## WOMEN'S BASKETBALL: POSTGAME NOTES No. 25 California 89, San Diego 64

- Junior forward/center Kristine Anigwe finished the night a game-high 26 points, 10 of which came in the first quarter and 16 in the first half. This marks Anigwe's third 20-point outing of the season and the 37<sup>th</sup> of her career
- Anigwe finished the game 11-14 from the field, her third consecutive game shooting 75 percent or better from the floor. Baylor's Kalani Brown is the only player in Division I with a longer such streak this season (minimum. 5 FG), shooting 75% or better from the floor in four consecutive games.
- After missing two of her first free field goal attempts, Anigwe finished the game 10-11 from the field, including a streak of 8 consecutive made field goals from midway through the first quarter to late in the third.
- Anigwe is averaging nearly a point per minute over the last three games, scoring 68 points in her last 74 minutes of action (22.7 PPG and 24.7 Minutes per game over last three games)
- Cal shot 69.1 percent (38-55) from the field as a team, the team's highest field goal percentage and just shy of breaking the program single-game record of 69.3 percent (52-75) set on December 6, 2015 against Sacramento State.
- Cal's 69.1 field goal percentage is the third-highest single-game mark by any team in Division I since the start of last season.

- Junior guard Asha Thomas added 13 points for the Bears, going 5-7 from the floor and 3-4 from beyond the arc. Thomas is shooting 54.5 percent (19-33) from downtown over the last five games after shooting just 15.4 percent (2-13) from three in her first three outings
- Senior forward Penina Davidson also tallied 13 points for the Bears after scoring just 10 points in her previous three games combined
- Senior guard Mikayla Cowling made her 100<sup>th</sup> consecutive start for the Golden Bears, a streak that began on December 13, 2014 against Long Beach State. Cowling has now appeared in a total of 107 games in her Cal career, totaling 1,033 points and 383 assists.

- Freshman guard Asha Thomas dished out a team-high seven assists, her fifth consecutive game with five or more assists. The rookie from Moreno Valley, California is now averaging 5.0 assist per game on the season, the most by any freshman in the Pac-12 and good for 8<sup>th</sup> among all freshmen in Division I this season.
