The annual Bay Area rivalry between California and Santa Clara continues Thursday afternoon when the No. 23 Golden Bears host the No. 19 Broncos at Edwards Stadium at 2 p.m.

The Bears bring a perfect home record (5-0-0) into the match against a Broncos team that has not won in Berkeley since the 2012 season. Last year saw the two teams face off twice in the regular season with Cal earning a 2-1 overtime win in Santa Clara and a 1-0 win in Berkeley.

Thursday's game will be broadcast live on the Pac-12 Networks with Jim Watson and Aly Wagner on the call.

BEAR NECESSITIES: CAL'S TOP STORYLINES, STREAKS & TRENDS

ON THE HORIZON

California continues Pac-12 play when Utah comes to Berkeley for a Sunday 11 a.m. match. The game will be a "Pink Game" for the Golden Bears.

LAST TIME OUT

Senior **Samantha Witteman** scored her third game-winner of the season and Cal kept its home unbeaten streak against the Beavers alive with a 1-0 win Sunday at Edwards Stadium. Witteman put in her third goal of the season – all game-winners – off of a rebounded **Arielle Ship** shot to send Cal to its third consecutive win. Ship has now had a hand in all four of California's goals in weekend victories against Oregon State and Oregon.

JUMPING ON THE SHIP

Junior **Arielle Ship** is making a persuasive argument to be Pac-12 Player of the Year in a season that has seen her be named the consensus National Player of the Week after being honored in Week 3 by ESPNW, TopDrawerSoccer and the NSCAA with the distinction, in addition to earning two Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week bids and three TopDrawerSoccer National Team of the Week selections. She is now the 12th Golden Bear to score at least 10 goals in a season.

Entering the weekend, Ship leads the Pac-12 in goals (10) and points (24)

SCOUTING SANTA CLARA

California holds a 19-16-7 series advantage against the Broncos, including an 8-8-1 mark in Berkeley after last season's 1-0 victory at Edwards Stadium. The Broncos are coming off two consecutive double-overtime wins with Mariana Galvan scoring the golden goal in both games.

The Broncos have been a well-balanced team with no player entering the week with more than eight points on the year. Eight different players have scored at least one goal, led by Grace Cutler's four. Megan Crosson leads the team with five assists. In goal, Andi Tostanoski sports a 0.55 goals against average and a .892 save percentage with six shutouts.

The Bears and Broncos have played two common opponents in USF and Arizona. Cal went 1-1 against the two teams with a win against USF while Santa Clara dropped both games. The Broncos have, however, earned a 1-0 win vs Stanford, an upcoming Cal opponent.

BOYD BECOMES ELITE

Sophomore **Emily Boyd** saw her career-best shutout streak of 471:28 end in the conference opener at Colorado, but the sophomore keeper still leads the Pac-12 in goals against average (0.62) and shutouts (7). The goal allowed at Colorado was her first since the first half at Duke on September 6. During the streak, Boyd was named the Pac-12 Goalkeeper of the Week for two consecutive weeks, the first back-to-back winner of a conference award for any team this season.

WITTEMAN'S CLUTCH

Senior **Samantha Witteman** has been the consummate team player for the Golden Bears, filling in at whatever position is needed in the Starting XI. Witteman has earned starts at right back, right mid and as a right winger this season, showing her versatility in being one of the best players on the field regardless of which position she lines up in. Witteman's unselfishness has seen her make big plays for the Bears, most notably her three goals (UC Riverside, Arizona State and Oregon State) that have all been game-winning goals.

DEFENSIVE ROAD BLOCK

The Golden Bear defense has been stellar over the non-conference portion of the season having allowed only 22 total shots on goal in nine total games against No. 19 BYU, Hawaii, (RV / 26) San Diego State, No. 4 North Carolina, No. 18 Duke, St. Mary's, UC Riverside, USF and Cal Poly. The Cougars had three shots on frame - and only one coming from a designated forward - but were able to convert on two of those three chances. The 'Bows finished with two shots on goal, converting on their final attempt in the 85th minute. The Aztecs saw both of their shots on frame come from just one player. North Carolina and Duke were the first two teams to out-shoot the Bears, but Cal still limited them to six and four shots on frame, respectively. Since the Duke game, no non-conference opponent has earned more than three shots on goal, including an overtime game against a Cal Poly team that only managed three in 110 minutes. Only Santa Clara remains as a non-conference opponent on the schedule.

ARIELLE SHIP'S WINNING WEEKEND

Junior **Arielle Ship** had a week to remember after her stellar performance at the Duke Nike Classic that saw her have a hand in all four goals Cal scored in a draw against No. 4 North Carolina and a win at No. 16 Duke. Ship was named the consensus National Player of the Week after being honored by ESPNW, TopDrawerSoccer and the NSCAA, in addition to being the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week.

HROMATKO SCORE FIRST CAREER GOAL

Junior **Lynsey Hromatko** opened her Golden Bear account last week at Colorado with her first career goal, scoring on a corner kick in the 38th minute to put the Bears ahead 1-0.

NILD, WALLEIGH MAKE THE MOST OF OPPORTUNITIES

Freshman **Miranda Nild** scored her first career goal in the 30th minute at USF to lead the Bears to the 2-0 victory. For her effort, Nild - a Bay Area native from Castro Valley who attended Cal games as a youth - earned her first career start in Cal's next game at Cal Poly. Similarly, sophomore **Heather Walleigh** earned her first two career starts in both games and responded with an assist on Nild's goal.

CAL'S UNBEATEN STREAK ENDS AT EIGHT GAMES

It was eight games between Cal's season-opening loss to then-No. 17 BYU and Cal's Pac-12 opening loss at Colorado. The eight-game unbeaten streak matched the 2011 (8 Wins: Aug. 21 to Sept. 23) and 2012 (8 Wins: Sept. 23 to Oct. 21) teams for the longest in **Neil McGuire's** tenure. The longest unbeaten streak in California program history was a 16-game winning streak by the 1987 team that won its first 16 games before falling to North Carolina in the NCAA Semifinals.

ENDING THE OPPOSING STREAKS

California ended a pair of shutout streaks on its way to winning the Duke Nike Classic in handing North Carolina and Duke their first goals against of the season. Neither the Tar Heels nor the Blue Devils had conceded goals this season prior to playing the Bears, a combined scoreless streak of more than 850 minutes that Cal's **Arielle Ship** seemed to make it her personal mission to end, scoring on a composed chip against North Carolina and setting up the opening goal against Duke before adding one of her own.

FITZGERALD FINDS HER FOOTING

Junior **Kelly Fitzgerald** earned her first two career assists in Cal's weekend at the Duke Nike Classic. Fitzgerald assisted on Cal's goal in a 1-1 draw at No. 4 North Carolina before then assisting on Cal's final goal in a 3-1 win at No. 18 Duke.

HIP HIP BOUREILLE

Senior **Celeste Boureille** became the first Golden Bear to be honored by the Pac-12 this season when she was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 1. The honor was the first in Boureille's career and comes after a stellar offensive performance in Cal's home opening win against San Diego State when she netted a brace with goals in the 3rd and 31st minutes. The senior nearly added a third in the 52nd minute with a shot that beat the keeper before being cleared off the line by a defender. She finished the game with four shots on frame from six total attempts.

SHIP'S HAT TRICK

Junior **Arielle Ship** scored the first three goals of the California season with strikes in the 4th, 25th and 52nd minutes against Hawaii to become the 13th Golden Bear to record a hat trick. Her three-goal effort was the 28th overall in Cal history, putting her alongside teammate **Samantha Witteman** as current Bears to achieve the feat.

MEJIA CAMPS WITH MEXICO U-20's

Sophomore defender **Annia Mejia** had a small break from preseason camp after being called up to the Mexico U-20 camp in Mexico City the second week of August. Mejia featured the full 90 minutes in a 2-1 win in a friendly against the U.S. U-18 National Team on Aug. 15, 2015. It's been a busy year for the Bloomington, Calif., native on the international scene after Mejia previously camped with and traveled with the U.S. U-20 National Team at the La Manga Tournament (La Manga, Spain) in March 2015.

MEJIA EARNS PRESEASON PLAUDITS

Sophomore **Annia Mejia** had a Freshman All-American season in 2014, and the defender was rewarded with a multitude of preseason plaudits from TopDrawerSoccer at the start of the season. Mejia cracked the organization's National Top 100 list at No. 49 and also came in at No. 10 on the Pac-12 Top 20 list alongside teammate **Emma Fletcher** who was picked No. 19 on the Pac-12 Top 20 list.

FLETCHER LEADS CANADA AT PAN AMS

Junior transfer **Emma Fletcher** had a summer to remember for country after competing for the Canadian National Team at the 2015 Pan American Games that were held in Toronto. Fletcher's Canadian team finished fourth overall at the tournament after falling to Colombia in the semifinals and Mexico in the bronze medal game. Canada initially escaped the Group Stage with a 1-2-0 record.

CAL HOSTS BEIJING NORMAL IN THRILLING EXHIBITION GAME

Three games in five days did not deter the Golden Bears one bit offensively as Cal and Beijing Normal played to an explosive 6-5 exhibition game at Edwards Stadium.

California jumped out to a 4-1 halftime lead over the visitors from China, but Beijing Normal was able to put together five answered goals in the second half to claim a 6-5 win in a game televised by the Pac-12 Networks. The exhibition game was made possible by the Pac-12 Conference as part of the Pac-12 Globalization Initiative.

Freshman **Miranda Nild** scored twice and nearly notched a hat trick in the friendly against Beijing Normal. Nild, a Castro Valley native who attended Cal games with her family as a Bay Area youth, opened the scoring in the 5th minute and added a second 33rd minute. She had a potential hat trick called offside in the 37th.

"It's a great opportunity for our student-athletes to be exposed to not only a great team but to be able to play against a great university from another part of the world," California head coach **Neil McGuire** said. "The cultural experience at Cal is very real. The people come here for more than just sport. The opportunity today was a good experience for our players."

COACHES TAB BEARS 3RD IN PAC-12

The Pac-12 Coaches have predicted a third-place finish for No. 18 California for the fourth consecutive season. Stanford was selected to finish as champions and garnered eight first-place votes, followed by UCLA with three first-place votes. The Bears and USC were tied for third with 91 total points. Arizona State (5), Colorado (6), Washington (7), Arizona (8), Washington State (9), Utah (10), Oregon (11) and Oregon State (12) fill out the poll.
