SCOUTING KENTUCKY CHRISTIAN

The Knights enter the week with a record of 0-5 and they are coming in off of their bye week. Kentucky Christian ranks last in the NAIA in scoring defense as it has allowed 56.2 points per game over its first five games this season. The fewest amount of points the Knights have given up this season in 43 during week three in a 43-14 loss at home to Union College. Kentucky Christian has also allowed the fifth-most points in a single game in the nation after allowing University of Pikeville to score 70 points in week four. The Knights have also struggled on offense scoring just 16 points per game -- which is 76th in the nation and 16th in the Mid-South Conference. Despite the defensive struggles, Emmett Keyes and Harmand St. Hubert have each recorded two of the team seven picks this season to rank 20th in the country as individuals. Braden Brown has highlighted the special teams for the Knights with 272 kickoff return yards to rank 18th in the NAIA. Kentucky Christian has compiled 1,280 rushing yards and 1,047 passing yards. A pair of freshmen have guided the Knight offense this season with Jakwon Roberts leading the passing game with 794 yards and three touchdowns, while De'Anta Sipp has 319 rushing yards over five games. Sipp, who also has a pair of rushing touchdowns, is the only rusher for the Knights to surpass 100 yards this season.

HOME COOKING

For the first time since, Thursday, August 24, the Campbellsville football team is set to play a home football game. This is the first time in school history that the Tigers have not played a home game in month of September. Three times prior (1999, 2003, 2013) Campbellsville did not have its first home game in September until the last week of the month. The 2003 season was also the last time in school history, the Tigers started the season 3-0. During the 2003 season, Campbellsville lost its home opener on Sept. 27 to slip to 3-1 on the year after playing its first three games away from home and all three games came outside of the state of Kentucky.

RETURNING WITH A BANG

After a 27-day layoff in between games, Campbellsville returned with an instant classic game, winning on walkoff rushing touchdown in overtime against Bethel University, 43-37, to start Mid-South Conference Bluegrass Division play. The Tigers also picked up solid individual performances on the field from Keanu Young and Justin Manning. Young caught 11 passes for 200 yards and a touchdown. He now sits tied for fifth all-time in receptions in a single game, while recording just the second 200-yard receiving game in school history. Both are also new career highs. Manning now leads the Mid-South with 12.3 tackles per game this season after recording 16 total tackles against the Wildcats. Both Young and Manning garnered Mid-South Conference Player of the Week honors.

A FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

Kentucky Christian has a young roster this season with 12 total freshmen projected to start this week against the Tigers. Just one senior is listed on the depth chart for the Knights this week as Emmett Keyes -- who anchors the defense with 46 tackles and two picks -- is the lone senior among Kentucky Christian's No. 1's and No. 2's. Along with the 12 freshmen listed to start, 22 freshmen are listed on the two deep and nine sophomores are listed. On the overall roster, the Knights have three seniors to go along with 54 dressed freshmen and 15 sophomores.

FINDING THE OLD FORM

After the extended time off, the Tigers are looking to pickup their old form as they enter what is nearly like their second home opener of the season. In facing divisional foes who are in mid-season form and have played five or six games. Campbellsville will need to regain its mid-season form quickly. Hunter Brown still leads the NAIA with 370 passing yards a game, while Justin Manning is the top tackler in the conference and third in the nation with 12.3 per game. As a team, the Tigers rank third in the NAIA with 370 passing yards per game and ninth in total offense after averaging 511.7 yards over their first three games. Campbellsville also ranks inside the top 10 with 26.3 first downs a game.

Campbellsville's All-Time Record on October 7

Campbellsville is 1-3-1 all-time on Oct. 7. The Tigers earned the program's only tie, 20-20, at home against Kentucky Wesleyan in the 1989 season.

In 1995, Campbellsville suffered a 35-14 loss on the road to North Greenville. The lone Tiger win on the date came in 2000, when Campbellsville edged Belhaven on the road, 35-34.

The Tigers have lost their last two games on this date -- both at home -- to Cumberlands in 2006, 27-12, and Georgetown in 2010, 52-21.

A CLOSE KNIT SERIES

Despite Campbellsville holding a 4-1 all-time series lead over Kentucky Christian, the series has been close as of late. The Knights won the last matchup between the two programs at home, 12-6, during the 2014 season. Along with Kentucky Christian winning the last game, three of the last four games have been decided by six points or less. In 2012, the Tigers escaped with a 15-14 road win, while earning a 24-21 victory in 2011. The average margin of victory in the series is 9.2 points in favor of Campbellsville. However, if the first matchup is taken out -- where the Tigers won by 31 points in 2010 -- Campbellsville has a 3.75 margin of victory over the last four games against the Knights.

BACK IN THE POLL...ALMOST

For the first time since the 2016 preseason poll, Campbellsville earned a mention in the NAIA Coaches' Top 25 poll this week. The Tigers are one of four teams to have earned five voting points to sit four spots outside of the top 25. A total of seven team from the Mid-South Conference earned a mention in the national rating this week, including four from the Bluegrass Division. Lindsey Wilson College and Georgetown College lead the division with top-10 rankings this week. Overall, Reinhardt University from the MSC Appalachian leads all conference teams at No. 3. Defending national champion University of St. Francis continues to hold the No. 1 ranking in the poll.

SEASON OF SIGNIFICANCE

Along with the 30th anniversary of the Campbellsville football program, each week has carried new significance for the Tiger football program. Week one saw head coach Perry Thomas coach in his 100th career collegiate football game -- all which have come at Campbellsville. Week two then saw Thomas pickup his 50th career collegiate head coaching victory. During the third game of the season, the Tiger earned victory No. 150 as a program. This week carries a brand new significance. After starting the season 3-0 for the first time since 2003, a victory on Saturday will give Campbellsville its first 4-0 start since 2001.

RELIVING THE EARLY 2000s

Campbellsville went into overtime at Bethel for the first time since 2005, when the Tigers needed more than four quarters to defeat Lambuth University on the road. In the last overtime game for Campbellsville it edged the

Eagles 20-14 in the first overtime period. Greg Fountain ran in from 15 yards out to give the Tigers just their third victory of the season.

PERFORMING IN CRUNCH TIME

With Campbellsville down by a touchdown with less than two minutes to play, Bethel had the ball and BJ Pelt pounced on a loose ball following a bad snap with 1:37 left in regulation. Hunter Brown led Campbellsville down field 40 yards in 1:12 to set up Bradley Bates for a 26-yard field goal opportunity. Despite hitting one of his first five field goals this season and missing his first two field goal tries of the game, Bates came in clutch and converted on the 26-yard field goal to tie the game with 25 seconds left and sent the game into overtime. In the first overtime session, the Tiger defense forced the Wildcats into a 4th & 1, where Bethel decided to go for the first down. The Wildcats converted on their first two fourth-down attempts of the game, but Campbellsville's defense clamped down and did not allow Bethel to get the first down forcing a turnover-on-downs and giving the Tiger offense the ball needing a score of any kind for the victory. Hunter Brown handed the ball off to Chantz Goodman on first and second down looking to give Bates a shot at the game-winning field goal. However, on 3rd & 5, Goodman got the ball for the third-straight play and he broke out for a 20-yard rush to seal the victory for the Tigers, 43-37.

This game became an instant Campbellsville Classic. And rightfully so! Hurricanes put the Tigers season on hold for almost a month. Needless to say, it was like a first game of the season when the Tigers stepped off the buses at McKenzie, Tennessee, on the last day of September 2017. CU looked sharp taking the game's first possession driving 66-yards down field and taking a seven-oh lead less than three-minutes into the game. Bethel answered with 17-straight points. It became the first time of the day the Tigers trailed by 10 to Bethel. The Tigers clawed back to take a 21-17 lead at the half. It was a three and out for Bethel to open the second half. But about mid-way through the third quarter, the Wildcats regained the lead at 23 to 21. CU bounced back ahead 27 to 23 only to see a field goal blocked and returned for a 70-yard touchdown putting Bethel back in front 30 to 27. An early fourth quarter TD pushed the Wildcats ahead by ten. With less than five-minutes to go, the Tigers drove 87 yards with Wade Holtsclaw running the final 21-yards to the west end zone. Campbellsville's first and only take away could not have come at a better time. With about a minute left, no time outs, and the ball at midfield, Hunter Brown and the Tigers battled down to the Bethel nine where Bradley Bates booted through the game tying field goal from 26-yards out. After two ties and five lead changes, the Tigers were looking for one more lead change, and they got it. It came in overtime. After holding Bethel on a fourth and one, CU took over and capped its possession with a 20-yard touchdown jaunt by Chantz Goodman. Final score. Campbellsville 43 Bethel 37. And that's today's Tiger Tales.

PERRY THOMAS HEAD COACH - 10th SEASON

Perry Thomas is entering his 10th season as head coach of the Fighting Tiger football program.

After a 3-7 record in 2013, Thomas has turned the football program around and has recorded the most successful two-year stint in CU history. In 2014 and 2015, the Fighting Tigers have a 15-7 record and knocked off five teams that were ranked inside the NAIA Top 8. Campbellsville broke 23

program records in 2015 en route to winning its second-straight Mid-South Conference West Division title and earning two-straight NAIA Football Championship Series playoff berths.

The MSC title in 2014 was the first since 1997 and the playoff berth was the first since 2001.

The Tigers took a step back in 2016 by going 2-8 overall. CU battled season-ending injuries and only starting one upperclassmen on the defensive side of the ball.

Thomas inherited the Campbellsville University football program in December 2007, coming off an 0-10 season. After posting a 3-8 record his first season in 2008, and finishing runner-up in the Mid-South Conference East Division in 2009 at 7-4, Thomas' program was named the No. 20 most improved program in all levels of college football and the No. 6 most improved in the NAIA. In 2010, he posted a 7-5 record, giving the Tigers their first back-to-back winning seasons in nearly a decade and took CU to the postseason for the first time since 2001 with a trip to the NCCAA Victory Bowl. The Tigers returned to the Victory Bowl in 2011, winning their first NCCAA title on their home field.

During the 2009 season, Thomas put Campbellsville's defense among the nation's best in third down situations and inside the Red Zone, as the Tigers posted their first winning season since 2004 and best finish since 2003, at 7-4. He led the Tigers to their first win over rival Georgetown College since 1997, with a 28-21 victory at home and also knocked off a Top 10 team in Shorter College, 42-28, in the CollegeFanz/NAIA National Game of the Week. During the season, the Tigers returned to the NAIA National Rankings for the first time in five seasons, ranking as high as No. 24 and finishing the year at No. 28.

As a first-year college head coach in 2008, Thomas coached the NAIA's leading rusher, Greg Fountain, who was his first NAIA All-American and later signed a pro contract in Europe. Calvin Bini became Thomas' second NAIA All-American in 2010 and also went on to play pro ball with the Indoor Football League.

Over the past five seasons, CU has had five NAIA All-American, 35 Mid-South Conference All-Conference selections, nine All-Conference Honorable Mentions and 37 Academic All-Conference selections. Thomas' team also had the 2009 Mid-South Conference Champion of Character Award given to one of his players, Calvin Bini. In 2010, the program was awarded the NAIA Champion of Character Team Award.

Before coming to Campbellsville, Thomas posted a successful, 16-year career as a high school coach in Kentucky, leading his team to the Kentucky State High School Football Playoffs each year he was a head coach. His 16-year record as a high school head coach is 133-64. His coaching career began in 1986 as a volunteer assistant at Allen County-Scottsville High School and he was an assistant coach for the Patriots in 1987. He then became defensive coordinator at Campbellsville High School from 1988-1991.

From 2000-2007, Thomas guided the Blue Tornado of Paducah Tilghman High School to a 70-31 record, including eight playoff appearances, five district championships, two regional championships and two state semi-final appearances. His 2007 team finished the season 9-5 and was eliminated in the state semi-finals 17-14 on a last second field goal by eventual Kentucky State Champion Louisville Central High School.

From 1992 through 1999 he was the head coach at Campbellsville High School where he compiled a 63-33 record. Thomas led the Eagle program to eight straight playoff appearances and had two district and one regional championship along with one state semi-final appearance.

Thomas has been named District and/or Region Coach of the Year nine times during his career and was named the 1993 and 1997 Kentucky Class A Coach of the Year by the Courier-Journal. He is a five-time coaching staff member of the Kentucky vs. Tennessee All-Star Team and was the Head Coach of the Kentucky All-Stars in 2006. Thomas was also a National Finalist for the American Football Coaches Association "Power of Influence" Award in 2005 and 2006 and received the Joe Russell Distinguished Leadership Award from the Western Kentucky Conference in 2003 and 2006.
