Merrimack College and Canisius University will meet for the first time on Friday night to open Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) play in the 2024-25 season. The Warriors are coming off the best (Kenpom) victory in school history after beating Troy last week. The Griffins are still looking to get a win this season, starting the year with eight straight losses.

SCOUTING THE GRIFFINS

Canisius junior guard Paul McMillan IV enters Friday's game ranked second in the MAAC with his 19.6 points per game scoring average. In the home loss to Brown Nov. 23, McMillan IV scored a game-high 25 points, making him the first Canisius player since Larry Fogle in 1973-74 to score 25-or more points in each of his first two home games with the program.

ADAM CALL HIM "BUDD" CLARK

Adam "Budd" Clark returns to the Warriors for his sophomore season after winning Northeast Conference Rookie of the Year as season ago. Clark averaged 13.4 points per game. He also had a team-high 84 steals. Clark is the leader at the point guard position for the Warriors. Hailing from the famous Philly Catholic league, Clark has played and big games and does not get caught up in the moment. The point guard from Philly is currently averaging close to 20 points per game this season and was recently named to the College Insider Lou Henson 'Early Season' Watch List.

MAKE CHAOS DEFENSE

In his time at Merrimack College, head coach Joe Gallo has become well known for his elevated zone defense. The scheme has been commonly referred to as the Syracuse zone on red bull. The extremely active zone created one of the best defenses in the country as season ago. The Warriors ranked were ranked among the best in defensive efficiency allowing just 62.3 points per game. Guard Javon Bennett was the nations leader in steals with 99 on the season. Now assistant coach Juvaris Hayes ended his Merrimack career has the NCAA's all-time steals leader.

SERIES HISTORY

Friday night will be the first time that these two schools meet on the basketball court. The matchup will mark Merrimack's first game as a MAAC school. The five previous seasons for the Warriors have been spent in the Northeast Conference. During this timeframe, the Griffins are 0-1 against NEC schools. The game came this season against newly added Mercyhurst. Canisius lost the game 62-52. The Warriors never played a MAAC school during their non-conference dates in their first five seasons in Division I, however Quinnipiac was also in the Northeast-10 in the 90's. The Warriors have an all-time record of 9-5 against the Bobcats with the last win being during the 1997-98 season. Merrimack also played against Mount St Mary's during their first three season in the NEC. Sacred Heart who came with the Warriors to the MAAC also have played Merrimack on a number of occasions.

REPLACING LOST PRODUCTION

During the off-season Merrimack lost its top scorer Jordan Derkack (Rutgers). Derkack did a little bit of everything for the Warriors. The guard from New Jersey won NEC Player and Defensive Player of the Year during the 2023-24 season. He averaged 17 points and six rebounds, both which were a team-best. Merrimack also lost Samba Diallo to graduation who started all 33 games a season ago. Diallo added some much needed experience to a young Warrior core. The forward from Manhattan averaged 7.5 points and 4.5 rebounds a game which ranked fourth and second. Jacob O'Connell and Jordan McKoy also departed North Andover, graduating in 2023. O'Connell came on strong late in the year, averaging 6.3 points per game during conference play. McKoy, who was a five-year player for Merrimack was a deep threat who averaged 5.2 points per contest. All four were key pieces for a team that went to the Northeast Conference championship game during the 2023-24 season. They also won 21 games and won a share of the Northeast Conference regular season title.

PORTAL PICKUPS

The Warriors had three transfer portal pickups this off-season, the first being David Murray from Connecticut College. Murray was a Division III first-team All-American a season ago, averaging 17.7 points and 8.9 rebounds per game for the Camels. The next transfer is from Division II Franklin Pierce. Sean Trumper averaged 18.8 points per game with the Ravens. He also averaged eight rebounds a game. Trumper was named to the third team NE-10. The final transfer is Matt Becht from Southern New Hampshire University. Statistically, Becht was one of the best shooters in the country a season ago. He shot 45% from long range for a Pennmen team that made a Division II Final Four run. Becht was instrumental in the run, averaging 16.4 points per game. He was named most outstanding player in the Division II East Region.

MACK STAFF

During the summer of 2023, the Warriors added two new coaches to their staff. Both former Warriors, Juvaris Hayes and Chris Mohr come back to North Andover to try and help out their alma mater. Hayes who is a 2020 graduate played two seasons overseas and is now back in the college ranks. He left Merrimack as the NCAA's all-time leader in steals. Mohr brings a wealth of knowledge back to North Andover after spending 16 seasons as an assistant coach at the University of New Hampshire. The Warriors now have five coaches, four of them are Merrimack College graduates. Head coach Joe Gallo and assistant coach Micky Burtnyk and earned degrees in North Andover.

MERRIMAAC

Merrimack College has accepted an invitation to join the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), as announced last month by MAAC Commissioner Travis Tellitocci. This move provides the opportunity for Merrimack student-athletes to continue pursuing excellence at the highest levels nationally, both in the classroom and in competition, which is a core priority for the College. Merrimack, located in North Andover, Massachusetts, will join the MAAC beginning with the 2024-25 season. Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, Connecticut, joins Merrimack in accepting an invitation from the MAAC.

COACHING STAFF



JOE GALLO
Head Coach
9th Season

Continuing a transformative era for the Merrimack College men's basketball program, Joe Gallo '04 begins his ninth season on the Warriors sidelines in 2024-25, directing the program into its new era as members of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

The eighth head coach in school history, Gallo completed a year of three NCAA Tournament appearances in three years in 2018-19 to put a bow on the program's Division II history. He also snapped a 19-year conference championship drought when he guided the program to the 2018-19 Northeast-10

Conference Championship. Gallo boasts a 81-45 (.643) career record, the most wins ever for a Merrimack head coach over their first four seasons.



Gallo and the Warriors took the Northeast Conference by storm during their five-year tenure. The squad from North Andover won three Northeast Conference regular season titles (2019-20, 22-23, 23-24), as well as a NEC tournament championship (22-23). During the Division I transition the teams Gallo has coached have an overall record of 82-64 (56.1%) and a conference record of 58-28 (67.4%). Player development as also been a calling card for Gallo and his coaching staff. The Jersey native has coached three NEC Defensive Players of the Year, two NEC Players of the Year, two first team, three second team, two third team, and four all-rookie NEC members. Coach Joe Gallo received a litany of awards following the season including Jim Phelan NEC Coach of the Year, HoopDirt.com NCAA Div. 1 Coach of the Year, John McLendon Award (Top collegiate coach nationwide), ECAC Coach of the Year, NABC District Coach of the Year, and USBWA Coach of the Year.

Gallo led Merrimack to win the 2019-20 NEC Regular Season Championship, becoming the first team ever to win a conference title in its first season of Division I membership. Merrimack's conference title came on the heels of being selected last in the conference's preseason poll, and the team went on to win 14 of 18 NEC contests to win the regular season crown in outright fashion. The 2019-20 season featured historic victories including the program's win at Northwestern, which was the team's first-ever Division I triumph, and the NEC's second victory ever over a Big Ten foe. The program added more non-conference wins against UMass Lowell, Jacksonville, Hartford, and Army. The conference slate featured a nine-game winning streak, the longest for any NEC team during conference play since 2014-15, and a conference-title-clinching win in the regular season finale against Central Connecticut.

Merrimack has won at least 19 games in all four seasons of Gallo's tenure to date, including three straight years of at least 20 wins. In 2019-20, Merrimack set a new NCAA record for wins by a program in its first year of reclassification to Division following its 17th victory of the year at Saint Francis Brooklyn. The 2019-20 campaign featured a myriad of media coverage as well, both regional and national. The Warriors made multiple appearances on ESPN throughout the year, and were featured in the Associated Press, Wall Street Journal, theScore Sports App and Forbes among other outlets. The team's "Make Chaos" mantra followed an effective defensive unit that led the NEC in scoring defense, 3-point field goal percentage defense, steals per game and turnover margin.

During the 2019-2020 season Coach Gallo helped Juvaris Hayes to an All-American season that included an NEC Defensive Player of the Year Award, all-conference first-team selection, and the Lefty Driesell Award as the top defensive player in the country. Other notable moments for Gallo came on the individual as multiple players had career seasons. Senior Juvaris Hayes put a bow on his historic career with a NEC Defensive Player of the Year honor, a spot on the all-conference first team and winning the Lefty Driesell Award, given to the top defensive player nationwide. Hayes finished his career as the NCAA's all-time steals leader while playing in Merrimack's 2-3 zone defense. Other individuals reached new heights in 2019-20 including junior Devin Jensen who set career highs in 3-pointers made and 3-point percentage. He was joined by Iris Joyner, who established career highs in scoring.

In 2018-19, Merrimack tied the school record for wins in a season with 22; the Warriors have now won 22 contests in a year five separate times. The Warriors also came away with the NE10 Championship in their last year to do so. Merrimack won 19 games in the regular season, and proceeded to best Adelphi (63-81), Le Moyne (84-77) and New Haven (51-46) to claim the program's third conference tournament title and first since the 1999-00 campaign. The semifinal win over Le Moyne and championship game triumph over New Haven came on the road with Merrimack topping the Southwest Division's top two seeds. Gallo became just the second coach in program history to win a conference title.

He also cemented himself as only the second head coach at Merrimack to guide the team to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments, and the only to do so over his first three years. Gallo's programs reached the regional semifinals (Round of 32) twice over the last three years, securing an opening-round upset in both the 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons. The 2018-19 team earned the NCAA Division II East Region's second seed, the program's highest seed ever in the NCAA Tournament.

Other notable moments for Gallo over his first three seasons include a run of back-to-back 20-win seasons, accomplishing that feat for just the third time in school annals. Gallo has won at least 19 games in each of his first three seasons, serving as head coach in three of Merrimack's 13 seasons with at least 19 triumphs ever. Gallo has seen two players (Juvaris Hayes, Ryan Boulter) receive five total all-conference selections over the last three years. He has helped direct Hayes to consecutive All-American selections (2017-18, 2018-19), becoming just the sixth two-time All-American to ever suit up for the Warriors. Hayes also boasts NE10 Rookie of the Year (2016-17) and NE10 Defensive Player of the Year (2018-19) accolades under Gallo's tutelage.

The recruiting trail has also been productive for Gallo and his staff; the Merrimack staff has brought in two of the eight players (Juvaris Hayes, Jaleel Lord) ever to play in three different NCAA Tournaments. Ahead of the 2019-20 season, the coaching staff signed six players to comprise their first-ever Division I class, marking the largest recruiting class in school history.

On May 9, 2016, Gallo returned to campus as Merrimack's head man after serving as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Robert Morris University for the past four seasons. The Colonials posted 76 wins in Gallo's four years in Moon Township, Pennsylvania, winning the 2015 Northeast Conference Championship and earning a berth in the NCAA Tournament. In Gallo's first two years on the staff, Robert Morris won back-to-back NEC regular season titles and advanced to the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) both years.

From 2013-15, the Colonials won a postseason game each year, twice in the NIT and once in the NCAA Tournament. Robert Morris defeated Kentucky (2013) and Saint John's (2014) in the NIT before taking down North Florida (2015) in the NCAA First Four, the programs second-ever NCAA win. As recruiting coordinator, Gallo brought 2015 NEC Rookie of the Year Marquise Reed to the program as well as 2016 All-NEC First Team guard Rodney Pryor. Eight Colonials earned all-conference distinctions during Gallo's tenure, including 2014 NEC Player of the Year, Karvel Anderson.

From 2009-12, Gallo spent two years as an assistant coach at Dartmouth College and a one-year stint as the Director of Hoop Group Elite, the nation's largest basketball exposure camp for high school players. After a one-year hiatus at the conclusion of his playing career, the Milltown, New Jersey, native returned to campus in 2005 to begin a four-year period as an assistant with the men's basketball program. Gallo helped guide the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in eight years during the 2007-08 season, and followed that up with the school's first NCAA Tournament win in 18 years during the 2008-09 campaign.

Gallo was instrumental in recruiting former All-Americans Darren Duncan '10 and Darin Mency '11 to the program, who won consecutive Northeast-10 Rookie of the Year awards in 2007 and 2008, respectively. Both players went on to score over 2,000 points in their careers and were three-time NE-10 All-Conference selections, in addition to their All-America accolades. Gallo also brought Wayne Mack '12 to the program before departing in 2009, with Mack leaving his mark as a 1,000-point scorer and eventually became Gallo's third recruit to earn All-America recognition.

The alumnus graduated from Merrimack in 2004 after a successful playing career, earning a business degree with a concentration in management. He is currently working towards his masters in organizational leadership.

MERRIMACK COACHING STAFF



Micky Burtnyk Assistant Coach 16th Season

Burtnyk enters his 16th season on the men's basketball coaching staff following an illustrious career from 2004-08, in which he guided the Warriors to 54 total wins and a NCAA Tournament berth in his final year.

Most recently, Burtnyk helped guide the Warriors to a Northeast Conference regular and tournament title during the

2022-23 season. Forward Jordan Minor won Northeast Conference Co-Player and Defensive Player of the year during that season as well.

With the help of Burtnyk, the Warriors won the 2019-20 NEC Regular Season Championship, becoming the first team ever to win a conference title in its first season of Division I membership. Burtnyk helped Merrimack to 20 victories last year, the programs third straight season with at least 20 wins. Burtnyk helped senior Juvaris Hayes to an All-American season that included an NEC Defensive Player of the Year Award, all-conference first-team selection, and the Lefty Driesell Award as the top defensive player in the country.

The coaching staff also saw multiple student-athletes reach new heights as well. Idris Joyner established career highs in scoring. Devin Jensen set career highs in 3-pointers made and 3-point percentage.

The long-time Warrior was part of his first-ever conference championship in 2018-19, assisting the program to its first NE10 Championship since the 1999-00 season and third conference tournament title in school history overall. Burtnyk helped Merrimack to a school-record 22 victories, a number the program has now reached five times overall, and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament's East Regional, the highest seed for the program ever. Burtnyk saw junior Juvaris Hayes earn All-American status for the second straight year as well as receiving NE10 Defensive Player of the Year and NE10 All-Conference First Team accolades. Senior Ryan Boulter also was an all-league selection, landing on the third team. In the regular season, Merrimack won 14 NE10 games and finished second in the Northeast Division. Both marks tied the second most since the NE10 moved to a divisional format.

The 2017-18 campaign saw continued excellence for the program. Burtnyk helped the program to its first 20-win season in nearly a decade and ninth overall, reaching the NCAA Tournament for the second time in as many seasons. The assistant helped the Warriors to 14 Northeast-10 Conference wins, which were the most for the program since 2009-10. Merrimack finished second in the Northeast Division, the program's highest finish since the NE10 moved to a divisional format in 2013-14.

In 2016-17, Burtnyk contributed to the development of seven returning players along with compiling an impressive recruiting class that allowed the Warriors to shock many in the region. After being selected to finish second-to-last in the Northeast Division, the Warriors posted 12 league victories and 19 overall, earned a conference tournament berth and reached the program's ninth NCAA Tournament as an at-large selection. Merrimack went on to upset top-seeded Le Moyne as the No. 8 seed, the lone eighth seed to advance out of the regional quarterfinals nationwide.

Over the 10 years of Burtnyk's stint on the sidelines, the program owns a 162-125 record (.564) with four of the school's 10 NCAA Tournament berths in tow. The Warriors have finished above .500 in seven of his 10 seasons as part of the Merrimack staff.

Other highlights of Burtnyk's coaching resume include a debut season in 2009-10 that saw the Warriors win 21 games, reach the NCAA Tournament and total a program-record tying 16 NE10 wins. Merrimack also finished above .500 in 2011-12, 2014-15 and 2015-16.

In his playing career Burtnyk tallied 830 points and also holds the Merrimack standard for points in his collegiate debut with 26.

Burtnyk lives in Worcester, Mass. with his wife Erin their daughters Ellie and Emma.



Jimmy Langhurst Assistant Coach First Season

Jimmy Langhurst has been named an assistant men's basketball coach as announced on Monday afternoon. Langhurst has spent the last two seasons of this coaching career at Stonehill College.

"I am thrilled to welcome Jimmy to our coaching staff", said head coach Joe Gallo.

"We always talk about how hard it is to win and Jimmy has been a part of a lot of winning in both his playing and coaching careers. He won two conference championships as a player at Robert Morris and then followed that up with four as a coach. I have known Jimmy for a long time. He will bring great energy to our gym everyday and will be a huge asset for our players. I would also like to welcome his wife Caroline and son EJ to our Warrior family."

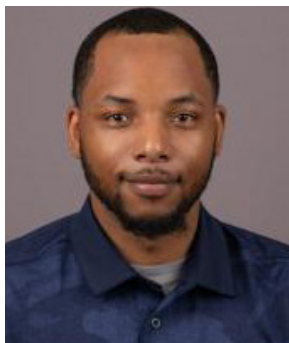
Langhurst played an integral role during the Skyhawks Division I transition. He helped Stonehill earn a 10-6 Northeast Conference record their first year in Division I.

Prior to coaching with the Skyhawks, Langhurst spent four years as the director of operations at his alma mater Robert Morris University. During his time with the Colonials he won the 2020 Northeast Conference championship, earning a bid to the NCAA Tournament. Before heading back to Robert Morris, Langhurst served as an assistant coach at Le Moyne College for three seasons. There he was named an Under Armor 30 Under 30 award recipient from the NABC and tabbed as the number nine ranked Division II Men's Assistant Coach by CoachStat.net. With the Dolphins, Langhurst had two 20-win seasons which were both capped off with Division II NCAA tournament appearances. Under his tutelage, the Dolphins went to the 2018 NCAA Division II Elite Eight.

Langhurst got this first coaching gig at Indiana University of Pennsylvania during the 2014-15 season. He helped the Crimson Hawks earn a national championship bid after finishing the season with a 31-7 record.

A 2010 Robert Morris graduate, Langhurst was a four-year player for the Colonials. He was apart of three 20-win seasons, two NCAA Tournament appearances, and one bid to the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). He went on to play professionally in the British Basketball League for the Sheffield Sharks, leading the team and ranking sixth in league scoring after averaging 19.2 points per game. He was named to the All-British honorable mention team.

Juvaris Hayes Assistant Coach Second Season

Hayes spent four seasons in North Andover, seeing immediate success as a freshman, earning Northeast-10 Conference Rookie of the Year after averaging 13.9 to go along with a NCAA Division II leading 9.3 assists per game.

The Warriors made it to the second round of the Division II East Regional during his freshman season. The Paterson, N.J. native averaged 17.8 points per game in his sophomore season. He finished the year leading the entire NCAA in steals per game with 3.9, as well as total assists (255) and total steals (124). Merrimack once again made it to the second round of the East regional. Hayes was named to the NE-10 First Team.

In his junior season, Hayes was named NE-10 Defensive Player of the Year. He averaged a career-high 19.3 points, 6.6 assists, 6.8 rebounds, and 3.9 steals per game. His close to four steals per game led the country. Hayes was once again named to the NE-10 First Team. The Warriors won 22 games during the 2018-19 season, including 14 in the NE-10. For his final season, Hayes on the team that was the first to transition to Division I at Merrimack. In just his second game in Division I he ran point in one of the biggest wins in school history against Northwestern University. Hayes continued his great play throughout the year, averaging 10.7 points per game. The Warriors would win the Northeast Conference regular season title. Hayes once again led the country in steals per game with 3.9. He was named to the NEC First Team, won NEC Defensive Player of the Year, as well as won the Lefty Driesell Award which is given to the nation's most outstanding Division I defender. Others to win the award include, Anthony Davis and Kent Bazemore.

Hayes would finish his career as the NCAA's all-time leader in steals with 457. He finished his career at Merrimack as the all-time leader in assists with 952. He also holds the record for most assists in a season with 287. He also ranks fifth in career rebounds (741) and seventh in career points (1,951).

After graduation, Hayes played in Europe for two seasons. Playing with the Itzehoe Eagles in Germany and the BC TS Tbilisi in Georgia.



Chris Mohr Assistant Coach Second Season

Chris Mohr, a Merrimack College graduate comes back to North Andover after spending the last 16 seasons at New Hampshire. He was instrumental in coaching the UNH Class of 2018, which is the most successful class in program history, winning 69

games in a four-year span. This includes the 2015-16 season when the Wildcats had a single-season best 20 wins. Before going to New Hampshire, Mohr was an assistant for six seasons at Merrimack under Bert Hammel. Mohr helped guide the Warriors to a 22-9 record during the 1999-2000 season. Merrimack also won the Northeast-10 Regular Season and Tournament Championship that year. The squad would make it to the NCAA Division II Northeast Regionals.

Mohr was also a player at Merrimack from 1992-97. He finished with 879 career points. As a senior captain, he averaged 10.5 points per game. Mohr was a two-time recipient of the Gregory Newman Award given to the ultimate team player. He also received the Ray Gallant award in 1995-96 and the Most Improved Player award in his second year in the program.

Prior to coaching at Merrimack, Mohr taught high school English and was an assistant basketball coach for the varsity program at Carmel High School in Mundelein, Ill.

Mohr is an active member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

Mohr lives in North Andover, Mass., with his wife, Meghan, son, Cooper and daughter, McKenna.
