### NEED TO KNOW

Coming off a 1-2 weekend to open Pac-12 play, the Bears host USF in a nonconference game Tuesday night at 7:05 p.m. that's being broadcast live on the Pac-12 Network. Cal lost to USC on Friday and Saturday by scores of 9-4 and 1-0, but finished on a high note with an exciting 9-8 victory Sunday to avoid the sweep. Freshman reliever Jack Hinrichsen entered a one-run game in the top of the ninth with one out Sunday and stranded the bases loaded to seal the Bears' victory.

After being held to a combined 11 hits in the first two games of the series, Cal broke out offensively with four home runs Sunday – one each by Brandon McIlwain, Cameron Eden, Cole Elvis and Sean Sullivan. The Bears rank second in the Pac-12 in homers with 20, trailing only Arizona State (32). They're third in slugging percentage (.422), sixth in runs (106) and sixth in hitting (.270). Pitching-wise, Cal enters Tuesday with a 3.95 team ERA that ranks sixth in the conference. Where the Bears' young pitching staff has excelled is in limiting the free passes. They've issued the third-fewest walks in the Pac-12 at 55.

One player who's heating up in the middle of the order is junior catcher Korey Lee. Over his past eight games, Lee is batting .423 (11-for-26) with two homers and five RBI. Though junior first baseman Andrew Vaughn has been relatively quiet of late, going 6-for-24 over the past seven games, the reigning Golden Spikes Award winner has still posted some of the best across-the-board numbers of any hitter in college baseball.

### BY THE NUMBERS

**8** The Bears used eight pitchers to get through Sunday's win over USC, the most they have gone through all season. Their previous high was the seven they called upon in last Tuesday's 13-0 shutout of San Jose State. Making things more challenging Sunday was that scheduled starting pitcher Grant Holman left the mound during his warm-up pitches in the first due to a lat strain.

**10** Cal has 10 players who have homered at least once through the first 17 games. Leading the charge is Andrew Vaughn with seven. Leadoff man Cameron Eden has notched three and Korey Lee and Brandon McIlwain have each gone deep twice. Max Flower, Cole Elvis, Grant Holman, Sam Wezniak, Connor Mack and Sean Sullivan also have left the yard.

**1.93** The ERA for lefty Arman Sabouri. The junior has allowed just four earned runs in 18 2/3 innings. He's served a crucial role as Cal's primary "opener." Sabouri, primarily a reliever last season, has made six starts among his eight appearances, usually pitching just 2-3 innings in those assignments. But Sabouri did throw a season-high five innings in a March 8 start at LSU.

**8** Andrew Vaughn has struck out just eight times in 82 plate appearances this season. He's homered seven times, meaning the returning Pac-12 Player of the Year has gone deep just one less time than he's struck out.

**17** Right fielder Max Flower has reached base in all 17 games so far this season, the only Bear to accomplish that. Flower is hitting .279 (19-for-68) with a homer and 10 RBI. He's also drawn six walks and been hit by a pitch once. Flower generally serves as Cal's cleanup man and he racked up a season-high four RBI last Tuesday against San Jose State.

**BEAR NECESSITIES: CAL'S STORYLINES****SCOUTING THE DONS**

**Last meeting:** Cal swept two games from USF last season, winning 9-7 at home and 5-4 in San Francisco.  
**USF 2018 Record:** 28-30, 15-12 WCC

- The Dons are coming off a series win at home over Portland, winning by scores of 2-1 and 5-4. Those close victories sandwiched a lopsided 20-2 loss.
- Senior Riley Helland was a first-team all-conference pick last season as a catcher, hitting .329 with 34 RBI and a slugging percentage of .441. This year he's also seeing some time at first base and DH. Helland is off to a slow start, hitting .219 with a homer and 11 RBI.

**NEXT UP**

Cal hits the road for a three-game series starting Friday at Oregon State, the defending College World Series champions.

**THE SECOND ACT**

Mike Neu is in his second season as head coach in Berkeley, looking to build on some positive momentum from 2018. The Bears improved from 25-29 in 2017 to 32-22 in their first season under Neu, who served as Cal's pitching coach from 2012-15 and then served as head coach at UOP for two seasons before taking over the Bears program. That 32-22 mark (.593) is the best record by a first-year Cal coach, in terms of winning percentage, since Clint Evans went 12-3 (.800) way back in 1930. But incredibly, the Bears have had just six different head baseball coaches over that 89-year span.

Neu attended the University of Miami and helped the Hurricanes to the 1999 College World Series title. He spent two seasons in the major leagues, posting a career 3.72 ERA as a reliever with the Oakland A's and Florida Marlins.

**KEEPING A GOOD THING GOING**

Cal finished on a strong note in 2018, winning seven of its final 10 games to finish 15-15 in Pac-12 play and a tie for fifth in the conference. That accounted for Cal's third top-five finish in conference play over the past four years.

**FRESH(MEN) FACES**

The Bears' 35-man roster includes a whopping 14 freshmen. Ten of those newcomers are pitchers, and the lack of returning experience on the staff means many of those pitchers are holding down significant roles. Their performance to this point has been a bright spot.

Sam Stoutenborough has impressed in a long relief role, holding opponents to three earned runs or less in four of his five outings. In a sign of just how much Cal has relied on "openers" this season, Stoutenborough's 23.0 innings pitched leads the team though he has yet to start a game.

Fellow right-hander Sean Sullivan has assumed a late-inning role and leads the team with three saves. Ian Villers has also been slated for work at the back end of the 'pen.

Another freshman, Jack Hinrichsen, closed out Sunday's 9-8 victory over USC when he stranded the bases loaded after entering with one out in the

ninth.

**THIS LOOKS FAMILIAR**

After winning the 2018 Golden Spikes Award as the nation's top amateur baseball player, the honors continued to roll in for junior 1B Andrew Vaughn. He was named to the preseason watch list for the 2019 Golden Spikes Award, and the Santa Rosa native was a preseason first-team All-American by Baseball America, D1baseball.com and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Vaughn spent the past two summers playing with the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team.

So far this season, he's off to one of the best starts of any hitter in the country. He brings a .414 average (24-for-58) into Tuesday, with seven home runs, 20 RBI and 20 walks in 17 games.

**MEMBER OF THE FAMILY**

Matt Flemer joined Cal's coaching staff this season to assist Neu with the pitchers. It's a homecoming for Flemer, who was a key reliever on the 2011 Cal squad that made an improbable run to the College World Series. Flemer went 4-2 with a 1.83 ERA that season and notched six saves in a team-high 30 appearances. He went on to play seven seasons in the Rockies organization, reaching Triple-A and posting a 43-40 record over 143 career outings.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY**

Darren Baker established himself as the Bears' second baseman during his freshman season, and he's off to a solid start in his second year. The left-handed swinging Baker is batting .275. His 19 hits are tied for second on the club and he's tied for third in runs with 12. He's reached base safely in 16 of Cal's 17 games.

Baker hit .273 with six doubles, one homer, 23 RBI, 29 runs and five stolen bases as a freshman. His lone homer was an early-season walk-off shot against Brown, and the Granite Bay native had 16 multiple-hit games, including four with three hits. Defensively, he provided a steady glove with a .983 fielding percentage and committed just three errors.

The sophomore began this season batting leadoff but has slid into the No. 5 spot in recent weeks. Darren is the son of 19-year Major League outfielder Dusty Baker, who won three Manager of the Year awards while skipping the San Francisco Giants.

**MR. CLUTCH**

Junior catcher Korey Lee came through big in a Feb. 24 win at Cal Poly. Twice, the Mustangs intentionally walked Andrew Vaughn to load the bases, and twice Lee made them pay with two-RBI hits. He's been producing of late, going 11-for-26 with two HRs and five RBI over his last eight games. Behind the plate, Lee has thrown out five would-be base stealers.

**WELCOME BACK**

Right-hander Jared Horn was expected to be a veteran leader of the starting rotation coming out of the gate this season. But a day before the opener, Horn fell ill and wound up having an appendectomy in Phoenix. The junior missed the season's first month but made two starts last week as the "opener." Horn threw two scoreless innings against San Jose State and then tossed three innings of one-run ball Saturday vs. USC.

As a sophomore, he went 5-5 with a 6.15 ERA. But he had some shining moments. The Napa native threw five scoreless innings to get the 'W' in a season-opening victory over the University of San Diego. He rang up a career-high nine strikeouts in beating Cal State Bakersfield. .

**EARLY IMPACT**

Freshman Grant Holman was scheduled to start Sunday vs. USC, but he left before facing a hitter after suffering a lat strain during his warm-ups. That's a costly blow to the Bears because the 6-foot-6 right-hander has been their most effective starter. In three starts, Holman has allowed just four earned runs in 17 innings. He twice has gone six innings, the longest outings turned in by a Cal starter in 2019.

A two-way threat, Holman starts at DH when not pitching and he homered in his first collegiate game against CSU Bakersfield. He also delivered a two-run double that helped secure a win over BYU.

Holman first made a name for himself years ago. He threw a no-hitter for Chula Vista in the 2013 Little League World Series. The game went seven innings, making Holman the first pitcher to throw an extra-inning no-hitter during the LLWS since 1979.

**SULLIVAN THE SLUGGER**

Reliever Sean Sullivan found himself in the batter's box Sunday after Cal forfeited its DH against USC in the middle innings. Sullivan stepped up to the plate and fouled off a couple of pitches, working the count to 2-2. Then the 6-foot-1, 165-pound pitcher drove a two-run homer well over the left field wall in his first collegiate plate appearance. He was so excited he nearly missed first base on his home run trot, and teammates mobbed him when he crossed home plate.

**MULTI-TASKER**

Outfielder Brandon McIlwain has been busy in recent weeks, participating in spring football practice in the morning and focusing on baseball in the afternoon. A transfer from South Carolina who sat out last baseball season, he appeared in 10 games at quarterback in the fall for the Bears and completed 62 percent of his passes for 763 yards and two touchdowns

McIlwain flashed his potential on the diamond Feb. 22, finishing just a homer short of the cycle against Cal Poly. His second-inning double accounted for his first hit in an official college baseball game since 2016.

**ARMAN HAMMER**

Lefty Arman Sabouri was an effective reliever last season for Cal, and the junior is proving his versatility so far in 2019. With the Bears foregoing a traditional starting rotation to this point, Sabouri has served as the "opener" in six of Cal's first 17 games and has also made two relief appearances. In eight outings overall, Sabouri is 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA.

**LIGHTS, CAMERON, ACTION**

Junior Cameron Eden began this season as the starting shortstop but shifted to left field after suffering a fractured right index finger. Eden also assumed leadoff duties March 1 against Saint Mary's, and overall he's hitting .300 with three home runs and 11 RBI.

With Eden in left field, Sam Wezniak has shifted from third base to shortstop and Hance Smith is seeing most of the time at third.

**SWING AND A MISS**

Though the Bears' pitching staff is relying on several freshmen, junior right-hander Rogelio Reyes has been a key man to this point. All five of his appearances have come in relief. Reyes has eaten up 4.0, 4.1 and 5.0 innings in three of those outings while surrendering just three earned runs overall. He's struck out 21 in 18.2 innings.
