NEED TO KNOW

Days before they jet to the Aloha State for the prestigious Maui Jim Maui Invitational, the Golden Bears are bringing Maui to the Mainland as they play host to Wofford as part of the tournament's opening games. The Bears tip off against the Bulldogs in Haas Pavilion on Thursday at 6 p.m., live on the Pac-12 Network and on KGO 810 AM.

The contest marks the third and final game of Cal's season-opening homestand. The Bears are 1-1, earning the first win of the Wyking Jones era against Cal Poly on Sunday. Through two games, Cal ranks among the nation's Top 25 in four categories: free throw attempts (6th, 72), total blocks (11th, 14), free throws made (14th, 49) and blocked shots per game (24th, 2.0).

Don Coleman is coming off back-to-back 30-point outings, the first Golden Bear to do so since current Houston Rockets player Ryan Anderson did so in 2008, while Kingsley Okoroh and Marcus Lee each set career-best scoring marks against Cal Poly with 15 and 21 points, respectively. Freshman Justice Sueing leads the newcomers with a pair of double-figure outings with 14 against UC Riverside and 12 against Cal Poly. Sueing earned his first career start over the Mustangs.

TICKETS & PROMOTIONS: Tickets for the game can be purchased in advance via CalBears.com or by calling (800) 462-3277. Thursday's game is part of the "Maui on the Mainland" games ahead of next week's Maui Jim Maui Invitational.

BY THE NUMBERS

2008 With 31 points against UC Riverside and 30 points against Cal Poly, Don Coleman became the first Cal player to score at least 30 points in consecutive games since Ryan Anderson did it on Jan. 17 & 19, 2008.

12 Justice Sueing leads all freshmen in the major conferences for free throws made with 12. He's shooting 92.3 percent from the charity stripe with a 12-13 clip.

1 Kingsley Okoroh leads the Pac-12 in blocked shots with 8 blocks through two games this season. His 7 against UC Riverside, which tied a Cal record, are the second-most by any player in the country.

70.8 Cal shot 56 percent from the floor against Cal Poly, including a 70.8 percent mark (17-24) in the first half.

2 Two Golden Bears set career-best point totals in Sunday's win over Cal Poly. Marcus Lee poured in 21 to top his previous best of 17, and Kingsley Okoroh put up 15 to top his record of 10.

SCOUTING THE TERRIERS

Last Meeting: 0-0
Series Record: Have Not Met
Wofford's 2017-18 Record: 1-1
Wofford's Last Game: The Terriers defeated Washington and Lee University, 103-66, for their first win of the season.

- Wofford returns three starters, including two who averaged double-figures last season – Fletcher Magee (18.6 points per game) and Cameron Jackson (12.6 ppg).
- Magee currently leads the Terriers with 17.0 ppg.
- Jackson (14.0 ppg) and Matthew Pegram (10.0) are also scoring in the double figures.
- Storm Murphy has a team-best 8 assists.
- Wofford's loss this season came against 2017 Final Four participant South Carolina, 73-52.

LAST TIME OUT

Cal earned the first win of the Wyking Jones era with an 85-82 victory over Cal Poly.

- Four Bears scored in double figures, led by Don Coleman's 30 points. Marcus Lee had 21, Kingsley Okoroh had 15 and Justice Sueing had 12.
- Lee tallied a double-double for the first time this season, adding 11 rebounds to his career-high 21 points.
- Okoroh's 15 points were a new career-high title.
- Sueing made his first career start.
- Cal shot 70.8% from the floor in the first half (17-24) and 56.0% for the game (28-50).
- The Bears scored 42 of their points in the paint, and 20 points off turnovers.
- Cal led by as many as 19 points in the second half.

BEARS SIGN TOP 25 CLASS

Head coach Wyking Jones first recruiting class is off to a strong start, signing a consensus Top 30 class, with three outlets listing Cal's 2018 signees as a Top 25 group. Top 100 recruits Jacobi Gordon (Houston, Texas) and Matt Bradley (San Bernardino, Calif.) and three-star California standout Andre Kelly have signed with the program. 247Sports and Scout gave the Bears the 18th-best class in the country. ESPN ranks the class 22nd. More notes on the class:

- Matt Bradley – 97th in the ESPN 100, four-star shooting guard
- Jacobi Gordon – 89th in the ESPN 100, No. 22 small forward in the country
- Andre Kelly – Stockton Record's reigning All-Area Player of the Year who averaged 24.1 points, 15.2 rpg, 2.7 assists and 1.9 blocks as a junior.

CAL TO OPEN NEXT SEASON IN CHINA

California men's basketball will open the 2017-18 season against Yale in China in the fourth edition of the Pac-12 China Game presented by Alibaba Group. The flagship event of Pac-12 Global is designed to grow the global popularity of Pac-12 athletic programs and universities, fostering cultural exchange through sport, and creating unique educational experiences for Pac-12 student-athletes. In addition to the game, the trip will include educational and cultural experiences for student-athletes and university delegations. Specific date and location information will be announced at a later date.

CH-CH-CHANGES

After a busy offseason, the Golden Bears boast among one of the youngest squads in the country, ranking among the Top 10 fewest returning starts from 2016-17 (7th, 45), fewest returning letterwinners (1st, 2), fewest minutes played by returnees in 2016-17 (3rd, 1,167) and most scholarship freshmen (5th, 6).

CAL IN THE PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL

The Golden Bears were projected to finish 11th in the Pac-12 in 2017-18, according to a preseason vote by media who regularly cover the conference.

Arizona is the favorite to win the conference, followed by USC and UCLA in the top 3. Washington State is predicted to finish behind the Bears at 12th.

Cal's worst finish in the last decade came in 2007-08, when the Bears went 17-16 overall and 6-12 in the Pac-10 to earn 9th place.

OKOROH ON KAREEM ABDUL JABBAR AWARD WATCH LIST

Kingsley Okoroh is on the shortlist of the best collegiate centers in the nation. The Cal big man was named one of 20 players on the 2018 Kareem

Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award.

Okoroh enters his senior season following Pac-12 All-Defensive Honorable Mention laurels last year. He logged 74 blocks to become Cal's single-season blocked shots leader. The Derby, England native started 24 contests in 2016-17 – appearing in all 34 games – en route to averaging a career-best in points (4.6) and rebounds (5.5). During his junior season, Okoroh also averaged 2.2 blocks per a game and recorded four or more blocks in six outings, while also setting single-game career-highs with five blocks against Wyoming and 13 rebounds against No. 4 UCLA.

The list will be narrowed down to 10 candidates by mid-February, with five finalists announced in March and the winner crowned in April.

HAMILTON NAMED TO NABC HONORS COURT

Senior guard Nick Hamilton was recognized for his exemplary work in the classroom this summer, earning NABC Honors Court laurels. The Honors Court recognizes student-athletes who excelled in academics during the 2016-17 season, carrying a 3.2 GPA or higher.

Hamilton boasts a 3.74 cumulative GPA as a double major in legal studies and media studies. The Inglewood, Calif. product saw action in 12 games during the Bears' 2016-17 campaign after recovering from a knee injury during the 2015-16 season.

OKOROH'S OFFSEASON

In preparation for Wyking Jones' style of press, Kingsley Okoroh spent his summer becoming a leaner, more mobile and more conditioned athlete. From June 19 to Aug. 28, Okoroh dropped 14 lbs. of weight, improving his lean body mass from 245.8 to 252 – a gain of 7 lbs. of muscle. His fat measured at 8.4, down from 18.7 in June, including a nearly four percent drop in body fat from 9 percent to 5.1 percent.

Okoroh worked with men's basketball strength and conditioning coach Jordan Jackson, with a primary area of focus in his mobility – including the ability to stay into basketball stances and positions for longer periods of times, and opening up his hips to move better. Ankle strength for the 7-footer was also a focus. Okoroh's conditioning to lean out included utilizing the underwater treadmill at Cal's Simpson High Performance Center to put less pressure on his joints, and participating in low-impact cardio such as intervals on the elliptical. Okoroh, Jackson and team nutritionist Elizabeth McNear also met several times throughout the summer to tighten up Okoroh's diet and nutrition plan.

BEARS HOST "FAMILY DAY OLYMPICS"

With a family atmosphere as an integral part of the foundation for head coach Wyking Jones' team culture, the Bears held a Family Day Olympics to kick off their preseason. Student-athletes, support staff and their families came together at Thousand Oaks Park in Berkeley for a picnic followed by a competitive slate of games, including a three-legged race, motivational quote unscramble,

obstacle course, limbo and more.

WORKOUT WAYS

In order to prepare for a new style of offense this year, the Golden Bears were hard at work this offseason adapting to Strength & Conditioning Coach Jordan Jackson's workouts. Along with Olympic style weightlifting and conditioning, the Bears also participated in unique sessions such as hot yoga, conditioning on the campus beach volleyball courts and running the California Memorial Stadium steps.

NEW-LOOK BEARS

California's new look extends beyond the nine newcomers on the squad, as the Golden Bears launched a 10-year partnership with global footwear and apparel leader Under Armour on June 1, 2017. The launch included a rebranding of several key athletics marks. The Cal script logo – one of the most iconic and recognizable marks in collegiate athletics – remains a staple, while two classic California symbols in the walking Bear and the block C combine to replace the old growling Bear logo. The Bears will also benefit from exclusive use of the custom Sather Stripe design, which pays homage to campus designs, including the Campanile.

NEWELLY-SURFACED

As part of Cal's transition to Under Armour, the Golden Bears received updated facilities paid for with a bonus from the apparel giant. Along with new signage and decor throughout Haas Pavilion, Pete Newell Court now displays the traditional Cal script logo at center court on the first-grade maple. The old maple wood surface was used for 17 seasons, reaching the end of its functional lifespan. The Sather Stripe makes an appearance on both baselines, as does the new font, again spelling out California and Golden Bears.

NEXT UP

The Golden Bears leave Berkeley for the first time all season, heading to the Aloha State for the Maui Jim Maui Invitational. Cal is set for three days of hoops at the Lahaina Civic Center, where the Bears will open tournament action against Wichita State at 2 p.m. PT on Monday, Nov. 20.

2016-17 KEY MOMENTS IN REVIEW

WYKING JONES NAMED HEAD COACH

Wyking Jones was named Cal's head coach on March 24, 2017. Jones had previously served on Cuonzo Martin's staff for two seasons. While an assistant coach at Cal, Jones helped the Bears to a combined 44-24 record and reached the postseason twice. Over his last two years at Cal, the Bears' defense has led the Pac-12 in points per game and field goal percentage allowed both seasons – 67.3 ppg and 39.6 percent in 2015-16 and 63.4 ppg and 40.0 percent in 2016-17.

MARTIN STEPS DOWN

Following Cal's loss to CSU Bakersfield in the NIT, Cuonzo Martin announced his resignation as head coach of the Golden Bears. Martin stepped down to pursue other opportunities, eventually accepting a position as head coach at Missouri. In his three seasons at Cal, Martin amassed a 62-39 overall record, and 29-25 record in the Pac-12.

RABB & BIRD GO SECOND ROUND

For the second year in a row, two California players were taken in the NBA Draft. Ivan Rabb and Jabari Bird were both selected in the second round. Rabb was taken by the Orlando Magic, with his draft rights immediately traded to the Memphis Grizzlies, and Bird was the 56th overall pick to the Boston Celtics. Their selections marked the third and fourth in the last two seasons, joining Jaylen Brown (Celtics) and Tyrone Wallace (Utah Jazz).

OKOROH SETS SINGLE-SEASON BLOCK RECORD

With one block in Cal's NIT game against CSU Bakersfield, Kingsley Okoroh became the program's new single-season blocked shots leader, bringing his total to 74 blocks in 2016-17. He surpassed David Kravish's 73 from 2014. Okoroh currently ranks third among Cal's career blocked shots leaders (135).

HEAD COACH WYKING JONES

With more than 15 years of collegiate coaching experience, Wyking Jones was introduced as California's head coach on March 24, 2017.

Prior to his tenure as head coach, Jones served as an assistant coach at Cal for two seasons under Cuonzo Martin in 2015-16 and 2016-17.

Charged with coaching Cal's big men, Jones helped forward Ivan Rabb become a two-time All-Pac-12 performer and Jaylen Brown earn All-Pac-12 and Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors in 2015-16. In addition, center Kingsley Okoroh set a school record with 74 blocks in 2016-17.

In his first season with the Golden Bears, Jones helped steer Cal to the program's first NCAA Tournament bid since 2013 and the program's highest tournament seeding, a No. 4 seed. Cal's defense earned top marks, leading the Pac-12 with just 67.3 points allowed per game and finishing in the top three for rebounding. The Bears went 23-11 and extended their home winning streak to 19 games, dating back to the 2014-2015 season.

The Bears continued their success in 2016-17 by pushing their home winning streak to a program-record 27 games and once again led the league in defense, limiting opponents to 63.4 ppg and 40.0 percent shooting. Cal finished the season with a 21-13 record and earned the top seed in the National Invitation Tournament.

Throughout his career, Jones has also been instrumental in the development of 11 current and former NBA players, including standout Golden Bear Jaylen Brown, plus Terry Rozier, Gorgui Dieng, Montrezl Harrell, Tony Snell, Russ Smith and Peyton Siva.

Jones, a native of Inglewood, Calif., returned to his home state with 12 years of experience as a coach at the collegiate level and was introduced as Martin's assistant on April 23, 2015. He joined the Golden Bears' staff after serving as an assistant coach at Louisville for four seasons. During his time on the Cardinals' coaching staff, UofL's combined record was 123-30. Louisville captured the 2013 NCAA Championship and reached two Final Fours over the past four seasons. The Cardinals completed the 2014-15 season with a 27-9 record, reaching the NCAA Tournament regional final.

Prior to Louisville, Jones served two seasons on the coaching staff at New Mexico where the Lobos won 52 games in two seasons, including a school-record 30-win campaign in 2010. New Mexico finished the 2010 season ranked eighth in the Associated Press national poll.

Jones served as an assistant coach for five seasons from 2002-06 at Pepperdine, where he was the Waves' recruiting coordinator. He got his start in coaching at his alma mater, Loyola Marymount, during the 1996-97 season.

As an assistant coach, Jones boasts one national championship, two Final Four runs, seven NCAA Tournament appearances, an Elite Eight and Sweet 16 run and 10 NBA Draft selections.

He was a standout at LMU from 1991-95 under head coach John Olive, where his 1,076 career points rank 24th all-time in the program's history. Jones also collected 493 career rebounds during his career with the Lions. He was a two-time All-West Coast Conference selection, highlighted by a 19.7 ppg average as a junior. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Loyola Marymount in 1995.

Jones played professional basketball from 1995-2001 in Italy, France, Japan, Lebanon and South Korea. He also served on the staff at Nike Elite Youth Basketball for three years, where he was the Travel Team Manager for more than 45 programs.

Jones and his wife, Estrella, have a son, Jameel and a daughter, Zoe.
