After dispatching Rice, 97-65, before 10,530 fans last Friday, No. 14 Cal remains at Haas Pavilion for two more games this week. Monday, the Golden Bears will host UC Santa Barbara at 7 p.m., while East Carolina visits Friday night with an 8 p.m. start. Both contests will be televised on the Pac-12 Network.

The two match-ups are part of a four-game homestand to begin the year. Cal is 8-2 in non-conference home games under head coach Cuonzo Martin and 49-5 on Pete Newell Court vs. non-Pac-12 opponents since the start of the 2009-10 campaign.

This season, the Bears are led by senior guard Tyrone Wallace, a first-team All-Pac-12 selection last year when he ranked among the top five in the league in scoring, rebounding and assists. He provided a similarly impressive stat line against the Owls with 20 points, six rebounds and a career-best nine assists.

All five of Cal's starters reached double figures vs. Rice, including 14 apiece by freshmen Jaylen Brown and Ivan Rabb. Combined with 13 points from Jordan Mathews and 11 more from Jabari Bird, the Bears' starters accumulated 72 points (29-57 FG, 50.9%), 25 rebounds, 12 assists and just two turnovers.

Bears Cruise in Exhibition Win

The Bears got the 2015-16 season off to a rousing start with a 97-65 victory over Rice before 10,530 fans at Haas Pavilion Friday night. Cal never trailed and led by as many as 35 points in the second half. All five starters scored in double figures, led by Tyrone Wallace's 20 points and nine assists. Freshmen Ivan Rabb and Jaylen Brown both had 14 points their debuts, while Jordan Mathews had 13 and Jabari Bird 11. Cal outrebounded the Owls, 48-30, paced by Rabb's 13, and turned the ball over just seven times. The Bears have now won 10 consecutive season openers and 11 straight home openers.

A Career High in Assists for Wallace

Senior Tyrone Wallace finished Friday's game against Rice with 20 points, six rebounds and a career-high nine assists, surpassing his previous best of eight set at Utah in 2013. In addition, the point total marked the 17th time he has topped 20 points in his career, 12 of which have come since the start of last season.

Notable Debuts for Rabb, Brown

Playing in their first collegiate game against Rice, freshmen Ivan Rabb and Jaylen Brown both made important contributions to the win despite being saddled with foul trou-

ble much of the night. Rabb finished with 14 points (6-8 FG, 2-2 FT), 13 rebounds and a pair of blocks in his 16 minutes of action. Brown, meanwhile, contributed 14 points (5-15 FG, 2-4 3P, 2-2 FT), a rebounds and two assists in 15 minutes. Below are some other notable first-game performances by recent Cal freshmen:

Pouring in the Points

Cal's 97-point output in the season opener against Rice marked the Bears' highest point total in a regulation game since a 98-62 victory over Dartmouth on Dec. 27, 2008. Cal did tally 105 points in a 107-015 triple OT loss to Arizona on Feb. 5, 2011. The Bears have surpassed 90 points in both season openers under Cuonzo Martin after downing Alcorn State, 91-57, last year.

Preseason Top 25

Cal is ranked among the nation's top 25 in both the AP and USA Today preseason polls for the first time since the 2009-10 season when the Bears were 12th in the USA Today and 13th in the Associated Press rankings. The Bears come in at No. 14 in both polls at the start of this year. In addition, Sports Illus-

trated pegs Cal at 13th in its preseason rankings and ESPN has the Bears at No. 12 in its preseason power rankings.

New Look to Haas Pavilion

Thanks to a generous \$10 million gift from the Evelyn and Walter A. Haas Jr. Fund, Haas Pavilion received much needed improvements before the start of the 2015-16 season. The upgrades include a new center-hung scoreboard with additional LED boards around the arena, an enhanced sound system, an enlarged and modernized video control room, and improved lighting for the court.

The Ones to Watch

Four Golden Bears are on preseason positional player of the year watch lists as announced by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. They are:

- Tyrone Wallace - Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award

We're No. 1

Generally considered the top-ranked public school in the world, Cal has held the No. 1 spot among the U.S. News & World Report rankings of public national universities for 17 consecutive years. In it's Best Global Universities ratings, U.S. News places Cal third overall behind only Harvard and MIT.

Wallace Top 5 in 3 Categories

One of the best all-around players in the

country, Tyrone Wallace completed his junior season in 2014-15 as the only player in the Pac-12 to rank among the top five in the conference in scoring (5th, 17.1 ppg), rebounding (4th, 7.1 rpg) and assists (4.0 rpg). All three categories were career highs for the 6-5 guard. He tallied a high of 29 points in a win at Nevada on Dec. 7, 2014, and set a personal best with 15 rebounds vs. Montana four days earlier.

Wallace Movin' Up Scoring List

With 20 points against Rice, Tyrone Wallace raised his career total to 1,216 points, which ranks 24th on Cal's all-time scoring list. He needs 16 more points to pass Jorge Gutierrez for the 23rd spot.

Rooks Return to Active Roster

Kameron Rooks is healthy and ready for action after missing all of last year rehabbing a tear of his left ACL, an injury that occurred prior to the start of the season. The 7-0 sophomore center returned to play in all four games during Cal's summer tour of Australia, contributing 4.3 ppg and 3.0 rpg. His stat line in the opener against Rice read: 2 points, 3 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 block and 1 steal in 12 minutes.

Domingo Makes Initial Cal Appearance

Junior Stephen Domingo, who sat out last year as a transfer from Georgetown, played

- The Gauchos opened the season last Friday at Nebraska-Omaha and emerged with a 60-59 victory. Eric Childress tipped in the game-winner with three seconds left.
- UCSB finished the 2014-15 season with an overall record of 19-14 and a Big West Conference mark of 11-5.
- Michael Bryson, the team's leading scorer last year, did not play vs. UNO and will return vs. Cal after a one-game suspension.

played 24 minutes off the bench against Rice last Friday in his first game as a Golden Bear. He finished with five points and seven rebounds. Domingo, who starred at St. Ignatius Prep in San Francisco, saw limited action over two campaigns with the Hoyas. Now a business administration major at Cal, he averaged 4.3 ppg and 3.8 rpg during Cal's four games in Australia over the summer.

Bears Enjoy Themselves Down Under

Prior to the start of the 2015-16 season, the Bears embarked on a four-game tour of Australia in August where they got a chance to bond as a team, do some sightseeing and win three of four contests over a 12-day trip.

"I thought we got everything we wanted to get out of the trip except four wins," head coach Cuonzo Martin said. "We competed, we played hard, we played together, we defended, we worked hard, we dove on the floor, and we rebounded. Overall, I thought we played as one, and we played with energy and passion."

Five Bears averaged in double figures, led by freshman Jaylen Brown's 17.8 ppg. Jabari Bird contributed 15.8 ppg, with Tyrone Wallace adding 14.8 ppg, Jordan Mathews 13.8 ppg and Ivan Rabb 12.8 ppg.

Freshman Class Earns Top 5 National Rating

Cal's recruiting class that features Ivan Rabb, Jaylen Brown and Roman Davis has been ranked among the best in the country. ESPN.com placed the Bears at No. 5, while Scout.com put Cal at No. 3, and Rivals.com and 247sports.com list the Bears at seventh.

'Real Talk' with the Bears

While the Bears practice, play and train during the season, meetings in Cal's locker room below the court level at Haas Pavilion tackle a different subject far from the view from their fans. One-hour "Real Talk" sessions held each weekend and moderated by director of operations Marco Harris provide opportunities to discuss just about any subject except basketball. Themes and topics can range from dealing with tough times and difficult situations, to morals and family crises. Head coach Cuonzo Martin introduced Real Talks when he was head coach at Missouri State and has carried them with him over the course of his career.

A Promise to His Grandfather

After his junior season ended last March, Tyrone Wallace explored skipping his senior year for a chance at the NBA. But after careful consultations, he elected to remain in school. One of the primary factors was a promise he made to his grandfather, who since passed away, that he would finish his studies and be the first in his family to earn a college degree. Wallace is on track to receive his bachelor's degree in social welfare this spring.

Wallace on Lute Olson Watch List

Senior Tyrone Wallace is one of the 30 student-athletes on the 2015 Lute Olson Award Preseason Watch List. The award is presented annually to the nation's top Division I player who has played at least two seasons. Last year, Wallace was a finalist for the Bob Cousy Award given to the nation's top point guard.

Mathews from 3

Junior Jordan Mathews, who paced the Pac-12 last season when he connected at a 44.3% clip from behind the arc, has established himself as one of the best three-point shooters in school history. His rate from last year ranks 10th all-time at Cal, while his 70 made three-pointers are fourth on the school's single-season list. Career-wise, Mathews is No. 3 in Cal history at 41.8% on three-pointers, trailing only Theo Robertson (44.0%, 2006-10) and Billy Dreher (43.1%, 1991-92). With 114 three-pointers to date in the program (114-of-273), Mathews needs 25 more to reach Cal's top 10.

Tyson Jolly Signs with Bears

Tyson Jolly, a 6-4 guard out of Oklahoma City who is considered one of the top shooting guards in the country, signed a National Letter of Intent to attend the University of California, Berkeley, on Nov. 11. He starred at Putnam City West High School, where he averaged 20.2 points, 9.1 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game as a senior in 2014-15. Named The Oklahoman's Big All-City Player of the Year that season, he is enrolled this year as a post-grad student at the Elev8 Sports Institute in Delray Beach, Florida. Jolly was a consensus top-five prospect in the state of Oklahoma, ranking second by 247Sports.cm and third by ESPN's recruiting service.

Roman Davis to Redshirt

Head coach Cuonzo Martin announced on Nov. 11 that freshman Roman Davis will use the 2015-16 season as a redshirt year.

Cal Returns to Maui in 2017

Cal will make its third all-time appearance in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational when the Golden Bears travel to Hawaii for the 2017 tournament. The field of teams that will join Chaminade at the Lahaina Civic Center also features LSU, Marquette, Michigan, Notre Dame, Virginia Commonwealth and Wichita State. The championship round of the 34th edition of the tournament will be held Nov. 20-22, 2017. Cal most recently played in Maui in the fall of 2013. The Bears defeated Arkansas, in the opening round before falling to No. 7 Syracuse and Dayton. In 1996, Cal played three consecutive top-25 teams and finished third in the field, with a win over No. 25 Iowa, a loss to No. 2 Kansas and a victory against No. 15 Massachusetts.







Boasting a track record of success that includes a conference Coach of the Year honor and postseason berths five of the past six seasons, Cuonzo Martin is regarded as one of the top basketball coaches in the game.

In his first season at California in 2014-15, Martin directed the Golden Bears to 18 wins and a run to the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Under his tutelage, Tyrone Wallace successfully transitioned to the point guard role. Wallace was named a finalist for the Bob Cousy Award recognizing the nation's top point guard in his first season at the position. The point guard finished the season as the only individual in the Pac-12 to place in the top five in the conference in scoring, rebounding and assists. David Kravish completed his career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and one of the program's top scorers and rebounders of all-time.

Martin and his staff signed a consensus national top-10 recruiting classes for the 2015-16 season, including top-five overall prospects in Ivan Rabb and Jaylen Brown and forward Roman Davis of Los Angeles.

Prior to California, Martin served as the head coach at Tennessee for three seasons, guiding the Volunteers to a spot in the Sweet 16 of the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

Martin owns a career record of 142-97, winning nearly 60 percent of his games as a head coach. The mentor has guided his teams to the postseason five of the last six years and has averaged more than 20 victories over seven seasons.

The 43-year-old Martin, a native of East St. Louis, Ill., has served the game of basketball for more than two decades, beginning with a standout four-year playing career at Purdue University. He has played and coached alongside some of the most highly-regarded mentors in the game, including Hall of Fame Coach Gene Keady. Martin is a member of a distinguished group of successful college basketball coaches to serve under Keady, along with Matt Painter (Purdue), Bruce Weber (Illinois and Kansas State), Steve Lavin (UCLA and St. John's) and Kevin Stallings (Vanderbilt).

As head coach at Tennessee in 2013-14, Martin led the Volunteers to the Sweet 16 and a national ranking of 23rd in the final USA Today poll. With a 24-13 final record, Tennessee matched its fourth-best win total in school history and recorded the most victories since the 2009-10 campaign. After earning a berth in the NCAA's First Four, the Martin-led Volunteers captured victories over Iowa, Massachusetts and Mercer to equal the most wins in one NCAA Tournament in program history.

Over his three seasons at Tennessee, Martin posted a 63-41 mark, taking the Vols to the postseason all three years. They finished in the top-five of the powerful SEC in each of Martin's three seasons, including a tie for second in his first campaign after the squad was predicted to place 11th in the conference's preseason poll. UT earned a berth in the National Invitation Tournament his first two years, before garnering an NCAA Tournament selection in 2014. Under Martin's tutelage, forward Jarnell Stokes was a two-time first-team All-SEC selection and was one of just three individuals in the six power conferences this season to average a double-double. Stokes led the SEC and ranked seventh nationally in rebounding at 10.6 rpg., while also averaging 15.1 ppg.

Predicated on tenacity and defense, Martin's 2013-14 Tennessee squad limited opponents to just 61.7 ppg., the lowest in the SEC and second-lowest total at UT since 1969. The Vols ranked 18th nationally in total defense this past year.

Prior to taking over at Tennessee, Martin served as head coach at Missouri State for three years where he built a record of 61-41 with win totals of 24 and 26 his final two seasons. He led the Bears to the CollegeInsider.com Tournament title in 2010. In 2010-11, Martin guided Missouri State to its first-ever regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championship and along the way became the program's first-ever MVC Coach of the Year. He was the 2011 recipient of the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, presented annually to the top minority head coach in Division I men's basketball.

Martin began his coaching career serving as an assist on the staff at West Lafayette High School in Indiana. His first stint as a collegiate coach came at Purdue where he joined the staff for the 2000-01 sea-

son under Keady, his college coach. He remained on staff with current Purdue head coach Matt Painter and was elevated to associate head coach for the 2007-08 season before being hired as head coach at Missouri State the next year. During his eight-year tenure at Purdue, Martin mentored several all-conference standouts, including All-American and current Minnesota Timberwolves forward Robbie Hummel.

Martin also has experience as a coach with USA Basketball, serving on the staff for the USA Junior National Team at the 2011 FISU World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

As a player, Martin was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1995 at Purdue when he averaged 18.4 ppg and sank 91 three-pointers. He graduated in 1995 as one of the program's all-time leaders in three-pointers (179) and one of the Boilermakers' career scoring leaders (1,666). Playing under Keady and alongside All-American Glenn

Robinson, Martin led Purdue to a pair of Big Ten titles and to a 90-37 record over four years. The Boilermakers went to the postseason each season with Martin, reaching the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament as a junior in 1994.

Following his stellar collegiate playing career, Martin was selected by the Atlanta Hawks with the 57th overall pick of the 1995 NBA Draft. He played professionally for four years with the Hawks, Milwaukee Bucks and Vancouver Grizzlies. In 1997, Martin was the leading scorer for Felize Scandone in Italy.

Martin returned to his alma mater where he earned his bachelor's degree in restaurant, hotel, institutional and tourism management from Purdue in 2000. He and his wife, Roberta, have two sons, Joshua and Chase, and a daughter, Addison.
