STARTING FIVE

- ▶ No. 6/8 Wichita State plays three games in three days at 2018 Maui Jim Maui Invitational, beginning with Monday afternoon's 4 p.m. CT (Noon HT) tip against California at the Lahaina Civic Center on the island of Maui, Hawaii.
- ▶ The winner advances to Tuesday's 12:30 p.m. CT (8:30 a.m. HT) semifinal against the Marquette/VCU winner on ESPN. The losers square off at 3 p.m. CT (11 a.m. HT) on ESPN2.
- ▶ **Dan Shulman** and **Jay Bilas** have the call on ESPN2.
- ▶ The Voice of the Shockers -- **Mike Kennedy** -- describes the action on KEYN FM 103.7 and online at GoShockers.com/Listen.

1 RETURN TO MAUI: The Shockers are making their second appearance in this tournament. In 2010, they dropped a quarterfinal heartbreaker to eventual national champion UConn, 83-79, but bounced back to defeat Chaminade (79-58) and Virginia (70-58) for a fifth-place finish. Left off the NCAA Tournament bubble in March, that WSU team rolled to the 2011 NIT title with five wins by an average of 15 points... WSU has played in seven other Hawaiian events over the years, dating back to 1981, but has never won a title. Shocker teams are 9-10 all-time in Hawaii. A runner-up finish at the 2014 Diamond Head Classic is their best to date.

2 GRAND OPENING: Three senior big men, **Shaquille Morris** (17.0 pts, 7.5 reb), **Rauno Nurger** (13.5 pts) and **Darral Willis Jr.** (16.5 pts, 8.5 reb) have led the charge in WSU's 2-0 start... The Shockers have out-rebounded opponents by an average of 21 boards and outscored them 83-24 in the paint... A 109-57 win over UMKC in the opener was the most-lopsided in 11 seasons under **Gregg Marshall** (52 points)... WSU's 39-point halftime lead (62-23) in that game was the largest in the program's modern history... Last Monday, the Shockers enjoyed a 25-point halftime cushion against CAA preseason favorite, College of Charleston and coasted to an 81-63 victory... In the two wins, they've outscored opponents in the first half by a combined count of 109-45.

3 MARSHALL MILESTONE: Naismith Hall of Famer **Ralph Miller** coached 353 games for the Shockers from 1951-64. Monday's Maui quarterfinal will be Marshall's 354th -- most in program history. Marshall (263-90 in his 11th season) surpassed Miller as the school's all-time wins leader in February, 2015.

4 1 MORE 3 FOR HISTORY: **Landry Shamet** (13.5 pts) has connected on a three-pointer in 27-straight games -- tied with former Shocker (and current Knick) **Ron Baker** for the school record. If Shamet hits at least one three against Cal in the quarterfinal, he will own the record outright. Teammate **Conner Frankamp** (10.5 pts, 6.0 assists) enters with his own 24-game streak.

5 SHAQ FACTOR: With his next block, Morris (102 career blocks) will tie Shocker legend **Xavier McDaniel** (103; 1981-85) for fifth on WSU's all-time list. Morris needs just three more to match former LA Laker **Gene Wiley** (105 from 1959-62) for fourth-place.

SEASON OUTLOOK

Wichita State returns essentially the entire cast from last year's 31-5 team that swept the Missouri Valley Conference regular season and tournament titles and danced for a sixth-straight year.

Eleventh-year head coach **Gregg Marshall** returns over 91 percent of his points and rebounds. His top eight scorers are back, and six of them are seniors.

That continuity will be important for the Shockers in a year otherwise marked by radical change.

On July 1, after 72 years in the MVC, Wichita State joined the American Athletic Conference as a non-football member -- a move that aims to boost the Shockers' basketball reputation and national exposure.

So far, so good.

A consensus top-10 team among the preseason annuals, WSU is in line for 26 national television appearances during the regular season, and at least half of the team's games will air on either ESPN, ESPN2 or CBS.

"We know it's going to be a challenge, but we're excited about it," Marshall said. "Hopefully the improvement in level of competition will aid us in getting into the NCAA tournament and getting favorable seeding."

The NCAA Selection Committee values quality wins, and WSU will be in a much-better position to collect them, going forward. The Shockers' 30-game regular season schedule includes as many as 15 contests against teams that finished in the top-100 of last year's RPI (compared to just six during the 2016-17 regular season).

The American annually ranks among the nation's toughest basketball conferences, earning 12 NCAA Tournament bids in its first four seasons of existence, highlighted by UConn's 2014 National Championship. In 2016-17, SMU and Cincinnati both reached the 30-win plateau and finished in the top-25.

The move also reunites WSU with four of its former MVC rivals: Cincinnati (a Valley member from 1957-70), Houston (1950-60), Memphis (1967-73) and Tulsa (1935-96). The Shockers and Golden Hurricane -- separated by less than 200 miles -- enjoyed a fierce basketball rivalry in the 1980s, and some of WSU's greatest basketball moments came while battling the Bearcats for national prominence in the 1960's.

WSU's shift to The American goes beyond hoops.

University president **John Bardo** hails it as a victory for the school's academic mission, aligning WSU and its burgeoning innovation campus with likeminded, metropolitan-based research institutions.

It's a timely change that ratchets up the level of competition and potential ceiling for all 15 of WSU's varsity men's and women's programs. Over the last 10 seasons as a Valley member, the group collectively won 80 conference regular season and tournament championships.

RETURNERS

► The good news: first team All-MVC selections **Landry Shamet** (6-4, R-So, PG) and **Markis McDuffie** (6-8, Jr, F) are back. The bad news: both players have battled foot injuries. Shamet returned in early November, but McDuffie, last year's leading scorer and rebounder, will be sidelined until at least mid-December.

► Seniors **Conner Frankamp** (6-1, R-Sr, G) and **Shaquille Morris** (6-8, R-Sr, C) were third team All-MVC picks who finished strong in 2016-17.

► **Zach Brown** (MVC All-Defensive Team), **Rashard Kelly** (MVC All-Bench Team), **Rauno Nurger** (MVC All-Bench Team) and **Darral Willis Jr.** (MVC All-Newcomer Team) also earned specialty accolades.

► **Austin Reaves** (6-5, So, G) and **C.J. Keyser** (6-3, So, G) benefited from on-the-job training as true freshmen.

KEY LOSSES

► Walk-on guards **John Robert Simon** and **Zach Bush** graduated (though Simon will stick around as a graduate manager). The two provided behind-the-scenes stability.

► **Daishon Smith** and **Eric Hamilton** both elected to transfer... Smith is the only significant loss from the rotation. The JUCO transfer started 12 games in his lone season as a Shocker but gradually lost minutes to Shamet as the year progressed. He averaged 4.8 points and 1.9 assists in just under 15 minutes per game... Hamilton -- a sophomore forward -- totaled 34 points in 26 games.

NEWCOMERS

► Marshall added three scholarship players for 2017-18.

► Second Team NCJAA All-American, **Samajae Haynes-Jones** (6-0, Jr, G) helped Hutchinson CC to a national championship last spring and fills an immediate need in the backcourt.

► Two freshmen, **Asbjorn Midtgaard** (7-0, Fr, C) and **Rod Brown** (6-6, Fr, F) provide depth in the front court but will need time to develop.

HEAD COACH

► Already the winningest coach in Shocker history, **Gregg Marshall** (261-90 in 10 seasons at WSU) is poised to break Naismith Basketball Hall of Famer **Ralph Miller's** school record for games coached during the Shockers' Maui Jim Maui Invitational opener.

► The 2017-18 season marks Marshall's 20th overall as a head coach. He's 455-173 all-time with 12 regular season conference titles and 13 NCAA Tournament bids.

► Marshall -- the consensus national coach of the year in 2014, has led the Shockers to four 30-win seasons in the last five years, beginning with a Final Four run 2013. He's one of just five coaches to lead his team to the second round in each of the last five tournaments.

AMERICAN PRESEASON POLL

► WSU lost out to Cincinnati by a single point in the team American Athletic Conference preseason poll. Five of the league's 12 head coaches picked the Shockers (115 total points), while seven sided with the Bearcats (the preseason favorite with 116).

► The teams won't have a chance to settle that argument on the court until late February. They meet twice in the final 15 days of the regular season: Feb. 18 at Cincinnati (ESPN) and March 4 in Wichita (CBS).

► The Shockers play home-and-homes with each of the other top-8 finishers in the poll and will meet the bottom four teams once-each.

► It's the first time since 2012 that a WSU squad has opened as anything other than preseason favorite. Over it's the final four years of its MVC tenure, the Shockers pulled 164 of a possible 171 first-place votes, and held serve each time with regular season crowns.

**THE SHOCKERS IN HAWAII:**

► Wichita State is back in Hawaii for the first time since December, 2014 when it finished runner-up to George Washington at Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu. Four current Shockers logged time in that tournament.

► **Rashard Kelly** played a career-high 27 minutes in the DHC semifinal and had the game winning tip-in ahead of the buzzer in an OT win over host Hawaii.

► The Shockers have made seven previous trips to Maui – all for tournaments -- and are 9-10 all-time on the islands (4-2 under Marshall).

SHOCKERS IN REGULAR SEASON TOURNEYS:

► The Shockers are 20-14 in multi-team events (MTE's) under **Gregg Marshall** (13-14 on site) with championships in the 2012 Cancun Challenge (Mexico) and the 2013 CBE Classic (Kansas City).

► A Maui Jim Maui Invitational title would be Wichita State's first in an eight-team bracket since **Dave Stallworth** powered the Shockers to the 1963 All-College Classic crown (and later that year, to the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance).

► All-time Wichita State owns **16** titles in regular season events, with **10** of those coming on campus.

► From 1979-86, WSU ran a four-team tournament called the McDonald's Shocker Classic and won it five times. WSU revived the event from 1993-98 as the Cessna Classic and won it five more times in six years.

► Since WSU's quarterfinal loss to Uconn in the 2010 Maui Invitational, the Shockers have won five of their last six tournament openers. Minus injured point guard Fred VanVleet, the Shockers went 0-3 at the 2015 Advocare Invitational.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2018:

► The Shockers are signed on to compete in the 2018 Gildan Charleston Classic, Nov. 15, 16 and 18 at TD Arena in Charleston, S.C.

► Alabama, Appalachian State, Ball State, Davidson, Northeastern, Purdue and Virginia Tech round out the field.

► Three teams from that group: WSU (Second Round), Virginia Tech and Purdue (Sweet 16) appeared in the 2017 NCAA Tournament.

ON CAL:

► The Golden Bears are making their third Maui appearance (1996, 2013).

► The Bears (21-13, 10-8 Pac 12 last year) were one of the last teams out on Selection Sunday 2017 and instead settled for an NIT bid.

► **Wyking Jones** begins his first year as head coach after two years as an assistant in the Cal program.

► **Kingsley Okoroh's** 74 blocks was a program record.

► Cal has reached eight of the last nine postseasons.

THE SERIES WITH CAL:

This will be just the second meeting between the two programs. The other came in December, 1975 when the Bears defeated the Shockers, 75-68, at the Lobo Invitational in Albuquerque. That WSU team went on to win the 1976 Missouri Valley Conference title and later took 14th-ranked Michigan to the wire in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

OTHER SERIES RECORDS FROM THE MAUI FIELD:

► **WSU vs. VCU: 2-2** ----- Three of the four matchups in the series came over stretch of 21 months...VCU used a Bracket Busters win at Charles Koch Arena in Feb. 2011 as a springboard into the NCAA Tournament field and an eventual trip to the Final Four...The following year, the 12th-seeded Rams bounced No. 5 WSU from the 2012 NCAA Tournament in a Round of 64 matchup... WSU played a Bracket Busters return game at VCU in November of 2012 and gained a measure of revenge with a 53-51 road victory... The only other meeting came in Wichita in the 1996 Cessna Classic. A night after VCU upset Billy Tubbs' TCU team in the semifinal, the Shockers hammered the Rams, 80-50 to claim the title.

► **WSU vs. Marquette: 3-4** ----- The teams have met seven times but this would be their first since 1978.

► **WSU vs. Chaminade: 2-0** ----- The Shockers downed the Swords, 79-58, in a 2010 consolation semifinal matchup behind 19 points from David Kyles... WSU also won a December, 1998 meeting in Wichita, 80-51. Jason Perez and Maurice Evans delivered 17 each.

► **WSU vs. Michigan: 3-3** ----- The teams haven't played since 1984... Michigan is 2-0 against the Shockers in postseason play, winning first round games in the 1976 NCAA Tournament and the 1984 NIT... The Shockers are 3-0 against the Wolverines in Wichita.

► **WSU vs. Notre Dame: 1-2** ----- A potential rematch from the 2015 NCAA Sweet 16.

► **WSU vs. LSU: 5-1** ----- WSU has five straight wins... WSU routed LSU last November in the Battle 4 Atlantis quarterfinals behind 15 points from Markis McDuffie, 12 points from Landry Shamet and a career-high seven assists from Conner Frankamp. The Shockers scored the first 11 points and led 46-19 at halftime... In the summer of 2006, with WSU coming off of a Sweet 16 appearance and LSU a trip to the Final Four, the teams agreed to a home-home-neutral series. The Shockers swept all three meetings... LSU's lone series victory came in the 1981 Elite Eight in New Orleans against a Shocker squad bookended by future NBA standouts Cliff Levingston and Antoine Carr.

RANDOM KNOWLEDGE:

- ▶ Senior **Rauno Nurger** celebrates his 24th birthday on Nov. 24. He's the oldest of the 17 Shockers on this year's roster, edging out redshirt senior **Shaquille Morris**, who turns 24 on Feb. 23.
- ▶ The Shockers will face three of this year's 23 first-time Division I head coaches, beginning with **Wyking Jones**. In December, **Gregg Marshall** will match wits with **Mike Boynton** (Oklahoma State) and **Mike Balado** (Arkansas State). ORU's **Paul Mills** (WSU's closed door scrimmage opponent) is an unofficial fourth.
- ▶ WSU's 109 points in the opener against UMKC was the fifth-highest total in American history.
- ▶ Over the last two seasons, WSU is 32-0 when outshooting its opponent and 1-5 when outshot.
- ▶ WSU is 83-1 under Marshall when scoring at least 80 points, with 60 consecutive wins. A triple overtime loss at Drake in January, 2012 is the lone exception.

SHOOTING STARS

- ▶ **Landry Shamet** tied **Ron Baker's** school record for consecutive games with a three pointer (27) during last Monday's win over College of Charleston, and teammate **Conner Frankamp** extended his own to 24.
- ▶ Shamet has made 63-of-128 attempts (.492) from three since the streak began on Dec. 17, 2015. Monday marked just the fourth time that he'd failed to connect on multiple attempts in a game.
- ▶ Frankamp is 58-of-117 from three during his own streak (.496) which began on New Years Day 2017.
- ▶ Frankamp's 111 career three-pointers rank 19th on WSU's career list. He needs two more to catch **Cleanthony Early** (113) and four to match **P.J. Cousnard** (114) for 18th and 17th respectively. The senior is on pace to finish sixth all-time despite playing just 2 1/2 seasons.

- ▶ **Shaquille Morris** blocked six shots in the first two games to move over the century mark for his career (102). He heads to Maui needing just one more to catch **Xavier McDaniel** for fifth on the all-time list. He's three blocks shy of **Gene Wiley** for fourth-place. **Claudius Johnson's** total (109) is the highest by a Shocker since 1985-86 when the block became an official NCAA stat.

- ▶ Nos. 1-3 are: **Xavier McDaniel** (.564), **Antoine Carr** (.557) and **Carl Hall** (.555). Morris ranks just ahead of **Claudius Johnson** (.543) and **Cliff Levingston** (.538).

POLL NOTES

- ▶ WSU climbed to No. 6 in the AP. It's the school's highest ranking since March 17, 2014 when the Shockers entered the NCAA Tournament at No. 2 in both polls.
- ▶ WSU opened at No. 7 in the AP preseason rankings and No. 8 in the Coaches' -- its highest starting point since the '81-82 season.
- ▶ WSU has appeared in four of the last five preseason AP Polls (last year's team earned votes but did not crack the top-25 until Feb. 20). Prior to that, WSU had appeared just three other times since 1961 when the AP began publishing preseason rankings.

► **Samajae Haynes-Jones** finished with seven points, seven assists and just one turnover.

ON THE RIGHT FOOT

► **Landry Shamet's** right foot made preseason headlines in Wichita, as well nationally. The All-American candidate had surgery on July 31 to repair a stress fracture. Doctors placed a screw in the Fifth Metatarsal of his right foot.

► Shamet returned for the Shockers' second exhibition on Nov. 6 -- approximately 13 weeks post-surgery. He played 12 minutes that night, then started the regular season opener four days later, finishing with 17 points in 17 minutes.

► Shamet had an identical procedure on his left foot in November, 2015 -- three games into his true freshman season.

GREEN LIGHT FROM 3

Encouraged by their off-season progress, Gregg Marshall gave big men **Shaquille Morris** and **Darral Willis Jr.** the green light to shoot more threes this year.

Based on the first two games, that was a good decision. Morris and Willis are a combined 7-of-12 from deep.

MORRIS CHASES 1,000-POINT MILESTONE

► Senior center **Shaquille Morris** (745 career points) is on pace to reach 1,000 points as a Shocker. He would be the club's 46th member and the ninth since Marshall's arrival.

HOME SWEET HOME

► Wichita State's on-campus home, Charles Koch Arena [pronounced "Coke"], is often referred to as "**the Roundhouse**" for its unique circular shape. The building opened in December, 1955 and the 2017-18 season will mark its 62nd season of use.

► The Shockers have won just over three-quarters of their games in the arena all-time, at **692-216**.

► WSU's rise to national relevance began in 2003 with the completion of the *Roundhouse Renaissance*. A \$25 million dollar construction project turned an aging Henry Levitt Arena into one of college basketball's best home environments. The building reopened as *Charles Koch Arena* for the start of the 2003-04 season.

► In the **15** seasons since the renovation, the Shockers are **190-34** on campus. That includes a **141-20** mark under Gregg Marshall.

► WSU has won **61** of its last **62** games at Charles Koch Arena over the last five seasons. The lone loss came to Northern Iowa on Feb. 13, 2016 and snapped a school-record 43-game home winning streak... **59** of those **62** games have come in front of capacity crowds (10,506).

► Throw in a 5-1 record at downtown INTRUST Bank Arena, and WSU is **94-5 (.949)** overall in Wichita since the start of the 2011-12 campaign.

► WSU has won 12-straight overall at home, last losing to Oklahoma State on Dec. 17, 2016 at INTRUST Bank Arena. This is the **21st** double-digit home streak in school history and the **19th** of the Roundhouse Era (1955-Pr.).

► WSU has won **21**-straight at Charles Koch Arena. It's the third-longest streak in the building's 62+ year history. From November, 2013 to February, 2016, the Shockers won **40**-in-a-row at the Roundhouse.

HOME COOKIN'

► The Shockers have won **21**-in-a-row at Charles Koch Arena, dating back to February 2016, and led by double-figures at halftime in every one of those games. During the streak, the Shockers have outscored opponents by an average of **30.6** points, outrebounded them by **11.7** per contest.

► The Shockers were unbeaten in 16 games at Koch Arena in 2016-17. They led wire-to-wire in 10 of the games and trailed for a combined **9:22** in the other six. ► WSU has been outrebounded just **15** times at Charles Koch Arena under Marshall (**161** games).

LOUD NOISES

► Charles Koch Arena has played host to **199**-consecutive regular season crowds of **10,000+**, dating back to December of 2004.

► The Shockers' **45**-game campus sellout streak ended on Nov. 29 when the ticket office reported 70 unsold general admission seats. That run began on Senior Day 2013 and lasted for nearly three-and-half years.

► WSU has sold out its last nine home games, dating back to last year.

► 2017-18 season tickets are sold out, marking the **fifth** consecutive year that WSU has unloaded its entire allotment (just over 9,000 total).

► WSU's home court advantage is owed largely to the school's passionate fan base, with a little assist from science. The arena's circular shape and highly-reflective dome roof amplifies sound and funnels it downward toward center court.

TESTING THE NBA WATERS

▶ **Markis McDuffie, Shaquille Morris and Zach Brown** put their names in the NBA Draft pool last summer without hiring an agent. All three later withdrew and returned to Wichita State.

ROAD WARRIORS

▶ Since the start of the 2013-14 season, the Shockers own the most road wins (**41-6**) and highest percentage (**.872**) in Division I.

▶ WSU has been the decade's best road team at **67-14 (.827)** since 2010-11 campaign.

▶ The Shockers' enter 2017-18 with one of the nation's 10-longest road winning streaks (**6**).

▶ WSU was one of just **six** Division I teams with double-digit road wins in 2016-17. They've hit that mark in **three** of the last four years.

▶ From 2013-14 to 2016-17, WSU recorded more double-figure road wins in conference play (**25**) than any other school had total road wins. Illinois State (**18**) was the closest.

WINNING WAYS:

▶ Wichita State has reached the 30-win mark in **four** of the last five seasons – more than any other program in college basketball. The feat has been matched just five other times in NCAA history.

▶ From 2012-13 to 2016-17, WSU's **152** wins and **.840** percentage were second only to Gonzaga.

▶ In their first 10 seasons under **Gregg Marshall**, the Shockers averaged **26.1** wins per season.

▶ Marshall has led the Shockers to eight-straight 25-win seasons. Kansas (12), Gonzaga (10), Duke (10) and VCU (8) are the only others with comparable streaks.

▶ With its inclusion in the 2017-18 preseason poll, WSU has cracked the AP top-25 in each of the last **seven** years.

MARCH HAPPINESS:

▶ The Shockers have appeared in **six**-straight NCAA Tournaments (a school record).

▶ WSU is one of just **five** schools that have won a game in each of the last **five** NCAA Tournaments, joining North Carolina, Kansas, Oregon and Gonzaga.

▶ The Shockers have won **10** NCAA Tournament games in that span, highlighted by a 2013 Final Four and 2015 Sweet 16. High-profile victims include Pittsburgh, Gonzaga, Ohio State, Indiana, Kansas and Arizona.

▶ The Shockers are one of **seven** teams that have averaged **2+** NCAA Tournament victories over that span: UNC (3.0), Wisconsin (2.6), Louisville (2.4), Duke (2.4), WSU (2.0), Michigan (2.0) and Arizona (2.0).

ONE (OR TWO) PUNCH

▶ The Shockers have finished first or second in their conference standings in each of the last **eight** seasons. Only three Division I schools (Gonzaga, 20; Kansas, 17; and Belmont, 12) have longer active streaks.

▶ The Shockers won or shared the regular season crown in **five** of their last six MVC seasons and finished with a **four**-peat, dropping just **four** conference games in **four** years to close out their tenure.

▶ WSU's **68-4** mark (**.944**) over the last four seasons is the highest conference winning percentage of any team in the nation.

▶ Heading into 2017-18, **Gregg Marshall's** 455 career wins were the eighth-most ever recorded by a head coach in his first 19 seasons.

▶ Marshall is one of 11 coaches to win 450+ games in his first 19 seasons, joining a list that includes **Bill Self, Tom Izzo, Roy Williams, Jerry Tarkanian, John Calipari, Nolan Richardson, Jim Boeheim, Tubby Smith and Billy Donovan**.

NUMBER SEVEN WITH SEVEN PLUS SEVEN?

▶ **Gregg Marshall** shoots to become just the **seventh** coach in NCAA history lead **two** different schools to **7+** NCAA Tournament appearances. He took Winthrop dancing **seven** times in nine years and has led WSU to **six**.

Marshall is currently one of **nine** coaches with **6+** trips at multiple schools.

KEN POM-POMS

▶ Ken Pomeroy's website is considered the gold standard for advanced analytics in college basketball. Since 2012, WSU has logged **six**-consecutive **top-20** finishes in KenPom's annual rankings – a feat matched by just **three** others schools (Kansas, Louisville and Duke).

AWESOME OFFENSE

The 2016-17 Shockers were arguably Marshall's best offensive team in two decades of coaching.

▶ The Shockers averaged **81.0** points per game last year – highest by a WSU team since 1983 when **Xavier McDaniel** and **Antoine Carr** shared the floor.

▶ WSU ranked **13th** nationally on Ken Pomeroy's offensive efficiency chart (**1.18** points per possession).

▶ The Shockers hit a school-record **310** three-pointers last year. **Eight** different Shockers hit double-digit threes for the year, led by Frankamp (**73**) and Shamet (freshman school record, **72**) who combined for just under half of the team total while shooting at a **.439** clip.

▶ WSU ranked **second** nationally in scoring margin last year (**+18.6**), behind national runner-up Gonzaga.

▶ The Shockers scored **80** a school-record **23** times.

▶ WSU was the first MVC team since 1994 Tulsa to average north of 80 points per game, and its **2,916** points was the second-highest total in league history behind Larry Bird's 1979 Indiana State Sycamores.

**THEY MIGHT BE ARE GIANTS**

► **Gregg Marshall** calls Shocker freshman **Asbjørn Midtgaard** the most physically imposing player that he's ever coached. The Danish to English translation of his first name is, quite fittingly, "God's Bear."

► Midtgaard is the sixth seven-footer in Shocker history and the third to play for Gregg Marshall at WSU, joining **Ehimen Orupke** (starting center on the Shockers' 2013 Final Four team) and **Garrett Stutz** (a first team all-conference pick as a senior in 2012). **Greg Dreiling** played 10 seasons in the NBA but transferred from WSU at the end of his freshman season.

► Is Midtgaard the most imposing Shocker ever? Perhaps not. 7-foot-1 **Paul "Big Show" Wight**, averaged 2 points 2 rebounds as a reserve center for the Shockers during the 1991-92 season before applying his talents to the wrestling ring. The seven-time world champion is one of WWE's longest-tenured stars.

► Heading into the 2017-18 season, 24 D-I play-by-play announcers have been at their current posts for at least 30 years. WSU's **Mike Kennedy** (38th season) is tied for eighth on the active list. The season opener will be his 1,157th consecutive regular season game.

► Wichita State radio broadcasters of Kennedy (pbp) and **Dave Dahl** (analyst) begin their 37th season working home games together. The pair have the second longest tenure in Division I basketball, trailing only Pittsburgh's 39-year duo of Bill Hillgrove and Dick Groat. Dahl missed the 2011-12 season during a successful campaign for district court judge, but the tandem has otherwise been in place since 1980-81.

WUSHOCK: A TRUE ORIGINAL

Legend has it that the name "Shockers" first appeared in 1904 on a poster advertising a football game between Wichita State-then Fairmount College-and the Chilocco Indians. The team's manager chose the name because many of the players earned money during the off season harvesting (or "shocking") wheat in the surrounding fields... When it came time to bring the name to life, students created WuShock – a big, bad, muscle-bound bundle of wheat – whose name was derived from a period in time when the university was simply known as Wichita University or WU.

WUSHOCK NAMED NCAA'S TOP MASCOT

The 2017-18 college basketball season kicks off this month, but Wichita State already has a title. In the six weeks leading up to the 2017-18 season, College Court Report operated its 4th Annual Mascot Mayhem Challenge, in search of the NCAA's Top Mascot. In a bracket-style tournament, 68 of the top mascots from across the country were randomly selected into four regions, and fans voted each week for their favorites. When the dust settled on Nov. 5, the only mascot still standing was WuShock.

SHOCKERS ACTIVE IN FALL SIGNING PERIOD

Wichita State received letters of intent from six Class of 2018 prospects during the fall signing period.

**AMERICAN POWER**

► Since its four seasons, The American has produced 12 NCAA Tournament teams, highlighted by UConn's 2014 National Championship.

► The American boasted a pair of 30-win teams last year in Cincinnati and SMU. Both finished in the top-25 and made the NCAA Tournament. Four others (UCF, UConn, Houston and Temple) earned top-25 votes over the course of the year.

► Nine of the 12 American head coaches have reached an NCAA Tournament, and four of them have led a team to the Final Four (WSU's Gregg Marshall, UConn's Kevin Ollie, Houston's Kelvin Sampson and Memphis' Tubby Smith).

TO OLD FRIENDS AND NEW BEGINNINGS

► Wichita State's move to the American reunites the Shockers with four of its former rivals from the Missouri Valley Conference: Cincinnati (1957-70), Houston (1950-60), Memphis (1967-73) and Tulsa (1945-96).

► WSU and Tulsa enjoyed a fierce basketball rivalry in the 1980s and have continued to play regularly in the non-conference. This fall, the two athletic departments announced plans for an official rivalry series "Havoc in the Heartland."

► Cincinnati's Oscar Robertson still holds the Roundhouse's single-game scoring record (50 points in 1958). March 1 marks the 60th anniversary of that performance. Fittingly, the Bearcats' first American Era visit to Wichita comes just three days later.

► The Shockers' visit to Houston will be their first since 1960. They last played at Memphis in 1983.

ALL-TIME

► Wichita State enters its 112th men's basketball season with an all-time record of 1,540-1,180.

► In 72 seasons as a member of the MVC, WSU won 11 regular season titles and put together a 591-502 record in league play.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

► WSU teams have appeared in 14 NCAA Tournaments with Final Fours in 1965 and 2013 and regional runner-up finishes in 1964 and 1981.

► The Shockers have reached the postseason 27 times, including a current-run of nine-straight dating back to a 2009 CBI appearance. The Shockers won the 2011 NIT Championship and followed it up with six-consecutive NCAA bids.

INDIVIDUAL STANDOUTS

► Five Shockers have their jersey numbers hanging in the rafters: #13 **Cleo Littleton** (1951-55), #45 **Dave Stallworth** (1961-65), #45 **Cliff Levingston** (1979-82), #35 **Antoine Carr** (1979-83) and #44 **Xavier McDaniel** (1981-85).

► Teammates on WSU's first NCAA Tournament team in 1964, Stallworth and **Nate Bowman** teamed up again to help the 1970 New York Knicks to an NBA title.

► Charles Koch Arena has long been referred to as "*the house that Stallworth built.*" The former All-American passed away last March on the eve of WSU's NCAA Tournament opener against Dayton. Former teammates are in the process of fundraising for a life-size statue of Stallworth to be placed near the arena's main entrance.

► McDaniel, Levingston and Carr all played more than a decade in the NBA. Levingston was a member of the Chicago Bulls' first two NBA Championship teams while playing alongside Michael Jordan. Carr helped the Utah Jazz to a pair of runner-up finishes in 1997 and 1998.

► A member of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, **Ralph Miller** won 220 games in 13 years on the Shocker bench (1951-64) and led the Shockers to their first NCAA Tournament in 1964. He's the second-winningest coach in program history behind Marshall (who surpassed his total in February, 2016). When Miller retired from Oregon State in 1989, at the close of a 38-year career, he was the eighth-winningest coach in NCAA history (674-370).

2018 & 2021 TOURNAMENTS COME TO WICHITA

► Wichita State will serve as co-host for First and Second Round action in the 2018 and 2021 NCAA Men's Basketball Championships at downtown INTRUST Bank Arena.

► This year marks the men's tournament's first stop in Wichita since 1994. Headliners that year at the old Kansas Coliseum included Michigan's Fab Five (minus Chris Webber) and John Calipari-led UMass. The second-seeded Minutemen fell to No. 10 seed Maryland in the second round.

PLAYING ANGRY

Head coach Gregg Marshall has developed a unique appreciation for WSU basketball history, even as he continues to write new chapters. Since his arrival, the 11th-year Shocker coach has made it a point to reach out to WSU basketball alums, such as NBA stars Xavier McDaniel, Antoine Carr and Cliff Levingston, who helped form the backbone of some of WSU's greatest teams in the early 1980s. While addressing the team midway through the 2012-13 season, Carr challenged Marshall's Shockers to "Play Angry." That message sank in, and the slogan gained national attention during the team's run to the Final Four later in the year.
