#### **GRIFFS TRAVEL TO ITHACA FOR NCAA OPENING WEEKEND**

The Canisius women's lacrosse team will travel to Ithaca, New York this Friday at 7 p.m. for their NCAA Tournament first-round matchup against No. 8 seed Cornell. The winner of the Canisius-Cornell contest will face the winner of the Princeton-UMass game on Sunday at noon.

#### **SCOUTING THE GOLDEN GRIFFINS**

- ▶ Canisius finished the regular season with a perfect 8-0 record in the MAAC, outscoring their conference opponents, 120-44. Overall, the Griffs are 13-6 in 2016.
- ▶ Canisius is led by MAAC Midfielder of the Year **Erica Evans**, who set numerous records this season, including goals (69) and points (86), while leading the team in draw controls (78), caused turnovers (31) and ground balls (45).
- ▶ MAAC Defensive Player of the Year, Rebecca VanLaeken, holds the second best GAA in team history (8.02), while the team defense boast the best GAA in school history (8.09).
- ▶ The Griffs are one win away from tying a school record for a single-season (14).

#### **2016 MAAC TOURNAMENT RECAP**

- ▶ The Griffs defeated Fairfield 10-7 in the MAAC Semifinals, before cruising to a 17-5 win over Monmouth for the MAAC Championship, the largest ever margin of victory in a MAAC Championship
- Erica Evans set a Canisius tournament record for goals with nine, while being named the tournament

#### **GRIFFS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT**

- ▶ Canisius earned its fifth ever trip to the NCAA Tournament, making all five tournament appearance from 2011 on.
- ▶ The Griffs have never won in the tournament, losing to UMass in 2011 & 2012, Penn State in 2013 and Penn in 2014. Two of the defeats were by just one goal (2012 and 2013).

#### **HOW EVANS STACKS UP NATIONALLY**

- Erica Evans ranks second in the nation in goals per game, being the only player in the country to rank in the top 20 nationally in goals, points (6th) and draw controls (18th) per game.
- Evans and Syracuse's Kayla Treanor are the only two players in the top 20 for points and draw controls in the nation.

#### **GRIFFS GET DEFENSIVE**

- ▶ Entering the weekend, the Griffs rank first in the MAAC in scoring defense and in the top 25 nationally (21).
- ▶ The Golden Griffins goals-against average is the best in school history at 8.09.

#### **VANLAEKEN TAKES CHARGE**

- ▶ In her first full season in net, goalkeeper **Rebecca VanLaeken** has set a record for most games allowing five goals or fewer, with seven.
- ▶ VanLaeken also holds the second best goals-against average in program history at 8.02, while ranking first in the MAAC in GAA (8.02).

#### **PERENNIAL WINNERS**

- ▶ The Golden Griffins are one of only three teams in the nation to win their conference tournament five out of the past six years.
- ▶ Both Massachusetts (six times) and Maryland (five times) have also achieved this level of consistency.

#### **EVANS BREAKS SINGLE SEASON POINTS RECORD**

- Erica Evans recorded seven points in the MAAC Championship game, giving her 86 for the 2016 season, setting a new program record for points in a year.
- ▶ Evans surpassed Maria Kotas' record of 81 on her third goal of the contest.

#### **EVANS NAMED TOURNAMENT MVP**

- **> Erica Evans** was named the MVP of the 2016 MAAC Championship Tournament after scoring five goals with two assists in the championship game.
- ▶ Overall, Evans recorded 12 points on nine goals and three assists in the tournament.

#### **FIVE NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**

▶ Taylor Giglio, Sami Franco, Erica Evans, Rebecca VanLaeken and Jourdan Roemer were each named to the MAAC All-Tournament Team, winning the 2016 MAAC Championship over Monmouth 17-5 this past Sunday.

#### **CANISIUS - CORNELL SERIES HISTORY**

- ▶ The two New York schools have played twice in regular season play before Friday's meeting with the Big Red winning both contests in 2012 and 2013.
- ▶ The schools last met during the 2013 campaign when the current senior classes were freshman. The 16th-ranked Big Red emerged victorious in Buffalo when it used a late 6-1 run en route to a 16-10 victory.

#### **CANISIUS - PRINCETON SERIES HISTORY**

▶ The Griffs and Tigers have never met in women's lacrosse previously.

#### **GRIFFS VERSUS IVY LEAGUE**

- ▶ While looking for the program's first NCAA Tournament victory, the Griffs are also searching for their first win against an Ivy League school.
- ▶ Canisius is 0-5 all-time against the conference, losing twice to Cornel and once each to Columbia, Penn and Yale. The Griffs fell to Columbia, 16-8, earlier this season.
- ▶ The meeting with the Quakers also came in the NCAA Tournament with #13 Penn posting a 9-4 win at Maryland in 2014.

#### **CANISIUS - MASSACHUSETTS SERIES HISTORY**

- ▶ The Griffs and Minutewomen have played twice in postseason play with Massachusetts posting victories at the 2011 and 2012 NCAA Play-In game.
- ▶ In the last meeting between the two schools, the Minutewomen scored with four seconds left in regulation to post a 13-12 victory during the 2012 season.

#### **GRIFFS VERSUS ATLANTIC 10**

- ▶ The Griffs have been more successful against the Atlantic 10 conference, compared to the lvy.
- ▶ Canisius is 11-16 all-time against the conference, posting a 7-7 record against local rival St. Bonaventure, a 4-7 mark versus Duquesne and a 0-2 record against Massachusetts.



#### **GRIFFS AMONG NATIONS BEST**

- ▶ Canisius ranks in the top-25 nationally in several major categories, including points per game (24th), scoring defense (21st), scoring margin (14th), scoring offense (17th), turnovers per game (17th) and win percentage (23rd).
- Erica Evans ranks second in goals per game and sixth in points per game, while Rebecca VanLaeken ranks 22nd in goals-against average.

#### **EVANS ALMIGHTY**

- ▶ Erica Evans has been a force this season, totaling 86 points and 69 goals.
- ▶ Evans leads the Griffs in goals (69), points (86), draw controls (78), caused turnovers (31) and ground balls (45).
- ▶ Evans tied a single game record for goals with eight, against Monmouth on Apr. 16.

#### **EVANS REACHES 100 GOAL MARK FOR CAREER**

- Erica Evans recorded four goals, including the 100th of her career, on her second of the contest in a 10-7 victory over the Fairfield Stags in last Friday's MAAC Semifinal contest.
- ▶ Evans is the first Griff in program history to reach the 100 goal mark as a sophomore.

#### **EVANS SETS SINGLE SEASON GOALS RECORD**

- ▶ Scoring the lone goal for the Golden Griffins in a continuation of a postponement vs. No. 4 Syracuse, Evans passed Morgan Leonard for most goals in a single-season by a Griff (60).
- ▶ The sophomore standout now sits at 69 goals this season, the second most in the country.

#### NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP

- Erica Evans has made a jump in her sophomore season, scoring 31 more goals and 39 more points than her freshman campaign.
- Evans set a program record for most goals and points as a sophomore, and currently ranks seventh in career goals and tenth in career points for Canisius.
- ▶ Her 133 points and 107 goals are the most by a Griff through two seasons of their career.

#### **DRAWN TO PERFECTION**

- Erica Evans is now tied for most draw controls by a Griff in a single game, after tying teammate Ashley Bull's mark of 11, in a 16-8 loss to Columbia on Mar. 21.
- ▶ Evans leads the team in draw controls on the year with 78, ranking fourth in program history.

#### **MALONEY CONTROLS THE DRAW CIRCLE**

- Megan Maloney has taken over the draw circle, in the place of team captain Ashley Bull, who suffered a season ending injury on opening-day.
- ▶ The sophomore has performed admirably in Bull's absence, recording the second most draw controls on the team (50).

#### **CORE FOUR**

- ► Four Griffs have reached the 40-point mark this season, Erica Evans (86), Taylor Giglio (64), Jourdan Roemer (42) and Lauren Smolensky (40).
- ▶ Roemer is one assist away from tying the school's freshman record of 19, while Smolensky is one assist away from moving into the top ten for a season.

#### **GIGLIO CLIMBS RECORD BOOK**

- ▶ Taylor Giglio currently ranks seventh in career points (177), sixth in career goals and seventh in career assists for the Blue and Gold.
- ▶ The senior is tied for 10th for goals in a single season with 44.
- Giglio recorded her 100th career goal in a 16-5 victory over St. Bonaventure, on her second of her three goals March 28.

#### What is a Griffin?

The Griffin is a mythical creature of supposed gigantic size that has the head, forelegs and wings of an eagle and the hindquarters, tail and ears of a lion. They are well known for their speed, ability to fly and having eyes like an eagle as well as the strength and courage of a lion.



Griffins have been known for centuries as symbols of strength and vigilance, have been called "The Hounds of Zeus" in Greek mythology and are said to have mastery of both the land and sky.

They are thought to be from India, where the natives of the land made their talons and claws into drinking cups because the talon of a Griffin was said to detect poison in a liquid. Griffins would find gold in the mountains and line their nests with it and as a result, were forced to become great guardians of the nests to keep the hunters away.

#### ONE FOR THE THUMB

- ▶ Head Coach **Scott Teeter** recorded his fifth MAAC Championship with the Griffs this past Sunday.
- ▶ The Blue and Gold are an astounding 5-2 in MAAC Championship games under Teeter, defeating both Marist and Fairfield twice in the Championship, winning over Monmouth once.

#### **GRIFFS IN THE MAAC**

- ▶ The Golden Griffins rank first in points per game (17.26), scoring defense (8.11), scoring margin (4.37), scoring offense (12.47), turnovers per game (12.32) and win percentage (.684).
- Erica Evans ranks first in the MAAC in goals per game (3.63), while Rebecca VanLaeken ranks first in goals against average (8.02).

#### **CANISIUS CLAIMS SEVERAL MAAC SEASON AWARDS**

- ▶ Erica Evans was named MAAC Midfielder of the Year, sophomore Rebecca VanLaeken was selected as MAAC Defensive Player of the Year, Tessa Chad was picked as the MAAC Rookie of the Year, while head coach Scott Teeter was named Lids Team Sports Coach of the Year.
- Evans and Teeter have now won their respective awards in two-straight season, while Chad, along with **Jourdan Roemer** and **Brenna Shanahan** were named to the MAAC All-Rookie Team.
- ▶ Four Griffs were selected to the All-MAAC First Team, **Taylor Giglio**, **Sami Franco**, Evans and VanLaeken, while Chad was named to the All-MAAC Second Team.

#### **GRIFFS GO BACK-TO-BACK**

- ▶ The Blue and Gold went a perfect 8-0 in MAAC regular season play for a second consecutive season.
- ▶ The Griffs were also perfect in MAAC play in 2013, going 6-0.

#### **GOLDEN GRIFFINS DOMINATE WEEKLY AWARDS**

- ▶ The Griffs gained the most MAAC Player of the Week awards of any team in the conference, totaling 11 for the year
- Erica Evans led all MAAC performers with four player of the week wins, three for offense and one for defense.
- ▶ Jourdan Roemer led all MAAC rookies with three Rookie of the Week wins.

#### **THREE NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS**

▶ Senior **Ashley Bull**, senior **Sami Franco** and sophomore **Nicole Nelson** were each named team captains for the 2016 season.

#### **EVANS NAMED MAAC PRESEASON PLAYER OF YEAR**

- ▶ Erica Evans was named Preseason Player of the Year.
- ▶ She was the first player in the program's history to earn the conference's Rookie of the Year honor, while also becoming the MAAC's first freshman to be named a Player of the Year since 2008.

#### **GRIFFS PICKED FIRST IN COACHES POLL**

- ▶ The Golden Griffins have been predicted to finish as the top team in the MAAC in this years preseason coaches poll.
- ▶ The Griffs received 77 points in the poll, while Fairfield finished second in team voting with 76 points.

#### **FIVE GRIFFS NAMED ALL MAAC**

▶ Sophomore midfielder Erica Evans, along with senior attacker Taylor Giglio, senior midfielder Ashley Bull, senior defender Sami Franco and sophomore defender Nicole Nelson were all named to this years preseason All-MAAC Team.

#### TEETER NAMED HEAD COACH OF CANADIAN NATIONAL TEAM

- ▶ Canisius College women's lacrosse head coach Scott Teeter will serve as the head coach for the Canadian National Team.
- ▶ Teeter is set to lead the team at the 2017 FIL Women's World Cup in Guildford, England.
- ▶ Teeter led the Canadian Under-19 National Team to the country's first gold medal in women's field lacrosse at any level in 2015 by winning the FIL Under-19 World Championship.

#### **GRIFFS WINNING GOLD**

- ▶ Four Griffs spent their summer claiming a gold medal.
- ▶ Scott Teeter, Tessa Chad, Erica Evans and Brenna Shanahan each helped Team Canada to its first gold medal at any level by claiming the 2015 FIL Under-19 World Championship.
- ▶ Evans was named to the All-World Team following her performance.





# Scott Teeter Head Coach • 14th Season 130-114 / 62-31 MAAC

At home and abroad, Scott Teeter has proved to be one of the most successful coaches in women's lacrosse – winning at both the collegiate and international levels.

Now in his 14th season leading the Golden Griffin women's lacrosse team, Teeter has guided Canisius from a team that averaged fewer than two wins per season to a MAAC Championship in each of the last five seasons, including trips to the NCAA Tournament from

2011 to 2014. In 2015, Teeter also led the Canadian National Team to the country's first gold medal by winning the 2015 FIL Under-19 World Championship.

In the last five years, Teeter has made a habit of lifting a trophy at the end of the season. In 2011, Canisius won a school-record 14 games and capped the successful campaign with the program's first MAAC Tournament title. The Griffs also added postseason championships in 2012, 2013 and 2014 – becoming the first school in MAAC history to win four-straight conference titles – while also winning the regular-season crown in 2013 and 2015.

The Griffs have also made their mark on the national scene in the last five years. Canisius finished the 2011 campaign with a final RPI ranking of 24 and ahead of perennial powers Notre Dame, Johns Hopkins, Richmond and Boston University. The 2012 and 2013 teams continued to raise the bar the following two seasons, advancing to the NCAA Tournament before narrowly falling to No. 8/15 Massachusetts, 13-12, in 2012 and No. 7 Penn State, 14-13, in 2013. The 2014 squad earned a marquee win for the program with a victory over Ohio State – a team that finished the season ranked 10th in the final IWLCA poll.

Canisius student-athletes have also been recognized on the national level with eight players earning regional All-America honors in the last five seasons. Maria Kotas and Tori Quinn became the first two Griffs to earn first-team accolades in 2014 and 2015, respectively, while Erica Evans was the first Canisius freshman (and one of just five in the country) to collect the honor in 2015.

The success for the Golden Griffin women's lacrosse team is even more remarkable knowing the rough starting position that Teeter was handed. Canisius won only 11 games and two conference matches in the program's first seven seasons before Teeter made his mark. The 2005 and 2015 MAAC Coach of the Year, Teeter is now the winningest coach in the conference's history with 117 career victories and 54 MAAC wins.

To add to his four MAAC Championships, Teeter has also served as head coach of the Canadian Under-19 National Team since 2009. He guided the team to a bronze-medal showing during the 2011 championship in Hannover, Germany, before earning the country's first women's field lacrosse title at the 2015 FIL World Championship in Edinburgh, Scotland.

The achievements under Teeter are not limited to just the last five years. The highlights include:

- Teeter has recruited and coached two players who competed in the Women's Lacrosse World Cup. He has also coached 13 student-athletes who have participated in the Under-19 World Championship.
- Teeter has mentored 16 Griffs to Player of the Year accolades, including 12 in the last four campaigns. He has led five student-athletes to MAAC Offensive Player of the Year honors, the first four MAAC Midfielders of the Year in the past four seasons, six MAAC Defensive Players of the Year and one MAAC Rookie of the Year.
- A total of 60 players have earned All-MAAC accolades under Teeter's guidance.
- Teeter was named the league's Coach of the Year in just his third season after leading the Griffs to an eight-win improvement in 2005. He collected the honor for a second time in 2015 after a conference-record eight regular-season MAAC wins.

Before coming to Canisius, Teeter served as an assistant women's lacrosse coach at Buffalo State College in 2002, where he helped guide the program to its best-ever finish at 5-6. Prior to his work at Buffalo State, he served as a student-assistant coach and team manager for the Canisius women's lacrosse team for four years. He helped with instruction during practices and also assisted with game-day operations.

Teeter was a four-year letterwinner for the Canisius College ice hockey team, graduating from the school in 2002. He played field lacrosse for his high school in Shelburne, Ontario, while also playing box lacrosse for the Orangeville Northmen in Western Ontario.

Teeter graduated from Canisius with a degree in physical education in 2002 and earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in sport psychology and coaching from Canisius in 2004.

Teeter and his wife, Jennifer, reside in Orchard Park with their newborn daughter, Olivia.
