

### HINKLE FIELDHOUSE - A TRUE COLLEGE SPORTS CATHEDRAL









Hinkle Fieldhouse was constructed in 1928 and it has stood up to the test of time, maintaining the splendor, character and atmosphere that makes it one of the nation's most famous basketball arenas.

Butler played its first basketball game in the Fieldhouse on March 7, 1928, defeating Notre Dame 21-13, in overtime. Since the Fieldhouse was not entirely completed at that time, the building dedication was held off until December 21, 1928. The name of the facility was changed in 1966 from Butler Fieldhouse to Hinkle Fieldhouse in honor of Butler's legendary coach and athletic director Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle, who built the University's athletic tradition over nearly half a century.

In addition to being the home of Butler basketball, the Fieldhouse has served as host to six U.S. presidents (Herbert Hoover, Dwight Eisenhower, Richard Nixon, Gerald Ford, George H.W. Bush and Bill Clinton), four professional basketball teams, the U.S. Olympic basketball trials, the first USSR-USA basketball game, all-star basketball games for the NBA and ABA and the East-West College All-Stars, a three-ring circus, and the popular movie "Hoosiers." The building also housed the U.S. military as a barracks during World War II.







Hinkle Fieldhouse is on the National Register of Historic Buildings. Many basketball legends, including John Wooden, Oscar Robertson, George McGinnis and Larry Bird, have played on the Hinkle hardwood.













When Hinkle Fieldhouse opened in 1928, the basketball floor ran east and west, which put more than half the seats at the ends of the court. The court was turned to its current configuration in the early 1930's.




Hinkle Fieldhouse was the site of the Indiana High School state championship from 1928 to 1971, except during World War II.

In December of 1985, Hinkle Fieldhouse was turned into a Hollywood stage for the filming of the popular movie Hoosiers, which has been recognized as one of the "Top 10" sports movies ever.



Hoosiers was based on the 1954 Indiana High School state championship game at Butler Fieldhouse when tiny Milan defeated Muncie Central, 32-30, on a last second shot by Bobby Plump.



# SPORTS MEDICINE

Butler student-athletes have access to a comprehensive sports medicine program that focuses on the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of athletic-related injuries. Butler's student-athletes are served by an extensive team of physicians, health care professionals and certified athletic trainers.

Butler's sports medicine program delivers traditional athletic training and sports medicine services to the studentathletes. The services to be delivered can be broken down into five domains:

- 1. Prevention of Athletic Injuries
- 2. Recognition, Evaluation, and Immediate Care of Athletic Injuries
- 3. Rehabilitation and Reconditioning of Athletic Injuries
- 4. Health Care Administration
- 5. Professional Development and Responsibility

Butler's sports medicine program utilizes the extensive medical network in the St. Vincent Hospital system, which boasts one of the largest and most knowledgeable groups of sports medicine professionals in the nation. Butler student-athletes also have access within this network to St. Vincent Sports Performance and its world-renowned comprehensive care facilities in the Indianapolis area.



# ACADEMIC SUPPORT



The Athletic Academic Support Offices are located in Hinkle Fieldhouse. Student-athletes know that either the Associate Athletic Director for administration or the coordinator of academic support is available to assist them in solving academic and non-academic problems. Support services for student-athletes are provided on a by-need basis or by student/coach-request. Student-athletes who need or desire academic support services are encouraged to seek assistance early in the school year by either going to their athletic academic support staff person or to their coach.

The Athletic Academic Support Office is organized by sport. That is, every student-athlete on a team works with the same athletic academic assistant to which his or her particular team has been assigned.





# STRENGTH & CONDITIONING







Our two basic objectives are to help enhance athletic performance while reducing the likelihood of injury. These two objectives are interrelated; by becoming a better conditioned, symmetrically balanced student-athlete you greatly reduce the risk of many injuries. To accomplish these, we emphasize activities that mimic sports demands, while always demanding proper technique.

#### PHILOSOPHY OF LIFTING

Emphasize squat, bench and clean. We incorporate exercises to keep the body balanced. Demand bending of the knees, build both ground based strength/power and develop the posterior chain.

#### OF CONDITIONING

To utilize activities that most mimic the activities of the sport; agilities, sprints and plyometrics.

#### DEALING WITH THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

Treat the student- athlete fairly and with respect, while requiring that they meet the goals of the program.

The Gold Shield motor coach allows you enjoy all the amenities, you'd expect in a luxury transport vehicle, including a bathroom. You have personal climate-control access from your seat, reading lights, reclining seats, 110-volt outlets, direct tv, and Bluetooth and DVD capabilities.

# EFFORT AND EXECUTION

**2019-20 TEAM GOALS:** Our goals remain the same. We want to compete for the BIG EAST regular season championship, and with that, want to fight for the tournament championship. Our ultimate goal is to make the NCAA Tournament.

SCHEDULE TALK: We have a lot of home games on our non-conference schedule because we play in one of the best venues in the country. There are so many teams out there that want to play inside Hinkle Fieldhouse. It allows us to create unique challenges by bringing in different types of quality opponents. This year we are going to face many different styles which will benefit our newcomers. They will see how we put together a scouting report for one team, and how different it can look for a new team just days later. I also think it's great for our student-athletes. Playing home games means they don't have to miss class.

**STYLE OF PLAY:** We will utilize the talent that we have on this roster. There are many different skill-sets on this team, but overall I'd say we will play an up-tempo brand of basketball. There will be more of a balanced scoring approach this year with the departure of Whitney Jennings and Tori Schickel. The bottom line for us is that we have to be one of the best defensive teams in the BIG EAST.

**TRANSITION INTO 2019-20:** If we do things the right way, good things will happen. Part of this group saw how that worked out for us last year. I realize that every team is different, but if you take what we did with last year's team and build those qualities into this year we can find success.

We need to have one common goal, one mission, and clear-cut objectives. My job is to take the different personalities in the locker room and build it into winning basketball. Our top priority is to out-work our opponent and execute.

**SENIOR CLASS:** Kristen Spolyar, Shae Brey, Katherine Strong, Sarah Humphrey, and Ashanti Thomas make up the 2019-20 senior class. Spolyar highlights the group with Preseason All-BIG EAST accolades. The top returning scorer on the team, Spolyar averaged 13.2 points per game a year ago after starting in all 33 games. She ended her campaign with 13 points at Cincinnati in the WNIT to land on 1,000 for her career.

#### Kristen Spolyar

Kristen understands what it takes to be successful on the court in the BIG EAST Conference. She will be a leader on this team and will help her teammates prepare for games. We want her to put points on the board, and to be a scoring threat on multiple levels. On top of that, we want her to help bring this team together. She's the type of person that never takes time off. She does things on a daily basis that you love to see as a coach and we know she is prepared for her senior season.





#### **Shae Brey**

Shae is a great teammate. She does everything right for this team. She will take a charge, set a good screen, create an extra possession with an offensive rebound, dive on a loose ball, you name it. She leads by her actions on the court and we are excited for her upcoming senior season.

#### **Ashanti Thomas**

Ashanti fought off some nagging injuries over the off-season and is now in much better basketball shape. As a staff, we really think she is starting to mature on the court, allowing her to play at her own pace. Having a better feel for the game can help her impact this team. We can play through the post with her on the floor and trust that she will make good basketball decisions. Defensively, Ashanti is a tremendous shot blocker with a nose for the ball. She secures the paint for us on each end.

#### **Katherine Strong**

Kat's basketball knowledge and skill-set makes her very tough to defend. She can knock down shots, but also plays big and strong around the basket. Last year, we felt that she played her best basketball just after Christmas break. She got comfortable with her new teammates and with our system at that point. This year, we will have to limit her minutes early in the season, but expect her to get back to that level during conference action.

#### Sarah Humphrey

Sarah has a great mind for the game. She understands exactly what we are trying to do and where all of her teammates are supposed to be on the court. She got a lot of playing time in Italy and we think that she can help us with her length and size.

**JUNIOR CLASS:** Upe Atosu, Jaia Alexander, Naira Caceres, N'Dea Flye, and Genesis Parker make up the junior class on the 2019-20 roster. All five of these student-athletes started their collegiate careers away from Butler. Atosu came from Labette, Alexander played at Clemson, Caceres spent her freshman year at Maine, Flye transferred in from Northwest Tech and Parker came after the 2018 fall semester from Cincinnati.

#### **Naira Caceres**

Naira is crafty. She is the most versatile player on our roster because she can play inside and out. Throughout our preseason we have noticed that she is even more comfortable with her back to the basket. She has been incredible in terms of shooting the ball and we are really pleased with her ability to pass off the dribble. Naira plays with great pace and has a knack to find her teammates while on the move. With her size and strength, we think she will be a tough matchup for many different teams.

#### Jaia Alexander

Jaia is an old-school point guard that unfortunately is hurt and could be out for the entire season. There is no timetable for her return at this point.

#### **Genesis Parker**

Genesis can impact our offense with her ability to break down defenders and win one-on-one matchups. She always finds a way to get her shot off, especially in traffic around the rim.

#### N'Dea Flye

N'Dea is a perfect fit for the BIG EAST because she can shoot the ball with confidence and attack off the dribble. We love her willingness to defend. She can run all day and really gets out on her assignment to take half the floor away. As a coach you love to see players take pride in shutting down their opponent.

#### Upe Atosu

Upe is a defensive-minded player that is both physical and hard-nosed on the court. The icing on the cake is her ability to shoot the ball when we have it. We think she will continue to grow while at Butler and add more dimensions to her game.

**SOPHOMORE CLASS:** Three student-athletes form the sophomore class for Butler. Jamilyn Robinson, Emilia Sexton, and Ellen Ross are all ready to log more minutes with one year of experience under their belts. Sexton hit 12 of her 17 field goal attempts from behind the arc. She appeared in 22 games for Butler off the bench. Ross played in 25 games and Robinson saw action in 17.

#### **Emilia Sexton**

Emilia gives us the ability to shoot the basketball when she is on the court. We are asking her to give us quality minutes on the defensive end this year. Our staff has worked on some things this summer that will help round out her game.

#### Ellen Ross

Ellen gives our team a physical presence. She is a great rebounder and offensively she can create for us by putting the ball on the floor. We would like to see her drive and pass more as a sophomore in order to utilize her athletic abilities.

#### Jamilyn Robinson

Jamilyn is a terrific athlete. She is trying to get healthy at the moment so she can get back on the court. We love her ability to rise above defenders to score. She can create her own shot in various ways.

**FRESHMEN CLASS:** Two talented freshmen join the program in 2019. Dowell led Morton to three Illinois High School Class 3A State Championships while scoring 1,762 career points. Toure finished her high school career with 2,137 points. She averaged 22.5 points as a senior, leading Kamiakin to a third-place finish at the 3A state tournament. Toure was also named the 3A Girls Player of the Year.

#### **Tenley Dowell**

Tenley was a bright spot for us in Italy. I think those games helped her adjust to the collegiate level of basketball. She will definitely impact our season with her size, length and ability to shoot the ball. She's basketball savvy. Gets the game.

#### **Oumou Toure**

Good things happen for us when Oumou is on the court. She has a nose for the ball and understands the right thing to do in so many situations. When you put yourself in the right position on the court the ball has a tendency to bounce your way. That's where Oumou helps us the most.





Kurt Godlevske was recognized as the BIG EAST Coach of the Year after the completion of the 2018-19 basketball season. The Bulldogs recorded 23 wins and reached the Sweet 16 of the WNIT. 11 of those 23 victories came in conference action, allowing Butler to play in the BIG EAST tournament as the No. 3 seed.

The upcoming 2019-20 campaign will mark Godlevske's sixth season as the head coach at Butler. Coach G has 68 wins as a Bulldog, marking the fourth-most by a coach in program history.

Two BU student-athletes have earned First Team All-BIG EAST accolades under the guidance of Godlevske. The 'Dawgs have also had student-athletes on the All-BIG EAST Second Team and the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team.

Godlevske has won three BIG EAST Tournament games during his tenure. The Bulldogs eliminated Xavier from the post-season tournament in back-to-back years (2016-2017). The last BU tournament win came in 2018 over Providence.

Godlevske has secured two wins over nationally-ranked opponents while at Butler. The 'Dawgs won 76-53 at #21 Villanova on Jan, 2, 2018. A second signature on his coaching resume came on Feb. 22, 2019 when the Bulldogs went to Milwaukee to defeat #11 Marguette 61-57.

In his first season, Godlevske guided the Bulldogs to a 14-16 overall record that included a 10-8 conference record in the BIG EAST. 14 total wins during the 2014-15 season was significant for the coaching staff as it set a new school record for most wins recorded by a first-year head coach in BU women's basketball history. Godlevske was able to motivate his inexperienced group of student-athletes that featured seven newcomers and not a single returning starter.

The 2014-15 team joined elite company by posting a perfect 8-0 record during the month of January. The Bulldogs had not gone undefeated during a full month in the past 17 years. Victories during the winning-streak came against Providence (2x), Creighton, St. John's, Marquette, Villanova, Georgetown, and Xavier.

Godlevske joined Butler as an assistant coach in the spring of 2013. After one full season as an assistant, Godlevske was tagged as the interim head coach, a title that would change on May 6 when A.D. Barry Collier named Godlevske the permanent head coach of the Bulldogs.

Prior to coaching at Butler, Godlevske spent seven years as girls' head coach at Bedford North Lawrence High School. He guided the Lady Stars to a 120-41 record, including a perfect 28-0 mark and the IHSAA Class 4A Girls' Basketball State Championship in 2013.

An all-state high school student-athlete in L'Anse, Mich., Godlevske played basketball at Northern Michigan University, and started his collegiate coaching career at NCAA Division II Lake Superior State University. He returned to the sideline as head coach of his alma mater in L'Anse, leading the school to a 40-9 record in two seasons before taking over at Bedford North Lawrence.

Godlevske earned his degree in physical education and health from Northern Michigan in 1994. He earned a master's degree from University of Indianapolis in 2004 and a principal's license from Oakland City in 2008.

Kurt and his wife Beth are the proud parents of three children, Corrin, Noah and Katie.







John Marcum joined the Butler women's basketball coaching staff in May of 2017. Marcum joins the Bulldogs after coaching stops at Grand Canyon, East Carolina, Indiana State, Cal Baptist and Oklahoma Baptist.

The 2018-19 campaign was one of the best in BU school history with the 'Dawgs posting 23 wins and reaching the Sweet 16 of the WNIT. The Bulldogs started the season 15-1 and became just the fourth team in program history to win nine-straight games in a single-season.

Marcum helped Grand Canyon post a 15-12 overall record. Before assisting the Lopes, he spent three seasons as the Associate Head Coach at East Carolina. The Pirates went 57-39 during that span with the team winning 22 games in each of his first two seasons. Marcum helped East Carolina sign a top 50-recruiting class in 2015, just one year after bringing in the second-best class in the American Conference for the 2014 campaign.

Marcum did more than just recruit during his time at East Carolina. His responsibilities included scouting, game preparation, and scheduling. Multiple players also earned all-conference honors during his time on the ECU sideline.

Additional coaching experience for Marcum includes stops at Indiana State, Cal Baptist and Oklahoma Baptist, his alma mater. He coached for the Sycamores in 2012-13, helping Indiana State reach 18 total wins. That season ended with a trip to the WNIT.

Marcum's first collegiate head coaching job came at Cal Baptist in 2010. He guided the team to a 47-12 record over two seasons. The Lancers claimed their first-ever conference championship during Marcum's tenure and returned to the national tournament for the first time at Cal Baptist since 1982.

Marcum's coaching career started at Oklahoma Baptist University in 2002. He served as an assistant to the men's basketball staff for four years and then transitioned to the women's basketball program from 2007-10.

A collegiate baseball player, Marcum graduated in 1997 with a bachelor's in secondary education with a concentration in history. He earned his master's in secondary education with a concentration in physical education in 2003 from East Central University.

John is the proud father of Abby, Matty and Cooper Marcum.





Kierra McCleary joined the Butler women's basketball coaching staff in June of 2017. A Murfreesboro, Tennessee native, McCleary has previous coaching experience at Northern Illinois, Western Illinois and Lewis. She played college basketball at North Alabama.

The Bulldogs picked up 23 wins during the 2018-19 season with 14 of those victories coming inside Hinkle Fieldhouse. Last year's team was the 11th in program history to win more than 20 games in a single-season.

McCleary helped Northern Illinois find success in 2016-17 by helping the Huskies post a 21-12 overall record. NIU won two games in the Mid-American Conference Tournament to reach the championship and would end the season with a WNIT appearance. The turnaround was significant as Northern Illinois finished the 2015-16 with just 11 wins and 19 losses. The program had hit a rough patch in recent years with their last winning season coming in 2008-09.

While working at NIU, McCleary spent time working with the team's guards which included Third Team All-MAC selection Ally Lehman. Under McCleary's guidance, Lehman became just the fifth player in NIU history to average a double-double in a single-season.

Before coaching at NIU, McCleary spent two seasons at Western Illinois, where she served as the recruiting coordinator for the Leathernecks. In her first season at WIU, the Leathernecks set a new record for points in a single-season (2,392) and for most field goals made in a season (846).

Western Illinois would go on to finish the 2013-14 season with a 14-16 record. They finished fifth in the Summit League, the Leathernecks best league finish since 2007-08. The team surpassed that standard in 2014-15, finishing 17-13 overall and 9-7 in the Summit League to finish third in the regular season standings. Ashley Luke would finish the season as the Summit League's Player of the Year, as well CoSIDA's Academic All-American of the Year.

Prior to her two seasons at Western Illinois, McCleary worked one season at Lewis, helping the Flyers to the best turnaround in Division II during the 2012-13 season. Lewis finished the year 24-6, earning an NCAA Tournament berth, after finishing the 2011-12 season with an 8-20 mark.

As a player, McCleary was a three-time team captain at North Alabama helping the Lions to an NCAA Tournament berth in 2010-11, the program's first appearance since 1994. In her final season, North Alabama finished 21-7 overall and was a perfect 12-0 in the Gulf South Conference. McCleary graduated from UNA in 2011 with a degree in business administration.







Gabe Henry joined the Butler women's basketball coaching staff in September of 2017. Previous coaching experience for Henry includes stops at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley, Odessa College, Central Methodist University, the University of Hawaii, the University of Alaska Anchorage and Gonzaga University.

Henry helped the BU defense lead the BIG EAST in scoring defense, field goal percentage defense, steals and turnovers forced in 2018-19. The 'Dawgs found success through their defensive efforts by winnings 23 games.

Henry was most recently a part of the coaching staff at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley. He joined the women's basketball program as an assistant coach on July 14, 2014. While at UTRGV, Henry served as the recruiting and defensive coordinator.

As recruiting coordinator, Henry was able to bring in top recruiting classes in the Western Athletic Conference for two consecutive years. The Dan Olson Collegiate Girls Basketball Report ranked the UTRGV 2015-16 class as No. 68 in the nation.

Defensively, UTRGV held the opposition to a .370 field goal percentage, the third-lowest in program history. In 2015-16, Henry helped coach a defense that allowed just 61.6 points per game, which was the fifth-best rate in program history.

Prior to UTRGV, Henry was a member of the women's basketball coaching staff at Odessa College for two years. Henry was the recruiting coordinator and helped handle all day-to-day operations of the team. In just two seasons, he coached and recruited nine all-conference players and one All-American student-athlete.

Henry also has coaching experience at Central Methodist University, the University of Hawaii and the University of Alaska Anchorage. He spent three years total with the teams.

Before Henry became a Butler Bulldog, he was once a Gonzaga Bulldog. Henry spent two seasons as the director of basketball operations at Gonzaga. During his time there, he helped lead the team to their first-ever NCAA Tournament win and two West Coast Conference Regular Season Championships.

The Brookfield, Mo. native earned his undergraduate degree from Missouri Valley College, which is also where he began his coaching career as a student assistant. Henry then went on to earn his master's degree in sports and athletic administration from Gonzaga University.

Henry lives in Indianapolis with his wife, Alana, and their two daughters, Avery and Arielle.
