JAN BROGAN

In her 28 years at Cal, Brogan has molded the Golden Bear program into one of the best in the country, guiding the Bears to 24 NCAA appearances, three AIAW showings, including a trip to the finals in 1982, and 18 Top 10 finishes since 1982. Brogan has also produced four national champion doubles

teams, 56 All-Americans, 16 first team All-Pac-10 selections and four conference player of the year honorees during her career. She currently boasts a 501-205 (.709) dual match record, and notched her 500th career win last spring when Cal defeated Mississippi in the first round of the NCAA tournament. Brogan is just the fourth Cal coach to reach the 500 win plateau and the winningest coach in Cal tennis history.

Known for developing players mentally, physically and technically, Brogan implements an applied sports psychology program with her athletes, stressing mental toughness and team culture. Her holistic educational coaching philosophy has guided the program to the highest graduation rate among sports teams at Cal, and one of the highest team GPAs on campus.

Although thorough in all aspects of player development, Brogan is known to have expertise as a doubles specialist. She has coached four NCAA doubles champions during her years with the Golden Bears, including back-to-back championships (1998-99) with the doubles

tandem of Amanda Augustus and current associate head coach Amy Jensen and 2002-03 pair of Raquel Kops-Jones and Christina Fusano.

Recently, the Cal program under Brogan has made strides in singles, specifically with the success of Raquel Kops-Jones and Suzi Babos. As a singles player in 2004, Kops-Jones spent much of the year ranked No. 1 in the nation, as well as being named Pac-10 Player of the Year and ITA Senior Player of the Year. Babos, who entered the 2005 fall season ranked No. 2 in the nation, was awarded the 2005 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and ITA Regional Rookie of the Year for the Northwest region.

Brogan herself has received an impressive list of accolades. Her dedication to excellence earned her the Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year award in 1990 and three ITA Northwest Region Coach of the Year honors in 1988, 1991 and 1993. She has also been named conference coach of the year eight times during her career, six consecutive years from 1982-1987 ('82-'86 NorPac, '87 Pac-10) and twice more in 1992 and '94 (Pac-10).

A successful teaching professional in Los Gatos before taking Cal's head coaching job in 1978, Brogan has been a member of the ITA Board of Directors, ITA Operating Committee, NCAA Championship Tennis Committee and is the co-chair of the ITA Sport Science Committee. A former USTA junior national coach, Brogan received her first U.S. National team assignment in 1985 and in 1995 as the U.S. women's head coach at the World University Games.

Brogan is a Bay Area native. A graduate of San Jose State University in physical education, she completed her teaching credential in 1978. In 1998 she completed a masters degree in sports psychology at John F. Kennedy University. She teaches an applied sports psychology and life skills class for student-athletes at Cal.

AMY JENSEN



2nd year Assoc. Head Coach
6th year coaching at Cal

A former Cal singles and doubles All-American who won an unprecedented three consecutive NCAA doubles titles, Amy Jensen enters her fourth year as an assistant coach with the Golden Bears. Previously, she spent two years in the capacity of volunteer assistant coach with the women's tennis program.

The 27-year old Australian native was a three-year letterwinner for the Golden Bears (1996-2000), posting a career record of 105-52 in singles and 94-29 in doubles. She won her doubles titles in 1998, 1999 and 2000, as well as being named a 1997 and 2000 NCAA singles All-American and a doubles All-American in 1998, 1999 and 2000.

Last year, Jensen was honored for her hard work with the Cal program, being named the 2004 Intercollegiate Tennis Association Northwest Regional Assistant Coach of the Year.

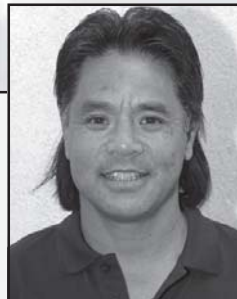
Before coming to Cal, Jensen was one of Australia's top juniors, earning a No. 15 world doubles ranking in 1996. She competed in both the 1996 Junior Wimbledon and Junior French Open, as well as claiming two European doubles titles with former Cal teammate Anita Kurimay in 1996.

Jensen graduated from Cal in May 2002 with a degree in Integrative Biology. She has also attained her strength and conditioning certification, and works as the conditioning coach for the tennis program. She is a P-1 certified teaching professional with the USPTA and is currently attending John F. Kennedy University working towards a masters degree in counseling psychology, specializing in sport psychology.

CORDELL HO



Volunteer Assistant Coach
9th Year at Cal

Cordell Ho returns to California as a volunteer assistant coach after a four-year hiatus from the program. Ho previously spent five seasons as the associate head coach for the men's program, as well as two seasons in a volunteer role with the Bears after stepping down to pursue his classical music career full time.

Ho has held several head pro and tennis director appointments on the East Coast, as well as teaching positions at the University of Pennsylvania and the University of Washington. He has also had a long-time association with men's head coach Peter Wright, whom Ho coached both as a junior and as a professional on the men's tennis tour.

Born and raised in San Francisco, Ho began playing tennis competitively in Northern California junior tournaments and played collegiate tennis at the University of Oregon, before moving to Vienna, Austria, to continue his music studies.

An active composer of symphonic and chamber music, Ho has written film scores, theater pieces and opera. His music has been performed in the United States, Europe and Asia and he has lectured on music at UC Davis, Columbia University and the University of Washington.

Ho, a Cal graduate, (M.A. '75, B.A. '72), and his wife, Michele (B.A. Cal '79), live in Berkeley with their two daughters, Ally and Xin Xin.
