#8 WASHINGTON HUSKIES

CAL OPENS PAC-12 SLATE AT NO. 8 WASHINGTON

ABOUT THE SERIES

- Saturday will be the 102nd all-time meeting between California and Washington
- The Huskies lead the series 56-41-4
- The teams have split the last four matchups with UW winning in 2021 and last season in Berkeley
- Cal has had recent success vs. ranked Husky teams, beating #15 Washington (12-10) in 2018 at CMS and #14 UW (20-19) in Seattle in 2019 after a lightning delay caused the game to end at 1:22 a.m.

TAKERS

- Cal's defense is among the nation's best at taking the ball away this season, tying for the national lead with Colorado, Fresno State, Liberty and San Diego State with 10 turnovers gained
- The Bears are knotted at the top of the country with Memphis and South Alabama in fumbles recovered, jumping on five loose balls
- Cal is third in the Pac-12 (Colorado 6, UCLA 6) and 11th nationally with five passes intercepted while sitting third in the conference and eighth in the NCAA in turnover margin (1.67)
- Nohl Williams leads the Pac-12 and is ninth in the country in interceptions per game (0.67)
- Second-half defense has been a strength through the first three games as Cal shut out North Texas, allowed just seven points to Auburn and put another zero on the board after halftime last week against Idaho
- Third down defense has been stout as Cal is holding opposing offenses to just a 12-38 (31.6%) conversion rate, second-best in the Pac-12 and 26th nationally
- The Bears forced and recovered three fumbles against Auburn for the first time since recovering three fumbles vs. Weber State on Sept. 9, 2017
- Cal snagged three interceptions at North Texas, the most since also picking up three on the road at Arizona in 2021
- The defense allowed only 41 yards on the ground at North Texas, which was its fewest since giving up 35 to Colorado in 2021 and only the second time since 2000 that the Golden Bears have allowed 42 rushing yards or less

SPEED TO BURN

- Cal's offense has been working at lightning speed in offensive coordinator Jake Spavital's return to the team, as it leads the Pac-12 and is second nationally in plays per game (80.3) behind only South Florida (83.3)
- The rushing offense has been electric through three games as Cal is outrushing its opponents 728-285 with the Bears averaging 242.7 yards per game and holding competition to 95.0 yards per game
- The Bears' 242.7 rushing yards per game rank second in the Pac-12 and fifth nationally
- Three Bears are averaging more than 50 yards per game rushing in the first three weeks of the season, led by Jaydn Ott (133.0), Isaiah Ifanse (68.7) and Ashton Stredick (50.7)
- Cal's halftime adjustments have led to outscoring opponents 42-7 in the second half of games and 29-0 in the third quarter
- Ott exploded for 188 yards rushing with two touchdowns, the second-highest total of his career in the opener at North Texas. Ifanse tied a career-high with three rushing touchdowns in his Cal debut at the Mean Green, a feat he previously accomplished twice while playing for Montana State

In 1941, Oski, the beloved Golden Bear mascot, made his official debut at CMS. The California Victory Cannon was introduced in 1964 and shot off at beginning of the game, after each score, and upon victory

- Aaron Rodgers entered his 19th NFL season before suffering a season-ending injury in week one, his first with the New York Jets after spending his first 18 campaigns (2005-22) with Green Bay, where he was the AP's NFL MVP and first-team All-Pro four times (2011, '14, '20, '21), the MVP of Super Bowl XLV following the 2010 season after leading the Packers to a victory over Pittsburgh, a 10-time Pro Bowler (2009, '11, '12, '14, '15, '16, '18, '19, '20, '21) and a member of the NFL's 2010 All-Decade team to highlight a long list of honors.
- Rodgers is one of five Pro Bowlers from Cal currently on NFL rosters along with Allen, Anger, Goff and Jordan.
- Jones Jr. is the only other Cal player to change teams from 2022 to 2023, returning to the Detroit Lions, where he played previously (2016-20) after having spent the 2021 and 2022 campaigns with Jacksonville.

- Jackson (6-of-6, 140 yards passing; 15 rushes, 79 yards, 2 TD) and Finley (65-of-123, 741 yards passing, 3 TD, 3 INT) saw limited action for their respective teams.

- After an eye-opening freshman season, Jaydn Ott has continued to dazzle during the early part of 2023. He exploded for 188 yards and two touchdowns on 17 carries while also catching a 13-yard pass during the Bears' win over North Texas then added 78 yards rushing and a touchdown before leaving the game with an injury against Auburn.
- Ott sat out last weekend's game against Idaho because of injury.
- Montana State transfer Isaiah Ifanse has impressed in his first season with the Bears. After scoring three rushing touchdowns in the season-opening win over North Texas, he registered 137 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries in Cal's win over Idaho. Ifanse, Montana State's all-time leading rusher, now has 18 career 100-yard rushing games and 29 career touchdowns on the ground.
- Sophomore Ashton Stredick has provided depth with 152 yards rushing and a touchdown on 32 carries so far this season. He gained a career-high 77 yards rushing against Idaho.
- Ott posted one of the nation's top campaigns by a freshman in 2022 when he earned All-True Freshman honors (Pro Football Focus), as well first-team (The Athletic) and second-team (College Football News) Freshman All-American honors.
- Ott ranked among Pac-12 leaders in all-purpose yards (1218, #4), all-purpose yards per game (101.5, #6), rushing yards per game (74.8, #5), rushing yards (897, #5), total touchdowns (11), rush yards per carry (5.28, #9) and rushing touchdowns (8, #11T) in 2022.

JOHNSON'S RETURN HIGHLIGHTS DEFENSIVE LINE PERFORMANCE

– DT Brett Johnson made his first appearance in 1,001 days against North Texas. The former Freshman All-American missed each of the past two seasons with injuries. He made 13 starts during his first two years at Cal and made 46 tackles with three sacks.

– Sirmon, who has played in 48 career games with 31 starts, spent four seasons at Washington from 2018-21 and started all 12 games in his first season at Cal in 2022. He led the team with career-highs in tackles (104) tackles for loss (6.0, -18 yards), 3.5 sacks (-12 yards), three pass breakups, 37 fumble recovery yards and one fumble recovery touchdown in a dramatic fourth quarter comeback Big Game win over Stanford.

– Iosefa has started at least a pair of games in each of the past three seasons, including a career-high 10 in 2021. His three starts in 2022 were the only other ones made by an inside linebacker on the 2023 roster, while all three of Rutchena's starts came in 2021.

BEARS DEMONSTRATE DEPTH IN DEFENSIVE BACK ROOM

-- San Diego State transfer Patrick McMorris has two pass break-ups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery while also recording 13 tackles

-- Nohl Williams, a transfer from UNLV, has registered interceptions in each of the past two games

-- Craig Woodson ranks third on the team with 17 tackles. He forced a fumble against Auburn

-- Woodson returned from an injury that forced him to miss the entire 2021 campaign and was one of eight Cal players, including four on defense, to start all 12 games last year. He was an honorable mention All-Pac-12 selection of the league's coaches in 2022 when he put up the most productive numbers of his career, contributing career highs of 75 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss (-8 yards), two interceptions that he returned for 41 yards including one 39 yards for a touchdown against UC Davis, one forced fumble, three pass breakups and two quarterback hurries.

--Jeremiah Earby, a Freshman All-American last season, recorded his second career interception against North Texas. He also had one in the 2022 season-opener against UC Davis

-- Cal both returns and adds a lot to its defensive backfield in 2023, highlighted by four defensive backs who have earned preseason All-Pac-12 honors in returnees Earby (third-team Athlon; honorable mention Pac-12 Media) and Woodson (second-team Athlon, Pac-12 Media, Phil Steele; third-team Pro Football Focus), as well as McMorris (second-team Pro Football Focus; third-team Athlon; honorable mention Pac-12 Media) and Williams (third-team Pro Football Focus; fourth-team Phil Steele).

-- Earby played in all 12 games with seven starts as a freshman and led the team with two fumble recoveries. He returned one 36 yards for a touchdown, while also ranking second in the Pac-12 with a team-high 11 pass breakups, adding 36 tackles that were the most among the team's cornerbacks.

-- McMorris played in 42 games with 27 starts over four seasons at San Diego State (2019-22) and contributed 162 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss (-14 yards), five interceptions that he returned for 61 yards, 15 pass breakups, 20 passes defended and two fumble recoveries, including one that he returned 30 yards for a touchdown, while earning first-team All-Mountain West Conference honors as both a 2021 sophomore and 2022 junior.

-- Williams was a three-year starter who played in 26 games at UNLV (2020-22) and contributed 98 tackles, five interceptions that he returned for 62 yards, 10 pass breakups, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.

-- Cal features seven other returnees in Dejuan Butler (11/0), Collin Gamble (22/16), Lu-Magia Hearn III (17/12), Tyson McWilliams (6/2), Raymond Woodie III (22/0) and Isaiah Young (18/15) who have combined to play in 96 games and make 45 starts for the Bears. Two other Power 5 transfers join the squad in Kaylin Moore (Colorado) and Marcus Scott II (Missouri), along with a juco transfer who took most of the first-team reps at nickelback in the spring, Matthew Littlejohn (Citrus College).

-- Cal has had five safeties selected in the NFL Draft since 2020 in Camryn Bynum (Minnesota, 2021), Ashtyn Davis (New York Jets, 2020), Jaylinn Hawkins (Atlanta, 2020), Elijah Hicks (Chicago, 2022) and Daniel Scott (Indianapolis, 2023) with all still on rosters of the teams they were drafted by (Scott is on injured reserve with Indianapolis).

-- After three seasons of the same primary specialists (place kicker Dario Longhetto, punter/holder Jamieson Sheahan, long snapper Slater Zellers), Cal will have new personnel at all three spots.

-- Michael Luckhurst, who played in all 12 games and handled all of the team's kickoffs over the final nine contests of 2022, has taken over placekicking duties. He's made two 39-yard field goals and a 32-yarder so far this season

-- Transfer Lachlan Wilson (Tulsa) is averaging 39.7 yards per punt through his first three games at Cal. Wilson was a preseason All-Pac-12 second-team (Phil Steele) and honorable mention (Pac-12 Media) selection who was on the Ray Guy Award watch list during each of the three seasons he saw action at Tulsa, registering a 44.3 career average on 103 punts for 7,127 yards including 44 that traveled 50 or more yards, while playing in all 34 games possible during the period.

-- Jeremiah Hunter (19 punt returns, 203 yards) was the team's starting punt returner in 2022 and named preseason second-team All-Pac-12 at the position by Phil Steele, while UNLV transfer Nohl Williams has experience as both a kick returner (14 kick returns, 294 yards) and punt returner (11 punt returns, 74 yards).

Justin Wilcox is in his seventh season as the Travers Family Head Football Coach at Cal in 2023. Wilcox, who signed a contract extension through the 2027 campaign in January of 2022, has compiled a long list of accomplishments and signature wins during his first six seasons, including three victories over Stanford in the last four Big Game meetings, most recently in 2022 with a dramatic fourth-quarter comeback. The other two Big Game victories during the stretch came at Stanford in 2019 and 2021 to make Wilcox only the fifth head coach in Cal history to be victorious at least twice in a row on The Farm, and along with Jeff Tedford, one of only two in the last 70 years since Pappy Waldorf won three straight from 1947-51. The Golden Bears also have a pair of wins over USC under Wilcox including Cal's most recent victory against the Trojans in its 2021 season finale after a road win in the Los Angeles Coliseum in 2018.

"I appreciate the opportunity to be the head football coach at Cal and am excited about the future of our program," Wilcox said in the announcement of his extension. "I have thoroughly enjoyed every minute I have spent with the extraordinary young men who have been in our program. We are in a great position and strongly aligned with our university thanks to the leadership of Chancellor Carol Christ and our Director of Athletics Jim Knowlton. I thank both of them for their continued trust and confidence in me to lead a football program that will make the entire Cal community proud. We have very high expectations. I think we've earned the right to expect more, and that's exactly what we're going to do."

"Justin Wilcox is a football coach who shares our values and vision, and we want to ensure that he is the leader of our program for the long term," Knowlton commented. "Justin is a great fit for Cal Athletics and our university, with a philosophy that places an emphasis on developing young men on the field, in the classroom and as people. I am confident our fans and alumni share my enthusiasm for the direction of our program, and the level of success we have seen to date has set a foundation for sustained excellence in the future."

"Since the beginning of his tenure, I have been impressed by Justin Wilcox's leadership, and his commitment to enabling our student-athletes to take full advantage of the academic and athletic opportunities we offer," Christ said. "He is, in my opinion, the quintessential Berkeley coach who understands the university's values, as well as the value his program brings to the campus as a rallying point for Cal's global community. College football is a highly competitive environment, and the investment represented in Justin's new contract is commensurate with all that I know he will contribute to our university in the years ahead."

Cal is off to a 2-1 start in 2023 with a defense that is tied for the national lead with 10 turnovers and an offense that is tied fifth in the nation in rushing yards per game (242.7) leading the way. Cal started the season with a bang at North Texas on Sept. 2, pitching a second half shutout on the way to a 58-21 victory, tallying 669 yards of total offense, its most ever in a road game and most overall in eight seasons. It was also the most points the Bears have scored in a game since 2015. After falling to Auburn, 14-10, Cal scored 31 straight points in a 31-17 victory over Idaho. The Bears have also been active in the offseason adding 50 new players, including 28 transfers to the program. Cal's 2023 spring transfer portal class was listed by The Athletic as one of its 10 "winners", while also being recognized by On3 (1 of 12 "winners") and 247Sports (No. 17 overall class). In addition, three new full-time coaches have joined the staff since the end of the 2022 campaign, including offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Jake Spavital, offensive line coach/run game coordinator Mike Bloesch and tight ends coach Tim Plough.

The Golden Bears excelled in several team statistical categories in 2022, including tying for second in the Pac-12 and tying for 12th nationally with three defensive touchdowns, while also ranking among the top three in the Pac-12 and Top 25 nationally in several turnover categories, including fumbles lost, turnover margin and turnovers lost. At one point during the season, Cal had the nation's longest active streak by forcing at least one turnover in 19 consecutive games starting with the 2020 finale through the first six games of 2022.

Wilcox has coached eight players as Cal's head coach who are currently on NFL rosters in Camryn Bynum (Minnesota), Jake Curhan (Seattle), Ashtyn Davis (New York Jets), Cameron Goode (Miami), Jeremiah Hawkins (Atlanta), Elijah Hicks (Chicago), Patrick Mekari (Baltimore) and Daniel Scott (Indianapolis, injured reserve). A total of 25 players have been on NFL rosters that played at Cal since Wilcox became the Bears' head coach in 2017.

Cal has also had success in the classroom throughout Wilcox's tenure. The program announced its highest GSR ever at 86 percent in December of 2022 and has improved each of the last four years. Cal has also recorded its top two scores in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate and its highest team grade-point average under Wilcox. The team's APR of 978 for the 2021-22 academic year announced in May of 2023 was 16 points higher than the national football average of 962. In addition, Cal has earned a combined 82 spots on the last three Pac-12 Academic Honor Rolls. Matt Anderson was the Pac-12's Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 2017 and Michael Saffell won the award in 2020.

Peter Sirmon (DC/ILB)

Sirmon is in his sixth season at Cal and his fourth as the Golden Bears' defensive coordinator in 2023, while he also continues to be the program's position coach for the inside linebackers for the sixth consecutive campaign. Sirmon started at Cal in 2018 as the inside linebackers coach before adding co-defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator duties to his role in 2019, for which he served three seasons (2019-21). Sirmon has been instrumental in developing a multitude of key players at Cal, including a pair of All-Americans in ILB Evan Weaver and CB Elijah Hicks, with Weaver a consensus pick and Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in 2019 while Hicks was a third-teamer. Weaver was also the nation's leading tackler in 2019. His son, Jackson Sirmon, is a preseason fourth-team All-American in 2023. Sirmon's defense has at least one takeaway in 23 of Cal's last 25 games dating back to final contest of the 2020 campaign.

**Jake Spavital (OC/QB)**

Spavital is in the first season of his second stint as Cal's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2023. Spavital served in the same role at Cal in 2016 when the Golden Bears' offense and quarterback Davis Webb set several school records while ranking fourth in the nation in passing offense and 10th in total offense. Spavital spent four seasons (2019-22) in his first head coaching position at Texas State, while he has also been at West Virginia (2017-18, OC/QB coach; 2011-12, QB coach), Texas A&M (2014-15, OC/QB coach; 2013, co-OC, QB coach). As an offensive coordinator, Spavital has piloted offenses on teams that finished in the top 20 in the country in total offense six times, reached seven bowl games and earned a spot in the AP Top 25 in seven different seasons. Spavital has recruited and worked with several elite college and future NFL quarterbacks in addition to Webb, including Will Grier (West Virginia), Case Keenum (Houston), Johnny Manziel (Texas A&M), Kyler Murray (Texas A&M), Geno Smith (West Virginia) and Brandon Weeden (Oklahoma State). Murray was the first overall selection of Arizona in the 2019 NFL Draft, while Weeden and Manziel were both first-round picks by Cleveland in 2012 and 2014, respectively.

**Vic So'oto (STC/OLB)**

So'oto is in his second season at Cal and his first campaign as the special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach in 2023 after serving as the outside linebackers coach in 2022. In his first campaign in 2022, So'oto ran the Golden Bears' kickoff unit that posted an average of 19.83 yards allowed per return, Cal's best since 2016. He coached an outside linebacker unit that was highlighted by the team's leader in tackles for loss and sacks Xavier Carlton.

**Mike Bloesch (OL)**

Mike Bloesch is in the first season as Cal's offensive line coach and run game coordinator in 2023. Bloesch's offenses have been known for protecting the quarterback, with each of his last two squads at North Texas (2021, '22) ranking in the top 10 nationally in fewest sacks allowed, while his balanced offensive attacks were highlighted by a 2020 North Texas unit that averaged 513.2 yards of total offense per game (283.0 passing, 230.2 rushing) to rank eighth in the nation.

**Terrence Brown (DB)**

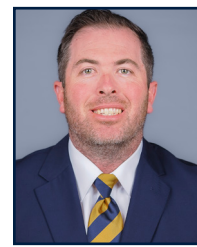
Terrence Brown is in his second season as a defensive backs coach at Cal in 2023. Brown shares duties with Tre Watson coaching the Golden Bears' defensive backs. Brown made an immediate impact in his first season at Cal in 2022 and along with Watson, tutored a pair of the Pac-12's top safeties in Daniel Scott and Craig Woodson, as well as one of the nation's top freshmen defensive backs in cornerback Jeremiah Earby.

**Andrew Browning (DL)**

Andrew Browning is in his fifth season as the defensive line coach and his sixth campaign overall at Cal. Browning's 2023 defensive line includes five players that have made a combined 37 collegiate starts at Cal during their 97 appearances. Health could be the determining factor for the Golden Bears' defensive line in 2023 with the nine members of the unit missing a combined 38 games in 2022 but all expected to be ready for the 2023 campaign.

**Tim Plough (TE)**

Plough is in the first season as Cal's tight ends coach in 2023. Plough coached previously at Boise State (2021-22), UC Davis (2008-12, 2017-20) and Northern Arizona (2013-16) with his experience including 11 campaigns as an offensive coordinator.

**Aristotle Thompson (RB)**

Thompson is in his fourth season as the running backs coach at Cal in 2023. Jaydn Ott is a 2023 Pro Football Focus first-team preseason All-Pac-12 selection after earning a host of honors in 2022, including first-team Freshman All-American from The Athletic and honorable mention All-Pac-12 recognition from the league's coaches.

**Burl Toler III (WR/RC)**

Toler is in his second stint and ninth season on the coaching or football staff at his alma mater Cal in 2023, as well as his fifth working with the wide receivers. He is also in his second campaign as the team's recruiting coordinator. Toler is expected to have three of his top four wide receivers from 2022 at his disposal in 2023 in Jeremiah Hunter, Mavin Anderson and Monroe Young, all of whom put up their top collegiate receiving numbers in 2022.

**Tre Watson (DB)**

Watson is in his third season as a defensive backs coach at Cal in 2023, sharing the duties for the second campaign with Terrence Brown. In 2022, along with Brown, he tutored a pair of the Pac-12's top safeties in Daniel Scott and Craig Woodson, as well as one of the nation's top freshmen defensive backs in cornerback Jeremiah Earby.

**Brian Johnson (AP)**

Johnson is in his third campaign as the head football athletic performance coach at Cal in 2023. Johnson has coached 79 players during 11 collegiate seasons that have been selected for the NFL Draft including a total of 11 first-rounders.

GAME 1: BEARS ROUT NORTH TEXAS TO OPEN 2023 SEASON

DENTON, Texas – In the Cal football team's first game with Jake Spavital as its offensive coordinator, the Bears did something they hadn't done since the last time he was the offensive coordinator.

The Bears racked up their most points in one half since 2016 and rolled to a 58-21 rout of North Texas in their 2023 season-opener on Saturday.

Cal led 33-21 at halftime and then shut out the Mean Green in the second half. It was the most points the Bears have scored in a half since amassing 35 in a victory over Texas in 2016, when Spavital served one season as the team's offensive coordinator.

Cal tallied 669 yards of total offense, its most in a game in eight seasons. It was also the most points the Bears have scored in a game since 2015.

"We expected to come out and play well," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "To say you're going to have 669 yards of offense every week is not realistic, but we have some good players and we felt like we matched up well and should have been able to move the ball on them. Spav and all of those coaches and players on that side of the ball contributed today. It was a big day for them."

Spavital went on to serve as the offensive coordinator at West Virginia before moving on to become the head coach at Texas State for four years. He returned as the Bears' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach before this season.

Sophomore running back Jaydn Ott exploded for 188 yards rushing with two touchdowns, the second-highest total of his career. Backup Isaiah Ifanse tied a career-high with three rushing touchdowns in his Cal debut. He previously accomplished the feat twice while playing for Montana State.

Quarterback Sam Jackson V threw his first career touchdown pass on his first attempt at Cal before eventually being replaced by Ben Finley due to injury. Finley went 24-for-34 for a career-high 274 yards in his Cal debut after transferring from North Carolina State.

"When I sat down with Spav and he told me they were going to go with Sam as the starter, I respected the decision and totally understood," Finley said. "Sam is a great player. At the same time, I had to prepare like I was the starter."

GAME 2: CAL'S DEFENSE SHINES IN LOSS TO AUBURN

BERKELEY – Defense kept the California football team within striking distance into the final minutes of its home opener on Saturday against Auburn, but the Golden Bears weren't able to turn takeaways into enough points, falling 14-10 in front of 44,141 at California Memorial Stadium.

Cal's defense forced four turnovers, including a fumble forced by safety Patrick McMorris with just over four minutes remaining in the game. That gave the Bears the ball in Auburn (2-0) territory, needing a touchdown trailing by just four points.

Quarterback Sam Jackson V hit wide receiver Trond Grizzell for 11 yards and an Auburn unnecessary roughness penalty added 15 more, quickly putting the Bears at the Tigers' 15-yard line. However, the Bears weren't able to find the end zone, and Auburn subsequently picked up the third-down conversion it needed to run out the rest of the clock.

"Our defense did a really good job for most of the night," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "We're going to show our guys what they did right and encourage them, but this is a team game and it's about winning, and we didn't get the job done."

Jackson – who exited Cal's season-opener early with an injury – initially entered the game midway through the second quarter and provided the offense with an instant boost. The Bears immediately went 65 yards in six plays, capping things off with a Jaydn Ott 14-yard touchdown scamper to go up 10-7.

"I was just looking to give the team a spark," said Jackson. "Just like in our first game, we were explosive from the jump. I was just looking for ways to get the guys going and get the offense going."

Ott finished the night with a game-high 78 rushing yards before missing the final quarter due to injury. Jackson completed 14-of-27 passes for 126 yards.

Linebacker Kaleb Elarms-Orr had a career night, leading all players with 13 tackles and helping force a turnover less than 90 seconds into the game as he pursued Auburn quarterback Payton Thorne to the sideline and knocked the ball free just before Thorne went out of bounds. That led to Cal's first scoring drive, as kicker Michael Luckhurst connected from 39 yards out.

That was the first of three fumbles recovered by the Bears' defense, which forced four turnovers – not including a turnover on downs to begin the second half – for the first time since the 2018 Cheez-It Bowl against TCU. Cal also totaled three sacks and picked off one pass on a high throw in the second quarter that went off a receiver's fingertips before being reeled in by cornerback Nohl Williams.

"We just wanted to play fast, play physical, and play our game," Elarms-Orr said. "We're a really good defense and we're a really good team. We just wanted to get to the quarterback, tackle in space, knock back tackles in the run game, and I feel like we did a pretty good job of doing that."

The Bears outgained Auburn 273-230 on offense, but missed key opportunities going 1-for-4 in the red zone.

GAME 3: BEARS SCORE 31 UNANSWERED POINTS IN WIN OVER IDAHO

BERKELEY – The California football team used a second-quarter surge to take control of Saturday's game against Idaho and shut out the Vandals for the final 39 minutes in a 31-17 win at California Memorial Stadium.

Quarterback Sam Jackson V contributed to three touchdowns – two through the air and one on the ground – while running back Isaiah Ifanse rushed for 137 rushing yards on 22 carries. Defensively, the Golden Bears (2-1) forced three turnovers.

In the final minutes of the opening half, Jackson dropped in a couple of perfect throws to the end zone of 20 yards to Jeremiah Hunter and 36 yards to Trond Grizzell. That started a run of 31 unanswered points, as Cal scored on five of seven possessions.

"Momentum is a huge part of this game. You can feel it in the stadium," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "We work real hard in terms of emphasizing the last four minutes of the first half and the first four minutes of the second half. You can really change the momentum in those eight minutes. That'll be a positive we talk about when we watch the tape."

On the first drive of the second half, the Bears went 80 yards in 10 plays, capping things off with Jackson's two longest runs of the day. One play after going for 10 yards on 3rd-and-8, Jackson broke contain for his longest carry of the season, making multiple defenders miss on a 27-yard touchdown run.

While Idaho (2-1) struggled to get first downs, the Bears' run game started to wear the Vandals' defense out. Ifanse had 81 of his 137 yards in the third quarter, scoring from 1 yard out with 2:53 left in the period to put Cal ahead 28-17.

After cornerback Lu-Magia Hearn III forced a fumble on the Vandals' next possession – the first of two fourth-quarter fumbles recovered by the Bears' defense – running back Ashton Stredick reeled off a highlight 41-yard run to set up a 39-yard Michael Luckhurst field goal.

Combined with cornerback Nohl Williams' second-quarter interception, Cal's defense has now forced 10 turnovers through its first three games.

"Our goal is three turnovers a game so we can give the ball back to the offense and they can put points on the scoreboard," said Williams, who has now picked off a pass in two straight games. "We were just emphasizing winning our 1-on-1s and getting off the field on third downs. After we cleaned up a couple things, we were good."

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Field photographers/videographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on the day of the game at Media Will Call. Photo vests are also distributed at Media Will Call and should be returned following use to the receptacle on the field behind the visitor (west) bench and near the entrance to the photographers work room in front of Section EE.

NCAA rules limit photographers/videographers to shooting outside the restraining line surrounding the playing field and restrict photographers from entering the team areas inside the 20-yard lines.
