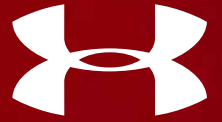

BARKER-LANE STADIUM and ED GORE FIELD



Opened in 2008, Barker-Lane Stadium and Ed Gore Field is home to the Campbell football and women's lacrosse teams. With the completion of the West stand in 2013, seating capacity now stands at 5500. Campbell hosted Birmingham-Southern on Aug. 30, 2008 in the inaugural game at the facility, attended by a standing-room crowd of 5,845 fans.

Barker-Lane Stadium was named for Bob Barker and Don Lane. Bob Barker, class of 1965, is chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of the Bob Barker Company, the industry's largest supplier of institutional products and supplies for correctional and rehabilitation facilities worldwide. The corporate office for the company is located in Fuquay-Varina, N.C. Dr. Don Lane is owner of Lane Family Dentistry, a full-service practice with over 20 locations across the state.

Ed Gore Field was named in honor of Edward M. Gore, a member of the class of 1952, during the spring of 2009. Dr. Gore was a highly successful real estate developer; his name is virtually synonymous with the prized coastal properties of Sunset Beach & Twin Lakes, Sea Trail Resort, and Ocean Ridge Plantation. He passed away in July 2014.

Ground-breaking ceremonies for the stadium were held Mar. 27, 2007 and construction was started by general contractor T.A. Loving. McMillan Smith & Partners served as architect.

Lights were added to the facility prior to the 2012 season, allowing the Camels more options for practice times, as well as greater flexibility for broadcasts and other sporting events. The four 110-foot poles, two on each side of the stadium, feature 42 each and 168 total fixtures, providing 100 foot candle on all portions of the playing field.

The West stand was completed in 2013 and includes 3,000 seats; with 867 chair back seats, plus bleacher back seating as well as new restroom and concession facilities.

Attendance has topped the 6,000 mark five times in the stadium's history, including a record 6,580 for the Camels' 2015 Homecoming matchup against Morehead State.

The W. Irvin Warren Athletic Center is named in honor of William Irvin Warren the Founder and President of Warren Oil Company, Inc. Warren Oil Company, with corporate offices located in Dunn, N.C., is the largest independent lubricants manufacturer in North America with pro-

duction locations in six states.

Inside the Warren Athletic Center is a multi-purpose room for gatherings and team meetings that may be sectioned into multiple rooms. Coaching staff offices and the coaches locker room, plus a conference room, video room and equipment room are also located within the building.

The Warren Center also houses an on-site athletic training room that includes whirlpool, ice machine and training tables. The home locker room features lockers for 120 football players, while the visitor locker room includes 80 lockers and can be sectioned into two separate rooms

Carlie C's IGA Hometown Proud Press Tower was completed in 2013 and is named in honor of Carlie C. and Joyce McLamb. Mr. and Mrs. McLamb opened their first grocery store in 1961. Over the years they expanded their business and today have 16 stores located in Harnett, Johnston, Cumberland, Wake, Durham and Wayne counties.

The press box is 80 feet high with elevator access to all floors. The building includes an executive level on the second floor just above the top row of bleachers and houses a central President's Suite with seating for 40. There are also two exterior patios on the north and south. The third floor houses a 3,800 square foot central press area with seating for 50, including home and visitor radio locations, an official box, and booths for both the visiting and home coaching staff.

In January 2015, the Burt Family Sports Performance Center opened. The nearly 6,000 square foot facility, located in the southeast corner of Barker-Lane Stadium, features 900 square feet of sport turf, 12 state-of-the-art custom Hammer Strength combo racks with inlaid Olympic lifting platforms, six glute hamstring developers and four Hammer Strength plate loaded machines. The training facility also includes two Pit Shark belt squat machines, custom iron grip dumbbells, custom plyometric jumping boxes and a comprehensive nutrition and hydration station.

The best game day experience in the PFL will be even better in 2016 with the installation of a state-of-the-art high-definition Daktronics video board just beyond the north endzone. The screen boasts a 24'-7 1/4" height and 42'-4" width.

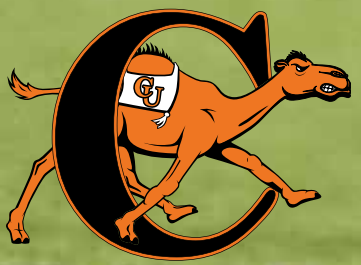

2016 PRESEASON Q&A with HEAD COACH MIKE MINTER

What do you lose when you have to replace more than 30 seniors on a team?

You lose the heart of that team. The heart of a team is its seniors. Now that they're gone, it leaves a void, and leadership has to come from somewhere else. You have to see who is going to have to create the identity of a football team. We have to have guys step up and do that now. The other thing is you have to fill a big hole in talent. Two of those seniors we lost are now in the National Football League. I've never had to worry about our long snapping because Danny Dillon was here. Now he's in Arizona. That position is a big part of a football team that a lot of people don't think about. You don't think about your pinkie until you don't have it anymore, right? That's how it is with a great long snapper. Then you have Greg Milhouse, Ugonna Awuruonye, Brandon Mobley and Nick Drew, among others that we lost. How do you replace that? Ben Bolling on the offensive side, who set nearly all of our receiving records in his career; now he's a coach, and he won't be on the field. So those are roles we have to replace, and you address that in the spring and in training

camp. These are just things you have to do when you lose over 30 seniors.

Last year's team lost six games by a combined 28 points, including five games by just 18 points in PFL play. How does that affect the 2016 team?

I think coming that close showed a lot of our returners that they can do it. We were so close in all of those games, and they know what they're working for now. Last year's team didn't truly know what they were working for because they didn't know what it was like to be in those situations. These guys have that experience, and they don't want to feel that pain again. That's what ignites people. Sometimes the motivating factor in life is pain. When you don't want to feel that anymore, then you're going to do whatever you have to do to not experience that again.

You coached a top-five defense in the country in 2015. What's the mentality of the 2016 version of this defense?

I think this defense wants to prove something. It's something about after great players leave, the guys that remain want to prove that it wasn't all about them. You look at the San Francisco 49ers when Bill Walsh left. They were bound and determined to win the Super Bowl again just to prove that it wasn't all about him. Or when you had Shaq and Kobe with the Lakers. When Shaq left, Kobe wanted to win another championship to prove that he could do it on his own. I think that's what our defense is feeling right now, and we're going to be a great defense without our Shaq and Bill Walsh.

Despite some vital losses on the defensive side, Campbell still returns some key contributors, like PFL Defensive Freshman of the Year Jack Ryan.

Jack is a great football player. When you think of a football player, he's that. His style reminds you a lot of Luke Kuechly, a rangy, fast guy that can get to the ball. He can diagnose plays and has great instincts. Jack will be a big piece in what we do. We also have a healthy Daniel Bostick, which we haven't had in a while. When he's healthy, he can thud you up, and he solidifies the linebacking corps. We talk a lot about Greg Milhouse, Ugonna Awuruonye and Brandon Mobley, but Jake Barr was a man that made a lot of plays for us in a lot of different situations, so that's a major role that we have to fill. Leading the way in the secondary is Carlos Merritt. He's a bigtime talent that can play at the next level. He's one year into it, so he'll be more comfortable in the system where he can use his talent even more. This defense is faster than the 2015 version. Last year's was bigger, but this one is fast.

You return most of your offense, especially on the line and at running back. What are the team's goals on the offensive side?

Last year our defense was No. 5 in the country, and our offense wants to join those ranks as well. We have a lot of talent and experience returning, and a lot of that will rest on the quarterback, which will be new. We have the best running back and the best offensive line in the conference. We also have Aaron Blockmon and Austin Fleming on the outside. Those guys can hurt you if you go man to man, and we'll have to take advantage of those matchups and situations.

How do special teams shape up?

Coach Duncan McLaurin has done a great job getting our special teams ready for the season after taking over that role. I'm excited about my kickers. Both of them return, so we have experience at those positions. No one is going to be afraid when the kicker goes out there. They know what is going to happen. The long snapper is where we don't have experience, but those guys are working and getting better every day.

How will incoming transfers impact the 2016 team?

Each one of these guys is going to play. All of them are big parts of what we're trying to do offensively and defensively. What I ask from transfers when they come in is to give me all that they have because they don't have a lot of time. To me, it's about the mental part of the game. These guys can play physically, but where are you at mentally? You don't transfer because you just want to transfer. Something happened to you to make you feel like you need to go somewhere else, so your confidence probably isn't as high as it should be. My job is to rebuild that. Once I get them to believe in themselves again, then the talent will take care of itself. Our players make everyone feel like they've been a part of this team for four years, and I make sure mentally they start to have confidence and belief in themselves again. Then, they just have to attack it.

What are some new names we can look for to have breakout seasons?

Dante Simmons has really developed at his position. I always thought he would be a corner, since I coached him in high

school, but we had him on offense early. He's really learned how to play corner at a high level. Scott Miller and Brandon Jones could make a big impact too. Brandon has been a receiver for us, but moved to linebacker this season and has been making a lot of plays. Those guys are football players, and Coach Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay has done a great job developing them at their position. Tony McWhite is another guy that you'll hear about this year.

Campbell already had the best game day experience in the PFL. What does this new video board add to that experience?

People get excited about this place. Our new video board is fantastic, the house is always packed, and teams love to play in this environment. Teams in our league don't get to play in this unless they come here. What Bob Roller and the athletic department have done has been truly amazing. Campbell is the experience that you want to have when you talk about FCS football. We have people from all over the region bring their families to Buies Creek to watch football. We have a great atmosphere and a great facility.

Preview the 2016 schedule for us.

This is a hard schedule, particularly in conference. We're playing all the top teams, plus dangerous teams like Stetson, who has a lot of talent, and Davidson, who is an in-state rival. Records don't matter at that point because they want to beat us and we want to beat them. Every week is a tough matchup in this league. Everyone is well-coached and no one is going to beat themselves. You have to execute at a high level to win these games. Our conference is tough, and we have to play tough every game to be successful.

Our nonconference schedule really prepares us for when we get into PFL play. We go from Bluefield in our opener to our first road game at Chowan, then step up to play Presbyterian, a Big South opponent, so you get a real test to see where you are with our nonconference schedule. If you're going to win a championship then you have to pay the price, so if we win the league with this schedule, then we deserve it.

What are you most looking forward to with this team?

How they handle adversity when it strikes. We talk about it all the time and they understand that it is going to come. They understand our definition of mental toughness too. How fast can we get back to center when you get knocked off of it? We've discussed that it's going to happen. Can you recognize the moment and get back? I'm looking forward to seeing that.

You're big on the mental aspect of this game. If you are around this team, you hear them say, "I will thrive in pressure situations," and "one team, one heartbeat." What do those words mean to this team?

It's like Paul said to the Philippians; he said to think on these things. Whatever is true, and honorable, and right, and pure, and lovely. That means don't think on these negative things, think about the good. That's what God tells us to do. Focus on the positives. That's what everything is about. You do thrive in pressure situations and you have to tell yourself that. You will thrive in every situation. That doesn't mean you're going to win every time, but if you tell yourself who you are long enough, you're going to believe it, and you will act the way you say you are. This is why we do it. It's not about anything else. We're going to tell ourselves who we are. We thrive in pressure situations. We are one team with one heartbeat. We will be mentally tough. We will have team discipline. We will do our job. You can ask any member of this team what we're about and they will be able to tell you. In the fourth quarter when tensions are high they believe because this is what we do. If you look at all the great teams, they believed they were great first, and then acted on it.

PRESEASON NOTEBOOK

JONES, STRYFFELER, O'BRIANT NAMED PRESEASON ALL-PFL

Campbell running back De'Shawn Jones, as well as offensive linemen Brian Stryffeler and Laurin O'Briant have been named to the 2016 Preseason All-Pioneer Football League team.

Jones, who enters his senior season in 2016, topped the PFL in rushing with 1,072 yards, adding eight touchdowns a year ago, when he ran for 100-plus yards four times on the way to First Team All-PFL honors. The junior, who is already Campbell's all-time rushing leader (1,991), reset his own CU single game school record with 201 yards in a three TD performance at Davidson.

In his first season at Campbell after transferring from Wingate, Stryffeler earned Second Team All-PFL honors on the offensive line. O'Briant, meanwhile, picked up an honorable mention all-conference nod. Both started all 11 games for the Camels and helped Campbell record more than 350 yards of total offense seven times this season, leading the PFL in rushing offense (1,956).

CAMELS PICKED FIFTH IN PFL PRESEASON POLL

Campbell has been voted fifth in the 2016 Pioneer Football League preseason coaches' poll. San Diego was picked to win the league's regular season race for the sixth-consecutive year.

San Diego, which shared the 2015 regular-season title with Dayton, was followed by the Flyers in polling. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available first-place votes. Coaches could not vote for their own team.

A group of six teams – separated by only 15 points – were bunched behind the lead duo. Drake was picked third, followed closely by Morehead State and Campbell. Marist was picked sixth and was followed by Butler and Jacksonville. Stetson was given a ninth-place nod with Valparaiso and Davidson rounding out the preseason poll.

FORMER CAMELS BEGIN 2016 NFL TRAINING CAMPS

Former Campbell standouts Greg Milhouse, Jr. and Daniel Dillon began their first training camps in the National Football League. The pair became the first Camels to ever sign with NFL franchises following the draft in April.

Milhouse, now with the New York Giants, was a two-time All-PFL defensive lineman, including a First Team selection in 2015. He recorded 49 total tackles with 12.5 tackles for loss and 5.0

sacks this season, posting at least one tackle for loss in 10 of 11 games.

Milhouse was a participant in the 2016 NFLPA Collegiate Bowl in Carson, Calif. and ranks among Campbell's career top-10 in sacks (7.5, seventh) and tackles for loss (17.5, fifth) after just two seasons, transferring from Appalachian State.

The defensive tackle helped the Camels rank fifth in the nation in total defense in 2015 (279.3 per game), standing third in team sacks per game (3.55) and ninth in scoring defense (17.7). The team shattered program records for all three categories, adding single season marks for tackles for loss (85.0) and total sacks (38.0).

Dillon, a member of the Arizona Cardinals, was Campbell's starting long snapper for the last four seasons, seeing action in 43 career games. He added seven tackles, forcing a fumble in 2013.

PREVIEWING THE 2016 CAMELS

Campbell returns seven offensive and five defensive starters, as well as 32 total letterwinners from 2015.

The Camels ranked fifth in the nation in total defense in 2015 (279.3 per game), standing third in team sacks per game (3.55) and ninth in scoring defense (17.7). The team shattered program records for all three categories, adding single season marks for tackles for loss (85.0) and total sacks (38.0).

Running back De'Shawn Jones, the PFL's leading rusher in 2015, as well as offensive linemen Brian Stryffeler and Laurin O'Briant were named to the 2016 Preseason All-PFL team last week. Red-shirt sophomore linebacker Jack Ryan also returns after being named the PFL's Freshman Defensive Player of the Year in 2015.

BARKER-LANE STADIUM 16TH IN FCS RANKINGS

Campbell's Barker-Lane Stadium has again been ranked among the best in FCS College Football.

Stadium Journey rated the home of the Camels No. 16 of 125 FCS stadiums.

Barker-Lane Stadium, the home of the Camels' football program since its re-launch in 2008, received a sizable facelift prior to the 2013 season, adding a new grandstand and two-level press box. The Burt Family Sports Performance Center was added to the stadium following the 2014 season.

Stadium Journey raved Campbell's Barker-Lane Stadium as "FCS football at its finest" in the review. The 5,500 seat venue is the highest-ranked Pioneer Football League facility, topping Butler's "Butler Bowl" at No. 28. Barker-Lane Stadium was also tabbed best among FCS stadiums in North Carolina.

Barker-Lane Stadium hosted a venue record 6,580 at CU's 2015 Homecoming game against Morehead State.

The best game day atmosphere in the Pioneer Football League is getting even better thanks to the installation of a new video board. The latest improvement at the facility is a state-of-the-art Daktronics video board that dominates the landscape at the North end of the facility. The new display measures 24 feet high by 42 feet wide with a 15HD pixel layout to provide excellent image clarity and contrast at wide viewing angles for the best view from any seat within the stadium.

Capable of variable content zoning, the display can show one large image or it can be divided into multiple windows to show any combination of live video, instant replays, game statistics and information, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.

Former Carolina Panthers standout and Nebraska Football Hall of Famer Mike Minter heads into his fourth season as head football coach at Campbell University in 2016.

The Camels ranked fifth in the nation in total defense in 2015 (279.3 per game), standing third in team sacks per game (3.55) and ninth in scoring defense (17.7). The team shattered program records for all three categories, adding single season marks for tackles for loss (85.0) and total sacks (38.0).

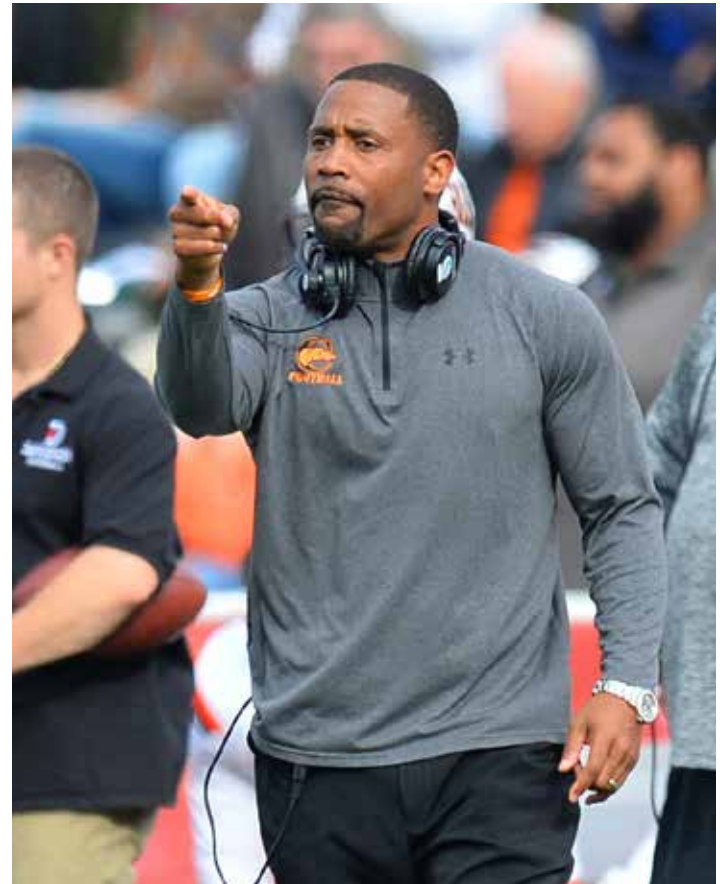
16 Camels were honored on the conference's All-PFL teams following the 2015 season, with junior running back De'Shawn Jones, redshirt senior defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye and senior defensive lineman Greg Milhouse Jr. all receiving First Team All-PFL accolades.

The PFL 2015 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year went to Campbell's Jack Ryan. Four Camels were also named to the 2015 Academic All-PFL teams.

The offseason saw another Campbell first, with defensive tackle Greg Milhouse Jr. (New York Giants) and long snapper Danny Dillon (Arizona Cardinals) both signing NFL contracts.

2014 saw the Camels notch their second-most total and conference wins at 5-7 overall and 4-4 in PFL play. A school record seven Camels, plus eight honorable mentions, were named to the 2014 All-Pioneer Football League teams, including four first teamers. Eight CU student-athletes, with six first team members, were tabbed PFL All-Academic.

In Minter's first season as head coach at CU, the Camels set 21



offensive team records, including rushing yards (2,800), passing yards (2,436), and total offense (5,236). The Camels also established four defensive marks, including sacks (27), and posted three team records on special teams.

Senior Kurt Odom became Campbell's first football All-America selection, earning Third Team honors from the Sports Network. Odom was also named First Team All-PFL while seven Camels took home honorable mention nods.

In May 2014, CU quarterback Brian Hudson signed a contract with the Canadian Football League's Calgary Stampeders.





The quarterback from Stafford, Va. played his lone season at Campbell in 2013 after transferring from Liberty. Hudson set Campbell single-season records for rushing yards, rushing attempts, pass completions, passing yards, passing touchdowns, passing yards per game, total offense and all-purpose yards, earning Honorable Mention All-PFL accolades.

Minter picked up his first win as a collegiate head coach in his home debut as the Camels cruised to a 56-21 triumph over UVA-Wise.

Minter, a member of two national championship teams at Nebraska and the Panthers' 2003 Super Bowl squad, joined the Fighting Camel program after serving as assistant coach at Liberty University in 2012 and Johnson C. Smith University in 2011. He also brought head coaching experience from First Assembly Christian School in Concord, where he guided his teams to 33 victories and two state titles in three seasons.

During his 10-year NFL career, Minter earned a starting safety role six games into his rookie year in 1997, and held that position until he retired after the 2006 season. A second-round draft choice, he helped lead the Panthers to three playoff trips, the 2003 NFC Championship and a berth in Super Bowl XXXVII.

In the Super Bowl against the New England Patriots, Minter suffered a broken left foot in the third quarter, but remained in the game and collected a career-high 18 tackles. At the time of his retirement, he held Panthers franchise records for starts (141), consecutive starts (94), fumble recoveries (11) and interceptions returned for touchdowns (4).

At Liberty, Minter worked as special teams coordinator/assistant defensive coach under head coach Turner Gill. He mentored three 2012 Big South all-conference performers in long snapper Richard Wright, place kicker John Lunsford and punter Grant Bowden.

Liberty finished the regular season ranked No. 4 in the country in kickoff return yardage defense, allowing only 14.04 yards per return. The Flames also finished 38th nationally in kickoff returns (21.3 yards).

In addition to his on-field coaching responsibilities at Liberty, Minter was involved in many aspects of the Flames operation. He helped run the scout team in practice, served as liaison with the athletic training and weight room staffs, and reviewed team members' academic achievement weekly with the Associate A.D. for Academic Affairs.

His primary recruiting territories focused on North Carolina, South Carolina, Oklahoma, Kansas, Nebraska and Colorado.

During his time at Johnson C. Smith, Minter helped the Golden Bulls dramatically improve in many phases of the game. Under his guidance as assistant head coach, defensive passing game coordinator and special teams coordinator, JCSU ranked fifth in the nation in punt return yardage in 2011.

The Golden Bulls also finished the season with 24 turnovers caused (which tripled the previous year's total) and won Pioneer Bowl XIII 35-33 over Miles College for the program's first-ever bowl victory.

Minter was a two-time national champion at Nebraska (1994 and 1995) where he played linebacker, free safety and strong safety for the Cornhuskers. He was a three-time all-conference performer and was inducted into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame in 2006. He graduated in 1997 with a Bachelor of Science degree in engineering.

Born Jan. 15, 1974, in Cleveland, Ohio, Minter led the State of Oklahoma in rushing yards (1,589) as a senior at Lawton High School in 1991. He was an all-state performer, National Honor Society member and also averaged 21 points per game on the Lawton basketball team.

In addition to playing and coaching football, Minter is CEO of Minter Enterprises, a multi-faceted business impacting real estate development, general contracting and construction, business consultation, publishing, public speaking engagements and a non-profit organization focused on youth development.

Minter and his wife Kim have four children – Michael Jr., Isaiah, McKenna and Brianna.

Landon Mariani begins his 10th year at Campbell and fourth as offensive coordinator.

In his three seasons as offensive coordinator, Mariani has orchestrated the top three passing seasons in Campbell history, throwing for more than 2,000 yards in each. Mariani also coached quarterbacks for each of the program's nine seasons.

Campbell led the PFL in rushing in 2015 with 1,956 yards, led by First Team All-PFL performer De'Shawn Jones. Jones, who enters his senior season in 2016, topped the PFL in rushing with 1,072 yards, adding eight touchdowns a year ago, when he ran for 100-plus yards four times. Jones, who is already Campbell's all-time rushing leader (1,991), reset his own CU single game school record with 201 yards in a three TD performance at Davidson.

Jones was one of seven Camels named All-PFL, with senior fullback Dalton Dillon and redshirt sophomore Brian Stryffeler both taking second team honors.

Aaron Blockmon (WR), Austin Fleming (TE), Josh Hutto (OL) and Laurin O'Briant (OL) also earned honorable mention nods.

In his first season as the Camels' offensive coordinator, the program set 21 offensive team records, including rushing yards (2,800), passing yards (2,436), and total offense (5,236).

Senior Kurt Odom became Campbell's first football All-America selection, earning Third Team honors from the Sports Network. Odom was also named First Team All-PFL while seven Camels took home honorable mention nods, including three on the offensive unit.

In May 2014, CU quarterback Brian Hudson signed a contract with the Canadian Football League's Calgary Stampeders.

The quarterback from Stafford, Va. played his lone season at Campbell in 2013 after transferring from Liberty. Hudson set Campbell single-season records for rushing yards, rushing attempts, pass completions, passing yards, passing touchdowns, passing yards per game, total offense and all-purpose yards, earning Honorable Mention All-PFL accolades.

Hudson ranked sixth in the PFL in rushing and total offense, setting a school for rushing yards by a quarterback with 168 against Morehead State, and posting Campbell's longest run from scrimmage, 80 yards, against Jacksonville. The PFL Academic Honor Roll member also recorded 340 yards passing against Marist and 33 completions against Mercer, both school records.

Hudson became Campbell's second football player to sign a professional contract, following quarterback Daniel Polk, who played for the Stuttgart Scorpions in Germany in 2011.

In 2014, Mariani coached a record number of All-PFL selections for the Camels, including Will Sawyer (first team offensive line), Dalton Dillon (first team fullback), Jabri Ridenhour (honorable mention wide receiver), Dalton Brown (honorable mention offensive line), Josh Hutto (honorable mention offensive line) and Dakota Wolf (honorable mention quarterback).

Dalton Dillon, Will Sawyer, Hunter Somerville and Dakota Wolf were all named First Team Academic All-PFL, while Ben Bolling was named to the Second Team.

Under Mariani's guidance, Dakota Wolf ended his career as Campbell's all-time leader in rushing touchdowns, pass attempts, pass completions, yards of total offense, touchdowns responsible for and total touchdowns scored following the 2014 season.

Mariani was elevated to offensive coordinator in December of 2012 after serving as the program's passing game and special teams coordinator for five years.

In 2012, Mariani's quarterbacks set program records both through the air and on the ground. Dakota Wolf led the team in rushing with 617 yards, setting a new school quarterback record and ranking third on the all-time list. Braden Smith also produced Campbell's first 300-plus yard passing game, throwing for a CU record 336 yards in the team's season opener.

A former player and coach at the University of North Carolina, Mariani's passing game posted a banner year in 2011, setting modern day program records in passing yards, completions, attempts, touchdowns, completions percentage, pass efficiency and passing yards per game.

In his first season under center, Braden Smith set single season school records for yards passing, completions, attempts and touchdown passes, earning a pair of Pioneer Football League Player of the Week accolades in 2011.

The first of Smith's back to back weekly league honors came after Campbell defeated San Diego 48-24 behind his four touchdowns. Smith rushed for three scores, also accounting for one through the air as the Rockwall, Texas native converted 16 pass attempts.

Smith's second PFL Player of the Week honor came after Campbell's triple overtime thriller at Davidson, with the signal caller leading the Camels back from a 17-3 four quarter deficit. Smith led the Camels to a pair of scoring drives late in regulation before scoring again in the third overtime.

Mariani's work with the CU quarterbacks also played major dividends in 2010. Daniel Polk led the team and ranked third in the conference with 12 rushing scores. Polk also threw for eight more touchdowns, totaled 558 rushing yards and passed for 1,263 yards. He became the first CU player to top 1,800 yards in total offense in consecutive seasons. Overall, the Campbell quarterbacks completed 126 passes for 1,263 yards and eight scores. The position also ran for 604 yards and 12 touchdowns in Campbell's dual threat offense.

Mariani's quarterbacks completed 137 passes for 1,674 yards and threw nine touchdown passes on the 2009 season for the Fighting Camels. CU quarterbacks also accounted for over 500 yards rushing and another four scores on the ground. The Campbell passing attack set a school record with 283 passing yards against Methodist. Matt Vollono set a new Campbell individual record with four passing scores. Among his four passing touchdowns was a school-record 85 yard pass to Carl Blain.

Mariani joined the Camels after two seasons at Coastal Carolina where he coached the tight ends and assisted with video coordination. During his final season with the Chanticleers he coached tight end Rodney Burgess to First Team All-Big South honors after an 18 catch, 300 yard season. Burgess was also selected to The State's South Carolina All-State Team and was an Honorable Mention All-American selection by Don Hansen's Football Gazette in his final campaign under Mariani's tutelage. Coastal won two Big South Championships during Mariani's tenure and earned a spot in the NCAA FCS Playoffs in 2006.

Prior to his two years at Coastal, Mariani spend one year at his alma mater as the offensive video assistant. A 2004 graduate of North Carolina, Mariani was a quarterback for four seasons with the Tar Heels, including the 2001 squad that defeated Auburn in the Peach Bowl. Mariani was the Tar Heels' signal caller his final three seasons and after walking on to the team he was awarded a scholarship his senior year. Mariani was also named one of the game captains on Senior Day against Duke.

A three-sport standout at Freedom High School in Morganton, N.C., Mariani earned his bachelor's degree in exercise and sport science from UNC in 2004.

Mariani is married to the former Katie Finnigan of Raleigh, N.C. The couple resides in Fuquay-Varina, N.C. and have a daughter, Elle, and a son, Finn.

Craig Cox begins his fourth season at Campbell as the Fighting Camels' defensive coordinator, and first as assistant head coach.

Cox was named assistant head coach following the 2015 season that saw his defense ranked fifth in the nation, yielding just 279.3 yards per game. Among FCS programs, Campbell also stood third in team sacks per game (3.55) and ninth in scoring defense (17.7). The team shattered program records for all three categories, adding single season marks for tackles for loss (85.0) and total sacks (38.0).

Seven members of Cox's defense were named All-PFL in 2015, including linemen Greg Milhouse and Ugonna Awuruonye, who garnered First Team honors.

Linebacker Jake Barr was named second team all-conference, while Chris Beaty (DB), Rogers Clark (DL), Brandon Mobley (DB) and Jack Ryan (LB) all picked up honorable mentions. Ryan was also named the PFL Defensive Freshman of the Year.

Following the season, Milhouse, along with long snapper Danny Dillon, became the first Camels to sign with NFL franchises. Milhouse inked a contract with the New York Giants, while Dillon signed with the Arizona Cardinals.

Cox, creator of the 3-Digit Defense, brings nearly two decades of coaching experience to the CU program, including eight seasons as a defensive coordinator and two as a head coach.

In 2014, the Campbell defense set program records for interception return touchdowns, interception return yards, pass breakups and quarterback hurries, while improving the Camels' production in total interceptions and tackles.

Defensive end Ugonna Awuruonye was named First Team All-PFL, while Greg Milhouse (defensive line) and Andrew Yost (linebacker) were both named to the league's second team.

Four more Camels on the defensive side received honorable mention nods, including senior linebacker Luke Hill, senior cornerback Isaiah Howard, junior defensive back Brandon Mobley and redshirt senior defensive lineman Isaac Scott.

Awuruonye tied the CU single season sacks record at 7.5 and recorded double digit tackles for loss for the second year in a row, while Yost came just three tackles from the single season stops mark.

Yost was also named Second Team Academic All-PFL, while Lucas Smith earned first team honors, in addition to CoSIDA Academic All-District and FCS Athletic Directors Association Academic All-Star Team accolades.

In his first season as defensive coordinator at Campbell, Cox guided the Camel defense to improvements in total offense, points per game, rushing yards per game and passing yards per game. Those strides included improvements of 62.3 yards of total offense and 54.7 yards rushing fewer per game.

Two Camels on the defensive side, linebacker Matt Farris and defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye, were named honorable mention All-PFL.

Farris led Campbell in tackles and finished 21st in the PFL with

77. The redshirt junior added 4.5 tackles for loss, a sack, an interception and a forced fumble, tying a school record with 14 tackles against Charleston Southern. Farris added two tackles for loss with a sack against PFL co-champion Marist and intercepted a pass in Campbell's win over UVA.-Wise.

Awuruonye, meanwhile, tallied a school record for most yards from tackles for loss (83) and picked up the second most tackles for loss (14.0) and sacks (7.0) in a single season despite only playing in eight games. The redshirt sophomore led the PFL in tackle for loss and stops by a defensive lineman, while ranking eighth in sacks in conference games.

Prior to Campbell, he spent four seasons on staff at Johnson C. Smith University, where he served as the Golden Bulls' defensive coordinator and associate head coach from 2011-12.

After taking over as coordinator, Cox helped Johnson C. Smith collect back to back winning season for the first time in forty years, while securing the school's first postseason victory in the 2011 Pioneer Bowl.

Under Cox, the Golden Bulls improved an average of 63 spots in the NCAA Division II rankings, marking the second biggest improvement in all of Division II.

Prior to his role as defensive coordinator, Cox served as Johnson C. Smith's defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator from 2009-10.

From December 2005 until 2008, Cox worked as the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Division II Virginia Union in Richmond, Va. for two seasons, piloting a defense that ranked in the nation's top-five in total defense, passing defense and passing efficiency defense. The Panthers also ranked second in the country in red zone defense.

Cox also served as VUU's recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach from 2005-07.

As recruiting coordinator, he increased the VUU Panthers' roster from 60 student-athletes to over 100 student-athletes without additional athletic scholarship funds. In 2005, Cox joined the Golden Bulls coaching staff as the defensive line coach and assistant recruiting coordinator. He was responsible for generating a defensive playbook, game plans, and scouting reports.

Cox served as the defensive line coach (2001-02) and running backs coach (2003-04), as well as recruiting coordinator at Livingstone College from 2001-05.

He was a head coach and defensive coordinator for the King George Kodiaks, a semi-professional football team in King George, Va., from 1998-2000. Cox took over an organization that had only won two games in two years and produced back-to-back 6-4 records and two playoff berths. During his time as defensive coordinator, the Kodiaks only allowed an average of 170 total yards per game over two years.

In 1990 and 1994, Cox was an assistant coach at Culpeper County High School in Culpeper, Va. Cox has attended training at the Washington Redskins and Carolina Panthers camps (Sports International). He has also been a member of the North Carolina Football Coaches Association.

Cox earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from Livingstone College and has four children: Jessica, Terrence, Craig Jr. and Jada.

Kevin Thompson enters his fourth season as Campbell's offensive line coach.

Over the last three seasons, Thompson has built Campbell's offensive line to the top of the PFL. Campbell led the PFL in rushing in 2015 with 1,956 yards, with Thompson's offensive line paving the way for the league's leading rusher, First Team All-PFL running back De'Shawn Jones.

Three members of the offensive line were named all-conference, with redshirt sophomore Brian Stryffeler leading the way with second team honors. Josh Hutto and Laurin O'Briant also earned honorable mention nods for the Camels.

In addition to the team's success on the ground, Campbell's last three seasons have been the best in the program's passing history, throwing for more than 2,000 yards in each.

In 2014, Thompson coached three Campbell offensive linemen to All-PFL selections, including First Team member Will Sawyer at left guard. Senior center Dalton Brown and freshman right tackle Josh Hutto were also honorable mentions.

In his first season as the Camels' offensive line coach, the program set 21 offensive team records, including rushing yards (2,800), passing yards (2,436), and total offense (5,236).

Center Dalton Brown and left guard Will Sawyer also picked up honorable mention nods on the offensive line for the Camels, helping Campbell rank second in the PFL in rushing offense at 233.2 yards per game. The Camels ran for more than 200 yards five times in 2013, including a school record 513 in a win over UVa.-Wise. CU also passed for more than 275 yards four times.

Thompson, a 20 year coaching veteran throughout the Southeast, came to Buies Creek after spending four seasons at Johnson C. Smith University, where he served as associate head coach and offensive line coach, while also handling the Golden Bulls' equipment duties.

Over his final two seasons at Johnson C. Smith, Thompson helped guide the Bulls to back to back winning records for the first time in 40 years. The team also concluded the season on a four-game winning streak, its longest since 1996.

Behind Thompson's line, quarterback Keahn Wallace set the mark for most passing yards in a single-season at JCSU with 2,280, and Dedrick Anderson became the Golden Bulls' first 1,000-yard rusher since 1991.

During the Golden Bulls' Pioneer Bowl championship run in 2011, Thompson constructed an offensive line that allowed JCSU to total 3,881 yards of offense. His o-line also protected quarterback Keahn Wallace, who produced 2,005 yards through the air and a record 473 yards on the ground.

Thompson began coaching at his alma mater, Savannah State University. As a player, Thompson's offensive unit paved the way for both of SSU's all-time leading rushers. In 1992, his team made the NCAA Division II playoffs and was ranked eighth in the country. That same year saw Thompson gain honorable mention accolades from the SIAC. Thompson earned second team honors on the 1994 All-SIAC list.

Thompson began coaching at SSU in 1995 as a student assistant and took over the Tigers offensive line in 1996. From SSU, Thompson followed his old coach Bill Davis to JCSU. Under Thompson's tutelage, the offensive line at JCSU led the way for the CIAA Offensive Player of the Year and leading rusher in 2000.

Thompson moved on to Livingstone College in 2003. While at Livingstone, his offensive line opened holes for the conference all-purpose yard getter in 2004, giving up only 10 sacks the entire season. Thompson would also send one of his linemen to the All-CIAA ranks both years at Livingstone.

In 2005, Thompson joined the coaching staff at Florida A&M University. While at FAMU, his o-line led the way for the 2005 leading rusher in the MEAC. In 2007, his line would make way for the Offensive Rookie of the Year who was second in the MEAC in rushing.

After leaving FAMU, Thompson became the offensive line coach at Lane College before returning to JCSU.

Adam Morris enters his fourth year at Campbell, guiding the Camels' wide receivers and serving as recruiting coordinator.

Over his three seasons at Campbell, Morris has guided Campbell receivers to the school's top-three team single-season totals in receiving yards and receiving touchdowns. The team set records for completions (205), receiving yards (2,436) and receiving touchdowns (18).

Redshirt freshman Aaron Blockmon was named honorable mention All-PFL in 2015, setting Campbell freshman records for receiving yards (453) and receiving touchdowns (5). Blockmon's 453 receiving yards is the fourth-most by a Camel overall in a single-season, while his five TD catches tied a CU record.

Following the 2015 season, he was also accepted in the NCAA and NFL Coaches Academy, which provides current, full-time intercollegiate football coaches at NCAA member institutions, some who are former NFL athletes, to expand their knowledge and insight into the world of intercollegiate football coaching.

In 2014, Morris coached All-PFL honorable mention Jabri Ridenhour, who set a Campbell single season record with 497 yards, also becoming the second Camel to reach the 40 reception mark in a year.

Morris' 2014 group racked up the second most receiving yards, receptions, reception touchdowns and receptions per game in Campbell's modern history.

In addition to his second 400-plus yard receiving season, Ben Bolling was named Second Team Academic All-PFL.

In his first season with the Camels, Morris' wide outs helped Campbell set 21 offensive records total, including passing yards (2,436) and total offense (5,236). Bolling set a Campbell single-season receiving yards record with 495 in 2013, also tying the single-season receiving touchdowns mark with five.

For the first time in program history, four Camels hauled in 300 or more yards on the season with Jabri Ridenhour (385), Kurt Odom (370) and Jordan Hildreth (343) joining Bolling.

Morris came to Campbell after spending the 2012 season as an offensive quality control coach at Big South member Liberty along with now CU head coach Mike Minter.

Alongside Minter, Morris helped the Flames win six of its last seven games, finishing the season in a three-way tie for first place with Stony Brook and Coastal Carolina in the conference standings, with each program posting a 5-1 record in Big South play.

Liberty capped off its 2012 home slate with a 28-14 victory over No. 6/8 Stony Brook on Nov. 10, marking the highest ranked opponent the Flames have defeated in program history. 13 Flames went on to earn All-Big South honors.

Morris was one of six former Kansas football staff members to follow Turner Gill to Liberty from Lawrence, Kan. During his two seasons with the Jayhawks, Morris served the program as quality control coordinator for Kansas' special teams in 2010 and defensive quality control in 2011.

Morris first worked under Gill on staff at Buffalo as special teams and offensive intern for the Bulls in 2009. Additionally, he worked with Buffalo's special teams and assisted with wide receivers on offense.

Prior to his collegiate working experiences, Morris spent one year working as an intern for the NFL's Buffalo Bills. His areas of focus while with the AFC team were training camp operations, pro personnel and coaching/football operations.

Morris got his start in the collegiate ranks at his alma mater, Ithaca, where he served as assistant director of football operations and offensive quality control staff member.

He resides in Fuquay-Varina with his wife, Carson.

D.J. Summers begins his fourth year at Campbell as the Camels' running backs coach.

Campbell led the PFL in rushing in 2015 with 1,956 yards, led by First Team All-PFL running back De'Shawn Jones. Jones, who enters his senior season in 2016, topped the PFL in rushing with 1,072 yards, adding eight touchdowns. He ran for 100-plus yards four times.

Jones, who is already Campbell's all-time rushing leader (1,991), reset his own CU single game school record with 201 yards in a three TD performance at Davidson.

In addition to Jones' All-PFL accolades, senior fullback Dalton Dillon was named all-conference for the third time, earning second team honors. Dillon posted 137 yards rushing with a touchdown, as well as 21 yards receiving on the year. Dillon became the second Camel to be named First or Second Team All-PFL three times, joining former offensive lineman Sam Issermoyer (2009-11).

In 2014, Dalton Dillon was named First Team All-PFL at fullback, also earning First Team Academic All-PFL status.

Summers guided the Camels to their second consecutive 2,000-plus yard rushing season, paced by De'Shawn Jones and Keith Goss' combined 771 yards on the ground.

In his first season in Buies Creek, Summers guided senior Kurt Odom to an All-America selection, Campbell's first in program history, earning Third Team honors from the Sports Network. Odom was also named First Team All-PFL.

The Camels set 21 offensive team records in 2013, including rushing yards (2,800) and total offense (5,236).

The then freshman duo of Keith Goss and De'Shawn Jones, meanwhile, combined for 980 yards and seven touchdowns on the ground.

Summers coached at his alma mater, Catawba College, for 11 seasons before making the move to Campbell, guiding the Indians' wide receivers. Summers duties also included coordinating the passing game and recruiting, as well as being the pro liaison.

In 2008, Summers tutored single-season rushing record breaker Jamelle Cuthberston. In 2007, he coached two All-SAC running backs in Kory Fisher and George Bell. His group of backs broke the school record for rushing yards in a single season with 2,616 yards and 41 TD's.

Prior to his return to Catawba, Summers coached wide outs at West Iredell High School. He began his coaching career at Polk County High School in 1997. He coached the receivers and defensive backs at Polk County from 1997-01 and also served as basketball coach.

Summers was a four-year performer at Catawba, earning All-SAC honors in 1995 and 1996. During his four years, Summers totaled 68 receptions for 1,284 yards and caught 15 touchdown passes. He stands 17th among Catawba's all-time receiving leaders and is second in career yards per catch at 18.9 per reception. He graduated in 1997 with a degree in physical education.

In high school, at West Iredell, Summers started all four seasons and earned a spot in the East-West All-Star Game. As a wide receiver, quarterback and defensive back, he was a two-time all-conference performer and was team MVP as a senior.

Damien Adams enters his fourth season at Campbell, instructing the defensive line.

Adams has coached the CU defensive line into the most vaunted in the Pioneer Football League, helping the Camels pile up 84 sacks and 203 total tackles for loss in just three seasons.

In 2015, Adams' front line helped the CU defense rank fifth in the nation in total defense, holding opponents to just 279.3 yards per game. Among FCS programs, Campbell also stood third in team sacks per game (3.55) and ninth in scoring defense (17.7). The team shattered program records for all three categories, adding single season marks for tackles for loss (85.0) and total sacks (38.0).

Greg Milhouse and Ugonna Awuruonye both garnered First Team All-PFL accolades, while Rogers Clark was named to the honorable mention list.

Following the season, Milhouse, along with long snapper Danny Dillon, became the first Camels to sign with NFL franchises. Milhouse inked a contract with the New York Giants, while Dillon signed with the Arizona Cardinals.

Both Ugonna Awuruonye and Greg Milhouse were named All-PFL in 2014, with Awuruonye taking first and Milhouse earning second team honors. Isaac Scott was also named an All-PFL honorable mention. Additionally, Lucas Smith earned First Team Academic All-PFL honors, in addition to CoSIDA Academic All-District and FCS ADA Academic All-Star Team accolades.

Awuruonye tied the CU single season sacks record at 7.5 and recorded double digit tackles for loss for the second year in a row, while Yost came just three tackles from the single season stops mark.

In 2013, his first season at CU, Adams helped the Camel defense to improvements in total offense, points per game, rushing yards per game and passing yards per game. Those strides included improvements of 62.3 yards of total offense and 54.7 yards rushing fewer per game. The team also set a new record for sacks with 27 on the year. Awuruonye was also named honorable mention All-PFL.

Awuruonye tallied a school record for most yards from tackles for loss (83) and picked up the second most tackles for loss (14.0) and sacks (7.0) in a single season despite only playing in eight games. The redshirt sophomore led the PFL in tackle for loss and stops by a defensive lineman, while ranking eighth in sacks in conference games.

Adams came to CU after serving in the same capacity at nearby Fayetteville State University, his alma mater, for five seasons. Under his direction, the FSU defensive line has routinely become one of the top units in the CIAA. During his first season with the Broncos, FSU defensive linemen accounted for 11.5 sacks and the Broncos' defense allowed only 885 yards rushing (10 games).

In 2011, Adams coached Darius Powell, a second team All-CIAA selection and Jamaal Dixon, an All-Rookie team pick. Adams' unit amassed 21.5 sacks, 43.5 tackles for loss and was a part of a FSU defense that held opponents to 12 points or less five times. In fact, the Broncos were first in the NCAA's Division II in total sacks in 2009 and ranked fourth in tackles for loss.

A 2003 graduate of FSU, Adams was a captain on FSU's 2002 and 2003 CIAA Championship squads and was named to the All-CIAA team in his final three seasons, 2001-03, at FSU.

Adams received his Bachelor's Degree in Geography and, soon after graduation, became head football coach at Benson Middle School in Benson, N.C. In his three years at the helm, he led Benson to a 14-7 record. After his stint at Benson, Adams became an assistant coach in charge of the defensive line at South Johnston High School. Adams helped lead South Johnston to a 10-2 record and a Cape Fear Valley Conference Championship.

Adams is married to Teneisha Parker of Tarboro, N.C. and they have two sons, Bryce and Chase.

Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay begins his second season on the Campbell staff, coordinating the Camels' run game defense and coaching linebackers.

Aughtry-Lindsay was named defensive run game coordinator following the 2015 season, where CU ranked fifth in the country in total defense, allowing just 279.3 yards per game. Among FCS programs, Campbell also stood third in team sacks per game (3.55) and ninth in scoring defense (17.7). The team shattered program records for all three categories, adding single season marks for tackles for loss (85.0) and total sacks (38.0).

Jack Ryan was named PFL Defensive Freshman of the Year, also picking up honorable mention all-conference accolades along with senior Jake Barr. Senior Andrew Yost was also one of a record five Campbell student-athletes to be named to the National Football Foundation's Hampshire Honor Society, as well as Second Team Academic All-PFL.

Aughtry-Lindsay is also the Camels' pro liaison. He organized Campbell's first ever pro day in March 2015, welcoming more than 20 professional scouts to Barker-Lane Stadium.

Aughtry-Lindsay, who starred at linebacker for one of the nation's top defenses at NC State, came to Campbell from NCAA Division II St. Augustine's, where he was the Falcons' defensive coordinator and special teams coach in 2014.

The Falcons finished third in the CIAA Southern Division, while freshman return specialist Claytin Lewis was placed on the All-CIAA Second Team. Lewis, also the CIAA's Rookie of the Year, was among seven Falcons to be named all-rookie by the conference, including four on the defensive side.

Aughtry-Lindsay was the linebackers coach at Elon during the 2012 and 2013 seasons. In his first season with the Phoenix, Aughtry-Lindsay coached Jonathan Spain to second-team All-Southern Conference honors, and guided John Silas to SoCon all-freshman team accolades in 2013.

Prior to Elon, Aughtry-Lindsay coached linebackers at Slippery Rock (Pa.) in 2011. He spent 2008-10 at his alma mater, NCSU, first as an assistant in the recruiting office in 2008, and as a defensive graduate assistant coach from 2009-10. He also served as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Andrews High School in High Point, N.C. in 2007.

Aughtry-Lindsay was a two-year starter at NC State where he was selected as a team captain in 2003 and 2004. In a win against UConn in 2003, Aughtry-Lindsay scored two defensive touchdowns - a 48-yard fumble recovery and a game-winning 56-yard interception return. That performance helped him earn both ACC and national player of the week honors. He amassed a career-best 105 tackles in 2003. In 2004, the Wolfpack boasted the nation's top-ranked defense. Aughtry-Lindsay was honored with the Al Michaels Award during his time with NC State. In his career, he recorded 266 tackles, 22.5 tackles for a loss and 6.5 sacks.

Following his collegiate career, Aughtry-Lindsay played two seasons in the Arena Football League 2 as a linebacker and fullback with the Arkansas Twisters and Laredo Lobos.

Aughtry-Lindsay earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from NC State in 2006.

Originally from High Point, N.C., Aughtry-Lindsay and his wife, Amber, have three sons - Colton, Colin and Colter.

Bryan Butterworth was named defensive backs coach at Campbell University in the spring of 2015, and added defensive pass game coordinator to his duties prior to the 2016 season.

Butterworth, in his second stint on the Campbell coaching staff, returned to Sacred Heart, his alma mater, during the 2013 and 2014 seasons, helping guide the Pioneers to back to back North-east Conference championships before coming back to Buies Creek in 2015.

Upon his return to CU, the Camels ranked fifth in the nation in total defense, allowing only 279.3 yards per game. Among FCS programs, Campbell also stood third in team sacks per game (3.55) and ninth in scoring defense (17.7). The team shattered program records for all three categories, adding single season marks for tackles for loss (85.0) and total sacks (38.0).

Defensive backs Chris Beaty and Brandon Mobley were also named honorable mention All-PFL.

Sacred Heart also ranked among the top defenses in FCS during Butterworth's tenure, leading the country in interceptions in 2013 and red zone defense in 2014. Sacred Heart reached the FCS Playoffs in both seasons, earning a No. 25 national ranking.

Butterworth coached AP All-American and All-NEC pick J.D. Roussel during both seasons, also tutoring All-NEC selection Gordon Hill. Roussel and Steven Thomas both received national defensive player of the week honors under Butterworth.

Butterworth previously coached the Campbell defensive backs during the 2012 season, also coordinating the Camels' punt rush, kickoff units, punt return and kick return specialists.

He came to Campbell in the spring of 2012 after spending five seasons at the University of Massachusetts.

He worked with the Minutemen's corners in 2011 in one of the toughest Football Championship Subdivision conferences in the country in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). Butterworth coached the UMass cornerbacks in 2011 in a base 3-4 scheme. He also acted as the defensive sideline caller during the season.

Freshman cornerback Kirkland Nelms was selected to both the CAA and the Sports Network FCS National Rookie of the Week list (9/19/11). The Minutemen ranked sixth in the CAA in total defense (365.5), total defense (208.9) and sixth in interceptions (13) in 2011. The program also placed fifth in pass defense efficiency (124.6).

From 2008-11, Butterworth coached the safeties at UMass and aided the secondary to a 39th national finish in 2010. Two of the safeties he coached during his three years at the position were First Team All-CAA honorees. Butterworth came to UMass in 2007 as a Defensive Graduate Assistant. He worked directly with the program's head coach, Don Brown, to coach a secondary that finished 34th nationally. He also assisted with the four special team units (kickoff, punt, punt return and field goal defense).

As a player, Butterworth played two years at Canisius in Buffalo, N.Y. and two years at Sacred Heart in Fairfield, Conn. At SHU, he was a two-time NEC All-Academic selection and a member of the NCAA Student-Athlete Academic Council. As a receiver he led the Pioneers with 36 catches for 403 yards as a senior in 2005.

Butterworth, a Scituate, Mass. native, graduated Cum Laude from Sacred Heart in 2005 with a degree in business.

Duncan McLaurin enters his sixth season as an assistant coach at Campbell. McLaurin is the Camels' special teams coordinator and works with the tight ends. He recruits the eastern half of the 910 area code of North Carolina.

Already assisting with the unit for much of his time at Campbell, McLaurin will now pilot the Fighting Camels' special teams in 2015.

Under McLaurin's guidance in 2015, Austin Fleming was one of the Camels' top offensive threats, posting 383 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns on the way to honorable mention All-PFL recognition.

Hunter Somerville was also named one of 135 national semifinalists for the 2015 William V. Campbell Trophy, presented by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The senior was also one of a record five Camels named to the National Football Foundation's Hampshire Honor Society.

Campbell posted its second straight season with 2,000 yards rushing and passing in 2014. CU tight ends combined for 314 receiving yards, including 229 by Austin Fleming.

Hunter Somerville was named First Team Academic All-PFL, as well as CoSIDA Academic All-District.

In 2013, McLaurin's first coaching the CU tight ends, the Camels set 21 offensive team records, including including rushing yards (2,800), passing yards (2,436), and total offense (5,236).

During his first season at Campbell, the Camels finished 6-5 overall and 5-3 in Pioneer Football League play, enjoying their highest win total and first winning season since restarting the program in 2008.

McLaurin coached the Campbell defensive backs in 2012, as the Camels broke up 35 and intercepted five passes.

The Dillon, S.C. native came to Campbell from Dillon High School, where he worked as an assistant coach.

At Dillon he coached the wide receivers while working for his former prep coach, Jackie Hayes. The Wildcats reached the championship game of the state playoffs and ended the year with a 14-1 record in 2011. He worked as the physical education teacher for the seventh and eighth grades, coordinated the Rosetta Stone programs for English for Speakers of Other Languages and coached the junior varsity basketball team.

Prior to his time at Dillon High, McLaurin worked for Dillon Christian School in Dillon, S.C. from 2008-10 as the school's athletic director. While at Dillon Christian his coaching responsibilities included being assistant varsity football coach, the offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach, head basketball coach and head golf coach. The football team won two state championships and had a combined 24-2 record during his tenure. During his time at Dillon Christian he also spent time as the director of the physical education program for grades 1-9.

McLaurin played college football at Clemson from 2003-05 as a walk-on receiver. He received a letter in 2005 on a team that defeated Colorado in the Champs Sports Bowl. He was part of the 2004 team that finished 9-4 and defeated Tennessee in the Chick-Fil-A-Bowl. His position coach at Clemson was Dabo Swinney, who is the current head coach of the Tigers.

The Dillon, S.C. native earned his bachelor's degree in sociology and a minor in communications studies in 2006.

Andrew Carter is in his ninth season guiding the Campbell strength and conditioning program, overseeing all areas of sport performance. In 2015, Carter was named Assistant Athletics Director for Strength and Conditioning.

He is primarily responsible for developing and implementing strength, speed, conditioning and nutrition protocol for Campbell's football, baseball and women's lacrosse teams, while overseeing specific strength and conditioning programs for all 21 sport programs.

Carter was an instrumental part in the design of Campbell's new Burt Family Sports Performance Center, opening in January 2015 at Barker-Lane Stadium.

The nearly 6,000 square foot facility, located in the southeast corner of Barker-Lane Stadium, home of the Camels' football and women's lacrosse programs, features 900 square feet of sport turf, and state-of-the-art equipment.

Under Carter's direction, eight Campbell athletes have earned the All-America Strength and Conditioning Award from the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA).

He was a featured speaker at the 2015 Hammer Strength Clinic at Dorman High School in Roebuck, S.C., presenting on his football offseason program. Carter was also an invited speaker at the 5th Annual Basketball Specific Strength and Conditioning Symposium in 2012, the premier conference focusing on strength and conditioning for all levels of basketball. Additionally, Carter was a guest lecturer at the CU School of Physical Therapy in 2014. He served as an adjunct professor in Campbell's exercise department from 2008-14.

Carter joined the Fighting Camel program after spending three years as the head strength and conditioning coach at St. Stephen's & St. Agnes School in Alexandria, Va. In addition to his strength and conditioning duties at St. Stephen's & St. Agnes, Carter also worked as a physical education teacher and the physical education department coordinator with additional duties as the assistant boy's lacrosse coach for three years.

CAMPBELL FOOTBALL HISTORY

Campbell has a football history that dates back to 1925 when the school fielded its first varsity team. That team led by coaches Edge and Baker went 3-1-1 including the historic first 7-0 victory over Carthage. The details of some of early teams remains sketchy but it is known that the 1929 team, under the direction of Coach Bob Hays, posted Campbell's first-ever state championship with a 5-2-1 record.

Campbell continued to be a program to account for and posted a state junior college championship in 1932 under the guidance of Coach S.O. Brandon. The third state title came in 1939 when Campbell tied both Belmont Abbey and Brevard.

With World War II in full swing Campbell made the decision to suspend football play from 1940-45 until the war came to an end. When CU resumed play the Camels continued to win. The team won the 1946 and 1948 North Carolina Junior College State Championships and finished as the runner-up in 1947 all under the direction of Coach Earl Smith.

The 1947 team lost to South Georgia 46-7 to finish as the runner-up for the Eastern United States Junior College Championship. One year later in 1948, Campbell won the North Carolina title, but fell to familiar foe South Georgia 26-19 in the Eastern U.S. Championship.

With the on-set of the Korean Conflict and the movement of many North Carolina schools to senior college status in the 1950's, Campbell dropped its varsity football program after the 1950 season until the present day.

In August 2004, Campbell first began to explore, by way of a feasibility study, the possibility of adding non-athletic scholarship football as a varsity sport. When results came back as something that should be pursued CU made the official announcement on April 7, 2006 that football was coming back to the Creek as varsity sport in time for the 2008 season. It was decided that the program would compete at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (non-scholarship) level.

Campbell's administration then began the task of searching for a conference affiliation that would embrace both the athletic demands as well as the high academic standards that Campbell has been built upon. In 2006, the Camels formally submitted a bid to join the Pioneer Football League.

On June 15, 2006 Dale Steele was named head coach and began to assemble his staff and his first signing class in 2007.



Steele and his staff continued their preparation for the 2008 season by conducting the team's first official football practice in more than 50 years on August 28, 2007 with more than 100 players participating.

The Campbell football team worked through the fall and held a two-hour intra-squad on October 20, 2007, the first official football game in the modern era, for the Homecoming/Parents' Day celebration. The Camels wrapped up their fall practices on November 17, 2007 with another scrimmage at Lee Senior High School in Sanford.

The Pioneer Football League formally accepted Campbell's application for the 2008 season on December 5, 2007. That day also served as the official unveiling of the 2008 game schedule.

After years of planning and waiting, the Camels were finally able to take the field on August 30, 2008 with a contest against Birmingham-Southern College. In front of overflowing crowd of 5,845 CU lost a hard-fought 12-6 game.

The 2009 football schedule saw Campbell win a pair of firsts at home. The Camels won the team's first-ever home game in a thrilling 48-28 season opening come-from-behind victory over Methodist on Sept. 5.

Campbell's football produced another historic first with the team's first win in Pioneer Football League play with a 31-22 victory over Morehead State on Oct. 31. The team also won its first on the road in league play with a 17-3 decision at Valparaiso on Nov. 14.

2011 marked a banner year for the CU football program, with the team producing its first winning season since its re-launch. The Camels finished 6-5 overall and 5-3 in PFL play, leading

the conference in rushing for the third straight year and placing 11 on all-conference teams.

On November 27, 2012, former Carolina Panthers standout Mike Minter was named head coach of the Fighting Camel program.

Under the direction of Minter, the Camels went 3-9 overall in 2013, finishing the year with a 47-14 win at rival Davidson. Four of CU's six PFL losses came by 10, or fewer, points. Campbell set 28 team records. Senior Kurt Odum became the program's first football All-America selection, earning third team honors at fullback from The Sports Network.

The 2014 Camels recorded the program's second-highest overall (5-7) and league (4-4) win totals in its Division I era (since 2008). A school record seven Camels, plus eight honorable mentions, were named to the 2014 All-PFL teams, including four first teamers.

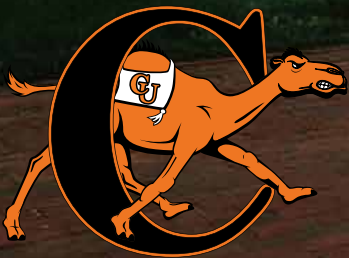
The Camels ranked fifth in the nation in total defense in 2015 (279.3 per game), standing third in team sacks per game (3.55) and ninth in scoring defense (17.7). The team shattered program records for all three categories, adding single season marks for tackles for loss (85.0) and total sacks (38.0).

Campbell led the PFL in rushing in 2015 with 1,956 yards, led by First Team All-PFL performer De'Shawn Jones, who led the league in rushing individually with 1,072 yards.

Jones was one of 16 Camels honored on the conference's All-PFL teams. The PFL 2015 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year also went to Campbell's Jack Ryan.

The offseason saw another Campbell first, with defensive tackle Greg Milhouse Jr. (New York Giants) and long snapper Danny Dillon (Arizona Cardinals) both signing NFL contracts.

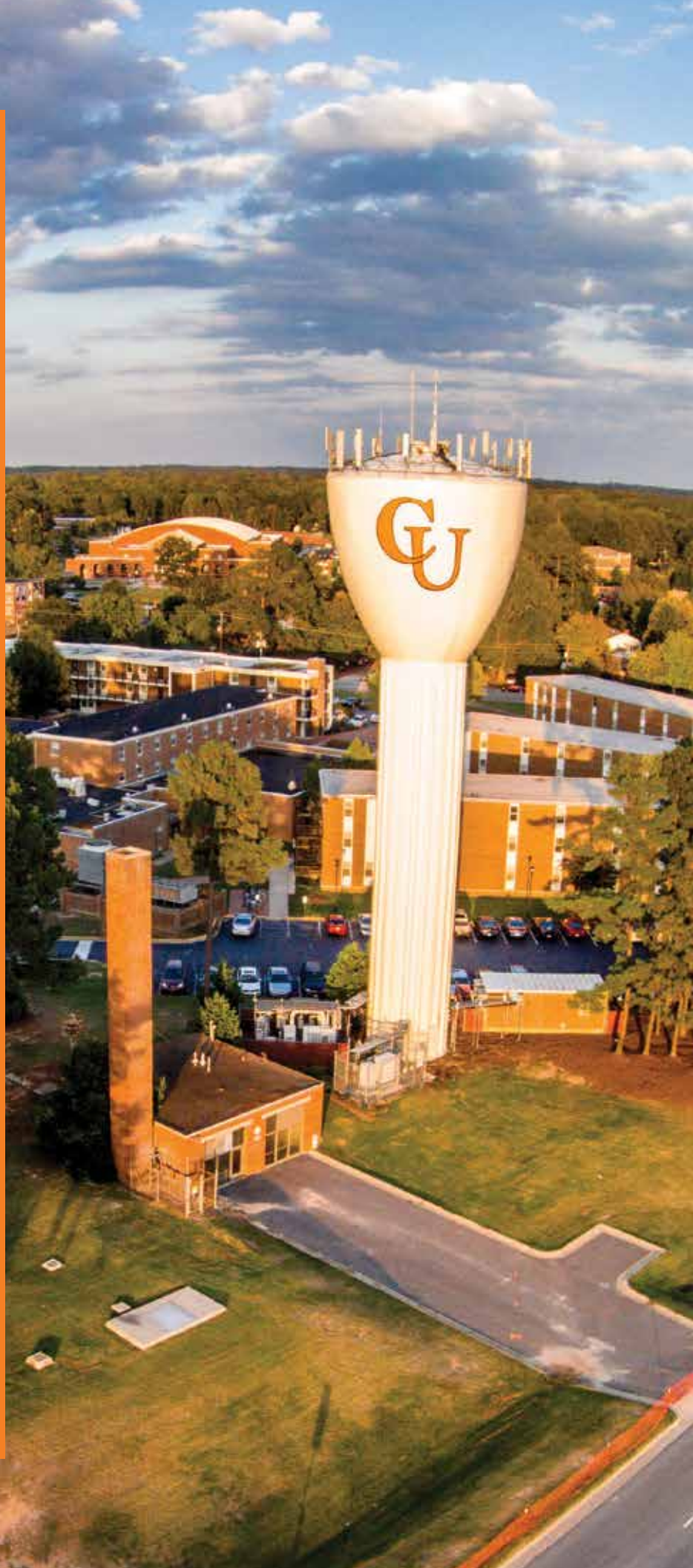
On Jan. 5, 1887, James Archibald Campbell, a 26-year-old Baptist minister, welcomed 16 students to a small church in Buies Creek, North Carolina, for the first day of classes for the school he founded: Buies Creek Academy. By the end of the first term, there were 92 students.

Since then, Buies Creek Academy has evolved to become Campbell Junior College (1926), Campbell College (1961), and Campbell University (1979). Throughout these transformations, the university has remained true to its founding principles to address the most pressing needs of North Carolina and to educate men and women for Christian service around the world.

A testimony to how these founding principles still guide Campbell University today is the establishment of three new schools in the last two years. Campbell launched the School of Osteopathic Medicine — North Carolina's first new medical school in over 35 years — in 2013. In 2016, it will open the doors to its eighth and ninth schools, nursing and engineering.

They join Campbell's other established schools — College of Arts & Sciences, the Norman Adrian Wiggins School of Law (1976), the Lundy-Fetterman School of Business (1983), the School of Education (1985), the College of Pharmacy & Health Sciences (1985) and the Divinity School (1996). In addition to its main campus in Buies Creek, Campbell University has extended campuses in the Research Triangle Park, Camp Lejeune, Fort Bragg/Pope Air Force Base, and Raleigh, where the law school relocated to in 2009.

Today, Campbell University enrolls nearly 6,500 students, including more than 4,500 undergraduate and graduate students on its main campus. They're studying across nearly 100 disciplines in the liberal arts, health sciences and professions — and continuing the university's tradition of excellence in faith, learning, and service.



University President Dr. J. Bradley Creed



An accomplished leader of mission-driven institutions and a scholar and historian of religion, Dr. J. Bradley Creed began his duties as Campbell University's fifth president July 1, 2015.

"The Campbell education is not just a transaction; it is a transformational learning experience that changes lives," Dr. Creed said during his inaugural address in April 2016. "Our work is not operating an institution of higher education, but our work is transforming lives."

Since his tenure began, Campbell opened only the second engineering school at a private university in North Carolina, opened the state-of-the-art First Citizens Wealth Management Center in the Campbell Business School, received one of its largest gifts in university history to establish The G. Eugene Boyce Center of Advocacy at Campbell Law, received its largest humanities-related grant in university history to start a youth theology institute, and hosted the 2016 Big South Men's Basketball Championship.

Previously, Dr. Creed was the provost, executive vice president, and professor of religion at Samford University.

During his 12 years as Samford's provost, he led multiple initiatives, including the launch of the College of Health Sciences in 2013 and the addition of over two-dozen new or enhanced academic programs. He also played a key role in strategic enrollment efforts that improved the size, retention, and academic quality of the undergraduate student body. Samford achieved the highest graduation rate of any college or university in Alabama during his tenure as provost.

Before joining Samford, Dr. Creed was dean, associate dean, and professor of Christian history at Baylor University's George W. Truett Theological Seminary. Earlier in his career, he served as pastor of churches in Texas and Louisiana.

A Jacksonville, Texas, native, Dr. Creed received his Ph.D. and Master of Divinity from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas, and Bachelor of Arts in Religion from Baylor University.

He and his wife, Kathy, have three children: Caitlin (1987-2007), Charles Vernon, and Carrie Grace.



Director of Athletics Bob Roller



Since taking over as Director of Athletics at Campbell University in July 2011, Bob Roller has led a department that has reached new heights in academics, facility construction, fund raising and competition.

Roller's tenure has seen Campbell Athletics achieve its highest academic marks in school history. Campbell student-athletes have maintained an overall GPA of 3.042 over the past two seasons.

During that same period, 42 percent of Campbell's 480 student-athletes among its 21 NCAA Division I sports maintained an overall GPA of 3.25 or higher.

On the field, the women's golf team has won three Big South Conference championships (2012, 2014 and 2016) and competed in five NCAA Regionals and two NCAA Championships; the men's golf team competed in this year's NCAA Regionals; the men's cross country team won the 2015 Big South title; and the baseball team won the Big South regular season title in 2013 and the tournament championship in 2014, when it also earned a berth in the NCAA tournament.

Overall, Campbell Athletics' 21 Division I programs have seen steady improvement in competition. That culminated with Campbell's highest ranking in the Big South Conference overall sports trophy standings in 2016 since re-joining the league five years ago.

Roller has led a transformation of Campbell Athletics through major facility improvements and record fund-raising. Major facility additions and expansions he has overseen include:

- Installing a four-sided center hung LED display scoreboard and court-side LED scorer's table at the John W. Pope, Jr. Convocation Center, where the basketball and volleyball teams play;

- Opening the Burt Family Sports Performance Center, adding lights and a LED display scoreboard and video board, and completing the West grandstand and press box at Barker-Lane Stadium, where the football and women's lacrosse teams play;

- Renovating and dedicating Jim Perry Stadium, where the baseball team plays/

- Dedicating the Irwin Belk Track and Clarence Roberts Field;

- Renovating Eakes Athletics Complex, home to the men's and women's soccer teams;

- Opening Amanda Littlejohn Stadium, where the softball team plays.

Construction on the Jim and Daphne Perry Pavilion at the baseball stadium began in early May 2015. The expansion will add locker rooms and offices for the baseball program and additional seating and VIP viewing desks for fans. A

Daktronics video board will also be installed this summer at Barker-Lane Stadium.

In addition, Roller led the creation of The CAMMYS, Campbell's multi-media awards show for student-athletes widely recognized as one of the finest events of its kind. He also was instrumental in Campbell winning the bid to host the 2016 Big South Men's Basketball Championship. The 2016 event held in Buies Creek drew the tournament's highest attendance in the last five years.

During Roller's tenure, Campbell has also co-hosted the 2013 and 2015 NCAA Women's Soccer College Cup and the 2014 NCAA Men's Soccer College Cup, and hosted the 2015 Big South Softball Championship and the 2014 Southern Conference Wrestling Championship. Campbell will co-host the 2016 NCAA Women's Soccer College Cup and the 2017 NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship.

Under his watch, 900 of Campbell's NCAA Division I student-athletes over the last four years have recorded an overall grade-point average of better than 3.0 during the academic year.

Campbell athletes have also donated more than 18,000 hours in community service around the Buies Creek area over the past five academic years.

Introduced on July 20, 2011 as the fourth A.D. of Campbell's Division I era (since 1977-78), Roller joined the Fighting Camel staff after spending more than 11 years as Director of Athletics at Samford University. While at the Birmingham, Ala., school, he oversaw one of the most exciting periods of growth in the history of Samford athletics.

During his tenure at Samford, the entire facilities landscape of the campus was transformed. New athletics venues were built for men's and women's basketball, volleyball, baseball, tennis, soccer, track and field and a football field house and strength and conditioning center were funded and constructed.

Roller arrived at Samford in 1997 to direct the Samford Athletic Foundation. During his first two years, the foundation saw record growth in individual and corporate donations to the university's athletics programs. Roller held that position until May 1999, when then-President Thomas E. Corts named him to the top position within the athletics department.

In the summer of 2003, Roller was elected to the prestigious executive committee of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics [NACDA] to serve a four-year term. He joined athletics directors from Kansas State, Stanford, Army and Clemson on the governing committee that oversees the activities of the 6,000-plus member organization.

In 2006, Roller was named national chairman of the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup Committee for NACDA. The Directors' Cup is awarded to the top universities in NCAA Division I, II, III and NAIA for overall athletics success throughout the inter-collegiate season.

Prior to his tenure at Samford, Roller was vice president of AdCraft Sports Marketing in Louisville, Ky., for seven years. During that time, he helped create the Sears Collegiate Champions program, which honors all champions of men's and women's sports throughout the nation at every level of college athletics.

While with AdCraft, a division of Host Communications, Inc., Roller created and managed a publishing division and helped launch NCAA Football USA, which involved promotion, licensing and merchandising for college football programs at all levels of intercollegiate athletics.

Roller was director of communications for the Orange Bowl Committee in Miami, Fla., from 1988 to 1991. He was with the Orange Bowl when Federal Express became its first title sponsor in 1989.

The Pearisburg, Va., native began his career in sports information. He earned his degree from Virginia Tech in 1983 and worked as a student assistant in the sports information office for four years. He was the sports information director at UNC Wilmington and East Carolina University from 1983 to 1988. While at UNC Wilmington, Roller was also executive director of the university's athletics fund-raising program.

Roller, 55, who holds a master's degree in education administration from Samford, is married to the former Carolyn Keller. He has one son, Brad, and three stepchildren – Kerstin, Kyle and Karrah.

CAMPBELL ATHLETICS

ATHLETIC TRAINING

CU's Athletic Training staff offers all Fighting Camel student-athletes the best available medical care for athletic injuries. They design and implement programs to prevent, manage and treat athletic injuries. They also supervise injury rehabilitation programs that are designed to return the athlete to athletic activity as quickly and safely as possible.

The athletic training services program is directed by head athletic trainer Jackie Knight, four assistant athletic trainers and five interns/graduate assistant athletic trainers.

In addition, the staff also provides hands on experience to a number of students majoring in athletic training. These students are enrolled in a challenging academic major that not only requires that they make the grade in the classroom but also must excel in real-life situations.

The education program is directed by Catherine Simonson. The Athletic Training staff also works closely team physicians, Dr. Bill Hage and Dr. Richard Slusher of Triangle Orthopedics in Raleigh and Dr. Michael Hart and Dr. Kristin Clarey of Cary Family Practice and Sports Medicine to provide quality physician services to student-athletes. They also have a team chiropractor in Dr. David Bradham of Bradham Chiropractic in Erwin. Other allied health care needs available within the athletic training services program include optometry, dentistry, and sports massage.

STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

The Campbell University strength and conditioning facilities are located at the John W. Pope Jr. Convocation Center in the Burns Strength and Conditioning Center.

Although specific strength and conditioning programs are designed for each sport, the basic goal is the same – to help athletes increase their full potential in: strength, speed, flexibility, endurance and ultimately sports performance, while decreasing the likelihood of injury.

Workouts are designed and implemented by Andrew Carter, who is in his third year as head strength and conditioning coach. The Campbell University Baseball Strength and Conditioning Program, in particular, is designed to utilize a combination of speed and strength development set out to prepare the Campbell baseball players to take the field in the best possible shape both mentally and physically.

The program uses several different methods of training focusing primarily on Olympic Weight Lifting aimed at developing strength, speed, and explosion. The program also incorporates a speed program aimed at increasing acceleration and multi-directional speed.

Carter also spends time with each basketball student-athlete to ensure they are meeting nutritional needs on a daily basis. Campbell's strength and conditioning program has an ultimate goal of helping the student-athlete to reach their maximum physical potential, in order to better prepare student-athletes in competition.



STUDENT-ATHLETE SUPPORT

The Campbell Athletics Department is committed to academic excellence and to promoting student-athlete welfare through the broad-based Student-Athlete Support Program. Under the guidance of Malinda Ashcraft, Associate A.D. for Academic Services, programs are available that provide opportunities for student-athletes to grow academically, socially, spiritually, emotionally and physically.

The Student-Athlete Support Program was created to assist student-athletes with a number of issues ranging from the development of personal responsibility and educational goals to addressing personal and social problems that are unique to the Division I student-athlete.

Some of the services offered through the Student-Athlete Support Program are the Individual Study Plan program, tutorial sessions, study halls, one-on-one academic advising, Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, NCAA Life Skills and other academic support services.

The Academic Support Center is the focal point of the program. The center is open seven days a week with flexible hours designed to accommodate the busy schedule of a student-athlete. The center has been designed to serve as an optimal learning environment, while providing the student-athlete with all the tools necessary to achieve academic success.

The center is equipped with several computer work stations, individual study carrels, and areas for monitored group study and tutorial work. Tutorial sessions of different subject areas are provided several times a week.

THE FIGHTING CAMEL

Many stories exist as to the origin of the nickname "Fighting Camels" and the adoption of a camel as the mascot of Campbell University athletic teams. To date, there is still uncertainty as to why the unique mascot (only one other school in the United States -- and none in Division I -- has the nickname "Camels") was chosen.

According to historian J. Winston Pearce, author of "Campbell College, Big Miracle in Little Buies Creek," the nickname's origin perhaps stretches back to the turn of the century when all but one of the school's original buildings were destroyed by fire. In the aftermath, Z.T. Kivett visited the school's founder and president, Dr. James Archibald Campbell, at his residence.

As Dr. Campbell bemoaned the fate of the institution he had worked 13 years to build, Mr. Kivett encouraged him, "Your name's Campbell; then get a hump on you! We've got work to do." Dr. Campbell thought that Mr. Kivett said, "You're a camel, get a hump on you." Hence the nomadic nickname.

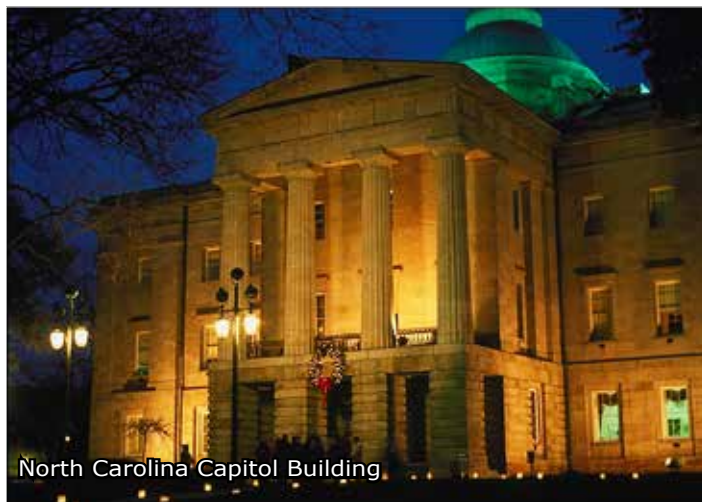
Campbell's athletic teams were originally named the "Hornets." Copies of Creek Pebbles, the school newspaper, in the 1920s and 1930s described the teams as "Hornets." Other references to the athletic teams were "The Campbells" or the "Campbellites." Although an official date is unknown, the changing of the mascot to a camel came in late 1933 or early 1934.

There is no explanation why the nickname was changed to Camels, only this one sentence was printed in the Jan. 13, 1934 issue of Creek Pebbles: "Eight new men were recently initiated into Campbell's monogram club, which has changed its name from 'Hornets' to 'Camels.'" From that point on, all Campbell athletic teams have proudly worn the Camel mascot.

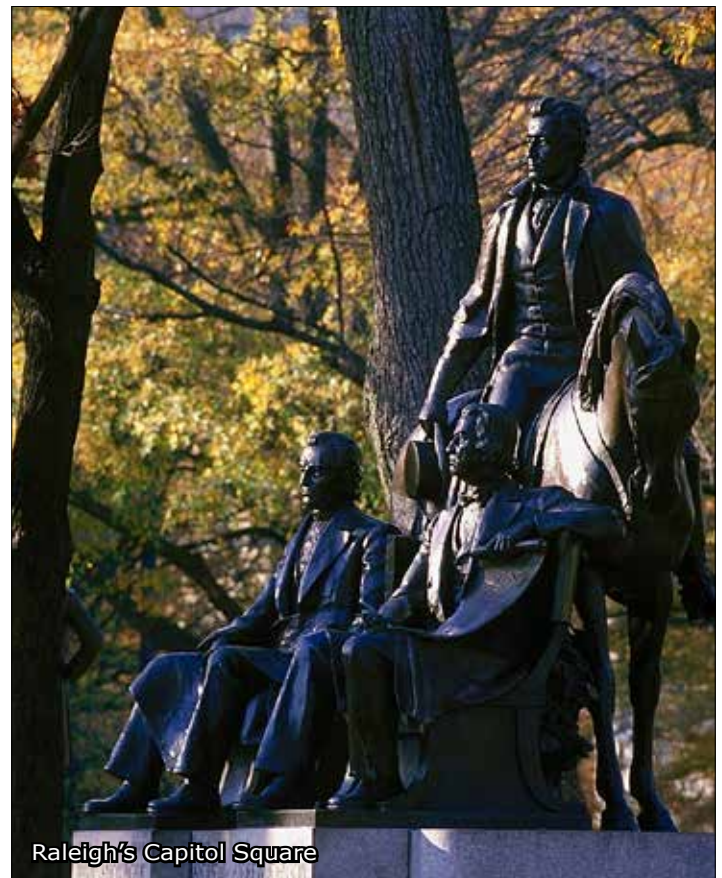

Media Information

This media guide has been prepared in order to assist in your coverage of Campbell University football during the 2016 season. All media requests should be made through Director of Athletic Communications Jason Williams.

Press Credentials

Press credentials are limited to working members of the print and electronic media, as well as photographers and videographers. Photographers are restricted to designated areas of the field.

Interview Policies

The Campbell Athletic Communications Department will attempt to arrange all reasonable requests for interviews with Fighting Camel head coach Mike Minter and team members. With respect to practice, study and personal time, a few guidelines should be followed.

Player Interviews

All interview requests with Campbell football players must be arranged through the Campbell Athletic Communications Department. Players are generally available for interviews immediately following practice sessions. If a media member desires to set up a telephone interview, this can be arranged.

Post Game Interviews

Following each home game, the visiting head coach and any requested players will be brought to the media interview room after a 10-minute cool-down period. Campbell head coach Mike Minter and players will follow in the interview room. The Campbell locker room is closed to all individuals with the exception of authorized team or university personnel.

Road Interviews

Interviews with Coach Minter or team members away from campus or contact outside of playing sites must be arranged through the media services department. Every attempt will be made to satisfy the interview request within reason.

Head Coach Interviews

Requests for interviews with Coach Minter should be made through Director of Athletic Communications Jason Williams at (910) 814-4367 or (910) 228-6908.

Home Game Services

Working press facilities are available at Barker-Lane Stadium / Ed Gore Field. Telephone lines, high-speed internet connections, wireless internet connections and fax services are available upon request.



Campbell Athletics Communications will provide a pre-game snack to working media members in the press box. A full NCAA box score and play-by-play sheets will be distributed as soon as possible following the completion of each game. Stats are also provided to press row after each quarter, and after scoring plays.

Pioneer Football League Public Relations

Throughout the football season, the Pioneer Football League staff will provide updated statistics daily for each conference team, plus a weekly release, to the media through pioneer-football.org. PFL games – and all Campbell home games – are available on a paid-subscription live video webcast through GoCamels.com.

Radio / Internet Broadcasts

Announcer positions for radio broadcasts of Fighting Camel football are located inside the Barker-Lane Stadium press box. Under reciprocal agreements, the official designated originating station of the visiting team is allowed to originate radio broadcasts without charge. Official stations must contact Chris Hemeyer (910-893-1822) for information concerning broadcasts.

Fighting Camel broadcasts will be available on 88.3 WUAW and through GoCamels.com for the entire 2016 season. Play-by-play and analysis throughout the season will be provided. Every broadcast begins 30 minutes prior to kick-off with the comprehensive pre-game show.

The Voice of the Camels

Director of Broadcasting and Digital Media Chris Hemeyer is in his sixth year as the voice of Fighting Camel Football and Men's Basketball.

During his time at Campbell, Hemeyer has done play-by-play on ESPN 3, plus Big South Conference Basketball and Softball Tournament games and the Big South Baseball Championship Game on the Big South Network. In addition, Hemeyer was chosen to emcee the Big South Conference Basketball Media Day, The Conference Hall of Fame Banquet, and the NCAA Men's and Women's College Cup Banquets.

Hemeyer joined the Fighting Camel staff from Kinston, NC, where he was Director of Broadcasting and Public Relations for the Kinston Indians, the Cleveland Indians affiliate in the Carolina (Class A) League.

In addition to Hemeyer's play-by-play work with the Indians, he also spent three seasons as the play-by-play voice for the first half of the East Carolina University baseball season. Hemeyer's basketball play-by-play experience includes fill-in work for East Carolina men's broadcasts.

His football experience includes television sideline reporting for East Carolina football games on MASN and Comcast Sports Southeast. Hemeyer was also the studio host for Ohio University football for radio broadcasts on the Ohio IMG Sports Network. In 2010, Hemeyer hosted a post-game call-in show and weekly talk show for East Carolina football. From 2006-10, Hemeyer has been the voice of high school football in Craven County, calling multiple state championship games.

Hemeyer is a graduate of the University of Missouri and a native of Columbia, Missouri.

Jay Sonnhalter is in his second year as color commentator for Campbell University Football.

Sonnhalter, played football at East Carolina University from 2004-2007 where he was a three-year letterman. He was a member of the 2007 team that defeated Boise State in the Hawaii Bowl and went to the Washington Redskins minicamp following his college career.

He was a part of the East Carolina radio network pregame and post-

game show for six years. He has also covered football, basketball, and baseball with Time Warner Cable.

Sonnhalter, who resides in Cary, has worked on various football scenes as a football player/stunt double for the movies *The Dark Night Rises*, *Necessary Roughness*, *Best Man Holiday*, and *Focus*.

Dr. Andy Bowman is in his sixth season with the Campbell University Digital Network. A 1993 Alum of Campbell University's then School of Pharmacy and Buies Creek resident, Dr. Bowman is the Director of Continuing Professional Education and a Clinical Assistant Professor of Pharmacy Practice at the College of Pharmacy & Health Sciences.

Dr. Bowman's radio resume started in 1995. While serving as Pharmacy Supervisor for the Kroger Company in Roanoke, Va., Dr. Bowman hosted a weekly show "Ask Andy, The Kroger Radio Pharmacist" on WFIR 960AM. When Dr. Bowman returned to his alma mater to serve on the faculty in 2000, he soon had an opportunity to add to his broadcast experience by hosting a monthly "Ask the Pharmacist" radio segment on WFNC 640AM in Fayetteville, N.C.

In addition to teaching courses at the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, Dr. Bowman serves as Director of Continuing Professional Education for the College, where he coordinates continuing pharmacy education programs from pharmacists around the state of North Carolina and across the nation. Dr. Bowman was recently elected as the Southeastern District Representative on the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy.

pioneer football league

The 2016 season marks the 22nd year of competition for the Pioneer Football League – the nation’s only non-athletic scholarship NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference.

The PFL is one of only two conferences that sponsor football as its only sport (the Missouri Valley Football Conference being the other). However, the PFL is a truly national conference with members on each coast and throughout the nation’s heartland. The league still retains four of its charter members – Butler Dayton, Drake and Valparaiso.

The University San Diego joined in 1992, followed in 2001 by Davidson College, Jacksonville University and Morehead State University. In 2008, Campbell became the ninth member school.

The league expanded to 10 members in 2009 with Marist College joining the league’s ranks. Mercer and Stetson joined the PFL in 2013 to increase membership to 12. Mercer then left the PFL to join the Southern Conference in 2014.

On Aug. 2, 2012, an NCAA executive committee passed a proposal to expand the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision playoffs from 20 to 24 teams and include an automatic qualifier for the PFL champion.

The league played an end of the season playoff game against the regular season champion in the Northeast Conference (NEC) from 2006-09 with the PFL winning three of those four contests.

Butler won a tie-breaker with Marist in 2013 for the right to represent the PFL in the NCAA FCS play-offs. San Diego secured the automatic berth in 2014.

In January 1991 the NCAA passed legislation to require Division I institutions to sponsor all intercollegiate sports at the Division I level. The five charter members (Evansville was the fifth before dropping football in 1997), each dedicated to the enhancement and sound management of intercollegiate football as an integral part of the student-athletes’ collegiate experience, joined together to form the Pioneer Football League. From the league’s inception it has been a proponent of the creation of a non-scholarship football classification within Division I and adopted the moniker of Pioneer based on the intent to become the first league in that new division.

The PFL is comprised of NCAA Division I universities that previously sponsored intercollegiate football at other levels with the exception of Jacksonville, which started a non-scholarship program in 1998, and Campbell, which began play in 2008. All are currently committed to the non-scholarship football model.

The PFL began play in 1993 with Dayton winning the league’s first crown. The league spent its first season in 1993 under the administrative guidance of the Midwestern Collegiate Conference, and the office moved to St. Louis in 1994 when current commissioner Patty Viverito was named the PFL commissioner, a leadership position she continues to fill.
