CAL HOSTS SYRACUSE SATURDAY

CAL ...



- Is coming off its first-ever ACC win last Friday at Wake Forest.
 - Has outscored opponents, 258-174, with its four wins coming by an average of 18.60 points per game and its four losses an average of 2.25 points per contest.
 - Has won its last four November games dating back to the final three of 2023.
 - Leads the nation with 17 interceptions and is among the country's top 10 in a total of six team categories related to turnovers, including turnover margin (2nd, +1.78 per game), turnovers gained (T3rd, 9), turnovers lost (T5th, 6), fewest passes had intercepted (T10th, 4) and fumbles lost (T10th, 2).
 - Has only six giveaways in 2024 after committing 28 in 2023 that were the fourth-most nationally.
 - Has not lost the turnover battle in 2024, winning in seven games (UC Davis, at Auburn, San Diego State, at Pitt, NC State, Oregon State, at Wake Forest) and even in two (at Florida State, Miami).
 - Has at least one takeaway in 44 of its last 47 games and 11 straight.
 - Has capitalized on its turnover success with a 54-20 points off turnovers advantage.
 - Is ranked in the top 30 nationally in a total of 18 team categories including rushing defense (11th, 100.4 ypg), team sacks (T11th, 3.11 spg), team passing efficiency defense (16th, 110.49), completion percentage (14th, 67.9), defensive touchdowns (T15th, 2), blocked kicks (18th, 2), passing offense (20th, 279.2 ypg), scoring defense (23rd, 19.3 ppg), kickoff returns (24th, 23.88), punt return defense (25th, 4.46 ypr), net punting (T25th, 41.48 avg) and red zone defense (30th, 77.3%).
 - Leads the ACC in five team categories (completion percentage, passes intercepted, scoring defense, team passing efficiency defense, turnover margin), while tying for the conference lead in two others (blocked kicks allowed, fewest passes intercepted).
 - Has a defense that is allowing just over half of the points per game it allowed in 2023 by cutting the 32.8 ppg allowed a season ago to its current 19.3 ppg.
 - Has not allowed more than 144 yards rushing in a game this season (at Pitt).
 - Has outscored opponents in the middle two periods by a combined 147-49 (79-34 in the second period, 68-15 in the third period).
 - Has scored on its opening drive in each of its last four games, getting touchdowns at Pitt, NC State, and Oregon State, before settling for a field goal at Wake Forest.
 - Set team season highs in each of its last two games in points, passing yards and total yards, eclipsing the previous marks set against Oregon State (44, 364, 478) at Wake Forest with 46 points, 385 passing yards and 500 total offense yards.
- NATIONALLY NOTABLE INDIVIDUALS**
- DB Nohl Williams leads the nation with seven interceptions, is tied for third with one kickoff return touchdown, tied for fourth with one interception return TD and tied for fifth with 12 passes defended.
 - DB Cam Sidney is tied for eighth with two fumble recoveries.
 - OLB Xavier Carlton is tied for seventh in sacks per game (1.00) and tied for seventh in total sacks (9.0).
 - P Lachlan Wilson is ninth in punting average (45.9 ypp).
 - QB Fernando Mendoza is 10th in completions per game (24.22), 12th in completion percentage (69.0%), 15th in passing yards per game (275.6), 18th in passing yards (2,480) and 20th in total offense (283.4 ypg).
 - ILB Teddye Buchanan is tied for 18th in tackles per game (9.2) and tied for 21st in total tackles (84).

NOHL'S HISTORIC NUMBERS

- DB Nohl Williams, who has been named a semifinalist for the Chuck Bednarik Award and Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, leads the nation with seven interceptions in 2024 is also tied for third on Cal's all-time list. Williams has more than any Cal player since Daymeion Hughes' eight in 2006 when Hughes was the Lott IMPACT Trophy winner, a consensus first-team All-American and the Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year. Williams is two shy of Deltha O'Neal's single-season school record of nine in 1999.
- Williams' 14 career picks are tied for first among active FBS players.
- Williams' four career touchdowns (all at Cal) have been scored in three different ways, most recently on a 40-yard interception return for a touchdown against Miami. Williams previously returned a kickoff 80 yards for six points vs. UC Davis in the 2024 season opener and had two fumble returns for scores in 2023 in back-to-back games at Oregon (9 yards) and against Washington State (52 yards).

FERNANDO MANIA

- QB Fernando Mendoza had yet another big game at Wake Forest when he completed 40-of-56 passes for 385 yards (all career highs) with two touchdowns and one interception, while adding 10 rushes for a career-high 51 yards and one touchdown including the two longest runs of his career of 17 and 24 yards to earn ACC Quarterback of the Week and Manning Award Star honors for his second straight game.
- Mendoza's completion percentage and rating (69.0%/144.9) through the first nine games of 2024 are career highs and significantly better (6.0%/12.1) than his final numbers in 2023 (63.0%/132.8) with his completion percentage just 1.7% behind the single-season school record 70.7% posted by Rich Campbell in 1980 and his current rating eighth on Cal's all-time single-season list.
- Mendoza has completed 218-of-316 passes overall for 2,480 yards in 2024 (all career highs) with 12 touchdowns and four interceptions and is among the nation's top 20 in completions per game (24.22, 10th), completion percentage (69.0%, 12th), passing yards per game (15th, 275.6), passing yards (18th) and total offense (283.4 ypg, 20th).

CARLTON CONSISTENTLY IN THE OPPONENT BACKFIELD

- DE Xavier Carlton, who has posted career and 2024 team highs in tackles for loss (10.5, -56 yards), sacks (9.0, -49 yards) and quarterback hurries (6), has become the first Cal player to record double digits in tackles for loss since Cameron Goode had 14.0 in 2019 and is 1.0 sack shy of becoming the first Cal player with 10.0 or more sacks since Zack Follett registered 10.5 sacks in 2008.
- Carlton's 1.00 sacks per contest are third in the ACC and tied for seventh, while his 9.0 total sacks and third and tied for ninth.

KICKERS WIN BACK-TO-BACK ACC SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK

- Cal has had two different placekickers (Ryan Coe, Derek Morris) win ACC Specialist of the Week honors in the team's last two games.
- Coe became the first Cal player to ever make two field goals of 54 yards or more in their career and connected on both of them in the same contest at Wake Forest last Friday with Coe's 54-yarders one yard shy of the school record of 55 co-held by Robbie Keen (1988 vs. Washington) and Tom Schneider (2006 vs. Stanford).
- Morris tied a Cal single-game school record with a career-high five field goals made (33, 46, 19, 25, 38) against Oregon State in the Golden Bears' previous contest to become the third Cal player to achieve the feat.

WILSON AMONG THE BEST

- P Lachlan Wilson is averaging 45.93 yards per punt in 2024 to rank second in the ACC and ninth nationally, as well as put himself 0.37 yards ahead of single-season school-record holder Bryan Anger's mark of 45.56 in 2010. Wilson's career average of 44.60 is the sixth best among active FBS punters, while his 45.14 mark in 22 career games at Cal is the best in school history and 1.18 ahead of second-place Scott Tabor's 43.96.

OTT ON CAREER LISTS. THOMAS LEADS RUNNING BACKS

- RB Jaydn Ott has missed three games in 2024 (San Diego State, at Pitt, NC State) and been limited in others due to injury but has still managed three rushing touchdowns to move into sole possession of seventh place on Cal's all-time list with 23 and is within 123 rushing yards of Cal's all-time top-10 list (John Olszewski (2,504, 1950-52). Ott has 2,381 yards rushing through his first 30 games at Cal.
- RB Jaivian Thomas has been the Golden Bears' top runner with team highs of 83 rushes, 503 yards rushing and six touchdowns on the ground, as well as a 6.1 yards per carry mark that is the best by a running back.

JUSTIN WILCOX ERA

- Cal has a long list of achievements in its first seven-plus seasons under Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox, including Big Game wins over Stanford in each of the last three and four of the past five seasons. Wilcox is the first Cal head coach to win the Big Game three straight times at Stanford since Pappy Waldorf's six in a row on The Farm from 1937-51.
- Wilcox led Cal to back-to-back winning seasons and bowl games in 2018 and 2019 (first time since 2008-09) then returned to a bowl in 2023.
- Wilcox's teams are 18-4 in regular-season non-league games including a 5-2 mark against Power 4 squads with two-game sweeps of North Carolina and Ole Miss, as well as this season's win at Auburn.

ESPN'S COLLEGE GAMEDAY

- Cal hosted ESPN's College GameDay for the first time ever on Oct. 5 prior to its first-ever ACC home game against Miami. The program was held on campus at Memorial Glade and drew 2.0 million viewers on average.

SELLOUT

- Cal's Oct. 5 game against Miami drew 52,428 and was Cal's first sellout at California Memorial Stadium in a non-Big Game since a sellout against Ohio State on Sept. 14, 2013. Cal's most recent sellout prior to Miami came in the 125th Big Game against Stanford on Nov. 19, 2022.

- Cal has 11 players on active NFL rosters in WR Keenan Allen (Chicago), P Bryan Anger (Dallas), S Camryn Bynum (Minnesota), OL Jake Curhan (Chicago), S Ashtyn Davis (NY Jets), QB Jared Goff (Detroit), S Jaylinn Hawkins (New England), S Elijah Hicks (Chicago), DE Cameron Jordan (New Orleans), G Patrick Mekari (Baltimore), QB Aaron Rodgers (NY Jets) and TE Jake Tonges (San Francisco).
- Cal has had six safeties selected in the NFL Draft since 2020 in Camryn Bynum (Minnesota, 2021), Ashtyn Davis (New York Jets, 2020), Jaylinn Hawkins (Atlanta, 2020), Elijah Hicks (Chicago, 2022), Patrick McMorris (Miami, 2024) and Daniel Scott (Indianapolis, 2023).
- Three former Cal players (RB Marshawn Lynch, WR DeSean Jackson, OL Alex Mack) are on the College Football Hall of Fame Class of 2025 ballot.
- Lynch was honored in October of 2024 for exemplifying ACC UNITE's mission to promote and encourage racial equality and social justice through education, partnerships, engagement and advocacy.

MENDOZA CONTINUES TO PUT UP BIG NUMBERS, WIN AWARDS

- Fernando Mendoza had yet another big game at Wake Forest when he completed 40-of-56 passes for 385 yards (all career highs) with two touchdowns and one interception, while adding 10 rushes for a career-high 51 yards and one touchdown including the two longest runs of his career of 17 and 24 yards to earn ACC Quarterback of the Week and Manning Award Star honors for his second straight game.
- Mendoza had thrown for a previous career-high 364 yards in his previous outing against Oregon State with two touchdowns and no interceptions on 27-of-36 passing (75.0%) for a 178.3 rating
- Mendoza's completion percentage and rating (69.0%/144.9) through the first nine games of 2024 are career highs and significantly better (6.0%/12.1) than his final numbers in 2023 (63.0%/132.8) with his completion percentage just 1.7% behind the single-season school record 70.7% posted by Rich Campbell in 1980 and his current rating eighth on Cal's all-time single-season list.
- Mendoza has completed 218-of-316 passes overall for 2,480 yards in 2024 (all career highs) with 12 touchdowns and four interceptions and is among the nation's top 20 in completions per game (24.22, 10th), completion percentage (69.0%, 12th), passing yards per game (15th, 275.6), passing yards (18th) and total offense (283.4 ypg, 20th).
- Mendoza has completed 70% or better of his passes five times in 2024 and been at 80% or better three times including a career-best 90.4% at Auburn (19-21).
- Mendoza is 371-of-559 for 4,188 yards with 26 touchdowns and 14 interceptions for a 139.6 rating that is fourth all-time at Cal in 18 career games and 17 starts.
- Chandler Rogers has played off the bench in six games. In addition to being 4-of-9 for 33 yards in the air, he has 15 rushes for 66 yards and one TD, as well as one reception for three yards.

JAIVIAN THOMAS CONTINUES TO LEAD THE RUN GAME

- Jaivian Thomas (83-503, 6 TD, 6.1 ypc) passed the 500-yard rushing mark for the 2024 season at Wake Forest and has been the team's leader in the running back room over nine games played and four starts with all of his totals career highs. Thomas is the team's leading scorer among non-kickers with his six rushing touchdowns and has scored five of those over the last four contests with at least one in each including his first career two-touchdown game against NC State when he rushed nine times for 78 yards and one touchdowns. Thomas has four of Cal's five longest runs of the 2024 season (57 vs. San Diego State, 49TD vs. Oregon State, 37 vs. San Diego State, 32TD at Auburn).
- Thomas had a career-high-tying 17 rushes and a career-high 169 yards rushing in his first collegiate start against San Diego State, equaled his career-high 17 rushes for 72 yards with one touchdown at Pitt.
- Preseason All-American Jaydn Ott has missed three full games and been limited in others due to injury but still ranks third to Thomas and WR Nyzhia Hunter among position players with totals of four touchdowns and 24 points. Ott scored twice against UC Davis (1-yard run, 6-yard run) and Miami (career-long 66-yard reception, 5-yard run) to give him nine career multiple-touchdown games.
- Ott is Cal's second-leading rusher on the season with 71 carries for 169 yards, while leading all running backs with 19 catches for 192 yards and his one scoring catch. His most productive rushing game of the campaign at Florida State with season highs of 16 carries and 73 yards rushing.
- Ott's three rushing touchdowns have moved him into sole possession of seventh place on Cal's all-time list with 23. Ott has 2,381 rushing yards through his first 30 games at Cal over two-plus seasons and is within 123 rushing yards of Cal's top-10 list with John Olszewski (2504, 1950-52) currently 10th.
- Kadarius Calloway (26-124-1 TD), Byron Cardwell Jr. (21-61-0) and Jamaal Wiley (6-18, 1 TD) have also carried the ball with Calloway's 60-yarder against San Diego State the longest Cal run in 2024.

ENDRIES LEADING ALL BEARS IN RECEPTIONS AND YARDS RECEIVING

- Jack Endries is the team's leader with career highs of 39 receptions and 460 yards receiving, while he is second on the team with two touchdown catches. Endries ranks ninth nationally among top tight ends in receptions and 14th in yards receiving. He had a career-high 119 yards receiving on eight catches with one touchdown against Pitt and a career-high nine receptions for 101 yards and one touchdown against NC State to become the first Cal player since Jeremiah Hunter in the final two games of the 2022 season to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games.
- Corey Dyches, who has 11 receptions for 139 yards and one TD, returned to action at Wake Forest after missing the last three contests due to injury but did not have a catch against the Demon Deacons as his string of 31 consecutive games with at least one reception came to an end.
- Dyches (118-1332, 10 TD) and Endries (74-867, 4 TD) have combined for 192 receptions, 2,199 yards receiving and 14 touchdown grabs in their collegiate careers.
- Jeffrey Johnson (2-13) is the only other tight end with a catch in 2024 and also has one start, while Ben Marshall (9 games), J.T. Byrne (8) and Nate Rutcheda (2) have played but have no offensive stats.

MERRIWEATHER, GRAYES MAKE CAL DEBUTS AT WAKE FOREST

– Transfers Tobias Merriweather (Notre Dame) and Kyion Grayes (Ohio State) made their highly-anticipated Cal debuts at Wake Forest after both missed the first games of the 2024 campaign due to injuries. Merriweather had a team-high-tying six receptions for 52 yards and one touchdown, while Grayes contributed two receptions for 22 yards.

– Nyziah Hunter continues to lead all Cal receivers with season totals of 29 receptions and 390 yards receiving that are both second overall on the team, as well as a team-high five touchdown catches. Hunter began the season with at least one touchdown reception in each of his first three games to become the first Cal player to do so since WR Chad Hansen started the 2016 campaign with at least one scoring catch in each of his first five contests. He did not have another touchdown catch until adding one against Oregon State when he had four receptions for a career-high 85 yards including a career-long 35-yarder then followed with a career-high five receptions for 75 yards at Wake Forest.

– Jonathan Brady (23-260) and Mikey Matthews (23-219) are tied for second for the team among receivers in receptions, while Trond Grizzell (21-299) is second in yards receiving. Brady (6-63) and Matthews (6-61) each had a Cal career-high six receptions at Wake Forest with Brady's 63 yards receiving also tying his best for the Bears. Grizzell had his strongest game of the 2024 campaign with season highs of five receptions and 95 yards receiving against Oregon State. Grizzell had a 51-yard catch against Miami that is the longest by a Cal wide receiver this season.

– Other wide receivers with receptions in 2024 include Mavin Anderson (13-87), Mason Starling (9-121), Josiah Martin (8-72), Merriweather (6-52, 1 TD), Jordan King (4-50) and Grayes (2-22).

– Isaac Torres has played in all eight games primarily on special teams in his first season at Cal but has no statistics, while Trevor Rogers and Cole Boscia have played in two each but have no stats.

– Five transfers – Boscia (Colorado), Brady (New Mexico State), Grayes, Matthews (Utah) and Merriweather are among nine newcomers that make up over half of the 16-player room.

OFFENSIVE LINE THAT CONTINUES TO MIX AND MATCH HAS IMPROVED

– The offensive line has helped Cal to its top two totals of the season in each of its last two games in points (46 at Wake Forest, 44 vs. Oregon State), total yards (500 at Wake Forest, 478 vs. Oregon State) and passing yards (385 at Wake Forest, 364 vs. Oregon State), setting season bests for each vs. Oregon State and then breaking each mark at Wake Forest.

– Cal has used six different starting lineups on the offensive line in 2024 most recently going with LT Nick Morrow, LG Sioape Vatikani, C Will McDonald, RG T.J. Session and RT Frederick Williams III. Vatikani and Session were starting at their respective LG and RG positions for the first time this season.

– The longest Cal has had any group together was a three-game run for LT Nick Morrow, LG Rush Reimer, C Will McDonald, RG Bastian Swinney, RT T.J. Session against Miami, Pitt and NC State.

– Cal has had eight different players make at least one start in McDonald, Morrow, Reimer, Session, Swinney, Vatikani, Williams III and Wykoff.

– LT Nick Morrow is the only member of the offensive line who has started all nine games.

– Cal has started four different offensive linemen at right guard (Swinney 5, Wykoff 2, Session 1, Vatikani 1), three at center (McDonald 6, Swinney 2, Wykoff 1), three at left guard (Reimer 7, Swinney 1, Vatikani 1) and two at right tackle (Session 7, Williams III 2).

– Swinney (center, left guard, right guard) has made at three different positions, while Session (right guard, right tackle), Vatikani (left guard, right guard) and Wykoff (center, right guard) have started at two each.

– According to Pro Football Focus, Morrow leads the unit with 557 offensive snaps in 2024 followed by Reimer (531), Swinney (522), McDonald (415), Wykoff (313), Williams (166), Vatikani (117), Stoffel (110), Trent Ramsey (10) and Braden Miller.

– McDonald (57 GP/32 GS; 6/6 at Cal) has played in the most career collegiate games overall, while Session (41/38; 31/28) leads the way in both overall collegiate and Cal starts. The games played and start numbers for the remainder of the group that have played in 2024 include Reimer (44/36; 8/7), Stoffel (44/20; 9/0), Wykoff (38/24; 22/15), Vatikani (27/22), Swinney (23/11), Morrow (9/9), Dylan Jemtegaard (6/0), Braden Miller (5/0; 2/0) and Ramsey (5/0).

– Cal's 2024 offensive line helped the Bears rush for a season-high 275 yards against San Diego State that were the most since Cal compiled 357 rushing yards at North Texas to open the 2023 campaign.

– Cal's 2023 offensive line was given much of the credit for the Bears averaging 172.8 rushing yards per contest, which was its highest mark since 2012.

– The offensive line has allowed just a combined 6.0 sacks in the last three games including none against Oregon State after giving up 21 in the previous four contests.

– Keanaaina (27 tackles; 2.5 TFL, -4 yards; 1.0 sack, -2 yards; 1 PBU; 1 QBH) leads the group in tackles, while Nate Burrell has the second-most stops and the most negative plays (21 tackles; 5.0 TFL, -32 yards; 2.5 sacks, -24 yards; 1 PBU; 1 QBH) and is followed by Bollers (15 tackles; 3.0 TFL, -8 yards; 2 PBU, 3 QBH; 1 BLK), Correia (13 tackles; 1.5 TFL, -4 yards), Saole-McKenzie (9 tackles) and Wilkins (8 tackles, 1 QBH, 1 BLK).

– Keanaaina has started each of the first nine contests, while Burrell started the first five opposite him and Ricky Correia each of the last four.

– Wilkins (vs. Oregon State) and Bollers (at Wake Forest) have blocked field goals in each of the last two contests after Cal had gone more than 10 years since its most recent blocked field goal against Oregon State in 2014.

– Akili Calhoun (1 tackle) and Curlee Thomas IV have also played two games each in 2024.

BUCHANAN SECOND-LEADING TACKLER IN ACC. BARTH TAKING ADVANTAGE OF OPPORTNITY

– Teddy Buchanan's 83 total tackles and rank 9.2 stops per game both rank second in the ACC with his per-game number 18th nationally and his total tied for 21st. Buchanan is also second on the squad with 9.0 tackles for loss (-51 yards) and 4.0 sacks (-31 yards), while adding four pass breakups, five quarterback hurries and one forced fumble.

– With Cade Uluave battling through injuries of late, Hunter Barth has emerged alongside Buchanan most recently at Wake Forest with career highs of seven tackles, a 2024 team-high 2.0 sacks (-21 yards) and one forced fumble on a kickoff return that led to a 16-yard fumble return touchdown for Miles Williams at Wake Forest. He also had a fumble recovery that was called back by a penalty against the Demon Deacons. Barth made his first start in the previous contest against Oregon State with Uluave out and had five tackles, one forced fumble (also on a kick return) and one pass breakup. Barth has 18 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss (-29 yards), 3.0 sacks (-29 yards), one pass breakup and two forced fumbles in 2024.

– Buchanan has career totals of 291 tackles, 24.0 tackles for loss (-108 yards), 8.0 sacks (-48 yards), eight interceptions that he has returned for 71 yards and one touchdown, 10 pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery over 45 games and 38 starts at UC Davis (2020-23 and Cal (2024).

– Despite missing the entire Oregon State game and much of the Wake Forest contest due to injury, Uluave remains Cal's second-leading tackler by a wide margin with 67. Uluave's 8.4 stops per game are fifth in the ACC. Uluave has added 2.5 tackles for loss (-6 yards), 0.5 sacks (-2 yards), one interception that he returned six yards, two pass breakups and five quarterback hurries in 2024. In 21 career games and 14 starts, he has totals of 133 tackles, 9.0 tackles for loss (-48 yards), 3.0 sacks (-28 yards), two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries that he has returned 51 yards and one touchdown, three interceptions that he has returned 10 yards, five pass breakups and five quarterback hurries.

– Liam Johnson has also made many contributions especially of late and on the season has totaled 11 tackles, one interception that he returned for a loss of two yards, one fumble recovery and one quarterback hurry.

CARLTON HAVING HUGE SEASON TO LEAD EDGE PLAYERS

– Xavier Carlton has posted career and 2024 team highs in tackles for loss (10.5, -56 yards), sacks (9.0, -49 yards) and quarterback hurries (6). Carlton has become the first Cal player to record double digits in tackles for loss since Cameron Goode had 14.0 in 2019 and 1.0 sack shy of become the first Cal player with 10.0 or more sacks since Zack Follett registered 10.5 sacks in 2008. Carlton also has 36 tackles.

– Carlton's 1.00 sacks per contest are third in the ACC and tied for seventh, while his 9.0 total sacks and third and tied for ninth.

– Carlton has played in 49 games with 30 starts over four-plus seasons at Utah (2020-21) and Cal (2022-24), contributing career totals of 138 tackles, 26.5 tackles for loss (-112 yards), 19.0 sacks (-93 yards), two fumble recoveries, four pass breakups and 15 quarterback hurries.

– Cheikhsaliou Fall (15 tackles; 3.0 TFL -8 yards; 1.0 SK, -4 yards; 1 PBU; 5 QBH), Ryan McCulloch (9 tackles; 1.5 TFL, -4 yards; 1.0 SK, -3 yards; 1 PBU; 5 QBH), David Reese (9 tackles; 3.0 TFL, -20 yards; 3.0 sacks, -20 yards; 2 PBU; 1 FF; 1 QBH) and Serigne Tounkara (5 tackles; 1.5 TFL, -11 yards; 1.5 SK, -11 yards; 1 QBH) have seen most of the remainder of the action.

– Reese had a notable outing at Wake Forest with season highs of three tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss (-16 yards), 2.0 sacks (-16 yards) and two pass breakups.

WILLIAMS A BEDNARIK AND THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALIST

- Nohl Williams is having a historic 2024 season and a semifinalist for both the prestigious Chuck Bednarik Award honoring the nation's top defensive player and Paycom Jim Thorpe paying tribute to the country's best defensive back. Williams is just the second Cal player to be named a semifinalist for the Thorpe Award, joining Daymeion Hughes in 2006.
- Williams recorded his seventh interception of the season in his most recent contest at Wake Forest and continues to lead the nation with his seven two more than anyone else in the nation and also tied for third with five others on Cal's all-time list, as well as the most since Hughes picked off eight in 2006 when he was also the Lott IMPACT Player of the Year, a consensus first-team All-American and the Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year. Deltha O'Neal's nine picks in 1999 are the single-season school record.
- Williams had at least one interception in five of Cal's first six games in 2024 (all other than at Florida State) and became the first Cal player since Eric Piatt in 2014 to record at least one interception in each of his first three games, as well as the first since Elijah Hicks in 2021 to have an interception in any three consecutive contests. Williams' 14 career picks are tied for the most among all active FBS players with nine of those in 22 games at Cal after five in 26 contests at UNLV.
- Williams has four touchdowns in his career (all at Cal) and has scored in three different ways, most recently twice this season when he returned an interception 40 yards for a touchdown against Miami and a kickoff 80 yards for a touchdown vs. UC Davis. He had two fumble return touchdowns in 2023 in back-to-back games at Oregon (9 yards) and against Washington State (52 yards).
- Nohl Williams is also tied for first in the ACC and tied for fifth nationally with his 12 passes defended.
- Marcus Harris and Craig Woodson have each added a pair of picks, while Lu-Magia Hearn III, Cam Sidney, Ja'ir Smith and Miles Williams have one each as the defensive backs have accounted for 15 of Cal's 17 interceptions that lead the nation.
- Nohl Williams has played in 48 career games with 45 starts including all 22 possible at Cal and in addition to his 14 interceptions that he has returned for 116 yards and one touchdown, he has career collegiate totals of 184 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss (-7 yards), 21 pass breakups, two forced fumbles, and four fumble recoveries that he has returned for 137 yards and a pair of touchdowns.
- Woodson is the only Cal player to start each the team's last 34 games over the last two-plus seasons and has career totals of 218 tackles, 9.0 tackles for loss (-21 yards), 15 pass breakups, five interceptions that he has returned for 41 yards and one touchdown, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, two quarterback hurries and one blocked kick.
- Cal has five defensive backs in Harris (49/42, 9/8 at Cal), Nohl Williams (48/45, 22/22), Miles Williams (46/9), Craig Woodson (42/36) and Lu-Magia Hearn III (39/23) who have played in at least 39 collegiate games with all but Miles Williams also posting 23 or more career starts.

COE HITS TWO 54-YARDERS, BECOMES CAL'S SECOND STRAIGHT ACC SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK

- PK Ryan Coe became the first Cal player to ever make two field goals of 54 yards or more in their career and connected on both of them in the same game at Wake Forest to earn ACC Specialist of the Week honors two weeks and one game after fellow PK Derek Morris earned the same honor after tying a Cal single-game school record with a career-high five field goals made (33, 46, 19, 25, 38) against Oregon State to become the third Cal player to achieve the feat. Coe's 54-yarder were one yard shy of the school record of 55 co-held by Robbie Keen (1988 vs. Washington) and Tom Schneider (2006 vs. Stanford).
- P Lachlan Wilson is averaging 45.93 yards per punt in 2024 to rank second in the ACC and ninth nationally, as well as put himself 0.37 yards ahead of single-season school-record holder Bryan Anger's mark of 45.56 in 2010. Wilson's career average of 44.60 is the sixth best among active FBS punters, while his 45.14 mark in 22 career games at Cal is the best in school history and 1.18 ahead of second-place Scott Tabor's 43.96. Wilson has pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line on 17 of his 40 punts in 2024, including a career-high-tying five times at Pitt, while he has nine punts of 50 or more yards. Wilson has career totals over 56 games at Tulsa (2020-22) and Cal (2023-present) of 253 punts for 11,285 yards that are both the second-most by any active FBS player, including 70 that have traveled 50 or more yards. Wilson had a 2024 season-long 69-yarder on his final punt at Florida State and averaged a season-best 49.3 yards per punt to earn a spot on the Ray Guy Award's weekly Ray's 8 then made the list again for his performance at Pitt (47.2 avg, career-high-tying 5 inside the 20, 61 long).
- PKs Derek Morris (10-11 FG, 9-9 PAT) and Ryan Coe (9-16 FG, 16-16 PAT) have shared FG/PAT duties in 2024 with Coe doing kickoffs (64.7 average, 40 touchbacks on 54 kickoffs).
- Cal's specialists have played a significant role in three of the team's five wins in 2024 with Wilson pinning Auburn at its two-yard line twice and inside its 20-yard line four times, Morris making a career-high five field goals against Oregon State and Coe hitting the two 54-yard field goals at Wake Forest.
- LS David Bird has made 152 career snaps (FG/PAT/Punt) without being errant, including 93 this year.

TRAVERS FAMILY HEAD FOOTBALL COACH JUSTIN WILCOX

Justin Wilcox has compiled a long list of accomplishments and signature wins as the Travers Family Head Football Coach and is in his eighth campaign on the job and Cal and his first in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2024. Wilcox is the first Cal head coach to win the Big Game three straight times on the road since Pappy Waldorf captured six straight at Stanford from 1937-51. The 2023 victory at Stanford was Cal's fourth win in the Big Game in the last five meetings, including three in a row overall (2021-23) and three straight on The Farm (2019, '21, '23). The Golden Bears have also won a combined five times over in-state rivals UCLA and USC during Wilcox's tenure, as well as ended long losing streaks Wilcox inherited from his predecessors with multiple victories against Stanford, USC and Washington. In 2018 and 2019, Wilcox led Cal to back-to-back winning campaigns and bowl games for the first time since 2008 and 2009, then returned to a bowl in 2023. The Bears have knocked off five teams that either won Pac-12 titles that season or were reigning league champs during Wilcox's tenure and taken down four AP Top 25 teams in No. 8 Washington State (2017), No. 15 Washington (2018), No. 14 Washington (2019) and No. 23 Oregon (2020).

Most recently, he led the Bears to bowl-eligibility and a Radiance Technologies Independence Bowl selection in 2023 after wins in each of their final three regular-season games at home against Washington State and then on the road at state rivals Stanford and UCLA. Cal's other victories in 2023 came at North Texas in the season opener and at home against Idaho and Arizona State. Five of the team's seven losses were against ranked teams at No. 5 Washington in its' Pac-12 opener and then in a school-record four straight games against ranked squads (No. 15 Oregon State, at No. 16 Utah, No. 24 USC, at No. 6 Oregon). The Bears also fell to perennial and national powerhouse Auburn in their home opener and Texas Tech in the Independence Bowl. All seven teams Cal was defeated by and UCLA played in bowl games with Washington reaching the championship game of the College Football Playoff, while Idaho reached the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs.

The 2023 Bears featured running back Jaydn Ott, a 2023 honorable mention All-American (Phil Steele), first-team All-Pac-12 selection and Pac-12's rushing champion, and 2024 Heisman Trophy candidate, who led the league and ranked among the nation's best in all-purpose yards per game (135.67, #6 NCAA), rushing yards per game (109.6 ypg, #9 NCAA) and rushing yards (1315, #14 NCAA). Ott, who had five of the Pac-12's top nine games for rushing yards in 2023 while no one else had more than one, also tied for second in the Pac-12 with 15 total touchdowns (#19T NCAA) and second with 12 rushing touchdowns (#29T NCAA) to lead a rushing offense that averaged 172.8 yards on the ground per game in 2023, which was fourth in the Pac-12 and Cal's highest mark since 2012, including four games of 235 or more yards with a 357-yard rushing game in the season-opener at North Texas that was the most by the Bears since rushing for 431 against Washington in 2008.

The 2023 defense led the nation with 16 fumbles recovered and tied for the national lead with 28 turnovers gained, both pacing the Pac-12. In addition, the Bears' three defensive touchdowns were second in the Pac-12 and tied for 15th nationally. All six players from Cal's 2023 Independence Bowl squad who were honored on All-Pac-12 teams last season return in 2024, with Ott joined by second-team punter Lachlan Wilson, honorable mention choices in outside linebacker David Reese and defensive back Craig Woodson, and a pair of freshman honorees in Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year inside linebacker Cade Uluave and Freshman Offensive Player of the Year honorable mention selection quarterback Fernando Mendoza. Uluave and tight end Jack Endries were also 2023 Freshman All-American picks with Uluave a three-time first-teamer (College Football Network, FWAA, The Athletic) while Endries earned first-team recognition from College Football News and second-team honors from The Athletic, in addition to being an honorable mention choice of the College Football Network.

The Bears built on their momentum at the end of the 2023 regular season and have added 54 players overall, 41 scholarship players and 28 first-year transfers to their 2024 roster including 18 players that arrived on campus in January and participated in 2024 spring practice. Cal's transfer portal recruiting class currently ranks No. 14 according to On3 and had been as high as No. 6 at one point.

Wilcox has coached 12 players as Cal's head coach who are currently on NFL rosters in Christopher Brooks (Miami), Camryn Bynum (Minnesota), Jake Curhan (Seattle), Ashtyn Davis (New York Jets), Cameron Goode (Miami), Jaylinn Hawkins (New England), Elijah Hicks (Chicago), Patrick McMorris (Miami), Patrick Mekari (Baltimore), Daniel Scott (Indianapolis, injured reserve), Jackson Sirmon (New York Jets) and Jake Tonges (San Francisco). A total of 28 Cal players since Wilcox became the Bears' head coach in 2017 have been on NFL rosters.

Wilcox also spent three seasons as Cal's linebackers coach from 2003-05 in his first position as a full-time coach. The Bears posted a 26-12 record during his first stint in Berkeley with trips to the Insight, Holiday and Las Vegas Bowls.

Mike Bloesch (OC/OL)

Mike Bloesch is in his second season on Cal's coaching staff in 2024 and his first full year as the Golden Bears' offensive coordinator/offensive line coach. Bloesch was Cal's offensive line coach/run game coordinator during the 2023 regular season before being elevated to offensive coordinator/offensive line coach on December 2, 2023.

Bloesch served in his current role in Cal's appearance at the Radiance Technologies Independence Bowl to conclude a 2023 season in which he was given much of the credit for the improvement of an offensive line that helped the running game average 172.8 yards per game, which was its highest mark since 2012. He engineered Cal's tremendous improvements in protecting the quarterback, improving from 10th to fourth in the Pac-12 in per game sacks allowed (2.58 to 1.77). He produced a trio of Pac-12 Offensive Lineman of the Week selections in Driscoll (Week 1 at North Texas; Week 11 vs. Washington State) and Miller (Week 12 at Stanford).

**Peter Sirmon (DC/ILB)**

Peter Sirmon is in his seventh season at Cal and fifth campaign as the Golden Bears' defensive coordinator in 2024, while he also continues to be the program's inside linebackers position coach for the seventh consecutive campaign. Sirmon started at Cal in 2018 as the inside linebackers coach before adding co-defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator duties to his role in 2019. He also served as the recruiting coordinator for three seasons from 2019-21. Sirmon has been instrumental in developing a multitude of key defensive players at Cal, including a pair of All-Americans in ILB Evan Weaver and CB Elijah Hicks. Weaver was a consensus first-team pick and earned Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in 2019, while Hicks was a third-teamer in 2021. Weaver was also the nation's leading tackler in 2019. Sirmon's son, Jackson, was a fourth-team preseason All-American in 2023 and was named first-team All-Pac-12 by Pro Football Focus despite missing the final seven games due to injury.

Vic So'oto (STC/OLB)

Vic So'oto is in his third season at Cal and his second campaign as the special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach in 2024, after serving as the outside linebackers coach in 2022. So'oto runs a Bears' kickoff return unit that posted an average of 19.83 yards allowed per return – which was Cal's best since 2016 and ranked fifth in the Pac-12 – in his first campaign as Cal's special teams coordinator in 2022, before dropping the yards allowed per kick return to 19.80 in 2023. So'oto coached an outside linebackers unit that helped the Cal defense become elite at taking away the ball in 2023. He has been instrumental in fostering the growth of 2024 returning starting outside linebackers Xavier Carlton and David Reese.

**Terrence Brown (DB)**

Terrence Brown is in his third season as a defensive backs coach at Cal in 2024. Brown, who joined the team's coaching staff on December 23, 2021, shares duties with Tre Watson coaching the Golden Bears' defensive backs.

**Andrew Browning (DL)**

Andrew Browning is in his sixth season as the defensive line coach and his seventh campaign overall with the program, having also served in a quality control role on the defensive side of the ball in his first season with the Bears in 2018.

**Sterlin Gilbert (QB)**

Sterlin Gilbert is in his first season as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2024. Gilbert has led some of the nation's top offenses during a coaching career that has spanned two decades, including stints over the last nine seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach on the FBS level at Tulsa (2015), Texas (2016), South Florida (2017-18) and Syracuse (2020-21).

**Mike Saffell (TE)**

Mike Saffell in his first season as the tight ends coach at Cal in 2024. Saffell, who was a four-year letterwinner as an offensive lineman for the Golden Bears (2017-20), has spent the past three seasons on Cal's football staff as a student coach (2021) and graduate assistant (2022-23) working with the offensive line.

**Aristotle Thompson (RB)**

Aristotle Thompson is in his fifth season as the running backs coach at Cal in 2024 after spending the previous 11 campaigns in the same role at Cal Poly. Thompson has a promising group of running backs in the fold in 2024, led by Heisman Trophy candidate and preseason All-American Jaydn Ott, who is poised to set Cal's all-time records for rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.

**Burl Toler III (WR/RC)**

Burl Toler III is in his second stint and 10th season on the coaching or football staff at his alma mater Cal in 2024, as well as his sixth season as a full-time assistant coach and fifth working with the wide receivers. He is also in his third campaign as the team's recruiting coordinator.

**Tre Watson (DB)**

Tre Watson is in his fourth season as the defensive backs coach at Cal in 2024 and shares the duties with Terrence Brown.

**Brian Johnson (AP)**

Johnson is in his fourth campaign as the head football athletic performance coach at Cal in 2024. Johnson has coached 79 players during 11 collegiate seasons that have been selected for the NFL Draft including a total of 11 first-rounders.

GAME 1: BEARS PULL AWAY FOR WIN TO OPEN 2024 SEASON

BERKELEY – The California football team pitched a second-half shutout to pull away from UC Davis in a 31-13 victory in its 2024 season opener Saturday afternoon at California Memorial Stadium.

The Golden Bears recorded three interceptions, including one by senior Nohl Williams, who also returned a kickoff 80 yards for a touchdown.

"Nohl was awesome," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "The kick return was huge. It was a momentum changer. I really like his competitiveness."

Redshirt freshman Nyziah Hunter had four catches for 47 yards and his first career touchdown in his collegiate debut while Jaydn Ott added two scoring runs for Cal, which has won all 12 meetings all-time against the Aggies.

Linebacker Cade Uluave and transfer cornerback Marcus Harris also picked off UC Davis quarterback Miles Hastings while Ott and junior Mavin Anderson each also added four receptions. Sophomore Fernando Mendoza started for Cal and went 15-for-22 for 158 yards and a touchdown. Transfer Chandler Rogers also saw time for the Bears, completing 3 of 6 passes for 21 yards and also gaining 17 yards on the ground.

"I didn't really expect to play this game. I just came in ready," Hunter said. "I kind of blacked out when I scored that touchdown. There was so much emotion going through my body."

The Aggies took a brief 13-7 lead late in the second quarter before Williams ran back the ensuing kickoff for a touchdown. The Bears would not relinquish the advantage again, as Ott and Hunter found the end zone in the second half and new placekicker Ryan Coe booted a 25-yard field goal.

"In the first half, we had good effort but our execution was lacking," Wilcox said. "We weren't in any type of rhythm as a team. I'm really proud of the way the guys persevered through that. Once you get out there and you trust your training. ... all of the sudden things start going your way. It was really a tale of two halves."

**GAME 2: BEARS TURN BACK AUBURN, 21-14**

AUBURN, Ala. – There is only one thing sacred in the California football program, and it has nothing to do with any player or coach.

It's the football itself.

Two games into the 2024 season, the Golden Bears are once again demonstrating the importance of getting the football in their hands. Saturday, it resulted in one of the most pivotal nonconference wins in Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox's eight seasons at Cal.

The Bears forced Auburn into five turnovers without committing one themselves, and Cal held on for a 21-14 victory over Auburn in front of a sellout crowd of 88,043 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

"We talked about it going into today, that we wanted to be plus-2 or plus-3 (in turnover margin)," Wilcox said. "It was about protecting the football and not giving it to them. That's the only sacred thing – not a coach or player. It's the football, and we took care of it today."

The Bears (2-0) ranked third in the country last season in turnovers gained and already have eight this season. Defensive back Nohl Williams had two interceptions against the Tigers to give him three for the season, while Ja'ir Smith and Lu-Magia Hearn III also picked off Auburn quarterback Payton Thorne. Cal also took it away when linebacker Teddye Buchanan stripped running back Jarquez Hunter and the ball was recovered by safety Craig Woodson.

"All the work we've put in is coming together – we just have to keep it going," Williams said. "Our defense did a good job of getting so many turnovers and getting the ball back to the offense."

It looked as though the Bears may have had a turnover for points on the second play of the game when linebacker Cade Uluave initially appeared to intercept a Thorne pass and return it for a touchdown. But video review revealed the ball hit the turf before Uluave could possess the ball, and the Tigers ended up scoring a touchdown on their first possession to lead 7-0 less than four minutes into the game.

But Cal answered immediately, led by a breathtaking opening possession by quarterback Fernando Mendoza. He led the offense on an eight-play, 75-yard drive – going 6-for-6 for 57 yards, culminating in a 19-yard touchdown throw to freshman Nyzhiah Hunter.

Mendoza completed his first eight passes of the game before throwing an incompletion on an intentional pass out of bounds, and then connected on seven more attempts in a row. One of those went for another touchdown to Hunter to give Cal a 14-7 lead in the second quarter.

Hunter, who began training camp as a third-string wide receiver but has received a chance to play because of injuries to others at his position, now has three scoring catches in his first two games.

"I didn't really expect to play this season," Hunter said. "I just came out prepared and ready to play. It was a tough game. I felt like I was part of the team and can make plays as well."

When Cal's defense wasn't forcing turnovers, it was for the most part also silencing Auburn's offense. The Bears held the Tigers to just 286 yards of total offense, led by linebacker Teddye Buchanan's stat-stuffing performance. Buchanan, a graduate transfer from UC Davis, recorded 11 tackles – including two sacks – while also forcing a fumble.

"He's a really good football player – but his approach is as important as anything," Wilcox said. "Around the building, how he approaches meetings and walk-throughs – he's a total professional. There's not much he isn't prepared for. That doesn't mean he's perfect, but if someone makes a play on him, you'll have to earn it."

Cal extended the lead to 21-7 on a 32-yard touchdown run by Jaivian Thomas with 11:27 left to play, but the Tigers answered to cut the deficit to 21-14 with just over six minutes left. Auburn's final two possessions ended on Cal interceptions.

"The leaders of this team came together with the other guys and talked about this being Cal vs. the world," Mendoza said. "We knew if we executed play by play, we would have a great result. Great teams finish out close games, and that was a big emphasis this offseason. We finished this game on the national stage, and I'm proud of all of my guys."

GAME 3: BEARS IMPROVE TO 3-0 WITH WIN OVER SAN DIEGO STATE

BERKELEY – Jaivian Thomas rushed for a career-high 169 yards and the Golden Bears held San Diego State without a touchdown until the fourth quarter in a 31-10 whitewashing of San Diego State on Saturday night at California Memorial Stadium.

With the win, Cal is off to its first 3-0 start since 2019 and has won six regular season games in a row for the first time since capturing the final regular season game of the 2006 season and the first five in 2007.

Four different Golden Bears scored touchdowns, including two who reached the end zone for their first time at Cal – running back Kadarius Calloway and tight end Corey Dyches. Wide receiver Nyziah Hunter continued his eye-opening freshman season with his fourth scoring catch of the year.

Calloway finished with 87 yards rushing as the Bears amassed 275 yards on the ground as a team. Jaydn Ott missed the game due to injury.

Cornerback Nohl Williams, who entered the game leading the nation in interceptions, added his fourth of the season in the second quarter. Xavier Carlton had a career-high 2.5 sacks for Cal.

The Aztecs scored first on a 29-yard field goal from Nick Lopez with 5:42 left in the first quarter but the Bears answered immediately with a seven-play, 69-yard drive that culminated in an 8-yard scoring run by Mendoza. The score remained 7-3 at halftime as the teams combined to commit 19 penalties in the first half – including 13 by the Aztecs.

The Bears established some breathing room with two long scoring drives in the third quarter – an 8-play, 85-yard possession that ended with Calloway's 7-yard scoring run, and a 13-play, 90-yard drive that culminated in a 20-yard touchdown pass from Mendoza to Dyches.

A 48-yard field goal by Ryan Coe pushed Cal's advantage to 24-3, and San Diego State finally reached the end zone to make it 24-10 early in the fourth quarter. Hunter capped off the scoring with a 15-yard touchdown catch with 9:48 to play.

GAME 4: BEARS FALL JUST SHORT TO FLORIDA STATE, 14-9

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – The California football team drove to the Florida State 12-yard line with under two minutes remaining but was ultimately turned back in a 14-9 loss to the Seminoles in its first Atlantic Coast Conference game ever at Doak Campbell Stadium on Saturday night.

The Golden Bears (3-1, 0-1) converted a long third down and sizable fourth down on their final possession, but the drive ultimately stalled at the FSU 23 with just under a minute to play.

"This stings, but this can make us a better team," Cal quarterback Fernando Mendoza said. "We have the opportunity to respond. Every guy on the team has a great mindset, and we are all going to respond accordingly."

Cal extended its national lead to 10 interceptions when Miles Williams picked off Seminoles quarterback DJ Uiagalelei in the first quarter.

Linebacker Cade Uluave had 11 tackles to lead a defensive effort that limited Florida State to 284 yards of offense. The Bears recorded three sacks and seven tackles for loss.

Mendoza went 22-for-36 for a career-high 303 yards and added a 26-yard run on 3rd-and-14 during the Bears' final possession. Jaydn Ott returned from a one-game absence due to injury and amassed 73 yards rushing on 16 carries. Mason Starling registered career-highs of five catches and 68 yards.

"We can't dwell on this," Uluave said. "We just have to put our head down and keep going."

Florida St. took a 7-0 lead in the first quarter but Cal chipped away on a pair of field goals by Ryan Coe to trim the advantage to 7-6 at the half. A third Coe field goal gave the Bears a 9-7 lead with 1:30 remaining in the third quarter.

But the Seminoles went back in front on a 3rd-and-7 from the Cal 36 on a touchdown pass from Uiagalelei to Ja'Khi Douglas with 11:08 to play.

The Bears' final drive began at their 36-yard line with 4:38 to play. Along with his 26-yard scramble for a first down, Mendoza also converted a 4th-and-13 on a pass to tight end Jack Endries to move the ball to the FSU 32 with 1:49 remaining.

"We have to identify the things that make the difference in the game," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "When you play a team like Florida State with that much talent, you can't make mistakes and expect to win. We had plenty of opportunities and couldn't capitalize on it. They did, so they deserve credit for that."

Not only did Saturday mark the first-ever ACC game for the Bears, it was also the first time Cal and Florida State have ever met on the football field.

GAME 5: BEARS CAN'T HOLD OFF NO. 8 MIAMI

BERKELEY – The California football team built a sizable lead midway through the third quarter but ultimately fell to No. 8 Miami 39-38 on Saturday night in front of a sellout crowd of 52,428 at California Memorial Stadium.

The Golden Bears, playing in their first home game in the Atlantic Coast Conference, built a 35-10 advantage with 8:06 to play in the third quarter before the Hurricanes stormed back. Miami scored the game-winning touchdown with 26 seconds remaining.

Cal built its lead with big plays, as it had three scoring plays go for at least 40 yards. Tight end Jack Endries registered a 57-yard touchdown catch, Jaydn Ott scored on a 66-yard TD reception and Nohl Williams returned an interception 40 yards for a score. When backup quarterback Chandler Rogers found the end zone on a 9-yard run, Cal led 35-10.

But after containing him in the first half, the Bears couldn't slow down Heisman Trophy candidate Cam Ward, who threw for 437 yards and two touchdowns.

It was Williams' seventh interception at Cal and 12th of his career. He also scored a touchdown on a kickoff return earlier this season.

Ott also scored on a 5-yard run in the second quarter, moving him into seventh place on Cal's all-time rushing touchdowns list with 23.

GAME 6: COMEBACK FALLS JUST SHORT AT NO. 22 PITTSBURGH

PITTSBURGH – The California football team held No. 22 Pittsburgh's high-powered offense scoreless for nearly three quarters but fell just short in a 17-15 defeat on Saturday afternoon at Acrisure Stadium.

The Panthers converted a field goal to take a 17-6 lead with 10:04 remaining in the second quarter and didn't score again. The Golden Bears (3-3, 0-3 ACC) got a 39-yard field goal by Ryan Coe midway through the second quarter and 19-yard touchdown catch by tight end Jack Endries early in the fourth period to trim the deficit to 17-15 but couldn't take the lead.

Cal hurt itself with 12 penalties for 110 yards and a handful of other untimely mistakes.

"There might be some teams that are good enough to have self-inflicted wounds – I'm not sure you ever go through a game perfectly," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "But we don't have the margin for error to play bad football from time to time and expect to win against a Top 25 team. Nobody feels sorry for us. Those are things we have to fix. If we do that, then we can win these one-score games."

Cal's three losses this season are by a combined eight points.

Pittsburgh entered the game ranked No. 4 nationally in total offense with an average of 522.2 yards per game and No. 6 in scoring offense at 45.6 points per contest. The Bears limited the Panthers to just 277 yards of offense and intercepted Pitt quarterback Eli Holstein twice to give them a nation-leading 13 on the season. Nohl Williams picked off one of the passes for his sixth of the year.

"I appreciate (the defense's) resilience," Wilcox said. "If we were able to take the lead, I felt good about our defense stopping them. Unfortunately, we weren't able to do that."

Cal put together a potential game-winning drive in the fourth quarter, notching three first downs and moving the ball to the Pittsburgh 22. But Coe couldn't convert a 40-yard field goal attempt with 1:50 to play.

The Bears' defense came up with one final stop off Pittsburgh's offense to get the ball back with 47 seconds remaining, but Cal couldn't move the ball from deep in its own territory and the Panthers held on for the victory.

Cal played the game without running back Jaydn Ott, who missed his second game this season due to injury. Jaivian Thomas led the Bears with 72 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries. Endries finished with career-highs of eight catches for 119 yards.

"Nobody wants to make mistakes; mistakes happen," said Cal quarterback Fernando Mendoza, who was 27-for-37 for 272 yards and a touchdown. "We know what we have to do in our locker room. The only thing that matters now is N.C. State."

GAME 7: CAL FALLS TO NC STATE, 24-23

BERKELEY – The California football team took a two-touchdown lead into the fourth quarter but couldn't hold on in a 24-23 loss to visiting North Carolina State on Saturday afternoon at California Memorial Stadium.

The Golden Bears got two touchdown runs from running back Jaivian Thomas and three field goals by freshman kicker Derek Morris, but the Wolfpack got into the end zone twice in the final period – including the game-winning score with 6:32 to go – to cap off the comeback victory.

Cal appeared to be in good position to go back in front late in the fourth quarter, putting together a 13-play, 65-yard drive that consumed almost five minutes of the clock. But Morris couldn't convert a 28-yard field goal attempt with 1:34 to play.

The Bears' defense held NC State to a three-and-out and Cal got one last possession, but the drive stalled at the Bears' 42-yard line to close things out.

"I have to do a better job coaching the team so we can find a way to win these tight games," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "Everyone has to come back and own their part of it. We need to have high expectations and standards for the way we operate around here. We need to show grit and toughness. But it starts with me. It's my job to help the team perform better."

Thomas put Cal up 7-0 on the fifth play from scrimmage when he ran straight up the middle of the field for a 49-yard touchdown run. A field goal and touchdown pushed the Wolfpack in front 10-7 but Morris then converted three consecutive field goals. Thomas' 7-yard scoring run with 24 seconds remaining in the third quarter extended the Bears' advantage to 23-10.

Thomas finished with 78 yards on the ground on nine carries while quarterback Fernando Mendoza was 30-for-42 for 282 yards. Tight end Jack Endries had a career-high nine catches for 101 yards.

Cal outgained NC State 399-363 and had eight more first downs (23-15).

"We have to regroup," Mendoza said. "It's a normal human emotion to feel frustrated after a loss. Nobody in our locker room is feeling good right now. But as leaders it's about inspiring positive energy within the team so we can regroup."

The Bears played Saturday's game without several key injured players, including running back Jaydn Ott, offensive lineman Sioape Vatikani and outside linebacker Ryan McCulloch.

GAME 8: BEARS DISMANTLE OREGON STATE, 44-7

BERKELEY – Quarterback Fernando Mendoza threw for a career-high 364 yards and freshman Derek Morris tied a school record with five made field goals, leading the California football team to a 44-7 rout of Oregon State on Saturday afternoon at California Memorial Stadium.

Mendoza threw two touchdown passes while Jaivian Thomas and Jamaal Wiley rushed for scores, as the Golden Bears snapped a four-game losing streak with a thorough victory over their old Pac-12 rivals.

"We just want to be really consistent in our play and have a standard of play that doesn't deviate, regardless of who we play, what the score is, what the weather is like, whether there are fans or no fans," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "This builds confidence, and confidence is a really important part of football."

One of Mendoza's touchdown throws ended up being credited to himself, as he completed a short pass to Thomas, who lateraled the ball back to Mendoza for a 15-yard score. Mendoza also completed a 20-yard touchdown pass to redshirt freshman Nyzhiah Hunter, his fifth scoring catch of the season.

Cal's defense came close to registering its first shutout since 2005 before the Beavers scored a touchdown with five minutes to play. The Bears held Oregon State to 200 yards of total offense, the lowest total by a Cal opponent since Colorado registered just 104 total yards in 2021.

"It's just all of us buying in," Cal safety Craig Woodson said. "The whole week we told each other to just believe in each other and buy into what we do. The way we dominated today gives us confidence going into our next game."

Morris went 5-for-5 on field goal attempts in just his second career game, including a 46-yarder in the second quarter.

The Bears' halted four-game losing streak came by a total of four points.

"The psychology of sports and how one play can really affect the psychology of a player or a team or an entire football community is amazing," Wilcox said. "We had some frustrating and agonizing losses. I'm really proud of the guys for coming out and playing with confidence and believing in themselves and each other."

"After four tough losses like that, there are people out there that would have crumbled and not been able to bounce back. I'm really, really proud and pleased with our guys for battling back."

GAME 9: BEARS HOLD OFF WAKE FOREST FOR FIRST-EVER ACC VICTORY

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. – The California football team forced four turnovers and quarterback Fernando Mendoza threw for a career-high 385 yards and accounted for three touchdowns, and the Golden Bears registered their first Atlantic Coast Conference victory in program history with a 46-36 triumph over host Wake Forest on Friday night at Allegacy Federal Credit Union Stadium.

Placekicker Ryan Coe booted a pair of 54-yard field goals and wide receiver Mikey Matthews notched career-highs of eight catches and 83 yards, as Cal inched closer to bowl eligibility for the second year in a row. The Bears (5-4, 1-4 ACC) need to win one of their final three games of the regular season to become eligible for a bowl game.

Cal picked off three passes, including a game-clinching interception by linebacker Liam Johnson with 1:54 to play.

"We found a way to win," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "It's hard to win. We have a ton of respect for Wake Forest. I'm proud of our players."

Mendoza threw touchdown passes to Matthews and fellow wide receiver Tobias Merriweather, a highly touted transfer from Notre Dame who made his Cal debut Friday after missing the first eight games of the season with an injury. Fellow heralded wide receiver Kyion Grayes, a transfer from Ohio State, also played his first game for Cal after recovering from injury.

Merriweather had six catches for 52 yards while Grayes added a pair of receptions for 22 yards. Eleven different players caught at least one pass for the Bears.

"It was great to have (Merriweather) and Kyion Grayes back in the rotation, throwing passes to them and getting back our chemistry," Mendoza said. "Those are two guys I'm going to get the ball to."

Mendoza added a 5-yard touchdown run near the end of the third quarter.

Cornerback Nohl Williams recorded another interception to extend his national lead to seven this season while safety Craig Woodson also had a pick during the game's waning seconds to polish off the win. The Bears scored their first touchdown of the game on a 16-yard fumble return by Miles Williams on a kickoff.

Coe, who made just 7 of 14 field goal attempts through the first six games and was eventually replaced by Derek Morris as Cal's primary placekicker, maintained his role as the Bears' choice for longer field goals and responded by twice falling 1 yard shy of tying the program record for longest field goal.

"It's really impressive," Wilcox said. "I'm just proud of that guy for continuing to stick with it through some tough times. For Ryan to come in and hit two 54-yarders, that's big time. We knew he could do it. We've seen it. It's not surprising. It's really a testament to him."

The Bears got off to a strong start, taking the opening kickoff and registering five first downs on a 64-yard drive that ended with a 29-yard field goal by Morris. Williams pushed Cal's lead to 10-0 on the ensuing kickoff after Hunter Barth forced a fumble during the return. The Bears led 29-14 at the half.

The teams traded scores throughout the second half, and the Demon Deacons started a possession from their own 17 trailing 39-36 with 2:17 to play. Johnson registered his interception on the second play of the drive, and running back Jaivian Thomas provided a cushion with an 11-yard touchdown run with 1:10 remaining.

Johnson and Barth split time at inside linebacker after Cade Uluave left the game with an injury in the second quarter. Barth finished with a career-high seven tackles, including a pair of sacks. Xavier Carlton and David Reese also had a pair of sacks for the Bears, who recorded seven overall.

"I just had to be ready when my number was called," Barth said. "That takes watching all the film, taking all the practice reps and paying attention to detail. It felt good to go out there and execute and leave it all out on the field."

MEDIA WILL CALL

Media Will Call is located adjacent to Gate 5 at California Memorial Stadium. It opens four hours before kickoff and remains open through the end of the first quarter. Identification is required to pick up credentials or tickets. Media who arrive after the end of the first quarter should contact Kyle McRae.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Field photographers/videographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be

picked up on the day of the game at Media Will Call. Photo vests are also distributed at Media Will Call and should be returned following use to the receptacle on the field behind the visitor (west) bench and near the entrance to the photographers work room in front of Section EE.

NCAA rules limit photographers/videographers to shooting outside the restraining line surrounding the playing field and restrict photographers from entering the team areas inside the 20-yard lines.

In addition, photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the Peter E. Haas Press Box and work from the main press area on level seven.

PHOTOGRAPHERS WORK ROOM

A photographers work room is available on the field level at California Memorial Stadium (entrance on west side at approximately the 20-yard line on the north end of the field). Power and ethernet access are available, as well as limited desk space on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional photographer work stations are available on level seven of the press box. Pregame meals and drinks for photographers and videographers are available on the north end of level seven in the press box.

PHOTOS

Requests for photos can be made through the Athletic Communications Office. Photos of all 30 teams can also be purchased through Cal's official photographer by visiting klcfotos.com/calbears.

PLAYER/COACH/STAFF INTERVIEWS

All football player, coach and staff interviews must be coordinated through Keeler McJunkin.

PRACTICE MEDIA COVERAGE

Cal is scheduled to practice at California Memorial Stadium throughout the 2024 season. Keeler McJunkin will distribute specific practice and media availability schedules as well as policies regarding non-gameday coverage of the team.

PRESS BOX

The media level of the Peter E. Haas Press Box at California Memorial Stadium is on the seventh floor. The photo deck is on level six.

TELEPHONE/VISITING RADIO PHONE LINES

ISDN and dial lines, as well as dry pairs to the visiting team locker room and visiting team interview room, are available for complimentary use for the official visiting team radio network.
