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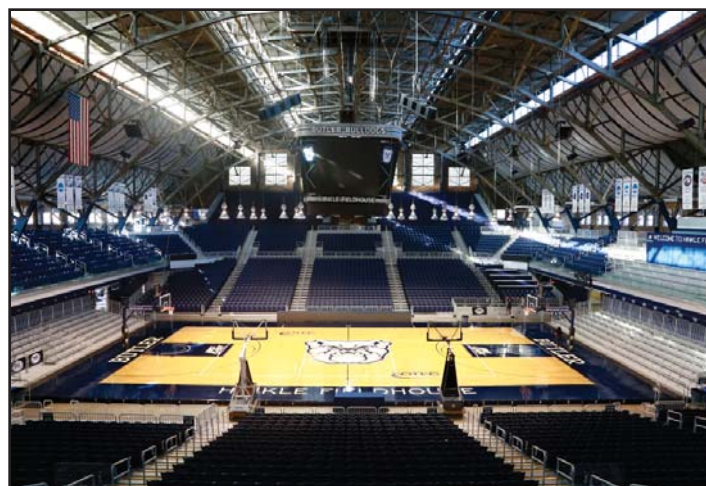
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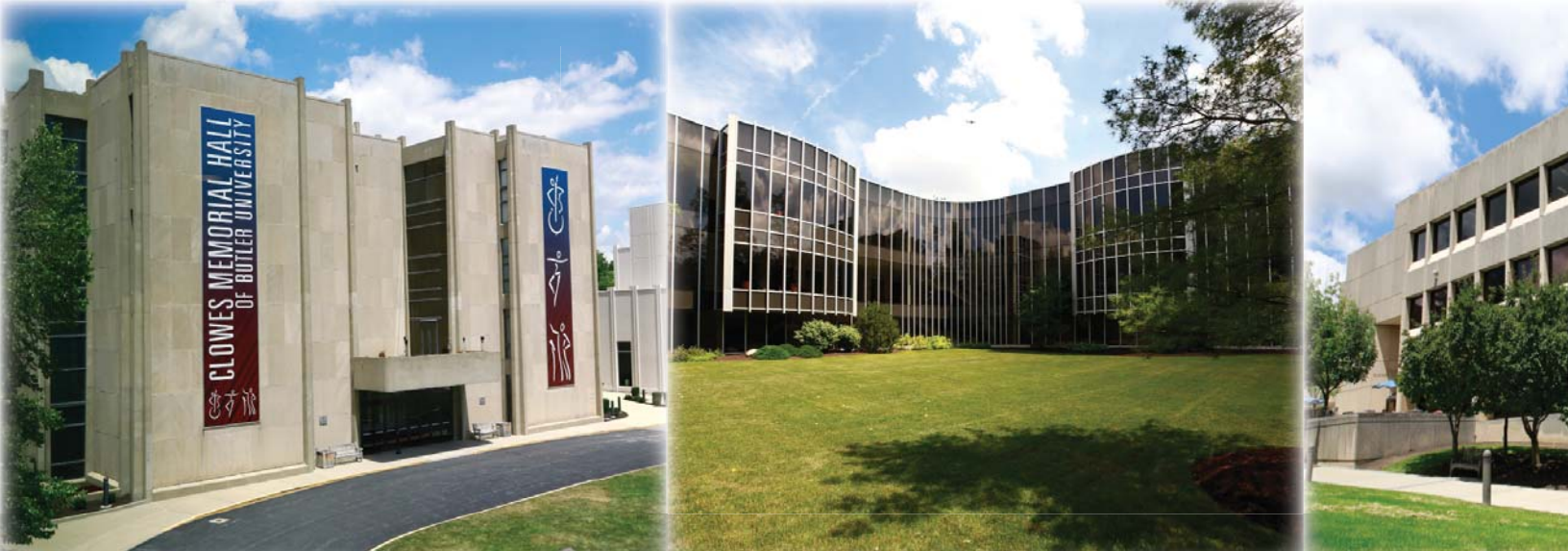

HINKLE FIELDHOUSE - A TRUE COLLEGE SPORTS CATHEDRAL



Hinkle Fieldhouse was constructed in 1928 and it has stood up to the test of time, maintaining the splendor, character and atmosphere that makes it one of the nation's most famous basketball arenas.

Butler played its first basketball game in the Fieldhouse on March 7, 1928, defeating Notre Dame 21-13, in overtime. Since the Fieldhouse was not entirely completed at that time, the building dedication was held off until December 21, 1928. The name of the facility was changed in 1966 from Butler Fieldhouse to Hinkle Fieldhouse in honor of Butler's legendary coach and athletic director Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle, who built the University's athletic tradition over nearly half a century.

In addition to being the home of Butler basketball, the Fieldhouse has served as host to six U.S. presidents (Herbert Hoover, Dwight Eisenhower, Richard Nixon, Gerald Ford, George H.W. Bush and Bill Clinton), four professional basketball teams, the U.S. Olympic basketball trials, the first USSR-USA basketball game, all-star basketball games for the NBA and ABA and the East-West College All-Stars, a three-ring circus, and the popular movie "Hoosiers." The building also housed the U. S. military as a barracks during World War II.



Hinkle Fieldhouse is on the National Register of Historic Buildings. Many basketball legends, including John Wooden, Oscar Robertson, George McGinnis and Larry Bird, have played on the Hinkle hardwood.



When Hinkle Fieldhouse opened in 1928, the basketball floor ran east and west, which put more than half the seats at the ends of the court. The court was turned to its current configuration in the early 1930's.



Hinkle Fieldhouse was the site of the Indiana High School state championship from 1928 to 1971, except during World War II.

In December of 1985, Hinkle Fieldhouse was turned into a Hollywood stage for the filming of the popular movie Hoosiers, which has been recognized as one of the "Top 10" sports movies ever.



Hoosiers was based on the 1954 Indiana High School state championship game at Butler Fieldhouse when tiny Milan defeated Muncie Central, 32-30, on a last second shot by Bobby Plump.



SPORTS MEDICINE

Butler student-athletes have access to a comprehensive sports medicine program that focuses on the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of athletic-related injuries. Under the supervision of Head Athletic Trainer Ryan Galloy, Butler's athletes are served by an extensive team of physicians, health care professionals and certified athletic trainers.

The Bulldogs' training room is located on the west end of Hinkle Fieldhouse, immediately behind the women's basketball office. The training room is divided into four areas - rehabilitation and injury management, athlete preparation, administration and storage - and is fully equipped to provide thorough rehabilitation.

Butler's athletic training staff provides care for Butler student-athletes at practices and games, while also maintaining daily hours for treatment and rehabilitation. The staff also works to educate Butler's student-athletes in the areas of injury prevention, nutrition and various wellness issues.

Butler's sports medicine program utilizes the extensive medical community in Indianapolis, which boasts one of the largest and most knowledgeable groups of sports medicine professionals in the nation. Butler student-athletes have access in Indianapolis to world-renowned medical facilities, as well as many of the leading physicians in the world of sports medicine.



ACADEMIC SUPPORT



Balancing the demands of NCAA Division I athletics with the responsibilities of a rigorous academic schedule is one of the biggest challenges facing collegiate student-athletes. To help ease that challenge Butler provides a dedicated academic support system. The Athletic Academic Support Offices are located in Hinkle Fieldhouse, where coordinator Sonya Hopkins and staff are available to assist student-athletes in solving academic and non-academic problems.

Butler offers its student-athletes academic and career counseling, guidance in study skills and time management, and academic tutoring. The academic staff monitors each student-athlete's progress toward Butler's degree requirements. Support services for student-athletes are provided on a by-need or by-student/coach request basis. Butler teams and student-athletes have won numerous league and national academic awards.

STRENGTH & CONDITIONING



The purpose of Butler's strength training program is two-fold. One is to reduce the risk of injury and the second is to increase performance potential. By increasing the strength of each athlete's muscles, bones and connective tissues, the chance of incurring an injury while performing lessens. The increase in functional strength is also an important step toward reaching the athlete's athletic potential. The strength and conditioning program stresses flexibility, agility, jumping skills, speed and reaction time, as well as strength. The program utilizes free weights, strength machinery, manual resistance and additional innovative techniques to help maximize the chance for Butler athletes to succeed.



The center of Butler's strength and conditioning program is the 4,000-square foot weight training room located in Hinkle Fieldhouse. The weight room is stocked with free weights, weight machines, stationary bikes, stairmasters, and related apparatus, and allows Butler athletes to train in an open and comfortable environment.

TRAVEL

The bus used by the Butler women's basketball program for road games features all-electric plush recliners for the players as well as a lounge area at the rear. The fleet also comes complete with multiple flat panel TVs, two satellite systems with Direct TV®, twin DVD systems, on-board rest room and a galley area complete with ice chests. Wireless internet access is also available throughout the bus.



The Bulldogs also take charter flights during the season. These private planes are provided by Million Air, the world's premier provider of private aviation services. The 30-seat plane comes equipped with work stations and WIFI.



INDIANAPOLIS



Indianapolis is the Nation's 15th largest city and is home to the Indiana Pacers, Indianapolis Colts, Indiana Fever, Indianapolis Indians, Indianapolis Motor Speedway and the BUTLER BULLDOGS!





THE CIRCLE CITY

Long recognized as the “Amateur Sports Capital of the World”, Indianapolis plays host to the Indiana Pacers, the Indiana Fever, the Final Four, Bankers Life Fieldhouse, the Indianapolis Colts, Lucas Oil Stadium, spectacular Victory Field, the Butler Bulldogs, the NCAA, and the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

Sports have played a key role in the development of the Hoosier state capital. Indianapolis gained an international reputation as host of the largest single-day sporting event in the world - the Indianapolis 500. In fact, the city hosts the two largest single-day sporting events in the world - the Indy 500 and the All-State 400 at the Brickyard. Indianapolis hosted the Pan American Games in 1987, the NCAA Men's Final Four in 1980, 1991, 1997, 2000, 2006, 2010, and 2015, the NCAA Women's Final Four in 2005, the World Gymnastics Championship in 1991, the World Basketball Championship in 2002, the World Swimming Championship in 2004, has hosted Olympic trials in swimming, diving, and synchronized swimming, national championships in gymnastics, boxing, track and field, rowing, canoe/kayak, swimming, diving, synchronized swimming, archery and ice skating, and numerous NCAA championships.

Indianapolis also boasts the Indiana Fever of the WNBA and the Triple-A Indianapolis Indians, a team that plays in one of the finest minor league baseball parks in the nation - Victory Field. The Hoosier capital houses the headquarters for numerous national amateur sports governing bodies, including the United States Gymnastics Federation, USA Track and Field, U. S. Diving, U. S. Synchronized Swimming, and the United States Rowing Association. The Horizon League headquarters is located in Indianapolis and the NCAA national office moved to Indianapolis in 2001.

Indianapolis features a wide array of world-class sports facilities. Lucas Oil Stadium, the home of the Indianapolis Colts, hosted the 2010 NCAA Men's Basketball Final Four. The Indiana Pacers play in the 18,500-seat Bankers Life Fieldhouse. The city is home to the Indiana University Natatorium, featuring the state-of-the-art National Institute for Fitness and Sport, the Indianapolis Tennis Center which houses 24 tennis courts and an 8,000-seat stadium, the 12,500-seat IU Track and Field Stadium, the Major Taylor Velodrome, historic Hinkle Fieldhouse and Victory Field.





EFFORT AND EXECUTION

GODLEVSKE'S 2018-19 SEASON PREVIEW: There is a different feel to practice this year because we have so many upperclassmen on the roster. I've never had this much experience on the floor. Our coaching staff is able to rely on our juniors and seniors to teach the system to our younger players. They can get in there and show the underclassmen where to be on the floor, how to get in position, and explain to them what we are looking for in different situations. We love having our seniors teach the younger kids. It's going to be strange at practice next year without this core group of seniors. I feel like their time here went by so fast.

Having this experienced group makes a huge difference with what we can accomplish at practice. The amount of time that we are able to spend on the overall aspect of our game is much greater than in previous years. In previous seasons, we would try to focus on one little area at a time, but now we can knock out four or five different areas and then push ahead and implement everything in a five-on-five situation.

2018-19 TEAM GOALS: Our end of the year goal is to be in position to compete for a BIG EAST regular season championship. We want to put ourselves in position to compete for the BIG EAST Tournament title and with that, we want to make sure we get into some type of postseason play.

As coaches, we have learned a lot about this group and we really have to focus in on the daily process. We don't want to get too far ahead and start thinking about what our long-term goals will be. Instead, we need to

take care of ourselves and get ourselves ready to play. Our message to our team, every single day, will be preparing for Eastern Illinois. The next game is the biggest game. It's the most important game on the schedule.

SCHEDULE TALK WITH COACH G: Our first six games of the regular season will be played inside Hinkle Fieldhouse. The teams that we went out and played last year on their home floors have become much better. A year ago, some of those early games were against teams in a re-build situation, but a majority of them are vastly improved this year due to the recruits they brought in.

I think Murray State will be a much improved team in 2018-19 and Western Illinois is another team that comes to mind that has been very consistent over the last three years. I also expect Illinois State to be better this year after bringing in two high level players. We like the challenges that are ahead.

Signature games for us include home tilts against in-state rivals Indiana State and Ball State. We look forward to playing at Indiana and we also get to matchup against Ohio State on a neutral floor. All of those games are important to prepare us for the conference season.

Looking ahead, I think the conference schedule is more balanced for us this year. What people need to know about BIG EAST women's basketball is that it is close to what the men's side has been like these last few

years. I think we have a legitimate six teams that could fight for a NCAA Tournament bid. There isn't a team in the BIG EAST where I can look at the schedule as say that's a win. You have to be ready to play every night and if you're not ready you're going to pay for it.

STYLE OF PLAY: We will try to play more up-tempo this year than what we have played in the past. With our experience, we are trying to give the reigns back to the players and let them play free.

Defensively, you will see a lot of the same concepts to what we have done in the past. I will say we have changed our philosophy a little bit. We believe we can come out and be more aggressive just because we have the bodies to do so.

GUARDS: Whitney Jennings, Michelle Weaver and Kristen Spolyar will all log heavy minutes for the Bulldogs this season. Jennings earned BIG EAST honorable mention accolades after her first year at Butler. Head Coach Kurt Godlevske will once again have Jennings running the point. "Whitney impacts every possession for us," Godlevske explained. "She comes to the gym every day and brings effort. She plays at such a high level and yet may be the most consistent player I have ever coached."

Weaver adds even more experience to this guard group. The senior has battled some injuries throughout her career, but has still started in 71 games for BU. Coach Godlevske sees her as a great two-way talent. "Michelle is the best defender on the team and I think she's very capable of having a larger impact for us on the offensive end."

The third member of the trio is junior Kristen Spolyar. She played in 31 games a year ago, averaging 11.6 points per game. Spolyar missed the BIG EAST portion of the schedule as a freshman due to a knee injury, but she is completely healthy for the upcoming campaign. "Kristen is physically ready to go this year," Godlevske stated. "She's a bucket-getter."

Two true freshmen will also be in the mix for Butler this season. Jamilyn Robinson and Emilia Sexton will try to jump in the rotation after successful high school careers. Robinson scored over 2,500 points at Ascension Christian High School in Gonzales, Louisiana. "Jamilyn is explosive off the dribble and can finish at the basket due to her athleticism," Godlevske said. "I think the best part of her game is the 15-foot pull-up jumper."

Sexton finished third on the all-time scoring list at Louisville Male High School with 1,476 points. "Emilia is a shot maker," Godlevske stated. "That was her game in high school and that is what she has brought to practice. You can't leave her open. She is someone that teams will have to defend."

Butler also added Jaia Alexander to the roster. The 5-11 guard transferred to Butler after spending two seasons at Clemson. "Jaia is an old-school point guard," Godlevske said. "She is physical, but at the same time welcomes contact. She's a big guard that can score from all three levels and she has a great feel for the game. Jaia will be able to spend the year concentrating on her game and will get to know our system."

WINGS: Coach Godlevske has a handful of players that can play either guard or forward. Naira Caceres, Katherine Strong, Taylor Buford and Sarah Humphrey all fall in this category. Caceres and Strong will suit for for the first time this season after transferring in a year ago. Each player should see significant playing time in 2018-19. "Naira is one of the most versatile players in our program," Godlevske said. "She's got a unique feel around the basket and also has 3-point range, so she can really play any position for us."

Strong is a similar talent that came to Butler from VCU. "Kat came into the program defensive orientated, but the offensive side of her game has really grown over the past year," Godlevske said. "She's a physical, powerful player that can defend anyone on the court."

Taylor Buford and Sarah Humphrey will continue to battle for playing time this season. Buford is a senior that missed a majority of last season due to an injury. "Taylor has a lot of experience," Godlevske stated. "We can depend on her to make 16-foot jumpers. That's her strength and a go-to part of her offensive game."

Humphrey played in 15 games a year ago. Coach Godlevske thinks she is more comfortable in the offense heading into her third season. "Sarah's making better decisions and is a player that can knock down 3's or go down on the block and post you up."

FORWARDS:

The forward group includes Tori Schickel, Ashanti Thomas, Shae Brey and freshman Ellen Ross. Schickel will go down as one of the best players in program history. The senior eclipsed 1,000 points last year and will reach 1,000 career rebounds in the early stages of the 2018-19 season. She will become just the third player in program history to hit 1,000 in each category. "I have a great amount of confidence in Tori because of what I see her do every day in practice," Godlevske said. "She always has herself ready to go. I've never seen her take a day off and when your best player works that hard it sets a standard for everyone else."

Penn State transfer Ashanti Thomas will be in action this year to give Butler a powerful duo in the paint. "Ashanti has unbelievable offensive skills for a post player," Godlevske stated. "Her length makes her extremely difficult to defend and it also makes her a difference maker on the defensive end. She alters a lot of shots and swallows up the inside due to her size."

Brey and Ross provide quality depth to the BU frontcourt. Brey was the second leading rebounder on the team last year, starting in 25 games for the Bulldogs. "Shae has grown as a player from her experiences over the past two years," Godlevske said. "She is someone that you can always count on to be in the right position at the right time. She's a huge compliment to her teammates."

Ross averaged 17 points, nine rebounds, three assists, two steals and 1.5 blocks per game as a senior at Bishop Dwenger H.S. She will fight for playing time as a freshman. "Ellen is a banger," Godlevske explained. "She's physical in the paint and loves to play through contact. Over the summer she was able to extend her shooting range which makes her a greater threat to defenses."





Kurt Godlevske will enter his fifth season as the head coach of the Butler women's basketball program in 2018-19. The Bulldogs ended the 2017-18 season with a 15-17 overall record, and won a BIG EAST Tournament game for the third consecutive season.

Tori Schickel and Whitney Jennings earned post-season honors for BU in 2017-18. Schickel was a First Team All-BIG EAST selection while Jennings was tabbed honorable mention. 15 wins is Godlevske's highest total since taking over the program in 2014-15. The Bulldogs picked up six conference wins to play as the No. 8 seed in the conference tournament where they earned a win over Providence.

In his first season at Butler, Godlevske guided the Bulldogs to a 14-16 overall record that included a 10-8 conference record in the BIG EAST. 14 total wins during the 2014-15 season was significant for the coaching staff as it set a new school record for most wins recorded by a first-year head coach in Butler women's basketball history. Godlevske was able to motivate his inexperienced group of student-athletes that featured seven newcomers and not a single returning starter.

The 2014-15 team joined elite company by posting a perfect 8-0 record during the month of January. The Bulldogs had not gone undefeated during a full month in the past 17 years. Victories during the winning-streak came against Providence (2x), Creighton, St. John's, Marquette, Villanova, Georgetown, and Xavier.

Godlevske joined Butler as an assistant coach in the spring of 2013. After one full season as an assistant, Godlevske was tagged as the interim head coach, a title that would change on May 6 when A.D. Barry Collier named Godlevske the permanent head coach of the Bulldogs.

Prior to coaching at Butler, Godlevske spent seven years as girls' head coach at Bedford North Lawrence High School. He guided the Lady Stars to a 120-41 record, including a perfect 28-0 mark and the IHSAA Class 4A Girls' Basketball State Championship in 2013.

An all-state high school player in L'Anse, Mich., Godlevske played basketball at Northern Michigan University, and started his collegiate coaching career at NCAA Division II Lake Superior State University. He returned to the sideline as head coach of his alma mater in L'Anse, leading the school to a 40-9 record in two seasons before taking over at Bedford North Lawrence.

Godlevske earned his degree in physical education and health from Northern Michigan in 1994. He earned a master's degree from University of Indianapolis in 2004 and a principal's license from Oakland City in 2008.

Kurt and his wife Beth are the proud parents of three children, Corrin, Noah and Katie.





John Marcum joined the Butler women's basketball coaching staff in May of 2017. Marcum joins the Bulldogs after coaching stops at Grand Canyon, East Carolina, Indiana State, Cal Baptist and Oklahoma Baptist.

Marcum helped Grand Canyon post a 15-12 overall record. Before assisting the Lopes, he spent three seasons as the Associate Head Coach at East Carolina. The Pirates went 57-39 during that span with the team winning 22 games in each of his first two seasons. Marcum helped East Carolina sign a top 50-recruiting class in 2015, just one year after bringing in the second-best class in the American Conference for the 2014 campaign.

Marcum did more than just recruit during his time at East Carolina. His responsibilities included scouting, game preparation, and scheduling. Multiple players also earned all-conference honors during his time on the ECU sideline.

Additional coaching experience for Marcum includes stops at Indiana State, Cal Baptist and Oklahoma Baptist, his alma mater. He coached for the Sycamores in 2012-13, helping Indiana State reach 18 total wins. That season ended with a trip to the WNIT.

Marcum's first collegiate head coaching job came at Cal Baptist in 2010. He guided the team to a 47-12 record over two seasons. The Lancers claimed their first-ever conference championship during Marcum's tenure and returned to the national tournament for the first time at Cal Baptist since 1982.

Marcum's coaching career started at Oklahoma Baptist University in 2002. He served as an assistant to the men's basketball staff for four years and then transitioned to the women's basketball program from 2007-10.

A collegiate baseball player, Marcum graduated in 1997 with a bachelor's in secondary education with a concentration in history. He earned his master's in secondary education with a concentration in physical education in 2003 from East Central University.

John is the proud father of Abby, Matty and Cooper Marcum.





Kierra McCleary joined the Butler women's basketball coaching staff in June of 2017. A Murfreesboro, Tennessee native, McCleary has previous coaching experience at Northern Illinois, Western Illinois and Lewis. She played college basketball at North Alabama.

McCleary helped Northern Illinois find success in 2016-17 by helping the Huskies post a 21-12 overall record. NIU won two games in the Mid-American Conference Tournament to reach the championship and would end the season with a WNIT appearance. The turnaround was significant as Northern Illinois finished the 2015-16 with just 11 wins and 19 losses. The program had hit a rough patch in recent years with their last winning season coming in 2008-09.

While working at NIU, McCleary spent time working with the team's guards which included Third Team All-MAC selection Ally Lehman. Under McCleary's guidance, Lehman became just the fifth player in NIU history to average a double-double in a single-season.

Before coaching at NIU, McCleary spent two seasons at Western Illinois, where she served as the recruiting coordinator for the Leathernecks. In her first season at WIU, the Leathernecks set a new record for points in a single-season (2,392) and for most field goals made in a season (846).

Western Illinois would go on to finish the 2013-14 season with a 14-16 record. They finished fifth in the Summit League, the Leathernecks best league finish since 2007-08. The team surpassed that standard in 2014-15, finishing 17-13 overall and 9-7 in the Summit League to finish third in the regular season standings. Ashley Luke would finish the season as the Summit League's Player of the Year, as well CoSIDA's Academic All-American of the Year.

Prior to her two seasons at Western Illinois, McCleary worked one season at Lewis, helping the Flyers to the best turnaround in Division II during the 2012-13 season. Lewis finished the year 24-6, earning an NCAA Tournament berth, after finishing the 2011-12 season with an 8-20 mark.

As a player, McCleary was a three-time team captain at North Alabama helping the Lions to an NCAA Tournament berth in 2010-11, the program's first appearance since 1994. In her final season, North Alabama finished 21-7 overall and was a perfect 12-0 in the Gulf South Conference. McCleary graduated from UNA in 2011 with a degree in business administration.



Gabe Henry joined the Butler women's basketball coaching staff in September of 2017. Previous coaching experience for Henry includes stops at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley, Odessa College, Central Methodist University, the University of Hawaii, the University of Alaska Anchorage and Gonzaga University.

Henry was most recently a part of the coaching staff at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley. He joined the women's basketball program as an assistant coach on July 14, 2014. While at UTRGV, Henry served as the recruiting and defensive coordinator.

As recruiting coordinator, Henry was able to bring in top recruiting classes in the Western Athletic Conference for two consecutive years. The Dan Olson Collegiate Girls Basketball Report ranked the UTRGV 2015-16 class as No. 68 in the nation.

Defensively, UTRGV held the opposition to a .370 field goal percentage, the third-lowest in program history. In 2015-16, Henry helped coach a defense that allowed just 61.6 points per game, which was the fifth-best rate in program history.

Prior to UTRGV, Henry was a member of the women's basketball coaching staff at Odessa College for two years. Henry was the recruiting coordinator and helped handle all day-to-day operations of the team. In just two seasons, he coached and recruited nine all-conference players and one All-American student-athlete.

Henry also has coaching experience at Central Methodist University, the University of Hawaii and the University of Alaska Anchorage. He spent three years total with the teams.

Before Henry became a Butler Bulldog, he was once a Gonzaga Bulldog. Henry spent two seasons as the director of basketball operations at Gonzaga. During his time there, he helped lead the team to their first-ever NCAA Tournament win and two West Coast Conference Regular Season Championships.

The Brookfield, Mo. native earned his undergraduate degree from Missouri Valley College, which is also where he began his coaching career as a student assistant. Henry then went on to earn his master's degree in sports and athletic administration from Gonzaga University.

Henry lives in Indianapolis with his wife, Alana, and their two daughters, Avery and Arielle.

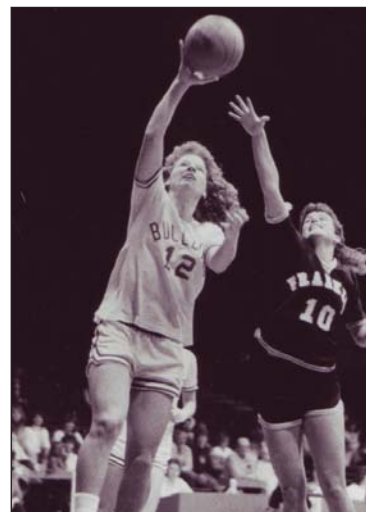
