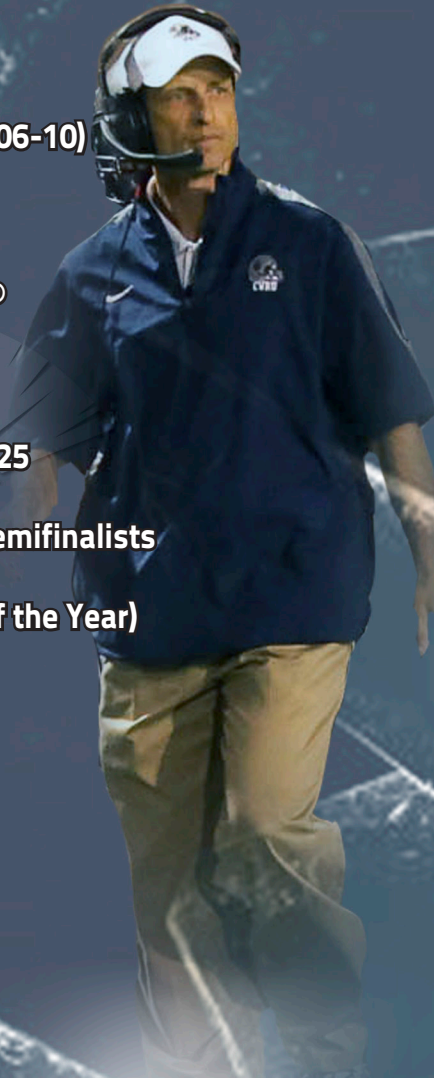

Since 1913, Case Western Reserve has been accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, and many individual programs are accredited by nationally recognized professional associations.

PRESIDENT BARBARA R. SNYDER

Barbara R. Snyder became president of Case Western Reserve University in 2007. Since her arrival, Snyder has encouraged interdisciplinary excellence, catalyzed institutional collaboration and reinvigorated alumni engagement and fundraising.

During her tenure, the university has tripled undergraduate applications, become twice as selective and dramatically improved the academic credentials of the entering class. Case Western Reserve reached the \$1 billion goal of Forward Thinking, the university's capital campaign, two-and-a-half years ahead of schedule. The Board of Trustees unanimously agreed to expand the campaign to \$1.5 billion. Among the highlights of the university's capital campaign are dramatic increases in the number of endowed professorships and student support, as well as additional new building projects. In 2014, the university opened the \$50 million, 89,000-square-foot Tinkham Veale University Center, as well as the 24,000-square-foot Wyant Athletic and Wellness Center. It also began renovations on the space that will be the new home for think[box], a \$30 million, 55,000-square-foot innovation hub.

In 2013, Case Western Reserve entered into a historic partnership with Cleveland Clinic to develop a 485,000-square-foot Health Education Campus including the university's schools of medicine, nursing and dental medicine. In addition to the university's collaboration with Cleveland Clinic, Case Western Reserve is also engaged in a partnership with the

Cleveland Museum of Art to establish a globally recognized institute dedicated to innovative education and training of future curators in the history of art and its practice in art museums. And, we recently announced

an initiative with Cuyahoga Community College to support a humanities pipeline program to develop a targeted and robust pathway for students to pursue a terminal degree in the humanities, which builds on our earlier STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) pipeline programs.

Snyder began her academic career as an assistant professor at Case Western Reserve's School of Law, then joined the faculty of Moritz College of Law at The Ohio State University. After serving in several leadership positions at Moritz and within the central university, Snyder became OSU's Interim Executive Vice President and Provost in 2003 before securing the permanent position the following year. She graduated from the University of Chicago School of Law, where she served as executive editor of its law review, and earned her bachelor's degree from Ohio State.





V.P. FOR STUDENT AFFAIRS LOU STARK



Lou Stark has served as the Vice President for Student Affairs at Case Western Reserve since July of 2013.

Prior to arriving at CWRU, he served as the Vice President for Student Affairs

at Coe College (Iowa) for 16 years. Stark also served as the Vice President for Student Life at Central College (Iowa), and prior to that, Associate Vice President for Student Affairs at Tulane University (La.) and Associate Dean at Washington University in St. Louis. He has also held a variety of other student affairs positions.

He received an M.S. in Education in Counseling from Hofstra University, a B.S. in Psychology from Davis and Elkins College (W. Va.) and did additional graduate work in higher education administration. He received a certificate in management from the A.B. Freeman School of Business at Tulane.

Stark is a past President and a former Board member of the Iowa Student Personnel Association and has served on numerous other boards. Most recently, he served on the NCAA Division III Management Council. Previously, he has served on the President's Council/Management Council Joint Legislative Steering Committee, the Strategic Planning and Finance Committee, and the Convention-Planning Subcommittee.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS AMY BACKUS



Named to her post on April 18, 2014, Amy Backus enters her third year as Director of Athletics and Chair of Physical Education at Case Western Reserve. Formerly the senior associate athletic director at Yale University, Backus

brings the Spartans a quarter century of experience as a basketball coach along with a decade of work in athletics administration.

A former basketball standout at nearby Vermilion High School, Backus began her professional career at her college alma mater, Central Michigan University. After graduation, Backus spent a year as a CMU assistant coach before claiming her first head coach position at then Otterbein College (now Otterbein University). She went on to secure similar positions at Middlebury College and Northwestern University before arriving at

Yale in 1999.

Prior to arriving in Connecticut, she earned a master's degree in administration and supervision with an emphasis on higher education from Loyola University of Chicago. While at Yale, she also served as national chair of the NCAA Women's Basketball Rules Committee and as a member of both the NCAA Division I Academic Performance Advisory Group and its Legislative Council. Within Yale University, meanwhile, she was a member of the Intercultural Affairs Council, Committee on Sexual Misconduct, Alcohol Policy Committee, and Safety Net Committee—the last one a group of staff and student leaders dedicated to supporting health and safety on campus.

Backus is also a member of the NCAA's Gender Equity Task Force, a group of 11 commissioners, college presidents and athletics directors, the goal of which is to move the needle on gender equity in college sports.

DISANTO FIELD HOME OF THE SPARTANS



The 2016 season will mark the 12th year that the Case Western Reserve University football team has called DiSanto Field home.

The 2,400-seat, state-of-the-art stadium and surrounding residence hall complex opened in August of 2005 as Case Field and was renamed in October of 2013 as DiSanto Field. The facility boasts many distinguishing features, such as its spacious locker rooms, updated press box, field surface and surrounding track. The entire complex was built at a total cost of \$126 million.

"As a coach and recruiter, you want to be able to show prospects a facility that they would be proud to call home during their collegiate career," said **Head Coach Greg Debeljak**. "The players and parents who visit our complex walk away with that feeling and more."

After playing over 35 years of football at Finnigan Field, the Spartans played their last game at the multi-sport complex on November 8, 2003. Finnigan Field had played host to many successful teams, including the 1984 Spartan football squad, which was the first in university history to finish the season undefeated. The field also was used as a practice facility for the Cleveland Browns from 1965 to 1972.

During the 2004 season, the Spartans played their home games at Brush High School's Korb Field while construction on their new home was completed. Play opened at the new facility for the Case Western Reserve football squad in front of 2,300 fans on September 10, 2005 versus Denison University. The Spartans did not disappoint on that day, defeating the Big Red, 20-6.

The setting in which DiSanto Field was built is arguably one of the best in all of college athletics. The gridiron is surrounded by seven residence halls known as the Village at 115. These student dormitories, built in a horseshoe shape around the field, house around 800 undergraduate students, giving the facility a unique and intimate feel.

"Our attendance has more than doubled since the facility was opened," explained Debeljak. "A very spirited atmosphere has created a home field advantage that is second to none in Division III."

The stadium also boasts a modern and spacious press box. The area contains booths designated for both home and away broadcasts as well as a large work room for members of the media and school representatives. The coaches' areas within the box are especially spacious and seat six coaches comfortably. Also included is



the Coach Bill Edwards President's Suite, which plays host to distinguished guests and sponsors. The press box includes wireless high-speed internet access and digital television throughout.

Currently, locker rooms are located adjacent to the field in the lower level of house seven of the dormitory complex along with a training room facility, named after Dr. Tom McLaughlin in 2007, which includes both full-size warm and cold whirlpools.

In the fall of 2014 the university opened the Wyant Athletic & Wellness Center. The facility was made possible by the \$4 million commitment of 1965 Case Institute of Technology alumnus, James C. Wyant, PhD. A former captain of the CIT Roughriders' cross country team, Wyant's gift was influenced by the role of athletics during his college years.

As part of the North Campus Residential Village and Athletic Complex, the three-level facility includes the 4,500-square foot Belichick Weight Room – gifted by New England Patriot Head Coach Bill Belichick in honor of his father, Steve, a 1941 graduate of Western Reserve University; a 4,200-square foot cardio workout facility; and a 2,500-square foot Varsity Club with a balcony overlooking the football field and track. Future plans call for the addition of a large multipurpose space with synthetic flooring, as well as an additional wing with locker rooms, coaches' offices, meeting rooms and a training/medical facility.

The field itself is a multifunctional field with a FieldTurf surface surrounded by the eight-lane Coach Bill Sudeck Track, named after the legendary cross country, track and basketball coach in 2008. The field was built in a European box style, which provides the appropriate dimensions for soccer contests. Along with hosting varsity football, soccer and track events, the field is used for intramural activities, special events and for the general recreation of the campus community.

HEAD COACH GREG DEBELJAK

13th Season ■ John Carroll '88 ■ Record: 82-41 (.667)



Greg Debeljak enters his 13th year as the head football coach at CWRU. In his 12 seasons, he has compiled an overall record of 82-41 (.667) and led the Spartans to an unbelievable 38-game regular

season winning streak from 2006-10. Debeljak was named head coach at CWRU on March 24, 2004 after serving for 15 years as an assistant coach in the local college ranks.

Debeljak led the Spartans to three-consecutive undefeated (10-0) regular seasons, NCAA Playoff appearances and University Athletic Association titles from 2007-09. And since 2007, Case Western Reserve has posted an overall record of 69-24, earning Debeljak and his assistants the UAA Coaching Staff of the Year award for three straight seasons from 2007-09 and once again in 2011. The Spartan staff has received that honor five times in the past 13 years.

Additionally, Case Western Reserve has been ranked in the top 25 in the nation in six of the last nine seasons, including their highest mark of No. 7 during the final regular season American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) poll in 2009.

Debeljak also was selected as one of five finalists in Division III for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award for three straight years (2007-09) and was named the 2008 Lee Tressel Ohio College Coach of the Year by the Northeast Ohio Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

Debeljak's Spartans also excel in the classroom, annually ranking amongst the nation's leaders in team GPA. During his time, ten Spartans have earned Capital

One Academic All-America® honors while three have been named a semifinalist for the Draddy Trophy (commonly referred to as the Academic Heisman).

A graduate of nearby Mentor High School, Debeljak served as the Spartans' associate head coach/offensive coordinator for three seasons before being named head coach. Highlighting his three years as the offensive coordinator, Case Western Reserve ranked first in all of NCAA Division III in passing offense and second in total offense in 2002.

Prior to coming to Case Western Reserve, Debeljak spent 12 years as an assistant (1988-00) at his alma mater, John Carroll University. At JCU, he was a graduate assistant during his first two seasons, before working eight years as the quarterbacks and receivers coach. Before his final season at John Carroll, he was promoted to offensive coordinator.

Debeljak was a member of the staff that





produced NFL Pro Bowl linebacker London Fletcher, and he was the position coach for former Denver Broncos Head Coach and current New England Patriots' Offensive Coordinator Josh McDaniels, San Diego Chargers General Manager Tom Telesco, and former pros Tom Arth (Colts, Packers, Toronto [CFL]) and Larry Wanke (Giants).

Debeljak earned both his bachelor's (1988) and master's (1995) degrees from John Carroll, and he played basketball and football for the Blue Streaks. On the gridiron, he lettered four times, once as a defensive back (earning second-team all-league honors), twice as a quarterback and once as a receiver. As a basketball player, he helped the Blue Streaks to a pair of Presidents' Athletic Conference titles and held the school record for assists in a single game with 13.

Debeljak and his wife, Kelly, reside in Beachwood. Their two daughters, Ashley '13 and Allison '15, were both women's soccer student-athletes at CWRU.

THE COACH "DEBS" PHILOSOPHY

Greg Debeljak has a three-part philosophy on how to win both on and off the field, and when it all comes together the Spartan leader feels it positions his team for ultimate success. "You are going to have various levels of success with wins and losses, but I think it's important to experience other things," he explained. "When we have recruiting weekends and we meet as a group, this is one of the first things I bring up."

- The first goal is to become a family through team-building activities. "We want our kids to come together as a team and a family, but it's difficult," Debeljak explained. "Each year brings different players with different personalities – that's why it is our number one goal. We can't accomplish anything else until we merge together as a family. The relationships an incoming freshman had with his high school teammates most likely began in elementary school – they grew up with each other. The biggest hurdle is to get (freshmen) to believe in their new family in a shortened period of time."
- The second is the commitment to excellence in both athletics and academics without sacrificing one for the other. "In regards to academics and athletics, we feel that even though we are one of the better academic institutions in the country, we still want to be competitive on a national level athletically. Simply said, they should both fit together." The Spartans annually rank amongst the nation's leaders in team GPA and have boasted one of the top combined winning percentages of any Division III program in the country since 2007.
- Third, student-athletes give something back through community involvement and service. One of his first initiatives in this area was making the players a household name with incoming freshmen by helping them move into their dorm rooms, a recurring event every August. And last year, the Spartan gridironers taught football skills to hundreds of inner city elementary students during a university-wide volunteer effort. "I think it is important to get out there and make your name known to the CWRU Community and to classmates," Debeljak said. "The Case For Community Day Sports Clinic event is a lot of fun, and our kids learn as much from the campers as they did from them."



DERECK SLESH

Offensive Coordinator/ Recruiting Coordinator/ Offensive Line



The 2016 season will mark Dereck Slesh's 13th as offensive coordinator and 17th overall at CWRU. Slesh joined the staff in 2001 and spent his first three seasons as the

defensive coordinator. In January of 2009, he was given additional responsibility as the program's recruiting coordinator.

During his time at CWRU, Slesh has guided some of the nation's top offensive units, including a 2009 squad that ranked fifth in the nation in scoring (42.4 ppg) and seventh in yardage (470.8 ypg). Slesh also produced a three-time (2007-09) UAA Offensive Player of the Year and 2009 AFCA All-American in quarterback Dan Whalen. In 2015, he oversaw the development of D3football.com All-Region selections in quarterback Rob Cuda and tight end Ethan Albers, as the offense finished 29th among all NCAA Division III squads in scoring offense.

Prior to his arrival at Case Western Reserve, Slesh spent three seasons (1996-97, 2000) on the staff at John Carroll University. He also served in the local high school ranks as head coach at Benedictine High School from 1998-99 and as a member of the staff at Beachwood High School from 1990-95. In 1988, Slesh began his coaching career at his high school alma mater, Hawken School.

Slesh was a football and baseball student-athlete at Marietta College, where he earned a bachelor's degree in business management in 1988. He also earned a Master of Business Administration from Cleveland State University in 1996.

WARREN MILLER

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers



Warren Miller will enter his fourth season at CWRU and second as defensive coordinator/linebackers coach in 2016.

In his first season as the team's defensive coordinator, Miller's unit finished 15th among all NCAA Division III squads in rushing defense (100.2 yards per game), holding opponents to 22.4 points per game. Ten of his players earned All-PAC honors in 2015.

Miller's first two seasons with the program were spent as special teams coordinator/linebackers coach, and in 2013 his unit produced the UAA Special Teams Player of the Year.

Before joining the staff in University Circle, Miller spent five seasons as linebackers coach at NCAA Division II Walsh University. He also served as an athletic academic advisor from 2010-12 as well as Director of Compliance and Eligibility from 2007-10.

Prior to his time in North Canton, Miller served for three seasons (2005-07) in a defensive quality control position at the University of Minnesota. During his time on the staff, the Gophers appeared in a pair of bowl games.

Miller also served as a graduate assistant and tight ends coach at Walsh from 2003-05 as well as a student assistant for offensive lineman and tight ends at his alma mater, Baldwin Wallace University, from 2001-03.

Miller graduated from BW with a Bachelor of Arts degree in business administration.



JOHN PONT

Wide Receivers/ Passing Game Coordinator



John Pont joined the Case Western Reserve coaching staff as the Receiver Coach prior to the start of the 2015 season. His responsibilities were extended entering the 2016 season to include coordination of the

Spartans' passing game.

During his first season with the team, he helped oversee an offense that ranked 32nd in Division III in total offense and 34th in passing offense. Under his leadership, Bryan Erb broke the program record with 13 receiving touchdowns, the 20th-best mark among DIII players.

Pont brings a wealth of NCAA Division I experience with him to Case Western Reserve, having previously served at the University of Akron as the Inside Receivers Coach and Recruiting Coordinator from 2012-15. He has also worked as a quality control coach at by Miami University (Ohio) and Colorado State University, in addition to coaching stints at the University of North Texas, the University of North Alabama, and Florida State University.

Pont received his Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from Miami University (Ohio), and his Master's Degree in Sport Administration from Florida State University.

BEN LOLLI

Defensive Backs/ Special Teams Coordinator



Ben Lolli rejoined the Case Western Reserve University coaching staff for the 2016 season, and will serve as the team's Special Teams Coordinator, while also coaching the defensive backs.

Lolli previously served as the wide receivers coach at Case Western Reserve during the 2013 and 2014 seasons. In between stints with the Spartans, he worked at Oberlin College, where he coached special teams and linebackers. Prior to his initial arrival at CWRU, Lolli spent the previous three years at Division II Walsh University with two seasons as a graduate assistant (2010-11) and one as a defensive assistant (2012) for linemen and backs. He previously worked with the Cavalier wide receivers in 2011.

Prior to his time in North Canton, Lolli served as a student assistant for four seasons at his alma mater, Kent State University.

A three-year letterwinner at Stow High School, Lolli went on to earn a bachelor's degree in history from Kent State in 2009 and a Master of Arts in Education from Walsh in 2012.



DAVE DiCARLO

Assistant Coach - Quarterbacks

Dave DiCarlo returns to the Spartan's coaching staff in 2016, and will be working with the team's quarterbacks.

DiCarlo, who earned a B.A. (political science & history) in 1961 from Western Reserve and M.A. (political science) in 1974 from Case Western Reserve, was the Spartans' quarterbacks coach for a four-year stretch from 2006-10, helping develop and mentor All-American Dan Whalen. He also served as the program's offensive coordinator in 1999, linebacker coach in 1984 and offensive line coach from 1985-86, 1989 and 1999. He was John Carroll University's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 1987.

DiCarlo has extensive experience at the high school level, including being the head coach at local Independence (1992-96), Cleveland Heights (1975-83) and Byzantine Catholic (1966-74) high schools. Independence made it to the state semifinals twice under the five-time coach of the year in 1992 and 1995. Most recently, he was the quarterbacks coach at Walsh Jesuit High School.

DiCarlo retired from a career in both public and private high school teaching in 1999.

JIM STEPHENS

Assistant Coach - Outside Linebackers

Jim Stephens will join the Spartan's coaching staff in 2016 as an assistant coach, following an outstanding career as a head coach and educator at the University School. His primary responsibilities at CWRU include working with the team's outside linebackers.

Stephens served as the head coach at the University School from 2000 until 2014, going 82-17 during his 15 seasons. The 82 wins rank as the most in the 125-year history of University School football. Prior to becoming the head coach, he was the assistant varsity football and wrestling coach at the school from 1994-2000, and held numerous coaching positions at Shaker Heights High School, Wickliffe High School, the Laurel School and Phillips Academy over his career.

Stephens was an English teacher at the University School for the previous 22 years. Prior to that, he was the Head of the English Department at the Laurel School from 1998-1994, and was an English teacher at Phillips Academy from 1980-88.

Stephens was a two-year starter at safety for Princeton University, graduating cum laude in 1974 with a degree in English. He went on to earn his Master of Arts degree in English from Columbia University in 1976, and his Master of Philosophy degree in English from Columbia in 1979, where he was a President's Fellow.





CONOR REILLY

Assistant Coach - Defensive Line



Conor Reilly joined the Case Western Reserve University football staff prior to the start of the 2016 season. His primary responsibilities include working with the Spartan's defensive line and recruiting.

Reilly comes to CWRU following a two-year stint as a graduate assistant with Ohio University, where he worked with the Bobcats' linebackers.

Reilly was a defensive lineman for the Bobcats during his collegiate career. After graduating from Ohio, Reilly played a year in the Arena Football League (AFL) with the Cleveland Gladiators.

Reilly received his Bachelor of Science in Recreation Management from Ohio in 2010, and earned his Masters of Sports Science in Coaching Education from Ohio in 2016.

JESSICA WHITE

Athletic Trainer



Jessica White was named the Head Athletic Trainer at Case Western Reserve University in the fall of 2014, after serving on the sports medicine staff since 2010.

White earned her Bachelor of Science degree in athletic training/clinic management from Bowling Green State University in 2007. She later earned a Master of Arts and Education with a sport science emphasis from Defiance College in 2010.

White also teaches CPR/first aid as an instructor of physical education and serves as the faculty advisor and clinical education coordinator for the sports medicine minor.

TYLER SCHOVANEC

Assistant Coach - Running Backs



Tyler Schovanec will begin his first season with the CWRU football staff in 2016, working with the team's running backs during the year, in addition to helping with the team's recruiting efforts.

Schovanec spent a season with the Spartans in 2015, earning a selection to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society for his efforts on the field and in the classroom. Prior to that, he was a three-year member of the Carroll University team, playing in 26 games during his career and accounting for 10 TDs.

Tyler received his undergraduate degree from Carroll University in Business Administration in 2015, and is scheduled to graduate from Case Western Reserve's Weatherhead School of Management with a Master's degree in Management and Finance in December 2016.





2016 SEASON PREVIEW

After coming just a game away from winning the 2015 Presidents' Athletic Conference Championship, the Case Western Reserve University football team will look to take another big step forward in 2016, as the squad aims for its first NCAA Division III playoff berth since the 2009 campaign.

The Spartans overall record of 7-3 in 2015 marked a four-game improvement from the previous season, as CWRU finished third in the PAC with a 6-2 conference record, rising four spots in the standings from 2014. Now in its third season as an affiliate member of the PAC, Case Western Reserve will enter the campaign receiving votes in the D3football.com preseason poll for the first time since prior to the start of the 2012 season.

With 13 starters returning from last year's team, including eight All-PAC honorees, the Spartans have their sights set on challenging for the conference championship and the bid to the NCAA Championships associated with it.

"Expectations are high," said Head Coach **Greg Debeljak**, who will enter his 13th season with the team with an overall record of 82-41. "The senior class last year really set a tone of getting back to national relevance. There was disappointment that we did not make the playoffs, but our eyes were opened to the potential to do that, especially with a team that is made of a great deal of returning players."

Last year's campaign was the Spartans eighth winning season in the last nine years, with the team going 69-24 (good for a .741 winning percentage) during the stretch.

"Every team is different, and we realize that success does not just happen by itself," continued

Debeljak. "We need to come in and create a culture of winning and caring about each other. If we can do that, we have the talent to be relevant on the national level, as long as we stay healthy and live up to our potential."

OFFENSE

The Case Western Reserve offense experienced a breakthrough season last year, behind the emergence of first-year starting quarterback **Rob Cuda**, who will be back to pilot the Spartans' attack as a junior in 2016. With Cuda at the helm, the Case Western Reserve offense ranked 29th among all NCAA Division III teams with 38.7 points per game, and 32nd with 468.4 yards per contest.

"We have a lot of pieces coming back, despite graduating a few big playmakers," said Debeljak. "We like our depth and we're still fairly young, but also very experienced. I think we'll find out what kind of depth we've established through recruiting this year."

Quarterback

Cuda will look to build upon his 2015 campaign, when he was named to the All-PAC and All-University Athletic Association first teams. Not only did he lead the team's air attack, throwing for 28 touchdowns (16th in Division III) and 2,631 yards (31st in Division III), but he was also the team's leading rusher during the campaign with 715 yards and eight touchdowns on the ground. His 334.6 yards of offense per game was the ninth-best individual total during the year, and he ranked 11th in Division III by accounting for 21.6 points per game.

"Rob is one of the best football players in the country," said Debeljak. "He makes everyone around him better, and a big part of that is because



everyone believes he will win games for us in some way – either running the football or throwing, everyone has confidence that he can make big plays to win a game. And, as good as he played last year, I think that he can play better, and he will play better.”

Adding additional experience at the position behind Cuda are sophomore **Mitchell Peer** and senior **Stephen Guenther**.

Running Back

With a large contingent of players handling the rushing load last season, Case Western Reserve finished the season ranked 72nd in Division III with 190.3 yards per game on the ground. This year, despite graduating a key piece in fullback **Adam Hochman**, the Spartans' backfield will be returning four players who saw action in at least seven games in 2015.

“We rotated a lot of players last year, so, even though we lost some running backs, we have a lot of people returning with experience at the position,” said Debeljak.

Junior fullback **Jacob Burke** is expected to see his role in the running game expanded significantly, after rushing the ball nine times for 58 yards and a touchdown last year, while also adding the ability to catch passes out of the backfield. Juniors **Myles Anthony** (141 yards, one TD) and **Jeffrie Brown Jr.** (110 yards) are expected to be the featured tailbacks, with junior **Aaron Aguilar** and sophomore **Kenny Warren Jr.** each playing a role at the position during upcoming season. Sophomore **JP Wassmann** will add depth at the fullback position as well.

Receiver/ Tight End

Despite returning a good portion of the receiving corps from last season, the Spartans will need to account for the loss of two of Cuda's favorite targets in graduated players **Bryan Erb** (65 receptions, 856 yards, school-record 13 receiving TDs) and all-region tight end **Ethan Albers** (29 receptions, 576 yards, five TDs).

“It will be a different group, but a really effective group,” commented Debeljak. “Last year, it was nice to be able to throw it up to two big bodies in Erb and Albers, who will not be here anymore. We will have to find ways to make big plays and put points on the board a little differently than last year. It does not mean that it won't happen, just that it will be different.”

The Spartans will, in part, look to two rising seniors in wide receiver **Brendan Lynch** and tight end **Zech Medved** to fill the void. Lynch was second on the team last year with 42 receptions, tallying 330 yards

and a touchdown, while Medved, now a second-year captain, had 18 receptions for 303 yards and three TDs in 2015. Junior **Luke DiFrancesco** caught 16 passes for a career-best 325 yards last season, and has 47 receptions for 584 yards and three TDs over the first two years of his career. **Justin Phan** will see his responsibilities expanded during his second year on the team as well, after catching 16 passes for 161 yards in 2015.

Other returners expected to be involved in the passing game this season include juniors **Zak Hurd** and **Giuseppe Orsini**, and sophomores **Louis Cotteta**, **Joey Spitali**, and **Hunter Tulloch**.

Offensive Line

The Spartans' offensive line was one of the keys to the team's breakout offensive campaign in 2015, yielding just 2.2 sacks per game during the season. This year, with the majority of the unit returning, including three players who received All-PAC recognition, the CWRU offensive line will aim for a carryover of its success from last season.

“We have six players on our offensive line that have started and are coming back, and we will start with 20 offensive linemen on the roster, including the freshmen coming in,” said Debeljak. “We have numbers and we have depth, but hopefully we can stay injury free and keep the upperclassmen on the field. I definitely think the offensive line is a strength of our team.”

Leading the line will be three juniors, each of which has started since their freshman year, in center **Gage Blair**, guard **Ryan DeMarinis**, and tackle **Ryan Merlau**. Blair was an All-PAC First Team selection as a sophomore, while DeMarinis claimed an honorable mention to the team last season. A pair of seniors in All-PAC honorable mention guard **Dante Capicchioni** and tackle **Nate Lewis** will round out the starters on the line, while senior center **Robbie Sabatelle**, junior guard **Alex Nesvisky**, and sophomore tackle **Steven Bachie** are expected to see significant time on the field during the year.

Additional returners with a chance to make an impact on the offensive line include sophomores **Jack Blanton**, **John Fry**, **Jim Irwin**, **Chaz Brown**, and **Joseph Katula**, and junior **David Khanin**.

DEFENSE

While the Spartans' offense was standout group in 2015, the defense quietly turned into one of the top performing groups in Division III during the year. Case Western Reserve allowed just 100.2 rushing yards per game last season, 15th best among DIII squads and second among PAC teams, while the team's 3.00 sacks per game ranked 23rd in the



nation. The Spartans allowed just 22.4 points and 343.6 total yards per game in 2015.

Although Case Western Reserve will be graduating seven starting players from last year's defense, the Spartans have a number of players on this year's roster who saw extensive time on the field last season, and will be aiming to fill the voids in the 3-4 defense.

"We are losing a lot of players, but we have a lot of people who rotated last year and played a third of the snaps during games, which is invaluable, because they have been put in game situations, and they were productive when they had their opportunities," said Debeljak. "It might take a little time to develop, but we certainly have some talent."

Secondary

The most experience and talent on the field for the Spartans will come from the secondary, which includes senior All-PAC second team cornerback **Nick Kwon** and All-UAA first team honoree **Cody Calhoun**. Kwon led the team with four interceptions, 14 pass breakups and 42 solo tackles last season, while Calhoun had 48 total tackles and a pair of interceptions last year.

"We have players in the secondary that could be considered for All-American status," said Debeljak. "At cornerback, Kwon, who is in his fourth year as a starter, makes everybody else look better because of his coverage skills. Calhoun, who is one of the better players in the region, has terrific cover skills and tackling ability."

Junior **Adrian Cannon** is slated to start at the other cornerback position, after starting the last five games of the 2015 season, including a school-record tying performance with three interceptions against Washington University (Mo.) on October 31st. Senior **Owen Williams** and sophomore **Andre Orantes** will be both be factors at cornerback as well, with returning juniors in **Mike Devereaux**, **Daniel Fabiniak** and **Alek LaVeck** all expected to see time at safety.

"It is a very talented group, and I think we have at least six players that could play at a very high level. It will be interesting to see what Coach [Warren] Miller and his staff do with them and how creative we can be," said Debeljak.

Linebacker

Despite losing three starters at the position, the Spartans should not suffer from a lack of experience at linebacker in 2016, thanks to a large rotation last year that heavily featured all four of the likely starters for the upcoming season.

"We have six players who have all played quite a bit, and with our philosophy of rotating players, this is where it should all pay off," said Debeljak.

On the inside, juniors **Andrew Banathy** (29 tackles, 3.0 TFL) and **Justin McMahon** (21 tackles, 3.5 TFL) will see their roles increase as they likely move into starting positions on the depth chart, and senior **Tim Briercheck** will look to make an impact after missing all last season due to injury. Three sophomores - **David Traganza**, **Mitchell Willis** and **Matt Gallagher** - are also likely see time at inside linebacker.

Senior **Zach Lyon** is the team's lone returning starting quarterback, and will look to pick up where he left off last season, when he led the team in quarterback hurries and sacked the quarterback three times. Junior **Alex Habeeb** also saw considerable time on the field last year, notching 10 tackles and a sack, and will have a chance to start this season. Other returning outside linebackers this year include senior **Jeep Madison**, junior **Chanan Demery** and sophomore **Jerred Butler**.

Defensive Line

The Spartans defensive line will have a new look for the 2016 season, after graduating each of the three starters from the position last season. However, Debeljak is hoping that with extensive depth on the line, Case Western Reserve will quickly find a combination of players that can be successful.

"The defensive line is our biggest question mark, if only for the lack of experience at the position," commented Debeljak. "We are going to have to see how everyone fits together, how we develop in camp, and who shows that he can play at our level. We have a lot of different ways to go, and a lot of it is going to be determined on how we play up front early. If we are not finding answers, we can move people around and play different sets."

Senior end **Tyler Doty** has the most experience at the position, including four tackles for a loss and two sacks last year, while junior **Jason Lockamy** added a sack and 12 tackles in 2015. Sophomores **Brian McNamara**, **Chris Zhang**, and **Tyler Bushman** and juniors **Dan Techman** and **Pete LeMaster** will each aim to increase their impact at defensive end in 2016. In the middle of the line, sophomore **Ian Henderson**, who saw extensive time on special teams last season, and sophomore **Will Graziani** should each see an increase of playing time at nose guard.

SPECIAL TEAMS

With the majority of the key players from the unit returning this season, the Spartans should

once again be strong across the board on special teams. Three experienced kickers are returning to the roster, including All-PAC second team junior **Ben Carniol**, who led all PAC players and was sixth in Division III with a .818 field goal percentage last season. Junior **Weston Salerno** also kicked for the team last year, while junior **Won Kun Park** served as a kickoff specialist. Meanwhile, in addition to his duties in the running game, **Jacob Burke** earned an honorable mention to the All-PAC team as a punter last season.

"We have some solid, experienced kickers and punters, and it is always good when you know what you have going into the season at those positions," said Debeljak.

The Spartans' roster also boasts two of the top returners in the conference. Last year, **Cody Calhoun** led the PAC and was 24th in Division III with 26.3 yards per kickoff return, while **Justin Phan** was fifth in the PAC and 48th in Division III with 8.3 yards per punt return as a freshman.

"I don't think you are going to find too many better return men than we have with Calhoun and Phan," said Debeljak. "We are pretty confident that our special teams can be a difference in games."

PAC OUTLOOK/ SCHEDULE

For the third year, the Spartans are slated to play an eight-game PAC slate, in addition to a pair of games against traditional UAA opponents in the University of Chicago and Washington University (Mo.). Two of the opponents on the Spartans schedule – Westminster College (Pa.) and Carnegie Mellon

University – received votes in the D3football.com Preseason Top-25 Poll, while two other PAC schools that are not on CWRU's schedule this season – 11th-ranked Thomas More College and Washington & Jefferson College (received votes) – were also recognized in the rankings.

"The strength of the top level of the conference can match up with many of the top leagues in the country," said Debeljak. "The fact that five teams were in the [D3football.com] preseason poll tells you a lot about the respect the conference has around the country. The PAC is a talented, deep conference."

The Spartans will open their schedule at home on September 5th against the University of Chicago in a UAA matchup. After a bye week, CWRU will hit the road for PAC games at Grove City College on September 17th and Waynesburg University on September 24th. Three of the Spartans' five games in October will be at home, with matchups at DiSanto Field against Saint Vincent College on October 1st (Fireworks Night), Thiel College on October 17th (Homecoming) and Geneva College on October 22nd, and road games at Bethany College on October 8th and at UAA opponent Washington (Mo.) on October 29th.

Case Western Reserve will wrap-up its season with a tough two-game stretch that could very likely have an impact on the top of the conference standings. On November 7th, the Spartans will head to Westminster for their first-ever meeting with the Titans, before returning home on November 14th to face Carnegie Mellon in the 31st-Annual Academic Bowl.

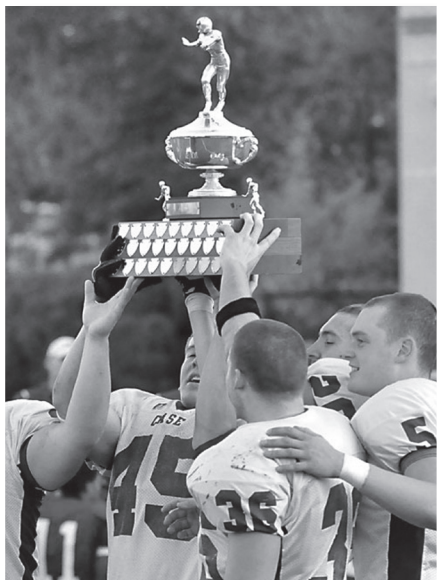
ACADEMIC BOWL

Each fall, student-athletes from Case Western Reserve University and Carnegie Mellon University meet on the gridiron with the victor claiming the Academic Bowl. Although the football series between the Spartans and Tartans began in 1970, it wasn't until 1986 when the annual meeting between two of the nation's top academic institutions was labeled the Academic Bowl.

With each school ranked amongst the nation's elite research and scholastic institutions, a natural rivalry exists in academics. So as competition in the classroom continues, the winner of the coveted Academic Bowl can claim bragging rights on the athletic field for at least one year.

The Academic Bowl is more than a trophy, however, as it emphasizes a 'Commitment to Academic and Athletic Excellence'.

The Spartans won the first Academic Bowl in 1986, defeating Carnegie Mellon 21-14. In the all-time Academic Bowl series, the Tartans hold a 16-14 advantage.

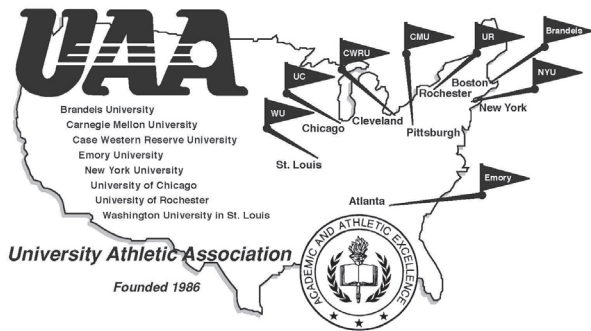
THE UAA: WHERE THEORY MEETS PRACTICE

For 30 years, the University Athletic Association has continued to serve as a bold statement of the vision of its founders — that the pursuit of academic and athletic excellence are complementary goals and can be achieved without the compromise of one by the other. The members of the UAA hold that the success of intercollegiate athletics is wholly dependent upon institutional integrity and the ability of institutions to complete the full integration of athletics into the academic fabric of higher education.

The UAA is a significant expression of the principle that the provision of a high-quality college athletic experience is worth the commitment required of an institution. It is worthwhile not only because it benefits the student-athletes, but also because it benefits the entire campus community and, in turn, the institution itself.

Members of the UAA share the belief that academic excellence and athletic excellence are not mutually exclusive. Implicit in this belief are several sets of assumptions. The first is that the academic enterprise is the primary element. Student-athletes are just that — students first and athletes second.

The second set of assumptions has to do with athletic excellence. Athletic excellence is not to be confused with a win-at-all-costs attitude. It properly relates



to the caliber of experience offered to students who participate in intercollegiate athletics. Athletic teams should have the benefit of qualified coaching — capable individuals chosen for professional competence and commitment to putting the welfare of the student first. They should play and practice in first-rate facilities at reasonable times. Their equipment should be safe, of high quality, and conducive to the best performance possible. A consistent and challenging level of athletic competition should be provided to both women and men.

The final assumptions concern what might be termed a proper athletic emphasis. Athletic programs are extracurricular activities conducted for students and should be given consideration similar to that accorded other such institutionally sponsored activities. They should not only complement the academic experience, but should also reflect the quality of the academic environment within which they exist. Division III is an approach to athletics — not a synonym for third-rate.



The University Athletic Association sponsors competition in 23 sports — twelve sports for men and eleven sports for women — including football, soccer, cross country, volleyball, basketball, fencing, wrestling, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, baseball, softball, outdoor track and field, tennis, and golf.

Many student-athletes from UAA institutions have been recognized for their achievements as scholars and athletes. During the 2015-16 academic year, 37 student-athletes from UAA institutions were recognized as CoSIDA Academic All-America® honorees, one of whom earned the prestigious NCAA Elite 90 award. 148 received All-America honors in team or individual sports, nine garnered individual national championship event titles or national Player of the Year honors, and 21 more won national titles in relays.

In addition, nine student-athletes from UAA institutions were among the select group of seniors across the country named NCAA Postgraduate or Fulbright Scholars.

Teams throughout the UAA are perennial contenders for post-season play. In 2015-16, UAA teams advanced to the national championship and captured the national title in women's swimming and diving and women's tennis.

In all, 22 UAA teams posted top-ten finishes in their national championships, including nine among the top-five, and 17 others finished in the top twenty.

THE PRESIDENTS' ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), built on the basic belief that an athletic program is an integral part of college life, but not an entity in itself, looks back on sixty years of growth and ahead to years of continued academic and athletic excellence.



The league's name clearly reflects its founding principle that operational control of all aspects of intercollegiate athletics is ultimately the responsibility of the presidents of each member institution, and thus active presidential leadership and oversight is paramount in conference administration.

Formally organized in 1955 by Western Reserve University, John Carroll University, Case Institute of Technology, and Wayne State University, the PAC was the result of a realization that college athletics, despite numerous virtues for the individual and the institution, were gradually becoming a financial and academic burden. If athletics were to be continued, action had to be taken to place the program on its proper level. This included the premise that benefits of participation should be provided to as many students as possible. The PAC and its membership continue its original, defining mission of promoting intercollegiate athletics and the pursuit of academic excellence.

Institutions involved understand that the key components to its progress lie in the foundation of faith in each member by each other member. It is the conviction of its membership that the PAC is the solution to the dilemma of intercollegiate athletic competition, and they have staked their athletic future on this premise.

Currently comprised of 10 select private institutions – Bethany College, Chatham University, Geneva College, Grove City College, Saint Vincent College, Thiel College, Thomas More College, Washington & Jefferson College, Waynesburg University and Westminster College – the PAC remains a unique organization in this day of high pressure intercollegiate athletics, with academics at the center of each member's philosophy.

The PAC expanded its membership to seven members in 2005 with the addition of Thomas More, formerly a NCAA Division III independent. Saint Vincent, a former NAIA member, joined the conference in 2006 as it began its reclassification to NCAA Division III status. Another former NAIA member, Geneva, became the conference's ninth member and began league play in 2007 as it started its NCAA Division III reclassification. Chatham became the league's 10th member, also in 2007.

In 2012, the PAC Presidents' Council voted to add Carnegie Mellon University and Case Western Reserve University as affiliate members in the sport of football beginning with the 2014 season.

Staying true to its original mission of promoting intercollegiate athletics and the pursuit of academic excellence, the PAC has seen nearly 200 of its participating student-athletes recognized as Academic All-Americans, while the league has also produced numerous NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship winners. Last year, the conference named 939 of its student-athletes to the PAC Academic Honor Roll, which recognizes all participating student-athletes who earn a term grade-point average of 3.60 or above.

THE NIKE CONNECTION
