SAINT MARY'S GAELS (6-0, 0-0 WCC)



California seeks its fourth consecutive win when the Golden Bears host Saint Mary's Saturday in Haas Pavilion. The game tips off at 12:30 p.m. and can be seen on the Pac-12 Network and heard on KGO 810 AM.

The Golden Bears won their first four games of the season before dropping a pair of contests at the Las Vegas Invitational. Since then, Cal has reeled off three straight victories, including a 78-72 overtime decision at Wyoming and a 74-62 triumph over Incarnate Word in the past week.

A perfect 6-0 at home, the Bears are outscoring the opposition by nearly 20 points per game (80.2 to 61.8) and are outrebounding them by a +15.8 margin in Berkeley. For the season, rebounding has played a key role in the team's success, as Cal owns a +10.3 differential, which is tied for second best in the Pac-12 so far this year.

Freshman Ivan Rabb has been the Bears' top man on the glass, pulling down 8.2 caroms per game. He's also been Cal's most efficient player on the offensive end, having connected on 68.3 percent of his shots and gone 10-of-11 over his past two games. Senior Tyrone Wallace continues to pace the squad in scoring (18.4 ppg), assists (5.4 apg) and steals (1.1 spg).

Brown, Bird Spark Win over Incarnate Word

Jabari Bird poured in a team-high 15 points off the bench and Jaylen Brown scored seven of his 13 points during a big second-half run to lead Cal to a 74-62 win over Incarnate Word Wednesday night. The Bears were tied at the break, then opened the second half on a 15-5 spurt, keyed by two dunks and a three-pointer from Brown. Cal shot 62.5 percent from the floor in the second half (15 of 24). Ivan Rabb posted a double-double with 12 points (5-6 FG) and 11 rebounds, while Tyrone Wallace finished with 14 points, seven rebounds and eight assists. The Bears improved to 6-0 on their home court this season.

Boards Make a Difference for Bears

So far this season, when Cal outrebounds its opponent, it wins - a perfect 7-0. In those games, the Bears are a cumulative +106, which averages to an impressive +15.1 per contest. Cal has had a double-digit differential in six of its victories, including a high of +19 vs. East Carolina, and has been at least +8 every time. In the Bears triumph at Wyoming Dec. 5, they were minus-1 at the half (17-18), then outrebounded the Cowboys by 12 in the second half and overtime (26-14). Overall, Cal owns a +10.3 rebounding

margin, which, if it holds up for the entire season, would be second only to the +11.2 posted by the 1959-60 season that finished as the NCAA runner-up.

Bears Having a Block Party

Led by freshman Ivan Rabb's 16 blocks this season, the Bears have accumulated 40 blocks through nine games, an average of 4.4 per outing. Since the stat began being kept in 1978-79, the Bears have averaged more than 4.0 just five times. In the Dec. 1 win over Seattle, Cal swatted away a season-high 10 shots with Tyrone Wallace and Kameron Rooks getting three apiece. The last time Cal had at least 10 in a game came on Jan. 12, 2013, when the Bears recorded 11 in a 67-54 win over Washington State in Haas Pavilion.

Rabb Playing the Percentages

Freshman forward Ivan Rabb has gotten his college career off to a strong start, averaging 12.4 ppg and a team-high 8.2 rpg through the first nine games of the year. He's reached double figures seven times with a best of 18 vs. San Diego State. Perhaps most impressively, Rabb is shooting 68.3 percent from the floor, having connected on 43 of his 63 attempts. He's 10-for-11 over his past two games (90.9%) and 27-for-37 over his last five outings (73.0%). No Cal player has shot more than 60 percent from the floor for a full

season since Solomon Hughes in 2000-01 (62.9%), while the school freshman record is 64.0% by Tony Gonzalez in 1994-95. Rabb has been at 50 percent or better in all but the UC Santa Barbara game when he was 1-for-3 from the field (he did go 10-for-10 at the FT line).

Brown's Big Night

Freshman Jaylen Brown had his best offensive night as a Golden Bear when he finished with 27 points on 11-of-16 shooting from the floor and 5-of-7 from the free throw line vs. Richmond Nov. 27. It was highest total for a Cal player since Jordan Mathews totaled 31 points vs. Washington on Jan. 2, 2015. Brown is now averaging 15.7 ppg - second on the squad.

Domingo Nominated For Good Works Team

Cal junior guard Stephen Domingo has been named a nominee for the 2016 Allstate National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Good Works Team®. This distinguished award shines a spotlight on a select group of student-athletes who have shown dedication to community service and altruism in their communities. Domingo, a 6-7 wing from San Francisco, has been an active participant in community service activities dating back to his time in high school. Among his areas of involvement with the Bears are visits to the Boys and Girls Club of Oakland and UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Oakland.

Wallace, Brown on Early Season Naismith List

Senior Tyrone Wallace and freshman Jaylen Brown added to their inventory of accolades Dec. 3 when the teammates were named to the 2016 Naismith Trophy Men's College Play-

er of the Year Early Season Watch List. Both Wallace and Brown are also tabbed for the preseason top 50 list for the 2016 John R. Wooden Award. In addition, Wallace is one of 30 student-athletes on the Luke Olson Award Preseason Watch List and on the preseason list for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award (he was a finalist last season). Brown, meanwhile, is among the early candidates for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award.

Wallace Moving Up Scoring List

With 14 points against Incarnate Word Wednesday, Tyrone Wallace raised his career total to 1,362 points, putting him within striking distance of the No. 16 spot in school history. The position is currently held by Jackie Ridgle, who totaled 1,382 points from 1969-71. Wallace has reached double figures in scoring in 23 consecutive games dating back to last year.

Mathews from Downtown

Junior Jordan Mathews, who paced the Pac-12 last season when he connected at a 44.3% clip from behind the arc, is keeping up the pace this season as Cal's top marksman by making 16 of his 46 attempts (34.8%). Now with 128 career triples, he is closing in on the school's top 10 with only 11 more needed to match Shantay Legans (139, 2000-02). Mathews has drained at least one 3-pointer 16 games in a row, including the final seven

- Saint Mary's enters Saturday's game at 6-0, most recently defeating UC Irvine, 70-60, on Dec. 6.
- Sophomore Emmett Near leads the Gaels in scoring with 16.5 ppg. Eight different players are averaging at least 8.0 ppg.
- Randy Bennett is in his 15th season leading the Saint Mary's program and has taken the Gaels to the NCAA Tournament five times and to the NIT on four occasions.
- Saint Mary's was picked to finish fourth in the WCC this year by the league coaches.
- **SERIES RECORD:** According to the Cal record book, the Bears lead the all-time series, 61-16 (1909-10 records incomplete). Saint Mary's won the most recent matchup, 61-52, on Nov. 12, 2004 in Berkeley, and the Gaels have claimed three of the past four meetings. Cal's most recent win was a 94-77 decision on Jan. 2, 1994 in a game played at the Oakland Coliseum.

games of last season. He's also made at least one basket from behind the arc in 30 of his past 31 games.

Preseason Top 25

Cal ranked among the nation's top 25 in both the AP and USA Today preseason polls for the first time since the 2009-10 season when the Bears were 12th in the USA Today and 13th in the Associated Press rankings. The Bears came in at No. 14 in both polls at the start of this year.

New Look to Haas Pavilion

Thanks to a generous \$10 million gift from the Evelyn and Walter A. Haas Jr. Fund, Haas Pavilion received much needed improvements before the start of the 2015-16 season. The upgrades include a new center-hung scoreboard with additional LED boards around the arena, an enhanced sound system, an enlarged and modernized video control room, and improved lighting for the court.

We're No. 1

Generally considered the top-ranked public school in the world, Cal has held the No. 1 spot among the U.S. News & World Report rankings of public national universities for 17 consecutive years. In it's Best Global Universities ratings, U.S. News places Cal third overall behind only Harvard and MIT.

Wallace Leads Pac-12 in 3 Career Categories

Tyrone Wallace is the active leader among all Pac-12 players in scoring (1,362), assists (362) and steals (122). One of the best all-around players in the country, Wallace completed his junior season in 2014-15 as the only player in the Pac-12 to rank among the top five in the conference in scoring (5th, 17.1 ppg), rebounding (4th, 7.1 rpg) and assists (4.0 rpg). All three categories were career highs for the 6-5 guard. So far this season, he is contributing a team-high 18.4 ppg along with 6.1 rpg and 5.4 apg.

Wallace Has Hold on Week 1 Honors

Tyrone Wallace earned Pac-12 Player of the Week honors for his 20-point, six-rebound, nine-assist performance against Rice in Cal's season-opener Nov. 13. This marks Wallace's fourth honor overall and the third straight year he has been recognized in week one.

Bears Enjoy Themselves Down Under

Prior to the start of the 2015-16 season, the Bears embarked on a four-game tour of Australia in August where they got a chance to bond as a team, do some sightseeing and win three of four contests over a 12-day trip.

"I thought we got everything we wanted to get out of the trip except four wins," head coach Cuonzo Martin said. "We competed, we played hard, we played together, we defended, we worked hard, we dove on the floor, and we rebounded. Overall, I thought we played as one, and we played with energy and passion."

Five Bears averaged in double figures, led by freshman Jaylen Brown's 17.8 ppg. Jabari Bird contributed 15.8 ppg, with Tyrone Wallace adding 14.8 ppg, Jordan Mathews 13.8 ppg and Ivan Rabb 12.8 ppg.

Freshman Class Earns Top 5 National Rating

Cal's recruiting class that features Ivan Rabb, Jaylen Brown and Roman Davis has been ranked among the best in the country. ESPN.com placed the Bears at No. 5, while Scout.com put Cal at No. 3, and Rivals.com and 247sports.com list the Bears at seventh.

'Real Talk' with the Bears

While the Bears practice, play and train during the season, meetings in Cal's locker room below the court level at Haas Pavilion tackle a different subject far from the view from their fans. One-hour "Real Talk" sessions held each weekend and moderated by director of operations Marco Harris provide opportunities to discuss just about any subject except basketball. Themes and topics can range from dealing with tough times and difficult situations, to morals and family crises. Head coach Cuonzo Martin introduced Real Talks when he was head coach at Missouri State and has carried them with him over the course of his career.

A Promise to His Grandfather

After his junior season ended last March, Tyrone Wallace explored skipping his senior year for a chance at the NBA. But after careful consultations, he elected to remain in school. One of the primary factors was a promise he made to his grandfather, who since passed away, that he would finish his studies and be the first in his family to earn a college degree. Wallace is on track to receive his bachelor's degree in social welfare this spring.

Tyson Jolly Signs with Bears

Tyson Jolly, a 6-4 guard out of Oklahoma City, signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Cal on Nov. 11. He starred at Putnam City West High School, where he averaged 20.2 points, 9.1 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game as a senior in 2014-15. Named The Oklahoman's Big All-City Player of the Year that season, he is enrolled this year as a post-grad student at the Elev8 Sports Institute in Delray Beach, Florida.

Roman Davis to Redshirt

Head coach Cuonzo Martin announced on Nov. 11 that freshman Roman Davis will use the 2015-16 season as a redshirt year.

Cal Returns to Maui in 2017

Cal will make its third all-time appearance in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational when the Golden Bears travel to Hawaii for the 2017 tournament. Cal most recently played in Maui in 2013. In 1996, Cal played three consecutive top-25 teams and finished third in the field.





Boasting a track record of success that includes a conference Coach of the Year honor and postseason berths five of the past six seasons, Cuonzo Martin is regarded as one of the top basketball coaches in the game.

In his first season at California in 2014-15, Martin directed the Golden Bears to 18 wins and a run to the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Under his tutelage, Tyrone Wallace successfully transitioned to the point guard role. Wallace was named a finalist for the Bob Cousy Award recognizing the nation's top point guard in his first season at the position. The point guard finished the season as the only individual in the Pac-12 to place in the top five in the conference in scoring, rebounding and assists. David Kravish completed his career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and one of the program's top scorers and rebounders of all-time.

Martin and his staff signed a consensus national top-10 recruiting classes for the 2015-16 season, including top-five overall prospects in Ivan Rabb and Jaylen Brown and forward Roman Davis of Los Angeles.

Prior to California, Martin served as the head coach at Tennessee for three seasons, guiding the Volunteers to a spot in the Sweet 16 of the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

Martin owns a career record of 149-99, winning nearly 60 percent of his games as a head coach. The mentor has guided his teams to the postseason five of the last six years and has averaged more than 20 victories over seven seasons.

The 43-year-old Martin, a native of East St. Louis, Ill., has served the game of basketball for more than two decades, beginning with a standout four-year playing career at Purdue University. He has played and coached alongside some of the most highly-regarded mentors in the game, including Hall of Fame Coach Gene Keady. Martin is a member of a distinguished group of successful college basketball coaches to serve under Keady, along with Matt Painter (Purdue), Bruce Weber (Illinois and Kansas State), Steve Lavin (UCLA and St. John's) and Kevin Stallings (Vanderbilt).

As head coach at Tennessee in 2013-14, Martin led the Volunteers to the Sweet 16 and a national ranking of 23rd in the final USA Today poll. With a 24-13 final record, Tennessee matched its fourth-best win total in school history and recorded the most victories since the 2009-10 campaign. After earning a berth in the NCAA's First Four, the Martin-led Volunteers captured victories over Iowa, Massachusetts and Mercer to equal the most wins in one NCAA Tournament in program history.

Over his three seasons at Tennessee, Martin posted a 63-41 mark, taking the Vols to the postseason all three years. They finished in the top-five of the powerful SEC in each of Martin's three seasons, including a tie for second in his first campaign after the squad was predicted to place 11th in the conference's preseason poll. UT earned a berth in the National Invitation Tournament his first two years, before garnering an NCAA Tournament selection in 2014. Under Martin's tutelage, forward Jarnell Stokes was a two-time first-team All-SEC selection and was one of just three individuals in the six power conferences this season to average a double-double. Stokes led the SEC and ranked seventh nationally in rebounding at 10.6 rpg., while also averaging 15.1 ppg.

Predicated on tenacity and defense, Martin's 2013-14 Tennessee squad limited opponents to just 61.7 ppg., the lowest in the SEC and second-lowest total at UT since 1969. The Vols ranked 18th nationally in total defense this past year.

Prior to taking over at Tennessee, Martin served as head coach at Missouri State for three years where he built a record of 61-41 with win totals of 24 and 26 his final two seasons. He led the Bears to the CollegeInsider.com Tournament title in 2010. In 2010-11, Martin guided Missouri State to its first-ever regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championship and along the way became the program's first-ever MVC Coach of the Year. He was the 2011 recipient of the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, presented annually to the top minority head coach in Division I men's basketball.

Martin began his coaching career serving as an assist on the staff at West Lafayette High School in Indiana. His first stint as a collegiate coach came at Purdue where he joined the staff for the 2000-01 sea-

son under Keady, his college coach. He remained on staff with current Purdue head coach Matt Painter and was elevated to associate head coach for the 2007-08 season before being hired as head coach at Missouri State the next year. During his eight-year tenure at Purdue, Martin mentored several all-conference standouts, including All-American and current Minnesota Timberwolves forward Robbie Hummel.

Martin also has experience as a coach with USA Basketball, serving on the staff for the USA Junior National Team at the 2011 FISU World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

As a player, Martin was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1995 at Purdue when he averaged 18.4 ppg and sank 91 three-pointers. He graduated in 1995 as one of the program's all-time leaders in three-pointers (179) and one of the Boilermakers' career scoring leaders (1,666). Playing under Keady and alongside All-American Glenn

Robinson, Martin led Purdue to a pair of Big Ten titles and to a 90-37 record over four years. The Boilermakers went to the postseason each season with Martin, reaching the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament as a junior in 1994.

Following his stellar collegiate playing career, Martin was selected by the Atlanta Hawks with the 57th overall pick of the 1995 NBA Draft. He played professionally for four years with the Hawks, Milwaukee Bucks and Vancouver Grizzlies. In 1997, Martin was the leading scorer for Felize Scandone in Italy.

Martin returned to his alma mater where he earned his bachelor's degree in restaurant, hotel, institutional and tourism management from Purdue in 2000. He and his wife, Roberta, have two sons, Joshua and Chase, and a daughter, Addison.


