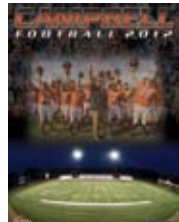

After posting the program's first winning season since its restart four years ago, Campbell heads into the 2012 season with high hopes.

2011 marked a breakthrough year for the Fighting Camels on the gridiron, finishing 6-5 overall and 5-3 in Pioneer Football League play, marking the team's highest win total since restarting the program in 2008. The Camels led the PFL in rushing for the third straight year, gaining 210.45 yards per game, ranking 18th in the nation, while five individuals ranked in the league's top 20 in rushing in Carl Smith, C.J. Oates, Jordan Cramer, Braden Smith and Kurt Odom.

Three Camels earned national recognition for outstanding performances in the classroom with Kurt Odom, Michael Rudisill and Colten Burris being CoSIDA First Team District 3 selections.

Senior fullback Jordan Cramer and senior offensive lineman Sam Issermoyer were selected to the All-PFL First Team for the first time in their careers. The Camels also placed two players on the second team in senior offensive guard Branden Burt and junior safety Brandon Chandler. The Camels had seven players earn Honorable Mention All-PFL recognition last season in senior wide receiver Paul Constantine, senior running back Carl Smith, senior offensive lineman Jeremy Hill, senior defensive lineman Jeremiah Robinson, senior defensive lineman Randel Herring, sophomore defensive back Steth Monroe and senior punter Ted Moore.

Five players earned spots on PFL All-Academic Teams, with Kurt Odom, Jordan Cramer, Colten Burris and Michael Rudisill earning First Team honors, and Sam Eberwein taking Second Team accolades. In addition, 56 players made the PFL's Academic Honor Roll, a program high.

This season, led by nine returning starters between the offensive and defensive sides of the ball, including senior defensive backs Brandon Chandler and Steth Monroe, the Camels will try to carry that momentum forward as the program rises through the PFL and FCS ranks.

Five of those starters come on the defensive side, led by 2012 Preseason All-PFL performers Chandler and Monroe.

"Brandon and Steth are really good football players and are really strong defensively," said Campbell head coach Dale Steele. "They've been steady players for us, and it's exciting to have two young men that other people in the conference think are good enough to be that type of player. We're very proud of for what they've achieved, and we look for big things out of them this fall."

Chandler, a Second Team All-PFL selection in 2011 and two-time All-Conference Honorable Mention honoree, totaled 50 tackles for the season, adding a pair of interceptions and a team-best 814 all purpose yards.

Monroe earned Honorable Mention All-Pioneer Football League honors in 2011, and was named to the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) preseason Defensive Back Award watch list in June. The senior led the league with 15 passes defended last season, adding four interceptions, good for second in the league. Monroe also recorded 4.5 tackles per game to rank among his position's leaders in the category.

Redshirt junior linebacker Mike Rudisill was a First Team Academic All-PFL and CoSIDA Academic All-District III First Team member last season, collecting 48 tackles, 5.5 for loss and two sacks for the year.

On the offensive side, senior quarterback Braden Smith, a two-time Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Week last season and 2012 PFL Academic Honor Roll member, also returns. Smith passed for several school single season records in his first season as a Camels with 1,965 yards, 14 touchdowns, 179 completions, 313 attempts and total offense at 2,254 yards.

Junior running back Kurt Odom collected 534 all purpose yards as a sophomore in 2011, also earning First Team Academic All-PFL, CoSIDA Academic All-District III and PFL Academic Honor Roll honors. The Robbinsville, N.C. native registered 288 yards rushing, 57 receiving and 176 yards returning kicks.

Senior Daniel Ritter, the lone returning starter on the offensive line, is a senior from Ramseur, N.C. with experience in 20 total games in a CU uniform in his career. Ritter started six games as a junior in 2011 before a season-ending injury, helping the Camels to 1,194 yards and nine touchdowns rushing in the Camels' first six contests.

Those returning starters, and 32 returning lettermen in all, will mix with 35 newcomers for the Camels in 2012.

**PFL Preseason Coaches Poll**

Campbell has been picked fifth in the Pioneer Football League's 2012 Preseason Coaches Poll, as announced by the conference office.

"We're excited that people respect our program enough to place us in the middle of the conference," said Steele. "Every week is a challenge in this conference, as I've said since I came here. On any given week, any team can beat any other team. I think that's also the case going into this year."

San Diego took the top spot in the poll, receiving eight of 10 first place votes for 79 points. Drake, which also took a first place vote, was slotted second with 71 points, while Jacksonville was slated third with 65 tallies.

Dayton was also given a first place vote, and posted 56 points for fourth in the poll. Marist (6th, 42 points), Butler (7th, 34), Morehead State (8th, 27), Davidson (9th, 20) and Valparaiso (10th, 11) rounded out the poll.

"There are a number of good football teams that could be right in the mix with certain breaks and other variables that happen over the course of the season," said Steele. "This could easily change during the year through the week to week conference schedule."

Lights Added at Barker-Lane Stadium  
The installation of lights has also been completed at Campbell's

Barker-Lane Stadium / Ed Gore Field.

"We are very appreciative to the many Campbell alums and friends who have supported this effort to bring night football to campus," said CU Director of Athletics Bob Roller. "This opens so many doors for selected Thursday night games and later starts on Saturday will enhance weekends such as Homecoming and Family Weekend."

"Night football will be an exciting addition to Campbell University, to Buies Creek, and the greater area," said Steele. "Being able to play at night will allow our fans and our student body an option that will make for an exciting atmosphere week in and week out. It's another first for this program, and I think it's going to be a great experience for our football players and our fans."

The four 110-foot poles, two on each side of the stadium, feature 42 each and 168 total fixtures, providing 100 foot candle on all portions of the playing field.

"This has been a goal of ours for the past year to gain more media exposure for all of Campbell University, and these broadcast-quality lights will allow the possibility of bringing other sporting events to Barker-Lane Stadium," added Roller. "We feel that football in the fall at Barker-Lane Stadium will be a great experience for our students and fans."

The stadium's permanent lights will allow the Camels more options

for practice times, as well as greater flexibility for broadcasts and other sporting events.

**The Schedule**

With the newly installed lights, Campbell will begin its 2012 football schedule with the program's first ever Thursday night game at Barker-Lane Stadium, kicking off an 11-game slate featuring six home contests.

CU's 2012 schedule will feature eight Pioneer Football League games, including four in Buies Creek. Campbell will be opening at home for the third time in five seasons, and for the first time under lights.

Campbell will also host UVA-Wise, Davidson and Drake in night games, while Valparaiso and Marist will be 1 p.m. home kickoffs. In addition to Shorter and UVA-Wise, the Camels will also travel to Old Dominion during its nonconference schedule. CU's 2012 schedule will feature eight PFL games, including four in Buies Creek.

"We feel like our schedule is going to be a challenge," said Steele. "We anticipate the same type of games as we had last year in terms of each game is going to be tough and hard fought with the need to play hard each and every week to come away with wins. That is the reason why spring practice and two-a-days are going to be so important for our football team this year. We need to make sure that we are doing the things necessary to put ourselves in a position to win next fall."

The Camels' Aug. 30 Thursday night opener will kickoff at 7 p.m. against Shorter University. The game is Campbell's first non-Saturday game in the Division I era. Shorter, who posted a 6-4 ledger in 2011, will be meeting CU for the first time.

"Our non-conference schedule has some obvious changes with Shorter being added this year, plus starting the season at home on a Thursday at night," said Steele. "Shorter is a program that has played at this level before with its games against Georgia State in the past, and will be a good test for us to start things off."

The Hawks, who started playing football in 2005, own a 43-33 overall record in seven seasons. Shorter earned a conference championship and a postseason berth in 2008. The game against Shorter will mark the third contest that CU has played against a school from the state of Georgia since the program was restarted in 2008 with the other two games being against Georgia State during the 2010 and 2011 seasons.

Remaining at home for week two, the Camels will welcome UVA-Wise on Sept. 8. The 6 p.m. game will be the team's second of

three under the lights at Barker-Lane Stadium/Ed Gore Field.

The Camels took on the Cavaliers in Wise, Va. to begin the 2010 season, with CU taking a 20-16 victory. The thriller featured then Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk rushing it in from a yard out with just 10 seconds remaining to secure the road win. The Cavaliers sported a 5-6 record in 2011.

Campbell will hit the road for the first time in 2012 on Sept. 15 at Old Dominion in Norfolk, Va. The Monarchs, who restarted their program in 2009, made the FCS playoffs in 2011, advancing to the second round before falling to third-seeded Georgia Southern by a 55-48 score.

The Monarchs went 10-3 in 2011 and have gone 27-8 since restarting the program. Campbell and ODU have met annually since 2009, with the Monarchs holding a 3-0 edge in the series. ODU took last year's contest 41-14.

"We have seen UVA-Wise before and we know how tough they can be, plus we are going back to Old Dominion, who improves yearly, and it is always a challenge to take on a team that played in the FCS playoffs," said Steele. "It will be a challenge to start the season playing those three non-conference schools."

The Camels then open their PFL slate with a trip to Indianapolis, Ind. against Butler on Sept. 22 at 1 p.m. Campbell is riding a two-game winning streak over the Bulldogs, defeating Butler by a 38-23 score in Buies Creek last season. The Bulldogs went 5-6 and 3-5 in the league in 2011.

"We all know from past years that this conference is one that on any given Saturday anything can happen and I anticipate it being that same way again this year," said Steele. "The Pioneer Football League is one where teams improve throughout the season."

Campbell wraps up the month of September with Family Weekend on Sept. 29, a home contest against PFL foe Drake. The 2011 co-PFL Champions defeated Campbell 31-14 last season in Des Moines, Iowa, and are 4-0 against the Camels all-time. The Bulldogs went 9-2 and 7-1 in the PFL last season.

Following the bye week, Campbell will make its first trip to San Diego in the "Golden State," visiting the Toreros on Oct. 13. The

contest will be the third in the series with USD, but the first time that CU has ventured to the West Coast. San Diego, who finished last season 9-2 overall with a 7-1 league record as the PFL's co-champion along with Drake, took their only conference loss of the season to Campbell last year in Buies Creek, 48-24.

The Camels will return home to host Davidson for Homecoming on Oct. 20. The game will kickoff at 6 p.m. and will be the team's third of the year under lights in Buies Creek. Campbell defeated PFL and in-state foe Davidson for the first time since restarting the program last season 26-20 in triple overtime.

The game saw Braden Smith rush in the eventual game-winning touchdown in the third overtime before defensive back Steth Monroe sealed the victory with an interception. The Wildcats went 4-7 last season and 2-6 in league play.

A trip to Morehead, Ky. follows with Campbell taking on PFL rival Morehead State at 2 p.m. on Oct. 27. The all-time series between the Camels and Eagles is knotted at two games apiece, with each team taking both of its home contests.

Campbell defeated Morehead State 41-31 in 2011 in Buies Creek with Jordan Cramer running for a school-record 170 yards and tying a school mark with four rushing touchdowns. Morehead State sported a 3-8 overall record and 2-6 mark in the conference in 2011.

The Camels return home to Barker-Lane Stadium/Ed Gore Field to take on Valparaiso on Nov. 3. The Crusaders, who went 1-10 overall in 2011 with a 1-7 league record, defeated Campbell 34-31 in Valparaiso, Ind. last season.

Campbell's final road game of the season will be on Nov. 10 at Jacksonville. Kickoff is scheduled for 1 p.m. from D.B. Milne Field. The Dolphins finished 7-4 overall and 6-2 in the league in 2011, defeated the Camels 57-21 last season.

CU will wrap up the 2012 regular season with a 1 p.m. home tilt against Marist on Nov. 17. Campbell defeated the Red Foxes 35-21 in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. last season, pulling the Camels to 1-2 against Marist in three tries all-time. Brandon Chandler picked off two passes in the game for the Camels and returned the second one for a 42-yard touchdown. Marist ended 2011 with a 4-7 overall record, going 3-5 in league play.

### Quarterbacks

At quarterback, Campbell returns 2011 starter Braden Smith, as well as experienced backup Dakota Wolf, who has seen game time both of his seasons with the program. Smith set multiple offensive records for the Camels in his first year with the program, and the senior looks to better those numbers during his final campaign in Buies Creek.

"We're very fortunate to be deep at the quarterback position," said Steele. "We have two experienced quarterbacks. Braden Smith will be in his second year in the offense, which will obviously help him to be more effective in leading the football team, having been through spring practice now and a season last year. It will also allow us to give him more freedom in the offense. We expect big things out of him. Dakota Wolf also comes back. We have no drop off when Dakota comes into the football game. He continues to grow as a decision maker and as a leader."

"Nick Potts has a good grasp of the offense and there are certain things we can do with him and be effective," added Steele. "He understands and knows the offense, and his eyes are very valuable on the sidelines. He gives us a great deal of depth at that position. Then Luke Sirgo and Cory Benedetto will both be in learning situations this year."

### Running Backs

Campbell lost its top three rushers from a year ago in Carl Smith, C.J. Oates and Jordan Cramer, but return Kurt Odom, who will carry the load as a junior in 2012. The Camels have led the PFL in rushing three straight years, posting 210.5 yards per game last

season, ranking 18th in the nation.

"Running back has been a position in the past where we've been extremely deep," said Steele. "We're in a unique position where we still have some very experienced guys after losing our seniors last year, but we're just not very deep at the moment. Kurt Odom has a tremendous amount of game experience and talent, but after that we have a lot of unknowns. Josh Williams played at times last year at the position, has played a lot of special teams for us, and carried a lot of the load during the spring. But he's still an unknown, and we'll need him to step up."

"At fullback, where we lost Jordan Cramer, we really don't have

a returner," said Steele. "We're looking at one of the freshmen, either Dalton Dillon, Logan Rosborough or Dylan Peebles, who redshirted last season, to come through and play at a high level. Also, one of them is going to have to be a solid backup. We have a number of players, and since we run the ball so much, we need depth at the tailback position. We also have Kyle Clark, Vince Mantuo, Ryan Davis, and the freshmen that are coming in, Damien Booe, Akile Jones and Derice Mills. So two-a-days will be very important in what we're going to be doing.

#### Wide Receivers

Despite losing four year starters Paul Constantine and Harrison Jordan, CU returns a solid group of wide outs that look to reset the program highs from last season. The Camels set modern day program records for receptions (181), yards (1,989), receiving touchdowns (14) and receptions per game (16.5), while the Campbell offense produced its most effective season to date. While topping the school's reception yards total by well over 300 yards, the CU offense set standards for total offense, touchdowns, offense per game, all purpose yards, as well as scoring.

"Wide receiver is a position that we haven't been really deep in, and even though we lost a couple of guys, I feel like our experience level there is higher than it's been, overall," said Steele. "Chad McMichael, Jonathan Rogers, Jabri Ridenhour and Jordan Hildreth all had really good springs, and we feel very strongly that they can play at the level we need them to play."

"We're still not as deep at the position as we need to be, but AJ Artis certainly showed that he can play in the spring," added Steele. "His progress through two-a-days will determine how much that is. Ben Bolling has shown that he is extremely talented at times. The remainder of these guys, TJ McGee, Darius Carter, Nate Landi, have been a little inconsistent at times. We do have another incoming player, a transfer from South Carolina, Riley Gallaher. We expect him to step up and be able to help us. We will see how our freshmen progress during two-a-days, but we need to add depth there."

#### Tight Ends

Campbell returns its starter at tight end in redshirt junior Alex Green, who hauled in five passes for 60 yards for the season, including two catches for 10 yards and a touchdown in a win at Marist. Experienced senior Christian Rogers will also add depth at the position.

"We are experienced at tight end and are really deep there with Alex Green and Christian Rogers, who both have played and been effective," said Steele. "We also have Hunter Somerville, who had a really good spring. We also have guys coming in that will compete in Alvin Adebule, Shawn Millsap and Tuck Benefield."

#### Offensive Line

No position will see the overhaul like that of the offensive line. The CU offensive line returns one starter, senior Daniel Ritter, but loses its other four starters in Troy Horan, Sam Issermoyer, Jeremy Hill and Branden Burt, who combined for over 120 career starts. The Camels do, however, return a talented group of young o-linemen, including Nick Beaver, Dalton Brown, Will Sawyer and Adam Stern, who all saw significant action last season.

"A lot of these guys played at times last season, but a lot of them didn't have to carry a full load besides Daniel Ritter," said Steele. "Nick Beaver played quite a bit for us, and of course Dalton Brown as well. Even though we've lost a lot of experience up front, we think this is a talented group, they just haven't played a lot of snaps yet. Will Sawyer will start at tackle, and we'll back him up with Dylan McSteen. Jacob Brewer will start at guard, and even though he didn't play last year, is a very talented lineman who we feel will be able to contribute a lot."

"Dalton Brown moves into the very important center position after a really good spring," said Steele. "We were able to play him some last year at guard, and that helped us. He was able to learn a lot from Troy Horan, learning how to move the offense and get us in the right schemes. Both Adam Stern and Beaver have traveled and

played, with Beaver starting some last year. So, this group is not totally devoid of experience, they just don't have as many snaps under their belts as we had in the past. Daniel Ritter is obviously our most experienced lineman and will start at tackle. Harris Hite, who we feel is a very young and good offensive lineman, will back up Beaver at tackle and add depth for us on either side. We're expecting some of the freshmen to add depth for us. We just don't want to get in a situation where we have to play them a lot early."

**Cornerbacks**

Steth Monroe will anchor a talented but young group of corners. The senior, who picked off four passes as a junior in 2011, will be joined by redshirt freshmen Aaron Nichols and Jaylan Adlam, both athletic Georgia natives.

"Steth Monroe continues to get better and better," said Steele. "Nichols also had a really good spring for us. Jaylan Adlam will also play corner, giving us three solid players at that position. We'll try to determine who will be the fourth corner out of a really talented young incoming group during two-a-days."

**Safeties**

One of the deepest groups for the Camels will be at safety with the high caliber Brandon Chandler leading the way. Another senior, Paul Pizzuti, as well as Jeff Swinton give Campbell a plethora of experience to cover the safety position. Redshirt freshman Justice Walker, as well as second year players Luke Hill and Jake Barr will also see time on the field, adding depth.

"Brandon Chandler returns, and he's one of the most talented players on the football field, as well as experienced," said Steele. "He had a really good spring, and he certainly excites us with what he does. We'll back him up with Jake Barr and Luke Hill, who both made progress during the spring with our defense."

"We come in with a new safety in Justice Walker, who we feel like he is going to be a really good football player," said Steele. "Again, not the experience that we'd like to have, but he is very talented. Brandon Stegall will back him up there. Our whip linebacker will be Paul Pizzuti, and we'll back him up with Jeff Swinton. Paul is a very talented football player who's played in a lot of games, and so has Jeff. So we have a lot of good depth at that position."

**Linebackers**

Campbell will have to replace longtime starters Milton Brown and Chris Price at linebacker, but bring back Mike Rudisill, who ranked

ninth on the team in tackles with 48 last season, adding two interceptions and a fumble recovery. Returners Colten Burris, Matt Farris and Hassan Williamson also highlight the position, giving the Camels multiple looks.

"Colten Burris came on and became a starter for us in the spring," said Steele. "We have depth in that position, and all of the players we have at that position have played there. Burris and Hassan Williamson have played a lot, and Chinedo Onuoha will be able to play on special teams and will give us a lot of depth there. Both Mike Rudisill and Matt Farris are really talented and solid players for us with a lot of experience."

**Defensive Line**

After graduating three of four starters on the defensive line last season in Randall Herring, Freddie Shine and Jeremiah Robinson, the Camels will look returners with minimal experience, as well as newcomers to fill the void. Junior defensive end Taurean Lynch stands as the only returning starter at the position, and will look to expand on his 23 tackles, 3.5 for a loss, with 1.5 sacks from a year ago.

"Where we are hurting right now is the defensive line," said Steele. "Right now, coming into camp we'll start Lucas Smith at the tackle position and Isaac Scott on the end. The nose guard position will be a freshman at this point. We recruited a large number of defensive linemen, Bobby Gazak, Brendon Grants, Dwan Hanshaw, Ryan Bristle, Matt Hogrefe and Dustin Young, and we'll just have to see which one can play that position during two-a-days."

"We came into the spring with a good player in Taurean Lynch, as well as talented young guys in Andrew Yost and Kevin Collins, who don't have a lot of playing time, but they are certainly talented enough to play the position," added Steele.

**Special Teams**

With familiar faces in kicker Adam Willets, punter Ted Moore and long snapper Austin Tart lost to graduation, the Campbell special teams units will also see changes in 2012. The Camels do return senior placekicker Sam Eberwein, who has extensive experience with 21 career games under his belt.

"I think Adam Lutz made great progress in the spring as a punter," said Steele. "He was able to concentrate on that and I think we will be solid there. He'll be backed up by a freshman, Mike McFerran. Our long snapping duties will be taken over by Danny Dillon. He's picking up where Austin Tart left off, and we're not missing a beat with him there. He certainly has been everything and more of what we thought he was going to be. Sam Eberwein had a very solid spring, and we'll look to either Lutz or McFerran to back him up. Right now, we're solid at those positions, especially with Eberwein having so much experience."

The Camels open preseason camp on Thursday, August 2 in Buies Creek.

Dale Steele enters his fifth season of competition as head football coach at Campbell University. A 32-year veteran at the collegiate level, Steele became the first football coach at Campbell in more than 50 years on June 15, 2006.

Under Steele's watch Campbell has produced 31 All-Pioneer Football League selections in the team's first four seasons, including 11 last year.

Campbell finished 2011 at 6-5 overall and 5-3 in Pioneer Football League play, marking the program's highest win total since restarting the program in 2008. The Camels led the PFL in rushing for the third straight year (210.45 yards per game), ranking 18th in the nation. The team had five individuals in the league's top 20 in rushing in Carl Smith, C.J. Oates, Jordan Cramer, Braden Smith and Kurt Odom.

Three Campbell players earned national recognition for outstanding performances in the classroom with Kurt Odom, Michael Rudisill and Colten Burris being named CoSIDA First Team District 3 selections.

Senior fullback Jordan Cramer and senior offensive lineman Sam Issermoyer were selected to the All-PFL First Team for the first time in their careers. The Camels also placed two players on the second team in senior offensive guard Branden Burt and junior safety Brandon Chandler. The Camels had seven players earn Honorable Mention All-PFL recognition last season in senior wide receiver Paul Constantine, senior running back Carl Smith, senior offensive lineman Jeremy Hill, senior defensive lineman Jeremiah Robinson, senior defensive lineman Randel Herring, sophomore defensive back Steth Monroe and senior punter Ted Moore.

Five players earned spots on PFL All-Academic Teams, with Kurt Odom, Jordan Cramer, Colten Burris and Michael Rudisill earning First Team honors, and Sam Eberwein taking Second Team accolades. In addition, 56 players made the PFL's Academic Honor Roll.

Campbell had four players that were either named to the first or second team in 2010. Mike Stryffeler, a tight end, became the school's second First Team All-PFL selection. Named to the second team for Campbell was offensive tackle Sam Issermoyer, defensive lineman Randel Herring and defensive back Jared Hart. CU placed five more on the honorable mention list.

Campbell continued its rise upward in 2010. The team continued to show off the strong running game that has become commonplace in



Buies Creek and led the conference and ranked among the top 20 teams nationally in rushing. The team placed 16th overall and averaged better than 200 yards on the ground a game (207.73). The Camels also set a modern day record for rushing yards (416) and points (55) in game against Valparaiso (11/6). The Camels topped the 200 yard rushing mark in three other games.

The Camels continued to stand out in the classroom and had a pair of players selected to the CoSIDA's First Team Academic All-District for the second consecutive season in offensive lineman Andy Johnson and Mike Stryffeler. Both of those players along with four others (quarterback Daniel Polk, tight end Josh Owens, defensive lineman Charles Fiore and defensive back Paul Pizzuti) were selected to the PFL Academic Team. The awards kept rolling in the spring as the Camels placed a total of 37 players on the PFL's Academic Honor Roll.

Steele spent his first two years building the Fighting Camel program for competition in 2008 at the NCAA Division I FCS level in the Pioneer Football League. He joined the Campbell athletics staff after spending his previous two years as assistant head coach and running backs coach at Elon University.

Steele has overseen the entire program and the recruiting of six football signing classes and the building of the CU coaching staff.

Coach Steele's ties to North Carolina run deep. In addition to his most recent two-year stint at Elon, he spent a decade in Eastern North Carolina working on both the collegiate and prep levels.

From the 1989-1994 seasons, he was an assistant coach at East Carolina, where he helped guide the Pirates to a pair of bowl berths under head coaches Bill Lewis and Steve Logan.



At ECU, Steele coached the wide receivers, he then took on recruiting coordinator duties from 1991-93. He was named assistant head coach in 1994 when the Pirates made a trip to the Liberty Bowl. ECU also won the 1991 Peach Bowl during his tenure.

Steele then spent four years (1995-98) as head football coach and athletic director at Northern Nash High School in Rocky Mount, N.C. He left that position in 1998 to assume duties as recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach at Baylor University, where his brother Kevin served as head coach. Following a four-year stint at Baylor, Steele moved on to East Tennessee State as assistant head coach and wide receivers coach for one year (2003) before accepting the job at Elon.

Steele began his college coaching career at Ball State in 1977, where he worked with the offensive line while earning his master's degree in physical education. He moved on to Wisconsin in 1978 as tight ends coach and head coach of the Badgers junior varsity squad.

He went on to spend two years at Tulane (1980-82) where he worked with tight ends, kickers and served as recruiting coordinator. In 1980, the Green Wave appeared in the Hall of Fame Bowl against Arkansas. After coaching one year at St. Charles High School (1983) in LaPlace, La., Steele moved on to Wichita State (1984-86), where he worked with the outside linebackers and tight ends.

Steele then moved on to Kansas State, where he oversaw tight ends and was offensive special teams coordinator in 1987 and coached wide receivers in 1988 before accepting the job at ECU.

The son of a high school coach, Steele participated in wrestling and football at Autauga County High School in Prattville, Ala., where he lettered three years in both sports. He is a 1976 graduate of South Carolina, where he walked on the football team and played both offensive and defensive line. Steele began his coaching career that same year as an assistant at A.C. Flora High School.

Steele and his wife, the former Pam Kilpatrick, have two daughters, Meghan and Kelsey.

Oscar Olejniczak, a 17-year coaching veteran, begins his sixth year at Campbell this fall. Olejniczak works as the team's offensive coordinator with individual attention for the team's offensive line and tight ends.

Last season, the Camels led the PFL in rushing for the third straight year (210.45 yards per game), ranking 18th in the nation. The team had five individuals in the league's top 20 in rushing in Carl Smith, C.J. Oates, Jordan Cramer, Braden Smith and Kurt Odom.

Several members of the CU offense earned all-conference honors, with senior fullback Jordan Cramer and senior offensive lineman Sam Issermoyer both named First Team All-PFL for the first time in their careers.

Senior offensive guard Branden Burt was also named to the league's second team, while senior wide receiver Paul Constantine, senior running back Carl Smith and senior offensive lineman Jeremy Hill named Honorable Mention All-PFL.

Under the director of Olejniczak, the Camels ranked second in the PFL in scoring in 2011 at 34.5 points per game, boasting 19 more total rushing touchdowns than any other school in the conference with 36. Campbell also allowed the second-fewest sacks in the league for the second-straight year.

The team led the conference and ranked 16th nationally in rushing with an average of 207.73 yards a game in 2010. His line bulldozed its way to a school-record 416 yards on the ground against Valparaiso (11/6). Upon completion of the season, five members of his offense were named All-PFL in tight end Mike Stryffeler (first team), offensive lineman Sam Issermoyer (second team), quarterback Daniel Polk (honorable mention), offensive lineman Branden Burt (honorable mention) and offensive lineman Jeremy Hill (honorable mention).

In 2009 his offense led the conference and ranked 13th nationally in rushing at 189.73 yards a contest. Campbell's 2,087 yards rushing were 1,355 yards more than the team had accumulated the previous season. At the end of the season four members of Campbell's offense were named all-league with tight end Mike Stryffeler and offensive lineman Sam Issermoyer both being All-PFL Second Team selections and receiver Harrison Jordan and center Troy Horan being honorable mention choices.

A wide receiver at Central Michigan from 1992-94, he has worked with the Fighting Camels offensive line and tight ends since his arrival in 2007.

In 2009 he was promoted from the run game coordinator to the team's offensive coordinator. In his first season as

offensive coordinator Campbell improved to an average of 19.45 points a game and were able to top 200 yards rushing as team in five different games. In his second year (2010) the Campbell offense continued to make major strides and had three of the top 10 rushers in the conference while topping the 200 yard rushing mark in four different games. The CU offense scored 20 or more points in eight games and set a then school-record with 55 points against Valparaiso. The team placed fourth in the conference with their average of 23.7 points a contest and led the league with 26 rushing touchdowns. Olejniczak also oversaw Campbell's regional and national recruiting efforts from 2008-10. A group of recruits that has proven to be the backbone of Campbell's quickly improving football program.



Prior to Campbell, Olejniczak assisted the offensive line and tight end coaches at Michigan State for two seasons. During games, he communicated with other coaches regarding opponent's defensive schemes and trends.

At Michigan State, he was also responsible for film breakdown and running the defense and special team scout teams during the Spartan practices. Olejniczak was a key part in Spartans' recruiting efforts, especially at the junior college level. Prior to joining the Big 10 power, Olejniczak was the outside linebackers coach at Wayne State, a NCAA D-II school in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Conference. In addition to his on the field coaching duties, he ran the scout teams and was responsible for a portion of the Warriors recruiting efforts.

Ake, who most recently coached Liberty's secondary and linebackers from 2009-11, will also guide the Fighting Camel linebacker unit. Last season the Flames were among the defensive leaders in the Big South Conference in numerous categories. Liberty had the top scoring defense in the league (22.0) and ranked first in pass defense efficiency (119.7).

The program ranked second in total defense (343.3), tied for second in interceptions (12), returning two for touchdowns, third in rush defense (144.4) and pass defense (198.9), also tying for third in fumbles recovered (9). The Flames had a pair of players who ranked tied for third in interceptions in the league in Kevin Fogg and Walt Aikens. Aikens, a defensive back, also led the conference with three forced fumbles.

Ake, who is a veteran of 33 years as a collegiate coach at 10 different institutions, came to Liberty from Army. While at Army he served as secondary coach for the Black Knights for five years (2004-08). Prior to his days at Army, Ake worked for three years at Western Michigan (2001-03), as a defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator. During the 2002 campaign, Ake's secondary picked off 14 passes, helping the Broncos finish second in the Mid-American Conference in pass defense. In 2001, Western Michigan ranked No. 17 nationally in pass defense.

Prior to his time in Kalamazoo, Mich., Ake was the defensive coordinator for Maryland (1997-2000). While overseeing the Maryland defenders, Ake saw the Terrapins rank as the No. 12 most improved defense in 1998, No. 13 in scoring defense and No. 14 in improved passing defense. Nine of his Maryland players went on to NFL careers.

Ake's first defensive coordinator position came at Rice, where he oversaw the Owls for three seasons (1994-96). Rice ranked No. 25 nationally in four different defensive categories in 1994, helping the Owls share the Southwestern Conference title.

Prior to his first defensive coordinator role, Ake coached linebackers and defensive lineman for more than a decade. A former player and coach at the University of North Carolina, Mariani's passing game posted a banner year in 2011, setting modern day program records in passing yards, completions, attempts, touchdowns, completions percentage, pass efficiency and passing yards per game.

In his first season under center, Braden Smith set single season school records for yards passing, completions, attempts and touchdown passes, earning a pair of Pioneer Football League Player of the Week accolades in 2011.

The first of Smith's back to back weekly league honors came after Campbell defeated San Diego 48-24 behind his four touchdowns. Smith rushed for three scores, also accounting for one through the air as the Rockwall, Texas native converted 16 pass attempts.

Smith's second PFL Player of the Week honor came after Campbell's triple overtime thriller at Davidson, with the signal caller leading the Camels back from a 17-3 four quarter deficit. Smith led the Camels to a pair of scoring drives late in regulation before scoring again in the third overtime.

Mariani's work with the CU quarterbacks continued to play major dividends in 2010. Daniel Polk led the team and ranked third in the conference with 12 rushing scores. Polk also threw for eight more touchdowns, totaled 558 rushing yards and passed for 1,263 yards. He became the first CU player to top 1,800 yards in total offense in consecutive seasons. Overall, the Campbell quarterbacks completed 126 passes for 1,263 yards and eight scores. The

position also ran for 604 yards and 12 touchdowns in Campbell's dual threat offense.

Mariani's quarterbacks completed 137 passes for 1,674 yards and threw nine touchdown passes on the 2009 season for the Fighting Camels. CU quarterbacks also accounted for over 500 yards rushing and another four scores on the ground. The Campbell passing attack set a school record with 283 passing yards against Methodist. Matt Vollono set a new Campbell individual record with four passing scores. Among his four passing touchdowns was a school-record 85 yard pass to Carl Blain.

Mariani joined the Camels after two seasons at Coastal Carolina where he coached the tight ends and assisted with video coordination. During his final season with the Chanticleers he coached tight end Rodney Burgess to First Team All-Big South honors after an 18 catch, 300 yard season. Burgess was also selected to The State's South Carolina All-State Team and was an Honorable Mention All-American selection by Don Hansen's Football Gazette in his final campaign under Mariani's tutelage. Coastal won two Big South Championships during Mariani's tenure and earned a spot in the NCAA FCS Playoffs in 2006.

Prior to his two years at Coastal, Mariani spend one year at his alma mater as the offensive video assistant. A 2004 graduate of North Carolina, Mariani was a quarterback for four seasons with the Tar Heels, including the 2001 squad that defeated Auburn in the Peach Bowl. Nick Cavallo enters his third season at Campbell and his fifth season as a college coach, piloting the Camel defensive line and recruiting efforts.

Last season, Cavallo helped coach the CU defense to program bests in tackles, tackles for loss, sacks, fumbles forced, fumbles recovered and blocked kicks. The team's 72 tackles for loss set the opposition back 266 yards in all, also setting a program record. The Camels recorded 26 sacks were more than the previous two seasons combined (23), resulting in 165 yards for loss alone.

The CU defensive line saw two of its members receive postseason honors, with seniors Jeremiah Robinson and Randel Herring earning Honorable Mention Pioneer Football League All-Conference accolades.

Robinson also earned an honorable mention for the College Football Performance Awards' weekly list after leading the team with 11 tackles, including a pair of sacks, forced a fumble and 2.5 of stops for loss against Old Dominion. Herring, who was a preseason Second Team All-PFL pick by Phil Steele last season, also earned an invitation to the Lombardi Bowl.

The Camels totaled 11 sacks in 2010, including eight from the defensive line, plus 36 tackles for loss with 19.5 coming from a member of the d-line. Defensive tackle Randel Herring was an All-PFL Second Team selection after leading all defensive linemen on the team in tackles.

Cavallo was promoted to the recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2011 and aided Campbell in signing 27 newcomers prior to the 2011 season.

Before coming to Campbell, Cavallo spent the 2009 season at Purdue as a graduate assistant coach working with the defense. In 2009 the Boilermakers' defense ranked ninth in the Big Ten in scoring defense, fourth in pass defense, ninth in turnover margin, seventh in total defense and fourth in sacks.

In 2011, Fontenette's second with the program, the Camels set modern day program records for receptions (181), yards (1,989), receiving touchdowns (14) and receptions per game (16.5), while the Campbell offense produced its most effective season to date.

While topping the school's reception yards total by well over 300 yards, the CU offense set standards for total offense, touchdowns, offense per game, all purpose yards, as well as scoring.

In addition, Paul Constantine was named a Pioneer Football League All-Conference Honorable Mention.

The Camels finished 2011 at 6-5 overall and 5-3 in Pioneer Football League play, enjoying their highest win total and first winning season since restarting the program in 2008.

In Fontenette's first season in Buies Creek, the CU receiving core caught 94 passes for 1,007 yards and seven touchdowns, with Harrison Jordan leading the team in both catches (29) and yards (334). The team's receivers also proved to be efficient and effective in the return game, combining to field 42 kicks for 789 yards.

Prior to Campbell, Fontenette spent the previous two years at Maine working as an offensive assistant, coaching the Black Bear wide receivers. In 2009 Maine led the Colonial Athletic Association in passing offense and ranked fourth in scoring offense. Under Fontenette's tutelage, Maine receiver Landis Williams led the conference in receptions and receiving yards per game. Fontenette also worked as the special teams' assistant at Maine, directing the gunners on the punt team, also running special teams and scout teams.

Fontenette spent the 2007 season as the wide receivers coach at Wagner College. As a graduate assistant coach he worked with all 10 receivers and ran daily meetings with the group.

He worked with the team's corners in 2011 in one of the toughest Football Championship Subdivision conferences in the country. The Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) was able to place five teams in the NCAA playoffs this past season.

Butterworth coached the UMass cornerbacks in 2011 in a base 3-4 scheme. He also acted as the defensive sideline caller during the season.

"This is an exciting time to be a part of this place," said Losey. "When you have a head coach with a vision, it makes things a lot easier to perform on Saturdays, both from the players' and coaches' perspective. There's a great tradition that's being created here and it's an honor to be a part of that."

Losey comes to Campbell from Webber International where the he coached the offensive line for one season. At WIU, Losey was also responsible for writing up the Warriors' run game.

Prior to WIU, Losey assisted at Florida State, working as an offensive quality control coach under offensive line coach Rick Trickett from February 2009 through January 2011. Losey was responsible for opponent breakdown, practice preparation, running the defensive scout team and charting opponent defensive tendencies on game days.

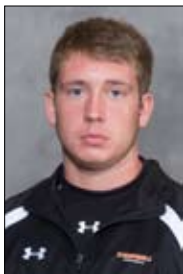

**DR. JERRY M. WALLACE**  
**University President**  
**East Carolina '56**

Elected President of the University by the Board of Trustees in May 2003, Dr. Jerry M. Wallace is leading the University in its quest to fully implement the Campus Master Plan.

Under Dr. Wallace's guidance, the Campbell University campus has undergone a remarkable transition over the past seven years. The McLeod Athletic Training facility opened in August 2004 to house the University's athletic training program as well as locker room and office space for the soccer and softball teams. The complete renovation of D. Rich Memorial Hall was completed in August 2004. A new \$15 million residence hall with 302 beds was constructed and opened for the fall semester of 2005.

University food services have also been overhauled with the addition of Starbucks Coffee, Chick-fil-A, Quizno's and more. Barnes and Noble assumed management of the University bookstore. Both Shouse and Marshbanks Dining Halls have undergone complete renovations.

The return of football as a varsity sport was announced in April 2006 and the Fighting Camels began competing in the Pioneer Football League in 2008. On Aug. 30, 2008, Campbell hosted its first intercollegiate football game in nearly 58 years as Barker-Lane Stadium was packed with a greater-than-capacity crowd.

On Sept. 1, 2006, Dr. Wallace oversaw groundbreaking ceremonies for the 30 million dollar John W. Pope Jr. Convocation Center and Gilbert Craig Gore Arena. During the 2008-09 academic year, the Campbell basketball, volleyball and wrestling teams played their inaugural seasons in the building, setting all-time attendance records in the process.

Maddox Hall, a 42,000 square-foot Pharmacy teaching facility was completed in September 2007. The state-of-the-art teaching and research center is located between the Campbell Hall of Science and Carter Gym.

The center of campus has been transformed with the addition of Fellowship Common, a pedestrian mall and gathering space that extends from T.T. Lanier Street to Main Street.

The Divinity School's 450-seat Butler Chapel was completed in the summer of 2009. Campbell also continues to work with architects and engineers to determine the feasible occupancies for its original building, historic Kivett Hall.

Renovations at the new site of Campbell's Norman Adrian Wiggins School of Law in Raleigh were completed in the fall of 2009.

Residence Hall renovation and construction has been given priority. Sauls, Kitchen, Baldwin, Hedgpath, Strickland Halls and Stadium Apartments were renovated. A new residence hall opened to receive students in August 2010.

The University grounds beautification continues. Gateway entrances were built and landscaped at three major campus entrances. New visitor parking was created.

Renovation to labs and classrooms in the Campbell Hall of Science was completed in August 2010. A natural science facility was fashioned from the former University laundry building.

Wiggins and Kivett Halls were completely renovated. Wiggins Hall now houses the Wiggins Memorial Library. Kivett Hall is home to the English Faculty and was transformed into a major classroom building.

During the 2010-11 academic year, Belk Track became the latest athletics facility to open and Campbell re-joined the Big South Conference.

The University also unveiled its plan to open a School of Osteopathic Medicine in 2013.

A native of Rockingham, North Carolina, Dr. Wallace attended East Carolina University where he received a B.A. degree in English and Government.

He went on to receive Bachelor of Divinity and Master of Theology degrees from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, and then added a Masters and Doctorate degrees in Sociology from North Carolina State University.

Dr. Wallace first joined the Campbell faculty in 1970 as an adjunct Professor of Sociology. He began full-time employment at the University in 1975 as Chairman of the Department of Religion and Philosophy and Tyner Professor of Religion.

He was appointed Dean of the College and Director of Graduate Studies in 1981, and in 1984 accepted the position of vice president of Academic Affairs and provost, a position he held until June 2001. During the next two years he served as special assistant to the president, and as the James R. Coates Professor of Religion and Society in the Campbell University Divinity School.

According to current vice president of Academic Affairs and provost, Dr. M. Dwaine Greene, the choice of Dr. Wallace is a tremendous selection. "He not only brings proven experience to the position, but he has both a comprehensive and a balanced understanding of Campbell's various operations. He carries the banner of Campbell's sterling tradition, while being a progressive and innovative administrator who no doubt will be an effective President."

The range of Dr. Wallace's contributions is also visible throughout North Carolina Baptist circles. He is widely acknowledged as one of the leading Baptist figures in central and eastern North Carolina. For 15 years, beginning in 1960, he pastored the Elizabethtown Baptist Church. During his years at Campbell he has held over a dozen interim pastorates and spoken in scores of North Carolina churches. He has also been widely active at the state convention level.

Dr. Wallace is married to Betty Blanchard Wallace, a 1972 graduate of Campbell College. Dr. and Mrs. Wallace are the parents of three children: Betty Lynne Johnson, Jerry McLain Wallace, Jr., and Lydia Kelly McLamb. The Wallace's have five grandchildren.





**BOB ROLLER**  
Athletic Director  
Virginia Tech '83

During his first year as Director of Athletics at Campbell University, Bob Roller helped lead a department that reached new heights in competition, facilities construction and student-athlete welfare.

Campbell's football and baseball teams set school records for single season victories, while the wrestling and men's and women's golf programs reached NCAA post-season competition. The men's basketball team knocked off a major conference opponent (Iowa) for the second-straight year and finished third in the Big South Conference regular season race.

Outside the playing realm, funding and construction were completed for Amanda Littlejohn Stadium, home of the Campbell softball team, as well as the addition of lights at Barker-Lane Football Stadium. Funds were also raised for a new home for the Campbell baseball program, while dedication ceremonies were held for the Irwin Belk Track and Clarence Roberts Field.

Roller was the driving force behind the CAMMYS, Campbell's multi-media end-of-year student-athlete awards program. Campbell athletes also donated more than 4,300 hours in community service around the Buies Creek area.

University President Dr. Jerry Wallace and Vice President for Student Life Dr. Dennis Bazemore introduced Roller, who brings three decades of experience in Division I athletics to his position.

"I am thrilled to be given this opportunity to lead Campbell's athletics department," said Roller. "I'd like to thank Dr. Wallace, the Board of Trustees and Dr. Bazemore for this tremendous honor. Their vision to see Campbell athletics strive to win Big South Conference championships left a great impression. We will work as an entire department to equip and develop these student-athletes to be graduates and leaders."

Introduced on July 20, 2011 as the fourth A.D. of Campbell's Division I era (since 1977-78), Roller joined the Fighting Camel staff after spending more than 11 years as Director of Athletics at Samford University. While at the Birmingham, Ala., school, he oversaw one of the most exciting periods of growth in its history.

In his time at the helm of the Samford athletics department, Roller led a major facilities upgrade while overseeing the department's move to the Southern Conference, one of the nation's oldest collegiate leagues. Samford's student-athletes also turned in outstanding performances both on the field and in the classroom during Roller's tenure. For all of his accomplishments, Roller was named the 2009-10 Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Southeast Region Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics.

In the 2009-10 school year, Samford won the SoCon's Germann Cup, which goes to the top women's sports program in the league. In that same year, Samford had 11 teams record perfect single-year scores of 1,000 in the NCAA's APR report. Five of Samford's teams earned Public Recognition Awards, which go to teams posting multi-year APR scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sport nationally.

Roller has also mentored two current Division I athletics directors. Janet Cone, now the athletics director at UNC Asheville and Alan Verlander of Jacksonville University, served as associate athletic directors under Roller at Samford.

Numerous athletics facility upgrades were accomplished during Roller's tenure at Samford. The most recent upgrade came with the opening the Cooney Family Field House prior to the start of practice for the 2009 football season. The new field house includes offices for the football coaches, a weight room, locker room, training room, player's lounge and meeting rooms.

The largest project among the many upgrades was the Pete Hanna Center, which opened in October of 2007. The Hanna Center is the largest building on Samford's campus and holds 6,000 spectators for graduation or concerts, and 5,000 for sporting events. The home of Bulldog basketball and volleyball, the Hanna Center features a state-of-the-art fitness center for all Samford



students, plus offices for the athletics department, academic center, weight room and training rooms.

Another addition to the Samford athletics facility plan was unveiled in the spring of 2007 with the opening of the Pat M. Courington Tennis Pavilion, which houses the Samford tennis offices and locker rooms, plus three indoor and six outdoor NCAA courts.

Early in Roller's tenure, Samford constructed Joe Lee Griffin Field for baseball in 1999. The 2004 season saw upgrades to the softball complex and a complete renovation of the soccer field with permanent seating for record crowds. Seibert Stadium's natural grass was replaced with a state-of-the-art LSR Blade Synthetic Surface in 2005 for football.

Prior to its move to the SoCon, Samford spent five years in the Ohio Valley Conference. In its time in the league, Samford won 13 team championships, and Samford women's teams claimed the Women's All-Sports Trophy three times (2003-04, 2006-07 and 2007-08). Samford won championships in women's soccer (four), women's tennis (four), women's cross-country (two), baseball, men's golf and men's tennis.

Roller arrived at Samford in 1997 to direct the Samford Athletic Foundation. During his first two years, the foundation saw record growth in individual and corporate donations to the university's athletics programs. Roller held that position until May 1999, when then-President Thomas E. Cortis named him to the top position within the athletics department.

In the summer of 2003, Roller was elected to the prestigious executive committee of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics [NACDA] to serve a four-year term. He joined athletics directors from Kansas State, Stanford, Army and Clemson on the governing committee that oversees the activities of the 6,000-plus member organization.

In 2006, Roller was named national chairman of the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup Committee for NACDA. The Directors' Cup is awarded to the top universities in NCAA Division I, II, III and NAIA for overall athletics success throughout the intercollegiate season. Prior to his tenure at Samford, Roller was vice president of AdCraft Sports Marketing in Louisville, Ky., for seven years. During that time, he helped create the Sears Collegiate Champions program, which honors all champions of men's and women's sports throughout the nation at every level of college athletics.

While with AdCraft, Roller created and managed a publishing division and helped launch NCAA Football USA, which involved promotion, licensing and merchandising for college football programs at all levels of intercollegiate athletics. Roller was director of communications for the Orange Bowl Committee in Miami, Fla., from 1988 to 1991. He was with the Orange Bowl when Federal Express became its first title sponsor in 1989.

The Pearisburg, Va., native began his career in sports information. He earned his degree from Virginia Tech in 1983 and worked as a student assistant in the sports information office for four years. He was the sports information director at UNC Wilmington and East Carolina from 1983 to 1988. While at UNCW, Roller was also executive director of the university's athletics fund-raising program. Roller, 51, who holds a master's degree in education administration from Samford, is married to the former Carolyn Keller. He has one son, Brad, and three stepchildren -- Kerstin (21), Kyle (20) and Karrah (14).



**ANDREW CARTER**  
**Director Strength & Conditioning**  
**Salisbury University '02**  
**5th Year**

Andrew Carter enters his fifth season as the head strength and conditioning coach at Campbell, where he works closely with all 20 athletic programs. Carter also serves as an instructor within the exercise science department. He comes to Campbell after spending three years as the head strength and conditioning coach at St. Stephen's & St. Agnes School in Alexandria, Va. In addition to his strength and conditioning duties, Carter also worked as the physical education department coordinator and assistant boy's varsity lacrosse coach. Carter began his career as an assistant strength and conditioning coach at the University of Delaware (2003-05) where he was responsible for implementing strength and conditioning programs for men's lacrosse, baseball, softball, men's soccer, rowing, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's track and field and cross country.

Carter has also served as the head strength and conditioning coach for the U.S. Women's National Lacrosse Team (2006-08), volunteer assistant strength coach at Notre Dame (2004) and the head strength and conditioning coach for the Cecil Community College's men's basketball team (2004-05).

Also included in Carter's extensive background is some teaching and research work as an adjunct professor at Marymount University (2007), a research assistant at the University of Delaware (2003-05) and a research associate with the Miami Project to Cure Paralysis at the University of Miami (2002-03). He also has authored numerous articles in peer reviewed journals including, the Journal of Strength and Conditioning Research and the Journal of Athletic Training. Carter has presented at the Southeastern North Carolina Strength & Conditioning Clinic, the NSCA National Conference, and the NATA National Conference.

A 2002 graduate of Salisbury University with a bachelor's degree in physical education with emphasis in exercise science, Carter also earned his master's in exercise physiology from Delaware in 2005.

Carter, a former three-year football letterwinner at Salisbury, is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) and is USA Weightlifting Club Coach Certified and is a member of the Collegiate Strength and Conditioning Coaches Association (CSCCa).



**Campbell University Strength & Conditioning Program**

The Campbell University strength and conditioning facilities can be found at the John W. Pope Jr. Convocation Center.

The 3,550 square foot facility is located in the right corner of the building closest to Leslie Campbell Avenue.

The state of the art facility includes: (4) double sided Nautilus Combination Racks, (4) Half Racks w/ Olympic Weight Lifting platforms, (4) Power Racks, (12) Adjustable Benches, (2) Nautilus Lat Pulldown Machines, a Nautilus Seated Row Machine, (2) Nautilus Lying Leg Curl Machines, Nautilus Leg Extension Machine, Hammer Strength Jammer, Hammer Strength 4-way Neck, Hammer Strength Isolation Leg Press, a Four-way hip machine, (2) Complete Sets of Dumbbells ranging from 5 to 120lbs (15) Medicine Balls, (2) sets of Plyo Boxes, (12) sets of Rubber Bumper Weight Plates, (18) 7-ft Bars (both Olympic and Power), (4) Trap Bars, a set of Kettlebells (12kg - 32kg), Over 5,500 lbs in Iron Grip Weight Plates, (2) Schwinn Airdyne Bicycles.

Although specific strength and conditioning programs are designed for each sport, the basic goal is the same - to help athletes increase their full potential in: strength, speed, flexibility, endurance and ultimately sports performance, while decreasing the likelihood of injury.

Workouts are designed and supervised by Andrew Carter, who is in his fifth year as the director of strength and conditioning at Campbell. He along with his staff provide a strong base for Campbell's student-athletes.

Members of each of CU's 21 varsity teams meet with Carter on a weekly basis, with most teams training and preparing for competition several times a week.

Campbell's strength and conditioning program has an ultimate goal of achieving the maximum potential, in order to better prepare student-athletes in competition. The strength and conditioning staff operates in conjunction with the athletic training staff to ensure that the Campbell football players can compete on the field at the highest level injury free.



**JACKIE KNIGHT**  
**Head Athletic Trainer**  
**Olivet College**  
**7th Year**

Jackie Knight begins her first year as Campbell University's head athletic trainer.

Serving as the interim head athletic trainer over the past year, Knight will begin her seventh year overall at Campbell University in 2012-13.

"I'd like to thank Athletic Director Bob Roller for entrusting me with this incredible opportunity," said Knight. "I have made a commitment to the athletes and coaches at Campbell University over the past six seasons and I am very happy that I will continue doing so for years to come. The support of the coaches and my amazing staff has made the transition to head athletic trainer a seamless one and I have no doubt that we will move forward together to help the athletic teams excel."

Knight headed all athletic training needs for Campbell's football team in 2011-12 while handling the entire department's daily operations, and will continue to do so under her new title.

Knight had been the athletic trainer for the women's basketball, men's and women's tennis and men's and women's golf teams prior to being promoted in the summer of 2011. She also works as the Clinical Coordinator of the Athletic Training Education Program and teaches classes within that program.

Prior to Campbell, Knight worked as the head athletic trainer and assistant professor in the Health and Physical Education Department at Hillsdale College in Hillsdale, Mich. for three years. While at Hillsdale College with a staff of only two Certified Athletic Trainers, Knight worked primarily with the football, men's basketball, and softball teams but covered all the other sports regularly.

While receiving her master's degree in athletic training from Indiana State University, Knight was a graduate assistant in the Sycamores athletic training department. During her stint at Indiana State, Knight also served as an athletic trainer at Terre Haute North Vigo High School.

Knight got her bachelor's degree in athletic training from Olivet College in Olivet, Mich. As an undergrad at Olivet, Knight served as the football equipment manager and student athletic trainer while participating as a student-athlete on the softball and basketball teams. She also had the opportunity to be one of the athletic trainers for the Michigan Cadet National Wrestling Camp during the summer.

In the summertime for the past several years, Jackie has worked with USA Athletes International and has had the opportunity to play softball in international competitions and travel around the world. More recently, she has transitioned to coaching softball teams as well as serving as the athletic trainer. In the summer of 2008, Jackie coached a team that won the gold medal while competing in Sydney, Australia at the Olympic Softball Stadium, the site of the 2000 Summer Olympics.

Knight is a member of the National Athletic Trainers' Association, Great Lakes Athletic Trainers' Association, Michigan Athletic Trainer's Society, Mid-Atlantic Athletic Trainers Association, and is an American Red Cross First Aid/CPR/AED instructor.



**Campbell University Athletic Training**

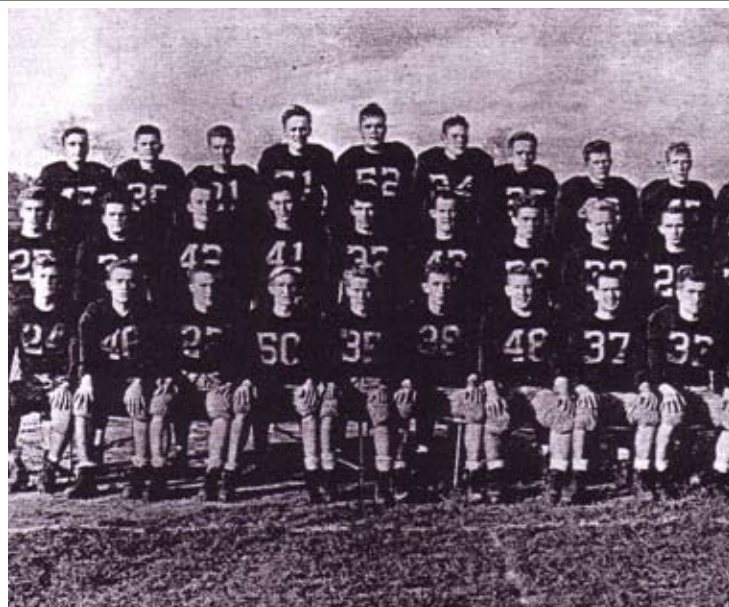
Campbell University student-athletes have access to one of the finest sports medicine care programs in North Carolina. CU's Athletic Training staff offers all Fighting Camel student-athletes the best available medical care for athletic injuries. They design and implement programs to prevent, manage and treat athletic injuries. They also supervise injury rehabilitation programs that are designed to return the athlete to athletic activity as quickly and safely as possible.

The athletic training staff has the use of both the McLeod Athletic Training Facility on campus and a separate training room inside the Barker-Lane Stadium Fieldhouse to meet all the needs of Campbell student-athletes.

In addition, the staff also provides supervision to students majoring in athletic training. These students are enrolled in a challenging academic major that not only requires that they make the grade in the classroom but also must excel in real-life situations. The education program is directed by Dr. Catherine Simonson.

The Athletic Training staff also works closely with Dr. Chris Stewart, M.D., and Mr. Jerry Brenneman, P.A., of Campbell University Student Health Services and team physicians Dr. Bill Hage of Triangle Orthopedic Associates of Raleigh and Dr. Michael Hart of Carolina Family Practice and Sports Medicine of Cary to provide quality physician services to student-athletes. Chiropractic services are provided by Damien Rodulfo of Healing Hands Chiropractic in Dunn.

Other allied health care needs available within the athletic training services program include optometry, dentistry and sports massage.



As surprising as it is this is not the first time that Campbell has had a football program. The Camels actually have a football history that dates back to 1925 when the school fielded its first varsity team. That team led by Coaches Edge and Baker went 3-1-1 including the historic first 7-0 victory over Carthage. The details of some of early teams remains sketchy but it is known that the 1929 team, under the direction of Coach Bob Hays, posted Campbell's first-ever state championship with a 5-2-1 record.

Campbell continued to be a program to account for and posted a state junior college championship in 1932 under the guidance of Coach S.O. Brandon. The third-ever state title came in 1939 when Campbell tied both Belmont Abbey and Brevard.

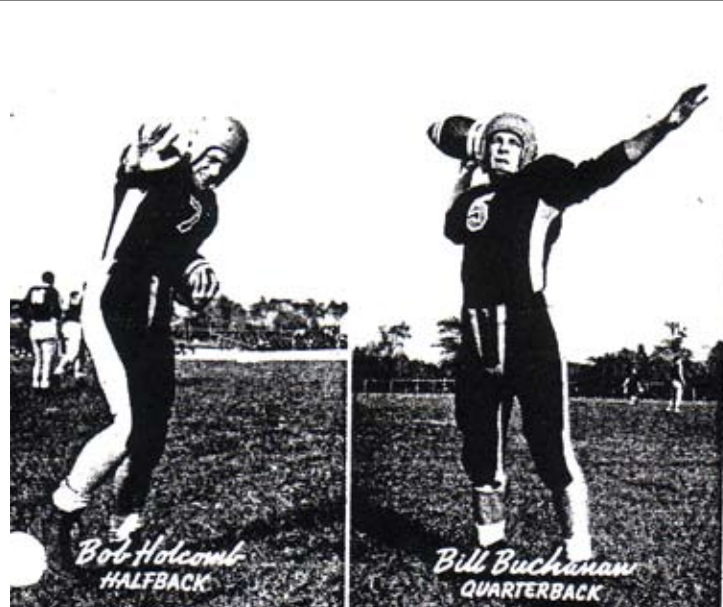
With World War II in full swing Campbell made the decision to suspend football play from 1940-45 until the war came to an end. When CU resumed play the Camels continued to just win. The team won the 1946 and 1948 North Carolina Junior College State Championships and finished as the runner-up in 1947 all under the direction of Coach Earl Smith.

The 1947 team lost to South Georgia 46-7 to finish as the runner-up for the Eastern United States Junior College Championship. One year later in 1948, Campbell won the North Carolina title, but fell to familiar foe South Georgia 26-19 in the Eastern U.S. Championship.

With the on-set of the Korean Conflict and the movement of many North Carolina schools to senior college status in the 1950's, Campbell dropped its varsity football program after the 1950 season until the present day.

In August 2004, Campbell first began to explore, by way of a feasibility study, the possibility of adding non-athletic scholarship football as a varsity sport. When results came back as something that should be pursued CU made the official announcement on April 7, 2006 that football was coming back to the Creek as varsity sport in time for the 2008 season. The program it was decided would compete at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (non-scholarship) level. Campbell's administration then began the task of looking for potential football leagues to join that would embrace both the athletic demands as well as the high academic standards that Campbell has been built upon. In 2006, the Camels formally submitted a bid to join the Pioneer Football League.

On June 15, 2006 the Campbell program after an extensive search found the man to act as the face of the program in head coach Dale Steele. Steele, a veteran of more than 25 years in the collegiate ranks and possessing several direct ties to many of the top programs around the state and the nation, began to assemble his staff and his first signing class in 2007.



On June 2, 2007 Campbell hosted its first official football outings with "A Day For The Camels: Touchdown 2008", which included a golf tournament, banquet, reception and a silent auction. Special guests included Mike Minter (Carolina Panthers), Greg Warren (Pittsburgh Steelers), and keynote speaker Fisher DeBerry (Air Force).

Steele and his coaching staff continue their preparation for the 2008 season by conducting the team's first official football practice in more than 50 years on August 28, 2007 with more than 100 players participating.

The Campbell football team worked through the fall and held a two-hour intra-squad on October 20, 2007, the first official football game in the modern era, for the Homecoming/Parents' Day celebration. The Camels wrapped up their fall practices on November 17, 2007 with another scrimmage at Lee Senior High School in Sanford.

The Pioneer Football League formally accepted Campbell's bid for acceptance for the 2008 season on December 5, 2007. That day also served as the official unveiling of the 2008 game schedule.

The Camels returned to the practice field for a set of 15 spring practices on March 26, 2008. Campbell concluded their spring schedule with the first-ever Orange and Black game on April 19, 2008. The defense outlasted the offense in the controlled scrimmage by a final score of 33-31.

After years of planning and waiting, the Camels were finally able to get on the field on August 30, 2008 with a contest against Birmingham-Southern College. In front of overflowing crowd of 5,845 the Campbell lost a closely fought 12-6 game to the Panthers.

The 2009 football schedule saw Campbell win a pair of firsts at home. The Camels won the team's first-ever home game in a thrilling 48-28 season opening come-from-behind victory over Methodist on Sept. 5.

Campbell's football produced another historic first with the team's first win in Pioneer Football League play with a 31-22 win over Morehead State on Oct. 31. The team also won its first on the road in league play in the 17-3 win over Valparaiso on Nov. 14.

2011 marked a banner year for the CU football program, with the team producing its first winning season since its re-launch. The Camels finished 6-5 overall and 5-3 in PFL play, leading the conference in rushing for the third straight year (210.45 yards per game) and placing 11 on all-conference teams.

**Barker-Lane Background Information**

- Campbell’s Barker-Lane Stadium officially opened on August 30, 2008 as CU welcomed football back to the creek with a game against Birmingham-Southern...CU was defeated in a close fought affair 12-6 by the Panthers.

- The facility was officially named ‘Barker-Lane Stadium’ for longtime Campbell benefactors Bob Barker and Dr. Robert Lane in a dedication ceremony to the new facility at halftime on opening weekend...Barker and Lane contributed \$4 million in pledges to Campbell’s startup football program.

- Largest crowd in the stadium history was the 5,845 that turned out for opening day...the crowd remains the largest to witness a sporting event in Buies Creek.

- In the spring of 2009 as part of Phase II of the facility, which will include permanent home side seating, a press box and an additional stadium entrance, longtime Campbell supporter Ed Gore had the field named in his honor...the official name of the field is Ed Gore Field at Barker-Lane Stadium.

- Barker-Lane Stadium added lights prior to the 2012 season, allowing the Camels more options for practice times, as well as greater flexibility for broadcasts and other sporting events. The four 110-foot poles, two on each side of the stadium, feature 42 each and 168 total fixtures, providing 100 foot candle on all portions of the playing field.

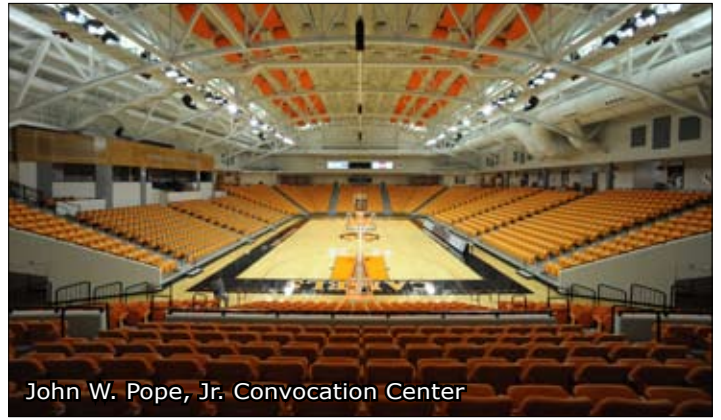

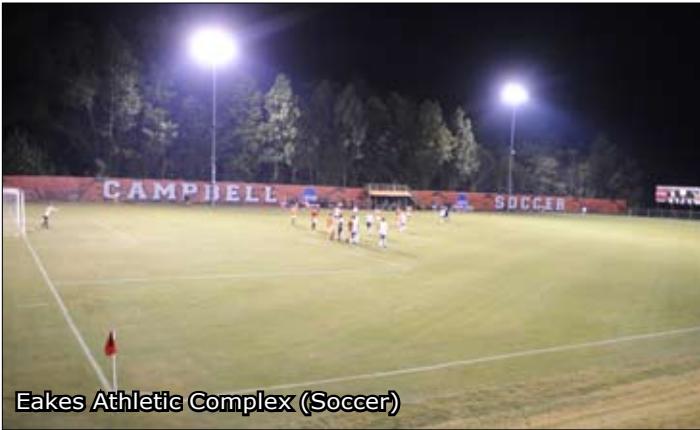

**The Fighting Camel**

Many stories exist as to the origin of the nickname "Fighting Camels" and the adoption of a camel as the mascot of Campbell University athletic teams. To date, there is still uncertainty as to why the unique mascot (only one other school in the United States -- and none in Division I -- has the nickname "Camels") was chosen.

According to historian J. Winston Pearce, author of "Campbell College, Big Miracle in Little Buies Creek," the nickname's origin perhaps stretches back to the turn of the century when all but one of the school's original buildings were destroyed by fire. In the aftermath, Z.T. Kivett visited the school's founder and president, Dr. James Archibald Campbell, at his residence.

As Dr. Campbell bemoaned the fate of the institution he had worked 13 years to build, Mr. Kivett encouraged him, "Your name's Campbell; then get a hump on you! We've got work to do." Dr. Campbell thought that Mr. Kivett said, "You're a camel, get a hump on you." Hence the nomadic nickname.

Campbell's athletic teams were originally named the "Hornets." Copies of Creek Pebbles, the school newspaper, in the 1920s and 1930s described the teams as "Hornets." Other references to the athletic teams were "The Campbells" or the "Campbellites."

Although an official date is unknown, the changing of the mascot to a camel came in late 1933 or early 1934. There is no explanation why the nickname was changed to Camels, only this one sentence was printed in the Jan. 13, 1934 issue of Creek Pebbles: "Eight new men were recently initiated into Campbell's monogram club, which has changed its name from 'Hornets' to 'Camels.'"

From that point on, all Campbell athletic teams have proudly worn the Camel mascot.

Founded in 1887, Campbell University is a private, coeducational institution of the liberal arts, sciences, and professions offering undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral degrees. The University is comprised of the College of Arts and Sciences, the Norman Adrian Wiggins School of Law, the Lundy-Fetterman School of Business, the School of Education, the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences and the Divinity School.

For nearly 125 years, Campbell University has been helping students build meaningful and successful futures. The university was ranked as one of the Best Regional Universities (South) by U.S. News & World Report in its America's Best Colleges 2011 edition and named one of the "100 Best College Buys" in the nation by Institutional Research & Evaluation, Inc. Campbell is also recognized as a Servicemembers Opportunity College.

**Location:** Set on over 1500 acres, Campbell maintains a beautiful, residential campus in the Cape Fear region of North Carolina. The University is located just 28 miles north of Fayetteville and 30 miles south of Raleigh, the capital city. Campbell also boasts campuses in the Research Triangle Park, Fort Bragg/Pope and Camp Lejeune. The Norman Adrian Wiggins School of Law moved to a new facility in Raleigh in the fall of 2009.

**Mission:** The mission of Campbell University is to graduate students with exemplary academic and professional skills who are prepared for purposeful lives and meaningful service. The University is informed and inspired by its Baptist heritage and three basic theological and biblical presuppositions: learning is appointed and conserved by God as essential to the fulfillment of human destiny; in Christ all things consist and find ultimate unity; and the Kingdom of God in this world is rooted and grounded in Christian community.

**Curriculum:** The University has over 100 undergraduate tracks and concentrations; as well as graduate and professional degree programs within the Norman Adrian Wiggins School of Law, College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, School of Education and Divinity School. Campbell University is also recognized as a North Carolina Teaching Fellows institution.

**Enrollment:** Each year, Campbell enrolls approximately 6,000 students representing diverse cultural, socioeconomic and religious backgrounds. On the main campus, approximately 3,000 undergraduates are enrolled with more than 1,500 students enrolled in master's programs or professional schools.

**Faculty/Student Ratio:** Campbell offers small class sizes and individual attention, with a faculty to student ratio of 1-to-18. Over 90 percent of faculty hold doctoral or terminal degrees.

**Athletics:** Campbell is a member of the NCAA Division I Big South Conference. Men's varsity sports include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis, track and field and wrestling. Women's sports include basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and field and volleyball. The Fighting Camels also compete in the Pioneer Football League, the Coastal Collegiate Swimming Association and as an associate member of the Southern Conference in wrestling.

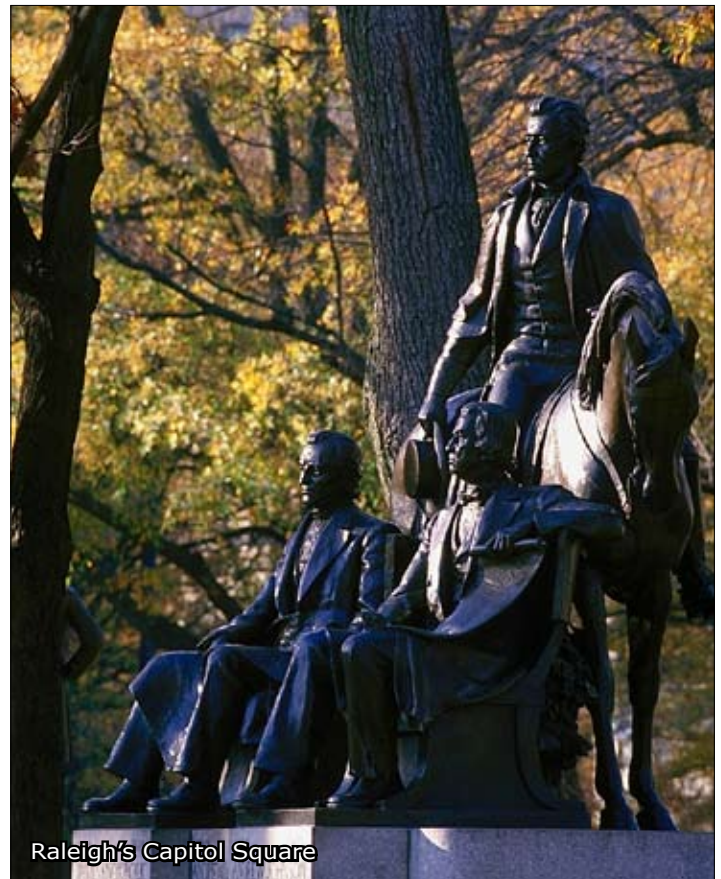

**pioneer**  
football league

The 2012 season marks the 20th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation’s only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference.

The PFL is one of only two conferences that sponsor football as its only sport (the Missouri Valley Football Conference being the other). However, the PFL is a truly national conference with members on each coast and throughout the nation’s heartland. The league still retains four of its charter members – Butler University, the University of Dayton, Drake University and Valparaiso University, plus the University of San Diego (joining in 1992) – which were joined in 2001 by Davidson College, Jacksonville University and Morehead State University. Campbell University joined the PFL in 2008, its first season of intercollegiate football. Marist College, which joined for the 2009 season, further extended the league’s footprint into the northeast.



In January 1991 the NCAA passed legislation to require Division I institutions to sponsor all intercollegiate sports at the Division I level. The five charter members (Evansville the fifth before dropping football in 1997), each dedicated to the enhancement and sound management of intercollegiate football as an integral part of the student-athletes’ collegiate experience, joined together to form the Pioneer Football League. From the league’s inception it has been a proponent of the creation of a non-scholarship football classification within Division I and adopted the moniker of Pioneer based on the intent to become the first league in that new division. The PFL’s original membership was comprised of NCAA Division I universities that previously sponsored intercollegiate football at other levels.

In recent years the league has attracted those institutions committed to the principles of the PFL model when beginning their football program, including Jacksonville which started its program in the non-scholarship mold in 1998 and Campbell which did so in 2008. In 2013, the league will expand its footprint in the southeast when Mercer University and Stetson University – which will both restart long dormant programs – join the league.

The PFL began play in 1993 with Dayton winning the league’s first crown. The league spent its first season in 1993 under the administrative guidance of the Midwestern Collegiate Conference and the office moved to St. Louis in 1994 when current commissioner Patty Viverito was named the PFL commissioner, a leadership position she continues to fill.

**Campbell Football On the Air**

For the sixth-straight year, Campbell University's flagship station is 107.3 WCLN-FM. WCLN's 92,000-watt signal reaches parts of 21 counties in southeastern North Carolina including all of Harnett, Cumberland, Johnston, and Sampson counties. The station's signal also covers a majority of Wake County, including a large portion of Raleigh.

In addition to the on-air signals at 107.3 WCLN-FM, audio and video coverage of Campbell Football games is also available online at GoCamels.com, the official web site of Campbell Athletics.

**Radio Broadcasts**

Football coverage on the Campbell University Radio Network will begin 30 minutes prior to the scheduled kickoff time with a comprehensive pregame show. The Bojangle's Tailgate Show includes a complete breakdown of the day's contest, interviews, and scores from around the Pioneer Football League and the nation.

Coverage continues well after the final whistle has blown. The Postgame Report features reaction from Coach Steele and selected players, final statistics from the game, highlights and other game scores.

**The Voice of the Camels**

Athletics Marketing Coordinator Chris Hemeyer is in his second year as the radio voice of Fighting Camel Football and Men's Basketball.

Hemeyer joined the Fighting Camel staff in 2011 from Kinston, NC, where he was Director of Broadcasting and Public Relations for the Kinston Indians, the Cleveland Indians affiliate in the Carolina (Class A) League. In his six years with the Indians, the radio network grew from one to four stations. He also produced and hosted a weekly television show, Tribe Talk, and spearheaded the All-Star Student Program, which reached more than 66,000 students in Eastern North Carolina.

In addition to Hemeyer's play-by-play work with the Indians, he also spent three seasons as the play-by-play voice for the first half of the East Carolina University baseball season. Hemeyer's basketball play-by-play experience includes fill-in work for East Carolina men's broadcasts. He has also been the voice of Lenoir Community College men's basketball.

His football experience includes television sideline reporting for East Carolina football games on MASN and Comcast Sports Southeast. Hemeyer was also the studio host for Ohio University football for radio broadcasts on the Ohio IMG Sports Network. Last season, Hemeyer hosted a post-game call-in show and weekly talk show for East Carolina football. Since 2006, Hemeyer has been the voice of high school football in Craven County, calling multiple state championship games.

Hemeyer arrived in North Carolina in 2001, spending five years at WCTI-TV (an ABC affiliate) in New Bern. He worked as a news and sports reporter, moving up to weekend sports anchor. He graduated from the University of Missouri in 1999.

In addition, the native of Columbia, Mo., oversees Campbell's web streaming video and audio program, the production of video content for GoCamels.com as well as producing marketing and promotional videos for the athletics department. Campbell produces live web streaming of home events in football, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, wrestling, baseball and softball.

Kim Graham, Associate A.D. for Operations at Campbell, joins the Campbell Radio Network for his first season as analyst. Graham

is no stranger to the radio booth, as he was the analyst for Liberty University Football on WRVL-FM from 1992-97.

A 1976 graduate of Georgetown (Ky.) College, where he was an NAIA All-America at wide receiver as a senior, Graham spent 11 seasons as an assistant coach at Liberty University (1978-88), where he coached the receivers, quarterbacks and also served as offensive coordinator. After serving as offensive coordinator at Sam Houston State in 1989, Graham returned to Lynchburg, Va., to start an 18-year tenure in athletics administration at Liberty.

Graham spent seven years as the Flames' Assistant A.D., then was promoted to Director of Athletics at Liberty in 1997 and served in that capacity through 2005. Graham is responsible for the daily operations of the Fighting Camel athletics department with emphasis in sport programming and support areas.

A member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA), Graham earned both his B.S. (1976) in physical education and M.A. (1978) in secondary education from Georgetown College. Graham and his wife, Andrea, have three sons - Chad, Travis and Cade - and a daughter, Brie.

Dr. Andy Bowman begins his second season with the Campbell University Radio Network. A Campbell Alum and Buies Creek resident, Dr. Bowman is the Director of Continuing Education and an Assistant Professor of Pharmacy Practice at Campbell. Bowman has mixed his pharmaceutical and broadcast background by hosting a monthly "Ask the Pharmacist" radio segment on WFNC 640AM in Fayetteville.

Prior to his return to Campbell in 2000, Bowman serving as a Pharmacy Coordinator with Kroger Pharmacy in Roanoke, Virginia and hosted a weekly show called "Ask Andy, The Kroger Radio Pharmacist" on WFIR 960AM.

In addition to his responsibilities in the classroom, Dr. Bowman serves as Director of Continuing Education for the College of Pharmacy, where he coordinates continuing education programs from pharmacists around the state of North Carolina and across the nation. He serves as the College of Pharmacy's liaison to the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy and is a member of the North Carolina Association of Pharmacists (NCAP). In the community, Bowman serves on the Board of Directors at Cape Fear Christian Academy in Erwin.

**Press Credentials**

Press credentials are limited to working members of the print and electronic media, as well as photographers and videographers. Photographers are restricted to designated areas of the field.

**Interview Policies**

The Campbell Media Services Department will attempt to arrange all reasonable requests for interviews with Fighting Camel head coach Dale Steele and team members. With respect to practice, study and personal time, a few guidelines should be followed.

**Player Interviews**

All interview requests with Campbell football players must be arranged through the media services office. Players are generally available for interviews immediately following practice sessions. If a media member desires to set up a telephone interview, this can be arranged.

**Post Game Interviews**

Following each home game, the visiting head coach and any requested players will be brought to the media interview room after a 10-minute cool-down period. Campbell head coach Dale Steele and players will follow in the interview room. The Campbell locker room is closed to all individuals with the exception of authorized team or university personnel.

**Road Interviews**

Interviews with Coach Steele or team members away from campus or contact outside of playing sites must be arranged through the media services department. Every attempt will be made to satisfy the interview request within reason.

**Home Game Services**

A full NCAA box score and play-by-play sheets will be distributed as soon as possible following the completion of each game. Stats are also provided to press row after each quarter, and after scoring plays.
