Campbell is 3-0 against the Pride since joining the CAA, sweeping last year's meetings. The last game on Long Island saw Jasin Sinani with a buzzer beater to force OT, and Colby Duggan win it at the buzzer in overtime.

The Tip-Off

- ▶ John Andrzejek takes over as a first-year head coach for the Camels. He most recently worked as an assistant coach for the 2025 national champion Florida Gators.
- ▶ Andrzejek is the third youngest head coach in the country, turning 33 on Nov. 8.
- ▶ Campbell faces its toughest schedule in program history with six games against "high major" programs: Wisconsin, West Virginia, Wake Forest, Penn State, Gonzaga, and Minnesota.
- ▶ CU's non-con strength of schedule currently ranks 30th in the country on KenPom.
- ▶ Campbell shattered the program records for scoring (149), rebounding (70), and assists (41) against VUL.
- ▶ Chris Fields Jr. recorded the first triple-double in program history against VUL with 23 points, 22 rebounds, 11 assists. His 22 boards were also a program record. It's the first 20-20-10 in college basketball since at least 2010.
- ▶ Campbell trailed by only 10 with 10 minutes left at Gonzaga, and gave the 'Zags their closest game by any mid-major this season.

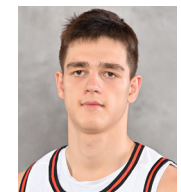

SIGHTS SET ON CAA

- ▶ Campbell went 10-8 for a fifth place finish in CAA play a year ago.
- ▶ CU went 4-5 on the road in league play last year and 6-3 at home.
- ▶ The Camels went 8-10 in '23-'24, the team's first year in the league, and sit at 18-18 across the last two seasons.
- ▶ Campbell was picked seventh in the CAA preseason poll.

NON-CON RECAP

- ▶ CU went 6-7 in non-con action, including 6-1 against non-P4 opponents and 4-1 against Mid Majors.
- ▶ Campbell went 5-0 at home, the first time going undefeated at home in non-con play since 2019-20, and the first time with three D1 home games since 2011-12.

BIG GAME AGAINST GREEN BAY

- ▶ CU scored its most points in regulation against a D1 opponent since 2007 in a 102-79 win over Green Bay.
- ▶ Campbell logged its highest-ever offensive efficiency score of the KenPom Era at 159.3 (1.54 points per possession).
- ▶ CU shot 71.9% in the second half, the sixth-best ever against a D1 program.
- ▶ Jeremiah Johnson went off against his former team pouring in a career-high 27.

HOME SWEET HOME

- ▶ Campbell is 5-0 in Gore Arena this season, scoring 103.8 ppg.
- ▶ The Camels are shooting 54% from the floor and 41% from beyond the arc at home.
- ▶ DJ Smith has been especially comfortable, averaging 23 ppg in his home gym.

FRONT COURT POWER

- ▶ The frontcourt duo of Dovydas Butka and Chris Fields Jr combines for 28.2 points and 17.6 rebounds per game.
- ▶ Either Butka or Fields has led the Camels in rebounding in all but one game this season.
- ▶ Each have three double-doubles already this season.

TESTED TOUGH

- ▶ Campbell has played the 44th-toughest non-con schedule in the nation, per KenPom.
- ▶ That number peaked as high as 23rd nationally after facing Gonzaga.
- ▶ Campbell has faced two ranked opponents (No. 24 Wisconsin, No. 7 Gonzaga), six true road games, five "high-major" programs, one neutral site game, and two mid-major opponents at home.
- ▶ It is the toughest non-con schedule in the CAA.

RECORD SETTING NIGHT

- ▶ Campbell trounced Va. Lynchburg 149-62, shattering multiple school records in the process.
- ▶ Total Points: 149... 1st half: 75... 2nd half: 74... Margin of Victory: 87... FG Made: 63... FG Attempts: 98... Rebounds: 70... Assists: 41... Individual Rebounds (D1 era): 22, Chris Fields Jr... Individual FG % (15+ att.): 93.3 (14-15) Muneer Newton...
- ▶ Campbell also set CAA records for points, FG made, and assists.
- ▶ 149 points are the most by any team since the 2020-21 season.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE

- ▶ Chris Fields Jr. recorded the first triple-double in program history, logging 23 points, 22 rebounds, and 11 assists against Va. Lynchburg.
- ▶ It is the only 20-20-10 triple double in college hoops in the last 15 seasons, and one of only five triple doubles by players to come off the bench.
- ▶ With a program record (D1 era) for rebounds, he also collects the first 20-20 game in program history.
- ▶ He has one of only 10 triple-doubles in the country so far this season, and is the only player to get one coming off the bench.

AGAINST THE "POWER 4"

- ▶ Campbell is 4-63 against current members of the "Power 4" Conferences.
- ▶ Campbell's Power 4 Wins:

FREE THROW RECORD

- ▶ Campbell shot 28-31 (90.3%) at the stripe against Weber State.
- ▶ The mark is good for a program record percentage when attempting 30+ free throws.
- ▶ The previous record was 86% (33-38), set against Lipscomb in 2010.

AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

- ▶ Campbell has never beaten a ranked opponent (0-15 all-time).
- ▶ Campbell fell 96-64 in the season opener at No. 24 Wisconsin, and 98-70 at No. 7 Gonzaga.
- ▶ Campbell last faced two ranked opponents in a single season in 2004 (#17 NC State, #8 Kentucky)
- ▶ CU's closest game with a ranked opponent was a 70-60 loss at No. 21 Virginia Tech in 2010.
- ▶ CU last faced an opponent ranked as high as #7 Gonzaga in 1996 (#2 Wake Forest).

NON-CON TESTS

- ▶ Campbell faces its toughest non-con schedule in program history, with six high major opponents.
- ▶ All six non-con road opponents reside in the KenPom preseason Top 100 (Gonzaga - 8, Wisc. - 20, Wake Forest - 49, West Virginia - 67, Minn. - 73, Penn State - 95).

FIGHT LIKE HILL

- ▶ Associate HC Eddie Hill was diagnosed with Stage 3 colorectal cancer this summer.
- ▶ Hill and Campbell Basketball have partnered with the V Foundation to raise money for colorectal cancer research.

NEW FACES ON STAFF

- ▶ **Landry Kosmalski** joins after 13 seasons as HC at Swarthmore (DII). Kosmalski was named 2019-20 NABC Coach of the Year, 4x Centennial Conference Coach of the Year, and took his teams to two final fours.
- ▶ **Eddie Hill** joins after three seasons at UC Riverside, where he also served as Assoc. HC. He comes from the same Kyle Smith coaching tree, getting his start at Wash. St. as the school record holder in 3pt shooting prior to Klay Thompson taking the top spot.
- ▶ **Anthony Lorenzo** also comes over from UC Riverside. Lorenzo worked on staff with Andrzejek at both Wash. St. and San Francisco.
- ▶ **Austin Burnette** (CU '19) returns to his alma mater after two seasons on the bench at North Alabama. Burnette played for the Camels from 2016-19 and won a conference title.
- ▶ **Joseph Yesufu** made a quick jump from player to coach as an active player on last season's WVU team. Yesufu played at WVU, Kansas, Drake, and Wash. State where he connected with Andrzejek via the Kyle Smith coaching tree. He won a national championship with Kansas in 2022.

- ▶ **DJ Smith with Robert Morris (Horizon League) 2024-25**
- ▶ **Chris Field Jr. with Norfolk State (MEAC) 2024-25**
- ▶ **Enoch Kalambay with Western Kentucky (CUSA) 2023-24**
- ▶ There are two national champions on staff...
- ▶ Head Coach John Andrzejek won the national championship with Florida in 2025.
- ▶ Assistant Coach Joseph Yesufu was a member of the 2022 Kansas national championship team.

BROTHERLY LOVE

- ▶ Campbell has a pair of twin brothers, Dovydas and Domynikas Butka, on the roster.
- ▶ They are the sixth pair of brothers to have played for CU.
- ▶ They are one of only six sets of twins playing together nationwide, per NCAA mailbag.

A NEW ERA IN THE CAA

- ▶ Campbell is now in its third season in the CAA
- ▶ Campbell's conference history:

1984-94 - Big South (charter member)
1994-11 - ASUN
2011-2023 - Big South
2023-pres. - CAA

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- ▶ Campbell's roster features six international players from five different countries: Australia, Canada, Guyana, Lithuania (2), Nigeria.
- ▶ Campbell has had at least one international player every season since 2000 with the exception of the 2014-15 season.
- ▶ CU's record for internationals in one season is 7 (2023-24).

FROM DOWNTOWN

- ▶ Campbell has made at least one three-pointer in 409 consecutive games (since Dec. 4, 2012), a program record. The new record mark was set on Feb. 26, 2024 against UNCW.
- ▶ The previous program record was 363 straight (Dec. 27, 1996- Dec. 14, 2009).
- ▶ CU teammates Chris Clemons (10-14) and Marcus Burk (10-16) become the first teammates in D1 history to both knock down 10 threes in a game in a 94-85 win at Liberty on Jan. 23, 2018.

AT HOME IN GORE ARENA

- ▶ Campbell stands at 165-89 all-time at Gore Arena, which has served as Campbell's home since 2008.
- ▶ 3,095 seat Gore Arena has twice hosted the Big South Championship (2016, 2019)
- ▶ A record 3,351 fans packed the building on Mar. 2, 2019 for the regular season finale when Campbell defeated Radford 64-62 to claim the Big South crown.
- ▶ Chris Clemons owns the top five scoring performances in Gore Arena history going for 48, 44, 39, 39, and 37 at home.
- ▶ Gore Arena opened in fall of 2008 to replace 947-seat Carter Gym, which was home to Campbell hoops from 1953-2008. Carter, still home to CU intramurals, was the second-smallest capacity building in NCAA D1 at the time of the move to Gore.

#PROHUMPS

- ▶ Campbell has 14 former players playing overseas.

THE ROAD TO THE CAPITAL

- ▶ The CAA Championship will be Mar. 6-10 at CareFirst Arena in Washington, D.C.
- ▶ The early rounds are broadcast on FloCollege, with the semifinals and championship on CBS Sports Network.
- ▶ The Camels remain in search of their first CAA Tournament win, bowing out in the second round (following a bye) each year thus far.

WHY THE CAMELS?

- ▶ Many stories exist, and there is still some uncertainty as to why the moniker Fighting Camels was chosen...
- ▶ A major fire destroyed all but one original campus building in the early 1900s. As the schools founder and president J.A. Campbell bemoaned the fate of his institution, Z.T Kivett encouraged him "You're name's Campbell; then get a hump on you! We've got work to do." Campbell thought he said "You're a Camel, get a hump on you." Hence the nickname.
- ▶ Campbell's athletic team's were initially called the Hornets along with other references as the Campbells or Campbellites.
- ▶ The change to the Camels came in late 1933 or early 1934. From that point on, all Campbell athletic teams have proudly worn the Camel mascot.
- ▶ Campbell remains the only D1 program to use the "Fighting Camels" nickname.
- ▶ NCAA DIII Connecticut College also uses the Camels.

vs Green Bay (W, 102-79)

- ▶ Campbell scored 58 points in the second half to race past Green Bay 102-79.
- ▶ It was the first time CU had scored 100 points in regulation against a D1 opponent since 2007.
- ▶ Campbell shot 71.9% in the second half, the sixth-best mark in program history against a D1 opponent.
- ▶ Campbell scored 1.54 points per possession (OE 159.3), the best offensive efficiency mark in the KenPom Era (since 1997)
- ▶ Jeremiah Johnson scored a career-high 27 against his former team (played for GB last season).
- ▶ Cam Gregory scored a Campbell career high 18, with 16 of those in the second half.
- ▶ Campbell did all this without Chris Fields Jr. (injury), the third leading scorer and leading rebounder.

at Minnesota (L, 50-78)

- ▶ Campbell fell at Minnesota to end a long road trip that saw the Camels on the road for six straight nights.
- ▶ Jeremiah Johnson paced the Camels with 17 points, the only scorer in double figures.
- ▶ Campbell couldn't slow down Cade Tyson, the nation's third leading scorer, who finished with 24 points.
- ▶ The Camels shot only 34.8% from the floor while Minnesota shot 57.7%.

at No. 7 Gonzaga (L, 70-98)

- ▶ Campbell trailed by only 10 with 10 minutes left, but came up short in The Kennel at No. 7 Gonzaga.
- ▶ Dovydas Butka scored 19 points and DJ Smith added 18 to pace the Camels.
- ▶ Gonzaga's Braden Huff set CU opponent records for FG made (16) and FG% (88.8%) en route to a game-high 37 points.
- ▶ Campbell gave the 'Zags their closest game with a mid-major this season, and lost by less than both Kentucky (35) and Maryland (39).

vs Ball State (W, 69-64)

- ▶ Tied at the half, CU outscored Ball State 39-34 in the second half to pick up the W.
- ▶ DJ Smith gave CU the lead for good with 2:30 left, scoring 7 of Campbell's last 9 points to seal the win.
- ▶ Chris Fields (14 & 14) and Dovydas Butka (22 & 10) both logged double doubles. Fields nearly had his in the first half with 11-9 at the break. Butka worked in the second half with 13 & 8 after halftime.

vs Va. Lynchburg (W, 149-62)

- ▶ Campbell trounced Va. Lynchburg 149-62, shattering multiple school records in the process.
- ▶ Total Points: 149... 1st half: 75... 2nd half: 74... Margin of Victory: 87... FG Made: 63... FG Attempts: 98... Rebounds: 70... Assists: 41... Individual Rebounds (D1 era): 22, Chris Fields Jr... Individual FG % (15+ att.): 93.3 (14-15) Muneer Newton...
- ▶ Campbell also set CAA records for points, FG made, and assists.
- ▶ Chris Fields Jr. logged the first triple-double in program history with 23 points, 22 rebounds, and 11 assists.
- ▶ Campbell hit the century mark with 13:30 to play in the game, and set an arena scoring record with more than 10 minutes left.
- ▶ Seven Camels scored in double figures, and three had 20+ points.
- ▶ Both Fields and Gregory dished out 11 assists, both good for the most assists by a Camel since 2013 (Trey Freeman).

at Penn State (L, 76-87)

- ▶ Campbell trailed by five with less than two minutes to go, but came up short in the 11-point loss.
- ▶ 17 Campbell turnovers led to 22 points for Penn State. Campbell turned it over 12 times in the first half.
- ▶ DJ Smith led the way with 19 points on 5-11 from three.
- ▶ Dovy Butka posted 15 points, 9 rebounds, and 4 assists.
- ▶ CU connected on 8 3FGs, tied for second most on the year.

at Wake Forest (L, 51-99)

- ▶ The Camels suffered their largest loss since 2004 in a 99-51 defeat at Wake Forest.
- ▶ The 48-point defeat was the sixth-largest for Campbell in its D1 era (since 1977-78).
- ▶ Chris Fields Jr led the way with 12 points and 9 rebounds.
- ▶ Campbell shot just 4-26 from 3 (15.4%) while Wake shot 12-29 (41%) from distance.

vs UT Arlington (W, 71-67)

- ▶ Campbell trailed by 9 with 10 minutes to play, but rallied for the four point win.
- ▶ Jeremiah Johnson scored 8 straight for the Camels in the final 2:30 to give Campbell the lead.
- ▶ DJ Smith logged his fifth 20 point game of the season.
- ▶ Dovydas Butka logged 17 & 9, narrowly missing his third straight double-double.
- ▶ Campbell again lived at the foul line, taking 32 FTs and hitting 19.

at Weber State (L, 91-85)

- ▶ CU trailed by as many as 21 with 10 minutes to play, and cut the deficit to just one point, but could not complete the full comeback.
- ▶ The Camels set a program record for free throw percentage with at least 30 attempts, going 28-31 at the foul line (90.3%).
- ▶ DJ Smith turned in his fourth 20-point game with 22 points.
- ▶ Dovydas Butka logged a 20 & 10 double-double, his second straight double-double.

vs Mid-Atlantic Christian (W, 108-55)

- ▶ CU finished two points shy of the arena record in the blowout.
- ▶ Dovydas Butka hauled in 16 rebounds to tie the arena record, the most by a Camel since 2012 (Darren White).
- ▶ CU outrebounded the Mustangs 55-22, one rebound shy of the arena record.
- ▶ Campbell went 30-39 at the foul line, taking 27 FTs in just the first half.
- ▶ Five Camels scored in double figures, with all 10 that played scoring at least three points.

vs Western Michigan (W, 91-82)

- ▶ John Andrzejek's first career win as Head Coach.
- ▶ CU shot 41 FTs (29-41) its most since the 2013 season.
- ▶ DJ Smith scored a career-high 29 points thanks to shooting 6-12 from beyond the arc.
- ▶ Dovydas Butka just missed a double-double with 19 points and 9 rebounds.
- ▶ Five Camels finished with double figure scoring.

at West Virginia (L, 65-73)

- ▶ Campbell took WVU to the wire, never trailing by more than 10 and getting the deficit only four points with less than two minutes to play.
- ▶ Campbell outrebounded the Mountaineers thanks to 15 boards by Chris Fields Jr., the most by a Camel since the 2019 season.
- ▶ Four Camels scored in double figures for the second straight game.

No. 24 Wisconsin (L, 64-96)

- ▶ Campbell trailed by five with 8 minutes to go in the game, but Wisconsin pulled away late in the season opener.
- ▶ CU nabbed an early lead and led for the first nine minutes of the ballgame.
- ▶ DJ Smith led CU with 23 points on 8-15 FG, 4-10 3FG, including a four-point play at the halftime buzzer.
- ▶ Campbell did not make a field goal in the final 10 minutes.
- ▶ Chris Fields Jr. scored 13 off the bench.

#0 Chris Fields Jr.

6-7, Jr., F | Petersburg, Va.

- ▶ Recorded first triple-double in program history with 23 points, 22 rebounds, 11 assists vs Va. Lynchburg
- ▶ Holds program D1 record for rebounds with 22 vs VUL.
- ▶ Hauled in 15 rebounds at WVU, the most by a Camel since the 2019 season.
- ▶ Transfer from Norfolk State, won MEAC Championship and advanced to NCAA Tournament in 2024-25.
- ▶ Averaged 8.4 points, 4.3 rebounds last season.
- ▶ Scored 14 points against Florida and Coach Andrzejek in NCAAT First Round game in Raleigh, NC

#1 Tasos Cook

6-2, Gr., G | Columbus, Ohio

- ▶ Team captain, has appeared in more games for CU (56) than any player on roster
- ▶ Started seven of nine games to end last season and shined, averaging 10.8 ppg in final nine games of season.
- ▶ Scored 19 points twice last season, both against Delaware including one of those in the CAA tournament.

#2 Jeremiah Johnson

Founded in 1887 as Buies Creek Academy, Campbell is a private, Christian liberal arts university located in the North Carolina Sandhills region between Raleigh and Fayetteville. Campbell operated as a junior college from 1926-61 before reaching senior college status in 1961 and university status in 1979. The University now includes College of Arts and Sciences, College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, Divinity School, School of Education, Lundy-Fetterman School of Business, School of Engineering, Jerry M. Wallace Osteopathic Medicine, Catherine W. Wood School of Nursing, Wiggins School of Law. Campbell also maintains a degree program at the Tunku Abdul Rahman College in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

Former head coach Fred McCall and Wake Forest coach Bones McKinney founded the Campbell Basketball School in 1956 becoming the nation's oldest and largest summer basketball camp in continuous operation. The school has included guest coaches and instructors like John Wooden, Press and Pete Maravich, Michael Jordan, and five others on the NBA's all-time Top 50 list. The school grew to over 2,000 kids in a three-week period in gymnasiums throughout Harnett County.

A member of the Coastal Athletic Association since July 1, 2023, Campbell joined NCAA D1 as an independent in men's sports in the fall of 1977, and became a charter member of the Big South conference in 1983. Campbell moved to the ASUN in 1994 before rejoining the Big South in 2011. In 39 years as a D1 member, Campbell has won 114 conference titles, including 52 Big South Championships from 2011-23. Men's basketball claimed the 1992 Big South title to reach the NCAA tournament, and the women reached the NCAA tournament for the first time in 2000.

Campbell's Notable Alumni include the NCAA's fourth-leading scorer Chris Clemons, former Charlotte Hornets President and COO Fred Whitfield, MLB Players Jim and Gaylord Perry, Los Angeles Angels Shortstop Zach Neto, New York Mets centerfielder Cedric Mullins, Arizona Diamondbacks reliever Ryan Thompson, New York Yankees pitcher Allan Winans.

Campbell unveiled a new visual identity on July 1, 2023 including new logos and wordmarks, a simplified color palette, and official typography fonts. The evolution of Campbell Athletics reflects the strength and resiliency of the Fighting Camel, while honoring both the past and present. The new primary mark streamlines the Fighting Camel with an even stronger, bolder stance, allowing for improved functionality in application, while giving Campbell student athletes, coaches, staff, and fans alike a championship caliber look to match its program's achievements in competition.

- ▶ In 2007 it was the second-smallest D1 gym in the nation (only Charleston Southern was smaller)
- ▶ Campbell went 173-106 record inside the "Carter Dome," and the ladies went 286-115 at the site.
- ▶ The gym also hosted a 13-OT game between Boone Trail and Harnett for the 1964 high school title, the longest basketball game in USA high school basketball history. Boone Creek won 5654, and neither team made a substitution during the contest!

The Chris Clemons Era

- ▶ Chris Clemons wrapped up his career at #3 on the NCAA all-time leading scoring list with 3,225 points (now fourth place).
- ▶ Clemons averaged 24.8 ppg during his four years in The Creek, and was a third team all-American in 2019.
- ▶ He led the nation in scoring in 2018-19, pouring in 30.1 ppg.
- ▶ He posted a career-high 51 in the Big South tournament against UNC Asheville on Mar. 2, 2017, and eclipsed 40 points five times.
- ▶ He did all this standing at just 5'9"
- ▶ His #3 has been permanently retired at Campbell.



John Andrzejek

1st Season Columbia, '13

John Andrzejek was named the sixth head coach in Campbell Basketball history on Mar. 20, 2025. At 32 years old he is the third youngest head coach in the country.

Prior to Campbell, Andrzejek spent two years at Florida, helping the Gators win the 2025 national championship as their defensive coordinator. He helped guide Florida to a 60-16 record during his two seasons in Gainesville, and added an SEC Tournament title as well in 2025. There, he coached first-team

all-American Walter Clayton Jr., and helped the Gators knock off eight Top-25 teams, including the No. 1 team in the nation twice during the season.

Prior to his stint in Gainesville, Andrzejek spent four seasons (2019-23) as an assistant coach with Washington State, working under Kyle Smith. During his time in Pullman, he helped the Cougars earn a pair of top-10 wins over No. 8 Oregon and No. 5 Arizona State.

Prior to WSU, he spent one season as an assistant at Dartmouth in 2018-19, and another at Johns Hopkins (2017-18). He also served as a director of basketball operations at San Francisco in 2016-17.

Andrzejek graduated in just two and a half years with a degree in philosophy from Columbia in 2013. Andrzejek served as the Lions' team manager during the 2012-13 and 2013-14 campaigns before being hired as the director of basketball operations in July of 2014.

Among career accomplishments, Andrzejek was named to ESPN's 40 Under 40 list in 2020 as the youngest coach on the list when published. He is also a three-time participant in the TopConnect Program for the top assistant coaches in D1 basketball.

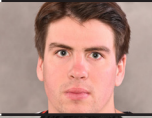
