## NEED TO KNOW

The Cal baseball team opens the 2019 season with four games in the Angels College Classic in Tempe, Ariz., beginning with Friday's opener against Cal State Bakersfield at 3 p.m. (MT). That's followed by Saturday's 6 p.m. (MT) game vs. Pepperdine, Sunday's 11 a.m. (MT) game vs. Northwestern and Monday's 11 a.m. (MT) contest vs. BYU. Three of those four will be played at Tempe Diablo Stadium, with Saturday's game taking place at Grand Canyon University in Phoenix.

After the College Classic, Cal will travel to Cal Poly for a three-game series beginning Feb. 22 and then opens the home schedule with a two-game set against Saint Mary's on Feb. 28.

The Bears went 32-22 (16-14 Pac-12) in 2018 and finished fifth in the conference in their first season under head coach Mike Neu. It marked their best conference finish since tying for third in 2015, and the eighth time in the past 12 seasons that Cal finished with a winning record overall. The Bears return 18 players from last season, including 2018 Golden Spikes Award winner Andrew Vaughn at first base and the rest of their starting infield.

Cal went 1-3 last season in neutral site games.

## BY THE NUMBERS

**57** Cal finished second in the Pac-12 last season with 57 home runs, trailing only eventual national champion Oregon State (67). Returning 1B Andrew Vaughn led the way with 23 long balls, but the only other Bear to reach double figures was Jonah Davis, and he's now playing in the Pirates' farm system.

**.819** The slugging percentage last season for Andrew Vaughn, which set a Cal single-season record. Vaughn also hit .402, which ranked third in school history, and drove in 63 runs in winning Pac-12 Player of the Year honors. His .531 on-base percentage was good for fourth in the country.

**14** The number of freshmen on the Bears' roster this season. Lots of newcomers will be expected to contribute, especially on the pitching staff. Only three pitchers return who threw more than 7 innings last season.

**.983** The fielding percentage posted by 2B Darren Baker last season as a freshman. Baker committed just three errors and returns in 2019 as an infield anchor. He hit .273 over 172 at-bats. Darren is the son of Dusty Baker, a longtime major leaguer and three-time National League Manager of the Year.

**2** Cal will play just two of its first 14 games on its home field. After their four games in the College Classic, the Bears play three at Cal Poly, then play a four-game home-and-home series with Saint Mary's and travel to Baton Rouge for a three-game set at national power LSU.

**BEAR NECESSITIES: CAL'S STORYLINES****SCOUTING THE ROADRUNNERS**

**Series history:** Cal swept a four-game series between the schools last season, outscoring CSUB 58-13 overall. The Bears are 5-0 vs. the Roadrunners all-time.

**CSU Bakersfield's 2018 Record:** 21-36, 10-14 WAC

- The Roadrunners welcome 19 newcomers to a 35-man roster, with 12 of them transferring in from junior colleges.

- Senior catcher Jake Ortega and senior outfielder Noah Barba both were named to the preseason All-WAC team by Perfect Game USA and College Baseball Daily.

- Ortega hit .245 with 30 runs scored last season, throwing out 13 base stealers. Barba hit .300 with a .761 OPS as a junior.

**SCOUTING THE WAVES**

**Series history:** Cal swept a three-game series at Pepperdine in 2017, winning by scores of 12-7, 3-2 and 3-1. The Bears are 20-22 all-time vs. Pepperdine.

**Pepperdine's 2018 Record:** 31-24, 17-10 WCC

- The Waves were picked to finish second in the conference this season by a vote of WCC coaches.

- Pepperdine has quality experience returning on the mound. RHP Jonathan Pendergast was the WCC Pitcher of the Year in 2018, going 7-4 with a 2.69 ERA. Fellow righty Cooper Chandler was the WCC Freshman of the Year, posting a 6-3 record and 3.99 ERA.

- 2B Quincy McAfee was a second-team all-conference pick last season, hitting .269 with a team-high 18 doubles.

**SCOUTING THE WILDCATS**

**Series history:** Cal is 6-0 all-time vs. Northwestern  
**Northwestern's 2018 Record:** 17-32, 6-18 Big Ten

- Northwestern returns 20 players from last year, including a strong core of pitching.

- Junior RHP Hank Christie was 3-5 with a 4.61 ERA in 2018 but was named to the All-Freshman Big Ten team in 2017.

- Senior SS Jack Dunn earned All-Big Ten honors last season when he hit a team-high .314 with 21 stolen bases, which also led the Wildcats.

- Junior 2B Alex Erro also was a staple of last season's lineup and should form a solid defensive core up the middle alongside Dunn.

- 1B Willie Bourbon will help anchor the offense. Last season as a junior, Bourbon finished second on the team in home runs (six), RBI (34) and slugging percentage (.455).

**SCOUTING THE COUGARS**

**Series history:** The Bears are 12-8 all-time vs. BYU. They claimed a 1-0 win last May in Berkeley when Max Flower drove in the game's only run.

**BYU's 2018 Record:** 22-28, 11-16 WCC

- Senior OF Brock Hale was picked by D1baseball.com as the preseason West Coast Conference Player of the Year. Conference coaches picked Hale for the preseason All-WCC team after he hit a team-high .342 last season. That earned Hale all-conference honors in 2018. Perfect Game lists Hale as the "best pure hitter" in the WCC.

- Keaton Kringlen, another senior outfielder, hit .305 last season, one of three Cougars who topped the .300 mark.

- Jordan Wood returns for his senior season to help anchor the rotation. Last year he went 5-4 with a 2.66 ERA.

**NEXT UP**

After the Angels College Classic, Cal will travel to Cal Poly for a three-game weekend series Feb. 22-24. The Bears are 41-13 vs. the Mustangs all-time. They last played in 2017, with Cal taking two of three to open its season.

**THE SECOND ACT**

Mike Neu begins his second season as head coach in Berkeley, looking to build on some positive momentum from 2018. The Bears improved from 25-29 in 2017 to 32-22 in their first season under Neu, who served as Cal's pitching coach from 2012-15 and then served as head coach at UOP for two seasons before taking over the Bears program. That 32-22 mark (.593) is the best record by a first-year Cal coach, in terms of winning percentage, since Clint Evans went 12-3 (.800) way back in 1930. But incredibly, the Bears have had just six different head baseball coaches over that 89-year span.

Neu attended the University of Miami and helped the Hurricanes to the 1999 College World Series title. He spent two seasons in the major leagues, posting a career 3.72 ERA as a reliever with the Oakland A's and Florida Marlins.

**KEEPING A GOOD THING GOING**

Cal finished on a strong note in 2018, winning seven of its final 10 games to finish 15-15 in Pac-12 play and a tie for fifth in the conference. That accounted for Cal's third top-five finish in conference play over the past four years.

**FRESH(MEN) FACES**

The Bears' 36-man roster includes a whopping 14 freshmen. Ten of those newcomers are pitchers, and the lack of returning experience on the staff means many of those pitchers will be holding down significant roles. Joe Ammirato, Lucas Gather, Sam Stoutenborough and Ian Villers are among the first-year players who could see time on the mound early on. All four signed with Cal in November 2017.

**PRESEASON ACCOLADES**

After winning the 2018 Golden Spikes Award as the nation's top amateur baseball player, the honors continue to role in for 1B Andrew Vaughn. He has been named to the preseason watch list for the 2019 Golden Spikes Award, and the Santa Rosa native is a preseason first-team All-American by Baseball America, D1baseball.com and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Vaughn spent the past two summers playing with the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, and he hit .308 for the Wareham Gatemen of the Cape Cod League in 2018.

**MEMBER OF THE FAMILY**

Matt Flemer joins Cal's coaching staff to assist Neu with the pitchers. It's a homecoming for Flemer, who was a key reliever on the 2011 Cal squad that made an improbable run to the College World Series. Flemer went 4-2 with a 1.83 ERA that season and notched six saves in a team-high 30 appearances. He went on to play seven seasons in the Rockies organization, reaching Triple-A and posting a 43-40 record over 143 career outings.

## WELCOME BACK

All four starters around the horn return for Cal's infield. Andrew Vaughn anchors the unit at first base as the reigning Pac-12 Player of the Year. Sophomore Darren Baker looks to build on an impressive freshman campaign at second base. He'll have the same double play partner from 2018 in junior shortstop Cameron Eden. And sophomore Sam Wezniak returns at the hot corner. Corey Lee takes over at catcher in his junior season. He started 28 games last season, and his five homers ranked fourth on the team.

## RUNS IN THE FAMILY

Darren Baker established himself as the Bears' second baseman during his freshman season. The left-handed swinging Baker hit .273 with six doubles, one homer, 23 RBI, 29 runs and five stolen bases. His lone homer was an early-season walk-off shot against Brown, and the Granite Bay native had 16 multiple-hit games, including four with three hits. Defensively, he provided a steady glove with a .983 fielding percentage and committed just three errors.

Baker is the son of 19-year Major League outfielder Dusty Baker, who won three Manager of the Year awards while skippering the San Francisco Giants.

## THE WORKHORSE

As the Bears sort out their young pitching staff, junior Jared Horn lends a stabilizing force with his experience. The right-hander enters the season with 30 collegiate starts under his belt. As a sophomore, he went 5-5 with a 6.15 ERA. But

he had some shining moments. The Napa native threw five scoreless innings to get the 'W' in a season-opening victory over the University of San Diego. He rang up a career-high nine strikeouts in beating Cal State Bakersfield. Overall, Horn made six starts in which he went at least five innings and surrendered two or fewer earned runs.

## DOUBLE DUTY

Freshman Grant Holman has a chance to help out at the plate and on the mound. The 6-foot-6 right-hander also plays first base and figures to see time as the designated hitter. A native of Chula Vista, Calif., Holman went 29-1 with a 1.10 ERA over his career at Eastlake High School. He was just as dominant with a bat in his hands, hitting .390 with 20 homers during his prep career. As a junior, he was named the CIF San Diego Section Player of the Year.

Turn back the clock further, and Holman grabbed headlines by throwing a no-hitter for Chula Vista in the 2013 Little League World Series. The game went seven innings, making Holman the first pitcher to throw an extra-inning no-hitter during the LLWS since 1979.

## DRAFT CLASS

The Bears continue to send players into the professional ranks, with five selected in the Major League Baseball draft last June. Outfielder Tanner Dodson was selected in the Competitive Balance Round B (71st overall) by the Tampa Bay Rays, pitcher Aaron Shortridge (fourth round)

and outfielder Jonah Davis (15th round) went to the Pirates, catcher Tyrus Greene was picked by the White Sox in the 16th round and pitcher Joey Matulovich went in the 20th round to the Milwaukee Brewers. It marked the second time in the past three drafts that five or more Cal players were selected.

## MULTI-TASKER

The outfield corps gets a boost this season from the addition of Brandon McIlwain, a redshirt sophomore who sat out 2018 after transferring from South Carolina. One of the best all-around athletes on the team, McIlwain spent the fall playing quarterback for Cal's football team.

He appeared in 10 games and completed 62 percent of his passes for 763 yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for 403 yards and four more scores. McIlwain appeared in eight games for the South Carolina baseball team in 2016 but didn't play in 2017. He also started three games at quarterback for the Gamecocks in 2016.

## ARMAN HAMMER

Lefty Arman Sabouri is likely to pitch often for the Bears, and in a variety of roles. As a sophomore last season, Sabouri appeared in 20 games and went 5-2 with a 3.07 ERA and one save. In 44.0 innings, he struck out 48 and walked just 11. He showed the ability to go multiple innings or match up against left-handed batters, and Cal will tap into Sabouri's versatility again. The southpaw could even draw occasional spot starts.
