Case Western Reserve University is among the nation's leading research institutions. Founded in 1826 and shaped by the federation of Case Institute of Technology and Western Reserve University, Case Western Reserve is distinguished by its strengths in education, research, service and experiential learning.

Located in Cleveland, Ohio, Case Western Reserve, a member of the Association of American Universities, offers nationally recognized programs in the arts and sciences, dental medicine, engineering, law, management, medicine, nursing and social sciences.

With an endowment of more than \$1.8 billion, Case Western Reserve, in partnership with individuals, corporations,



and foundations, supports about 100 designated academic and research centers and is among the nation's top 25 private universities in federal research spending

## PRESIDENT ERIC W. KALER

Eric W. Kaler is the 11th president of Case Western Reserve University. He joined Case Western Reserve on July 1, 2021 from the University of Minnesota, where he served as president from 2011-2019 and professor of chemical engineering and materials science from 2011-2021.

An accomplished chemical engineer and visionary university leader, President Kaler's career in higher education spans more than 40 years and includes leadership and faculty roles at premier public research universities. He is a member of the National Academy of Engineering and was elected as a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences for both his leadership in engineering and in higher education.

President Kaler has significant expertise in elevating research, expanding fundraising, forming collaborative partnerships, encouraging entrepreneurship and advocating for access to education for all.

The university embraces its core values, each of which guides President Kaler's three priorities—to elevate academic excellence, expand the university's research enterprise and enhance community engagement and impact.

Under President Kaler's leadership, CWRU has:

- Grown undergraduate and total enrollment to approximately 6,300 undergraduate students (with an average first-year class size of 1,550) and nearly 12,300 students overall in fall 2023;
- Increased annual research expenditures from about \$400 million in 2021 to \$554 million in fiscal year 2023;
- Begun construction on the Interdisciplinary Science and Engineering Building (ISEB), a nearly 200,000-square-foot, \$300 million research building located on the Case Quad that will be dedicated to interdisciplinary discovery and collaboration. The ISEB is expected to be completed in 2026, just in time for the bicentennial celebration of the founding of Western Reserve University.
- Committed to hiring 100 net new tenured and tenure-track faculty by 2028, a 15-percent increase for the university.
- Expanded scholarship opportunities for graduates of the Cleveland Metropolitan School District and East Cleveland high schools through the Cleveland Scholars program.
- Strengthened partnerships and connections with community members through the creation of a Neighborhood Advisory Council, expansion of Pre-

College Programs, and the renovation of a vacant, historic property into the Wade Park Community Engagement Center, which opened in fall 2024.

- Won its first-ever NCAA Division III national team championship with Men's Tennis in 2023.



President Kaler began his career in higher education as a research and teaching assistant at the University of Minnesota, where he earned his PhD in chemical engineering in 1982. He then joined the faculty at the University of Washington, where he was an assistant professor and associate professor of chemical engineering from 1982-1989.

His first leadership positions followed at the University of Delaware, which he joined as an associate professor in 1989. He was promoted to professor in 1991 and appointed the Elizabeth Inez Kelley Professor in 1998. He also served as the chair of the chemical engineering department from 1996-2000 and dean of the College of Engineering from 2000-2007. He joined Stony Brook University in 2007 as provost and senior vice president for academic affairs and professor of engineering and chemistry. He also served as the university's vice president for Brookhaven Affairs from 2008-2011.

President Kaler holds 10 patents and has published more than 200 peer-reviewed papers. In addition to election to the National Academy of Engineering and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, President Kaler is a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the American Chemical Society, the Neutron Scattering Society of America, and he was a member of the inaugural class of the National Academy of Inventors. Currently, he serves on the Board of Directors of the Greater Cleveland Partnership, where he also co-chairs the Innovation and Growth Committee.

President Kaler earned his bachelor's degree in chemical engineering in 1978 from the California Institute of Technology.

Born in Vermont, President Kaler is a first-generation college graduate. He credits his wife, Karen, as the major contributor to his success. Karen Kaler, a Tennessee native, is well known for her warmth, enthusiasm, and advocacy. The couple have been married since 1979 and have two adult sons, Charlie and Sam, daughters-in-law Lisa and Lizzy, and granddaughters Ophelia and Kit.



## VICE PRESIDENT FOR STUDENT AFFAIRS TRAVIS APGAR



Travis T. Apgar is the Vice President for Student Affairs at Case Western Reserve University. He joined Case Western Reserve in July 2024 from Rensselaer Polytechnic

Institute, where he served as Associate Vice President for Student Life and Dean of Students from 2017 to 2024. Before that, he served Cornell University as the Robert G. Engle Associate Dean of Students from 2006 to 2017.

Recognized as an outstanding higher education leader, Vice President Apgar has more than 25 years of experience in student affairs at premier public and private research universities. He has expertise in student engagement, support, and development, and is an advocate for the multidimensional individuals that make up a college student community.

Apgar has served numerous professional associations in volunteer leadership roles, is a current member of the Board of Directors for the Hazing Prevention Network, and is a national speaker and consultant on the college student experience.

## DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS TJ SHELTON



TJ Shelton, a veteran athletics administrator, assumed the role of Case Western Reserve University's James C. Wyant Director of Athletics on January 1, 2022.

of the University Athletic Association.

During his years at Ohio State, Shelton has served as the lead administrator for several teams, a role that involved hiring coaches, oversight of budgets and support of athlete recruitment. He also managed all aspects of the university's athletic risk and compliance efforts (including Title IX and gender equity matters), negotiated athletic equipment and apparel agreements and participated in fundraising efforts that secured a \$1 million endowment for OSU's Head Wrestling Coach position, as well as scholarship and facilities programs.

CWRU athletics experienced immediate success under Shelton, with the department recording its four highest finishes in the Learfield Directors Cup Division III standings, including a 23rd-place finish in 2023-24. The men's tennis team won the first NCAA Division III Team Championship in department history in 2023, and a program-record 11 Spartan teams placed at their respective NCAA Championship in 2023-24.

A native of Independence, Kansas, Shelton earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from Wichita State University (WSU), the latter in sport science administration. After serving as a graduate assistant and intern for athletics at his alma mater, Shelton joined Washington University as an assistant facility manager in 1992. He went on to become an assistant athletic director there, overseeing four sports and participating in fundraising efforts that brought in \$3.2 million to enhance several athletic facilities.

Shelton, who came to CWRU after serving as a senior associate athletic director at The Ohio State University (OSU), previously spent 15 years in the athletics program at Washington University in St. Louis—a Division III program that, like Case Western Reserve, is a member

## DISANTO FIELD HOME OF THE SPARTANS



The 2025 season will mark the 21<sup>st</sup> year that the Case Western Reserve University football team has called DiSanto Field home.

The 2,400-seat, state-of-the-art stadium and surrounding residence hall complex opened in August 2005 as Case Field and was renamed in October 2013 as DiSanto Field. The facility boasts many distinguishing features, such as its spacious locker rooms, updated press box, field surface, and surrounding track. The entire complex was built at a total cost of \$126 million.

"As a coach and recruiter, you want to be able to show prospects a facility that they would be proud to call home during their collegiate career," said Head Coach Greg Debeljak. "The players and parents who visit our complex walk away with that feeling and more."

The field itself is a multifunctional field featuring a brand-new FieldTurf surface, installed during the summer of 2017. The field is surrounded by the eight-lane Coach Bill Sudeck Track, named after the legendary cross country, track, and basketball coach in 2008. The field was built in a European box style, which provides the appropriate dimensions for soccer contests. Along with hosting varsity football, soccer, and track events,

the field is used for intramural activities, special events, and the general recreation of the campus community.

After playing over 35 years of football at Finnigan Field, the Spartans played their last game at the multi-sport complex on November 8, 2003. Finnigan Field had played host to many successful teams, including the 1984 Spartan football squad, which was the first in university history to finish the season undefeated. The field also was used as a practice facility for the Cleveland Browns from 1965 to 1972.

During the 2004 season, the Spartans played their home games at Brush High School's Korb Field while construction on their new home was completed. Play opened at the new facility for the Case Western Reserve football squad in front of 2,300 fans on September 10, 2005, versus Denison University. The Spartans did not disappoint on that day, defeating the Big Red, 20-6.

The setting in which DiSanto Field was built is arguably one of the best in all of college athletics. The gridiron is surrounded by seven residence halls known as the Village at 115. These student residences, built in a horseshoe shape around the field, house around 800 undergraduate students, giving the facility a unique and intimate feel.



"Our attendance has more than doubled since the facility was opened," explained Debeljak. "A very spirited atmosphere has created a home field advantage that is second to none in Division III."

The stadium also boasts a modern and spacious press box. The area contains booths designated for both home and away broadcasts as well as a large work room for members of the media and school representatives. The coaches' areas within the box are especially spacious and seat six coaches comfortably. Also included is the Coach Bill Edwards President's Suite, which plays host to distinguished guests and sponsors. The press box includes wireless high-speed internet access and digital television throughout.

Locker rooms are located adjacent to the field in the lower level of House 7 of the residence complex along with a training room facility, named after Dr. Tom McLaughlin in 2007, which includes both full-size warm and cold whirlpools.

In the fall of 2014 the university opened the Wyant Athletic & Wellness Center. The facility was made possible by the \$4 million commitment of 1965 Case Institute of Technology alumnus, James C. Wyant, PhD. A former captain of the CIT Roughriders cross country team, Wyant's gift was influenced by the role of athletics during his college years.

As part of the North Campus Residential Village and Athletic Complex, the three-level facility includes the 4,500-square foot Belichick Weight Room - gifted by New England Patriot Head Coach Bill Belichick in honor of his father, Steve, a 1941 graduate of Western Reserve University; a 4,200-square foot cardio workout facility; and a 2,500-square foot Varsity Club with a balcony overlooking the football field and track. Future plans call for the addition of a large multipurpose space with synthetic flooring, as well as an additional wing with locker rooms, coaches' offices, meeting rooms and a training/medical facility.

# HEAD COACH GREG DEBELJAK

22<sup>nd</sup> Season • John Carroll '88 • Record: 144-62 (.699)



Greg Debeljak, the most accomplished coach in the history of the Case Western Reserve University football program, was named to the position on March 24, 2004. Entering his 22nd season with the team in 2025, he has compiled an impressive overall record of 144-

62 (.699) and led the Spartans to a 38-game regular season winning streak from 2006-10.

Debeljak guided the Spartans to three consecutive undefeated (10-0) regular seasons, NCAA Playoff appearances, and University Athletic Association titles from 2007-09. And from 2007 through 2023, Case Western Reserve posted an overall record of 125-41 (.753), earning Debeljak PAC Coach of the Year honors in 2017 and 2019 and he and his assistants the UAA Coaching Staff of the Year award for three straight seasons from 2007-09 and again in 2011, 2016 and 2017. Additionally, Case Western Reserve has been ranked in the top 25 in the nation in ten of the last 18 seasons, including its highest mark of No. 7 during the final regular season American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) poll in 2009.

The Spartans will enter the 2025 campaign with a winning record in each of the team's last nine seasons. In 2019, Debeljak led the Spartans to the PAC Championship for the second time in three years and earned a bid to the NCAA Playoffs for the fifth time in program history. He helped junior wide receiver Colt Morgan earn an honorable mention to the D3football.com All-America team, while three Spartans were selected as CoSIDA Academic All-Americans.

Debeljak became the first coach in program history to reach the 100-win mark with the team, hitting the milestone during the team's victory over Westminster College on November 4th, 2017. The triumph was a part of one of the best seasons in the program's history, as Debeljak led the Spartans to an 11-1 overall record, with the team making the playoffs for the fourth time ever, and reaching the second round of the tournament for the second time. The Spartans won both the PAC and UAA Championships in 2017, leading to Debeljak being named both the PAC and UAA Coach of the Year.

He coached senior center Gage Blair to AFCA All-America honors, while Blair, senior quarterback Rob Cuda, and senior running back Jacob Burke were each named to the D3football.com All-Region team.

Debeljak was also selected as one of five finalists in Division III for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award for three straight years (2007-09) and was named the 2008 Lee Tressel Ohio College Coach of the Year by the Northeast Ohio Chapter of the National Football Foundation. Debeljak's Spartans also excel in the classroom, annually ranking among the nation's leaders in team GPA. During his time, 17 Spartans have earned Capital One Academic All-America® honors while three have been named semifinalists for the Draddy Trophy (commonly referred to as the Academic Heisman).

A graduate of nearby Mentor High School, Debeljak served as CWRU's head coach/offensive coordinator for three seasons before being named head coach. Highlighting his three years as the offensive coordinator, Case Western Reserve ranked first in all of NCAA Division III in passing offense and second in total offense in 2002.

Before coming to Case Western Reserve, Debeljak spent 12 years as an assistant (1988-00) at his alma





mater, John Carroll University. At JCU, he was a graduate assistant during his first two seasons, before working eight years as the quarterbacks and receivers coach. Before his final season at John Carroll, he was promoted to offensive coordinator. Debeljak was a member of the staff that produced NFL Pro Bowl linebacker London Fletcher, and he was the position coach for former Denver Broncos and Las Vegas Raiders Head Coach and New England Patriots Offensive Coordinator Josh McDaniels, former Las Vegas Raiders General Manager Tom Telesco, and former pros Tom Arth (Colts, Packers, Toronto [CFL]) and Larry Wanke (Giants).

Debeljak earned both his bachelor's (1988) and master's (1995) degrees from John Carroll, and he played basketball and football for the Blue Streaks. On the gridiron, he lettered four times, once as a defensive back (earning second-team all-league honors), twice as a quarterback, and once as a receiver. As a basketball player, he helped the Blue Streaks to a pair of Presidents' Athletic Conference titles and held the school record for assists in a single game with 13.

Debeljak and his wife, Kelly, reside in Beachwood. Their two daughters, Ashley '13, and Allison '15, were women's soccer student-athletes at Case Western Reserve.

## THE COACH "DEBS" PHILOSOPHY

Greg Debeljak has a three-part philosophy on how to win both on and off the field, and when it all comes together the Spartan leader feels it positions his team for ultimate success. "You are going to have various levels of success with wins and losses, but I think it's important to experience other things," he explained. "When we have recruiting weekends and we meet as a group, this is one of the first things I bring up."

- The first goal is to become a family through team-building activities.
 

"We want our kids to come together as a team and a family, but it's difficult," Debeljak explained. "Each year brings different players with different personalities – that's why it is our number one goal. We can't accomplish anything else until we merge together as a family. The relationships an incoming freshman had with his high school teammates most likely began in elementary school – they grew up with each other. The biggest hurdle is to get (freshmen) to believe in their new family in a shortened period of time."
- The second is the commitment to excellence in both athletics and academics without sacrificing one for the other.
 

"In regards to academics and athletics, we feel that even though we are one of the better academic institutions in the country, we still want to be competitive on a national level athletically. Simply said, they should both fit together." The Spartans annually rank among the nation's leaders in team GPA and have boasted one of the top combined winning percentages of any Division III program in the country since 2007.
- Third, student-athletes give something back through community involvement and service.
 

One of his first initiatives in this area was making the players a household name with incoming first-year students by helping them move into their dorm rooms, a recurring event every August. In previous years, the Spartans taught football skills to hundreds of inner city elementary students during a university-wide volunteer effort. "I think it is important to get out there and make your name known to the CWRU Community and to classmates," Debeljak said. "The Case For Community Day Sports Clinic event is a lot of fun, and our kids learn as much from the campers as they did from them."



## DERECK SLESH

Offensive Coordinator/ Recruiting Coordinator



The 2025 season marks Dereck Slesh's 22nd as offensive coordinator and 25th overall at CWRU. Slesh joined the staff in 2001 and spent his first three seasons as the defensive coordinator. He has also served as the program's recruiting coordinator since January 2009.

The Spartans' offense has consistently been one of the most effective in Division III with Slesh at the helm. The 2024 squad ranked sixth in Division III in passing offense (317.0 yards per game) and he helped to develop wide receiver Noah Coyne, who went on to attend the New York Giants' rookie mini camp. Slesh helped to mentor 2019 D3football.com All-America honorable mention wide receiver Colt Morgan, as the team finished the campaign with a 9-2 overall record and qualified for the NCAA playoffs for the fifth time under his tenure. In 2018, he helped coach freshman quarterback Drew Saxton to all-region honors and the UAA Offensive Player of the Year award. The 2017 squad led all PAC teams in points per game (39.9) while ranking 45th in Division III in yards per game (437.7). The squad set program records for total yards and points during the 2017 campaign. Slesh helped mentor AFCA All-American center Gage Blair, and D3football.com All-Region quarterback Rob Cuda and running back Jacob Burke during the season. The 2016 squad set a school record for rushing yards and ranked 14th in Division III with 257.9 rushing yards per game.

Slesh was also influential with the 2009 squad that ranked fifth in the nation in scoring (42.4 ppg) and seventh in yardage (470.8 ypg). Slesh also produced a three-time (2007-09) UAA Offensive Player of the Year and 2009 AFCA All-American in quarterback Dan Whalen.

Before he arrived at Case Western Reserve, Slesh spent three seasons (1996-97, 2000) on the staff at John Carroll University. He also served in the local high school ranks as head coach at Benedictine High School from 1998-99 and as a staff member at Beachwood High School from 1990-95. In 1988, Slesh began his coaching career at his high school alma mater, Hawken School.

Slesh was a football and baseball student-athlete at Marietta College, where he earned a bachelor's degree in business management in 1988. He earned a Master of Business Administration from Cleveland State University in 1996.

## WARREN MILLER

Defensive Coordinator/ Outside Linebackers



Warren Miller enters his 13th season at CWRU and 11th as defensive coordinator/ outside linebackers coach in 2025.

Miller's defenses have consistently ranked among the best in the conference during his time with the team. Most recently, the 2024 group ended the year

ranked 12th in Division III in total defense (243.8 yards per game) and 33rd in scoring defense (16.6 points allowed per game). In 2019, Miller helped mentor senior defensive end Cameron Brown to become the first two-time PAC Defensive Player of the Year in conference history, while both junior linebacker Travis Johnston and senior safety Patrick Crossey were also named to the All-PAC First Team. He helped Brown earn All-America and PAC and UAA Defensive Player of the Year honors during the 2018 campaign, as the defensive end finished second among Division III players in sacks per game. Miller's 2017 unit was one of the best in the Presidents' Athletic Conference, leading the league in points allowed per game (17.8), total yards allowed per game (289.6), and rushing yards allowed per game (121.8). Brown and linebacker Justin McMahon both earned All-PAC First Team honors, while seven other CWRU defensive players were named to either the second team or an honorable mention. Miller was also a part of the UAA Coaching Staff of the Year during the season for the second time in his career.

Miller's first two seasons with the program were spent as special teams coordinator/linebackers coach, and in 2013 his unit produced the UAA Special Teams Player of the Year.

Before joining the staff at University Circle, Miller spent five seasons as the linebackers coach at NCAA Division II Walsh University. He also served as an athletic academic advisor from 2010-12 as well as Director of Compliance and Eligibility from 2007-10.

Before his time in North Canton, Miller served for three seasons (2005-07) in a defensive quality control position at the University of Minnesota. During his time on the staff, the Gophers appeared in a pair of bowl games.

Miller also served as a graduate assistant and tight ends coach at Walsh from 2003-05 as well as a student assistant for offensive linemen and tight ends at his alma mater, Baldwin Wallace University, from 2001-03.

Miller graduated from BW with a Bachelor of Arts degree in business administration. He and his wife Bryn live in Olmsted Falls with their three sons, Warren, William, and Wade.



## JEFF RAMSEY

Special Teams Coordinator/ Defensive Backs



Jeff Ramsey, who has coached at all three levels of NCAA competition, joined the CWRU staff as the team's Special Teams Coordinator and defensive backs coach prior to the start of the 2022 season.

Ramsey had previously served as the Head Coach at nearby Oberlin College from 1999-2013 and ranks as the

second-winningest coach in the program's history. During his time with the team, his players earned a combined seven All-America honors, nine all-region selections, and 96 all-conference honors.

After leaving Oberlin, he went on to be the defensive coordinator at the University of Puget Sound from 2014-15, and most recently completed a six-year stint as the defensive coordinator and strength and conditioning coordinator at Wabash College, helping the team win two NCAC Championships and make one NCAA Tournament appearance.

Ramsey was also on the coaching staff at Division II Sonoma State (1993-95), Division I-AA Nevada-Reno (1989-92), and Division III Marietta (1988-89). He began his career as an assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of California, Davis, from 1982-86, before serving as a graduate assistant coach at the University of Illinois from 1986-89.

Ramsey received his bachelor's degree in physical education from UC Davis, where he was a wide receiver and quarterback on the football team, helping his team to conference titles in 1980 and 1981. He earned his master's degree in Kinesiology and Athletic Administration from Illinois in 1988.

## 2025 SEASON PREVIEW

A retooled Case Western Reserve University football team will enter the 2025 campaign looking to continue its stretch of consecutive winning seasons as it strives for the Presidents' Athletic Conference title in the upcoming season.

The Spartans concluded the 2024 campaign with a 6-4 overall record, marking the ninth consecutive winning season for the team, the longest stretch in program history. It was good for a fifth-place finish in the Presidents' Athletic Conference. However, it was a tale of two seasons for CWRU, which opened the campaign with six straight wins (averaging 53.3 points and holding opponents to just 8.0 points per game during the period) before dropping its final four games of the campaign by an average margin of just 8.3 points.

"We were disappointed with how last year finished," said longtime CWRU Head Coach Greg Debeljak, who will begin his 21st season at the team's helm with an overall record of 144-62. "We got off to a great start in all three phases of the game, and I don't think we could have played any better in the first six games, but then the last four were disappointing."

CWRU once again showcased a tough defense that was supported by a high-scoring offense in 2024. The Spartans will need to overcome the loss of 33 players, 14 of whom were starters, from last year's roster. However, with a group of 79 returners, several of whom will get an opportunity to start for the first time after patiently waiting for several years supplemented by a class of 27 incoming first-year players and five transfer students the Spartans are hoping not to skip a beat entering the 2025 campaign.

Furthermore, a team trip to Italy and Greece in May provided the returning players with a chance to demonstrate their ability and give the coaching staff a clearer picture of the depth chart entering camp before the upcoming season.

"We did have an extended spring season because of our foreign trip, and that allowed us to have contact football practices with a very young team coming back," said Debeljak. "I think we had a lot of questions answered in those practices, and we are excited about the youth of our team next year and the talent they possess. We are excited

to see some new faces out on the field, and we have a lot of confidence that they can play at a very high level."

## OFFENSE

The Spartans' high-powered offense was on full display during the 2024 season. CWRU ended the season ranked sixth in Division III in passing offense (317.0 yards per game), ninth in passing efficiency (175.53), 16th in red zone offense (89.6%), 22nd in scoring offense (40.5 points per game), 23rd in passing yards per completion (14.74 yards), and 32nd in total offense (440.0 yards per game). The team's 405 total points scored during the year were the fifth-most in a season in program history. Five starters are slated to return on the offensive side of the ball, three of whom are on the offensive line.

"Our strengths should be in the same areas this year as they were last year," said Debeljak. "I think we have an excellent group of quarterbacks and receivers, and a large group of running backs that all played last year. I think we can be an explosive offense again, no doubt about it. There are just going to be some different names involved."

### Quarterback

Despite graduating the team's primary starting quarterback in 2024, Alex Fromberg, CWRU should be well-positioned to cover the loss. Senior Aaron Filipis demonstrated his ability on the field late in the season, starting the team's final game and throwing for a career-high 315 yards with two touchdowns and running for an additional 67 yards and a score in the game. He finished the campaign completing 67.7% of his passes for 743 yards and nine touchdowns with just one interception while running for 149 yards and three touchdowns.

"Aaron was on the field the first game of his freshman year as our wildcat quarterback," said Debeljak. "And if things had gone differently, this could have been Aaron's third year as a starter, but he had suffered a season-ending injury in the spring of his freshman year. But Aaron grew from it, and it is going to set him up for a fantastic senior year. I think he can be at the elite level at Division III."

Junior Sam DeTillio had success in limited snaps for the Spartans behind center last year, rushing for 194 yards and two touchdowns, while other returning options include junior Andrew Lowe and sophomore Lucas Holubar. In



addition, CWRU added a pair of transfers in sophomore Chris Chenette (Division III Utica) and junior Pierce Olsen (Division I Merrimack) to add further depth to the position.

### Running Back

CWRU averaged 125.1 rushing yards per game during the 2024 campaign and will look to build on that number this season with four of the team's top-five leaders in rushing yards returning. Leading the way is sophomore Andy Kavcic, who emerged as the starter midway through his first season of college football and finished the year leading the team with 329 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns. Junior Mitchell Waite (106 yards, two touchdowns) saw significant time at the position as well, while seniors Christopher Lim and Stefan Lopez will be aiming to return to form after missing time due to injury in 2024.

"Running back is a position where people are going to battle for playing time," said Debeljak. "I think we have great depth and depth with experience. However, we have not gotten a lot of explosive plays out of our running game, and that is something we focused on improving during the offseason."

Other experienced options at the position include seniors Matthew Bittel and Caden Parlett, juniors Nico Lancashire and Zeke Wadlington, while sophomore Ray Perry and first-years Aaron Alexander, Hyers Holland, and Joel Hancock will look to make an impact as well.

### Wide Receiver/ Tight End

Despite graduating two of the team's top targets last year in Noah Coyne and Ethan Dahlem, the Spartans' receiving corps should be well-equipped to overcome the loss. Senior Dylan Cave, an All-PAC Honorable Mention in 2024, will look to lead the unit this year after catching 36 passes for a team-high 816 yards and four touchdowns last season, while senior Alec Angello (35 receptions, 384 yards, four touchdowns) and junior Beau Wolf (18 catches, 211 yards, one touchdown) will look to expand their roles in 2025. In addition, sophomore Will Stack is expected to make an impact after emerging late in his first-year campaign to make three catches for 49 yards on a key go-ahead drive against Carnegie Mellon in the team's final game of the year.

Adding to the depth of the group will be graduate student transfer Brian Caldwell Jr., who was an All-Empire 8 Third Team receiver at SUNY Brockport last year after recording 22 receptions for 327 yards and five touchdowns.

"We have a good group of receivers," said Debeljak. "We are certainly going to miss Coyne and Dahlem, but we have guys with experience that made major impacts last year."

Additional returning options at wide receiver include senior TJ Yoder, juniors Liam O'Brien, Garrett Pavlick, and Jake Otto, and sophomore Avery Gaines, while newcomers to the group include Jensen Perkovich, a senior transfer from Washington & Jefferson, and first-

years Cal Mangini, Mike Veon, and Kail Swager.

Senior Jack Bryer will be the team's primary tight end in addition to playing H-back for the Spartans in 2025. Other options at tight end include juniors Noah Archbold and Harrison Steeves-Little, and first-year Asher Heflin.

"Bryer has three years of experience playing two positions, so we feel he can fill both those roles," said Debeljak. "After that, it is going to take camp to see who emerges as blocking fullback and tight end personnel. We have younger guys that have not been on the field at all, but it doesn't mean that they can't surface during camp."

### Offensive Line

The offensive line will be the most experienced unit for the Spartans entering the 2025 campaign, with three starters returning from last year's group that held opponents to just 1.3 sacks per game. Senior Owen Myer earned All-PAC Second Team honors for his work at right tackle last year, while on the other end of the line, senior David Freedman has started 20 straight games for the team. Senior Zach Miller, who arrived on campus last year as a transfer from Division II East Stroudsburg, started all 10 games, seeing most of his playing time at right guard. Seniors James Kline, Zachary Dalton, and Garrett Moorhead, and junior Michael Paterra have each seen action in a reserve role throughout their careers and will be part of the group looking to fill the vacancies in the offensive line this year, left by D3football.com All-Region Third Team center Tony Thivener and All-PAC Honorable Mention right guard Peter Kelly.

Other returners for the offensive line include junior Nick Petrucci and sophomores Ben Casper, Caleb Apgar, Jeffrey Meschede, Jacob Granger, Trevor Popeck, and Sean DiDona.

Graduate transfer Gus Salopek, who appeared in 17 games over four seasons at Division I Lafayette, will be a key addition to the group in 2025. Other newcomers include first-years Zack Stromock, Derick Su, Michael Reed Jr., Cooper Komsthoef, and Owen Eisert.

"For the first time in a while, we have a number of people that will be competing to see playing time at offensive line," said Debeljak. "We have some people coming in new to our program, between a graduate transfer and this group of freshman offensive linemen, which is as talented as we have had in quite a while. We will have to see how it all plays out."

### DEFENSE

CWRU featured one of the most effective defenses in Division III last year. The group finished the season ranked 12th among Division III teams in total defense (243.8 yards allowed per game), 33rd in scoring defense (16.6 points per game), 10th in passing yards allowed (147.0 per game), and third in first downs allowed (132). While the team will need to replace eight of its 11 starters from last year, several returning players have significant experience in a reserve role and are ready to see increased playing time this year.



"It is the side of the ball that we have the most people to replace," said Debeljak of his defense. "But I also think there was (and still is) depth at many of those positions, especially our linebackers and defensive backs. I think skill-wise we are going to be fine, and we are excited to see some new players out there more consistently on defense."

### Defensive Line

The defensive line will feature three new starters in 2025 after losing defensive ends AJ Dudowski (All-PAC First Team) and Kaden Tong (All-PAC Second Team) to graduation. At defensive end, the most experienced options for CWRU are seniors Joseph Swarm (15 tackles, three tackles for loss, one sack) and Sean Reilly (18 tackles, three tackles for loss). Other potential returning options at the end positions include juniors Dhruv Amin, Coby Goelz, Trenton Vincent Jr., and Jack Rickert, and sophomores Russell Clark and Luke Bryer. Sophomore Jack Tierney will look to build on a successful campaign last year when he appeared in eight games at nose guard and totaled six tackles, including two for a loss, one sack, and a fumble recovery, and sophomore Greg Hanson Jr. will provide an additional option in the middle of the line.

"The defensive line is where we have lost the most and have the least amount of experience," said Debeljak. "But we have a number of guys that have stood out because of their strength and how they move. They have the makings of some really good linemen. But the position is still a question mark, and we need to see how they play against good competition."

Newcomers Vincent Vorrasi, Dominic Ghilani, Jack Bellinotti, Charlie Nevins, and Isaac Burnett will each have a chance for playing time on the defensive line as well.

### Linebacker

While losing several starters from the linebacker group as well, the Spartans have a number of players with experience who appear ready to step up. Senior Henry Busch, an outside linebacker, will be the most experienced returner of the group after leading the team with eight tackles for loss last season and recording 39 tackles overall with a pair of sacks, an interception, and three quarterback hurries. Junior Phil LaVerde also saw significant time at outside linebacker in his first season with the team last year, notching 28 tackles, including 4.5 for loss and one sack. Additional returning options at outside linebacker include senior Brady Bartusiak, juniors Bidinga Kapapi, Michael Gevaudan, and Nathan Wagner, and sophomores Vinny Hack, Cameron Hinkle, and Daniel Range.

"We have several players that we are excited about at outside linebacker," said Debeljak. "I think we have some good people to go along with the experience of Busch. That position could be a strength for us this year."

At inside linebacker, senior Daniel King (27 tackles), sophomore Tim Gonakis (17 tackles, three tackles for loss, one sack), and senior Shane Schwartz (nine tackles, one tackle for loss) all played significant snaps last season and will look to emerge as potential starters in 2025. Sophomores Zach Yordy (who saw time as a running back last year), Kam Eggerton, Charles Smith, and Declan Boyle

could also emerge as contributors at inside linebacker this season.

"King is going to get his first opportunity to start after backing up for three years, and we love what he brings to the table as far as his physicality," said Debeljak. "We have guys that can play, but we just haven't seen them on the field against varsity competition yet. But from what we have seen in practice, we are excited about the linebacker position."

Additions to the Spartans' linebacker corps this year include first-years Jack Griffiths, Ryan Michel, John Goggin, Patrick Chumo, and Aleric Piper.

### Defensive Back

Senior cornerback Osi Chukwuocha is the team's only returning All-PAC honoree on the defensive side of the ball this year. He earned a spot on the all-league second team after tallying a pair of interceptions and six pass breakups with 37 total tackles during his junior campaign. Leading contenders to start at the other cornerback position include junior Joey Bellinotti, who had five tackles and a pass breakup in a reserve role last year, and junior Tyler Fikis, a converted quarterback who totaled three tackles while learning the position in 2024. Additional returning options at cornerback include senior Joshua Pail and sophomore Aidan Whalen.

"Osi has the potential to be an All-American, and we are excited about the move to defensive back from Fikis, who has impressed everybody with his physicality and athleticism. And, Bellinotti gained valuable experience at the position last year to put him in a strong position entering his junior season."

Senior Mason Mehl started all 10 games at free safety for CWRU last year and ended the campaign with 54 tackles and four pass breakups, and will look to continue to anchor the position for the Spartans this season with senior Cullen McDaniel and sophomore Noah Barnes providing depth behind him. One of the leading contenders to start at strong safety is sophomore Jake Kavcic, an athletic option who could see time on both sides of the ball this year. Also contending to start at strong safety will be senior Luca Maravola, junior Charlie Morrison, and sophomores Max Anderson and Daniel Oblich.

"Mehl played a big role for the team last year in his first as a starter, and we anticipate him repeating that this year," said Debeljak. "Jake Kavcic is such a great football player and made big play after big play in the spring. We are excited about the athleticism and the talent that we have in the back eight of our 3-4 defense."

A pair of incoming first-year players - Cooper Gearhart and Ryder Raya - will add talent to an already deep unit in 2025.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

Junior Gabriel Petrozzi will begin his third season as the team's primary option for placekicking and kickoffs. Last year, he was successful on three of his four field goal tries and 45-of-47 extra point attempts while averaging 59.6 yards per kickoff. Junior Colin Corum will add further

veteran depth to the kicking game for CWRU.

“Petrozzi will handle our kickoffs and placement kicking, and he has been really solid during his time here,” said Debeljak. “We have a lot of confidence in him.”

The Spartans will need to fill the void left by the graduation of four-time All-PAC punter Joseph Rhodes V and will look to do so with a pair of talented first-year players in Tucker Dias and Nick Delfau, who could each also serve as a backup kicker. Petrucci and Maravola will each be back after serving as long snappers last year, and the team has added first-year long snapping specialist Nick Lowe to the roster.

“Rhodes was incredible and will be hard to replace, but the two incoming punters are both good,” said Debeljak.

The Spartans should also be deep in the return game with a number of experienced options set to return for the upcoming season. Wolf averaged 23.7 yards per kick return in 2024, including a 92-yard touchdown return, while returning 13 punts for an average of 6.85 yards. Jake Kavcic returned 11 kicks for 18.45 yards per return last year and could add to the return game again this year, while Stack, Yoder, and Andy Kavcic are additional options for CWRU in 2025.

“Some combination of the players from last year will handle our returns right now, unless we have some surprises develop,” said Debeljak.

## SEASON OUTLOOK

After two seasons of playing a conference-only schedule, the Spartans will once again have the opportunity to play teams outside the PAC in 2025, opening the campaign with a pair of road games at Rowan and Wabash. CWRU will begin the season at Rowan (6-4 in 2024) on September 6 in Glassboro, New Jersey, before traveling to Crawfordsville, Indiana, the following week to face Wabash (8-3 in 2024). The matchup against the Little Giants will be the first meeting between the two teams since they met in the NCAA Playoffs in back-to-back years in 2007 and 2008.

CWRU will begin its conference slate with its home-opening game at DiSanto Field against Westminster on

September 20, before back-to-back road games at Bethany on September 27 and Saint Vincent on October 4. The Spartans will then return home for their Homecoming game against Allegheny on October 11. After a bye week, CWRU will conclude its season with road games at Thiel on October 25 and Washington & Jefferson (which received votes in the D3football.com Top 25) on November 1, and home games against 23rd-ranked Grove City on November 8 and Geneva on November 15.

“I think the first three games are extremely challenging with non-conference contests at traditionally strong teams in Rowan and Wabash, along with Westminster. We have to be ready to play those first three games,” said Debeljak. “And I think the top-third of our league is as good as any in the country, so it will be a challenge as always. But, you know that if you make the playoffs, you have already faced three or four playoff-level teams.”

The Spartans will be aiming to win their third PAC Championship and make their first NCAA Playoff appearance since the 2019 campaign in 2025. CWRU is also eligible for the Opendorse Bowl Series at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton, Ohio, on November 22. The event features the top non-NCAA qualifying teams from the PAC, Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC), and Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC).

Debeljak believes that the key to the team’s success lies in three areas for the upcoming season.

“First, we need to win the turnover battle. If we are playing well, it probably means that we’re doing a good job of holding onto the ball and forcing turnovers. Second, we need to create explosive plays on offense and stop them on defense. And, finally, we need to be a strong tackling team and make people miss tackles when we are on offense. If we can do those three things, we will end up being a very good football team.”

## THE PRESIDENTS' ATHLETIC CONFERENCE



The Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), built on the basic belief that an athletic program is an integral part of college life but not an entity in itself, looks back on 70 years of growth and ahead to years of continued academic and athletic excellence. The league's name clearly reflects its founding principle that operational control of all aspects of intercollegiate athletics is ultimately the responsibility of the presidents of each member institution, and thus active presidential leadership and oversight is paramount in conference administration.

Formally organized in 1955 by Western Reserve University, John Carroll University, Case Institute of Technology, and Wayne State University\*, the PAC was the result of a realization that college athletics, despite numerous virtues for the individual and the institution, were gradually becoming a financial and academic burden. If athletics were to be continued, action had to be taken to place the program on its proper level. This included the premise that benefits of participation should be provided to as many students as possible. The PAC and its membership continue its original, defining mission of promoting intercollegiate athletics and the pursuit of academic excellence.

Institutions involved understand that the key components to its progress lie in the foundation of faith in each member by each other member. It is the conviction of its membership that the PAC is the solution to the dilemma of intercollegiate athletic competition, and they have staked their athletic future on this premise.

Currently comprised of 12 select, private institutions -- Allegheny College, Bethany College, Chatham University, Franciscan University of Steubenville, Geneva College, Grove City College, Hiram College, Saint Vincent College, Thiel College, Washington & Jefferson College, Waynesburg University and Westminster College -- the PAC remains a unique organization in this day of high-pressure intercollegiate athletics, with academics at the center of each member's philosophy. Case Western Reserve University has competed as an affiliate member in the sport of football since 2014.

Hiram, which was announced as the PAC's 12th full-time member in April, 2024, began full PAC membership with all voting and membership rights on July 1, 2024. After competing in the PAC in wrestling and men's volleyball in 2024-25, the Terriers will begin competition in all sports in the 2025-26 academic year.

In March, 2025, the PAC announced that Saint Francis University will reclassify from Division I to Division III to become the conference's 13th full-time member. As Saint Francis transitions to Division III, a process which will take three years to complete, the Red Flash will have full schedules in all applicable PAC sports. Saint Francis will not be eligible for PAC Championships or compete in Conference Championship Tournaments in basketball, soccer, volleyball, tennis, lacrosse, baseball & softball until they are approved for active Division III membership by the NCAA. Red Flash programs in sports such as cross country, golf, swimming and diving and indoor and outdoor track and field will be able to compete at PAC Championships starting in 2026-27 but will not be eligible for all-conference recognition.

In lieu of All-PAC honors, Saint Francis athletes in all sports will be eligible for PAC Coaches Honors, an equivalent to All-PAC, until their transition to NCAA Division III status is complete.

The PAC crowns league champions and awards all-conference honors in its 24 championship sports (13 men, 11 women). The PAC began sponsorship of men's volleyball as its 24th varsity sport in the 2024-25 academic year. Head coaches determine All-PAC squads for all team sports, while in individual sports, such as cross country and golf, All-PAC accolades are based upon performances at the conference championships.

The PAC, which celebrated its 60th anniversary during the 2014-15 academic year, annually awards its All-Sports Trophies to the schools which perform best across the board in PAC competition. The men's and women's athletic programs at Grove City swept their respective All-Sports Trophies for the 2024-25 academic year, the second consecutive year the Wolverines captured both trophies. The All-Sports Trophy for the Grove City men is their fourth in the last five years and 14th in program history. This was the third All-Sports Trophy in the last four years for the Grove City women's program and 21st overall.

Staying true to its original mission of promoting intercollegiate athletics and the pursuit of academic excellence, the PAC has seen over 300 of its participating student-athletes recognized as Academic All-Americans, while the league has also produced numerous NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship winners. In 2024-25, a record 1,962 student-athletes were recognized on the PAC Academic Honor Rolls (897 fall, 1,065 spring), which acknowledges all participating student-athletes who earn a semester grade-point average of 3.60 or above.
