CARDINALS (0-0, 0-0 ACC)



In one of the premiere matchups of opening weekend, two of the nation's elite programs meet when Cal women's basketball faces No. 9 Louisville on Sunday at 11 a.m. PT in the KFC Yum! Center.

The game marks the third contest between the teams in the last four years, with Louisville owning a 2-0 advantage in the series that started in 2012-13, when the Cardinals ousted the Golden Bears from the Final Four in Cal's historic NCAA Tournament run. Similar to the Bears, the Cardinals begin their season without three starters who helped Louisville to a Sweet 16 berth, and debut a crop of talented newcomers.

### A LOOK AT LOUISVILLE

**Series Record:** Louisville leads, 2-0  
**Previous Meeting:** Cal lost, 70-57, on Dec. 21, 2014  
**Louisville's Last Outing:** Sunday's contest with Cal will be Louisville's season opener.

- The Cardinals lost three starters from last year's squad, which went 27-7 and reached the Sweet 16.
- Louisville was picked to finish third in the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- The Cardinals are led by returning All-Americans Mariya Moore and Mysha Hines-Allen.
- Moore led the Cardinals with 13.4 points per game last season on top of 121 assists and 55 steals.
- Hines-Allen shot 55.8 percent, good for 13th nationally, while averaging 11.8 ppg and 4.9 rebounds per game.
- Cortnee Walton is expected to make her return after sitting her junior season out due to injury.
- Louisville's five-member freshman class was ranked the No. 1 recruiting class in the country, and includes top-ranked prospect Asia Durr, a member of the ACC Newcomer Watch List.

### FAST FACTS

- Cal moved to 27-16 all-time in season openers with its win over Austin Peay.
- Lindsay Gottlieb is 4-1 in ALL season openers at Cal, and 2-1 in season openers ON THE ROAD.

When referring to any California athletic team, please use either "California" or "Cal" to denote the institution and "Golden Bears" or "Bears" when indicating the mascot. Refrain from using names such as UC Berkeley, California-Berkeley, Cal-Berkeley, or Cal State Berkeley, or Lady Bears when referring to women's teams.

**LAST TIME OUT**

Courtney Range led the Bears to a season-opening victory with a 23-point night against Austin Peay State. Despite a 34.7 percent shooting night from the Bears, Range scored 13 second-half points as Cal defeated the Lady Governors 67-58 in Clarksville, Tenn. APSU kept it close with the help of Tiasha Gray, who racked up 28 points in the contest, including 17 on the first half to propel the Lady Govs within two points of Cal, 33-31, at halftime. Cal scored a game-best 22 points in the third quarter, including 12 from Range, to widen the gap. An end-of-quarter triple by Gabby Green punctuated Cal's third quarter and sparked the Bears the rest of the way. Four newcomers made their California debut, with Kristine Anigwe (11 points) and Asha Thomas (10 points) leading their freshmen class.

**NEXT UP**

The Bears return to Berkeley to make their Haas Pavilion debut in a two-game homestand starting with the annual School Haas Rock game. Cal will host UC Riverside, as well as a host of schoolchildren, in a contest that includes a pre-game education assembly and academic demonstrations during timeouts. Game time is set for 11:30 a.m.

**FRESHMEN SHOW NO GROWING PAINS IN EXHIBITION**

Cal walked away with a 91-39 victory over NAIA opponent Westmont in an exhibition at Haas Pavilion on Sunday. The Bears jumped out to a 22-8 lead in the first quarter and cruised the rest of the way, shooting 67 percent (35-52) from the floor. Four Cal players finished in double figures, led by freshman Kristine Anigwe's 19. Rookie Asha Thomas added another 18 for the Bears. Cal showcased its versatility as head coach Lindsay Gottlieb mixed and matched her personnel, with all four healthy freshmen making their Haas Pavilion debuts.

**FOURTH-PLACE FINISHERS**

The Golden Bears are predicted to finish fourth in the Pac-12 this season, according to both the preseason Pac-12 Coaches Poll and the Preseason Media Poll.

Both the media and coaches expect Oregon State to defend its regular-season title, garnering 23 first-place votes in the media poll and 11 from coaches.

**BACK FOR THE BEARS**

The Bears return two starters in sophomores Gabby Green and Mikayla Cowling, with Green averaging 6.7 points in 33.2 minutes per game while making all 34 starts last season. Cowling is the leading scorer among all five returners, averaging 10.0 points per game with a .493 shooting percentage in 2014-15. Also returning for the Bears is junior Courtney Range, whose sophomore campaign was hampered due to injury. Range averaged 8.7 points per game in 27 appearances. Veteran Penina Davidson, a sophomore who also saw time in all 34 games as a rookie, and junior KC Waters, who made 16 appearances last season, round out the returning class.

**THE NEWCOMERS**

Cal's 2015 class, ranked eighth in the country by ESPN.com, features five newcomers to the Golden Bear program. The player with the chance to make the most immediate impact is Arizona's Kristine Anigwe, a two-time gold medalist with USA Basketball and McDonald's All-American, ranked No. 8 overall in her class by ESPN HoopGurlz and the No. 1 post player. Anigwe is joined by 6-7 center Chen Yue, No. 51 in the rankings, plus guard Asha Thomas (No. 57, Prospects Nation), wing MaAne' Mosley (No. 81, Prospects Nation) and guard Breanna Cavanaugh (No. 81, ESPN HoopGurlz).

**CAVANAUGH OUT WITH CONCUSSION**

Freshman Breanna Cavanaugh is out indefinitely after suffering a concussion before preseason. Cavanaugh is not enrolled in classes and has not been involved in team activities but is expected to return once she is fully recovered.

**SUCCESS UNDER GOTTLIEB**

The Golden Bears have enjoyed unprecedented success in head coach Lindsay Gottlieb's time at the helm. In her second season, Gottlieb helped Cal to its first Pac-12 Regular-Season Championship (2012-13) and the program's first-ever Elite Eight and Final Four appearances. Under Gottlieb, the Bears have not finished lower than third in the Pac-12 any season of her head coaching tenure. She posted the most wins in a four-year period of any Golden Bear women's basketball coach, and is one of only three coaches in the Pac-12 (Tara VanDerveer, Charli Turner Thorne) to reach 100 wins at their respective institutions. Additionally, Gottlieb has coached four Cal players to six All-America seasons: Brittany Boyd (2015, 2014); Reshanda Gray (2015); Layshia Clarendon (2013, 2012); Gennifer Brandon (2013), with four WNBA Draft selections since 2012-13.

**BLUE & GOLD GO RED, WHITE & BLUE**

Cal has three players on its current roster who have competed internationally for USA Basketball: Kristine Anigwe, Gabby Green and Courtney Range. Anigwe claimed back-to-back gold medals at the 2014 FIBA U17 and 2015 FIBA U19 world championships, on top of a silver medal from the 2015 FIBA 3x3 U18 World Championship. Green competed at both the 2013 FIBA U18 3x3 and FIBA U19 world

championships, claiming gold at both events. Range is also a gold medalist for Team USA in six appearances for the 2015 World University Games squad.

Former Cal players Reshanda Gray, Justine Hartman, Alexis Gray-Lawson, Devanei Hampton, Trisha Stafford, Cynthia Cooke and Karen Smith all represented the U.S. Current head coach Lindsay Gottlieb is a member of the USA Junior National Team Committee, which selects teams for various international competitions.

**HOME SWEET HAAS**

Thanks to a generous \$10 million gift from the Evelyn and Walter A. Haas Jr. Fund, Cal's home arena Haas Pavilion received a slew of improvements prior to the start of the 2015-16 season. The arena's latest upgrades include a new center-hung scoreboard with additional LED display boards throughout the arena, an enhanced sound system, an enlarged, modernized video control room and state-of-the art dynamic lighting system for the arena.

**NO. 1 IN THE CLASSROOM**

Generally considered the top-ranked public university in the world, Cal has held the No. 1 spot among the U.S. News & World Report rankings of public national universities for 17 consecutive years. In its Best Global Universities ratings, U.S. News places Cal third overall behind only Harvard and MIT.

**EYE ON THE NLI'S**

Cal's 2016-17 squad is in solid shape with the addition of two four-star prepsters who inked NLI's at the start of the early signing period. Cal Sparks teammates Jaelyn Brown and Celeste Joi 'CJ' West will join the Bears next season.

Brown (Murrietta, Calif.) is the nation's 10th-ranked wing and No. 54 overall according to ESPN HoopGurlz, averaging a career 16. ppg, 10.5 rpg, 3.4 spg, 2.7 apg and 1.2 bpg entering her senior season at Vista Murrieta High School.

The No. 15 post player in the 2016 class, West (Bakersfield, Calif.) has turned in more than 1,500 points and 1,500 rebounds in three seasons at Garces Memorial High School. As a junior, West put up 18.8 points, 14.3 rebounds, 2.1 bks, 1.8 steals and 1.1 assists per game.

## HEAD COACH LINDSAY GOTTLIEB

Many coaches struggle to find the right balance between success on the court and success in the classroom while empowering student-athletes to enjoy their experiences and letting their individual personalities shine. In four short years as the head coach at California, Lindsay Gottlieb has shown the ability to find the perfect balance in Berkeley by taking the program to unprecedented heights since being hired on April 25, 2011.

Since Gottlieb earned her first head coaching job in 2008-09, only nine coaches have taken their team to an NCAA Final Four appearance, with Gottlieb becoming the eighth coach on that list after leading her 2012-13 California squad to a 32-4 record that included the program's first Pac-12 regular season championship as well as the first Elite Eight and Final Four bids in 40 years of California women's basketball. Doing so in her second season in Berkeley, Gottlieb became just the seventh coach in the country since 1990 to coach her team to the Final Four in her first two seasons at the helm of a program. The Bears have followed the success of the historical 2012-13 season with an NCAA Tournament bid each year since.

Gottlieb's most recent season saw the Bears log another 20-win campaign after finishing at 24-10 overall and 13-5 in Pac-12 play. Cal tied for third in the Pac-12, reached the championship game of the conference tournament and earned a second-round berth in the NCAA Tournament. The season also saw Gottlieb notch her 100th Cal win, becoming the quickest coach in program history to reach the 100-win mark. She joined Tara VanDerveer and Charli Turner Thorne as the only head coaches in the Pac-12 with at least 100 wins at their respective institutions.

Following Cal's 2014-15 NCAA Tournament run, seniors Brittany Boyd and Reshanda Gray became the first Golden Bear duo to be selected in the same year of the WNBA Draft, with Boyd going No. 9 to the New York Liberty and Gray selected by the Minnesota Lynx at No. 16. California has now had at least one player drafted in each of the last three seasons, the only Pac-12 program to hold that distinction.

In her third season in Berkeley, 2013-14, Gottlieb guided Cal to a 22-10 record and third consecutive NCAA Tournament berth after finishing as the conference runner-up. With another 20-win season under her belt, Gottlieb became the winningest Cal women's basketball coach over a three-year period, notching a 79-24 record.

The 2012-13 season was a record-breaking season for the Golden Bears that culminated in Gottlieb being named a finalist for the prestigious Naismith National Coach of the Year award in addition to the media selecting Gottlieb as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year after she led her team to a 17-1 conference record.

Earning praise for her ability to gameplan and make in-game adjustments, 2012-13 also marked the year that Gottlieb became just the fifth coach to win a Pac-12 title in her first two seasons as a head coach in the conference. She is the only active coach in the conference to lead her team to a road victory at Stanford's Maples Pavilion, a feat she accomplished with a 67-55 victory on January 13, 2013 that ended the Cardinal's 81-game conference winning streak and announced California's ascension into the conference and national championship discussions.

Gottlieb's Bears reeled off a program-record 15 consecutive wins to end the regular season and earn a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament. In a run that surpassed the combined NCAA Tournament win total of all previous California head coaches, Gottlieb led her team to victories over Fresno State, South Florida, LSU and Georgia to reach the 2013 Final Four. She holds a career NCAA Tournament record of 7-5 in five appearances – once as the head coach at UC Santa Barbara and four times at California.

Leading teams to success in the postseason isn't her only specialty though. In her four seasons at California, Gottlieb has amassed a 103-34 record – more California-bests by setting new marks for most wins in a two-year, three-year, and four-year period in Berkeley. Already the first coach to win 20 games in her first season with the Bears, her program-record 32 wins in the 2012-13 marked just the 12th time in conference history that a team surpassed the 30-win barrier, going down as the seventh-best single-season win total in Pac-12 history.

Utilizing an up-tempo, attractive brand of basketball, Gottlieb's approach has helped revitalize West Coast women's basketball with guard Layshia Clarendon thriving under Gottlieb's system en route to being selected No. 9 by the Indiana Fever in the 2013 WNBA Draft as the first player based on the West Coast to be selected. Clarendon twice earned All-America honors in two years playing under Gottlieb and was selected as the Pac-12 Scholar Athlete of the Year. In total at California, Gottlieb has coached players to six All-America seasons in four years with Clarendon earning honors in 2012 and 2013, Gennifer Brandon in 2013, Boyd in 2014 and 2015 and Gray in 2015.

In her first season at the helm in Berkeley in 2011-12, Gottlieb took Cal back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2009 with her Bears advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Gottlieb also led the Bears to a second place Pac-12 finish in her inaugural season, just the third time since joining the Pac-10 in its inaugural season (1985-86) that the Bears finished in second place and it was only the second time that Cal has finished with sole possession of second.

## Getting A Start At UCSB

Before returning to Cal where she spent three years as an assistant to Joanne Boyle, Gottlieb spent three seasons as the head coach at the University of California at Santa Barbara from 2008-11. In her three seasons with UCSB, Gottlieb led the Gauchos to two postseason berths and a pair of Big West Conference championships, amassing a 56-39 (.589) record. Previously, she spent two seasons as a Cal assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2007-08.

In 2010-11, Gottlieb guided the Gauchos to their second Big West title in her three seasons at the helm, amassing a 19-12 record (12-4 in the Big West) before falling in the first round of the WNIT to USC. Gottlieb's first team in 2008-09 amassed a 22-10 overall record and a 15-1 mark in the Big West, claiming the conference's regular-season and tournament crowns to earn an NCAA Tournament appearance. As a result, she was named the 2009 Big West Coach of the Year. Gottlieb was the first-ever coach at UCSB to win 20 games in her first season and became one of only seven active coaches nationwide to win 20 games in her first year and also be named Coach of the Year.

Other accolades for Gottlieb include becoming the first coach in UCSB history to win her first 11 conference games and the first coach in school annals to finish her inaugural season with a winning record.

In 2010-11, Gottlieb led the Gauchos to their 18th consecutive winning season and the team won at least 20 games for the 12th time in the past 14 years. The Gauchos led the Big West in both field goal percentage (43.2 percent) and field goal percentage defense (35.4 percent) as well as being tops in the conference in rebounding (40.2 per game).

Under her tutelage, UCSB ranked in the nation's top 10 in field goal percentage defense and the top 20 in points allowed per game while setting a school record in free throw percentage in the 2008-09 season.

Following her time at UCSB, Gottlieb became the ninth head coach for the California Golden Bears women's basketball program by replacing Boyle, who resigned her position to take over the head coaching duties at the University of Virginia.

## First Run In Berkeley

Gottlieb initially joined the Cal staff as an assistant coach in 2005-06, a position she held for two seasons before being elevated to associate head coach in 2007-08. During her time in Berkeley, she worked with all aspects of the program, including recruiting and scouting, and served as the team's academic liaison.

Gottlieb was integral to the development of Cal's post players, including Devanei Hampton, the 2006-07 Pac-10 Player of the Year and a two-time All-Pac-10 selection, and Ashley Walker, an All-American and Cal's first player to be selected in the first round of the WNBA draft.

In Gottlieb's inaugural year as an assistant in Berkeley, Cal posted its first winning record (18-12) in 13 years and received its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1993. In 2006-07, Gottlieb helped Cal



register a 23-9 mark - one win shy of equaling the school's win record at the time - and earn another bid to the NCAA Tournament. Cal's 2007-08 squad made the program's first-ever appearance in the Pac-10 Tournament championship game and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

## East Coast Beginnings

Gottlieb spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Richmond under Boyle before the two came to Cal. The Spiders posted 20-plus wins each year and advanced to the postseason three times. In 2004-05, Richmond finished with a 23-8 record and earned the program's first NCAA Tournament berth in 14 years. The Spiders were invited to the 2003 and 2004 WNIT.

Prior to Gottlieb's stint at Richmond, she served as an assistant coach at New Hampshire in 2001-02 under head coach Sue Johnson.

Before joining the New Hampshire staff, Gottlieb was an assistant coach for two years at Syracuse with Marianna Freeman at the helm. In addition to her coaching duties for the Big East program, Gottlieb was the assistant director of the school's girls' basketball camp. While at Syracuse, she earned her Master's degree in Philosophy of Education.

Gottlieb obtained additional coaching expertise with the Westchester Basketball Association AAU program and Kutsher's Sports Academy.

The Scarsdale, N.Y., native graduated from Brown in 1999 with a Bachelor's of Arts degree in Political Science and was a member of the women's basketball team. Gottlieb was a student assistant coach during the 1998-99 campaign and received the Team Heart and Soul Award in 1999.
