## LMU LIONS (13-5-1)



NCAA Tournament action returns to Berkeley this weekend when No. 3-seed California hosts LMU in an NCAA First Round game this Saturday at Edwards Stadium. Kickoff is scheduled for 12 p.m. in Berkeley.

The Bears earned their 12th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and, with a national seed, have earned the right to host an NCAA Tournament match for the second consecutive season.

Tickets for Saturday's match are \$10 for adults and \$5 for seniors, youth (24 months to 12th grade) and students with a valid ID, and can be purchased on CalBears.com now as well as with cash on the day of the match.

## BEAR NECESSITIES: CAL'S TOP STORYLINES, STREAKS & TRENDS

### ON THE HORIZON

The NCAA Second and Third Rounds will be contested next weekend on campus sites. The winner of the Cal-LMU game will face the winner of Minnesota-South Dakota State at a site to be determined.

### GOLDEN BEARS IN THE POSTSEASON

Cal's 2015 postseason run is its 12th consecutive postseason appearance, with the streak dating back to 2004. Cal has advanced to at least the second round of the tournament in eight of the last 12 seasons, failing to advance only in 2013, 2010, 2008 and 2004.

Cal's highest finish in the tourney came in 1987 and 1988, where the Bears tied for third after losing to North Carolina in the semifinals both years.

This is Cal's second consecutive year hosting the NCAA Tournament in Berkeley and eight time overall. Last season saw Cal host San Diego State in a classic game that was won by Cal with an overtime golden goal by Arielle Ship. Berkeley was also a stop on the road to the College Cup five times before that – in 1983, 1984, 1986, 1987, 1988 and 2000.

### PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Junior **Arielle Ship** became the first Golden Bear to be named the Pac-12 Player of the Year after a season that has seen her be named the consensus National Player of the Week after being honored in Week 3 by ESPNW, TopDrawerSoccer and the NSCAA with the distinction, in addition to earning two Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week bids and four TopDrawerSoccer National Team of the Week selections. Ship exploded offensively with 14 goals, 34 points and six game-winning goals – all top marks in the league – as she became the first Golden Bear to lead the league in points and goals since 2001. She also netted two hat tricks on the year.

### SCOUTING LMU

LMU is making its third NCAA Tournament appearance after earning a program-record 13 wins to finish second in the tough West Coast Conference. Head Coach Michelle Myers was named the WCC Coach of the Year while Callie Taylor was the Co-Defender of the Year. Another pair of Lions, Jocelyn Blankeship and Morgan Hilby - earned All-WCC First Team honors.

### FIVE BEARS EARN ALL-PAC-12 HONORS

California junior **Arielle Ship** topped one of the finest regular seasons in the NCAA this year by being named the Pac-12 Player of the Year, the first student-athlete in the storied California women's soccer program to earn the league's top honor. Ship was one of five players to be honored by the league with All-Pac-12 honors and was joined on the first team by senior defender **Samantha Witteman**. Senior **Celeste Boureille** and sophomore **Emily Boyd** were named All-Pac-12 Second Team selections, and junior **Emma Fletcher** was an All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention.

### BOYD BREAKS INTO THE CALIFORNIA RECORD BOOKS

Sophomore **Emily Boyd** earned her 11th shutout of the season against UCLA to match the California single-season record that was initially set in 1996 by **Karen Cook** - a span of 20 seasons! Boyd is also *on pace to become the first Cal goalkeeper to earn a goals against average under 0.60* since **Ashley Sulprizio** sported a final average of 0.47 in 2005. A 90-minute shutout at Stanford will drop Boyd's GAA to 0.51.

### ARIELLE SHIP LOOKS FOR THE TRIPLE CROWN

Junior **Arielle Ship** - a Pac-12 Player of the Year, All-America and MAC Hermann Trophy candidate - holds a large lead in the Pac-12 race for total points (34), total goals (16) and game-winning goals (6). Ship also sits third in the Pac-12 with a total of six assists on the year, two shy of conference leader **Gabi Soian** (8) of Arizona. The Westlake Village native is close to becoming just the fifth player to win the Pac-12 triple crown (regular and postseasons are included) as the leader in goals, assists and points.

**GOLDEN BEAR OFFENSE CLOSSES IN ON A PAC-12 FIRST**

California is currently second the Pac-12 with 101 points on the year, one point shy of Arizona's current league-best of 102 points. Both teams begin NCAA Tournament play this weekend. If the Bears keep pace and move atop the Pac-12 points listing throughout postseason play, it will mark the first time in program history that California would finish the year as the Pac-12's top points scoring team. In the history of the league, only three teams have ever won that title - Stanford (11 times), UCLA (9 times) and USC (2 times).

**MEJIA'S HEROICS**

Sophomore **Annia Mejia** was a Freshman All-American last season as a defender, but she came up big offensively to score the opening goal in an eventual 1-1 draw at No. 3 Stanford. She scored her first career goal in the 77th minute, ending Stanford's shutout streak of 418 minutes that dated back to the first half against Washington State on October 22. Mejia played all 110 minutes in the draw that saw Cal become the only conference team to earn a point against the Cardinal, who went 10-0-1 on the year after the result.

**BOYD BECOMES ELITE**

Sophomore **Emily Boyd** saw her career-best shutout streak of 471:28 end in the conference opener at Colorado, but the sophomore keeper still *leads the Pac-12 in save percentage (.860) and shutouts (11), and is second in goals against average (0.55)*. During the streak, Boyd was named the Pac-12 Goalkeeper of the Week for two consecutive weeks, the first back-to-back winner of a conference award for any team this season.

**HISTORY MADE: CAL KNOCKS OFF UCLA, 7-0, FOR LARGEST CONFERENCE WIN IN CAL HISTORY**

Cal's 7-0 win over UCLA on Oct. 29 matched the 1991 squad's 7-0 win against Oregon State on Sept. 21, 1991 for the biggest conference win in program history. A full rundown of Cal's notes from the game:

- **Emily Boyd** matches the California single-season record with her 11th shutout of the year. Boyd now shares the record with Karen Cook who set the mark in the 1996 season.
- **Emily Boyd** is now a perfect 3-for-3 against penalty kicks after UCLA's Annie Alvarado missed her attempt Thursday. It was the second consecutive game that the opposing team missed a penalty kick against Boyd
- California first win against UCLA since taking a 1-0 overtime victory in Los Angeles on Oct. 24, 2004.
- **Arielle Ship** notched her second hat trick of the season and finished the day with seven points
- **Arielle Ship** is just the fourth Golden Bear to net two hat tricks in the same season - it was also achieved by Alex Morgan in 2010, Laura Schott in 2000 and Joy Biefeld in 1987.
- **Arielle Ship's** 7-point game goes down as the third-best single-game performance in Cal history alongside the 7-point outings from Kaitlyn Fitzpatrick (vs USC, 10/28/11), Laura Schott (vs Arizona, 11/8/02), Joy Biefeld (vs UC Davis, 10/4/89) and Tucka Healy (vs Long Beach State, 9/5/85)
- **Arielle Ship** moves to No. 7 on the California all-time single-season goals list with 14 on the year
- **Arielle Ship** is the first Golden Bear to earn 30 points in a season since Alex Morgan did so in 2010
- **Karly Graf** has now had a hand in the game-winning goal in each of Cal's last two games, scoring the game-winner at Washington State and assisting the game-winner against UCLA
- **Heather Walleigh** earned her first career goal and tallied a four-point game with two assists as well

**WALLEIGH'S WORLD**

Sophomore **Heather Walleigh** had a game to remember in Cal's historic 7-0 win against UCLA. Walleigh scored her first career goal in the match - hitting the decisive 7th tally in the 75th minute - and also added assists on **Arielle Ship's** third goal and **Celeste Boureille's** first of the game for a four-point game. One could unofficially give Walleigh three assists in the game as her cross in the 48th minute was deflected by UCLA Defender **Reema Bzeih** into the back of the net for an own goal.

**QUARTET OF GOLDEN BEARS ON PAC-12 ALL-CENTURY TEAM**

The Pac-12 All-Century Women's Soccer Team has been revealed by the Pac-12 Networks and features a quartet of California Golden Bears on the list of 24 players, highlighted by the selections of **Joy Biefeld Fawcett** and **Lesle Gallimore** to the "Starting XI" as two of the top players in their positions in conference history. They were joined on the All-Century Team by reserve selections **Alex Morgan** and **Mary Harvey**.

**CAL LEADS PAC-12 IN PLAYER OF THE WEEK NODS**

With **Annia Mejia** being named the final Pac-12 Defensive Players of the Week of the season, it marked the ninth Player of the Week nod for the Golden Bears this season - *the most of any program in the Pac-12*. In fact, the next closest any other team comes is seven selections (Stanford) and three selections (Arizona, ASU, UCLA and USC each have three nods). The Bears, Cardinal, Wildcats and Sun Devils are the only schools with one selection in all three categories (Offensive, Defensive, Goalkeeper).

Earning Pac-12 Player of the Week honors this season have been Celeste Boureille (Offensive, Week 2), Arielle Ship (Offensive, Weeks 3 & 8), Sandra Ley (Defensive, Week 3), Emily Boyd (Goalkeeper, Weeks 4 & 5), Samantha Witteman (Offensive, Week 9), Indigo Gibson (Defensive, Week 9) and Annia Mejia (Defensive, Week 12). *Boyd is one of just two players in the conference to earn back-to-back honors this season.*

**WITTEMAN'S CLUTCH**

Senior **Samantha Witteman** has been the consummate team player for the Golden Bears, filling in at whatever position is needed in the Starting XI. Witteman has earned starts at right back, right mid and as a right winger this season, showing her versatility in being one of the best players on the field regardless of which position she lines up in. Witteman's unselfishness has seen her make big plays for the Bears, most notably her four goals (UC Riverside, Arizona State, Oregon State, Santa Clara) that have all been game-winning goals. *Witteman has had a hand in 5 of Cal's 13 game-winning goals, hitting the game-winners in four games and assisting on the game-winner against Utah.*

**SHIP AND MEJIA EARN MIDSEASON PLAUDITS**

Senior **Arielle Ship** and sophomore **Annia Mejia** have earned marquee spots on the TopDrawerSoccer midseason Top 100 list. Ship, in the midst of an All-American campaign for the Bears as a primary striker, was selected No. 27 on the list despite not featuring on the preseason edition. Mejia, who was No. 49 on the preseason list, comes in at No. 45 on the midseason list.

**REACHING 100**

California Head Coach Neil McGuire earned his 100th win at the helm of the Golden Bears program with the 2-0 win over San Diego State, becoming just the second Cal coach to earn 100 wins with the program. McGuire owns a 111-56-22 record at Cal, trailing only Kevin Boyd's 124 wins as the head coach at Cal from 1997-2006 (124-63-20).

**RETURN TO ACTION**

The past weekends have seen a return to action for **Ifeoma Onumonu** and **Lorin Hom**, two Bears that have missed significant time this season and in their careers at Cal due to leg injuries. Hom became injured in Cal's win against UC Riverside (Sept. 11) before making her return one month later against Santa Clara (Oct. 15). Onumonu suffered a muscle injury at USF (Sept. 18) before making her return against Oregon (Oct. 9).

**FITZGERALD FINDS HER FOOTING**

Junior **Kelly Fitzgerald** earned her first two career assists in Cal's weekend at the Duke Nike Classic. Fitzgerald assisted on Cal's goal in a 1-1 draw at No. 4 North Carolina before then assisting on Cal's final goal in a 3-1 win at No. 18 Duke.

**ARIELLE SHIP'S WINNING WEEKEND**

Junior **Arielle Ship** had a week to remember after her stellar performance at the Duke Nike Classic that saw her have a hand in all four goals Cal scored in a draw against No. 4 North Carolina and a win at No. 16 Duke. Ship was named the consensus National Player of the Week after being honored by ESPNW, TopDrawerSoccer and the NSCAA, in addition to being the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week.

**NILD, WALLEIGH MAKE THE MOST OF OPPORTUNITIES**

Freshman **Miranda Nild** scored her first career goal in the 30th minute at USF to lead the Bears to the 2-0 victory. For her effort, Nild - a Bay Area native from Castro Valley who attended Cal games as a youth - earned her first career start in Cal's next game at Cal Poly. Similarly, sophomore **Heather Walleigh** earned her first two career starts in both games and responded with an assist on Nild's goal.

**CAL'S EARLY UNBEATEN STREAK ENDS AT EIGHT GAMES**

It was eight games between Cal's season-opening loss to then-No. 17 BYU and Cal's Pac-12 opening loss at Colorado. The eight-game unbeaten streak matched the 2011 (8 Wins: Aug. 21 to Sept. 23) and 2012 (8 Wins: Sept. 23 to Oct. 21) teams for the longest in **Neil McGuire's** tenure. The longest unbeaten streak in California program history was a 16-game winning streak by the 1987 team that won its first 16 games before falling to North Carolina in the NCAA Semifinals.

**ENDING THE OPPOSING STREAKS**

California ended a pair of shutout streaks on its way to winning the Duke Nike Classic in handing North Carolina and Duke their first goals against of the season. Neither the Tar Heels nor the Blue Devils had conceded goals this season prior to playing the Bears, a combined scoreless streak of more than 850 minutes that Cal's **Arielle Ship** seemed to make it her personal mission to end, scoring on a composed chip against North Carolina and setting up the opening goal against Duke before adding one of her own.

**HIP HIP BOUREILLE**

Senior **Celeste Boureille** became the first Golden Bear to be honored by the Pac-12 this season when she was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 1. The honor was the first in Boureille's career and comes after a stellar offensive performance in Cal's home opening win against San Diego State when she netted a brace with goals in the 3rd and 31st minutes. The senior nearly added a third in the 52nd minute with a shot that beat the keeper before being cleared off the line by a defender. She finished the game with four shots on frame from six total attempts.
