NEED TO KNOW

Coming off its first shutout of the season, the Cal baseball team opens Pac-12 play with a three-game home series against USC that begins Friday night. The Bears enter the conference schedule with an 8-6 record and having routed San Jose State 13-0 in Berkeley on Tuesday. This weekend's series opens with a 7:05 p.m. Friday, followed by a 3:05 p.m. matchup Saturday and the finale Sunday at 1:05 p.m. Links for a live stream and live stats of each game can be found on the baseball schedule page at CalBears.com.

Cal received big performances on the mound and at the plate in Tuesday's win over San Jose State. Max Flower led the way offensively with four RBI, and eight of nine starters in the lineup registered at least one hit. Seven pitchers combined on a four-hitter, with junior Jared Horn making the start and tossing two scoreless innings in his first outing of 2019.

To no one's surprise, reigning Golden Spikes Award winner Andrew Vaughn paced the Bears offensively in non-conference play with some of the best all-around numbers in the country. The junior first baseman is hitting .426 (20-for-47) with seven homers and 20 RBI in 14 games to go along with a .603 on-base percentage that ranks second in the country.

The pitching staff ranks sixth in the Pac-12 with a 3.72 ERA and has issued the second-fewest walks in the conference at 40.

BY THE NUMBERS

.426 The Bears' .426 slugging percentage is third-best in the Pac-12 behind Arizona State (.572) and Arizona (.485). Their 14 homers rank second behind ASU's 27. Individually, Andrew Vaughn is slugging a team-best .894 to put him among the nation's leaders. He's followed by Brandon McIlwain (.541) and Cameron Eden (.513).

5 Arman Sabouri, who takes the hill in Friday's series opener, is averaging five strikeouts for every walk he issues. In his 14 2/3 innings pitched, the junior left-hander has struck out 15 and walked just three. Primarily a reliever in 2018, Sabouri has been utilized this season as an "opener," delivering anywhere from two to five innings in a starting role.

12 The number of batters Cal sent to the plate during a six-run seventh inning rally Tuesday against San Jose State. The Bears also batted around the order in the fourth inning. It marked the third and fourth times on the season that Cal has batted around in a single inning.

.423 Left fielder Cameron Eden is batting .423 (11-for-26) over his past seven games. The junior has heated up ever since taking over in the leadoff spot March 1 against Saint Mary's. Overall, Eden is hitting .333 with two homers and nine RBI in 12 games.

7 Andrew Vaughn has hit seven home runs and he's struck out just seven times in 69 plate appearances. For much of the season, his homers have actually outnumbered his strikeouts, speaking to the bat skills that currently have him projected as a top-five overall draft pick this June.

BEAR NECESSITIES: CAL'S STORYLINES**SCOUTING THE TROJANS**

Last meeting: USC took two out of three in Los Angeles last May, winning by scores of 11-4 and 9-8. Cal won its game 6-2.
USC 2018 Record: 26-28, 12-18 Pac-12

- USC lost two of three games during last weekend's Dodger Stadium College Baseball Classic. The Trojans fell to Oklahoma State 11-6, then beat No. 16 Michigan 4-1 and lost to No. 2 UCLA, 7-5.
- CF Matthew Acosta is hitting a team-high .339 from the No. 3 spot in the order with 1 HR and 10 RBI. He's also sporting a team-best .464 on-base percentage.
- 1B Jamal O'Guinn is second behind Acosta in batting at .320, with 1 HR and 11 RBI.
- C CJ Stubbs is hitting .309 with 1 HR, 8 RBI and a team-high .509 slugging percentage.
- USC has taken its lumps so far with a 5-10 record, but the team has shown a flair for the dramatic with two walk-off victories over Arkansas and Omaha.

NEXT UP

The Bears will conclude their five-game homestand Tuesday night against USF.

THE SECOND ACT

Mike Neu is in his second season as head coach in Berkeley, looking to build on some positive momentum from 2018. The Bears improved from 25-29 in 2017 to 32-22 in their first season under Neu, who served as Cal's pitching coach from 2012-15 and then served as head coach at UOP for two seasons before taking over the Bears program. That 32-22 mark (.593) is the best record by a first-year Cal coach, in terms of winning percentage, since Clint Evans went 12-3 (.800) way back in 1930. But incredibly, the Bears have had just six different head baseball coaches over that 89-year span.

Neu attended the University of Miami and helped the Hurricanes to the 1999 College World Series title. He spent two seasons in the major leagues, posting a career 3.72 ERA as a reliever with the Oakland A's and Florida Marlins.

KEEPING A GOOD THING GOING

Cal finished on a strong note in 2018, winning seven of its final 10 games to finish 16-14 in Pac-12 play and a tie for fifth in the conference. That accounted for Cal's third top-five finish in conference play over the past four years.

FRESH(MEN) FACES

The Bears' 35-man roster includes a whopping 14 freshmen. Ten of those newcomers are pitchers, and the lack of returning experience on the staff means many of those pitchers are holding down significant roles. Their performance to this point has been an early-season bright spot.

Sean Sullivan has assumed a late-inning role and has allowed just one earned run over 8.0 innings pitched in five appearances.

Another right-hander, Sam Stoutenborough, has impressed in long relief, surrendering just four earned runs over 14 2/3 innings in his last three outings. Ian Villers is also poised to hold down a spot at the back end of the bullpen.

THIS LOOKS FAMILIAR

After winning the 2018 Golden Spikes Award as the nation's top amateur baseball player, the honors continue to role in for junior 1B Andrew Vaughn. He was named to the preseason watch list for the 2019 Golden Spikes Award, and the Santa Rosa native was a preseason first-team All-American by Baseball America, D1baseball.com and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Vaughn spent the past two summers playing with the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team.

So far this season, he's off to one of the best starts of any hitter in the country. He brings a .426 average (20-for-47) into the weekend with seven homers and 20 RBI in 14 games.

MEMBER OF THE FAMILY

Matt Flemer joined Cal's coaching staff this season to assist Neu with the pitchers. It's a homecoming for Flemer, who was a key reliever on the 2011 Cal squad that made an improbable run to the College World Series. Flemer went 4-2 with a 1.83 ERA that season and notched six saves in a team-high 30 appearances. He went on to play seven seasons in the Rockies organization, reaching Triple-A and posting a 43-40 record over 143 career outings.

WHERE THEY RANK

The first RPI baseball rankings were released this week and Cal came in a very respectable 57th out of 299 Division I schools. That placed the Bears sixth among Pac-12 programs.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY

Darren Baker established himself as the Bears' second baseman during his freshman season, and the sophomore is off to an impressive start this year. The left-handed swinging Baker has been on a tear of late, going 11-for-24 with five RBI over his past six games. For the season, he's hitting .305 and has reached base safely in all 14 games.

Baker hit .273 with six doubles, one homer, 23 RBI, 29 runs and five stolen bases as a freshman. Defensively, he provided a steady glove with a .983 fielding percentage and committed just three errors.

The sophomore began this season batting leadoff but has hit in the No. 5 spot for the past six games. Darren is the son of 19-year Major League outfielder Dusty Baker, who won three Manager of the Year awards while skipping the San Francisco Giants.

MR. CLUTCH

Junior catcher Korey Lee came through big in a Feb. 24 win at Cal Poly. Twice, the Mustangs intentionally walked Andrew Vaughn to load the bases, and twice Lee made them pay with two-RBI hits. On Saturday at LSU, Vaughn again was walked intentionally and Lee followed with an RBI single

that helped key a 5-2 victory.

Behind the plate, Lee has thrown out four would-be base stealers.

WELCOME BACK

Right-hander Jared Horn was expected to be a veteran leader of the starting rotation coming out of the gate this season. But a day before the opener, Horn fell ill and wound up having an appendectomy in Phoenix. On Tuesday, Horn made his 2019 debut and delivered two scoreless innings against San Jose State. He'll be an important piece of the staff moving forward, bringing experience to a group relying heavily on freshmen.

EARLY IMPACT

Freshman Grant Holman has been a solid contributor as a two-way player, and he's really stood out on the mound. The 6-foot-6 right-hander has impressed in three consecutive starts. On Feb. 24, he threw five scoreless innings against Cal Poly. Then he tossed six strong innings Sunday at Saint Mary's for his first collegiate win. On Saturday at LSU, he earned the victory with six innings of two-run ball.

But this isn't the first time Holman has drawn attention on the mound. He threw a no-hitter for Chula Vista in the 2013 Little League World Series. The game went seven innings, making Holman the first pitcher to throw an extra-inning no-hitter during the LLWS since 1979.

When he's not pitching, Holman serves as Cal's

regular designated hitter and he's batting .250 with one homer and 9 RBI.

DRAFT CLASS

The Bears continue to send players into the professional ranks, with five selected in the Major League Baseball draft last June. Outfielder Tanner Dodson was selected in the Competitive Balance Round B (71st overall) by the Tampa Bay Rays, pitcher Aaron Shortridge (fourth round) and outfielder Jonah Davis (15th round) went to the Pirates, catcher Tyrus Greene was picked by the White Sox in the 16th round and pitcher Joey Matulovich went in the 20th round to the Milwaukee Brewers. It marked the second time in the past three drafts that five or more Cal players were selected.

MULTI-TASKER

Outfielder Brandon McIlwain is busy these days, participating in spring football practice in the morning and focusing on baseball in the afternoon. A transfer from South Carolina who sat out last baseball season, he appeared in 10 games at quarterback in the fall for the Bears and completed 62 percent of his passes for 763 yards and two touchdowns

McIlwain flashed his potential on the diamond Feb. 22, finishing just a homer short of the cycle against Cal Poly. His second-inning double accounted for his first hit in an official college baseball game since 2016.

After seeing time in right field early in the season,

McIlwain has settled in as the regular center fielder. He's playing as a redshirt sophomore.

ARMAN HAMMER

Lefty Arman Sabouri was an effective reliever last season for Cal, and the junior is proving his versatility so far in 2019. With the Bears foregoing a traditional starting rotation to this point, Sabouri has served as the "opener" for five of Cal's first 13 games and has also made one relief appearance. In six outings overall, Sabouri is 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA.

LIGHTS, CAMERON, ACTION

Junior Cameron Eden is the returning starting shortstop from last season. But after suffering a broken finger, he missed two games and has started the past eight in left field. Eden also assumed leadoff duties six games ago and has produced. He's hitting .333 with two homers and nine RBI in 11 games overall.

With Eden in left field, Sam Wezniak has shifted from third base to shortstop and Hance Smith is seeing most of the time at third.

SWING AND A MISS

Though the Bears' pitching staff is relying on several freshmen, junior right-hander Rogelio Reyes has been a key man to this point. He allowed three runs Saturday against LSU, but those were the first runs Reyes has surrendered in four outings. He's 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA and 18 strikeouts in 13.1 innings pitched.
