OPENING TIP

A one-week hiatus, due to finals, will end for UC Davis when it makes the brief drive down I-80 to Berkeley to face the California Golden Bears, in a nationally televised matchup carried by the Pac-12 Networks.

Ted Robinson and former Cal head coach Ben Braun will call the action courtside at Haas Pavilion starting at 7:30 p.m. Subscribers to the Pac-12 Networks can watch this broadcast, or access an online stream by visiting the Networks' homepage and signing in with their respective cable/satellite information.

Even though Haas Pavilion and the Pavilion are separated by only 63 miles (on the same freeway, no less), Saturday's all-UC contest, the first during the Jim Les era, will mark the first meeting since Dec. 1, 2010. When the Aggies face the Bears Saturday evening, they will look to snap two current streaks: Cal has won all 31 previously played head-to-head games and will enter its game against UC Davis with victories in its last 25 consecutive home games — a streak that stretches back to the final game of the 2014-15 season (March 1, 2016).

With both teams suffering narrow losses in their last game — UC Davis fell to Idaho on a buzzer-beater on Jan. 3 while two Seton Hall free throws clinched a three-point victory over Cal on Wednesday in the team's final game at the Pearl Harbor Invitational.

Saturday's game is the sixth of seven straight games for the Aggies taking place outside of Davis, a string that will end on Wednesday when they head to North Dakota State. When UC Davis returns, it will host its second home game in a month when William Jessup visits the Pavilion.

When Cal hosts the Aggies, it will compete in its seventh home game of the year. Compared to UC Davis' road slate, the Bears have not competed in a true road game this season, and participated in three neutral-site events.

- #0 Brynton LEMAR:** Leads all Aggies in scoring at 12.9 points per game — the 8th-highest average among all league players entering this week's action
- #1 Lawrence WHITE:** Finished with a game-high seven rebounds, one shy of a career high, and set a new career mark by earning four assists at Idaho
- #2 Darius GRAHAM:** Ranked No. 4 in three-point pct. (.484), No. 8 in assists (3.4) and tied for No. 12 in field goal pct. (.500) among all Big West players
- #4 Arell HENNINGS:** Scored his first points as an Aggie, a three, in his inaugural home game at UC Davis (11/17 vs. Holy Names).
- #5 Siler SCHNEIDER:** His 18 points at Idaho is the sixth double-figure total posted this season — a team-high figure also matched by Brynton Lemar and Chima Moneke
- #11 Chima MONEKE:** Leads the league in rebounding (8.3 rpg), and ranked No. 9 in scoring (12.6 ppg); also ranked No. 2 in blocks (1.4 bpg)
- #12 Georgi FUNTAROV:** Came off the bench and played 14 minutes at Idaho, a season-high against Div. I opposition
- #13 J.T. ADENRELE:** Grabbed a season-high seven rebounds vs. Oakland (11/26) in the Aggies' final game at the GCI Great Alaska Shootout
- #22 Joe MOONEY:** Shot a perfect 4-for-4 overall, 2-for-2 from three and 2-for-2 at the stripe vs. Weber State (11/24)
- #23 Rogers PRINTUP:** Competed in 22 games as a freshman; all eight field goals made were from three
- #24 Mikey HENN:** Averaging 19.3 minutes per game, shooting .521 overall and .467 from three

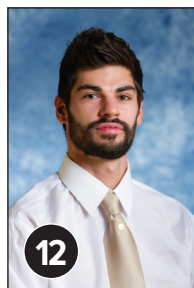

RECORD ROAD TRIP CONTINUES

- UC Davis' game at Cal is the sixth of a seven-game road swing
- This is the longest trip in the program's Division I era
- Previous record of five games took place throughout the 2011-12 season, and included stops at Hawai'i, UCLA, San José State, Southern Utah and Cal State Fullerton

WITHOUT UC DAVIS, THE BIG WEST HAS NOTHING

- Of the 18 neutral games played this season, the Big West Conference is a combined 3-15
- UC Davis is responsible for all three of those victories, collecting two at the Cable Car Classic and another at the GCI Great Alaska Shootout

ALLOW ME TO INTRODUCE MYSELF

- For the second week in a row, junior forward Chima Moneke is the top rebounder in the Big West Conference, leading all players with his 8.3 per game
- He also leads the league with 56 defensive and 75 total boards
- Ranked No. 2 in blocks per game (1.4) and No. 3 in offensive rebounds (18) among all BWC players, Moneke is also ranked No. 6 in field goals made (44), No. 8 in field goal percentage (.537) and No. 9 in free throws made (25) entering this week's schedule
- Three of the top nine single-game rebound totals posted by a BWC player this season also belong to the Canberra native: 14 rebounds performance vs. Tennessee State (his first game as an Aggie) — the second-highest total this season by a conference player — 13 rebounds vs. Sacramento State and 12 rebounds vs. Oakland

UC DAVIS KNOWS HOW TO SHARE

- Entering this week's schedule, the Aggies led all Big West teams in assists at 15.8 per game
- Three Aggies hold top-15 figures: senior guard Darius Graham is No. 8 (3.4 apg), sophomore guard Siler Schneider is tied for No. 9 (3.0) and senior guard Brynton Lemar is No. 11 (2.9)

EFFICIENCY AT ITS FINEST

- Two Aggies hold top-12 Big West individual field goal percentages
- Junior forward Chima Moneke sits eighth with a .537 figure
- Senior guard Darius Graham is tied for No. 12 and is shooting .500 overall

LEMAR NAMED BIG WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- A week that started with a career-high performance against UC Davis' Causeway rivals ended with Big West weekly honors for Brynton Lemar when conference officials announced its Player of the Week selection on Nov. 28
- For the week, Lemar hit 7 of 13 attempts from three (.538), connected on 13 of 15 shots from the stripe (.867), tallied 12 rebounds, 15 assists and three steals
- This is the first time Lemar received Big West Men's Basketball Player of the Week accolades as an Aggie

MONEKE EARNS ALL-GREAT ALASKA SHOOTOUT HONORS

- Junior forward Chima Moneke made the GCI Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament Team by averaging 13.7 points and 9.3 rebounds over the three games.
- He concluded the tournament with his second double-double of the season, 21 points and 12 rebounds versus Oakland

ADENRELE IS A LEADER ON THE COURT FOR THE AGGIES AND THE BIG WEST

- **NOTE: All stats and rankings provided by the Big West Conference through games played on Dec. 5.**
- Among all active Big West Players, senior forward J.T. Adenrele holds top 10 career totals in four different categories
- The senior forward is ranked No. 1 in blocked shots (89), a total that is also a UC Davis Division I-era record
- Adenrele also leads the league in career rebounds; there is a 100-plus cushion between his total (429) and the second-ranked player (311)
- The Roseville native is ranked No. 4 in scoring with 794 points
- Adenrele's quick hands are responsible for 54 steals, the seventh-highest total in the BWC

LEMAR IS ALL OVER THE LEAGUE'S TOP 10

- Senior guard Brynton Lemar's name also occupies spots on numerous active Big West career lists
- The San Diego native's 705 points rank him No. 6, right behind teammate Darius Graham
- Lemar is not afraid to crash the glass since he has 217 rebounds to his credit, the ninth-highest total
- As one of the top guards in the league, it should surprise no one that he is also ranked No. 8, among all active conference players, in career assists (145)
- Lemar is for No. 11 in steals (48)

GRAHAM IS AN AGGIE CHART CLIMBER AS WELL

- Senior guard Darius Graham completes a trio of Aggies who have successfully competed at a high level throughout their entire career since he is one of the conference's top 10 players in four career categories
- The Sacramento native enters his final season at UC Davis within striking distance of the No. 1 spot in career assists; he is ranked No. 2 with 336, 25 dimes behind the league's active leader
- Graham is No. 5 in scoring with 742 points, and No. 5 in steals with 60
- The senior Aggie is not afraid to mix it up with the trees since his total of 227 rebounds ranks him No. 8 in this category

HISTORIC WEEK BEGAN AT THE GOLDEN 1 CENTER...

- Inaugural college basketball game at the Sacramento Kings' new downtown, state-of-the-art arena featured UC Davis and Sacramento State
- This is the first of four annual games that will take place at the Golden 1 Center
- Senior guard Darius Graham made the first basket in a college game hosted by the Golden 1 Center when he drained a three from the near corner, in front of the Hornets' bench, shortly after tipoff
- Graham's buzzer-beating bank shot, which took place just before halftime, gave the Aggies the lead for good
- Led by Brynton Lemar's 23 points, five Aggies scored double figures: Chima Moneke (15), Mikey Henn (13), J.T. Adenrele and Graham (10)
- Graham, a senior guard, and Adenrele, a senior forward, competed in front of a hometown crowd; the former grew up in Sacramento, the latter hails from nearby Roseville
- The largest crowd for a Causeway Cup game — combined attendance was 10,104 for this matchup and the one that followed between San Diego State and Cal — was recorded that night
- Last neutral-site Causeway Cup game took place on Dec. 15, 1989, at Arco Arena as part of the Campbell's Soup Capital City Classic
- Golden 1 Center will also host first and second round matchups of the 2017 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament in March

...AND CONTINUED THREE DAYS LATER AT THE GREAT ALASKA SHOOTOUT

- Three days after competing in the first-ever college basketball game in the Golden 1 Center's history, UC Davis returned to action in its opening game at the GCI Great Alaska Shootout
- This is the first time that UC Davis competed in the longest-running regular-season college basketball tournament in the country
- When UC Davis defeated Drake, senior guard Brynton Lemar was named GCI Player of the Game by scoring 17 points, on 6 of 14 shooting overall and 3 of 5 from three
- Throughout its three games, Aggie opponents averaged a tournament-low 30.0 rebounds per game

- Chima Moneke led all players with his rebound average (9.3/gm)

MONEKE WAS DOUBLE-DOUBLE THE TROUBLE FOR THE HORNETS

- Junior forward posted UC Davis' first double-double of the season when he finished with 15 points and 13 rebounds vs. Sacramento State
- This is the second time within the Aggies' first five games that he collected 13 or more rebounds in a game; in his UC Davis debut vs. Tennessee State (11/11), he collected 14

IT'S THE HORNETS WHO WERE STUNG BY LEMAR

- Brynton Lemar set a new career high when he posted 23 points against Sacramento State
- This topped his previous career high of 21 points, set on Nov. 24, 2015 at... Sacramento State
- At one point of this year's rivalry contest, the San Diego native scored 14 of his team's points in a row midway through the second half

NOT JUST GOODE, HE WAS GREAT

- In UC Davis' home opener vs. Holy Names, sophomore forward Garrison Goode shot 4 of 6 overall, and hit 1 of 2 at the free throw line to tie a career high in scoring (9 pts.), which was originally set the previous game
- Goode's 12 rebounds, collected vs. Holy Names, is another career-high that was four more than his previous career best
- By making all three shots from the field, and 3 of 4 attempts at the stripe, Garrison Goode set a new career high with nine points vs. Northern Arizona (11/13).

STRONG START TO THE SEASON FOR SCHNEIDER

- Led by Siler Schneider's clutch play, UC Davis was the only Big West team to record two wins against Division I teams during the opening weekend of the season
- The sophomore guard led all players with 22 points in the Aggies' season opener vs. Tennessee State (11/11), averaged 14.3 ppg, shot 50% (8-16) from three — both are team-high figures — and 45% (14-31) overall for the weekend

MAKING THE MOST OF A FIRST IMPRESSION

- In his first career game as an Aggie, Moneke grabbed 14 rebounds, the eighth-highest single-game rebound total, vs. Tennessee State (11/11)
- This is the highest rebound total recorded by a UC Davis player in his debut game (Div. I era)
- Two days later, freshman forward Mikey Henn recorded 11 points on 5 of 8 shooting vs. Northern Arizona
- Henn has posted double-digit scoring figures in two of his first four games played as an Aggie

THIS PARTICULAR FIRST WAS WORTH THE WAIT

- A 30-year hiatus ended on Nov. 12 when UC Davis faced Santa Clara; their last head-to-head meeting took place on Dec. 6, 1986

THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE THE PAVILION

- Since joining the Big West Conference in 2007, UC Davis has won 7 of 10 home openers as a Division I program
- By winning its first home game of '16-17 vs. Holy Names (11/17), UC Davis has won six of its seven last home openers

HOME IS WHERE YOUR RUMP RESTS

- A road-heavy non-conference schedule comprises a sizable portion of the Aggies' travel this season
- The team will travel a collective 23,732 miles from Davis, to their respective opponents
- When travel to and from the Big West Tournament is included, that total bumps up to 24,582 miles.
- Of that overall total, 15,380 miles will take place throughout UC Davis' non-conference schedule
- Trips to the Great Alaska Shootout, Air Force and North Dakota State are responsible for a bulk of the Aggies' November and December travel
- The team's league road trip to Hawai'i covers 59 percent of the miles traveled during conference play

A SNAPSHOT OF THE AGGIES' NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

- The Aggies will face six teams that advanced to postseason play last year before league play begins in early January
- Men's basketball will face Cal, its I-80 rivals, for the first time in six seasons
- UC Davis will compete in two tournaments: the Cable Car Classic, hosted by Santa Clara (Nov. 11-13) and the GCI Great Alaska Shootout, hosted by Alaska-Anchorage (Nov. 24-26)
- Of the team's 15 non-conference games, 12 will take place outside of Davis

EXPERIENCE IS EVERYTHING

- UC Davis' roster is loaded with experience; in addition to its five seniors, 11 of the 15 student-athletes on roster are upperclassmen
- After redshirting last season, junior forward Chima Moneke and redshirt freshman Joe Mooney will make their Aggie debuts this years
- Only two players from the 2015-16 team were lost to graduation
- Two-thirds of the team's offense, and players responsible for 69 percent of UC Davis' minutes played last year returns for sixth-year head coach Jim Les

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- Cal, an opponent UC Davis will face on Dec. 10, received votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today Sports first national polls
- When CollegeInsider.com released its first Mid-Major poll of the season, six Aggie opponents were a part of that list: Weber State, Oakland, North Dakota State, Long Beach State, Hawai'i, and UC Irvine

AGGIES ABROAD

- This past summer, UC Davis basketball embarked on a week-long foreign tour of Costa Rica
- Included throughout the foreign tour were three games against international competition
- UC Davis, known for its extensive community outreach, also volunteered at a local orphanage, in San Jose, for a day
- Per NCAA rules, this tour allowed the team to host 10 practices before embarking to Central America

- Centennial, a team ranked No. 17 nationally and No. 4 in the state by MaxPreps, also won three straight CIF State playoff games by 20 or more points, and advanced to the semifinal round that year

- All UC Davis home games, and Big West Conference matchups not carried by ESPN or FOX will stream at BigWest.TV

2015-16 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Ended the year with the No. 1 defense among all Big West schools; also ranked No. 40 in the nation by allowing 66.0 points per game
- That average dropped to 63.6 ppg vs. league teams — another Big West low
- UC Davis was a highly-disciplined team as indicated by its 532 fouls committed, the 16th-lowest in the country
- Defensive field goal percentage (.415) is a new Division I program record
- Defensive three-point percentage (.342) is another new program low. That was the 22nd-lowest mark among all Div. I programs
- Both percentages crush the former marks set by the 2014-15 Big West championship-winning team
- Another three D-I program rebounding records were set last season: total rebounds (1,034), defensive rebounds (778) and defensive rpg (25.9)

- For the second year in a row, UC Davis basketball was the only athletics team honored by the UC Davis Community Resource Center when the list of Service Award recipients was revealed last April
- By organizing numerous campus visits, on-site assemblies and projects, in addition to its extensive outreach efforts through the team's Reading Program, men's basketball earned its second Silver Community Service Award
- UC Davis basketball was one of 364 individuals, or groups, recognized by the CRC. Combined, this year's award recipients completed more than 100,000 combined hours of service

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATION

- When the Big West Conference released its Preseason Media Poll, UC Davis was slotted fifth with 88 votes
- Long Beach State (19), UC Irvine (1), CSUN (2) and UC Santa Barbara comprised the top four selections (first place votes in parenthesis), Cal State Fullerton, UC Riverside, Hawai'i (1), and Cal Poly occupied the final four positions
- How accurate have these polls been in recent seasons? UC Davis was predicted to finish ninth when the Aggies won the league during the 2014-15 season. Last year, UC Davis was pegged to finish seventh, but ended the year in fifth place.

• Aggie is a term for students of an (historically) agricultural school. Since schools like UC Davis & Texas A&M have agricultural roots, all students at schools such as these are "Aggies." The official UC Davis mascot is a mustang named Gunrock, hence the horse image. The name dates to 1921 when the U.S. Army brought a horse named Gun Rock to UC Davis to supply high-quality stock for cavalry horses. The mustang mascot was selected to honor that cavalry horse.

DID YOU KNOW?

• UC Davis, is a public research university located in Davis, California, 15 minutes west (in good traffic) of Sacramento - the capital of California. The campus covers 7,309 acres, making it the largest within the 10-campus University of California system. UC Davis also has the third-largest enrollment in the UC System after UCLA and UC Berkeley.

• Classified as a Public Ivy, a publicly funded university considered as providing a quality of education comparable to those of the Ivy League, the university offers over 100 undergraduate majors.

• Even though UC Davis' agricultural heritage remains strong, the university has expanded over the past century to include graduate and professional programs in medicine (which includes the UC Davis Medical Center), law, veterinary medicine, education, nursing, and business management, in addition to more than 90 research programs offered by UC Davis Graduate Studies. UC Davis' School of Veterinary Medicine is the largest in the United States and is ranked No. 1 in the nation.

REMEMBER YOUR ROOTS

• The In 1905, the California legislature passed the University Farm Bill, which called for the establishment of a farm school for the University of California (at the time, Berkeley was the sole campus of the university). After two failed bills, a law authorizing the creation of a University Farm was passed on March 18, 1905. Yolo County, home to some of California's prime farmland, was chosen as the site. A committee appointed by the Regents purchased land near Davisville (now Davis) in 1906. The Regents officially took control of the property in September 1906 and constructed four buildings in 1907.

• Short courses were first offered in 1908 and UC, Davis opened its doors as the "University Farm" to 40 degree students (all male from UC Berkeley, who participated in the school's first three-year program that commenced in January 1909).

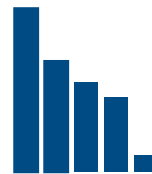

Jim Les was named the 23rd head coach in UC Davis history on May 5, 2011, and ended his fourth year with the Aggies in 2014-15 - the most successful season in the program's Division I era. The 2014-15 Big West Coach of the Year led UC Davis to its first-ever Big West Conference championship and its inaugural postseason berth as a D-I team when the Aggies faced Stanford in the opening round of the National Invitation Tournament. That appearance capped a season that included new school records for the most overall, home, road, conference and non-conference wins.

For the first time in school history, UC Davis ended the season as the NCAA's national team three point champions by virtue of its .447 shooting percentage - the highest mark recorded by any team since the three-point line was pushed back to its current distance. Corey Hawkins, the country's No. 1 three-point shooter with his .488 percentage brought the team's first-ever individual title to Davis; combined, the 2014-15 squad recorded the highest three-point team percentage since 1994.

As the only team in the nation to hold top five three-point and overall field goal percentages on a weekly basis, men's basketball posted a +16 win differential - a Big West Conference record and the nation's No. 1 turnaround.

Under Les' tutelage, no league team collected more all-conference and specialty awards that UC Davis - home of the Big West Coach of the Year, Player of the Year (Hawkins) and Sixth Man of the Year (Josh Fox). This season marked the first occasion that an Aggie received each award.

Last season, it was Les who coached one of the top defenses in the nation; UC Davis led the Big West Conference in all major statistical categories, and set new defensive program records.

Les came to the Aggies after spending nine years as the head coach at his alma mater, Bradley University, where he won more than 150 games and led the Braves to the 2006 NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen. In all, Les possesses nearly 30 years of successful playing and coaching experience in both the collegiate and professional ranks.

Les is no stranger to the Sacramento area, having spent four years as a player with the Sacramento Kings, followed by three seasons as an assistant for the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs. After a nine-year professional playing career, which included seven seasons in the National Basketball Association, Les enjoyed a successful venture into the financial world before returning to his basketball roots. After three years spent with the Monarchs, Les returned to Bradley and was named the 12th men's basketball coach in Braves history on April 7, 2002.

In his first head coaching position, Les' resume continued to build at Bradley. The Braves averaged better than 20 wins in five seasons from 2005 to 2010, while racking up 10 postseason wins the that time. Along the way, Les became the first coach to win games in four different postseason tournaments in NCAA history.

Les' coaching career has been defined by more than just wins and losses, however. Of the 26 seniors he has coached in his first nine years, 24 have earned their degrees, while the other two are currently playing professional basketball overseas. Under Les' direction, Bradley set a program record for grade point average and had 11 team members earn a spot on the Bradley Athletic Director's Honor Roll during the 2009-10 academic year for posting

a minimum 3.0 semester GPA during at least one of the two grading periods that year.

Inheriting a team that produced a 9-20 record during the 2001-02 season, Les laid a solid foundation for a program that re-emerged as a force in the Missouri Valley Conference. Les finished with a 152-140 record in nine seasons as Bradley's head man, having directed the Braves to the Sweet 16s of the 2006 NCAA Tournament and 2007 National Invitation Tournament, followed by runner-up finishes in the inaugural College Basketball Invitational (2008) and CollegelInsider.com Postseason Tournament (2009).

In 2005-06, Les' veteran Braves were able to find their stride down the stretch and play their way into the postseason picture by winning 13 of their last 17 contests, including a seven-game win streak that took the team all the way to the MVC Tournament championship game. Bradley went on to win a pair of NCAA Tournament games, defeating No. 4 seed Kansas (77-73) and fifth-seeded Pittsburgh (72-66) at the Palace of Auburn Hills to make its first Sweet 16 appearance since 1955.

Les began his college career at Cleveland State, but transferred to Bradley during the winter break of his sophomore season. Once in the Bradley fold, Les led the Braves to a 60-27 (.690) record in his 87 games, consecutive trips to the postseason (1985 NIT and 1986 NCAA Tournament) and one of the greatest seasons in the history of both Bradley and Valley men's basketball.

HEAD COACH JIM LES/COACHING STAFF

The 1985-86 squad won the MVC regular season title with a perfect 16-0 league record and it remains the last Valley team to post an undefeated conference slate. Although the Braves lost the MVC Tournament championship game at Tulsa, Bradley earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, where the Braves lost to eventual national champion Louisville in the second round. Bradley's 83-65 victory versus UTEP in the first round of the 1986 West Regional, however, was the program's first NCAA Tournament victory since 1955.

During Bradley's memorable 1985-86 season, Les averaged 14.2 points and led The Valley with 7.9 assists per game. In addition to being named MVC Player of the Year in 1986, the 5-foot-11 point guard won the Frances Pomeroy Naismith Hall of Fame Award as the nation's best player less than 6-feet tall.

Les was inducted into the Bradley Athletics Hall of Fame Feb. 7, 1998. He also has been inducted into the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, the Greater Peoria Sports Hall of Fame and the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame. Additionally, Braves fans voted Les one of the 15 greatest players in program history during the celebration of Bradley's first 100 basketball seasons.

Following his senior season, Les was a third-round (70th overall) selection by the Atlanta Hawks during the 1986 NBA Draft. He went on to play seven seasons for Utah, the Los Angeles Clippers, Sacramento and Atlanta. He led the NBA in 3-point field goal percentage (.461) during the 1990-91 season and he was the runner-up to Chicago's Craig Hodges in the AT&T Long Distance Shootout during the 1992 NBA All-Star Weekend. Among the coaches for whom Les played during his NBA career are Lenny Wilkens, Jerry Sloan and Dick Motta, three of the winningest coaches in NBA history.

Originally from the Chicago suburb of Niles, Ill., Les is married to the former Jodi Martineau. The couple has three children: son Tyler and daughters Amber and Hannah.



KEVIN NOSEK

Kevin Nosek brings more than a decade of experience as either a UC Davis coach or student-athlete. This season marks his 15th as an assistant coach. He began his Aggie coaching career in 1999-2000 following a four-year playing career at UC Davis. After serving a three-year stint as head coach at Menlo College, Nosek returned to the Aggies in 2006-07. He assists in all aspects of the program.

Nosek, a true veteran of the men's basketball staff whose connection to the program dates back to his youth days, first served as a ball boy for Bob Hamilton's teams in the late 1980s. Since his return in 2006, he has been instrumental in helping the program complete its transition to Division I, a process that includes the program's first official D-I and Big West Conference season in 2007-08.

After starring at nearby Davis Senior High, Nosek played for UC Davis from 1996-99, highlighting his career with a NCAA Division II national championship in 1988. He enjoyed his best collegiate game during his senior year, when he hit 4 of 5 from three-point range en route to a career-high 12 points against Holy Names. Perhaps as a premonition of things to come, his teammates dubbed him "Coach Nosek" for his unrelenting diligence both on and off the court.

Nosek remained with the Aggie program as an assistant to Brian Fogel from 1999-2003. In his four seasons, the Aggies compiled a 67-23 record and qualified for the NCAA D-II West Regional (1999-2000).

Following his first tenure at UC Davis, Nosek earned his first collegiate head coaching role when he took the helm of the men's basketball program at Menlo College. In three seasons with the Oaks, he turned around a program that finished 4-22 his first season, to one that posted a 17-11 mark and its best record in seven years. The Oaks advanced to the Cal Pac Conference Tournament semifinal game during the 2004-05 season and reached the title game the following year.

Nosek's Menlo tenure included a roster that led all D-II teams in rebound defense, also ranking among the nation's leaders in rebound margin and field goal percentage defense.

Nosek graduated from UC Davis in June of 1999, earning his bachelor's degree in organizational studies. He received his masters in sport coaching from the United States Sports Academy shortly thereafter.

Nosek and his wife, Nicole reside in Davis; they have two daughters, Maya and Grace.



KYLE VOGT

Kyle Vogt enters his fifth season at UC Davis as an assistant coach after being hired in June, 2012. In his role, he assists in all areas of the Aggies' program, specializing in defensive schemes, perimeter play and development, recruiting and opponent scouting.

"I am very excited to add Kyle to our staff," said head men's basketball coach Jim Les shortly after Vogt's hiring. "He is an accomplished Division I assistant that brings with him great knowledge and enthusiasm. He will be a tremendous asset to our staff and an excellent resource for our players both on and off the floor."

Vogt brings an 11-year coaching career to UC Davis that including stops at UW Platteville (2003-04), Bradley ('04-'11) and Western Illinois ('11-'12). Vogt has been a part of five postseason teams throughout those 11 years, including Bradley's 2006 Sweet 16 run. In back-to-back years, teams Vogt coached set single-season school records for the most Division I wins - 18 at Western Illinois and 14 at UC Davis.

A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Vogt graduated from Lakeland College in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in marketing. An outstanding player for the Muskies, Vogt was a three-time all-conference performer and scored 1,123 points throughout his career. He is ranked No. 2 all-time with 183 three-point field goals and was amongst the Div. III national leaders in three-point percentage during both his junior and senior seasons.

Vogt and his wife, Erin, live in Davis with their three children: Jackson, Nolan and Avery.

Jonathan Metzger-Jones, an assistant coach for the last five seasons at Montana, is UC Davis basketball's new assistant coach as announced by head coach Jim Les on June 16, 2016.

Throughout his tenure in Missoula, the Grizzlies won three Big Sky Championships and advanced to postseason play on four occasions. In addition to competing in the 2012 and 2013 NCAA Tournaments, Metzger-Jones' teams also competed in the 2015 National Invitation Tournament and 2016 College Basketball Invitational.

"We are very excited to add Jonathan to our basketball staff. His experience, energy, and track record of success will be instrumental, as we continue to build a championship basketball program that UC Davis, and our community, can be proud of," Les said.

With Metzger-Jones on staff, Montana won 20 or more games in four of his five years. Under his tutelage, 17 Grizzlies earned All-Big Sky Conference honors -- a list that includes Kareem Jamar (2013 league MVP), Will Cherry (Cleveland Cavaliers), Jordan Gregory and Martin Breunig. All four players received NABC All-District recognition.

Off the court, Metzger-Jones was in charge of player academics -- the team posted its highest overall cumulative grade point average in program history this past season -- the team's fundraising efforts, assisted his colleagues with recruiting, skill development, in-game strategy, opponent scouting and game preparation.

Before he joined the Grizzlies' staff, Metzger-Jones helped lead UC Santa Barbara to its most successful stint in program history. Throughout his four years, the Gauchos won two regular-season titles, consecutive Big West Tournament championships and earned the program's first-ever back-to-back berths at the NCAA Tournament.

While at Santa Barbara, Metzger-Jones recruited and mentored Orlando Johnson, James Nunnally and Alan Williams. Johnson and Williams received Big West MVP distinction in 2010 and 2014 respectively; all three have NBA experience.

Metzger-Jones played two seasons at the University of the Pacific, was named co-captain as a senior and etched his name in the Tigers' records book as one of the program's top 10 three-point shooters when he graduated in 2002 with a bachelor of science degree in business administration.

Afterwards, he spent three seasons playing professionally in Switzerland, Denmark and Finland.

Upon his return to the United States, Metzger-Jones started his coaching career alongside head coach Bob Burton as his Director of Basketball Operations at Cal State Fullerton. Before transferring to Pacific, he played two seasons at West Valley Junior College for Coach Burton.

By joining Les' staff, Metzger-Jones will return to a familiar environment that is close to home.

"I have numerous friends and family that attended UC Davis. Even though I grew up in Oakland, returning to Northern California, and working at this university, is a homecoming for me."

Metzger-Jones is married to the former Alison Keck. The couple has one son, Jason.

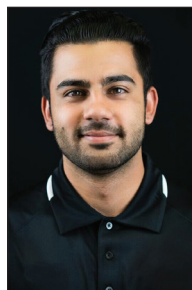
For her team's accomplishments in the classroom, community and on the court, the Bay Valley Conference bestowed Coach of the Year honors to Steliga in 2012 and '13.

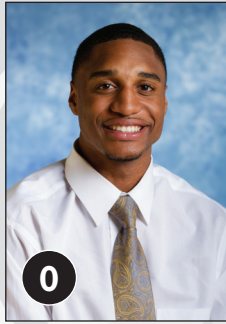

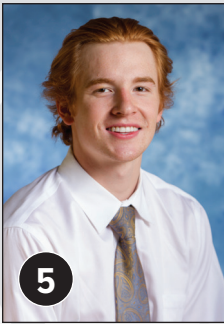

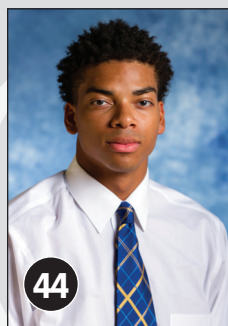
