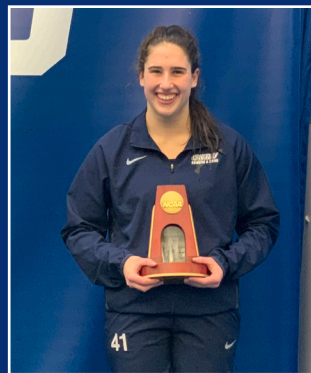

DEAR SPARTAN FAMILY,

The 2022-23 academic year was a historic one for the Case Western Reserve University Department of Physical Education and Athletics. Not only did our men's tennis team win the first-ever NCAA team championship in program history, student-athletes from all 19 of our varsity sports set records on the court, on the field, on the track, in the pool, and in the classroom, embodying our core values of compete, win, respect, and unite.

COMPETE

We are most proud of our student-athletes' academic success, and this past academic year, they raised the bar. CWRU produced a record number of Academic All-Americans, with 21 earning national honors from the College Sports Communicators, putting the Spartans third in Division III behind only MIT and Johns Hopkins. Sophomore Hannah Kassaie of the women's tennis team became just the second Case Western Reserve student-athlete to be named Academic All-America Team Member of the Year and was one of four CWRU student-athletes, along with seniors Jack Begley and Elizabeth White and junior Sahil Dayal, to win the prestigious NCAA Elite 90 Award. In addition, a program record 79 juniors and seniors with cumulative GPAs above 3.8 were inducted into the Van Horn Society in December.

WIN

While the year was capped with a pair of national championships by the men's tennis team, the 2022-23 academic year was successful for all our 19 varsity teams. Ten of the programs scored at NCAA Championships, resulting in the most points for CWRU in the LEARFIELD Directors' Cup in program history. The women's soccer team, one of four programs to win a conference championship during the year, recorded the best national finish by a women's program in school history by reaching the national championship match. The men's basketball and men's tennis teams won their first-ever University Athletic Association championships, and the softball team won the UAA for the second straight season. Individually, 20 student-athletes were named All-Americans across nine different teams.

RESPECT

While our impact at the University is important, the department values its contributions to the community. This year, we began a program in partnership with 2nd & 7 where our student-athletes would read to second graders at Roxboro Elementary School in Cleveland Heights. Our Spartans Stronger Together 5k, now in its third year, had its most successful campaign yet raising over funds to support Adaptive Sports Ohio. A huge thank you to the Stronger Together Committee, BLAC CWRU, and CASA for putting together the event. In March, we partnered with the Cleveland Cavaliers to host one of the team's Special Olympics Hoops Clinics. The baseball team continued its partnership with Team IMPACT, adding a child facing serious illness to its roster to create a long-term, life-changing experience. Finally, the department hosted a celebration of 50 years of Title IX, inviting four alumnae spanning the five decades to share their experiences as student-athletes at CWRU during this historic moment.

UNITE

I am incredibly proud of the way our community of students, staff, faculty, alumni, parents, and friends came together to support CWRU Athletics during our most successful year ever. Horsburgh Gymnasium was filled with a pair of sell-out crowds during the NCAA Men's Basketball tournament, Mather Park was filled with fans during the NCAA Regional Championship, and the Veale Center was packed during the NCAA Wrestling Regional. Our livestreams have never been more popular with unique viewership increasing for every sport. We also received lots of kind words on social media, particularly after winning the national championship, from our supporters expressing their pride in Spartan athletics. President Eric W. Kaler again deserves recognition for his continued support of our department and for appearing on multiple broadcasts. Finally, outgoing Vice President of Student Affairs Lou Stark will be missed next year following his well-deserved retirement.

My first full year leading the Case Western Reserve University Department of Athletics and Physical Education was a historic one, and I am looking forward to our students, coaches, staff, and faculty continuing their pursuit of comprehensive excellence in 2023-24.

The CWRU men's cross country team qualified for the NCAA Championship for the fourth consecutive season, placing 28th. Senior Joe Jaster won the program's second individual UAA Championship, and the team recorded its best finish in the league since 2007. Led by first-year runners Ashley Novak and Lauren Iagnemma, the women's cross country team placed fifth in the conference and 10th in the region. Novak and junior runner Grace Jackson each earned All-Region honors.

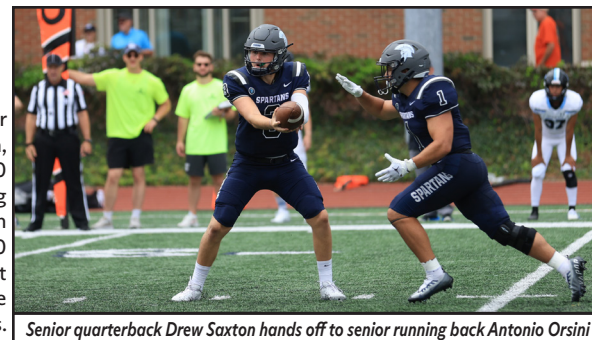

First Team All-PAC honorees Drew Saxton and Joshua Blamer led the Spartans to a 6-4 record during the 2022 season, including an upset of #25 Washington & Jefferson with 10 members of the team receiving All-PAC honors. Kaden Tong finished the season with 7.5 sacks, moving into the top 10 in program history in career sacks. The team scored at least 30 points in half of its games, including a season-high 54 points at Allegheny on October 29. A 45-21 victory over St. Vincent gave the program its 13th Homecoming win in the last 15 seasons.

Senior quarterback Drew Saxton finished his career as the program record holder in career completions (868), passing yards (10,844), and passing touchdowns (96)...Saxton was named to the All-PAC First Team for the fourth time in his career, the most of any Spartan in program history...CWRU ranked eighth in Division III in time of possession, averaging 33 minutes and 35 seconds of ball control per game... Joshua Blamer, Jace Merritt, Peter Kelley, Tony Thivener, and Paul Bruno started all 10 games for the Spartans on the offensive line.

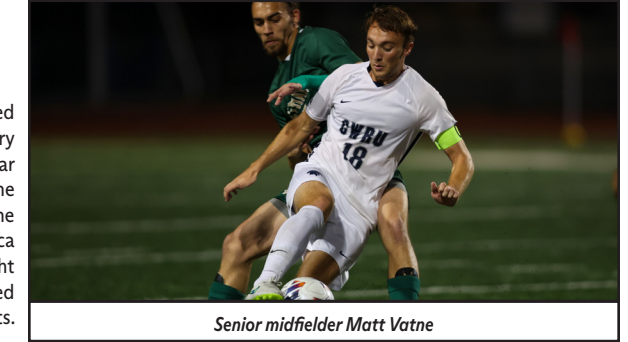

In Head Coach Carter Poe's second full season, the Spartans qualified for the NCAA Championship for just the fourth time in program history and their second in five years. CWRU won 10 matches during the year and challenged for the conference championship, losing just one game in league play. Senior Matt Vatne, the UAA Offensive Player of the Year, became the fifth player in program history to earn All-America honors after leading the team with 22 points on a team-high eight goals and team-best six assists. Senior Sean Atwater was also selected to the All-UAA First Team, scoring five goals and adding four assists.

The runner-up finish in the UAA marked a five-spot improvement over the 2021 season and was the team's best finish since 2018...Senior Matt Vatne (Third Team) and junior Alex Lippiatt (Second Team) earned CSC Academic All-America honors...The Spartans were undefeated at home, going 7-0-1 on DiSanto Field during the season...Senior Sean Atwater and graduate student Alexandru Rumleanschii were both named to the All-Region Third Team...Senior Jackson Kallen started all 17 matches in front of the net, recording four shutouts and saving 34 shots.

The women's soccer team completed one of the greatest seasons in school history for any program, reaching the national championship match in the NCAA Playoffs. The Spartans won the UAA for the first time in program history and were unbeaten prior to the national championship. The team was led by a pair of All-Americans in graduate student Camryn Hartman and senior Merry Meyer. Hartman led the offensive attack, tallying 38 points on 14 goals and 10 assists, and Meyer led a defense that recorded 11 shutouts and allowed just 0.68 goals per game. CWRU set a Division III record for goals in the NCAA Tournament, scoring 23 times in postseason play.

The CWRU women's soccer team was named the Greater Cleveland Female Collegiate Athlete of the Year at a ceremony in January...The Spartans set single-season program records for wins (20) and goals scored (70)...Senior defender Elizabeth White received the NCAA Elite 90 Award for Women's Soccer prior to the team's national semifinal win...First-year Jamie Goldfarb, seniors Lexi Gomez and Anika Washburn, and graduate student Camryn Hartman were all named to the NCAA Championship All-Tournament Team...The national runner-up finish was the highest by a women's program in CWRU history, besting the fifth place finish of the 2018 softball team...CWRU had three CSC Academic All-Americans in Elizabeth White (First Team), Anika Washburn (Second Team), and Helina VanBibber (Third Team).

The men's basketball team completed a historic season in 2022-23, winning the first UAA title in program history along with setting a school record for wins and reaching the second round of the NCAA Championship for the second consecutive season. Graduate student Mitch Prendergast became the first D3Hoops.com All-America selection and the first UAA Player of the Year in program history. Three Spartans appeared on the All-UAA First Team, including Prendergast, senior Cole Frilling, and graduate student Danny Frauenheim. CWRU opened the season with an 11-game winning streak and entered the postseason on a nine-game winning streak.

Case Western Reserve's 11 wins in conference play were a program record...Both senior Cole Frilling and graduate student Danny Frauenheim reached the 1,000-point threshold for their careers, with Frilling finishing the season with 1,220 career points (10th in program history)...The Spartans hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament, notching their first-ever postseason home win in front of a sold-out record crowd inside Horsburgh Gymnasium...CWRU scored 101 points against Brandeis and 102 against Emory, marking the first time in program history it reached the century mark in multiple UAA games in the same season...Frilling scored a season-high 30 points in the regular season finale win over archrival Carnegie Mellon.

The women's basketball team won the third-most games in program history during the 2022-23 season, going 15-10 during the campaign. The Spartans were led by senior guard/forward Isabella Mills, an All-Region Second Team and All-UAA First Team selection who set a program record with 74 made three-pointers during the season. For the first time in program history, CWRU swept UAA rival WashU, winning 74-64 at home and 61-57 in St. Louis. The Spartans added an upset win over #25 Rochester later in the campaign, defeating the Yellowjackets 78-60 inside Horsburgh Gymnasium.

The Spartans, who went undefeated against Division III competition during the season, finished the campaign with a record of 33-4, ending the season on a 19-match winning streak. In addition, senior James Hopper and junior Vishwa Aduru won the doubles national championship, the second straight national title for Hopper

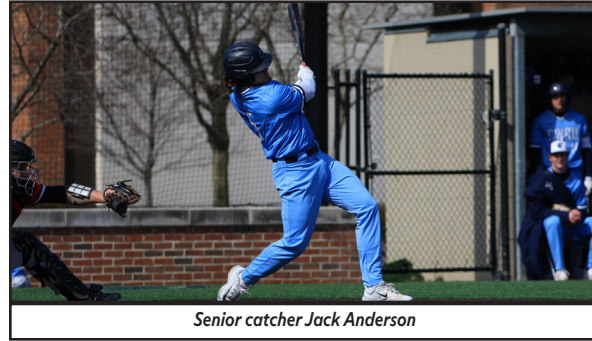

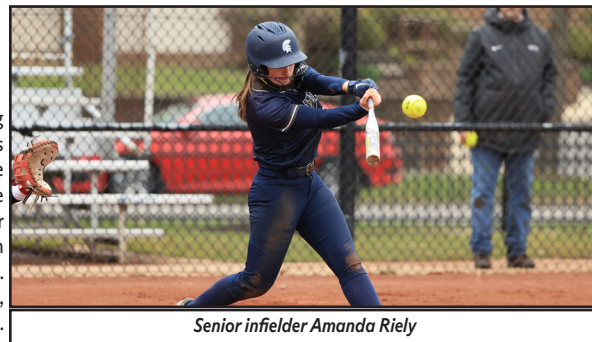

Van Horn Society

New initiation created to recognize the top tier Academic Student-Athletes at CWRU. The Van Horn Society honors all Juniors and Seniors who have achieved a 3.8 cumulative GPA or higher.

The Van Horn Society was named after Dr. Frank Van Horn, a geology professor at Case Institute of Technology in 1900 when he was chosen to improve a poor sports program, which consisted of football and basketball. He had no experience in athletics and was given virtually no budget, but somehow he raised \$3,000 and hired his first football coach, Joe Wentworth. What followed were six of the greatest seasons in CIT history with four Ohio championships. Amongst the defeated were Ohio State, Purdue and Western Reserve.

In the 1920s, Van Horn built a football stadium with the finest grandstand in the Midwest, and the field was later named in his honor. He personally raised \$35,000 to buy an old church near the campus and converted it into a gymnasium complete with pool and clubhouse. It enabled Case to begin varsity programs for basketball, swimming and wrestling.
