Head Coach Larry Kennan

Larry Kennan is in his fourth year as the head coach of the Cardinals. A long-time NFL coach and Executive Director of the NFL Coaches Association, he had had great success at a number of different levels. He was the quarterback coach for the Super Bowl XVIII winning Los Angeles Raiders.

Kennan led the Cardinals to their first ever winning season in 2013. The team went 6-5 in their first year as a member of FCS. He has been crucial to the team transitioning from a member of NCAA Division II to FCS. The 2013 Cardinals posted the first two shutouts in school history and accumulated more school records along the way than can be reasonably written down.

Kennan is 11-24 at UIW and 35-44-3 all-time in six seasons as a head coach.

Series Check

This is the second all-time meeting between the Cardinals and Colonels. Last year, the Cardinals picked up their first road Southland Conference victory in the program's history. UIW defeated Nicholls, 38-20 on November 1, 2014 at John L. Guidry Stadium.

This Week's Game

The Cardinals return home for their second Southland Conference game of the year. They welcome Nicholls to Benson Stadium for the first time on Saturday at 2 p.m.

Last Week

It was a tale of two halves for the Cardinals in their game at #23 McNeese State. It was the season-opener for the Cowboys after their original opener at LSU was cancelled due to inclement weather. UIW played well in the first half with the defense doing an outstanding job and trailed just 9-0 at the break. In the second half it was all Cowboys as they scored on each of their first five drives to put the game away. The final score ended up as 43-6 at Cowboy Stadium in front of 12,804 people.

Playing Some Defense

In the first half against McNeese State, the UIW defense played some inspired ball. They forced the Cowboys to punt three times, came up with a goal line stand and forced a long missed field goal. The only offensive points the Cowboys scored in the half came on a 36-yard touchdown run.

The leaders of the defense were senior outside linebacker Myke Tavarres and senior cornerback Kobie Douglas. Tavarres led the team with six tackles, including a tackle for loss. He made two of his tackles on the team's goalline stand. Douglas picked up a pair of pass breakups during the half and now leads the team with four on the season.

England Lineman Making Plays

Junior defensive lineman Alex Jenkins came to the Cardinals all the way from Bath, England in 2013. It has taken a lot of time and hard work, but he is starting to make himself into a good player for UIW.

Jenkins started a few games in 2014 and is now firmly entrenched into the starting lineup. In the season opener he made a tackle and blocked a kick. This week he had a breakout performance against #23 McNeese State. He made a career high 10 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss and he also had a quarterback hurry. The Cardinals will need Jenkins to continue with the strong performances with preseason All-America defensive lineman Corey Lee likely out for the season with an injury.

A Good Start Sets Some Records

Sophomore quarterback Trent Brittain had a good start to the game at McNeese State. He went 12-of-18 for 152 yards in the first half and picked up six passing first downs. The good start helped Brittain set three UIW career records during the game.

On the first play from scrimmage, Brittain completed a pass for 12 yards to Cole Wick to move past Eric Massoni into first place on the program's career total yards list. He finished the game with 2,754 yards of total offense in his 14-game career. Later in the first quarter, Brittain completed a 19-yard pass to Wick to surpass Paden Lynch for the career record in passing yards. He finished the night with 2,251 passing yards in his career.

The final record that Brittain set was for career pass attempts. On his final pass attempt of the first quarter, a completion to Cyril Clarke, he moved past Lynch in career pass attempts and now has 383 going forward. Brittain needs just six more completions to move past Lynch for first place in career completions.

Jordan Jumps at Chance

Senior quarterback Jordan Scelfo got his first chance under center this season in the fourth quarter against McNeese State. He showed he was up for the challenge of coming off the bench cold going 5-for-6 for 63 yards and a touchdown through the air. He guided the team on their lone score of the game that ended with an 11-yard touchdown pass to Kody Edwards.

In his last two times having to come off the bench he has performed extremely well. Last year, he was thrown onto the field at the end of the game at Northwestern State and led the team on a touchdown drive while going 3-for-3 for 62 yards and a touchdown. He moved into the starting role at quarterback the following week last year.

This season Scelfo won't be making the move into the starting role next week, but he provides the UIW coaching staff with a level of comfort in knowing that they have someone who can step in if Trent Brittain would get hurt.

Look for the Big Guy

Senior tight end Cole Wick is quickly becoming someone that

the opposing scouts and scouts at the next level are getting to know. Already, six NFL scouts have been through Benson Fieldhouse to meet with Wick about the next step.

The reason Wick is being noticed by NFL scouts is that he is playing well on the field. On Saturday, he hauled in a career high seven passes for 92 yards against McNeese State and was easily the team's best offensive player in the game.

Wick leads the team with 10 receptions for 135 yards. He is currently third in the Southland

Conference with 67.5 yards receiving per game and he actually leads the league with 135 total receiving yards.

Making the Stops

The Cardinals' three starting linebackers on Saturday combined to make 24 tackles between them. Myke Tavarres led the way with 10 stops, two pass breakups and a tackle for loss. On each pass breakup, he nearly intercepted the pass. Senior Padyn Giebler added a season high nine tackles and had one tackle for loss while Josh Zellars chipped in with five

Last Game (9-12-15) #23 McNeese State 43, Incarnate Word 6

LAKE CHARLES, LOUISIANA – UIW suffered their first loss of the season in the Southland Conference opener at #23 McNeese State, 43-6 at Cowboys Stadium on Saturday night.

The first half was well-played by the Cardinals (1-1, 0-1), but they were unable to put any points on the board against a strong Cowboys (1-0, 1-0) defense. Four times the team crossed over midfield, but they were limited to two punts, a long missed field goal and a turnover on downs.

The offensive highlights for the first half included red-shirt sophomore quarterback Trent Brittain setting a trio of UIW career records and senior tight end Cole Wick putting up big receiving numbers. Brittain went 12-of-18 for 152 yards through the air and moved into first place on the school's career passing yards, passing attempts and total offensive yards lists. Wick was Brittain's main target hauling in a career high six passes for 72 yards in the half.

The Cowboys came out of halftime with a 9-0 lead and took over the game with a strong third quarter. They scored on all four of their drives and put the game out of reach with two touchdowns and two field goals while holding the Cardinals to negative-10 yards of offense.

The Cardinals would finish with 227 yards of total offense and only 12 on the ground. Brittain finished 12-of-23 for 152 yards while Jordan Scelfo was 5-of-6 for 63 yards and a touchdown. Wick led all players with seven catches for 92 yards.

The Cowboys racked up 406 yards of total offense with the yards split nearly even. They gained 225 yards on the ground on 51 carries and picked up 181 through the air. Daniel Sams was 12-of-21 for 181 yards and a touchdown.

tackles after leading the team with 11 in the first week of the season. The three players are first, second and third on the team's season tackles list.

Giebler entered the season in sixth place on the school's all-time. He remains in sixth place after two games, but he will quickly move into fourth place. He needs seven tackles to move past Devan Avery and Devin Haywood into fourth.

The Good and Bad

Good football teams generally do not make mental mistakes or

turnovers. This year, the Cardinals have done well in one of those facets and struggled in the other. They have committed just eight penalties for an average of 32.0 yards per game. They lead the conference in fewest penalty yards per game. Conversely, the team is last in the conference with seven total turnovers and they have committed three more turnovers per game than the opposition.

What Happened to the Ground Game

One week after rushing for the 10th most yards in school history

against Texas A&M-Kingsville, the Cardinals gained the second fewest yards in school history against McNeese State. The Cowboys recorded six sacks and 10 tackles for loss while holding the Cardinals to 12 yards rushing on 27 attempts.

Nicholls Colonels

The Colonels opened the 2015 season with a 47-0 loss at UL-Monroe. They were limited to 260 yards of total offense.

Nicholls was picked to finish 10th in the Southland preseason polls. They welcome back quarterback Tuskani Figaro who red-shirted last year with an injury. Two years ago, he helped the Colonels average nearly 27 points per game after rushing for 1,103 yards and passing for 1,135 yards. This year he teams with running back Michael Henry who rushed for over 1,000 yards last year.

In the season opener, B.T. Sanders made 12 tackles while Hezekiah White had nine stops plus 1.5 tackles for loss. Last year, the team allowed over 50 points per game.

A Cover Corner

Senior Kobie Douglas got his final season started on the right foot. He was one of the Southland Conference leaders last year with 10 pass breakups. He is currently on pace to double that mark this year. He has four pass breakups in the first two games of the year with two in each game. He is second in school history with 18 career pass breakups.

The All-Time Record

UIW heads into this week's game with an overall record of 21-47 (.309). They are 15-19 (.441) at Benson Stadium, 6-25 (.200) on the road and 0-1 at a neutral site. They are 4-2 against NAIA opponents, 4-16 against NCAA FCS opponents, 1-0 against non-USA opponents and 12-27 against NCAA Division II foes.

From the moment he came on board at Incarnate Word in mid-December of 2011, Larry Kennan has had a major, positive effect on the Cardinals football program. He has provided leadership and direction to a program in the transitional phase of Division I and the results are starting to play out on the field.

On the day of his hiring UIW Director of Athletics Mark Papich was prophetic. Said Papich at the time: "...in support of the university's vision of expanding our brand Larry Kennan provides the experience we need... he gives Incarnate Word name recognition through his ability to reach into the NFL as well as the collegiate ranks..."

It only took Kennan two seasons to show a significant upgrade in the product on the field for UIW. The 2013 season proved to be the most successful in the program's short history. A 6-5 record, the first winning season for the program, and a few milestone victories along the way made it a season to remember.

The 2013 Cardinals posted the first two shutouts in school history and accumulated more school records along the way than can be reasonably written down. The two biggest wins of the season came on the road at McMurry when the team battled back from an 11-point fourth quarter deficit to win 47-43 and give Kennan his first road victory at UIW. The next came the following week at home when the Cardinals came back from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to defeat Abilene Christian, 34-31. ACU had defeated UIW, 40-6 just three weeks earlier in Abilene.

One of the most important decisions Kennan made in 2013 was to hire former Heisman trophy winner Ricky Williams as the running backs coach. The addition of Williams to the staff brought instant recognition to the program and played a major role in the recruiting process for a number of players.

The 2014 season was one that went bad from the start with the loss of starting quarterback Trent Brittain in the first quarter of the first game to a season-ending injury. An already daunting schedule that included national champion North Dakota State plus three other playoff teams became nearly untenable. Despite the loss of Brittain and a few other starters to season-ending injuries, Kennan remained upbeat and the Cardinals improved throughout the season.

Kennan started four different quarterbacks during the season before finally settling on Jordan Scelfo. Scelfo provided the team some stability over the final four weeks of the season when the team played their best ball of the season.

One of the high points of the 2014 season for Kennan and the Cardinals came off the field. The program appeared on ESPN's College GameDay program when they traveled to North Dakota State. The entire experience and the national exposure proved to be something great for Kennan and the program despite the outcome of the game.

Kennan patrolled the sidelines in 2012 for the first time since 1997, however he remained close to the game during that time. He was executive director of the NFL Coaches Association based in Washington D.C. for the 13 years prior to becoming the head coach of the Cardinals. Those years combined with his 16 seasons as an NFL coach means he knows just about everyone who has walked the professional sidelines for the past three decades.

The Cardinals were only 2-9 in Kennan's first year at the helm, but there were a number of firsts for the program. The "Forever First" class completed their eligibility and the 2012 class set a record with 25 seniors. The team played a game in Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, TX. Devan Avery became the first UIW player to play in a postseason all-star game when he went to California for the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl. Tight end Andrew Mocio became the first receiver

in school history to earn all-region honors. Avery and Mocio also participated in UIW's first Pro Day in the Spring of 2013.

He has been an NFL offensive coordinator, a quarterbacks coach, a tight ends coach and a wide receivers coach. He owns a championship ring from the Los Angeles Raiders Super Bowl XVIII win. And, he was the head coach of the London Monarchs when they won a World Football League championship in 1991.

And perhaps most attractive of all for prospective Cardinals, he is a quarterback guru. During his tenure with the NFL Coaches Association he kept his hand in by tutoring quarterbacks as they prepared for their professional careers. The list of students includes Tim Couch, Chad Pennington, Drew Brees, Tony Romo, Byron Leftwich, Eli Manning, Alex Smith, Drew Stanton and T.J. Yates to name a few.

Prior to his career in the NFL, Kennan was an offensive coordinator for three years at both Nevada-Las Vegas and SMU. He took over as head coach at Lamar University in 1979 and spent three years in the Southland Conference. His LU squad set 38 team or individual awards in his first year when they posted a 6-3-2 record. His biggest win at Lamar was an 18-17 win over defending SWC champion Baylor in 1981. He went 13-17-3 before moving on to the NFL.

Considering all of that, what Larry Kennan wanted to do was coach. And when the first opportunity came with 2012 spring drills at UIW he openly admitted to being "excited." He recalled that on the first day when the clouds broke and the sun came out he knew all was good.

Kennan was hired in December of 2011 and he has continued to sign better and more highly touted players each year. He is laying the groundwork for a program that will be successful in the short and long run.

And, when he leads his staff to conferences and clinics, the doors open because people know Larry Kennan and they want to talk football with him. And that's good because he knows the game, he is immersed in it and he is back doing what he wants to do--coach.

Kennan enters his fourth season with the Cardinals with a career record of 10-23 and his is 34-41-3 in eight years as a head coach.
