SNAPPING A LOSING STREAK

Campbellsville started the season strong with a 28-14 victory over University of Pikeville last week. The victory marked the first season opening win since the 2011 season when the Tigers took down Union College, 30-14. The win over Pikeville was also the first home opening win for Campbellsville since 2013, where the Tigers defeated Belhaven University, 54-22. Since Perry Thomas took over as head coach in 2008, Campbellsville is now 4-6 all-time in season openers. In program history, the Tigers are 13-17 in season openers.

SCOUTING POINT

Point started its first season as a member of the Mid-South Conference Appalachian Division with a 10-7 victory over Webber International University on the road last week. In a game that was halted late in the fourth quarter due to weather, the Skyhawks rebounded from an early 7-0 deficit to score 10-unanswered points in the second half to come away with a 10-7 victory. Point had a balanced offensive attack with 206 passing yards and 142 rushing yards. Dual-threat quarterback Derek Bellard led the way for the Skyhawks with 206 passing yards and 80 rushing yards. In the receiving game, Charles Ducksworth was one of Bellard's main targets with four catches for 76 yards, while Ricardo Sloan made three catches for 26 yards and a touchdown. The Point defense held Webber International to just 212 total yards and 61 passing yards. The Warriors completed just eight of its 22 pass attempts in the game. Kendall Hillman led the Skyhawk secondary with five pass breakups and four tackles. Kadaymen Johnson tied a game-high with 12 tackles -- eight solo -- to go along with two tackles for loss and a sack. The Point defense forced two turnovers, but the turnover battle ended all square after Bellard threw two interceptions in the game.

DEFENSE CRACKS DOWN

The Campbellsville defense started the season strong only allowing Pikeville to score 14 points in the game last week. The Tiger defense also did not allow the Bears into the red zone the entire night. Outside of the two touchdowns for the Bears -- which were from 34 and 24 yards out -- the closest Pikeville got to the red zone was on its final drive of the game, when it turned the ball over on fourth down on the Campbellsville 25-yard line. The Tigers limited the Bears to six drives that lasted longer than five plays, while Campbellsville forced five three-and-outs.

CONTROLLING THE BALL

The Campbellsville offense controlled the time of possession in the game holding the ball for 33:52. Along with winning the possession battle, the Tiger offense did not have a three-and-out until its second to last possession of the game. Outside of the Tigers one-play drive at the end of the first half and back-to-back three-play drives to end the game, Campbellsville's shortest drive of the game was four plays, which ended in a Wade Holtsclaw touchdown run. The Tigers ended the game with three drives of at least 10 plays.

OFFENSIVE LINE DOING ITS JOB

The Campbellsville offensive line kept Hunter Brown clean for most of the game as the Tigers surrendered just one sack, which occurred in the fourth quarter. Along with allowing just the one sack, the offensive line limited the pressure in the backfield last week as Pikeville generated just four tackles for a loss that totaled just nine negative yards throughout the game. The experience on front line also helped the Tigers generate 502 yards of offense.

MAKING A GREAT FIRST IMPRESSION

BJ Pelt -- who transferred to Campbellsville from Scottsdale Community College this season -- made a great first impression for the Tigers recording the lone turnover of the game for Campbellsville with an interception in the fourth quarter, which helped the Tigers shutout Pikeville in the fourth quarter of the game. Along with the interception, Pelt finished the game with seven tackles, a team-high six solo tackles and four pass breakups.

FILLING THE VOID NICELY

The Campbellsville wide receiving core stepped up to the task in filling the shoes of former Tiger wide out Tyus Alcorn. Kendon Young caught all three touchdown passes from Hunter Brown during Campbellsville's win over Pikeville last week. Young -- who caught five touchdown passes all last season -- set a new career-high with three touchdown receptions in a game. Zerric Willis led the Campbellsville offense with 86 receiving yards on seven catches, while Jordan Duff and Chantz Goodman had 74 and 71 receiving yards, respectively.

FINDING A BREAKTHROUGH ON SPECIAL TEAMS

The Campbellsville special teams unit is looking for a breakthrough during its game at Point this week. The Tigers only had one kick return for 16 yards, while recording zero yards on three punt return attempts. Also, Bradley Bates missed both of his field goal attempts against Pikeville. However, Noah Bicksler and Hunter Brown helped pin Pikeville deep in their own end of the field with a combined three punts inside the Bears 20-yard line. Bicksler also recorded a career-best punt of 53 yards in the game.

GIVING AWAY YARDS

Last week, Campbellsville was penalized nine times for 101 yards. Of the nine penalties, the Tigers gave Pikeville three first downs via penalties. Two of the three penalties that gave the Bears a first down occurred on third down and both came on Pikeville's first touchdown drive of the game, which tied the score a seven in the second quarter. The Tigers racked up the ninth-most penalty yards in the nation during week one of the season.

LOOKING FOR ANOTHER MILESTONE

In Campbellsville's 28-14 victory over Pikeville last week, Perry Thomas coached in his 100th career collegiate football game. Coming into this week's matchup against Point, Thomas is looking for his 50th career victory as a head coach. All-time, Thomas is 49-51 as a collegiate head coach with all 100 games coming at the helm of the Campbellsville football program.

FACING A BRAND NEW OPPONENT

Campbellsville is set to face Point for the first time in program history. The Skyhawks become the Tigers' 55th different opponent in program history. All-Time, Campbellsville is 24-30 when facing a new opponent for the first time. In the Perry Thomas era, the Tigers are an even 6-6

when facing a brand new opponent. The last new opponent Campbellsville faced was in the season finale last year, when the Tigers took down Cincinnati Christian University, 49-0.

GETTING EXPERIENCE ON THE FLY

Point is set to have 17 players make their first appearance during the 2017 season. All seven players set to make their first appearance on the defensive side of the ball this season are listed second on the Skyhawks depth chart. On offense, 10 players are making a season debut with five coming on the offensive line. Point has a youthful offensive front with just two seniors set to start on the offensive line this week, along with two sophomores and a freshman. The defensive side of the ball has a similar look with four sophomore starters and a pair of freshmen.

TRYING TO FLIP THE TIDE IN ALABAMA

Despite playing at Point University, which is based out of West Point, Georgia, Campbellsville is set to play the Skyhawks at Ram Stadium in Valley, Alabama on the campus of Valley High School. All-time, the Tigers are 1-2 in games played in the state of Alabama. The three previous games have all come against former MSC West Division foe, Faulkner University. However, the last time Campbellsville played in Alabama, it came away with a 59-50 win over Faulkner on October 13, 2015. The victory helped propel the Tigers to the MSC West title.

Perry Thomas coached Campbellsville Tiger Football teams have had more than their share of opening season losses; close ones at that. During Thomas' tenure, his Tigers are 4-6 in first games of the season. One of those victories was on the road with the other three coming at Finley Stadium. The 2017 season opener snapped a five-game skid of losses for Thomas and the Tigers. In fact, it was the second biggest margin of victory in a first game during the Thomas Era. The biggest win? Well, that was in 2011 when Campbellsville last won on opening night. It was a 30-14 victory over Union College on Citizens Bank Field. From that night until August 24, 2017, Campbellsville had lost all its season christening games by an average of less than a touchdown. A win today against the Point Skyhawks marks the third time a Perry Thomas coached Tiger team started a season at 2-0. PERRY THOMAS HEAD COACH - 10th SEASON

Perry Thomas is entering his 10th season as head coach of the Fighting Tiger football program.

After a 3-7 record in 2013, Thomas has turned the football program around and has recorded the most successful two-year stint in CU history. In 2014 and 2015, the Fighting Tigers have a 15-7 record and knocked off five teams that were ranked inside the NAIA Top 8. Campbellsville broke 23

program records in 2015 en route to winning its second-straight Mid-South Conference West Division title and earning two-straight NAIA Football Championship Series playoff berths.

The MSC title in 2014 was the first since 1997 and the playoff berth was the first since 2001.

The Tigers took a step back in 2016 by going 2-8 overall. CU battled season-ending injuries and only starting one upperclassmen on the defensive side of the ball.

Thomas inherited the Campbellsville University football program in December 2007, coming off an 0-10 season. After posting a 3-8 record his first season in 2008, and finishing runner-up in the Mid-South Conference East Division in 2009 at 7-4, Thomas' program was named the No. 20 most improved program in all levels of college football and the No. 6 most improved in the NAIA. In 2010, he posted a 7-5 record, giving the Tigers their first back-to-back winning seasons in nearly a decade and took CU to the postseason for the first time since 2001 with a trip to the NCCAA Victory Bowl. The Tigers returned to the Victory Bowl in 2011, winning their first NCCAA title on their home field.

During the 2009 season, Thomas put Campbellsville's defense among the nation's best in third down situations and inside the Red Zone, as the Tigers posted their first winning season since 2004 and best finish since 2003, at 7-4. He led the Tigers to their first win over rival Georgetown College since 1997, with a 28-21 victory at home and also knocked off a Top 10 team in Shorter College, 42-28, in the CollegeFanz/NAIA National Game of the Week. During the season, the Tigers returned to the NAIA National Rankings for the first time in five seasons, ranking as high as No. 24 and finishing the year at No. 28.

As a first-year college head coach in 2008, Thomas coached the NAIA's leading rusher, Greg Fountain, who was his first NAIA All-American and later signed a pro contract in Europe. Calvin Bini became Thomas' second NAIA All-American in 2010 and also went on to play pro ball with the Indoor Football League.

Over the past five seasons, CU has had five NAIA All-American, 35 Mid-South Conference All-Conference selections, nine All-Conference Honorable Mentions and 37 Academic All-Conference selections. Thomas' team also had the 2009 Mid-South Conference Champion of Character Award given to one of his players, Calvin Bini. In 2010, the program was awarded the NAIA Champion of Character Team Award.

Before coming to Campbellsville, Thomas posted a successful, 16-year career as a high school coach in Kentucky, leading his team to the Kentucky State High School Football Playoffs each year he was a head coach. His 16-year record as a high school head coach is 133-64. His coaching career began in 1986 as a volunteer assistant at Allen County-Scottsville High School and he was an assistant coach for the Patriots in 1987. He then became defensive coordinator at Campbellsville High School from 1988-1991.

From 2000-2007, Thomas guided the Blue Tornado of Paducah Tilghman High School to a 70-31 record, including eight playoff appearances, five district championships, two regional championships and two state semi-final appearances. His 2007 team finished the season 9-5 and was eliminated in the state semi-finals 17-14 on a last second field goal by eventual Kentucky State Champion Louisville Central High School.

From 1992 through 1999 he was the head coach at Campbellsville High School where he compiled a 63-33 record. Thomas led the Eagle program to eight straight playoff appearances and had two district and one regional championship along with one state semi-final appearance.

Thomas has been named District and/or Region Coach of the Year nine times during his career and was named the 1993 and 1997 Kentucky Class A Coach of the Year by the Courier-Journal. He is a five-time coaching staff member of the Kentucky vs. Tennessee All-Star Team and was the Head Coach of the Kentucky All-Stars in 2006. Thomas was also a National Finalist for the American Football Coaches Association "Power of Influence" Award in 2005 and 2006 and received the Joe Russell Distinguished Leadership Award from the Western Kentucky Conference in 2003 and 2006.
