AZTECS (3-2, 0-0 MWC)



California (#14 AP/#13 USA Today) leaves the confines of Haas Pavilion for the first time this season when the Golden Bears travel to the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational at the Orleans Arena. Cal will first face off with San Diego State Thursday at 9 p.m. before meeting either West Virginia or Richmond on Friday. Both contests will be televised by FOX Sports 1.

The Bears stand at 4-0 for the fourth time in the last five seasons. They've clearly enjoyed their homecourt advantage, outscoring opponents by 21 points per game (85.2-64.2) and boasting a +14.9 rebounding margin. Cal has also held all four of its opponents to 40 percent or lower shooting from the floor, with none of them scoring more than 67 points in a game.

Senior Tyrone Wallace has paced the scoring attack with 20.3 ppg and he just missed his fourth consecutive 20-point game in Monday's win over Sam Houston State when he finished with 18 points in 25 minutes of action. He is shooting an impressive 60.4 percent from the field (29-48) and leads the team with 23 assists while committing only eight turnovers.

Junior Jordan Mathews reached a season-high with 18 points vs. SHSU despite taking only five shots from the field. He benefited from a trio of three points and a 7-for-7 performance from the free throw line.

BEAR BITES: CAL'S TOP STORYLINES, STREAKS & TRENDS

Big Run Fuels 89-63 Win over Bearkats

Cal used a 15-0 run midway through the first half to turn a 23-20 edge into an 18-point advantage and cruised to an 89-63 victory over Sam Houston State Monday night at Haas Pavilion. Jaylen Brown posted his second straight double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds - both career highs - while Jordan Mathews matched him for team scoring honors with 18 points. The Bears shot 51.7 percent from the floor and committed only six turnovers against 18 assists. Cal was also +15 in rebounding, the third time in four games this season the team has had a margin of 15 or more.

Bears Big on the Boards

Through the first four games of the season, Cal is averaging 14.9 more rebounds than its opponents, 44.2 to 29.3 per game. The Bears posted their largest differential vs. East Carolina when they were +19 (45-26), helped by 13 boards from Ivan Rabb and 10 from Jaylen Brown. Cal also opened the year +18 (48-30) against Rice and had a +15 margin vs. Sam Houston State. While the season clearly has a long way to go, a look at the record book shows that the Bears have been at least +4.0 only eight times since 1954-

55, including twice in the last 40 years (+4.3 in 2011-12 and +4.6 in 1992-93). The school record came during the 1959-60 season under Pete Newell when Cal reached the NCAA Championship game with a +11.2 rebounding margin.

Wallace Reaches 20 in First 3 Games

With 20 points vs. Rice, 24 vs. UC Santa Barbara and another 20 vs. East Carolina, senior guard Tyrone Wallace became the first Cal player since Allen Crabbe in 2012-13 to score at least 20 points in the first three games of the year. Crabbe posted 27 against Cal State Bakersfield, 33 vs. Pepperdine and 20 vs. Denver. Including this year's totals, Wallace has 19 career 20-point performances.

Martin 1st Cal Coach to Open 3-0 Twice

When Cal picked up its victory over East Carolina Nov. 20, the Bears improved to 3-0 on the year and in the process made Cuonzo Martin the first coach in school history to begin his career with two consecutive 3-0 starts. Among some of the notable coaches at Cal, Nibs Price, No. 1 on the Bears' all-time wins list, dropped his first game to the Olympic Club in 1924; Pete Newell lost his third game to Pacific in 1954; Lou Campanelli lost his opener at Missouri in 1985; Ben Braun lost his second game to Kansas in 1996; and Mike Montgomery started 3-0 his first season in 2008, but lost his third game in 2009 to Syracuse.

Multiple Blocks for Ivan Rabb

Freshman Ivan Rabb leads the Bears with 12 blocks through Cal's first four games, an average of 3.0 per outing. His high game came against East Carolina Nov. 20 when he redirected five shots, and he came back with

three more vs. Sam Houston State Nov. 23. Rabb has had at least two blocks in each of the Bears' contests this year.

Wallace into Cal's Top 20

With 18 points against Sam Houston State Monday, Tyrone Wallace raised his career total to 1,277 point. The effort moved him past former teammate David Kravish and into the 20th position on Cal's all-time list. He needs 15 more to pass Dave Butler for the 19th spot.

Mathews from Downtown

Junior Jordan Mathews, who paced the Pac-12 last season when he connected at a 44.3% clip from behind the arc, has kept up the pace this season by making 9 of his 19 attempts from beyond the arc (47.4%). He was a perfect 3-for-3 on three-pointers vs. Sam Houston State, which lifted his career rate to 42.1 percent (third highest in school history). Now with 121 career triples, he is closing in on the school's top 10 with only 18 more needed to match Shantay Legans (139, 2000-02).

Notable Debuts for Rabb, Brown

Playing in their first collegiate game against Rice Nov. 13, freshmen Ivan Rabb and Jaylen Brown both made important contributions to the win despite being saddled with foul trouble much of the night. Rabb finished with 14 points (6-8 FG, 2-2 FT), 13 rebounds and a pair of blocks in his 16 minutes of action. Brown, meanwhile, contributed 14 points (5-15 FG, 2-4 3P, 2-2 FT), a rebounds and two

assists in 15 minutes. Below are some other notable first-game performances by recent Cal freshmen:

Preseason Top 25

Cal ranked among the nation's top 25 in both the AP and USA Today preseason polls for the first time since the 2009-10 season when the Bears were 12th in the USA Today and 13th in the Associated Press rankings. The Bears came in at No. 14 in both polls at the start of this year.

New Look to Haas Pavilion

Thanks to a generous \$10 million gift from the Evelyn and Walter A. Haas Jr. Fund, Haas Pavilion received much needed improvements before the start of the 2015-16 season. The upgrades include a new center-hung scoreboard with additional LED boards around the arena, an enhanced sound system, an enlarged and modernized video control room, and improved lighting for the court.

spot among the U.S. News & World Report rankings of public national universities for 17 consecutive years. In it's Best Global Universities ratings, U.S. News places Cal third overall behind only Harvard and MIT.

Wallace Leads Pac-12 in 3 Categories

Tyrone Wallace is the active leader among all Pac-12 players in scoring (1,277), assists (322) and steals (115). One of the best all-around players in the country, Wallace completed his junior season in 2014-15 as the only player in the Pac-12 to rank among the top five in the conference in scoring (5th, 17.1 ppg), rebounding (4th, 7.1 rpg) and assists (4.0 rpg). All three categories were career highs for the 6-5 guard. So far this season, he is contributing a team-high 20.3 ppg along with 5.8 rpg and 5.8 apg.

Wallace Has Hold on Week 1 Honors

Tyrone Wallace earned Pac-12 Player of the Week honors for his 20-point, six-rebound, nine-assist performance against Rice in Cal's season-opener Nov. 13. This marks Wallace's fourth honor overall and the third straight year he has been recognized in week one.

Bears Enjoy Themselves Down Under

Prior to the start of the 2015-16 season, the Bears embarked on a four-game tour of Australia in August where they got a chance to bond as a team, do some sightseeing and win three of four contests over a 12-day trip.

"I thought we got everything we wanted to get out of the trip except four wins," head coach Cuonzo Martin said. "We competed, we played hard, we played together, we defended, we worked hard, we dove on the floor, and we rebounded. Overall, I thought we played as one, and we played with energy and passion."

Five Bears averaged in double figures, led by freshman Jaylen Brown's 17.8 ppg. Jabari Bird contributed 15.8 ppg, with Tyrone Wallace adding 14.8 ppg, Jordan Mathews 13.8 ppg and Ivan Rabb 12.8 ppg.

Freshman Class Earns Top 5 National Rating

Cal's recruiting class that features Ivan Rabb, Jaylen Brown and Roman Davis has been ranked among the best in the country. ESPN.com placed the Bears at No. 5, while Scout.com put Cal at No. 3, and Rivals.com and 247sports.com list the Bears at seventh.

'Real Talk' with the Bears

While the Bears practice, play and train during the season, meetings in Cal's locker room below the court level at Haas Pavilion tackle a different subject far from the view from their fans. One-hour "Real Talk" sessions held each weekend and moderated by director of operations Marco Harris provide opportunities to discuss just about any subject except basketball. Themes and topics can range from dealing with tough times and difficult situations, to morals and family crises. Head coach Cuonzo

Martin introduced Real Talks when he was head coach at Missouri State and has carried them with him over the course of his career.

A Promise to His Grandfather

After his junior season ended last March, Tyrone Wallace explored skipping his senior year for a chance at the NBA. But after careful consultations, he elected to remain in school. One of the primary factors was a promise he made to his grandfather, who since passed away, that he would finish his studies and be the first in his family to earn a college degree. Wallace is on track to receive his bachelor's degree in social welfare this spring.

Tyson Jolly Signs with Bears

Tyson Jolly, a 6-4 guard out of Oklahoma City who is considered one of the top shooting guards in the country, signed a National Letter of Intent to attend the University of California, Berkeley, on Nov. 11. He starred at Putnam City West High School, where he averaged 20.2 points, 9.1 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game as a senior in 2014-15. Named The Oklahoman's Big All-City Player of the Year that season, he is enrolled this year as a post-grad student at the Elev8 Sports Institute in Delray Beach, Florida. Jolly was a consensus top-five prospect in the state of Oklahoma, ranking second by 247Sports.cm and third by ESPN's recruiting service.

Roman Davis to Redshirt

Head coach Cuonzo Martin announced on Nov. 11 that freshman Roman Davis will use the 2015-16 season as a redshirt year.

Cal Returns to Maui in 2017

Cal will make its third all-time appearance in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational when the Golden Bears travel to Hawaii for the 2017 tournament. Cal most recently played in Maui in 2013, when Bears defeated Arkansas before falling to No. 7 Syracuse and Dayton. In 1996, Cal played three consecutive top-25 teams and finished third in the field, with a win over No. 25 Iowa, a loss to No. 2 Kansas and a victory against No. 15 Massachusetts.

Boasting a track record of success that includes a conference Coach of the Year honor and postseason berths five of the past six seasons, Cuonzo Martin is regarded as one of the top basketball coaches in the game.

In his first season at California in 2014-15, Martin directed the Golden Bears to 18 wins and a run to the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Under his tutelage, Tyrone Wallace successfully transitioned to the point guard role. Wallace was named a finalist for the Bob Cousy Award recognizing the nation's top point guard in his first season at the position. The point guard finished the season as the only individual in the Pac-12 to place in the top five in the conference in scoring, rebounding and assists. David Kravish completed his career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and one of the program's top scorers and rebounders of all-time.

Martin and his staff signed a consensus national top-10 recruiting classes for the 2015-16 season, including top-five overall prospects in Ivan Rabb and Jaylen Brown and forward Roman Davis of Los Angeles.

Prior to California, Martin served as the head coach at Tennessee for three seasons, guiding the Volunteers to a spot in the Sweet 16 of the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

Martin owns a career record of 146-97, winning nearly 60 percent of his games as a head coach. The mentor has guided his teams to the postseason five of the last six years and has averaged more than 20 victories over seven seasons.

The 43-year-old Martin, a native of East St. Louis, Ill., has served the game of basketball for more than two decades, beginning with a standout four-year playing career at Purdue University. He has played and coached alongside some of the most highly-regarded mentors in the game, including Hall of Fame Coach Gene Keady. Martin is a member of a distinguished group of successful college basketball coaches to serve under Keady, along with Matt Painter (Purdue), Bruce Weber (Illinois and Kansas State), Steve Lavin (UCLA and St. John's) and Kevin Stallings (Vanderbilt).

As head coach at Tennessee in 2013-14, Martin led the Volunteers to the Sweet 16 and a national ranking of 23rd in the final USA Today poll. With a 24-13 final record, Tennessee matched its fourth-best win total in school history and recorded the most victories since the 2009-10 campaign. After earning a berth in the NCAA's First Four, the Martin-led Volunteers captured victories over Iowa, Massachusetts and Mercer to equal the most wins in one NCAA Tournament in program history.

Over his three seasons at Tennessee, Martin posted a 63-41 mark, taking the Vols to the postseason all three years. They finished in the top-five of the powerful SEC in each of Martin's three seasons, including a tie for second in his first campaign after the squad was predicted to place 11th in the conference's preseason poll. UT earned a berth in the National Invitation Tournament his first two years, before garnering an NCAA Tournament selection in 2014. Under Martin's tutelage, forward Jarnell Stokes was a two-time first-team All-SEC selection and was one of just three individuals in the six power conferences this season to average a double-double. Stokes led the SEC and ranked seventh nationally in rebounding at 10.6 rpg., while also averaging 15.1 ppg.

Predicated on tenacity and defense, Martin's 2013-14 Tennessee squad limited opponents to just 61.7 ppg., the lowest in the SEC and second-lowest total at UT since 1969. The Vols ranked 18th nationally in total defense this past year.

Prior to taking over at Tennessee, Martin served as head coach at Missouri State for three years where he built a record of 61-41 with win totals of 24 and 26 his final two seasons. He led the Bears to the CollegeInsider.com Tournament title in 2010. In 2010-11, Martin guided Missouri State to its first-ever regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championship and along the way became the program's first-ever MVC Coach of the Year. He was the 2011 recipient of the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, presented annually to the top minority head coach in Division I men's basketball.

Martin began his coaching career serving as an assist on the staff at West Lafayette High School in Indiana. His first stint as a collegiate coach came at Purdue where he joined the staff for the 2000-01 sea-

son under Keady, his college coach. He remained on staff with current Purdue head coach Matt Painter and was elevated to associate head coach for the 2007-08 season before being hired as head coach at Missouri State the next year. During his eight-year tenure at Purdue, Martin mentored several all-conference standouts, including All-American and current Minnesota Timberwolves forward Robbie Hummel.

Martin also has experience as a coach with USA Basketball, serving on the staff for the USA Junior National Team at the 2011 FISU World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

As a player, Martin was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1995 at Purdue when he averaged 18.4 ppg and sank 91 three-pointers. He graduated in 1995 as one of the program's all-time leaders in three-pointers (179) and one of the Boilermakers' career scoring leaders (1,666). Playing under Keady and alongside All-American Glenn

Robinson, Martin led Purdue to a pair of Big Ten titles and to a 90-37 record over four years. The Boilermakers went to the postseason each season with Martin, reaching the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament as a junior in 1994.

Following his stellar collegiate playing career, Martin was selected by the Atlanta Hawks with the 57th overall pick of the 1995 NBA Draft. He played professionally for four years with the Hawks, Milwaukee Bucks and Vancouver Grizzlies. In 1997, Martin was the leading scorer for Felize Scandone in Italy.

Martin returned to his alma mater where he earned his bachelor's degree in restaurant, hotel, institutional and tourism management from Purdue in 2000. He and his wife, Roberta, have two sons, Joshua and Chase, and a daughter, Addison.
