With an AP preseason All-American in Ivan Rabb and a host of battle-tested veterans on its roster, California men's basketball opens its 2016-17 campaign Friday at home against South Dakota State. The Golden Bears are back in action at 7 p.m. in Haas Pavilion.

California returns two bona fide starters in sophomore Rabb (12.5 ppg, 8.6 rpg, 42 blocks) and senior Jabari Bird (10.4 ppg, 3.3 rpg) as well as a strong veteran core. The Bears expect plenty of help in the paint from junior Kingsley Okoroh, who had 17 starts in 31 appearances, and junior Kameron Rooks, who's expected to have a breakout season. Senior Sam Singer, who started nine games at point guard in 2015-16 due to injuries to Tyrone Wallace, returns to help lead the Bears after averaging 19.9 minutes.

FAST FACTS

The Golden Bears limited opponents to just 67.3 points per game in 2015-16 to lead the league in scoring defense. Cal was also tops in field goal defense as the only team allowing under 40 percent of field goals (39.6 percent allowed).

BEAR NECESSITIES: CAL'S TOP STORYLINES

SCOUTING THE JACKRABBITS

Last Meeting: Have Not Met

Series Record: 0-0

- Head coach T.J. Otzelberger is in his first season leading South Dakota State and as a head coach. Otzelberger previously served as an assistant under Washington's Lorenzo Romar and Iowa State's Fred Hoiberg, among others.
- South Dakota State has three NCAA Tournament appearances in the last five seasons.
- The Jackrabbits were picked second in the Summit League preseason poll.
- Mike Daum, who was voted the Summit League's Preseason Player of the Year, led the Jackrabbits with 27 points in their exhibition against South Dakota Mines.
- Reed Tellinghuisen notched a 23-point, 11-rebound double-double on top of four assists and three blocks against SD Mines.

LAST TIME OUT

Cal defeated Cal Baptist, 81-73, in an exhibition game on Nov. 3

- Grant Mullins and Kameron Rooks led the Bears with 16 points apiece.
- Four Bears scored in double figures Mullins, Rooks, Stephen Doming (12) and Jabari Bird (11)
- Rooks led the Bears with eight rebounds.

RABB NAMED AP PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Ivan Rabb became the first Golden Bear since Jason Kidd in 1993-94 to earn AP preseason All-America honors this year, and was also named to the 2016 Lute Olson Award Preseason Watch List. In addition:

- Rabb's 57 All-American votes are the second-most among this year's honorees.
- His 57 votes are the third-most by any player in the last three seasons.
- Rabb and Oregon's Dillon Brooks are the first Pac-12 student-athletes to earn AP preseason honors since UCLA's Darren Collison in 2008-09.
- Rabb is the only underclassman this year, and the third underclassman selected to the five-member AP
 preseason squad in the last three seasons.

RABB RISING

Forward Ivan Rabb stunned the college basketball community with his decision to return to Cal for his sophomore season, despite his projection as a top 10 draft pick in 2016. Instead, Rabb returns to lead a Bear squad looking to clinch their first Pac-12 title since 2009-10. As a frosh, Rabb earned Pac-12 All-Freshman and second-team All-Pac-12 recognition after posting 12.5 ppg and 8.6 rpg during his rookie season. He also became the first Cal player to shoot better than 60 percent from the floor (61.5%) in 15 years and added a team-high 42 blocks. Rabb's 291 total rebounds broke the school freshman mark set by Ryan Anderson in 2006-07.

Rabb opens the season as one of 20 players on the **Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year watch list**, among a host of other accolades, including:

BEARS RECEIVE GIFT FROM CAL LEGEND

In early November, NBA Champion and 10-time All-Star Jason Kidd announced his commitment to endow the Jason Kidd Scholarship for men's basketball with a seven-figure financial gift to California. As a freshman at Cal in 1992-93, Kidd recorded a school-record 110 steals to lead the nation as he led the Bears to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament, beating LSU and defending champion Duke on his way to being named the National Freshman of the Year. As a sophomore, he posted a single-season school record of 272 assists, and his 204 career steals over those two seasons remain the most in program history. Kidd was the No. 2 overall pick in the NBA Draft of 1994, and in 2004, he was inducted into the Pac-12 Hall of Honor and saw his No. 5 Cal jersey retired at Haas Pavilion.

FULL COURT FRIDAY

The 2016-17 Pac-12 men's basketball season tips off live on Pac-12 Networks with Full Court Friday on November 11, featuring live coverage from eight Pac-12 team's home openers across seven networks, all in one night. The national network will move from game to game, providing viewers with portions of live coverage from all nine contests. Mike Yam, Eldridge Recasner and Kevin O'Neill will lead the coverage from Pac-12 Studios in San Francisco. The entire Cal-South Dakota State game will air on Pac-12 Bay Area starting 7 p.m., as the regional networks will be home to full game telecasts of the teams in their respective regions. When each regional network does not have a full live game on, it will switch to the game-to-game coverage.

BEARS PICKED FOURTH IN PRESEASON POLL

The Golden Bears are expected to finish fourth in the Pac-12 in 2016-17, according to a vote by media who regularly cover the conference. The Bears are expected to finish behind early favorite Oregon, followed by second-place Arizona and third-place UCLA. Colorado, Washington, USC, Utah, Oregon State, Stanford, Arizona State and Washington State follow the Bears, respectively.

CAL LEADS LEAGUE IN FG %, SCORING DEFENSE

In 2015-16, Cal developed into one of the top defensive teams in the country and led the Pac-12 in both field goal percentage defense (39.3 percent) and scoring defense (67.0 ppg). The Bears last paced the Pac-12 in scoring defense during the 1996-97 campaign (67.8 ppg), while the Cal's most recent time on top of the league in field goal percentage defense was in 2012-13 (39.3%).

Entering the NCAA Tournament, Cal was also **first nationally in 2-point field goal percentage defense** at 40.9 percent, just ahead of Cincinnati and Valparaiso, who were at 40.9 percent. The figure is down from 45.6 percent in 2014-15, which ranked 90th in the country.

Cal's defense was particularly stingy inside Haas Pavilion last year with the Bears surrendering just 62.8 ppg and 37.7 percent shooting from the floor. Cal owned a +10.0 rebounding margin and averaged 6.1 blocks.

DEFENDING HAAS

At 18-0 in 2015-16, Cal set a school record for consecutive home victories in a single season. It was the **best home record against Division I opponents** in the country. Oregon also finished 18-0, but one win came against Division II Western Oregon.

Cal extended its homecourt winning streak to 19 games when including a victory from the final contest of the 2014-15 campaign. The run is the second-longest in school history and the eighth-longest current streak in the country.

2015-16 IN REVIEW

California's second year in the Cuonzo Martin era in 2015-16 was highlighted by a vastly improved defense and star-studded lineup as the Golden Bears went 23-11 and a perfect 18-0 in Haas Pavilion. The Bears added a third-place conference finish with a 12-6 record in Pac-12 play.

Cal opened the season with a 10-3 record in nonconference action, which included pushing perennial powerhouse and nationally ranked Virginia into an overtime game on the Cavaliers' home court.

After opening conference play with wins against Colorado and Utah at home, the Bears stumbled in road games early in the Pac-12 season. Still, as February rolled around, so did the Bears, who went a perfect 7-0 in the month, including two wins on the road at Washington and Washington State.

After a loss at Arizona to start off March, Cal got back on track with a win at Arizona State to cap off the regular season. The Bears opened the Pac-12 Tournament with a 76-68 win against Oregon State before falling to Utah in overtime in the semifinals.

In mid-March, the Bears earned their highest NCAA Tournament seed in program history with a No. 4 seed. The squad opened the tournament against 13th-seeded Hawaii, falling 77-66 in the first round.

Three Bears earned All-Pac-12 honors, including Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and first team recognition for Jaylen Brown. Both Brown and fellow rookie Ivan Rabb were named to the conference's All-Freshman squad. Additionally, Rabb was a second-team honoree and senior point guard Tyrone Wallace earned honorable mention laurels. Stephen Domingo, Roger Moute a Bidias and Sam Singer earned nods to the Pac-12 All-Academic squad.

In June, both Brown and Wallace were selected in the 2016 NBA Draft. Brown went third overall to the Boston Celtics, while Wallace was selected by the Utah Jazz in the second round.

WE'RE NO. 1

Generally considered the top-ranked public school in the world, Cal has held the **No. 1 spot** among the U.S. News & World Report rankings of public national universities for **18 consecutive years**. In its Best Global Universities ratings, U.S. News places Cal fourth overall behind Harvard, MIT and Stanford.

THE COMMUNITY'S TEAM

In line with head coach Cuonzo Martin's philosophy of "Building Men," the Golden Bears are encouraged to pursue volunteer opportunities in the Bay Area community. This season alone, Cal's community service events have included: joining Laguna Honda Hospital and Rehabilitation Center in helping its patients celebrate 150 years of service and visiting the South Berkeley Senior Center to serve visitors a pancake breakfast on a weekday morning.



HEAD COACH CUONZO MARTIN

Boasting a track record of success that includes a conference Coach of the Year honor and postseason berths six of the past seven seasons, Cuonzo Martin is regarded as one of the top basketball coaches in the game.

In his first season at California in 2014-15, Martin directed the Golden Bears to 18 wins and a run to the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Under his tutelage, Tyrone Wallace successfully transitioned to the point guard role. Wallace was named a finalist for the Bob Cousy Award recognizing the nation's top point guard in his first season at the position. The point guard finished the season as the only individual in the Pac-12 to place in the top five in the conference in scoring, rebounding and assists. David Kravish completed his career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and one of the program's top scorers and rebounders of all-time.

Martin and his staff signed a consensus national top-10 recruiting class for the 2015-16 season, including top-five overall prospects in Ivan Rabb and Jaylen Brown along with forward Roman Davis of Los Angeles. The 2015-16 season saw the Bears go a perfect 18-0 at home for the best single-season home record at Haas Pavilion, finishing the year with a 19-game overall home winning streak. Cal's defense was tops in the league, and the Bears limited opponents to a league-low 67.3 points per game while allowing just 39.6 percent of field goals – the only team in the Pac-12 to limit opponents to under 40 percent.

The Bears capped off 2015-16 with a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the highest seed in program history. Brown was named a USBWA Freshman All-American as well as the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year en route to a No. 3 overall selection by the Boston Celtics in the 2016 NBA Draft. Wallace joined Brown as Martin's second Bear prospect drafted, selected in the second round by the Utah Jazz.

Prior to California, Martin served as the head coach at Tennessee for three seasons, guiding the Volunteers to a spot in the Sweet 16 of the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

Martin owns a career record of 165-108, winning just over 60 percent of his games as a head coach. The mentor has guided his teams to the postseason six of the last seven years and has averaged more than 20 victories over seven seasons.

The 43-year-old Martin, a native of East St. Louis, III., has served the game of basketball for more than two decades, beginning with a standout four-year playing career at Purdue University. He has played and coached alongside some of the most highly-regarded mentors in the game, including Hall of Fame Coach Gene Keady. Martin is a member of a distinguished group of successful college basketball coaches to serve under Keady, along with Matt Painter (Purdue), Bruce Weber (Illinois and Kansas State), Steve Lavin (UCLA and St. John's) and Kevin Stallings (Vanderbilt and Pitt).

Volunteerism

As head coach at Tennessee in 2013-14, Martin led the Volunteers to the Sweet 16 and a national ranking of 23rd in the final USA Today poll. With a 24-13 final record, Tennessee matched its fourth-best win total in school history and recorded the most victories since the 2009-10 campaign. After earning a berth in the NCAA's First Four, the Martin-led Volunteers captured victories over lowa, Massachusetts and Mercer to equal the most wins in one NCAA Tournament in program history.

Over his three seasons at Tennessee, Martin posted a 63-41 mark, taking the Vols to the postseason all three years. They finished in the top-five of the powerful SEC in each of Martin's three seasons, including a tie for second in his first campaign after the squad was predicted to place 11th in the conference's preseason poll. UT earned a berth in the National Invitation Tournament his first two years, before garnering an NCAA Tournament selection in 2014. Under Martin's tutelage, forward Jarnell Stokes was a two-time first-team All-SEC selection and was one of just three individuals in the six power conferences in 2013-14 to average a double-double. Stokes led the SEC and ranked seventh nationally in rebounding at 10.6 rpg., while also averaging 15.1 ppg.

Predicated on tenacity and defense, Martin's 2013-14 Tennessee squad limited opponents to just 61.7 ppg., the lowest in the SEC and second-lowest total at UT since 1969. The Vols ranked 18th nationally in total defense.



The Other Bears

Prior to taking over at Tennessee, Martin served as head coach at Missouri State for three years where he built a record of 61-41 with win totals of 24 and 26 his final two seasons. He led the Bears to the CollegeInsider.com Tournament title in 2010. In 2010-11, Martin guided Missouri State to its first-ever regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championship and along the way became the program's first-ever MVC Coach of the Year. He was the 2011 recipient of the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, presented annually to the top minority head coach in Division I men's basketball.

Midwest Beginnings

Martin began his coaching career serving as an assist on the staff at West Lafayette High School in Indiana. His first stint as a collegiate coach came at Purdue where he joined the staff for the 2000-01 season under Keady, his college coach. He remained on staff with current Purdue head coach Matt Painter and was elevated to associate head coach for the 2007-08 season before being hired as head coach at Missouri State the next year. During his eight-year tenure at Purdue, Martin mentored several all-conference standouts, including All-American and current Minnesota Timberwolves forward Robbie Hummel.

Martin also has experience as a coach with USA Basketball, serving on the staff for the USA Junior National Team at the 2011 FISU World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

As a player, Martin was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1995 at Purdue when he averaged 18.4 ppg and sank 91 three-pointers. He graduated in 1995 as one of the program's all-time leaders in three-pointers (179) and one of the Boilermakers' career scoring leaders (1,666). Playing under Keady and alongside All-American Glenn Robinson, Martin led Purdue to a pair of Big Ten titles and to a 90-37 record over four years. The Boilermakers went to the postseason each season with Martin, reaching the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament as a junior in 1994.

Following his stellar collegiate playing career, Martin was selected by the Atlanta Hawks with the 57th overall pick of the 1995 NBA Draft. He played professionally for four years with the Hawks, Milwaukee Bucks and Vancouver Grizzlies. In 1997, Martin was the leading scorer for Felize Scandone in Italy.

Martin returned to his alma mater where he earned his bachelor's degree in restaurant, hotel, institutional and tourism management from Purdue in 2000. He and his wife, Roberta, have two sons, Joshua and Chase, and a daughter, Addison.
