LOUISVILLE CARDINALS

BEARS TO VISIT CARDINALS FOR FIRST-EVER MEETING

BEARS VS. CARDINALS

- The California football team will meet Louisville for the first-time ever on the gridiron Saturday evening at L&N Stadium in Louisville, KY.
- Saturday will be Cal's seventh night game of the 2025 season, with kickoff set for 7 p.m. ET.

CAL...

- Is looking to become bowl eligible for the third straight year for the first time since going to seven consecutive bowl game appearances from 2003-09.
- Has recorded two or more rushing touchdowns in each of the last five games.
- Has registered at least one sack in 21 consecutive games dating back to last season.
- Has a passing defense that ranks third in the ACC, averaging 199.1 yards allowed through the air per game. The Bears are tied with Wake Forest for fewest passing touchdowns allowed by opponents this season (7). Cal ranks fourth in the conference in defensive efficiency (120.5).

RAPHAEL RACKS UP TOUCHDOWNS

- RB Kendrick Raphael matched his career-high three touchdowns against Virginia after setting the personal best at Virginia Tech the week prior. Raphael had a pair of rushing touchdowns and his lone receiving touchdown of his career against the Cavaliers.
- Raphael now has 11 touchdowns for the season - which is tied for second in the ACC and leads the Bears.
- He has at least one rushing touchdown in each of Cal's last five games and a total of nine over the past five contests.
- Raphael finished with 13 rushes for 46 yards as well as career highs of four receptions and 66 yards receiving against the Cavaliers.
- The last time a Cal player rushed for three touchdowns in a game was on Oct. 18, 2023, when Jaydn Ott did so against USC.
- His 148 carries are the second most of any running back in the ACC and tied for 12th-most in the nation
- Raphael is the Bears' leading rusher this season. He has compiled 612 rushing yards, which is seventh most in the ACC. His 68 yards per game is good for eighth in the conference.

MASSSES, AUSTIN LEAD CONFERENCE IN PASSES DEFENDED

- Two Cal DBs - Hezekiah Masses and Brent "Paco" Austin - lead the ACC in passes defended in 2025.
- The 20 combined pass breakups by Masses (10) and Austin (10) mark the first time two Cal players have had double-figure pass breakups in a season since 2011 when defensive backs Marc Anthony (12) and Steve Williams (11) combined for 23.
- Both Masses and Austin are one pass breakup shy of breaking into Cal's top 10 in single-season PBUs.
- Masses leads the nation in passes defended for the sixth consecutive week with his 14 between four interceptions and 10 pass breakups. His four interceptions are tied for second in both the NCAA and the ACC.
- DB Brent "Paco" Austin set a career-high six pass breakups against the Cavaliers. It is the most in recorded history for any Cal player and the most in a game by any FBS player this season.

DE JESUS ONE OF NATION'S MOST PRODUCTIVE WIDE RECEIVERS

- WR Jacob De Jesus' 57 catches this season rank second in the ACC and ties for fifth most nationally. His 8.33 receptions per game rank fourth in the conference and 13th in the NCAA.
- De Jesus trails Boston College's Lewis Bond by seven catches for the ACC lead. The Bears haven't had a player lead the conference in receptions since Chad Hansen hauled in 92 catches to pace the Pac-12 in 2016.
- He ranks fourth in the conference and 19th nationally in punt returns with a 10.7 average while also ranking fourth in the conference and 33rd nationally in kickoff returns with a 21.7 average.
- De Jesus is third in the ACC and 25th nationally in all-purpose yards per game (113.3).
- He had a career-high 13 receptions for 105 yards in Cal's 21-18 win over North Carolina on Oct. 17. The 13 catches tied for sixth most in a single game by a Cal receiver in program history. It was also the most in a game by a Cal receiver since Chad Hansen had 14 catches at SDSU on Sept. 16, 2016.

MINI CAN DO IT ALL

- TE Mason Mini threw a 42-yard touchdown pass to Kendrick Raphael against Virginia to become the first non-quarterback to throw a touchdown pass for Cal since WR Vic Wharton III connected with fellow WR Kanawai Noa on a 15-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter at Colorado on Oct. 28, 2017. It was his career-first throw and touchdown pass.
- Mini added a pair of catches for 34 yards against the Cavaliers.
- He leads the tight ends in touchdowns (4) and yards receiving (382) this season

FROM WALK-ONS TO WORKHORSES

- Cal has several former walk-ons who have turned into top week-to-week contributors for the Bears.
- Former walk-on WR Trond Grizzell is the Bears' second leading receiver behind De Jesus, totaling 528 receiving yards on 34 catches (15.53 avg).
- Grizzell surpassed 1,500 career receiving yards in Cal's game against Virginia. He has 1,519 yards on 100 catches over the last three seasons since 2023 when he first began recording stats other than participation.
- Former walk-on Aaron Hampton stepped up to fill a gap left by an injured Cade Uluave early in the first quarter versus Virginia. He racked up a career and game-high 15 tackles (including seven solo) to lead the Bears against the Cavaliers. Fifteen tackles is the second most by a Cal player in a single game this season, behind Uluave's 19 at Virginia Tech.
- Former walk-on WR Jordan King has compiled 248 yards and two touchdown receptions in 2025. Prior to this season, King had registered only 50 yards receiving and no touchdowns in 2024. He primarily played on special teams from 2022-23.
- King hauled in a career-high 64 receiving yards on four receptions, which ties for his career best, at Virginia Tech. He also had his career-longest catch with a 38-yard grab on a pass from Sagapolutele against the Hokies.

SAGAPOLUTELE CONTINUES TO DAZZLE AS TRUE FRESHMAN

- QB Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele is the only Power 4 and second true freshman in FBS history to pass for 200 or more yards in each of the first nine games of his college career, and one of only three in FBS history with seven or more. Houston's David Piland began his career with 14-straight 200+ passing yard games spanning the 2010-12 seasons.
- Sagapolutele ranks fourth in the ACC in average passing yards per game

- (243.9) and ranks fourth in total passing yards (2,195). His 317 passing attempts are tied with SMU's Kevin Jennings for most in the conference.
- His 13 touchdowns (two rushing, 11 passing) are the third most of any true freshman quarterback in 2025 behind BYU's Bear Bachmeier (20) and Maryland's Malik Washington (15). His 11 passing touchdowns are tied with Bachmeier for most by a true freshman QB this season.
- He has recorded a pair of three-passing touchdown games this season against Oregon State and Minnesota.
- Sagapolutele became Cal's first true-freshman signal caller to win a season opener in Cal's 34-15 win in Corvallis, Oregon. He completed the first nine pass attempts of his collegiate career and in his first two drives was 6-of-6 for 125 yards with two TDs. He is only the second true freshman to be named the Bears' starting quarterback for a season opener and the first since Jared Goff arrived in Berkeley in 2013, on his way to becoming the No. 1 overall NFL draft pick in 2016.

DEFENSIVE TRIO IN THE TRENCHES MAKES IMPACT

- Aidan Keanaaina and T.J. Bollers have been anchors on the defensive line, starting every game this season together.
- Keanaaina (39 tackles) and Bollers (34 tackles) have combined for 73 tackles and are seven away from becoming the first Cal defensive lineman duo to combine for 80 since Luc Bequette (52) and Zeandae Johnson (29) had 81 in 2019. They are 17 away from becoming the first with 90 or more since Bequette (49) and Tevin Paul (43) registered 92 in 2018.
- Keanaaina's 39 tackles, set after his career-high 10 against Virginia, are one away from making him the first Cal defensive lineman to put together consecutive seasons of 40 or more tackles since Bequette in 2018 (49) and 2019 (52). Bequette added a third in 2021 (41). Keanaaina had a career-high 45 tackles in 2024.
- Derek Wilkins' four pass breakups are the most by a Cal defensive lineman since Bequette also had four in 2021, while the last Cal defensive lineman with more than four Chris Palmer with six in 2018.

CADE RISES

- ILB Cade Uluave ranks second in the ACC in both tackles per game (9.0) and total tackles (81). He ties for 18th in the nation in tackles per game and shares an 11th-place ranking in total tackles in the NCAA.
- Uluave led the conference in tackles and tackles per game entering last week's game, but dropped to the second-place spot after Cal's game versus Virginia in which he exited the contest early in the first quarter with injury.
- Uluave ranks fifth in the ACC and leads the Bears in total tackles for loss (10.5-34 yds).
- Uluave recorded 19 tackles two weeks ago at Virginia Tech, the most in a game by a Cal player since Evan Weaver had 22 at Utah on Oct. 26, 2019. His first tackle of the game was his career 200th.

- Cal has 20 players on active NFL rosters in WR Keenan Allen (Los Angeles Chargers), P Bryan Anger (Dallas), LB Teddye Buchanan (Baltimore), RB Chris Brooks (Green Bay), S Camryn Bynum (Indianapolis), OT Jake Curhan (Carolina) S Ashtyn Davis (Miami), QB Jared Goff (Detroit), LB Cameron Goode (Miami), CB Marcus Harris (Tennessee), S Jaylinn Hawkins (New England), S Elijah Hicks (Chicago), DE Cameron Jordan (New Orleans), G Patrick Mekari (Jacksonville), WR Nikko Remigio (Buffalo), QB Aaron Rodgers (Pittsburgh), LB Jackson Sirmon (New York Jets), TE Jake Tonges (San Francisco), CB Nohl Williams (Kansas City), S Craig Woodson (New England). SAGAPOLUTELE CONTINUES TO IMPRESS AS TRUE FRESHMAN QB

- QB Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele is the only Power 4 and second true freshman in FBS history to pass for 200 or more yards in each of the first nine games of his college career, and one of only three in FBS history with seven or more. Houston's David Piland began his career with 14-straight 200+ passing yard games spanning the 2010-12 seasons.
- Sagapolutele ranks fourth in the ACC in average passing yards per game (243.9) and ranks fourth in total passing yards (2,195). His 317 passing attempts are tied with SMU's Kevin Jennings for most in the conference.
- His 13 touchdowns (two rushing, 11 passing) are the third most of any true freshman quarterback in 2025 behind BYU's Bear Bachmeier (20) and Maryland's Malik Washington (15). His 11 passing touchdowns are tied with Bachmeier for most by a true freshman QB this season.
- Sagapolutele became Cal's first true-freshman signal caller to win a season opener in Cal's 34-15 win in Corvallis. He completed the first nine pass attempts of his collegiate career and in his first two drives was 6-of-6 for 125 yards with two TDs. He is only the second true freshman to be named the Bears' starting quarterback for a season opener and the first since Jared Goff arrived in Berkeley in 2013, on his way to becoming the No. 1 overall NFL draft pick in 2016.
- Devin Brown has played in eight games for the Bears this season and scored his first touchdown as a Bear with a 14-yd pass to Jayden Dixon-Veal against Texas Southern.
- Brown, who spent his first three seasons at Ohio State, recorded 331 career passing yards and three passing touchdowns at Ohio State from 2023-25. He appeared in nine games during Ohio State's national championship-winning season in 2024-25.

RAPHAEL LEADS GROUND ATTACK

- Kendrick Raphael matched his career-high three touchdowns against Virginia after setting the personal best at Virginia Tech the week prior. Raphael had a pair of rushing touchdowns and his lone receiving touchdown of his career against the Cavaliers.
- Raphael now has 11 touchdowns for the season - which is tied for second in the ACC and leads the Bears. He has at least one rushing touchdown in each of Cal's last five games and a total of nine over the past five contests.
- Raphael finished with 13 rushes for 46 yards as well as career highs of four receptions and 66 yards receiving against the Cavaliers.
- His 148 carries are the second most of any running back in the ACC and tied for 12th-most in the nation. Raphael is the Bears' leading rusher this season. He has compiled 612 rushing yards, which is seventh most in the ACC. His 68 yards per game is good for eighth in the conference.
- True freshman Anthony League had the first two carries of his college career at Virginia Tech and has two more against Virginia.
- LJ Johnson Jr. has not played the last two games due to injury. He surpassed 100 yards rushing this season against Duke. He has rushed for 117 yards on 34 carries and two touchdowns in 2025.
- Brandon High Jr. played the first five games of the season before sitting out the last four with injury. He totaled 98 rushing yards on 23 carries in 2025.

MINI CONTINUES TO LEAD TIGHT ENDS GROUP

- Mason Mini threw a 42-yard touchdown pass to Kendrick Raphael against Virginia to become the first non-quarterback to throw a touchdown pass for Cal since WR Vic Wharton III connected with fellow WR Kanawai Noa on a 15-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter at Colorado on Oct. 28, 2017. It was his career-first throw and touchdown pass. Mini added a pair of catches for 34 yards against the Cavaliers. He leads the tight ends in touchdowns (4) and yards receiving (382) this season.
- Mini's 51 yard touchdown reception at Boston College is tied for Cal's longest play from scrimmage this season. It was also the longest reception of his career and the Bears' longest TD reception of the season. His 70 yards receiving in that game was also a career high. Mini totaled 61 receiving yards in 12 games as a redshirt freshman at Idaho in 2024.
- Landon Morris has 41 yards receiving on four catches and one touchdown in 2025.
- Jeffrey Johnson has hauled in a pair of catches for 31 combined receiving yards, including a 20-yarder.
- Two of the three receiving TDs in Cal's week one win over Oregon State were hauled in by tight ends.
- The last time Cal had two tight ends with touchdown catches in a single game was Oct. 23, 2021 in Cal's 26-3 win over Colorado when Keleki Latu and Gavin Reinwald each scored a touchdown.

DE JESUS RACKING UP RECEIVING NUMBERS

- Jacob De Jesus' 57 catches this season rank second in the ACC and ties for fifth most nationally. His 8.33 receptions per game rank fourth in the conference and 13th in the NCAA.
- De Jesus trails Boston College's Lewis Bond by seven catches for the ACC lead. The Bears haven't had a player lead the conference in receptions since Chad Hansen hauled in 92 catches to pace the Pac-12 in 2016.
- Trond Grizzell is the Bears' second leading receiver behind De Jesus, totaling 528 receiving yards on 34 catches (15.53 avg).
- Grizzell surpassed 1,500 career receiving yards in Cal's game against Virginia. He has 1,519 yards on 100 catches over the last three seasons since 2023 when he first began recording stats other than participation.
- Jordan King has compiled 248 yards and two touchdown receptions in 2025. Prior to this season, King had registered only 50 yards receiving and no touchdowns in 2024. He primarily played on special teams from 2022-23.
- King hauled in a career-high 64 receiving yards on four receptions, which ties for his career best, at Virginia Tech. He also had his career-longest catch with a 38-yard grab on a pass from Sagapolutele against the Hokies.

OFFENSIVE LINE PAVES WAY FOR RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS

- Cal's starting offensive line saw one change between weeks eight and nine. RG Sioape Vatikani, C Tyson Ruffins and LG Jordan Spasojevic-Moko made their ninth consecutive starts and RT Leon Bell started his seventh consecutive game, this time joined by Braden Miller at LT. Miller started in Cal's season opener at Oregon State at the same position.
- Cal's offensive line helped the Bears score a pair of rushing touchdowns against Virginia. The Bears have now scored at least two rushing touchdowns in each of the last five games and six of Cal's nine games this season.
- Fifteen of Cal's 19 offensive linemen have participated in at least one collegiate season entering 2025.
- Vatikani made his 32nd career start vs. Virginia. He appeared in five total games last season while making three starts before missing the rest of the season due to an injury. He made a pair of starts at left guard while making one start at right guard.
- Bell appeared in two games for Mississippi State in 2024. Before joining the Bulldogs, he was ranked as the No. 2 JUCO product in the state of Texas at Kilgore Junior College.
- Ruffins made nine starts and appeared in 11 games at Nevada in 2024. He saw 585 snaps last season for the Wolf Pack, all at left guard and did not surrender a sack and gave up just one QB hurry.
- Spasojevic-Moko made 10 starts at Charlotte in 2024. Before his time in the Queen City, he spent three seasons at Texas A&M from 2021-23 and played in nine games with three starts.
- Williams III, a redshirt sophomore, entered the 2025 season with five starts under his belt from 2024.
- Owens, a transfer from New Mexico, reunited with offensive line coach Famika Anae in Berkeley this season after starting 10 games as a redshirt freshman for the Lobos in 2024. He earned Mountain West Freshman of the Week honors in Week 11 vs San Diego State and allowed just four quarterback pressures during the 2024 season. He was part of the Lobo offensive line unit that only gave up five sacks during the season.
- Bastian Swinney returned to Cal this season after appearing in 12 games as a starter on the offensive line. He made seven starts at right guard, two starts at center and one start as the left guard.
- Daveion Harley, a transfer from Jacksonville State, appeared in 13 games with eight starts last season and saw over 700 reps at center while also logging time at guard. He allowed just two sacks in 826 plays and helped clear the way for the nation's No. 2 rushing attack. He appeared in 12 games for the Gamecocks as a true freshman in 2023.
- Lamar Robinson started every game for Georgia State at left guard in 2024 and saw a total of 757 offensive snaps while allowing just 18 pressures on the quarterback.

CONSISTENCY DEFINES DEFENSIVE LINE ROOM

- Cal's has a passing defense that ranks third in the ACC, averaging 199.1 yards allowed through the air per game. The Bears are tied with Wake Forest for fewest passing touchdowns allowed by opponents this season (7). Cal ranks fourth in the conference in defensive efficiency (120.5).
- Aidan Keanaaina and T.J. Bollers have been anchors on the defensive line, starting every game this season together. Keanaaina (39 tackles) and Bollers (34 tackles) have combined for 73 tackles and are seven away from becoming the first Cal defensive lineman duo to combine for 80 since Luc Bequette (52) and Zeandae Johnson (29) had 81 in 2019. They are 17 away from becoming the first with 90 or more since Bequette (49) and Tevin Paul (43) registered 92 in 2018.
- Keanaaina's 39 tackles, set after his career-high 10 against Virginia, are one away from making him the first Cal defensive lineman to put together consecutive seasons of 40 or more tackles since Bequette in 2018 (49) and 2019 (52). Bequette added a third in 2021 (41). Keanaaina had a career-high 45 tackles in 2024.
- Derek Wilkins' four pass breakups are the most by a Cal defensive lineman since Bequette also had four in 2021, while the last Cal defensive lineman with more than four Chris Palmer with six in 2018.
- Cal pulled off a successful fake punt against Texas Southern, with Bollers running nine yards for a first down. The last time Cal successfully ran for a first down on a fake punt play was Nov. 25, 2023 during Cal's 33-7 win over UCLA.
- Cal started the 2025 season with 13 defensive linemen, including nine returnees in Bollers, BJ Canady, Legend Journey, Keanaaina, Ike Okafor, Michael-Anthony Okwura, Stanley Saole-McKenzie, R.J. Stephens and Wilkins.

HAMPTON STEPS UP, ULUAVE AND FERRELLI CONTINUE SUCCESS AS DUO

- Cade Uluave and Luke Ferrelli have emerged as Cal's latest dynamic inside linebacker duo. The pair have combined for 146.0 total tackles this season
- Uluave ranks second in the ACC in both tackles per game (9.0) and total tackles (81). He ties for 18th in the nation in tackles per game and shares an 11th-place ranking in total tackles in the NCAA.
- Uluave led the conference in tackles and tackles per game entering last week's game, but dropped to the second-place spot after Cal's game versus Virginia in which he exited the contest early in the first quarter with injury.
- Uluave ranks fifth in the ACC and leads the Bears in total tackles for loss (10.5-34 yds).
- Uluave recorded 19 tackles two weeks ago at Virginia Tech, the most in a game by a Cal player since Evan Weaver had 22 at Utah on Oct. 26, 2019. His first tackle of the game was his career 200th. - Ferrelli recorded the first interception of his career at Boston College with 19 seconds left in the fourth quarter - the play that sealed the Bears' victory.
- Uluave and Ferrelli are the latest in a strong pattern of notable Cal inside linebacker duos. Uluave and 2025 NFL Draft pick Teddy Buchanan turned heads in 2024, combining for 185 tackles even with Uluave's season cut short due to injury after playing in only nine of the Bears' 13 games. Jordan Kunaszyk and Evan Weaver combined for 307 total tackles in 2018 before Weaver paired with Kuony Deng to form the nation's leading FBS duo with 301 tackles in 2019.
- Aaron Hampton stepped up to fill a gap left by an injured Cade Uluave early in the first quarter versus Virginia. He racked up a career and game-high 15 tackles (including seven solo) to lead the Bears against the Cavaliers. 15 tackles is the second most by a Cal player in a single game this season, behind Uluave's 19 at Virginia Tech.

OUTSIDE BACKERS GROUP APPLIES PRESSURE

- TJ Bush Jr. continues to pressure quarterbacks, leading the Bears with 4.0 sacks in 2025 to push back opponents a combined 27 yards. His 7.5 TFL are the most of any Cal outside linebacker this season. He has registered 29 total tackles.
- Jayden Wayne continues to fill the gap left by injured starter Ryan McCulloch, making his sixth straight start for Cal vs. Virginia. He has 17 tackles, 2.0 sacks and three QB hurries in 2025.
- Chris Victor has totaled 13.0 tackles this season, including one sack, and four QB hurries.
- McCulloch had been one of Cal's most productive OLBs, compiling 11.0 tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss that pushed opponents back 14 yards. He had 1.5 sacks (-10 yards), one pass breakup, one fumble recovery and four QB hurries through the Bears' first four games.

DEFENSIVE BACKS MAKE IMPACT

- Two Cal DBs - Hezekiah Masses and Brent "Paco" Austin - lead the ACC in passes defended in 2025.
- The 20 combined pass breakups by Masses (10) and Austin (10) mark the first time two Cal players have had double-figure pass breakups in a season since 2011 when defensive backs Marc Anthony (12) and Steve Williams (11) combined for 23.
- Both Masses and Austin are one pass breakup shy of breaking into Cal's top 10 in single-season PBUs.
- Masses leads the nation in passes defended for the sixth consecutive week with his 14 between four interceptions and 10 pass breakups. His four interceptions are tied for second in both the NCAA and the ACC.
- Austin set a career-high six pass breakups against the Cavaliers. It is the most in recorded history for any Cal player and the most in a game by any FBS player this season.
- Cam Sidney registered his second career interception against Virginia Tech, and first of the season. He has totaled three pass breakups and 40 tackles in 2025, including 4.0 TFL and 1.0 sack.
- Sidney also both forced and recovered a fumble against the Tar Heels on the first play from scrimmage, setting up a short field for the Bears to score the first touchdown of the game four plays later.
- Dru Polidore Jr. also forced and recovered a fumble against North Carolina, to make it the first time Cal has recorded three forced fumbles in a game since Cal's 42-39 win over Washington State on Nov. 11, 2023. Polidore Jr. has 40 tackles through seven games played this season, and has recorded a pair of pass breakups.
- Isaiah Crosby totaled 24 tackles and three pass breakups through the Bears' first four games before incurring a season-ending injury at San Diego State.
- True freshman Aidan Manutai had broken into the Bears' starting saftey spot and tallied 27 tackles, one PBU, one QB hurry and recovered a muffed punt before incurring an injury which sidelined him in Cal's game against Virginia.
- Cal's defensive backs have helped Cal to a passing defense that ranks third in the ACC, averaging 199.1 yards allowed through the air per game. The Bears are tied with Wake Forest for fewest passing touchdowns allowed by opponents this season (7). Cal ranks fourth in the conference in defensive efficiency (120.5).

- P Brook Honore Jr. ranks tenth in the ACC in punting average (43.9).
- PK Michael Luckhurst returned to the Bears' roster against North Carolina to handle all kickoffs. Luckhurst was a member of the Bears in 2022-23 before playing for Cal's men's soccer team in 2024.
- Cal is 8-of-10 on field goal attempts this season. Abram Murray has made three and Chase Meyer has connected on five.
- WR Jacob De Jesus ranks fourth in the conference and 19th nationally in punt returns with a 10.7 average while also ranking fourth in the conference and 33rd nationally in kickoff returns with a 21.7 average.
- De Jesus is third in the ACC and 25th nationally in all-purpose yards per game (113.3).
- All longsnapping has been carried out by Rino Monteforte with no errors.
- The Golden Bears have revamped their special teams unit entering 2025. Three of the special team newcomers spent the 2024 season on College Football Playoff teams last season - Kern (Texas), Meyer (Penn State) and Monteforte (Notre Dame).

GAME 1: BEARS ROLL PAST OREGON STATE IN SEASON OPENER

CORVALLIS – Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele threw three touchdown passes in his collegiate debut and the California football team led wire-to-wire in a season-opening 34-15 thumping of Oregon State on Saturday night at Reser Stadium.

Sagapolutele, who became the first Cal quarterback to start a season-opener as a true freshman since Jared Goff in 2013, got his career off to a breathtaking start. He completed his first nine pass attempts, including two for touchdowns, as the Golden Bears scored on each of their first two possessions of the game to lead 14-0 midway through the first quarter.

"I got to play in my first college game, and it went not too bad," Sagapolutele said. "It wasn't my best game. We left some points on the board. Our coaches put in a great game plan for us and I just trusted the system."

Cal turned two turnovers into 10 points and linebacker Cade Uluave made 10 tackles for the Bears, who won its season-opener for the fourth consecutive season.

Sagapolutele finished 20-for-30 passing for 234 yards while Trond Grizzell recorded five catches for 83 yards and a touchdown. Tight end Mason Mini caught his first career touchdown pass, a 19-yard grab from Sagapolutele that gave the Bears an early 7-0 lead. Grizzell hauled in a 32-yard scoring catch on the following drive to push Cal's early advantage to 14-0.

"Jaron is a very accurate passer," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "It showed up early in the game and late in the game. He still has a lot to learn but he threw the ball really well. That's what we expected. That's exactly what he does in practice."

Abram Murray and Chase Meyer each converted field goals in their first games as a Golden Bear. Tight end Landon Morris also caught a 4-yard scoring pass from Sagapolutele in the third quarter.

"For me, there's no better feeling like this," Uluave said. "Oregon State is a tough place to play and I thought we handled it really well. All of the guys were just having fun. You could tell on the sidelines. It was a fun environment. We just have to keep building and moving forward."

GAME 2: BEARS PULL AWAY TO DEFEAT TEXAS SOUTHERN

BERKELEY – The California football team held an opponent without a touchdown for the first time in almost four years and running back Kendrick Raphael rushed for a career-high 122 yards and a touchdown as the Golden Bears pulled away in the second half for a 35-3 victory over Texas Southern on Saturday afternoon at California Memorial Stadium.

The Golden Bears took a shutout into the fourth quarter before the Tigers got on the board on a 39-yard field goal by Christian Avelar. Cal held Texas Southern to 194 yards of total offense.

It marked the first time the Bears have held an opponent without a touchdown since a 26-3 victory against Colorado on Oct. 23, 2021.

"If we keep the other team from scoring a touchdown, that's really good. However, there is an expectation of how we play," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "There were a lot of things that we are going to need to improve upon. We need to be competing against what we are capable of out there."

Redshirt freshman linebacker Luke Ferrelli recorded a game-high 11 tackles in his second career game and safety Isaiah Crosby had a career-best nine tackles to lead Cal's defensive effort. It was also the least amount of yards the Bears have yielded in a game since giving up 104 in the win over Colorado in 2021.

Raphael, making his first career start, carried 17 times and scored on a 1-yard run in the third quarter for his first touchdown at Cal and fifth of his career.

"We started off flat, and that resulted in the start that we had," Raphael said. "Guys picked each other up and we were just patient and stayed the course. It was just about trusting the process and playing ball."

Reigning ACC Rookie of the Week Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele threw for a career-high 267 yards on 27-of-38 passing and the Bears scored four touchdowns on the ground as Cal improved to 2-0 for the second consecutive season.

The Bears led 11-0 at halftime after a 44-yard field goal by Abram Murray and a 1-yard touchdown run by Sagapolutele – the first rushing TD of his career. Mason Mini's run gave Cal a two-point conversion.

The Bears' offense found a rhythm in the second half, scoring on all four of its possessions. After Raphael's touchdown run, fellow running back LJ Johnson Jr. scored on a 12-yard scamper, Chase Meyer nailed a 43-yard field goal and backup quarterback Devin Brown connected with wide receiver Jayden Dixon-Veal on a 14-yard scoring throw.

GAME 3: AERIAL ATTACK LEADS BEARS TO WIN OVER MINNESOTA

BERKELEY – True freshman quarterback Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele continued the dazzling start to his college career Saturday, throwing for a career-high 279 yards and another three touchdowns in a 27-14 victory over Minnesota at California Memorial Stadium.

The Golden Bears, who improved to 3-0 for the second straight season, made it clear they were going to make the passing game the focal point of their game plan on offense, and it proved to be a winning formula. Sagapolutele completed 24 of 38 passes without an interception and finished with a 150.9 passer rating.

"Jaron continues to impress," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "It's not surprising to us because we see it every day in practice. We don't sit there on the sideline thinking Jaron can't handle it. Those words never come out of our mouth. He's doing a heck of a job."

Wide receiver Jacob De Jesus had seven catches for 54 yards and his first touchdown at Cal while Jordan King caught his first career touchdown pass. Tight end Mason Mini added his second scoring catch of the season.

"(Offensive Coordinator) Bryan Harsin told me at the beginning of the week that we were going to have to throw the ball," Sagapolutele said. "All of the receivers were getting open for me, and they made the throws so much easier."

Cornerback Hezekiah Masses recorded an interception for the third straight game and freshman Aiden Manutai recovered a pivotal muffed punt in the fourth quarter for the Bears, who have now started a season 3-0 five times in Wilcox's nine years at Cal.

The teams exchanged first-half touchdowns before the Bears perfectly executed a two-minute drill after starting a drive at their own 25-yard line and 37 seconds left before halftime. Sagapolutele went 3-for-4 on the possession, which culminated in a 45-yard field goal by Abram Murray as time expired to give Cal a 10-7 advantage.

The Golden Gophers briefly went in front 14-10 in the third quarter but the Bears quickly answered, putting together a 9-play, 75-yard drive that ended with Sagapolutele's 9-yard scoring pass to Mason Mini to make it 17-14 with 20 seconds to play in the third quarter.

It was still 17-14 midway through the fourth quarter when Minnesota's Koi Perch couldn't cleanly handle a punt by Cal's Michael Kern and Manutai recovered at the Golden Gophers' 8-yard line. Sagapolutele found King on a 2-yard TD pass three plays later to push the Bears' advantage to 24-14.

Chase Meyer's 38-yard field goal with just over a minute to play closed out the scoring.

"Every win in college football is a big win. It's not easy to win," De Jesus said. "Give that team a lot of credit. They have a lot of great players. We showed we can beat them and where we are at. I thought tonight was our big first test, and it showed what we can do."

GAME 4: BEARS FALL TO AZTECS

SAN DIEGO – The California football team suffered its first loss of the season Saturday night, falling to San Diego State 34-0 at Snapdragon Stadium.

The Golden Bears put together a couple of sustained drives in the first half but couldn't turn them into points, and the Aztecs scored a touchdown and converted a pair of field goal attempts to lead 13-0 at halftime.

Cal committed two costly turnovers in the third quarter that SDSU turned into touchdowns.

"We have to give a lot of credit to San Diego State. They played a fantastic game," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "The most important day of the year is going to be Monday - what everybody looks like walking through that door. We have to examine everything, starting with me. Obviously, I did a poor job making sure we were ready to play, and anybody that had anything to do with that game has to look themselves in the mirror and figure out what they can do better so that never happens again. That was unacceptable on our part."

Freshman quarterback Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele went 17-for-38 for 208 yards while linebacker Cade Uluave led the Bears' defensive effort with 10 tackles. Defensive back Cam Sidney recorded his second career sack.

GAME 5: BEARS PULL OFF DRAMATIC WIN OVER BOSTON COLLEGE

CHESTNUT HILL – Redshirt freshman linebacker Luke Ferrelli made a game-clinching interception in the end zone with 19 seconds remaining and the California football team overcame an early deficit to defeat Boston College 28-24 in its Atlantic Coast Conference opener Saturday at Alumni Stadium.

After true freshman quarterback Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele connected with tight end Mason Mini on a 51-yard touchdown pass to put the Golden Bears (4-1, 1-0 ACC) in front with 1:30 remaining, the Eagles took over at their own 25 and drove to the Cal 5-yard line, converting a 4th-and-8 along the way.

But Ferrelli stepped in front of a pass by BC quarterback Dylan Loneragan that was intended for tight end Kaelan Chudzinski to register his first career interception, and the Bears were able to run out the clock to seal the win.

"I'm super excited, but we definitely have a lot to do as a team to get better," Ferrelli said. "The main thing for us is to get past adversity. They gave us some great looks. They are a great football team. I'm just glad we came out with the win."

The Bears quickly fell behind 14-0 midway through the first quarter but answered with back-to-back sustained scoring drives to tie it at 14-14. The Eagles added a field goal late in the second quarter to take a 17-14 lead at the half.

Cal went in front after Hezekiah Masses notched his fourth interception of the season and returned it to the BC 2-yard line, and running back Kendrick Raphael scored two plays later to give the Bears a 21-17 advantage.

Cal, which was coming off a disappointing 34-0 loss in its previous game at San Diego State, was faced with a challenge again when Boston College running back Turbo Richard scored on a 71-yard touchdown run on the next play from scrimmage to immediately put the Eagles back in front.

Still trailing 24-21, the Bears began their final scoring drive at their own 12-yard line with 4:48 to go. They faced 4th-and-11 from their own 34 but a defensive pass interference call gave them a first down on their own 49. Two plays later, Sagapolutele delivered a perfect throw past two defenders to Mini, who turned up field and raced untouched into the end zone.

"Jaron gave me a great ball. I just jumped up to get it and took off," Mini said. "I feel like I'm building a great connection with Jaron. He's a young quarterback who is figuring out who to get the ball to, and I feel like I'm one of those guys."

It was Mini's third touchdown of the season and the longest reception of his career.

Raphael finished with 119 yards rushing and a touchdown on a career-high 25 carries. Wide receiver Jacob De Jesus had a Cal career-high eight catches for a Cal career-high-tying 61 yards receiving and a score, while Sagapolutele was 22-of-34 for 254 yards and two touchdowns and one interception.

"In the moment, the guys made the plays that we needed to make to win, and it's great to learn all those lessons in a victory," Travers Family Head Coach Justin Wilcox said. "Every time you line up, you have to bring your A game. I'm looking forward to us getting better throughout the season. I think we can make massive improvements this week. There are a lot of things we can do better."

GAME 6: BEARS FALL TO DUKE

BERKELEY – Cal raced out to an early lead but ultimately couldn't keep up with Duke's offense in a 45-21 loss to the Blue Devils at California Memorial Stadium.

The Golden Bears got the crowd of 42,240 rocking by scoring touchdowns on each of their first three possessions to take a 21-7 lead early in the second quarter. Freshman quarterback Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele connected with wide receiver Jordan King on a 6-yard scoring pass and running back Kendrick Raphael found the end zone on runs of 5 and 4 yards.

But Duke, which entered the game averaging 36.7 point over its past three games, got its offense rolling and scored touchdowns on four straight drives before ending the first half on a 25-yard field goal to lead 31-21 at the break.

Cal's defense stiffened to begin the second half, forcing the Blue Devils to punt on their first four possessions and allowing just one first down along the way. But the Bears' offense stalled as well and Cal couldn't make a dent in the deficit.

"We have glimpses where we can play good football, but it's too much of a roller coaster," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "You can't play that way and win."

GAME 7: BEARS HOLD ON TO DEFEAT NORTH CAROLINA

BERKELEY – Brent Austin forced a fumble while North Carolina was on the doorstep of a go-ahead touchdown and Jacob De Jesus caught the most passes by a Cal receiver in nine years as the California football team held on for a 21-18 victory over the Tar Heels at California Memorial Stadium.

North Carolina appeared to be on the verge of going in front with 3:48 remaining after Nathan Leacock caught a short pass and took it toward the goal line. But Austin stripped the ball out of Leacock's hands at the 1-yard line and recovered it in the end zone for a touchback to preserve the lead.

"That's as good an individual play as we've had this season," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "It was an unbelievable play."

The Bears took over on offense and were able to hold the ball until six seconds remained to secure the win.

De Jesus caught a career-high 13 passes for 105 yards and a touchdown – the most receptions in a game by a Golden Bear pass-catcher since Chad Hansen had 14 grabs at San Diego State on Sept. 10, 2016. It also tied for No. 6 on Cal's all-time list for single-game receptions.

"I feel like I'm getting a little more targets on offense," De Jesus said. "I'm just grateful for our coaches and staff for believing in me and trusting me, and putting me in places to make a play."

Running back Kendrick Raphael rushed for 81 yards and a touchdown.

The game got off to an auspicious start for the Bears (5-2, 2-1 ACC) after the Tar Heels' Shanard Clower caught a short pass but then fumbled on the game's first play from scrimmage. Cal's Cam Sidney forced and recovered the fumble, and Cal scored four plays later on a 3-yard rush by quarterback Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele.

The Bears never trailed in the game and took a 21-10 lead on Raphael's 2-yard touchdown run early in the third quarter.

GAME 8: BEARS FALL TO VIRGINIA TECH

BLACKSBURG, VA – Cal forced overtime with a touchdown late in the fourth quarter but ultimately fell 42-34 at Virginia Tech.

Running back Kendrick Raphael scored the last of his career-high three rushing touchdowns with 2:34 to play to tie the game at 27-27 before both teams missed field goal attempts in the waning moments of regulation. The Bears and Hokies exchanged touchdowns in the first overtime with Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele finding Mason Mini on a 25-yard touchdown to give the Bears the lead before Kyrone Drones answered with a 17-yard touchdown run to send the game into a second extra period. Virginia Tech came up with the go-ahead and eventual game-winning score on a seven-yard touchdown pass to Takye Heath before stopping the Bears without them gaining a yard in their second overtime possession on four consecutive incompletions.

"Football is a game for tough people, and you have to be tough the entire game," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "That's physically, mentally and emotionally. Having the ability to stay focused throughout the game is what we need to do."

Sagapolutele was 24-for-39 for a career-high 285 yards and a touchdown with his 39 passing attempts also equaling a career best, while Jacob De Jesus caught a game-high eight passes for 85 yards. Cade Uluaave had career highs of 19 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks.

The Hokies struck first with 10 quick points to begin the game but the Bears answered quickly on a 38-yard field goal by Chase Meyer and a 1-yard scoring run by Raphael. Another Meyer field goal from 34 yards out and 1-yard Raphael touchdown run gave the Bears a 20-10 lead at halftime.

Virginia Tech began the second half with 17 unanswered points before Raphael's equalizer.

"There is still a lot of season left," De Jesus said. "We are going to go back to the drawing board and really work on our discipline this week, and be tougher as a team. We're still really motivated and want to win."

GAME 9: BEARS FALL SHORT AGAINST NO. 15 VIRGINIA

BERKELEY – Cal closed to within three points of No. 15 Virginia in the fourth quarter but ultimately fell to the Cavaliers 31-21 at California Memorial Stadium.

Kendrick Raphael's third and final touchdown of the game cut Virginia's lead to 24-21 with just under 13 minutes to go, but the Cavaliers sealed the victory on Kam Robinson's 35-yard interception return for a touchdown with 34 seconds remaining.

Raphael rushed for a pair of scores and caught a 42-yard scoring pass from tight end Mason Mini to give him three touchdowns for the second week in a row. Raphael now has 11 total touchdowns on the season (10 rushing, 1 receiving).

The Golden Bears fell behind 10-0 midway through the first quarter and proceeded to trade touchdowns with the Cavaliers the rest of the way. Raphael's first score came on a 2-yard run early in the second quarter.

Aaron Hampton (15), Aidan Keanaaina (10) and Cam Sidney (9) all set career highs in tackles for Cal. Hampton saw the most extensive action of his career after injured star linebacker Cade Uluave left the game following the Bears' first series on defense.

Wide receiver Trond Grizzell led the Bears with a career-high eight receptions for 80 yards.

TRAVERS FAMILY HEAD FOOTBALL COACH JUSTIN WILCOX

Justin Wilcox has compiled a long list of accomplishments and signature wins as the Travers Family Head Football Coach and is in his ninth campaign on the job at Cal. Through eight seasons, Wilcox has compiled a 42-50 record, 42 wins is the sixth-most victories by a head coach in California football history. In 2018 and 2019, Wilcox led Cal to back-to-back campaigns and bowl games for the first time since 2008 and 2009, then returned to back-to-back bowl games in 2023 and 2024.

Against Stanford, Cal has won five of the last six Big Game meetings, including four in a row overall (2021-24) and three straight on The Farm (2019, '21, '23). Wilcox is the first Cal head coach to win the Big Game three straight times on the road since Pappy Waldorf captured six straight at Stanford from 1937-51.

The Golden Bears have also won a combined five times over in-state rivals UCLA and USC during Wilcox's tenure, as well as ended long losing streaks Wilcox inherited from his predecessors with multiple victories against Stanford, USC and Washington. The Bears have knocked off five teams that either won Pac-12 titles that season or were reigning league champs during Wilcox's tenure and taken down four AP Top 25 teams in No. 8 Washington State (2017), No. 15 Washington (2018), No. 14 Washington (2019) and No. 23 Oregon (2020).

Most recently, in 2024, he led the Bears to bowl-eligibility for the fourth time as Cal's head coach. In its inaugural season in the ACC, the Bears found themselves in all but one game. Six of Cal's seven losses last season were decided by a combined 17 points. The 2024 Bears were led by Fernando Mendoza who produced just the ninth 3,000-yard passing season in California history and finished in the top-10 on Cal's single-season passing charts in total offense yards, passing efficiency and yards passing. Defensively, the Bears ranked third in the ACC in total defense and was one of two teams in the ACC that gave up less than five yards per play. Following the season, Nohl Williams became the second First Team All-American under Wilcox. In the 2025 NFL Draft, Cal had four Golden Bears selected, which was the most since the 2016 NFL Draft.

In 2023, he led the Bears to bowl-eligibility and a Radiance Technologies Independence Bowl selection after wins in each of their final three regular-season games at home against Washington State and then on the road at state rivals Stanford and UCLA. Cal's other victories in 2023 came at North Texas in the season opener and at home against Idaho and Arizona State. Five of the team's seven losses were against ranked teams at No. 5 Washington in its' Pac-12 opener and then in a school-record four straight games against ranked squads (No. 15 Oregon State, at No. 16 Utah, No. 24 USC, at No. 6 Oregon). The Bears also fell to perennial and national powerhouse Auburn in their home opener and Texas Tech in the Independence Bowl. All seven teams Cal was defeated by and UCLA played in bowl games with Washington reaching the championship game of the College Football Playoff, while Idaho reached the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs.

The 2023 defense led the nation with 16 fumbles recovered and tied for the national lead with 28 turnovers gained, both pacing the Pac-12. In addition, the Bears' three defensive touchdowns were second in the Pac-12 and tied for 15th nationally. All six players from Cal's 2023 Independence Bowl squad who were honored on All-Pac-12 teams last season return in 2024, with Ott joined by second-team punter Lachlan Wilson, honorable mention choices in outside linebacker David Reese and defensive back Craig Woodson, and a pair of freshman honorees in Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year inside linebacker Cade Uluave and Freshman Offensive Player of the Year honorable mention selection quarterback Fernando Mendoza. Uluave and tight end Jack Endries were also 2023 Freshman All-American picks with Uluave a three-time first-teamer (College Football Network, FWAA, The Athletic) while Endries earned first-team recognition from College Football News and second-team honors from The Athletic, in addition to being an honorable mention choice of the College Football Network.

Wilcox has coached 16 players as Cal's head coach who are currently on NFL rosters in Christopher Brooks (Miami), Teddye Buchanan (Baltimore), Camryn Bynum (Minnesota), Jake Curhan (Seattle), Ashtyn Davis (New York Jets), Cameron Goode (Miami), Marcus Harris (Tennessee), Jaylinn Hawkins (New England), Elijah Hicks (Chicago), Patrick McMorris (Miami), Patrick Mekari (Baltimore), Daniel Scott (Indianapolis, injured reserve), Jackson Sirmon (New York Jets), Jake Tonges (San Francisco), Nohl Williams (Kansas City) and Craig Woodson (New England).

Wilcox also spent three seasons as Cal's linebackers coach from 2003-05 in his first position as a full-time coach. The Bears posted a 26-12 record during his first stint in Berkeley with trips to the Insight, Holiday and Las Vegas Bowls.

Bryan Harsin (OC/QB)

– Bryan Harsin enters his first season at Cal.

– 23 years of coaching experience on the offensive side of the ball, including 10 seasons as an FBS head coach at Auburn (2021-22), Boise State (2014-20) and Arkansas State (2013).

– Carries a 85-36 overall record as a head coach at the FBS level. At Boise State, he compiled a 69-19 overall record with three Mountain West Conference titles in his seven seasons.

– In five seasons as the Broncos offensive coordinator, Boise State's record was 61-5 and his offenses were in the top five nationally in scoring four times, capped by ranking first in 2009 (42.2 ppg) and second in 2010 (45.1 ppg). In all, Boise State averaged 41.4 ppg during his time as coordinator.



Vic So'oto (Co-DC/OLB)

– Vic So'oto enters his fourth season with the Golden Bears and was recently named Co-Defensive coordinator.

– He previously served as the special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach in 2023-24 after serving as the outside linebackers coach in 2022.

So'oto was on coaching staffs that won division titles in back-to-back seasons with the Cavaliers in 2019 (ACC Coastal) and Trojans in 2020 (Pac-12 South), while reaching bowls in each of his last three campaigns at Virginia (2017 Military Bowl, 2018 Belk Bowl, 2019 Orange Bowl) and then again at Cal in 2023 and 2024 with appearances in the Radiance Technologies Independence Bowl and LA Bowl.



Allen Brown (DB)

– Allen Brown returned to Cal after being named a defensive backs coach on January 28, 2025. Brown previously served as a defensive quality control coach for the Golden Bears during the 2022 season.

– In addition to Cal, Brown has coached at Washington State, Florida, Eastern Washington and Cal Poly.

– In his five coaching stops, Brown has mentored nine all-conference defensive backs, two freshman All-America selections, two All-America honorees and an NFL draft pick.

– A native of Tacoma, Wash., Brown graduated from Eastern Washington in 2014.



Terrence Brown (Co-DC/DB)

– Terrence Brown enters his fourth season with the Golden Bears and was recently named Co-Defensive coordinator.

– He previously served as the defensive backs coach and passing game coordinator. Brown has accumulated more than a decade of experience as a coach and player on the West Coast.

– Brown has spent time on coaching staffs at Cal, Washington (twice) and Vanderbilt after graduating from Stanford in 2013.

– Brown has coached 17 defensive back draft selections in his four stops at the FBS level.

– At Cal, Brown has made an immediate impact co-leading the defensive unit. In 2024, the Bears defense led the ACC by only giving up a total of 290 points to opponents. In addition, the Bears ranked third in total defense in the ACC (337.5 ypg) and was one of two teams in the ACC to surrender less than five yards per play over the course of the season.



Famika Anae (OL)

– Famika Anae is in his first season at Cal.

– Anae has over 10 seasons of collegiate coaching experience, most recently serving as the offensive line coach at New Mexico in 2024. Before New Mexico, Anae was the offensive line coach at Campbell University, Texas A&M Commerce and at Dixie State in 2018. Before his first full-time role, he was an assistant offensive line coach at Virginia (2016-18) and also BYU (2014-15).

– In his three full-time stops, Anae has seen eight of his players garner All-Conference honors.

– At New Mexico, the Lobos' high-powered offense was led by a strong running attack, ranking fourth nationally in rushing at 253.6 yards per game. Led by Anae, the Lobos' offensive line led the country last season in both total sacks allowed (5) and sacks allowed per game (0.42). New Mexico also topped FBS teams in tackles for loss allowed, giving up just 26 on the season for 70 yards (2.17 pg). The 26 tackles for loss allowed were eight fewer than Army's 34, the second-least allowed in the country. The Lobos were fourth in the NCAA in total offense at 484.3 yards per game.



Andrew Browning (DL/RGC)

– Andrew Browning is in his seventh season as the defensive line coach and his eighth campaign overall at California in 2025, having served one season in a quality control role on the defensive side of the ball in his first season with the Golden Bears in 2018 before moving into his current role.

– In 2019, Browning was promoted to Defensive Line coach. Since his promotion, he has helped guide the Bears' defense to 24 or more sacks in five of his six seasons. (The lone season without 24 sacks was during the COVID-19 shortened season).

– Browning returned to Cal in 2018 as a defensive quality control analyst.

– His first full-time coaching role came as the defensive line coach at UTEP (2013-17).

– Started his coaching career with three campaigns on the staff at his alma mater Boise State, working in quality control for one season in 2010, and as a graduate assistant from 2011-12.



Michael Bruno (ILB)

– Michael Bruno returns for his second stint at Cal, now working as the inside linebackers coach after serving as an analyst with the group last season. 2025 will be his sixth overall season with Bears after also serving as an analyst from 2018-21.

–Prior to his arrival at Cal in 2018, Bruno worked with Golden Bears' defensive coordinator Peter Sirmon when Sirmon was the defensive coordinator at both Louisville (2017) and Mississippi State (2016)

–A graduate assistant on the defensive side of the ball at Mississippi State during the 2016 campaign when he connected with Sirmon (then Mississippi State's defensive coordinator) and helped the Rebels establish a red zone defense that tied for ninth nationally by holding opponents to 73.3 percent in red scoring

**Kyle Cefalo (WR/PGC)**

– Kyle Cefalo is in his first season at Cal.

–Cefalo has over a decade of coaching experience at the FBS level. He has made stops at Arkansas State, Maryland and most recently at Utah State.

–During his time as an offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach, Cefalo has been part of six teams that have been ranked in the top 25 nationally in both total offense and passing offense.

–Three of his teams have been ranked in the top 10 in the country in passing offense, including the No. 2-rated squad in passing offense when he was the wide receivers coach and special teams co-coordinator at Arkansas State in 2020.

–During his tenure as offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach at Utah State, Cefalo directed a unit this past season that produced 467.7 yards per game – which ranks seventh in the nation and second in the Mountain West Conference.

–Cefalo began his coaching career at Arkansas State in 2013 and spent three seasons there as a graduate assistant – the first of which he worked under then-Red Wolves head coach Bryan Harsin.

He played wide receiver for the University of Colorado from 2009-13.

**Julian Griffin (RB)**

– Griffin enters his first season at Cal in 2025.

– Griffin comes to Berkeley after five successful seasons at UTSA, where he helped the Roadrunners shatter several school records – including single-season marks for rushing yards, rushing yards per game, rushing average and rushing touchdowns.

– UTSA qualified for a bowl game in each of Griffin's five seasons.

– Griffin was named to Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40 list in June 2021.

– Prior to his time in San Antonio, Griffin served as an offensive quality control coach at Arkansas and SMU. With the Mustangs, he worked with current Denver Broncos wide receiver Courtland Sutton and helped SMU rank in the top 20 nationally in both scoring offense and passing offense in 2017.

**Keith Heyward (DB)**

– Keith Heyward enters the first season of his second stint at Cal. He served as the outside linebackers coach in 2021. This time, Heyward will serve as a defensive backs coach.

– Before rejoining the Golden Bears, Heyward served as the defensive coordinator at his Alma Mater, Oregon State.

– Heyward has spent 17 of his 18 seasons as a collegiate coach on the West Coast.

– Before his lone NFL coaching season, he spent the 2022 season as UNLV's defensive coordinator and cornerbacks coach. While at UNLV, the Rebel's defense intercepted 15 passes, most in the Mountain West and 14th nationally and ranked in the top half of the Mountain West for red zone defense, third down defense and sacks.

In 2021, Heyward began his first stint in Berkeley, he was the outside linebackers coach for Cal. That season, Cal's defense finished fourth in the Pac-12 in total defense at 366.3 ypg and in sacks at 25. He coached future NFL Draft pick Cameron Goode while at Cal.

**Mike Saffell (TE)**

– Mike Saffell in his second season as the tight ends coach at Cal in 2025.

– Saffell, who was a four-year letterwinner as an offensive lineman for the Golden Bears (2017-20), has spent the past four seasons on Cal's football staff as a student coach (2021), graduate assistant (2022-23) and tight ends coach (2024-present).

– Saffell played in 28 career games with 23 starts including all 17 Cal contests at center during his 2019 junior and 2020 senior campaigns before announcing his medical retirement from football with one season of eligibility remaining prior to the 2021 campaign.

– Helped Cal to back-to-back bowl games with the Bears appearing at the Cheez-It Bowl in 2018 before knocking off Illinois at the 2019 Redbox Bowl to finish 8-5 overall.

**Jason Novak (S&C)**

– Jason Novak begins his first season as the California football program's head athletic performance coach.

– Novak comes to Berkeley with extensive experience, including most recently serving as director of strength & conditioning at James Madison in 2024 after serving in the same role at Michigan State from 2020-23.

– Before arriving in East Lansing, Novak was the head of physical conditioning at IMG Academy (2019-20), was the director of strength and conditioning at Central Michigan (2015-19), and spent 11 years as an assistant strength and conditioning coach for the Tennessee Titans (2004-15).

ENTHUSIASTIC CHANCELLOR RICH LYONS

UC Berkeley chancellor Rich Lyons has been one of the top supporters of Cal football and the athletic department since his appointment on July 1, 2024. Lyons has not only been supportive but done it with style and flair. A pre-game on-field bike ride before Cal's homecoming football game against Duke this season and his acoustical rendition of the Rolling Stones "Sympathy For The Devil" at a student-athlete welcome event in 2024 are just a couple of examples.



POLY CONNECTION

Cal has a large number of players and coaches with Polynesian heritage on its 2025 roster, including four players on the preseason watch list for Polynesian College Football Player of the Year (Aidan Keanaaina, Jordan Spasojevic-Moko, Cade Uluave, Sioape Vatikani), as well as standouts Jacob De Jesus, Aiden Manutai and Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele, and co-defensive coordinator/outside linebackers coach Vic So'oto. Cal's game against Virginia on November 1 was Asian American and Pacific Islander Appreciation Day.



THE BLACK BEAR

Cal has teamed with the iconic Raider fan group "The Black Hole" to create a new designated seating section in the south end zone at California Memorial Stadium titled "The Black Bear". In addition to its designated seating section, "The Black Bear" has a tent in Oski's Village for pregame tailgating. High-profile members of "The Black Hole" to appear at California Memorial Stadium in 2025 include "Gorilla Rilla" and "Cisco The Kid".



CAL'S FIRST GENERAL MANAGER RON RIVERA

Ron Rivera, a consensus All-American linebacker at Cal (1980-83) and a member of the Cal Athletics Hall of Fame (1994), has returned to Berkeley after 36 seasons as an NFL player and coach as the first general manager of the Cal football program. Among Rivera's many goals is to hold the football program to the same standards as the school's vaunted academics. Rivera has been a consistent presence at Cal football events on and off the field since his March 2025 arrival.



MORE HALL OF FAMERS

Former Cal football players have had tremendous Hall of Fame representation recently. Alex Mack is a member of the Class of 2025 for both the College Football and Cal Athletics Hall of Fame, while Jeff Tedford joined Mack in the latter. Both were celebrated at Cal in October along with Class of 2024 Cal Athletics Hall of Famer Tarik Glenn. In 2026, DeSean Jackson, Marshawn Lynch and Ron Rivera are on the ballot for the College Football Hall of Fame and Lynch is also on the Pro Football Hall of Fame ballot.



CAL FOOTBALL TRADITIONS

Cal football has a long list of traditions including the Big C, Big Game, Cal Band, Cal Spirit Groups, California Victory Cannon, March To Victory, Oski and Tightwad Hill. An extended list of traditions and more details about each are available on page 96 of the 2025 Cal football media guide.



EXPANDED MEDIA COVERAGE

"Inside Cal Football", "Cal Football Countdown" and "Cal Football Wrap-Up" have elevated Cal football's profile in 2025. "Inside Cal Football" is a weekly TV show hosted by Justin Allegri that debuts each Thursday on NBC Sports Bay Area, while "Cal Football Countdown" and "Cal Football Wrap-Up" hosted by Greg Silver and former Cal and NFL running back Patrick Laird take place on the Lisa and Douglas Goldman Plaza before and after each home game. All three shows also air on the Cal Athletics YouTube page.



JORDAN KING'S NIKE TIES

Jordan King's father, Cliff King, is the Director of Sports Marketing for the Jordan Brand at Nike. Cal's junior wide receiver picked up his first name from the brand's namesake Michael Jordan and as a kid hung out with many of his dad's clients including Larry Fitzgerald and Ndamukong Suh. King started his career at Cal as a walk-on wide receiver in 2022 before earning a scholarship in January of 2025 and making his first career start on Oct. 17 against North Carolina.



NOD TO THE NOBELS

The Cal football program honored the school's Nobel Prize winners by wearing a helmet sticker with the number "59" for the Golden Bears' homecoming game against Duke on Oct. 4. By the time the team's most recent home game came around against North Carolina on Oct. 17, the school's number of Nobel Prize winners had grown to 63 and new helmet stickers were produced.

The Underhill Garage located near the corner of Channing Way and College Avenue serves as the football gameday media parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about four blocks from California Memorial Stadium. A media shuttle is available pre and postgame from the corner of Bancroft Way and Warring Street (south end of Warring Alley near Gate 5) to the Underhill Garage. Parking passes must be requested in advance through sportssystems.com/Cal and can be emailed directly. They are not available for pick up on gamedays. Television broadcast crews should order parking passes in advance by sending the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the University of California website (pt.berkeley.edu).

MEDIA PARKING (NON-GAMEDAY)

MEDIA WILL CALL

Media Will Call is located adjacent to Gate 5 at California Memorial Stadium. It opens four hours before kickoff and remains open through the end of the first quarter. Identification is required to pick up credentials or tickets. Media who arrive after the end of the first quarter should contact Kyle McRae.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Field photographers/videographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on the day of the game at Media Will Call. Photo

vests are also distributed at Media Will Call and should be returned following use to the receptacle on the field behind the visitor (west) bench and near the entrance to the photographers work room in front of Section EE.

NCAA rules limit photographers/videographers to shooting outside the restraining line surrounding the playing field and restrict photographers from entering the team areas inside the 20-yard lines.

In addition, photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the Peter E. Haas Press Box and work from the main press area on level seven.

PHOTOGRAPHERS WORK ROOM

A photographers work room is available on the field level at California Memorial Stadium (entrance on west side at approximately the 20-yard line on the north end of the field). Power and ethernet access are available, as well as limited desk space on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional photographer work stations are available on level seven of the press box. Pregame meals and drinks for photographers and videographers are available on the north end of level seven in the press box.

PHOTOS

Requests for photos can be made through the Athletic Communications Office. Photos of all 30 teams can also be purchased through Cal's official photographer by visiting klcfotos.com/calbears.
