BEARS NECESSITIES

California continues its tour of in-state competition this week with a midweek home game versus UC Davis before heading to SoCal for more Pac-12 competition against top-ranked UCLA.

After a disappointing 0-2 weekend against Stanford, the Golden Bears (20-11, 1-4 Pac-12) hope to find favor against the Aggies (24-5) on Wednesday at 4 p.m. (PT) and then against the one-loss Bruins (28-1, 3-0) in a Friday-Sunday series.

The Bears-Aggies matchup has become quite a battle as of late, despite Cal's 28-6 series lead. Three of the last four outings have been decided by one-margin, with Cal coming out victorious in all four. Last time out, the Bears edged the visiting Aggies 3-2 in eight innings.

Cal will not have an easy inning this week as it looks for its first win against UCLA since 2013. Recently, Cal has been plagued by errors recording nine over the last four games, but the Bears boast the nation's hits leader (53) Lindsay Rood, who also tops the conference with 21 stolen bases.

BEAR BIDNESS

- Lindsay Rood's 53 hits leads the nation and she and teammate Destiny Blueford co-lead the Pac-12, along with Alyssa Barrera with four triples
- Rood, who was named Pac-12 Player of the Week on March 12 after going 11-for-17 (.647) in Honolulu, currently paces the Pac-12 with a .482 batting average, which ties for eighth nationally. She continues to top the league with 21 steals in as many attempts
- Mikayla Coelho leads the Bears with seven home runs, tied for 11th in the league, and her .522 on base percentage ranks third in the Pac-12 list. Her 22 walks is also the most in the league
- Coelho's .379 batting average ranks seventh in the league and she and fellow sophomore Karlee Sparacino top the Cal ledger with 25 RBI each
- Cal's defense have held opponents to a .221 batting average, but have collectively batted .319
- Cal's wins over No. 22 James Madison (7-2) and No. 24 Notre Dame (7-6) mark the first time the Bears have downed two non-conference top-25 opponents since 2016 when they outlasted No. 18 Kentucky (5-1) and another 24th-ranked Fighting Irish squad (8-7)
- Cal made a historic run from March 1-9 winning seven consecutive five-inning games, believed to be a program record
- Freshman Alexandra Perez's 2.26 ERA ranks 11th in the league behind a 5-0 record in 11 appearances and 40.1 innings of work
- Zoe Conley pitched her first no-hitter in a Bear's uniform on March 8 against St. Bonaventure in Honolulu; a 12-0 shutout for the Bears

- Cal's last two victories came on game-winning yard balls from junior Destiny Blueford (8-7 vs Utah in eight) and sophomore Karlee Sparacino (3-1 vs Sac State in nine)
- The Bears have done some of their best offensive work under pressure, recording 54 two-out RBIs so far this season

VS. UC DAVIS

- Led by senior infielder Meghan Bradbury's .358 batting average and impressive OBPS 1.196. Bradbury tops the UC Davis ledger with 29 hits and 29 RBI and has amassed a team-high nine doubles and seven homers
- Likely the No. 2 and No. 3 hitters, Marisa Given (.351) and Alyse Rojas (.342) have raked in 27 hits each and combined for 39 runs
- The circle is dominated by Brooke Yanez, who holds a 15-1 record and a notable 1.17 ERA which ranks 12th in the nation. As impressive is the sophomore's WHIP of 0.99
- The Aggies are on a five-game win streak headed into Wednesday's matchup

VS. UCLA

- UCLA checks in at No. 1 in all three national polls (NFCA/USA Softball/Softball America) this week for the third week in a row. The Bruins were selected first in the preseason Pac-12 Conference coaches poll
- Along with her Pac-12 Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week honors, redshirt junior Rachel Garcia was also named National Player of the Week by both the NFCA and USA Softball last Tuesday
- Redshirt junior Rachel Garcia, junior Bubba Nickles and redshirt sophomore Aaliyah Jordan were all named to the Top 50 Watch List for the 2019 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award, as announced by USA Softball on Jan. 30
- Aaliyah Jordan's 13 doubles co-leads the Pac-12 and is tied for fifth nationally
- UCLA's pitching staff holds the top-two spots in conference for ERA. Garcia's 0.50 tops the list and ranks second in the country and Megan Faraimo (1.22) comes in second in the league and 18th nationally
- The Bruins started off Pac-12 with a decisive series sweep in Seattle, taking down the then fifth-ranked Washington Huskies including a 15-6, five-inning run-rule in their getaway-day game

LAST GO AT LEVINE-FRICKE

Cal softball will soon have a new stadium to call home under a plan announced by Chancellor Christ in the summer of 2018. Demolition of the site is expected to begin in the fall of 2019, with the Golden Bears moving into their facility for the 2021 season. Located on the current site of Levine-Fricke Field, once completed, the new stadium will include expanded permanent seating for 1,500 fans, covered batting cages, locker rooms, a video board, restrooms, field lighting and an elevated press box, among other amenities. The facility will be configured to meet current field dimension standards, allowing Cal the ability to host NCAA postseason games.

KAMA CAN

Senior ace Kamalani Dung, competed for the Puerto Rican National team and won a gold medal, the country's first in more than 20 years at the 2018 Central American Games. The Hawaii native, also pitched the first perfect game since 2010 at Cal when the team played in Honolulu, nearby her hometown of Waianae on March 1, 2018. It was the first time she played in her hometown as a collegiate athlete and brought her mother to tears. The second time around, the senior aces final outing in Hawaii as a Golden Bear, she pitched two shutouts, giving up just four hits. Dung grew up impoverished and despite not initially taking to t-ball or baseball, softball was a natural fit and became her ticket off the island. Dung was listed as No. 79 on Softball America's Top 100 list to open the season.

IT'S ROOD TO STEAL AND NOT NICE TO HIT

Cal's returning stolen base leader (31 of 32) has assumed another role as a senior leader this season. Called a game-changer by head coach Diane Ninemire, Lindsay Rood has wasted no time pilfering plates and has been as lethal at the plate leading the nation with 53 hits. She also leads the Pac-12 with 21 stolen bases, including two steals at home. The next closest has 18 steals on the season. Rood, who was also a standout soccer player in high school, followed in her mother Valerie's footsteps playing D1 softball, but caused a little family feud when she chose Cal over her mother's alma mater Arizona. MIK DROP

Sophomore Mikayla Coelho continues to surprise opponents at the plate. As a freshman, Coelho led the Bears in homers and RBIs, the first freshman to do so since Veronica Nelson in 2000. So far Mikayla has been quietly creeping up the chart, with her seven homers currently tied for 11th in the league, and .522 on base percentage ranked third in the Pac-12 list. Coelho's 22 walks is the most in the league and her .379 batting average ranks ninth in the league and she tops the Cal ledger with 25 RBI along with fellow sophomore Karlee Sparacino.

CAL IS HER DESTINY

Junior transfer Destiny Blueford has made an immediate impact for the Bears leading the teams with three home runs through opening weekend. Although she began her career at New Mexico State, she finally made her way to Cal where her mother Caryn (Williams) Blueford played from 1985-88. A two-time all-regional selection (1st team in 1988, 2nd team in 1985), Williams led the Bears in hits (60) and runs (36) in 1988, and in runs (21) in 1987. With such a notable start, the current Blueford may also find her name in the Cal record book. She currently co-leads the league, along with teammate Lindsay Rood and Utah's Alyssa Barrera, with four triples. Blueford had another notable moment in her first taste of Pac-12 competition when she blasted the game winning shot to overcome the Utes 8-7 in the eighth inning on March 17.

GOLDEN HEART

Junior utility player Jordan Fines has had a breakout season, making her way into the heart of the lineup with a .328 batting average. The Elk Grove, Calif., native, has recorded 20 hits, 18 runs and 15 RBI. Recently starting in the outfield, Fines has been clutch with runners on, batting .889 average with a body on the hot corner and less than two outs and Also with a heart for people, she started the Golden Girls organization at Cal Athletics, to connect, empower and support the female student-athletes at Cal. She hosts multiple meetings monthly where student-athletes discuss topics unique to their experience as women in sport and also hold community service events and attend competitions across the 30 Cal sports to unite the student-athlete population. Fines also initiated a pay-it-forward service day, where she and some of her teammates gifted care packages to homeless victims in Berkeley.

CONLEY IS LIVING CAL HISTORY

Senior ace Zoe Conley, a 2018 all-region selection and Cal's single-season saves record holder (7), is Cal's first black pitcher and she wears the number 42 to commemorate the legacy of Jackie Robinson. That isn't her only historical note, as Conley added her moniker to the program's no-hitter list on March 8, in Cal's 12-0, five-inning win against St. Bonaventure in Honolulu. FANTASTIC FRESHMEN

Freshmen Amani Bradley, Alexandra Perez and Makena Smith have proven that youth is not wasted on the young, making an immediate impact on the Bears in year 1. These freshmen are staples in the lineup, with Bradley (.324 batting average) being a key contact hitter in the number two spot for the Bears, while Smith (.319 batting average) finds herself in the heart of the lineup and pulling defensive double duty behind the plate and at first base. Playing multiple roles is a highlight of the group, that also includes Morgan Zamora, who's come in as a pinch player. Perez (2.26 ERA, .268 batting average) is probably the prime example who finds herself in the starting rotation of Cal's pitching staff. Perez also starts at first base when she is not in the circle. The trio is responsible 81 hits and for 55 runs, including 13 extra-base hits. Remaining undefeated in the circle, Perez holds a 5-0 record.

EDUCATION

Graduated in 1980 with a bachelor's degree from University of Nebraska-Omaha and a master's degree in physical education from Texas Women's University in 1987

ATHLETIC BACKGROUND

Began her collegiate career at Midland Lutheran, leading the team to a state championship as a freshman before transferring to Nebraska-Omaha. At UNO, she played varsity basketball and softball. A shortstop and left fielder, Ninemire helped UNO win the 1978 championship and make three appearances in the College World Series.

Since her first year in the dugout in 1988, Diane Ninemire has continually pushed Cal to new heights as one of the winningest and most successful softball programs in the nation. Now entering her 31st season as head coach of the perennially powerful Golden Bears, the NFCA Hall of Famer is part of an elite group of world-class coaches, surpassing her 1,300th career win, boasting a national championship, two national Coach of the Year titles and numerous national and conference honors during her tenure.

In her three decades at the helm of the Cal program, Ninemire has coached 19 players to All-America status for a total of 37 All-America honors and 98 All-Region honorees, plus 163 All-Pac-12 selections. In the classroom, Ninemire's Bears have excelled at one of the most prestigious universities in the world, combining for four CoSIDA Academic All-America honors and 73 Pac-12 All-Academic selections.

From 1999-2005, Cal made seven consecutive trips to the College World Series with the Bears' most recent appearances in Oklahoma City coming in 2012 and 2011. With a national championship, 12 Women's College World Series trips and 26 straight (30 overall) NCAA postseason appearances to her credit, it is no wonder that Cal enters every season as a contender for the national title.

Cal's most recent campaign ended with the program's 30th appearance in the postseason under Ninemire, where the Bears saw action at the Athens Regional hosted by Georgia. With a 35-21 record, the 2018 season concluded with a pair of first-time All-Regional nods for then juniors Lindsay Rood and Zoe Conley. Cal finished seventh in a stacked Pac-12 schedule to produce a trio of all-conference members including Jazmyn Jackson, Bradie Fillmore and Rood.

The 2017 results were nearly the same as the Cal advanced to the Auburn Regional hosted by Auburn. With a 32-24 record, the 2017 season concluded with another All-Regional honoree in then junior Jazmyn Jackson and three all-conference nods.

2016 saw the Bears return to the postseason, finishing with a 33-24-1 record and a trip to the Alabama regional. Along the way, All-America pitcher Nisa Ontiveros led the Pac-12 during the regular season with a 1.91 ERA to becoming a NFCA third team All-American, and first team Pac-12 and All-Pacific-Region honoree.

And, 2015 brought another career milestone for Ninemire, with a 7-4 win over Arizona on March 14 representing the 1,200th victory in her coaching career. She enters the 2016 season as one of just 11 coaches with 1,200 career wins.

The 2014 Bears produced strong offensive numbers that saw Cordes lead Cal in nearly every offensive category. Along with Danielle Henderson and Kylie Reed, Cordes was an NFCA All-Region selection. Cal also earned eight All-Conference honors, while four Bears were recognized for their efforts in the classroom as Pac-12 All-Academic Honorable Mention selections.

The Golden Bears punched their ticket to a 26th consecutive postseason in 2013, in a season that saw Jolene Henderson break Michele Granger's career wins record and become the winningest Cal pitcher in program history (130 wins). The team lost to eventual WCWS participant Michigan at the Ann Arbor Regional, failing to advance to Super Regionals for only the second time since the Super Regional format was introduced in 2005. Henderson was named an All-American while Lindsey Ziegenhirt became Cal's first CoSIDA Academic All-American since 2005, and the 2013 squad raked in an additional five All-Region, seven All-Pac-12 and three Pac-12 All-Academic honors.

Thanks to an 8-1 victory over then-No. 14/18 Oregon on April 20, 2012, Ninemire hit one of the most impressive milestones in coaching history - notching career win No. 1,100.

In 2012, Cal set program single-season records for most runs scored (422), RBI (376), homers (84), total bases (856), and the highest fielding percentage (.979). Not only did the 58 wins set a new team best, but they also topped the previous high of 56, which was set by the 2002 NCAA Title-winning team.

Cal opened the 2012 year on a 23-game winning streak before dropping its sole nonconference loss of the regular season to Hawaii in a 10-inning battle. The Bears won the inaugural Pac-12 title by going 21-3 in the most competitive softball conference in the country, winning every single series and sweeping five of the eight series. Cal claimed the No. 1 spot in at least one of the two national polls 13 times this season, finishing the campaign third in both rankings. After winning the Berkeley Regional and Berkeley Super Regional, the Bears went 2-2 at the Women's College World Series, in which they defeated LSU and Oregon but lost to eventual champion Alabama and eventual runner-up Oklahoma.

In 2011, the Golden Bears returned to the hallowed grounds of Oklahoma City for the 11th time in school history for the Women's College World Series. They got there by notching Cal's first-ever Super Regional series title over an SEC School - going 2-1 against host Kentucky. On the Regional level, the Bears breezed through the competition in Louisville.

After starting the 2011 campaign ranked 12th in the polls and slated to finish fourth in the Pac-10, Cal ended the year No. 5 in the country

and second in the conference. Cal closed out the year at a 45-13 clip with an impressive 15-6 conference record to take second place, marking the best Pac-10 finish since 2005, when the Bears tied for first. The Bears won at least one game in each Pac-10 series and swept three schools - then-No.17 Oregon, Oregon State as well as then-No. 8 and defending national champion UCLA. For their stunning work in 2011, the National Fast Pitch Coaches' Association lauded the Cal coaching staff as the Pacific Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

In the fall of 2011, Midland University honored Ninemire with induction into its Athletic Hall of Fame. Ninemire began her collegiate playing career at Midland in 1976, lettering in basketball and softball. Ninemire led Midland softball to a state championship in 1977.

Thanks to a 6-0 victory over Sacramento State on April 7, Ninemire became the ninth coach in the history of Division I softball to notch 1,000 wins. Already the winningest coach - male or female - in all of Cal history for any sport, Ninemire now has a career record of 1,059-509 after leading the Bears to the WCWS in 2011. She has accumulated the second-most wins in Pac-10 history (1,059).

In addition to posting their 37th consecutive winning record in 2010, the Bears finished 10-11 in the Pac-10 Conference to tie for fourth, which is the highest conference finish since 2005, when the Bears were third. The Bears were one of the seven Pac-10 teams to earn an at-large bid to the postseason, marking their 25th consecutive trip to NCAA tournament, which is the second-longest streak in the nation. Cal shut out the competition at the Columbus Regional, icing Bucknell, Kentucky and Ohio

State to win its fifth Regional title since the format was adopted in 2005, before falling to No. 6-seeded Georgia in Athens, Ga.

In 2009, Ninemire set another career milestone, joining the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's Hall of Fame class that year. Ninemire, who joined Frank Cheek of Humboldt State and Bill Edwards of Hofstra, was inducted into the NFCA Hall of Fame on Friday, Dec. 11, 2009, at the Renaissance Hotel in Nashville, Tenn.

Ninemire helped make Golden Bear history in 2002 when she directed Cal to its first NCAA Championship at the WCWS with a 6-0 win over Arizona, marking the first women's title in Cal athletic program history. The 2002 team set a school record for wins (56), while Jocelyn Forest claimed the tournament's Most Outstanding Player honor, and Ninemire was chosen as the NFCA National Coach of the Year. Cal became the first Pac-10 team other than UCLA and Arizona to ever win the softball national title. In the circle, Forest went undefeated in Cal's postseason run and completed the WCWS with a 4-0 record, 0.50 earned run average and 33 strikeouts in 28.0 innings.

Ninemire has enjoyed plenty of other memorable moments along her career path. In 2005, Cal won a share of the Pac-10 title (a first for a Ninemire squad) and advanced to its seventh consecutive WCWS. The 2004 version of the Bears was one of Ninemire's most successful and most decorated groups, as four All-Americans and eight All-Pac-10 selections helped drive Cal to its third consecutive WCWS championship game appearance. That same year, her winning reputation was recognized internationally when she was named as an assistant coach to the

inaugural Greek Olympic softball team. Two of Ninemire's former players - Michele Granger and Gillian Boxx - were four-time All-Americans and helped the United States win a gold medal as members of the 1996 Olympic Team in Atlanta. Former California Golden Bear Vicky Galindo, who Ninemire coached, was the most recent Cal softball player named to the 2008 15-member Olympic Team roster. In 2001, Cal began the season 32-0 before finishing fifth at the WCWS.

Prior to becoming head coach, Ninemire served as an assistant for five years at Cal under Donna Terry. Together, the tandem led the Bears to three appearances in the NCAA Tournament, a third-place finish at the 1986 WCWS and the inaugural Pac-10 championship in 1987.

Along with her coaching duties, Ninemire is a member of the NCAA Pacific Region Advisory Committee and a former chair of the All-American Selection Committee.

Ninemire began her collegiate playing career at Midland Lutheran College (Fremont, Neb.), leading the team to a state championship as a freshman. After one season, she transferred to Nebraska-Omaha, where she played on both the softball and basketball teams for three years. A shortstop and left fielder, Ninemire helped UNO win the 1978 championship and make three appearances in the College World Series.

Ninemire graduated from UNO in 1980 and completed her master's degree in physical education at Texas Woman's University in 1987. She began her coaching career at TWU in 1980 as Terry's assistant before heading west to assist Terry and the Golden Bear program in 1983.
