month at home. The Bison travel to Lafayette to take on the Leopards at 12:30 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 11.

THE LAST TIME OUT: BUCKNELL 30, SAINT FRANCIS 23

- After being down by one with just under eight minutes left in the game, Ralph Rucker IV rushed for 32 yards to set up Tariq Thomas for a 17-yard rush followed by a seven-yard rushing touchdown. Bucknell converted their two-point try to gain a 30-23 lead over Saint Francis with just about five-minutes left in the game. The Bison would ride that momentum to get the 30-23 victory over the Red Flash at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium on Senior Night.
- Saint Francis threatened to score with a big drive in the final two minutes of the ball game. The Red Flash had possession at the 20 with 7.5 seconds remaining, throwing deep to the end zone. Brad Gerken jumped the route and picked the ball with 1.5 seconds remaining, effectively sealing the game.
- Thomas rushed for 95 yards on 10 attempts and a touchdown as he surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the contest.
- Rucker went 15-for-26 and a touchdown, and he also rushed for a touchdown for the Bison.
- TJ Cadden led the Bison in receiving with six catches for 78 yards and a touchdown.
- Brandon Biagiarelli led the team in tackles with nine total.

INSIDE THE RECORD BOOK

- QB Ralph Rucker IV re-invented the record books. Rucker is now Bucknell's single-season leader in touchdown passes (25), passing yards (2,826), completion percentage (.672), passing completions (244) and total offense (2,922) Rucker also leads Bucknell in single game passing yards (437) and single game touchdown passes (5 TD passes 3X). With this being his final season, Rucker holds career records in passing touchdowns (46), passing yards (6,421) and completion percentage (.647).
- Sam Milligan ranks first in touchdown catches in a single game with four against VMI on Saturday, Sept. 13. He also ranks sixth all-time in receiving yards in a single game with 192 yards in that VMI win for Bucknell.
- TJ Cadden tied for the longest kickoff return (100 yds) and holds the records for most punt return touchdowns in a season (2) and most total return touchdowns (3; two punt return and one kickoff return).
- Matt Schearer holds the record for season PAT's with 45.
- As a 2024 team, Bucknell broke even more records. The 2024 team holds the records for; single season completions (277), single season passing yards (3,220), single season average passing yards per game (268.33), single season total yards (4,651), single season total plays (836), single season total points (346), single season first downs (252), single game total offense (428) and single season touchdown passes (28).

HEAD COACH DAVE CECCHINI



Dave Cecchini, one of the all-time great wide receivers in Patriot League history who has since gone on to achieve tremendous success in the coaching ranks, was named the 27th Bob Odell Head Football Coach at Bucknell University on February 6, 2019.

During the 2021 spring campaign, Cecchini was voted the Patriot League Dick Biddle Coach of the Year for leading Bucknell to a spot in the first-ever Patriot League Championship Game. Bucknell, picked to finish last in the preseason poll, knocked off Pennsylvania rivals Lafayette and Lehigh to earn a date with defending champion Holy Cross. In addition, Cecchini was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented by STATS to the FCS Coach of the Year, for the second time in his career.

Cecchini's Bison placed 11 on the 2021 Spring All-Patriot League Team, headlined by a school-record seven First Team selections. Senior linebacker Simeon Page became the fifth Bison to make four All-Patriot League Teams; he later joined Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year Rick Mottram on the Academic All-Patriot League Team.

In total, the Bison have combined for 34 All-Patriot League Team honors during Cecchini's tenure, including 15 First Team honorees, and 16 have landed on the Academic All-Patriot League Team. Cecchini has also coached one Offensive Player of the Year, one Rookie of the Year and one Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Cecchini's 2024 team displayed one of the most effective offenses in program history and rewrote the Bucknell record book in various ways. The Bison placed third in the Patriot League, their highest finish since 2019 when they also placed third. The team set new single-season standards for passing completions (277), passing yards (3,220), touchdown passes (28), average passing yards per game (268.33), total yards (4,651), total plays (836), first downs (252) and total points (346). Bucknell also set a single-game record for total offense (428). Quarterback Ralph Rucker set individual single-season records in touchdown passes (25), passing yards (2,826), completion percentage (.672), passing completions (244) and total offense (2,922). He also set single-game records in passing yards (437) and touchdown passes (5). Additionally, TJ Cadden set records for punt return touchdowns (2), total return touchdowns (3: 2 PR/1 KR) and tied the record for the longest kickoff return (100 yds.)

Ralph Rucker was the 2024 Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and Tariq Thomas was the 2024 Patriot League Rookie of the Year. 10 Bison received All-Patriot League Team accolades following the 2024 campaign, with Ralph Rucker IV, Tariq Thomas, Eric Weatherly, TJ Cadden and Sam Milligan earning first team honors and John Ohnegian, Aneesh Vyas, Brad Jamison, Gavin Willis and Matt Schearer earning second team honors. John Ohnegian was the 2024 Patriot League Scholar Athlete of the Year and Bucknell landed four players on the Academic All-Patriot League Team.

In 2019, Cecchini led the Bison to a third-place finish in the Patriot League, their highest placement since they were the 2014 runners-up. Their Patriot League victories came over defending champion Colgate (32-14), rival Lehigh (20-10) and Georgetown (20-17); two of their three league losses came by a touchdown or less. Bucknell faced a grueling non-conference schedule, featuring FBS opponent Temple and three nationally ranked FCS teams; the Bison ultimately finished the year with a 3-8 overall record.

Cecchini's offense set then-school records in completions (229) and passing attempts (426) during the 2019 season. All-Patriot League First Team wide receiver Brandon Sanders became the sixth Bison to make at least 50 catches in a single campaign while quarterback Logan Bitikofer cracked Bucknell's top 10 in single-season completions and single-season passing attempts. Defensively, the Bison excelled, leading the Patriot League in conference action in yards per play allowed (4.4), takeaways (14), sacks (32) and defensive touchdowns (4); they also finished second in total defense (319.7) and rushing defense (96.3).

Following the 2019 campaign, five Bison were recognized on the All-Patriot League Team while two made the Academic All-Patriot League squad. Punter Alex Pechin closed his record-breaking career by capturing numerous awards.

Most notably, he was honored as an All-American by every entity that selects an All-America team, became the first football player to earn three-straight Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year awards, won the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year award and was presented the prestigious STATS FCS Doris Robinson Scholar-Athlete Award.

In 2021, Bucknell faced another challenging schedule highlighted by road games at then No. 11/12 Villanova and FBS opponent Army West Point. The Bison were a young team that sent 30 first-time starters to the field, a group that included two seniors, four juniors, 12 sophomores and 12 freshmen and represented just over 30 percent of the roster. At the conclusion of the season, wide receiver Dominic Lyles, who matched the school standard with three touchdown catches in a tight loss to Georgetown, and safety Brent Jackson, who became the first non-senior to be presented the Bison Gridiron Club Award as Team MVP since 2012, were voted to the Academic All-Patriot League Team.

Bucknell made massive strides defensively during the 2022 season, allowing nearly 10 fewer points per game than the year prior and finishing third in the Patriot League in points allowed per game. The Bison also gave up the fewest passing yards among Patriot League teams and led the league in interceptions. Four Bison landed on the All-Patriot League Team. Highlighting the All-League honorees was Jackson, who received the Bison Gridiron Club Award for a second time after leading the FCS in solo tackles per game.

The 2022 Bison pulled out several dramatic victories, defeating Pennsylvania-rival Lehigh with a last-minute field goal and upending Georgetown on the road in the team's first overtime victory since 2017. Bucknell won its last two games of the season, concluding with a 24-13 win over Marist at home.

The head coach at Valparaiso University from 2014 to 2018, Cecchini has a long track record of building explosive offenses at elite academic institutions. Previously the offensive coordinator at Lehigh, The Citadel and Harvard University, his offenses have shattered school records at his every stop, propelling his teams to a combined seven conference championships. An All-American wide receiver at Lehigh during his playing days in the early 1990s, Cecchini spent 13 of his previous 24 seasons as a coach at his alma mater.

In 2014, Cecchini took over a Valparaiso football program that had won just three games, all against the same opponent, in the four seasons before his arrival. The 2017 campaign saw Valparaiso reach new heights thanks to a potent offense that totaled 330 points and 4,398 yards, both good for second in school history. Picked to finish 10th of 11 teams in the Pioneer Football League, Valparaiso tied for third with a 5-3 record, its most league wins since 1961. Overall, Valparaiso finished above .500, at 6-5, for the first time since 2003.

For guiding Valparaiso's turnaround, Cecchini was a finalist for the American Football Coaches Association's FCS National Coach of the Year and the STATS FCS Coach of the Year awards; he was also voted as the Pioneer Football League Coach of the Year and the AFCA FCS Region 4 Coach of the Year.

Cecchini left Valparaiso as the program's winningest coach through 50 games since 1986. Other highlights of his time at Valparaiso included defeating rival Butler in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2005, going 4-0 in conference games at Brown Field in 2017 and sending two student-athletes to the 2018 FCS National Bowl, which showcases the FCS's top players.

Before becoming the 17th head football coach in Valparaiso history, Cecchini spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Lehigh. During his second stint on the

Mountain Hawk staff, Cecchini built one of the most proficient and explosive offenses in the nation. In 2011, Lehigh ranked in the FCS's top five in total offense (469.6) and passing offense (340.6) while averaging a Patriot League-best 32.5 points per game. Ten offensive players captured All-Patriot League laurels that season, headlined by Offensive Player of the Year Chris Lum. Lum, who was also the runner-up for the Walter Payton Award, broke the Patriot League's single-season record for passing yards (4,378) and touchdown passes (32). For his role in Lehigh's success, Cecchini was a finalist for the FootballScoop FCS Coordinator of the Year award.

With Cecchini guiding the offense, the Mountain Hawks went a combined 39-9 and won two Patriot League titles. Wide receiver Lee Kurfis led the nation in receiving yards per game (122.8) in 2013 while quarterback Mike Colvin finished fifth nationally in total offense (326.64) the year before. Under Cecchini's watch, four Mountain Hawks garnered All-America honors.

From 2007 to 2009, Cecchini served as The Citadel's offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach. During his first season in Charleston, the Bulldogs finished with their best record in 15 years, bolstered by an offense that set 16 school records, including points per game (39.5) and total offense (437.6). Cecchini mentored wide receiver Andre Roberts, a First Team All-American who set Citadel records in single-season receptions (95), receiving yards (1,334) and touchdown catches (15). Roberts was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round of the 2010 National Football League Draft and played 13 seasons, earning First Team All-Pro honors in 2018 and Second Team All-Pro honors in 2020 and 2021.

Beginning in 2003, Cecchini spent three seasons as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks and wide receivers coach at Harvard. His fast-paced offense paid immediate dividends, as the Crimson averaged 461 yards per game during his first campaign, a figure good for fourth nationally. The next season, Harvard went 10-0 and won the Ivy League championship. After the Crimson led the Ivy League in aggregate offense, the AFCA selected Cecchini as its 2005 Mike Campbell Top Assistant Coach Award winner.

Under Cecchini's tutelage, 14 Harvard records fell, including points per game (33.9). Among his charges was quarterback Ryan Fitzpatrick, the 2004 Ivy League Player of the Year who was selected by the St. Louis Rams in the 2005 NFL Draft and spent time with nine different organizations over his 17-season pro career.

Before his tenure in Cambridge, Cecchini spent nine seasons on his alma mater's staff. In 2000, Cecchini's first campaign as offensive coordinator, Lehigh went 11-0 during the regular season and reached the Division I-AA (now FCS) quarterfinals. Following that season, Cecchini was promoted to assistant head coach while retaining his responsibilities as offensive coordinator. In 2001, his up-tempo offense averaged 38.3 points per game, helping the Mountain Hawks secure their second-straight undefeated regular season and championship quarterfinal appearance. In Cecchini's first three seasons directing the offense, Lehigh posted a combined 31-6 record and captured two Patriot League titles.

During his playing days at Lehigh, Cecchini became a consensus First Team All-American after leading the nation in receptions and receiving yards per game in 1993. That season, he set Patriot League records in receptions (88), receiving yards (1,318) and touchdown receptions (15); his 15 touchdown catches remain the Patriot League standard to this day. Cecchini, who was later named to the Patriot League 15th Anniversary Team, graduated from Lehigh in 1995 with a bachelor of science degree in marketing.

Cecchini first joined the Mountain Hawk football staff as a tight ends coach. He also served as a running backs coach, quarterbacks coach and wide receivers coach before being promoted to offensive coordinator. During Cecchini's first stint in Bethlehem, Lehigh averaged more than 350 yards of offense and over 26 points per game.

Cecchini and his wife, Tammy, have two sons: Evan and Will. Tammy serves as Bucknell's head women's tennis coach.



Bucknell Football Drops Season Opener at Air Force

Cade Harris rushed for two touchdowns and caught another to lead Air Force to a weather-delayed 49-13 win over Bucknell in the season openers for both teams on Saturday before 30,207 fans at Falcon Stadium.

Ralph Rucker IV completed 10 of 18 passes for 126 yards and a touchdown, and Tariq Thomas had a good day on the ground with 80 yards on 18 carries, but the Bison dropped their opener on the road against a Football Bowl Division (FBS) team for the third year in a row.

"Our players are smart, and they know we played a really good football team today," said head coach Dave Cecchini. "Physically, we played with them at times, but we weren't able to sustain it for the whole game. Our first step is to fix the assignment errors where it doesn't matter who you're playing. We have an opportunity to get better from week one to week two, and that will be our focus."

Known more for its potent option running attack, Air Force opened up a big first-half lead thanks to its passing game. The Bison defense forced a punt on the first series of the game, but the Falcons cashed in with an 80-yard touchdown march on their second drive. Bucknell's secondary bit on the run, and Josh Johnson found a wide-open Quin Smith for a 40-yard scoring pass at the 6:22 mark of the first quarter.

After a punt, Liam Szarka completed passes of 18 and 29 yards to set up a Harris 9-yard touchdown run with 2:31 left in the opening stanza.

Bucknell answered with a terrific 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive, culminating with Rucker's 12-yard strike to Sam Milligan on a slant pattern. Earlier in the drive, Nate Anderson drew a pass interference penalty in the end zone on third-and-9 to set the Bison up with a first-and-goal.

Air Force came right back with a matching 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. This time, the Falcons gobbled up all the yardage on the ground. Fullback Dylan Carlson started the series with a 17-yard run, and he finished it off with a dive across the goal line from the 2 to make it 21-7 with 7:14 left in the second quarter.

Bucknell made two first downs on its next drive, one on the first career catch from tight end Jack Bohm-Squicciarini, but Roger Jones picked off a pass at the Air Force 38-yard line to end the threat. One play later, Johnson came back in at quarterback and connected with Harris on a 62-yard bomb to make it 28-7.

The defense came up with a big stop to keep it a three-score game at the end of the half. A Deuce Geter sack and a Brandon Biagiarelli QB pressure forced a 42-yard field goal attempt, which was pushed wide to the right in the final 20 seconds.

The Bison received the second-half kickoff and went for it on fourth-and-inches from their own 34. Rucker appeared to have the first down on the quarterback sneak, but as he drove the pile, Mikhail Seiken ripped the ball out, and Korey Johnson returned the fumble for a backbreaking touchdown. Harris then scored his third touchdown of the day on an 8-yard run one play after a shanked punt, and suddenly the Falcons led 42-7 only 3:26 into the second half.

Some good, hard running from Thomas and Michael Cadden led to Matt Schearer's 37-yard field goal with 5:49 left in the third quarter. Rucker's TD pass to Josh Gary was waved off on an offensive pass interference penalty, but the Bison still managed points on a long 12-play drive that took 5:45 off the clock. That was the last play before the game was delayed about 45 minutes due to lightning.

Air Force won its fifth straight game dating back to last season. The Falcons used three quarterbacks in the game, and Johnson and Szarka combined to complete 6 of 9 passes for 159 yards and two touchdowns. Harris led a balanced rushing attack with 66 yards on eight carries. Air Force totaled 270 yards on the ground.

Seven different Bucknell receivers caught passes, with Milligan, Michael Cadden, and TJ Cadden grabbing two apiece. Sophomore quarterback Christopher Dietrich saw his first action and completed all six of his passes on a 13-play drive that culminated with Schearer's second field goal of the day, this one from 39 yards with 44 seconds remaining.

Biagiarelli paced the defense with eight tackles, all solo, while Geter and Terian Williams II tallied six each.

"A lot of our mistakes were self-inflicted, and we will go back and look at those and correct them," said Cecchini. "The start of the second half was not Bison Football, but we came back after the delay with a lot of younger guys on the field and put together a good drive. There were a lot of positives to take from this. We'll build on the negatives and be ready to take on Marist next week."

Bucknell heads back on the road next Saturday to face the Red Foxes at 1 p.m. Then the Bison will play their next four at home, starting with VMI on Sept. 13 at 3:30 p.m.

**Tariq Thomas Rushes for Two Touchdowns in the Bison's 34-23 Win Over Marist**

The Bison football team found their first victory of 2025 at Marist on Saturday with a 34-23 win. Tariq Thomas led the offensive charge as he rushed for 77 yards and two touchdowns. Ralph Rucker IV went 18-of-23 for 236 yards through the air, and TJ Cadden (104 yards) and Sam Milligan (87 yards) both broke their career records in receiving yards. Freshman Logan Busson recorded his first career interception in the first half, and Terian Williams II and Deuce Geter paced the defense with 13 tackles each.

Outside of the normal for Bucknell, all four Bison touchdowns came on the ground. Alongside Thomas' two, Rucker and Michael Cadden each found their way into the end zone. Matt Schearer went 2-for-2 in field goals to round out the score.

"It's a team sport and all 11 guys on offense, defense, and special teams were firing on all cylinders," said head coach Dave Cecchini. "Tariq did a phenomenal job right from the get-go. Hats off to our offensive line, they did a great job protecting Ralph even with a lot of blitzes."

Marist won the toss and elected to receive the ball in the first quarter, but the Bison defense came out explosively and forced a quick three-and-out to start the game. Bucknell's offense then took the field and continued the trend with a six-play, 53-yard touchdown drive, culminating with a 15-yard rush by Rucker into the end zone to put the Bison on the board first.

The Red Foxes offense found its way to the Bucknell 47-yard line thanks to four straight passes from quarterback Sonny Mannino, but the Bucknell defense struck once again. Busson read the route and picked off Mannino's pass and ran it back to the Marist 40-yard line.

"I was just dropping to my curl and I saw the quarterback's eyes go back in so I cut back inside and got it," said Busson. "I am new to playing inside linebacker, so I am just trusting my coaches and giving 100% all the time."

Thomas opened the offensive drive with a 36-yard rush, but the Marist defense locked down and forced the Bison to settle for a field goal. Schearer nailed the 22-yarder to give the Bison a 10-0 lead.

Marist's offense played aggressively as they attempted to convert on two fourth downs within their third drive; the first was successful, but the passing attempt on 4th and 10 went incomplete, forcing a turnover on downs.

The Bison took the 10-0 lead into the second quarter, as they were driving down the field. Bucknell started the second on the Marist 14-yard line. Rucker rolled out of the pocket to avoid a sack and attempted to pass the ball into the end zone, but Nate Robinson Jr. was sitting on the pass and picked it off to get Marist out of a tricky situation.

The interception was followed up by each team going three and out. On the Red Foxes' fourth offensive drive of the game, however, momentum shifted in their favor. Starting at the Marist 20-yard line, the offense put together a seven-play, 80-yard touchdown drive, which culminated with a one-yard rush into the end zone by Tristan Shannon to make it a three-point game.

The Bison followed up Marist's touchdown drive with one of their own. A nine-play, 80-yard drive that was highlighted by a Milligan 36-yard catch and a fully stretched out TJ Cadden 12-yard catch. Finishing the drive was Thomas, who rushed four yards into the end zone for the score.

Marist was holding on with under four minutes left in the first half as they used the rest of the clock to drive down the field. With 15 seconds left in the half, Sonny Mannino made a one-yard pass into the end zone to Connor Hulstein to cut the Bison lead to three.

Coming out of the half, both teams' defensive sides were able to adapt, which left the beginning of the third quarter scoreless as both teams had unsuccessful drives. The Bison broke the drought with a 32-yard Schearer field goal to make it a 20-14 game with 5:10 left in the third quarter.

Bucknell's defense then came up big to limit Marist to a field goal and maintain the lead. After the Red Foxes drove down the field and had 3rd-and-goal, Williams broke up a pass in the end zone to force the field goal. Sameer Layous made the 29-yarder.

The Bison offense then came out swinging as TJ Cadden caught a 46-yard bomb from Rucker to the Marist one-yard line to end the third quarter. To start off the fourth, Thomas burst across the line to extend the Bison's lead to 27-14.

As the Red Foxes did several times throughout the game, they got into Bison territory and then went for it on fourth down. This time, Marist went for a 4th and 6 at the Bucknell 41-yard line, but the plan was thwarted by Williams, who broke through the line and sacked Mannino to force a turnover on downs.

The sack was a diving board for the Bison offense, which went seven plays for 59 yards and a touchdown immediately after. The score came from Michael Cadden on an eight-yard rush with 7:30 left in the game.

As time was counting down, the Red Foxes had one more offensive drive and they took advantage of it. Marist went seven plays for 64 yards and ended the drive with a four yard rushing touchdown by Ja'Cyon Cox. The extra-point attempt hit the upright, and then the Bison got the ball and lined up in victory formation as they earned their first win of 2025 with a scoreline of 34-23.

**Rucker-to-Milligan Combo Leads Football to 35-28 Win over VMI**

Sam Milligan's team-record fourth touchdown reception came with 1:49 remaining in the game, sending the Bucknell football team to a thrilling 35-28 win over VMI in the home opener on Saturday at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium. Ralph Rucker IV tied the school record with five touchdown passes, four of them going to Milligan, as the Bison won their second straight game to improve to 2-1 on the season.

Rucker completed 21 of 28 passes for 405 yards and five touchdowns. There have now been four five-touchdown passing games in team history, and Rucker has three of them. The 405 passing yards were second-most in a game in school history, trailing only Rucker's 437 in last season's win over Colgate.

Milligan had three touchdown grabs in the first half alone, as Bucknell raced to a 21-7 lead at intermission. Milligan sat out most of the third quarter due to a minor injury, but he returned in the fourth quarter and made the biggest play of the day. After VMI rallied to tie the game at 28-28, Milligan outmuscled a defender for a spectacular 37-yard catch in the front left corner of the end zone with less than two minutes to go.

"I felt very calm today out there," said Milligan. "I wasn't thinking much when I made that catch. I was relaxed and that's something that I haven't felt a ton of and feeling that today was really cool and really exciting."

VMI was set back by a holding penalty and a bad snap on its final drive, and the Keydets came up short on a 4th-and-31 play. A first-down run by Logan Bush sent the Bison into victory formation.

Milligan finished with seven catches for 192 yards. Six Bison previously caught three touchdown passes in a game: Carl Probst (1971), Ken Jenkins (1980), Mike Morrow (1986), Will Carter (2014), Jake Hartman (2014), and Dominic Lyles (2021). Milligan's 192 receiving yards were sixth-most in a game in team history, and the most since Carter went for 246 at Lehigh in 2014.

Outside of breaking his touchdowns in single-game records, the junior broke his career receptions record with seven and his career reception yards record with 192. TJ Cadden also broke his career receiving yards record with 123 in this game.

Down by just one score with nine minutes remaining, the Keydets strung together a nine-play, 52-yard drive that culminated with a 14-yard receiving touchdown for Owen Sweeney to tie the game at 28 with just over five minutes left to play. The Keydets found the end zone the play before as well, but it was taken away due to an ineligible player downfield penalty. Ben Shrewsbury made the extra point to officially tie the game.

With just under two minutes left in the game, the Bucknell offense was faced with a 28-28 scoreline and a 3rd-and-1 situation. Rucker kept the ball and battled through the defensive line of VMI to give the Bison a fresh set of downs and a chance to make a game-winning play. Rucker threw a deep ball to the end zone and found Milligan, who toe-tapped it in for the game-winner and record breaker.

"I have to earn the right for the football. If Ralph is willing to throw me the football, I need to go get it," said Milligan. "Every time the ball is in the air that's him putting his faith in me. The five linemen are blocking and they are doing all this just so I can catch the football. It is a team effort and when you have those opportunities to capitalize on what everyone else on the team is doing, you have to go make a play. That's one of those things that helps me relax."

The Bison came out to a 21-7 lead at the end of the first half, but VMI was able to stay in the game and put up a comeback in the final quarter of play to make it come down to that two-minute drill to decide a winner.

The defenses came up big to start off the game as the first two offensive drives for both Bucknell and VMI were three and outs.

The Bison then broke the scoring drought with a one play, eight second, 45-yard touchdown pass from Rucker to Milligan, after the VMI punt landed on their own 45-yard line.

The Keydets responded with a touchdown drive of their own. VMI scored on a 12-play, 69-yard drive that culminated with Sweeney catching an 18-yard touchdown pass from Collin Shannon.

Both teams then ended drives with a punt and the second quarter began with an even 7-7 scoreline.

To open the second quarter, the Bison strung together a long 16-play, 94-yard touchdown drive that lasted 8:03. On the drive, Tang Thomas rushed for 20 yards, TJ Cadden rushed for 48 yards, Nate Anderson had 20 receiving yards and Milligan found the 18-yard touchdown reception for his second score of the game.

Bucknell's defense then came out with pressure and forced VMI to punt the ball with just over three minutes left in the first half. The offense took the field looking to make it a two-score game before heading into the locker room and would be successful with Milligan's third of the game, a record tying touchdown for the junior. The 34-yard one-handed touchdown reception was the culmination of a 10-play, 85-yard drive, which put the Bison up 21-7 at halftime.

Rucker Becomes All-Time Passing Leader in Loss to No. 10/10 Lehigh

Ralph Rucker IV broke Bucknell's all-time passing yards record with 291 on the day, putting him at 6,421 for his career, in Bucknell's loss to #10/10 Lehigh. Despite scoring back-to-back touchdowns in the fourth quarter to make it a two-score game with just over six minutes remaining, the Bison (2-2, 0-1 PL) fell to the Mountain Hawks (4-0, 2-0 PL) by a score of 41-24.

Rucker surpassed Brandon Wesley '13 and his 6,277 career passing yards to become Bucknell's all-time passing yards leader. He went 23-for-34 for 291 yards and two touchdowns in the game to get the record. Rucker also rushed for 35 yards and a touchdown to be the Bison's leading rusher of the night.

Sam Milligan led the Bison receivers with 109 yards on five receptions. Nick Hoying and Deuce Geter led the Bison in tackles with six tackles each.

"They are a good football team," said head coach Dave Cecchini. "They showed why they were preseason favorites and why they are ranked 10th in the country. When that happens, you just have to be your best. They showed that today at least, they were the better football team."

Bucknell struggled at the start with its first two offensive possessions going unsuccessful, while Lehigh put 10 points on the board in their first two offensive possessions. The Bison opened with the ball, and on the first snap, Rucker threw an interception at the Bucknell 25-yard line. Lehigh then got the ball in a good position, but the Bison defense was able to limit the damage to a field goal. Bucknell's second offensive drive was a quick three-and-out, and Lehigh capitalized once again, but this time in the form of a seven-play, 28-yard touchdown drive that culminated with a 12-yard rush by Jaden Green.

After going down by ten with 7:03 left in the first quarter, the Bison's offense started making progress with a Ty Stauffer 10-yard rush and a Sam Milligan 59-yard reception to set Matt Schearer up for a 29-yard field goal, which put Bucknell on the board.

On Lehigh's next offensive drive, the Mountain Hawks began with a deep pass downfield, but England Allen came up big with the breakup for Bucknell. Lehigh ended up going three-and-out and the defense held up their end of the bargain as the Mountain Hawks then forced the Bison to punt on the next drive.

Lehigh ended the pause in scoring with an 11-play, 98-yard touchdown drive after Schearer punted the ball to the Lehigh two-yard line. On their drive, the Mountain Hawks went for it on 4th and 1 with a quarterback rush by Hayden Johnson. Green rushed for 14 yards to make it to the one-yard line, and Luke Yoder punched it in for the touchdown to give Lehigh a 17-3 lead, which wouldn't hold for long as the Bison would score on the next drive.

Bucknell's offense hit its stride as it put together a 12-play 85-yard touchdown drive with 4:29 left in the first half to make it a one-score game. The drive began with a TJ Cadden 22-yard catch and ended with Rucker keeping the ball and using a hesitation tactic to draw away the defender and rush five yards to the end zone. Schearer would make the extra point to cut Lehigh's lead to seven. The final four and a half minutes would go scoreless, and the Mountain Hawks went into halftime with a 17-10 lead.

Lehigh dominated the third quarter with back-to-back Green rushing touchdowns and defensive three-and-outs to extend the lead to 31-10 with 7:30 left in the period. The Mountain Hawks would add one more touchdown to end the third quarter up 38-10, this time on a pass to Mason Humphrey.

The Bison stayed competitive and put together back-to-back touchdown drives. The first was a 12-play 75-yard touchdown drive that ended with a 10-yard touchdown reception for Nate Anderson, his first of the season. Josh Gary had two 10+ yard receptions that were instrumental in the drive. The second came from an 11-play, 86-yard drive that ended with a three-yard receiving touchdown for TJ Cadden, making it a two-score game with 6:09 remaining.

The Mountain Hawks would land one last punch with a field goal late in the fourth quarter to make the final score 41-24.

Bison Hold Off Saint Francis in 30-23 Victory

After being down by one with just under eight minutes left in the game, Ralph Rucker IV rushed for 32 yards to set up Tariq Thomas for a 17-yard rush followed by a seven-yard rushing touchdown. Bucknell converted their two-point try to gain a 30-23 lead over Saint Francis with just about five-minutes left in the game. The Bison (3-2, 0-1 PL) would ride that momentum to get the 30-23 victory over the Red Flash (0-5, 0-1 NEC) at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium on Senior Night.

Saint Francis threatened to score with a big drive in the final two minutes of the ball game. The Red Flash had possession at the 20 with 7.5 seconds remaining, throwing deep to the end zone. Brad Gerken jumped the route and picked the ball with 1.5 seconds remaining, effectively sealing the game.

"It's not easy for someone with two hands to make that play, but for someone with one hand and one club, it was a great play," said head coach Dave Cecchin. "This was his second game playing with the club and broken thumb. All you are looking for is to knock it down and hope there are zeros on the clock and the game would be over, but thank goodness he caught it because they would have had one more shot at the end zone. Phenomenal heads up play by him to get a foot in bounds."

Thomas rushed for 95 yards on 10 attempts and a touchdown as he surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the contest. Rucker went 15-for-26 and a touchdown, and he also rushed for a touchdown for the Bison. TJ Cadden led the Bison in receiving with six catches for 78 yards and a touchdown.

The game started with both teams punting the ball away on their opening offensive drives and then following that up with touchdowns on their next opportunities. The Bison struck first with a 12-play, 72-yard touchdown drive that culminated with Rucker finding TJ Cadden in the end zone for the score. On the drive, Sam Milligan, Nate Anderson and TJ Cadden all had 10+ yard catches to set up the touchdown. Matt Schearer made the extra point to put Bucknell up 7-0 at the end of the first quarter.

Saint Francis answered with a 9-play, 63-yard touchdown drive that ended with Raphael Ekechi rushing five yards to the end zone and made the extra point to tie the game at the beginning of the second quarter.

Saint Francis forced Bucknell's offense to punt after the Bison were penalized for holding. Bucknell's defense then forced Saint Francis to go three and out thanks to a sack from freshman Matti Krüger, his career first.

The Bison then strung together a seven-play, 23-yard drive to set Schearer up for a 49-yard field goal attempt. The senior nailed the long kick in front of his family to give Bucknell a 10-7 lead with 3:18 left in the half.

Saint Francis opened its next offensive drive with a 36-yard pass to Peyton Nelson to give them solid field position, but would end up punting to a quarterback hurry by Darius Day and a stop by Luke Freeman on 3rd and 10. The Red Flash defense however, would force Bucknell to have a quick three and out offensive drive to give Saint Francis the ball with 58 seconds left in the half. The Red Flash took advantage of the possession as Maultsby had two 10-yard receptions, including a one-handed grab in the corner of the end zone to put Saint Francis up 14-10 at halftime.

Opening up the second half, Nick Whithfield Jr. threw a dart to Maultsby for 48 yards. The Bucknell defense was able to apply pressure and stand strong at the 4-yard line to force two incomplete passes and limit Saint Francis to a field goal attempt. Matt Plummer made the 21-yarder to put Saint Francis up 17-10 early in the second half.

Bucknell answered with a seven-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that culminated with Rucker breaking through an all-out blitz and rushing 11-yards to the end zone. The drive was kickstarted by a 13-yard catch from Milligan, followed up by an 18-yard rush from Thomas. Schearer missed the extra point to tie the game at 17, leaving Bucknell down by one point with 10:57 left in the third quarter.

Bucknell's offense capitalized on Takai Whitmore's strip sack, as Michael Cadden broke a tackle and rushed 20 yards into the end zone on a seven-play, 44-yard drive to put the Bison up 22-17 midway through the third quarter. The Bison went for two, but were unsuccessful.

Bucknell's defense then came out and made another big stop as they forced the Red Flash's offense off the field after four plays. Jack Insera ended the drive with a quarterback hurry on third down to force a Saint Francis punt. Bucknell's offense would follow that up with a quick three and out of their own, but their defense would stand tall and force Saint Francis to do the same, with freshman Kato Meissner recording his career first sack on third and five to end the drive and the third quarter.

The Bison strung together a six-play, 53-yard drive highlighted by a 36-yard catch by TJ Cadden, but opted to go for a fake field goal on 4th and 8. Schearer ran the ball but was tackled by Malik Garrit and Colin Douglass after two yards gained, causing the Bison to turn over the ball on downs. Saint Francis took advantage of their next possession as they put together a 12-play, 85-yard drive that resulted in an Ekechi six-yard rushing touchdown. The Red Flash attempted a two-point conversion, but were unable to convert, giving them a one-point lead with under eight minutes left in the game.

The Bison offense came out swinging as Rucker would scramble for 32-yards to set up Tariq Thomas for a 17-yard rush followed by a seven-yard rushing touchdown. Bucknell converted their two-point try to gain a 30-23 lead over Saint Francis with just about five-minutes left in the game.

On the final Saint Francis offensive drive of the game, the Red Flash were on the Bucknell 17-yard line with seconds left on the clock and Whitfield tossed a ball into the end zone for the tie, but Gerken was there for the game securing interception.
