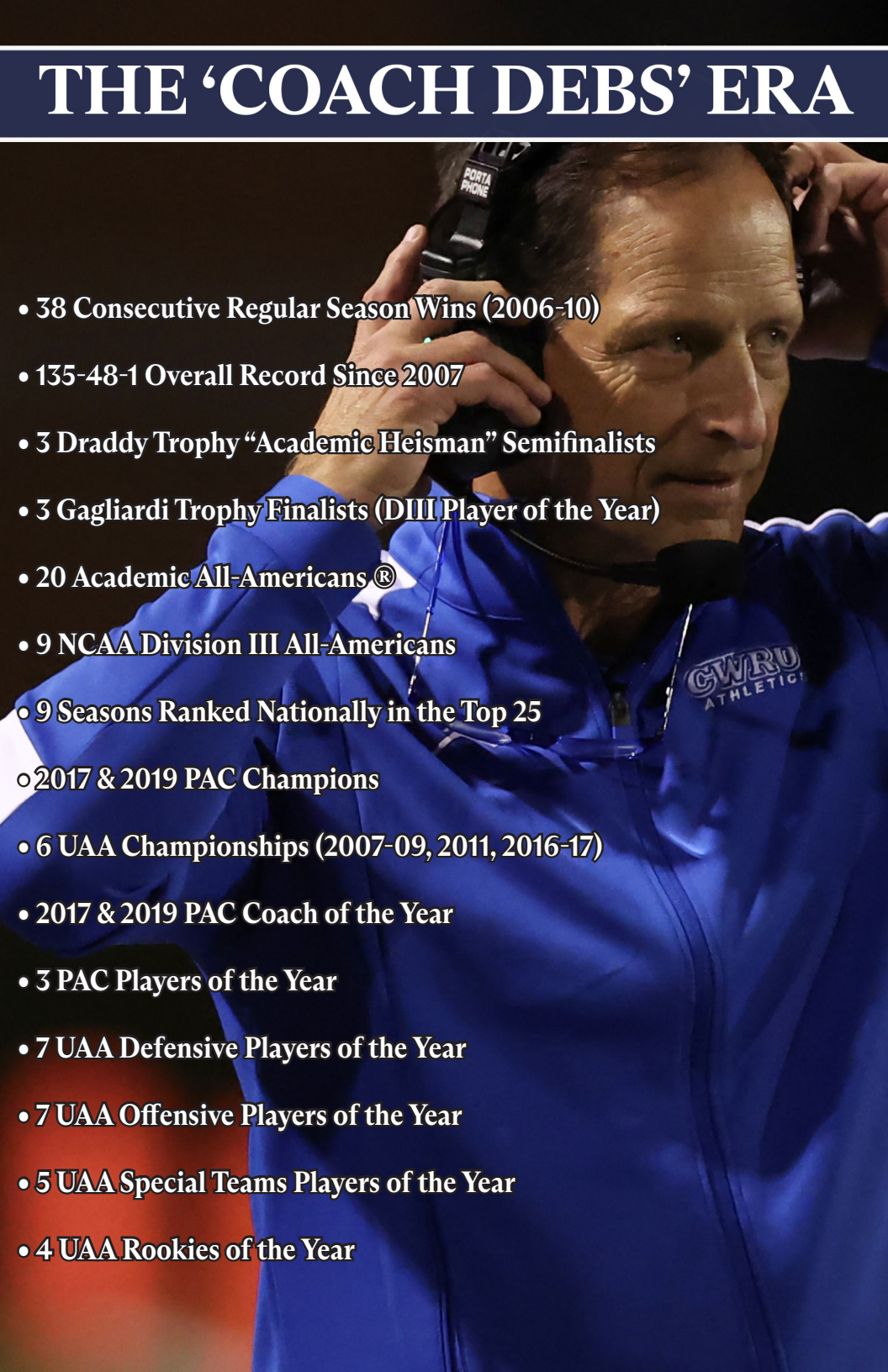

PRESIDENT ERIC W. KALER

Eric W. Kaler is the 11th president of Case Western Reserve University and the Morton L. Mandel Presidential Chair. He joined Case Western Reserve on July 1, 2021 from the University of Minnesota, where he served as president from 2011-2019 and professor of chemical engineering and materials science from 2011-2021.

An accomplished chemical engineer and visionary university leader, President Kaler's career in higher education spans more than 40 years and includes leadership and faculty roles at premier public research universities. He is a member of the National Academy of Engineering and was elected as a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences for both his leadership in engineering and in higher education.

President Kaler has significant expertise in elevating research, expanding fundraising, forming collaborative partnerships, encouraging entrepreneurship and advocating for access to education for all.

Under President Kaler's leadership, CWRU has:

- Grown enrollment to approximately 6,500 undergraduate students and nearly 12,500 students overall in fall 2024.
- Become one of the fastest-growing research universities in the country, according to data from the 2024 National Science Foundation Higher Education Research and Development Survey.
- Achieved a record year of philanthropy in Fiscal Year 2024, raising nearly \$211 million.
- Begun construction on the Interdisciplinary Science and Engineering Building (ISEB), a 189,000-square-foot, \$500 million research building located on the Case Quad that will be dedicated to interdisciplinary discovery and collaboration. The ISEB is expected to be completed in 2026, just in time for the bicentennial celebration of the founding of Western Reserve University.
- Committed to hiring 100 net new tenured and tenure-track faculty by 2028, a 15-percent increase for the university.
- Opened the 11000 Cedar Startup Incubator, a community that nurtures startups in healthcare and technology.
- Created a Corporate Engagement Center to foster connections and partnerships with industry for research, talent development and philanthropy.
- Received a \$25.5 million Cancer Center Support Grant in summer 2025, marking 38 years of continuous National Cancer Institute Funding.
- Celebrated the opening of the Midtown Collaboration Center, a hub for several CWRU School of Medicine programs dedicated to improving population and

community health.

- Strengthened partnerships and connections with community members through the creation of a Neighborhood Advisory Council, expansion of Pre-College Programs, and the opening of the Wade Park Community Engagement Center.



- Won its first-ever NCAA Division III national team championship with Men's Tennis in 2023.

President Kaler began his career in higher education as a research and teaching assistant at the University of Minnesota, where he earned his PhD in chemical engineering in 1982. He then joined the faculty at the University of Washington, where he was an assistant professor and associate professor of chemical engineering from 1982-1989.

His first leadership positions followed at the University of Delaware, which he joined as an associate professor in 1989. He was promoted to professor in 1991 and appointed the Elizabeth Inez Kelley Professor in 1998. He also served as the chair of the chemical engineering department from 1996-2000 and dean of the College of Engineering from 2000-2007. He joined Stony Brook University in 2007 as provost and senior vice president for academic affairs and professor of engineering and chemistry. He also served as the university's vice president for Brookhaven Affairs from 2008-2011.

President Kaler holds 10 patents and has published more than 200 peer-reviewed papers. In addition to election to the National Academy of Engineering and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, President Kaler is a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the American Chemical Society, the Neutron Scattering Society of America, and he was a member of the inaugural class of the National Academy of Inventors. Currently, he serves on the Board of Directors of the Greater Cleveland Partnership, where he also co-chairs the Innovation and Growth Committee.

President Kaler earned his bachelor's degree in chemical engineering in 1978 from the California Institute of Technology.

Born in Vermont, President Kaler is a first-generation college graduate. He credits his wife, Karen, as the major contributor to his success. Karen Kaler, a Tennessee native, is well known for her warmth, enthusiasm, and advocacy. The couple have been married since 1979 and have a dog named LuLu.



VICE PRESIDENT FOR STUDENT AFFAIRS TRAVIS APGAR



Travis T. Apgar is the Vice President for Student Affairs at Case Western Reserve University. He joined Case Western Reserve in July 2024 from Rensselaer Polytechnic

Institute, where he served as Associate Vice President for Student Life and Dean of Students from 2017 to 2024. Before that, he served Cornell University as the Robert G. Engle Associate Dean of Students from 2006 to 2017.

Recognized as an outstanding higher education leader, Vice President Apgar has more than 25 years of experience in student affairs at premier public and private research universities. He has expertise in student engagement, support, and development, and is an advocate for the multidimensional individuals that make up a college student community.

Apgar has served numerous professional associations in volunteer leadership roles, is a current member of the Board of Directors for the Hazing Prevention Network, and is a national speaker and consultant on the college student experience.

CWRU athletics experienced immediate success under Shelton, with the department recording its five highest finishes in the Learfield Directors Cup Division III standings, including a 23rd-place finish in 2023-24. The men's tennis team won the first NCAA Division III Team Championship in department history in 2023, and a program-record 11 Spartan teams placed at their respective NCAA Championship in 2023-24.

Shelton, who came to CWRU after serving as a senior associate athletic director at The Ohio State University (OSU), previously spent 15 years in the athletics program at Washington University in St. Louis—a Division III program that, like Case Western Reserve, is a member

During his years at Ohio State, Shelton has served as the lead administrator for several teams, a role that involved hiring coaches, oversight of budgets and support of athlete recruitment. He also managed all aspects of the university's athletic risk and compliance efforts (including Title IX and gender equity matters), negotiated athletic equipment and apparel agreements and participated in fundraising efforts that secured a \$1 million endowment for OSU's Head Wrestling Coach position, as well as scholarship and facilities programs.

A native of Independence, Kansas, Shelton earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from Wichita State University (WSU), the latter in sport science administration. After serving as a graduate assistant and intern for athletics at his alma mater, Shelton joined Washington University as an assistant facility manager in 1992. He went on to become an assistant athletic director there, overseeing four sports and participating in fundraising efforts that brought in \$3.2 million to enhance several athletic facilities.

DISANTO FIELD HOME OF THE SPARTANS



The 2026 season will mark the 22nd year that the Case Western Reserve University football team has called DiSanto Field home.

The 2,400-seat, state-of-the-art stadium and surrounding residence hall complex opened in August 2005 as Case Field and was renamed in October 2013 as DiSanto Field. The facility boasts many distinguishing features, such as its spacious locker rooms, updated press box, field surface, and surrounding track. The entire complex was built at a total cost of \$126 million.

Most recently, a video scoreboard was added to the south end of the stadium, thanks to a gift from the Wyant Foundation in honor of the late James C. Wyant, further elevating the facility.

"As a coach and recruiter, you want to be able to show prospects a facility that they would be proud to call home during their collegiate career," said Head Coach Greg Debeljak. "The players and parents who visit our complex walk away with that feeling and more."

The field itself is a multifunctional field featuring a brand-new FieldTurf surface, installed during the summer of 2017. The field is surrounded by the eight-lane Coach Bill Sudeck Track, named after the legendary cross country, track, and basketball coach in 2008. The field was built in a European

box style, which provides the appropriate dimensions for soccer contests. Along with hosting varsity football, soccer, and track events, the field is used for intramural activities, special events, and the general recreation of the campus community.

After playing over 35 years of football at Finnigan Field, the Spartans played their last game at the multi-sport complex on November 8, 2003. Finnigan Field had played host to many successful teams, including the 1984 Spartan football squad, which was the first in university history to finish the season undefeated. The field also was used as a practice facility for the Cleveland Browns from 1965 to 1972.

During the 2004 season, the Spartans played their home games at Brush High School's Korb Field while construction on their new home was completed. Play opened at the new facility for the Case Western Reserve football squad in front of 2,300 fans on September 10, 2005, versus Denison University. The Spartans did not disappoint on that day, defeating the Big Red, 20-6.

The setting in which DiSanto Field was built is arguably one of the best in all of college athletics. The gridiron is surrounded by seven residence halls known as the Village at 115. These student residences, built in a horseshoe shape around the field, house around 800 undergraduate students, giving



the facility a unique and intimate feel.

"Our attendance has more than doubled since the facility was opened," explained Debeljak. "A very spirited atmosphere has created a home field advantage that is second to none in Division III."

The stadium also boasts a modern and spacious press box. The area contains booths designated for both home and away broadcasts as well as a large work room for members of the media and school representatives. The coaches' areas within the box are especially spacious and seat six coaches comfortably. Also included is the Coach Bill Edwards President's Suite, which plays host to distinguished guests and sponsors. The press box includes wireless high-speed internet access and digital television throughout.

Locker rooms are located adjacent to the field in the lower level of House 7 of the residence complex along with a training room facility, named after Dr. Tom McLaughlin in 2007, which includes both full-size warm and cold whirlpools.

In the fall of 2014 the university opened the Wyant Athletic & Wellness Center. The facility was made possible by the \$4 million commitment of 1965 Case Institute of Technology alumnus, James C. Wyant, PhD. A former captain of the CIT Roughriders cross country team, Wyant's gift was influenced by the role of athletics during his college years.

As part of the North Campus Residential Village and Athletic Complex, the three-level facility includes the 4,500-square foot Belichick Weight Room - gifted by New England Patriot Head Coach Bill Belichick in honor of his father, Steve, a 1941 graduate of Western Reserve University; a 4,200-square foot cardio workout facility; and a 2,500-square foot Varsity Club with a balcony overlooking the football field and track. Future plans call for the addition of a large multipurpose space with synthetic flooring, as well as an additional wing with locker rooms, coaches' offices, meeting rooms and a training/medical facility.

HEAD COACH GREG DEBELJAK

23rd Season • John Carroll '88 • Record: 148-67-1 (.688)



Greg Debeljak, the most accomplished coach in the history of the Case Western Reserve University football program, was named to the position on March 24, 2004. Entering his 23rd season with the team in 2026, he has compiled an

impressive overall record of 148-67-1 (.688) and led the Spartans to a 38-game regular season winning streak from 2006-10.

Debeljak guided the Spartans to three consecutive undefeated (10-0) regular seasons, NCAA Playoff appearances, and University Athletic Association titles from 2007-09. And from 2007 through 2025, Case Western Reserve posted an overall record of 135-50-1 (.728), earning Debeljak PAC Coach of the Year honors in 2017 and 2019, and he and his assistants the UAA Coaching Staff of the Year award for three straight seasons from 2007-09 and again in 2011, 2016, and 2017. Additionally, Case Western Reserve has been ranked in the top 25 in the nation in ten of the last 19 seasons, including its highest mark of No. 7 during the final regular season American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) poll in 2009.

The Spartans will enter the 2026 campaign with a winning record in 16 of their last 18 seasons. In 2019, Debeljak led the Spartans to the PAC Championship for the second time in three years and earned a bid to the NCAA Playoffs for the fifth time in program history. Debeljak became the first coach in program history to reach the 100-win mark with the team, hitting the milestone during the team's victory over Westminster College on November 4th, 2017. The triumph was a part of one of the best seasons in the program's history, as Debeljak led the Spartans to an 11-1 overall record, with the team making the playoffs for the fourth time ever, and reaching the second round of the tournament for the second time. The Spartans won both the PAC and UAA Championships in 2017, leading to Debeljak being named both the PAC and UAA Coach of the Year.

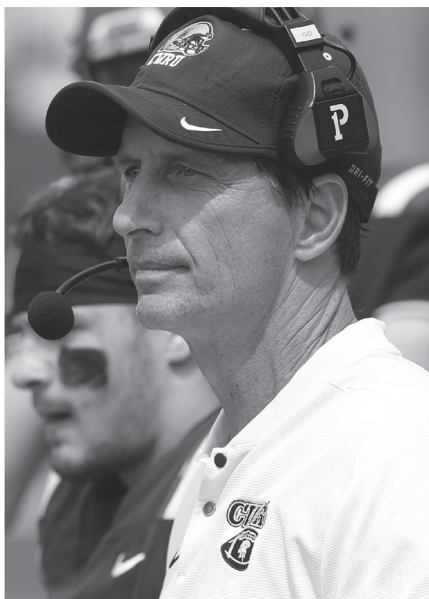
Debeljak was also selected as one of five finalists in Division III for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year

Award for three straight years (2007-09) and was named the 2008 Lee Tressel Ohio College Coach of the Year by the Northeast Ohio Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

Debeljak's Spartans also excel in the classroom, annually ranking among the nation's leaders in team GPA. During his time, 20 Spartans have earned Capital One Academic All-America® honors, while three have been named semifinalists for the Draddy Trophy (commonly referred to as the Academic Heisman).

A graduate of nearby Mentor High School, Debeljak served as CWRU's head coach/offensive coordinator for three seasons before being named head coach. Highlighting his three years as the offensive coordinator, Case Western Reserve ranked first in all of NCAA Division III in passing offense and second in total offense in 2002.

Before coming to Case Western Reserve, Debeljak spent 12 years as an assistant (1988-00) at his alma mater, John Carroll University. At JCU, he was a graduate assistant during his first two seasons, before working for eight years as the quarterbacks and receivers coach. Before his final season at John





Carroll, he was promoted to offensive coordinator.

Debeljak was a member of the staff that produced NFL Pro Bowl linebacker London Fletcher, and he was the position coach for former Denver Broncos and Las Vegas Raiders Head Coach and New England Patriots Offensive Coordinator Josh McDaniels, former Las Vegas Raiders General Manager Tom Telesco, and former pros Tom Arth (Colts, Packers, Toronto [CFL]) and Larry Wanke (Giants).

Debeljak earned both his bachelor's (1988) and master's (1995) degrees from John Carroll, and he played basketball and football for the Blue Streaks. On the gridiron, he lettered four times, once as a defensive back (earning second-team all-league honors), twice as a quarterback, and once as a receiver. As a basketball player, he helped the Blue Streaks to a pair of Presidents' Athletic Conference titles and held the school record for assists in a single game with 13.

Debeljak and his wife, Kelly, reside in Beachwood. Their two daughters, Ashley '13 and Allison '15, were women's soccer student-athletes at Case Western Reserve.

THE COACH "DEBS" PHILOSOPHY

Greg Debeljak has a three-part philosophy on how to win both on and off the field, and when it all comes together the Spartan leader feels it positions his team for ultimate success. "You are going to have various levels of success with wins and losses, but I think it's important to experience other things," he explained. "When we have recruiting weekends and we meet as a group, this is one of the first things I bring up."

- The first goal is to become a family through team-building activities.

"We want our kids to come together as a team and a family, but it's difficult," Debeljak explained. "Each year brings different players with different personalities – that's why it is our number one goal. We can't accomplish anything else until we merge together as a family. The relationships an incoming freshman had with his high school teammates most likely began in elementary school – they grew up with each other. The biggest hurdle is to get (freshmen) to believe in their new family in a shortened period of time."

- The second is the commitment to excellence in both athletics and academics without sacrificing one for the other.

"In regards to academics and athletics, we feel that even though we are one of the better academic institutions in the country, we still want to be competitive on a national level athletically. Simply said, they should both fit together." The Spartans annually rank among the nation's leaders in team GPA and have boasted one of the top combined winning percentages of any Division III program in the country since 2007.

- Third, student-athletes give something back through community involvement and service.

One of his first initiatives in this area was making the players a household name with incoming first-year students by helping them move into their dorm rooms, a recurring event every August. In previous years, the Spartans taught football skills to hundreds of inner city elementary students during a university-wide volunteer effort. "I think it is important to get out there and make your name known to the CWRU Community and to classmates," Debeljak said. "The Case For Community Day Sports Clinic event is a lot of fun, and our kids learn as much from the campers as they did from them."



DERECK SLESH

Offensive & Recruiting Coordinator/ Off. Line



The 2026 season marks Dereck Slesh's 23rd as offensive coordinator and 26th overall at CWRU. Slesh joined the staff in 2001 and spent his first three seasons as the defensive coordinator. He has also served as the program's recruiting coordinator since January 2009.

The Spartans' offense has consistently been one of the most effective in Division III with Slesh at the helm. The 2024 squad ranked sixth in Division III in passing offense (317.0 yards per game) and he helped to develop wide receiver Noah Coyne, who went on to attend the New York Giants' rookie mini camp. Slesh helped to mentor 2019 D3football.com All-America honorable mention wide receiver Colt Morgan, as the team finished the campaign with a 9-2 overall record and qualified for the NCAA playoffs for the fifth time under his tenure. In 2018, he helped coach freshman quarterback Drew Saxton to all-region honors and the UAA Offensive Player of the Year award. The 2017 squad led all PAC teams in points per game (39.9) while ranking 45th in Division III in yards per game (437.7). The squad set program records for total yards and points during the 2017 campaign. Slesh helped mentor AFCA All-American center Gage Blair, and D3football.com All-Region quarterback Rob Cuda and running back Jacob Burke during the season. The 2016 squad set a school record for rushing yards and ranked 14th in Division III with 257.9 rushing yards per game.

Slesh was also influential with the 2009 squad that ranked fifth in the nation in scoring (42.4 ppg) and seventh in yardage (470.8 ypg). Slesh also produced a three-time (2007-09) UAA Offensive Player of the Year and 2009 AFCA All-American in quarterback Dan Whalen.

Before he arrived at Case Western Reserve, Slesh spent three seasons (1996-97, 2000) on the staff at John Carroll University. He also served in the local high school ranks as head coach at Benedictine High School from 1998-99 and as a staff member at Beachwood High School from 1990-95. In 1988, Slesh began his coaching career at his high school alma mater, Hawken School.

Slesh was a football and baseball student-athlete at Marietta College, where he earned a bachelor's degree in business management in 1988. He earned a Master of Business Administration from Cleveland State University in 1996.

WARREN MILLER

Defensive Coordinator/ Inside Linebackers



Warren Miller enters his 14th season at CWRU and 12th as defensive coordinator in 2026.

Miller's defenses have consistently ranked among the best in the conference during his time with the team. Recently, the 2024 group ended the year ranked

12th in Division III in total defense (243.8 yards per game) and 33rd in scoring defense (16.6 points allowed per game), while the 2023 unit was 12th among Division III teams in points allowed per game (13.2) and 22nd in yards allowed (258.1). In 2019, Miller helped mentor senior defensive end Cameron Brown to become the first two-time PAC Defensive Player of the Year in conference history, while both junior linebacker He helped Brown earn All-America and PAC and UAA Defensive Player of the Year honors during the 2018 campaign, as the defensive end finished second among Division III players in sacks per game. Miller's 2017 unit was one of the best in the Presidents' Athletic Conference, leading the league in points allowed per game (17.8), total yards allowed per game (289.6), and rushing yards allowed per game (121.8). Miller was also a part of the UAA Coaching Staff of the Year during the season for the second time in his career.

Miller's first two seasons with the program were spent as special teams coordinator/linebackers coach, and in 2013 his unit produced the UAA Special Teams Player of the Year.

Before joining the staff at University Circle, Miller spent five seasons as the linebackers coach at NCAA Division II Walsh University. He also served as an athletic academic advisor from 2010-12 as well as Director of Compliance and Eligibility from 2007-10.

Before his time in North Canton, Miller served for three seasons (2005-07) in a defensive quality control position at the University of Minnesota. During his time on the staff, the Gophers appeared in a pair of bowl games.

Miller also served as a graduate assistant and tight ends coach at Walsh from 2003-05 as well as a student assistant for offensive linemen and tight ends at his alma mater, Baldwin Wallace University, from 2001-03.

Miller graduated from BW with a Bachelor of Arts degree in business administration. He and his wife Bryn live in Olmsted Falls with their three sons, Warren, William, and Wade.



JEFF RAMSEY

Special Teams Coordinator/ Defensive Backs



Jeff Ramsey, who has coached at all three levels of NCAA competition, joined the CWRU staff as the team's Special Teams Coordinator and defensive backs coach prior to the start of the 2022 season.

Ramsey had previously served as the Head Coach at nearby Oberlin College from 1999-2013 and ranks as the

second-winningest coach in the program's history. During his time with the team, his players earned a combined seven All-America honors, nine all-region selections, and 96 all-conference honors.

After leaving Oberlin, he went on to be the defensive coordinator at the University of Puget Sound from 2014-15, and most recently completed a six-year stint as the defensive coordinator and strength and conditioning coordinator at Wabash College, helping the team win two NCAC Championships and make one NCAA Tournament appearance.

Ramsey was also on the coaching staff at Division II Sonoma State (1993-95), Division I-AA Nevada-Reno (1989-92), and Division III Marietta (1988-89). He began his career as an assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of California, Davis, from 1982-86, before serving as a graduate assistant coach at the University of Illinois from 1986-89.

Ramsey received his bachelor's degree in physical education from UC Davis, where he was a wide receiver and quarterback on the football team, helping his team to conference titles in 1980 and 1981. He earned his master's degree in Kinesiology and Athletic Administration from Illinois in 1988.

2026 SEASON PREVIEW

The Case Western Reserve University football team will look to get back on the winning track when the team hits the field for the 2026 campaign.

The Spartans have notched a winning record as a team in 16 of their last 18 seasons and entered last year with nine consecutive winning campaigns, before finishing 2025 with a 4-5-1 overall record, including a 4-4 mark in Presidents' Athletic Conference games (tying the team for fifth place in the league). It was a year of streaks for the Spartans, who opened the year with an 0-2-1 record before winning their next four games, and then dropping their final three.

"It was as challenging a season on and off the field as I have ever experienced," said CWRU Head Coach Greg Debeljak. "We had probably our toughest schedule ever with six teams going on to play in postseason games. And I think we got the most out of our players as we could, at least until the last game of the season. We are viewing it as a learning experience, and now we know how to play and take on adversity, and now we are ready to thrive this year."

It will now be up to the 2026 squad to prove that last year was an aberration and lead the team to another winning campaign. The roster consists of 112 athletes, including 71 returners. Among the 41 total newcomers are 37 first-years and four upperclassmen, all of whom will be looking to make an early impact on the team.

"We played a lot of younger guys last year, and it was a learning process," said Debeljak. "We took our lumps, but now we are a battle-tested, experienced team."

OFFENSE

The Spartans finished the 2025 season ranked in the top 25% of Division III teams with 251.6 passing yards per game and 32.6 points per contest. CWRU added 147.4 rushing yards per contest during the season, and the team's 399.0 total yards per game were second in the PAC and 59th among all Division III squads.

CWRU is set to return six starters on the offensive side of the ball, including graduate student quarterback Aaron Filipis, who started the opening game of the season for the Spartans last year before suffering a season-ending injury midway through the game.

"We knew coming in that we were going to be fairly young, but we felt that we could hang with and beat anybody because we had this unbelievable quarterback in Filipis, and then we very quickly did not," said Debeljak. "So our biggest on-field challenge

was replacing a player that was probably irreplaceable."

Quarterback

Filipis is the leading candidate to start under center for the Spartans after seeing his 2025 campaign cut short. He was off to a promising start, completing 17-of-24 passes for 236 yards and a touchdown with 48 yards and a second score on the ground against Rowan, before suffering the injury in the third quarter of the game. With Filipis set to use his final year of eligibility as a graduate student in 2026, Debeljak expects his return to have a major impact on the offense.

"Aaron has the physical, mental, and leadership ability to be a pretty special player," said Debeljak.

The Spartans should be deep behind Filipis as well. Senior Sam DeTillio, who started the final nine games of the season after Filipis' injury, completed 54.4% of passes for 1,793 yards and 15 touchdowns and 10 interceptions, while leading the squad with 468 rushing yards and six touchdowns. Seniors Andrew Lowe and Pierce Olsen, and junior Chris Chenette also saw time at quarterback during the year, while first-years Alex Bryson and Maddox Giel will add to the team's depth at the critical position.

"I thought Sam did a really good job for most of the season," said Debeljak. "So, I think we do have some good depth at the position, because we did have guys get experience last year, and they all bring something different to the table."

Running Back

Despite graduating its top running back last year, Stefan Lopez, the Spartans have considerable experience returning to the position, led by junior Andy Kavcic, who has run for 537 yards and seven touchdowns over his career, while adding 15 catches for 264 yards and an additional three touchdowns, and appears ready to assume the role of the team's primary rushing option.

"Andy possesses experience and versatility," said Debeljak. "We feel we could split him out at receiver. He has thrown the ball on halfback passes, and he has the ability to make people miss. We feel great about him."

Senior Mitchell Waite is another feature option in the running game for CWRU, having accumulated 215 yards and two touchdowns on the ground over his career. A pair of sophomores had success in limited opportunities last year in Joel Hancock (158 rushing yards, two TDs) and Aaron Alexander (55 rushing yards, one TD), while sophomore Hyers Holland will try to increase his role entering his second season on the team. First-years Dom Manicioto and Jackson Hood are additional options



at running back for CWRU for the upcoming year.

"Mitchell, unfortunately, hasn't been able to stay healthy, but he can break one at any time with his speed," said Debeljak. "Hancock led us in average per attempt and had a really good season. Alexander was on the field fairly early for us as a big running back in between the tackles, and Holland is a very good athlete. We like our stable of running backs and we might be able to utilize different running backs against different defenses."

Wide Receiver

CWRU will be bringing back a pair of dynamic targets at wide receiver, despite losing its top target in recent graduate Dylan Cave. Junior Will Stack will look to take another step forward in his career after catching 29 passes for 373 yards and three touchdowns last year, while senior Beau Wolf finished the campaign with 19 catches for 274 yards and a pair of scores. Senior Jake Otto is also set to make his return after missing all of last season due to injury, and could provide big-play potential for the offense.

"Jake is the heart and soul of that position, and we are happy to get him back," said Debeljak. "He's a captain, a really good football player. He is a good blocker, has a physical presence, and can get up and catch the ball. Wolf has been our big play threat and will continue to grow in that role. And Stack is one of the best all-around football players we have and can be versatile, getting the ball on counters and sweeps, and even throwing the ball."

A pair of transfer students will be looking to have an immediate impact on the unit as well. Graduate student Sergio Beltran played wide receiver, running back, and quarterback at Bates College, and will enter the year with 80 career receptions for 971 yards and seven touchdowns. Sophomore Julian Dahlem, younger brother of former Spartan and All-PAC wide receiver Ethan Dahlem, has also joined the team after spending last year at John Carroll.

"Beltran is a very versatile athlete as well," said Debeljak. "He played quarterback in high school and was an all-conference as a receiver in the NESCAC at Bates. Dahlem was one of the best players in Western Pennsylvania his senior year. We have some people with ability, and we need to figure out how we want to use them and how they fit into an offense that we feel can be quite flexible."

Additional returning options at the position include senior Garrett Pavlick, juniors Noah Barnes and Avery Gaines, and sophomores Cal Mangini, Kail Swager, and Mike Veon. First-year additions at the position include Tommy Burke, Elijah Moon, Jolyon White, Tyler Wiedemann, and Randy Yan.

Tight End/ H-Back/ Fullback

The Spartans will be looking to put an added emphasis on the tight end, h-back, and fullback positions with a talented group of incoming players aiming to fill the void left by the graduation of All-PAC honorable mention Jack Bryer. Sophomore Will Maisenbacher, a transfer from Division I Wofford, has a chance to emerge as an impact player as both a blocker and a receiver for the team after not seeing any action last year as a Terrier.

"Maisenbacher was a mid-semester transfer, so we got to see him in the spring, and he has everything you look for in a tight end," said Debeljak. "He can catch the ball, has a big body, and has shown the willingness to block. We feel like we can have a tight end on the field as a part of our base formations."

Senior Harrison Steeves-Little caught his first career touchdown pass last season and is the most experienced option at the position for the Spartans, while junior Jeffrey Meschede, who played in eight games on the offensive line and special teams, will transition to a fullback role in 2026. First-years Seamus Campbell, Lars Galinanes, Brody Junker, Reid Kacmarynski, and Brian Renshaw Jr. could all see time on the field in 2026.

"Steeves-Little brings some different things to the table, and we're hoping he can be ready to contribute during his senior year, and we're excited to see what Meschede can do at fullback," said Debeljak. "The rest of the group are first-years, so we are going to see who develops there."

Offensive Line

The offensive line will see significant turnover from last year's team with four of the five starters having graduated, including All-PAC First Team right tackle Owen Myer and Second Team left tackle Gus Salopek. The team's lone returning starter from the unit is junior Sean DiDonna, who played in nine total games with eight starts, and will likely make the move from center to tackle this year. Senior Nick Petrucci appeared in eight games in a reserve role on the line and on special teams, and will add additional playing experience to the unit.

Other potential starters on the interior of the line include sophomores Cooper Komsthoef, Michael Reed Jr., and Brock Gillespie, while sophomore Derick Su could see time at tackle.

Additional returning offensive linemen for the Spartans include juniors Ben Casper, Jacob Granger, and Trevor Popeck, and sophomores Owen Eisert and Zack Stromock. First-year options on the line are Rafael Castro, Trey Donovan, Anthony Ghabrial, Matthew Iannicca, Lee Jobs, and Buka Odeluga.

"I think we are going to be more physical than we were last year," said Debeljak. "There were several younger players we liked that are going to see more time this year. Last year's line was so experienced, and did a lot of things on the mental side of the game. I think this year, if we let the offensive line be aggressive and physical, we can be a successful offensive line."

DEFENSE

CWRU allowed the fewest passing yards in the conference and ranked 53rd among all Division III teams in 2025, allowing opponents just 174.5 yards through the air per game. The Spartans allowed 22.4 points per game while surrendering 116.2 rushing yards and 290.7 total yards per contest (49th in DIII).

The Spartans will be returning seven starters from last year's defense, including junior strong safety Jake Kavcic, an All-PAC Second Team honoree, and junior nose guard Jack Tierney, an All-PAC honorable mention.

Defensive Line

Tierney emerged as a starter for the Spartans last season and ran with the role, anchoring the middle of the line and finishing with 24 tackles (including 1.5 for loss), two quarterback hurries, and a fumble recovery, en route to earning the first all-conference honor of his career. However, the Spartans will need to replace the two defensive ends who flanked him on either side last year - All-PAC honorees and 2026 graduates Joseph Swarm and Sean Reilly.

"Jack is one of the best nose guards in the conference, no doubt about it," said Debeljak. "He does his job in the middle, occupying people and changing the line of scrimmage. He is super strong, physical, and sneakily athletic. He did a great job



for us as a sophomore and got some people's attention on the field."

Among the most experienced candidates to fill in the spots on the line are senior Jack Rickert (seven tackles) and juniors Russell Clark (seven tackles) and Greg Hanson Jr. (14 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks). In addition, senior Trenton Vincent Jr., sophomores Dominic Ghilani and Charlie Nevins, and first-year Roman Sylvester are also candidates to potentially see significant time on the field this year.

Other options for the Spartans' defensive line in 2026 include senior Dhruv Amin, junior Luke Bryer, sophomores Jack Bellinotti and Vincent Vorrasi, and first-years Liam Barger, Donovan Lampkin, Liam Link, Stamati Sideridis, and Tabor Tackett.

"It is going to be a great competition, because we have a bunch of guys that have played a little bit," said Debeljak. "And, we have probably the strongest group of defensive linemen recruiting-wise. So, it wouldn't surprise me if some first-years come in and contribute right away."

Linebacker

The Spartans should once again be deep and experienced at the linebacker position with five players with starting experience set to return for this season. CWRU will have to replace its top tackler from last year in graduate Daniel King, but should have options among inside linebackers led by junior Tim Gonakis, who finished with 36 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss, and sophomore Jack Griffiths, who impressed as a first-year, totaling 34 tackles, two interceptions, and a forced fumble. Junior Zach Yordy also played in five games for the Spartans as an inside linebacker and recorded 19 tackles, including a pair for loss.

At outside linebacker, senior Phil LaVerde played in seven games last year and had 35 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, three pass breakups, and a fumble recovery, while senior Bidinga Kapapi was consistently disrupting opponents' offenses last year, collecting four sacks, 6.5 tackles for loss, a forced fumble, and 12 total tackles. Junior Vinny Hack started the first three games of the season at outside linebacker before missing the rest of the campaign due to injury, while senior Michael Gevaudan played in all 10 games and made three starts, notching 11 tackles, including 2.5 for loss and one sack.

"We have great confidence in our returning linebackers, and not only in their ability to play, but in their experience and knowledge of our defense, so that we can expand some things this year," said Debeljak.

Senior Nathan Wagner, juniors Declan Boyle and Daniel Range, and sophomores Patrick Chumo, John Goggin, Ryan Michel, and Aleric Piper each saw limited time at linebacker last year and could see their roles increase, both at linebacker and on the kick coverage units, while newcomers in sophomore Shareef McMillan and first-years Ryan Fresquez, Carter Hladki, Vincent Kamarck, Ben Rude, Tyler Scott, and Michael Walter will all be competing for playing time as well.

"I think if we wanted to rotate people, we will be able to do that, because we certainly have guys physically that can play linebacker at a high level," said Debeljak. "It's just a matter of understanding the responsibilities and concepts of our defense."

Defensive Back

Jake Kavcic will headline the Spartans' secondary in 2026 after making a successful transition from the offensive side of the ball before the 2025 campaign. He went on to lead the team with

three interceptions while accumulating 41 tackles, five tackles for loss, two sacks, and five pass breakups. Kavcic also saw time at running back in short-yardage situations, totaling 47 yards and four touchdowns, while returning 15 kicks for an average of 23.3 yards.

"Jake is our best football player. Physically, he has everything you're looking for as far as speed, quickness, and physicality," said Debeljak. "He was our best blitzer off the edge and created the most issues for opposing offenses. He is tough to block. He certainly has a nose for the ball. And, because of his offensive background, I think that makes it easier for him to play. Plus, you can throw in his leadership too. He will keep people accountable and his teammates respect him."

After losing free safety Mason Mehl to graduation, the Spartans will likely turn to senior Charlie Morrison to start alongside Kavcic this year. He played in all 10 games last year and finished with eight tackles, an interception, and a pass breakup.

Senior Tyler Fikis emerged as a starter at cornerback last year and led the team with seven pass breakups, while adding 32 tackles and an interception. CWRU will need to replace all-PAC cornerback Osi Chukwuocha at the other cornerback spot, with sophomores Yaw Gyamfi (six tackles, one interception) and Cooper Gearhart (13 tackles) prime candidates to do so. In addition, the Spartans are optimistic that senior Joey Bellinotti can return from a season-ending injury suffered in the opening game last season after starting at cornerback.

"Fikis was everything we thought he was after making the transition from quarterback," said Debeljak. "He got attacked a lot because nobody wanted to challenge Osi, and he stepped up. Gyamfi has the physical ability to just be the type of corner that Osi was, and does some great things despite being relatively inexperienced. Gearhart stepped up at the end of the year and played great. So, we think we have three really good corners, not including Bellinotti, who we hope can come back."

Other options in the secondary for CWRU include juniors Max Anderson, Daniel Oblich, and Aidan Whalen, and first-years Nico Grzymkowski, Marko Pavlovich, Darius Payne, and Lucas Vacanti.

SPECIAL TEAMS

The Spartans should be strong on special teams with the majority of the unit returning, including all-PAC honorees in senior kicker Gabriel Petrozzi and sophomore punter Nick Delfau.

Petrozzi was named an honorable mention to the All-PAC Team after making six of nine field goal attempts (including a 50-yard kick) and all 40 of his extra point attempts to lead all Spartan players with 58 points during the year. He also averaged 58.9 yards on kickoffs and totaled 16 touchbacks. Behind Petrozzi are senior Colin Corum and promising first-year kicker Jay Greenberg.

Delfau, meanwhile, immediately became one of the top punters in the PAC, earning all-conference first-team honors during his first season of college football. He averaged 38.14 yards per punt with a long of 62 yards, eight fair catches, 10 inside the opponents' 20-yard line, and three punts of 50 or more yards. Sophomore Tucker Dias will provide the Spartans with further depth at punter in 2026.

"During our time here, it is as solid a punter and kicker unit as we have had," said Debeljak. "They have good experience, and they have been very productive. And, I think we have good



depth there.”

Petrucci served as a long snapper for the Spartans last season, and sophomore Nick Lowe, a long-snapping specialist, appeared in one contest at the position last year.

CWRU will also be bringing back all of their top returners from last year. In addition to Kavcic, Wolf also returned kicks for an average of 20.55 yards and brought back seven punts during the campaign. Mangini also had two kick returns and one punt return during the 2025 season.

“We have a lot of options to choose from in the return game,” said Debeljak.

COACHING STAFF

Debeljak will begin his 23rd year at CWRU and holds a 148-67-1 career record, making him the winningest coach in program history in terms of both total victories and winning percentage (.688). He has been named the PAC Coach of the Year twice during his career.

In addition to long-time coordinators Dereck Slesh (offensive coordinator), Warren Miller (defensive coordinator), and Jeff Ramsey (defensive coordinator), Debeljak will welcome former Saint Vincent head coach Ron Dociato back to the staff as a co-offensive coordinator. In addition to returning assistant coaches John Perse (defensive line) and Logan Techentin (wide receivers), Debeljak has added former Gannon Head Coach Jim Kiernan (quarterbacks), Andrew Winkler (running backs), and Paul Yappel (assistant offensive line) to the staff.

SEASON OUTLOOK

The Spartans 2026 schedule will feature a pair of non-conference opponents to begin the campaign, followed by an eight-game PAC schedule (including a game against Division III newcomer Saint Francis that will not count toward the conference standings). CWRU is slated to face five opponents who finished the 2025 season with a .500 or better record, including four teams that qualified for a postseason game last year.

CWRU will try to navigate a challenging four-game stretch to open the campaign. The Spartans are set to open the season on the road on a Friday night against Rochester (5-5 in 2025), facing the Yellowjackets for the first time since the 2021 campaign. After the team's bye week, CWRU will face Shenandoah (8-3) for the first time in its program history, hosting the Hornets at DiSanto Field for its home opener on September 19. The

Spartans will open conference play at home against defending champions Washington & Jefferson (8-3) on September 26 and then travel to Westminster (8-3) on October 3.

“It is a very front-loaded schedule this year, not to take away from any teams we play later,” said Debeljak. “We need to be focused in camp to make sure we will be ready and preparing for those first three games.”

The Spartans will face a first-time opponent to DiSanto Field for Homecoming on October 10, taking on Saint Francis (0-11) in its first year of transitioning from Division I. CWRU will remain home to host Waynesburg (4-6) the next week, then head to Hiram (5-7) on October 24, before returning to DiSanto Field to face Thiel (1-9) for ‘Senior Day.’

CWRU will conclude its season with road games against Grove City (8-3) on November 7 and Allegheny (4-6) on November 14.

“If you look at how the PAC has done, we have qualified multiple teams in each of the first two years of the NPI system,” said Debeljak. “I think the PAC has been established as a really good football league, and I don't think this year is going to be an exception.”

The Spartans will be aiming to win their third PAC Championship and make their first NCAA Playoff appearance since the 2019 campaign in 2026. CWRU is also eligible for the third-annual Opendorse Bowl Series at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton, Ohio. The event features the top non-NCAA qualifying teams from the PAC, Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC), and Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC).

Debeljak sees several keys to the team's success this year.

“First and foremost, we need to keep our best players healthy and on the field,” said Debeljak. “Then, we need to determine an identity on offense and figure out what type of team we are going to be. We need to develop our young offensive line into a cohesive unit. And, on defense, we need to determine who can play up front that can play at a high level, because we feel like we have the experience and talent behind them to be successful.”

THE PRESIDENTS' ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), built on the basic belief that an athletic program is an integral part of college life but not an entity in itself, looks back on 70 years of growth and ahead to years of continued academic and athletic excellence. The league's name clearly reflects its founding principle that operational control of all aspects of intercollegiate athletics is ultimately the responsibility of the presidents of each member institution, and thus active presidential leadership and oversight is paramount in conference administration.



Formally organized in 1955 by Western Reserve University, John Carroll University, Case Institute of Technology, and Wayne State University*, the PAC was the result of a realization that college athletics, despite numerous virtues for the individual and the institution, were gradually becoming a financial and academic burden. If athletics were to be continued, action had to be taken to place the program on its proper level. This included the premise that benefits of participation should be provided to as many students as possible. The PAC and its membership continue its original, defining mission of promoting intercollegiate athletics and the pursuit of academic excellence.

Institutions involved understand that the key components to its progress lie in the foundation of faith in each member by each other member. It is the conviction of its membership that the PAC is the solution to the dilemma of intercollegiate athletic competition, and they have staked their athletic future on this premise.

Currently comprised of 13 select, private institutions -- Allegheny College, Bethany College, Chatham University, Franciscan University of Steubenville, Geneva College, Grove City College, Hiram College, Saint Francis University, Saint Vincent College, Thiel College, Washington & Jefferson College, Waynesburg University and Westminster College -- the PAC remains a unique organization in this day of high-pressure intercollegiate athletics, with academics at the center of each member's philosophy. Case Western Reserve University has competed as an affiliate member in the sport of football since 2012.

Hiram, which was announced as the PAC's 12th full-time member in April, 2024, began full PAC membership with all voting and membership rights on July 1, 2024. After competing in the PAC in wrestling and men's volleyball in 2024-25, the Terriers began competition in all sports in the 2025-26 academic year.

In March, 2025, the PAC announced that Saint Francis University will reclassify from Division I to Division III to become the conference's 13th full-time member. As Saint Francis transitions to Division III, a process which will take 2-3 years to complete, the Red Wolves will have full schedules in all applicable PAC sports. Saint Francis will not be eligible for PAC Championships or compete in Conference Championship Tournaments in basketball, soccer, volleyball, tennis, lacrosse, baseball & softball until they are approved for active Division III membership by the NCAA. Red Wolves' programs in sports such as cross country, golf, swimming and diving and indoor and outdoor track and field will be able to compete at PAC Championships starting in 2026-27 but will not be eligible for all-conference recognition. In lieu of All-PAC honors, Saint Francis athletes in all sports will be eligible for PAC Coaches Honors, an equivalent to All-PAC, until their transition to NCAA Division III status is complete.

The PAC crowns league champions and awards all-conference honors in its 25 championship sports (13 men, 12 women). The PAC begins sponsorship of women's wrestling as its 25th championship sport in 2026-27 after starting men's volleyball as its 24th varsity sport in the 2024-25 academic year. Head coaches determine All-PAC squads for all team sports, while in individual sports, such as cross country and golf, All-PAC accolades are based upon performances at the conference championships.

The PAC annually awards its All-Sports Trophies to the schools which perform best across the board in PAC competition. The men's and women's athletic programs at Grove City swept their respective All-Sports Trophies for the 2025-26 academic year, the third year in a row the Wolverines captured both trophies. The All-Sports Trophy for the Grove City men is their fifth in the last six years and 15th in program history. This was the fourth All-Sports Trophy in the last five years for the Grove City women's program and 22nd overall.

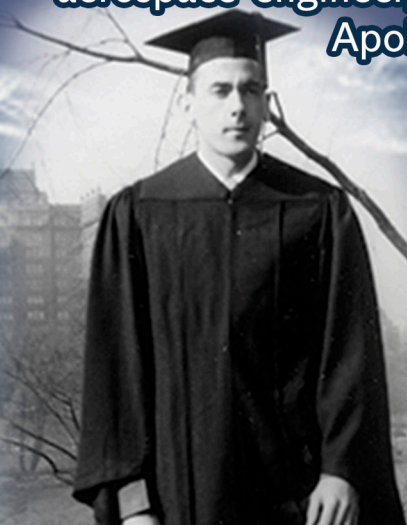
Staying true to its original mission of promoting intercollegiate athletics and the pursuit of academic excellence, the PAC has seen over 300 of its participating student-athletes recognized as Academic All-Americans, while the league has also produced numerous NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship winners. In 2025-26, a total of 1,908 student-athletes were recognized on the PAC Academic Honor Rolls (823 fall, 1,085 spring), which acknowledges all participating student-athletes who earn a semester grade-point average of 3.60 or above.
