Louisiana Tech BULLDOGS (3-2)



Fresh off a win over Southeastern Louisiana on Sunday, another Pelican State foe awaits the Golden Bears this week as Cal men's basketball plays host to Louisiana Tech on Wednesday. Game time is set for 6 p.m. in Haas Pavilion, where the Bears carry a 23-game home winning streak.

Cal got to win No. 23 with a 22-point performance by freshman phenom Charlie Moore along with Ivan Rabb's third consecutive double-double (17 points, 10 rebounds). Kingsley Okoroh (10 points) and Grant Mullins (13 points) also produced double-digit scoring efforts, and Okoroh reached career-high totals for both points and assists (3).

Cal is 20-2 in non-conference home games under head coach Cuonzo Martin and 61-5 on Pete Newell Court vs. non-Pac-12 opponents since the start of the 2009-10 campaign.

Charlie Moore's 20.2 points per game average is the third-highest among the nation's freshmen. He is led only by Markelle Fultz (Washington, 23.0) and Michael Weathers (Miami (OH), 22.5).

Ivan Rabb's double-double streak of three consecutive games is the longest streak of his career. Rabb has a double-double in seven of his last nine games (dating back to 2015-16) and is averaging 16.0 points and 10.3 rebounds.

Cal has made a habit of rushing out to big early leads at home. In three of the first four games in Berkeley this season, the Bears have led by 10+ points in the first few minutes: South Dakota State, 11-2; Wyoming, 11-1; and Southwestern Louisiana, 11-1.

Cal's +13.0 rebound margin ranks as the nation's seventh-largest margin. Utah leads at +20.3

Though Ivan Rabb missed Cal's first two games due to injury, he already has more rebounds than anyone on the Golden Bear squad. Rabb's 31 boards are four more than the next-closest leaders (27 -- Rooks, Moue a Bidias)

Cal's 23-game home-winning streak is tied for the sixth-longest active streak in the nation. The run dates back to March 1, 2015 and trails only the record of 26, set from Dec. 27, 1958 to Dec. 16, 1960.

- Jacobi Boykins and Erik McCree combined for 44 points, including eight three-pointers, in the Bulldogs' 20-point win over UMES.
- McCree leads Louisiana Tech with 14.4 points and 6.6 rebounds per game. He was named to the Conference USA All-Preseason Team.
- Jalen Harris (11.3), Omar Sherman (11.2) and Derric Jean (10.0) are also averaging double-figure scores.
- Daquan Bracey has 23 assists and just two turnovers, a ratio which ranks third among all Division I squads.
- LA Tech is 0-2 in road games this season.

LAST TIME OUT

Cal caged Southeastern Louisiana's Lions, 67-55

- Cal led by as many as 22 points for the second consecutive game.
- Ivan Rabb notched his third consecutive double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds on top of 2 assists, 2 steals and a block.
- Kingsley Okoroh matched career-high point (10) and rebound (9) totals while setting a career-best three assists.
- Charlie Moore paced all scorers with 22 points, his fourth consecutive game in double figures.
- Grant Mullins scored 10+ points for the second time this season, finishing with 13 for the evening.
- The Bears nabbed a season-high nine steals.

KING'S COURT

Kingsley Okoroh is coming off a productive three-game stretch that saw the junior center set career-highs in four categories last week. The Derby, England product started the week off by setting a personal-best rebound total of 9 against San Diego State last Monday, and followed the performance with a career-high 5 rebounds against Wyoming on Friday. He capped off the week by matching both his career-best point (10) and rebound (9) totals and setting a new personal-best mark for assists with 3 against Southeastern Louisiana.

PROWESS IN THE PAINT

With defense as a staple of head coach Cuonzo Martin's program, California is once again emerging as a force in the paint, where the Bears rank among the nation's elite in four different categories. Cal owns a +13.0 rebound margin over its opponents, good for seventh in the nation, while checking in at 13th in defensive rebounds per game (31.0). The Bears are averaging 43.60 total rebounds per game, putting them at 16th in the nation. Cal isn't only dominating the glass, as the Bears are receiving plenty of protection at the rim from their big men to rank 25th overall in blocks per game (5.8). Kingsley Okoroh (2.60 BPG) is 30th in the NCAA for blocked shots per game, and Okoroh is 38th overall for total blocks with 13.

WELCOME TO MY HAAS

With Cal's most recent home win, the Bears have extended their homecourt winning streak to 23 games when including a victory from the final contest of the 2014-15 campaign. The run is the second-longest in school history and tied for the sixth-longest current streak in the country.

The Golden Bears wrap up a four-game homestand on Saturday against Alcorn State. The action is set to begin at 1 p.m. in Haas Pavilion, airing live on the Pac-12 Network.

CHARLIE BUCKETS

Charlie Moore scored 38 points to break Shareef Abdur-Rahim's 20-year-old freshman scoring record en route to Cal's 75-65 overtime victory against UC Irvine. The Cal rookie went 10-20 from the field and an impressive 15-17 at the charity stripe to top Abdur-Rahim's Cal record of 33 points as a freshman, set against Northern Arizona on Nov. 25, 1995. Moore's points were the most by a Cal player since Jerome Randle had 39 at Washington State on Jan. 14, 2010, and the fourth-highest total among all freshmen in Pac-12 history. His 38 points were the fifth-most in NCAA Division I action, and the most by any Pac-12 player through two weeks of the season.

Moore was named Pac-12 Player of the Week in week No. 2 for his effort against UC Irvine, becoming the first freshman to win the award since Arizona's Allonzo Trier on Dec. 14, 2015. Moore is Cal's first frosh to earn conference Player of the Week honors since Leon Powe on Jan. 26, 2004.

RABB'S RETURN

Highly heralded sophomore Ivan Rabb made his return to the Cal lineup for the first time this season against San Diego State, where he came off the bench and logged a team-high 30 minutes of action. Though Rabb had just three points in the first half on a 3-5 performance at the charity stripe, he finished the game only two points shy of his career-high total with 19 points. The AP Preseason All-American logged his 13th collegiate double-double with 11 rebounds on the night while adding two blocks, an assist and a steal. Dating back to 2015-16, Rabb has a double-double in seven of his last nine games, including three consecutive since he returned to the lineup.

NO MOUTE POINT

After averaging just 1.2 points through 67 games in his first three seasons with the Golden Bears, Roger Moute a Bidias is off to a strong start in his final year as a Golden Bear. Through five games this season, he has already matched his single-season high of 3 steals (29 games, 2014-15) and set new single-game career-best totals in points (12), rebounds (7), assists (5) and steals (2). He's tallied 12 points in a game twice this season, first in the home opener vs. South Dakota State and against Wyoming. Moute a Bidias is averaging 6.5 points this season, far above his season-best 1.6 in 2014-15.

RABB ON THE RISE

Sophomore Ivan Rabb stunned the collegiate basketball world when he decided to forego the 2016 NBA Draft, where he was projected as a Top 10 pick, and his pro prospects to return to California for a second season. Instead, he returns in hopes of leading the Bears to their first conference title since 2009-10 and to a deep run in the postseason. He starts off the season as the first Golden Bear since Jason Kidd in 1993-94 to

earn AP preseason All-America honors this year. His 57 All-American votes are the second-most among this year's honorees, and he is the only underclassman this year, and the third underclassman selected to the five-member AP preseason squad in the last three seasons. Among his other honors are:

As a frosh, Rabb earned Pac-12 All-Freshman and second-team All-Pac-12 recognition after posting 12.5 ppg and 8.6 rpg during his rookie season. He also became the first Cal player to shoot better than 60 percent from the floor (61.5%) in 15 years and added a team-high 42 blocks. Rabb's 291 total rebounds broke the school freshman mark set by Ryan Anderson in 2006-07.

BEARS PICKED FOURTH IN PRESEASON POLL

The Golden Bears are expected to finish fourth in the Pac-12 in 2016-17, according to a vote by media who regularly cover the conference. The Bears are expected to finish behind early favorite Oregon, followed by second-place Arizona and third-place UCLA. Colorado, Washington, USC, Utah, Oregon State, Stanford, Arizona State and Washington State follow the Bears, respectively.

CAL LEGEND GIVES BACK

In early November, NBA Champion and 10-time All-Star Jason Kidd announced his commitment to endow the Jason Kidd Scholarship for men's basketball with a seven-figure financial gift to California. As a freshman at Cal in 1992-93, Kidd recorded a school-record 110 steals to lead the nation as he led the Bears to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament, beating LSU and defending champion Duke on his way to being named the National Freshman of the Year. As a sophomore, he posted a single-season school record of 272 assists, and his 204 career steals over those two seasons remain the most in program history. Kidd was the No. 2 overall pick in the NBA Draft of 1994, and in 2004, he was inducted into the Pac-12 Hall of Honor and saw his No. 5 Cal jersey retired at Haas Pavilion.

WEST COAST TRIO SIGNS WITH CAL FOR 2017

California picked up a trio of talented West Coast prospects in the early signing period when Earl Watson Elite teammates Jemarl Baker and Juhwan Harris-Dyson, as well as Utah's Trevin Knell signed their National Letters of Intent to join Cuonzo Martin's program.

- Baker: A four-star guard and No. 66 on the ESPN Top 100 for the class of 2017.
- Harris-Dyson: A four-star guard who averaged 14.7 points and 13.6 rebounds as a junior at Heritage Christian School.
- Knell: A three-star guard from Utah and elite shooter who notched 3.6 triples per game as a junior at Woods Cross High School. He will reclassify

MONTGOMERY JOINS BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME

Mike Montgomery, who directed Cal to postseason appearances in each of his six seasons overseeing the Golden Bear men's basketball program and led the team to the 2010 Pac-10 title, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame on Nov. 18. Montgomery was enshrined at the Arvest Bank Theatre at the Midland in Kansas City, Missouri alongside Mark Aguirre (DePaul), Bob Boozer (Kansas State), Doug Collins (Illinois State), Lionel Simmons (La Salle), Jamaal Wilkes (UCLA) and Dominique Wilkins (Georgia) and coach Hugh Durham (Georgia, Florida State, Jacksonville).

Under Montgomery, who coached the Bears from 2008-09 through 2013-14, Cal enjoyed its winningest six-year stretch in school history with 130 victories. He completed his career as the school's third-winningest coach with a 130-73 record and in 2010, guided the Bears to their first conference regular-season championship in 50 years. He led the Bears to the NCAA Tournament four times and to the National Invitation Tournament twice, becoming the only coach in school history to guide Cal to six consecutive postseason appearances.

CAL LEADS LEAGUE IN FG %, SCORING DEFENSE IN 2015-16

In 2015-16, Cal developed into one of the top defensive teams in the country and **led the Pac-12 in both field goal percentage defense (39.3 percent) and scoring defense (67.0 ppg)**. The Bears last paced the Pac-12 in scoring defense during the 1996-97 campaign (67.8 ppg), while the Cal's most recent time on top of the league in field goal percentage defense was in 2012-13 (39.3%).

Entering the NCAA Tournament, Cal was also **first nationally in 2-point field goal percentage defense** at 40.9 percent, just ahead of Cincinnati and Valparaiso, who were at 40.9 percent. The figure is down from 45.6 percent in 2014-15, which ranked 90th in the country.

Cal's defense was particularly stingy inside Haas Pavilion last year with the Bears surrendering just 62.8 ppg and 37.7 percent shooting from the floor. Cal owned a +10.0 rebounding margin and averaged 6.1 blocks. At 18-0 in 2015-16, Cal set a school record for consecutive home victories in a single season. It was the **best home record against Division I opponents** in the country. Oregon also finished 18-0, but one win came against Division II Western Oregon.

While the Bears practice, play and train during the season, meetings in Cal's locker room below the court level at Haas Pavilion tackle a different subject far from the view from their fans. One-hour "Real Talk" sessions held each week-end and moderated by members of the Cal coaching staff provide opportunities to discuss **just about any subject except basketball**. Themes and topics can range from dealing with tough times and difficult situations, to morals and family crises. Head coach Cuonzo Martin introduced Real Talks when he was head coach at Missouri State and has carried them with him over the course of his career.

THE COMMUNITY'S TEAM

In line with head coach Cuonzo Martin's philosophy of "Building Men," the Golden Bears are encouraged to pursue volunteer opportunities in the Bay Area community. This season alone, Cal's community service events have included: joining Laguna Honda Hospital and Rehabilitation Center in helping its patients **celebrate 150 years of service** and visiting the South Berkeley Senior Center to **serve visitors a pancake breakfast** on a weekday morning.

HEADED TO BEARADISE IN 2017

Cal will make its third all-time appearance in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational when the Golden Bears travel to Hawaii for the 2017 tournament. The field of teams that will join Chaminade at the Lahaina Civic Center also features LSU, Marquette, Michigan, Notre Dame, Virginia Commonwealth and Wichita State. The championship round of the 34th edition of the tournament will be held Nov. 20-22, 2017. Cal most recently played in Maui in the fall of 2013. The Bears defeated Arkansas, in the opening round before falling to No. 7 Syracuse and Dayton. In 1996, Cal played three consecutive top-25 teams and finished third in the field, with a win over No. 25 Iowa, a loss to No. 2 Kansas and a victory against No. 15 Massachusetts.

WE'RE NO. 1

Generally considered the top-ranked public school in the world, Cal has held the **No. 1 spot** among the U.S. News & World Report rankings of public national universities for **18 consecutive years**. In its Best Global Universities ratings, U.S. News places Cal fourth overall behind Harvard, MIT and Stanford.

HEAD COACH CUONZO MARTIN

Boasting a track record of success that includes a conference Coach of the Year honor and postseason berths six of the past seven seasons, Cuonzo Martin is regarded as one of the top basketball coaches in the game.

In his first season at California in 2014-15, Martin directed the Golden Bears to 18 wins and a run to the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Under his tutelage, Tyrone Wallace successfully transitioned to the point guard role. Wallace was named a finalist for the Bob Cousy Award recognizing the nation's top point guard in his first season at the position. The point guard finished the season as the only individual in the Pac-12 to place in the top five in the conference in scoring, rebounding and assists. David Kravish completed his career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and one of the program's top scorers and rebounders of all-time.

Martin and his staff signed a consensus national top-10 recruiting class for the 2015-16 season, including top-five overall prospects in Ivan Rabb and Jaylen Brown along with forward Roman Davis of Los Angeles. The 2015-16 season saw the Bears go a perfect 18-0 at home for the best single-season home record at Haas Pavilion, finishing the year with a 19-game overall home winning streak. Cal's defense was tops in the league, and the Bears limited opponents to a league-low 67.3 points per game while allowing just 39.6 percent of field goals -- the only team in the Pac-12 to limit opponents to under 40 percent.

The Bears capped off 2015-16 with a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the highest seed in program history. Brown was named a USBWA Freshman All-American as well as the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year en route to a No. 3 overall selection by the Boston Celtics in the 2016 NBA Draft. Wallace joined Brown as Martin's second Bear prospect drafted, selected in the second round by the Utah Jazz.

Prior to California, Martin served as the head coach at Tennessee for three seasons, guiding the Volunteers to a spot in the Sweet 16 of the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

Martin owns a career record of 165-108, winning just over 60 percent of his games as a head coach. The mentor has guided his teams to the postseason six of the last seven years and has averaged more than 20 victories over seven seasons.

The 43-year-old Martin, a native of East St. Louis, Ill., has served the game of basketball for more than two decades, beginning with a standout four-year playing career at Purdue University. He has played and coached alongside some of the most highly-regarded mentors in the game, including Hall of Fame Coach Gene Keady. Martin is a member of a distinguished group of successful college basketball coaches to serve under Keady, along with Matt Painter (Purdue), Bruce Weber (Illinois and Kansas State), Steve Lavin (UCLA and St. John's) and Kevin Stallings (Vanderbilt and Pitt).

Volunteerism

As head coach at Tennessee in 2013-14, Martin led the Volunteers to the Sweet 16 and a national ranking of 23rd in the final USA Today poll. With a 24-13 final record, Tennessee matched its fourth-best win total in school history and recorded the most victories since the 2009-10 campaign. After earning a berth in the NCAA's First Four, the Martin-led Volunteers captured victories over Iowa, Massachusetts and Mercer to equal the most wins in one NCAA Tournament in program history.

Over his three seasons at Tennessee, Martin posted a 63-41 mark, taking the Vols to the postseason all three years. They finished in the top-five of the powerful SEC in each of Martin's three seasons, including a tie for second in his first campaign after the squad was predicted to place 11th in the conference's preseason poll. UT earned a berth in the National Invitation Tournament his first two years, before garnering an NCAA Tournament selection in 2014. Under Martin's tutelage, forward Jarnell Stokes was a two-time first-team All-SEC selection and was one of just three individuals in the six power conferences in 2013-14 to average a double-double. Stokes led the SEC and ranked seventh nationally in rebounding at 10.6 rpg., while also averaging 15.1 ppg.

Predicated on tenacity and defense, Martin's 2013-14 Tennessee squad limited opponents to just 61.7 ppg., the lowest in the SEC and second-lowest total at UT since 1969. The Vols ranked 18th nationally in total defense.

The Other Bears

Prior to taking over at Tennessee, Martin served as head coach at Missouri State for three years where he built a record of 61-41 with win totals of 24 and 26 his final two seasons. He led the Bears to the CollegeInsider.com Tournament title in 2010. In 2010-11, Martin guided Missouri State to its first-ever regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championship and along the way became the program's first-ever MVC Coach of the Year. He was the 2011 recipient of the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, presented annually to the top minority head coach in Division I men's basketball.

Midwest Beginnings

Martin began his coaching career serving as an assist on the staff at West Lafayette High School in Indiana. His first stint as a collegiate coach came at Purdue where he joined the staff for the 2000-01 season under Keady, his college coach. He remained on staff with current Purdue head coach Matt Painter and was elevated to associate head coach for the 2007-08 season before being hired as head coach at Missouri State the next year. During his eight-year tenure at Purdue, Martin mentored several all-conference standouts, including All-American and current Minnesota Timberwolves forward Robbie Hummel.

Martin also has experience as a coach with USA Basketball, serving on the staff for the USA Junior National Team at the 2011 FISU World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

As a player, Martin was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1995 at Purdue when he

averaged 18.4 ppg and sank 91 three-pointers. He graduated in 1995 as one of the program's all-time leaders in three-pointers (179) and one of the Boilermakers' career scoring leaders (1,666). Playing under Keady and alongside All-American Glenn Robinson, Martin led Purdue to a pair of Big Ten titles and to a 90-37 record over four years. The Boilermakers went to the postseason each season with Martin, reaching the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament as a junior in 1994.

Following his stellar collegiate playing career, Martin was selected by the Atlanta Hawks with the 57th overall pick of the 1995 NBA Draft.

He played professionally for four years with the Hawks, Milwaukee Bucks and Vancouver Grizzlies. In 1997, Martin was the leading scorer for Felice Scandone in Italy.

Martin returned to his alma mater where he earned his bachelor's degree in restaurant, hotel, institutional and tourism management from Purdue in 2000. He and his wife, Roberta, have two sons, Joshua and Chase, and a daughter, Addison.
