**THE WESTERN CAROLINA GAME**

Wofford will return to Southern Conference play on Saturday when the team hosts Western Carolina ... The Terriers are 0-4 overall and 0-1 in the SoCon to begin the season, with a 16-15 loss at South Carolina State, a 14-10 home loss to Richmond, a 22-21 loss at Mercer, and a 38-6 loss at Virginia Tech ... The Terriers are coming off a 5-7 record last year, with a 3-5 mark in the Southern Conference ... Western Carolina is 2-3 on the season, winning their last two games, including a 42-35 win on the road at Campbell last Saturday ... They are 1-0 in the SoCon with a win over Samford ... Last season the Catamounts were 7-5 overall and 6-2 in the SoCon to finish second ... This will be the 47th meeting between the two teams, with Wofford holding a 28-18 lead in the series ... Western Carolina has won the last four meetings, including a 21-17 win in 2024 in Cullowhee ... The Catamounts are seventh in the nation in total offense, but ranked 126 in total defense.

**TERRIER TOP NOTES**

Here are the top notes of interest heading into the game against Western Carolina ...

- Wofford is 0-4 coming off the open week in the last four seasons, with two of the losses to the Catamounts.
- Shawn Watson enters his third full season as head coach of the Terriers.
- Wofford returns ten starters overall, including four on offense, four on defense and two specialists.
- Six players were named to the All-Southern Conference preseason team. C.J. Coombes earned a spot on the first team and he is also on the preseason watch list for the Buck Buchanan Award.
- The Wofford defense is 79th in the nation and third in the SoCon, with the scoring defense 31st overall and second in the SoCon.
- Two of the four losses (S.C. State and Mercer) have been decided by just one point.

# THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT ...

## WESTERN CAROLINA'S LAST GAME

Taron Dickens threw for 427 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Catamount offense, but it took a toss by a former prep QB to ensure the road victory.

Wide receiver James Tyre hit Painter Richards-Baker on a 61-yard pitch-and-catch that handed Western Carolina a two-score advantage with under five minutes to play as the Catamounts held off a late Campbell rally for a 42-35 win over the Camels on Saturday in front of 4,060 fans at Barker-Lane Stadium.

Tyre caught six passes for a career-high 101 receiving yards, adding a pair of punt returns for 47 yards to give him a game-best 148 all-purpose yards. But it was his 61-yard fourth-quarter strike to Richards-Baker, who finished with five catches for a career-high 99 receiving yards, that helped Tyre to Saturday's most valuable performance.

Dickens finished 26-of-40 for 427 yards, with touchdown passes of 17, 32, 9, and 10 yards to tight ends Brayden Blackmon and David Hulbert, with receiver Marcus Striggles and tailback Patrick Boyd Jr., who each hauled in scores. The quarterback connected with 11 different receivers, adding 35 rushing yards in the winning effort. Following a four-score performance a week ago, RB Camury Reid punched in his seventh touchdown of the season on a one-yard plunge to open scoring, finishing with 43 yards on the ground.

## TARHEEL TERRIERS

Wofford has 14 players from the state of North Carolina, with most of those from the Charlotte area.

## CATAMOUNT CONNECTIONS

Wofford punter Maddox Cowart spent last season at Western Carolina, but did not see game action. Tight end Samuel Cornett played one game at quarterback in 2022 for the Catamounts and was 4-of-4 passing for 64 yards and a touchdown.

## LAST MEETING

**WOFFORD 17, WESTERN CAROLINA 21**  
**SATURDAY, OCTOBER 5, 2024**

CULLOWHEE, N.C. – Wofford was defeated 21-17 by Western Carolina at Whitmire Stadium. Playing without spectators, the game was tied at 14-14 at the half. Wofford took a 17-14 lead on the first drive of the third quarter, but the Catamounts scored a touchdown late in the third quarter for a 21-17 advantage.

Wofford is now 2-3 overall and 0-2 in the Southern Conference. Western Carolina is 2-3 overall and opens SoCon play at 1-0. The Terriers were led by Pauly Seeley V with 18-of-39 passing for 209 yards and a touchdown, while Ryan Ingram rushed for 87 yards. The Catamounts were led by Cole Gonzales with 29-of-39 passing for 257 yards with two interceptions.

The Catamounts had the ball first and had a 21-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead at 11:36 in the first quarter. Wofford had a rushing first down by Ryan Ingram before punting. With the ball back, the Catamounts had four first downs to move inside the red zone. The Wofford defense held and Western Carolina added a 25-yard field goal for a 6-0 lead with 4:48 on the clock. The Terriers had two first down receptions before Western Carolina recovered a fumble at the 26-yard line.

Wofford's defense forced a three-and-out and the Catamounts punted. After three first downs, J.T. Smith capped the drive with a 10-yard touchdown run to give Wofford a 10-6 advantage with 10:58 on the clock in the second quarter. Western Carolina's Jalyann Williams had a five-yard touchdown run. With the successful two-point attempt, they took a 14-7 lead at 7:14 in the second quarter.

The Terriers faced fourth-and-one on their next drive, but a fake punt with a run by Jon Schaffer picked up the first down. Faced with another fourth-and-one, a rush was short with 3:47 left in the half. The Catamounts had a first down and then on fourth-and-three, John Boyles tipped a pass in the backfield that fell to the turf. Pauly Seeley found Isaiah Scott for a three-yard touchdown reception which tied the game at 14-14 with 15 seconds remaining on the clock.

To begin the second half, J.T. Smith went 55 yards to give Wofford first-and-goal from the five-yard line. Devery Cagle gave the Terriers a 17-14 lead with a 31-yard field goal with 11:36 on the clock. The Catamounts had one first down and then C.J. Coombes ripped the ball away from the receiver for the interception at the 38-yard line. The Terriers lined up for a 44-yard field goal, but they ran a fake that came up just short of the first down line.

The Catamounts regained the lead with a three-yard touchdown run for a 21-17 score with 4:02 remaining in the third quarter. After Wofford went three-and-out and punted, Western Carolina had four first downs and were inside the 10-yard line when David Powers intercepted a pass at the two-yard line. Kyle Watkins caught a pass on third down for a first down, but Wofford punted. The Catamounts had a 26-yard field goal attempt was wide right after being tipped at the line.

With 8:33 left in the fourth quarter, Wofford took over at the 20-yard line and had one first down before punting. The Catamounts had three first downs and then attempted a 53-yard field goal with 1:36 left that was wide right. With the ball at the 36-yard line, Pauly Seeley ran across midfield for a first down. The Terriers had fourth-and-six with 51 seconds remaining. The pass was broken up and the Catamounts took over on downs.

ABOUT WOFFORD

Shawn Watson is entering his third full season as head coach of the Terriers. On offense, the offensive line features returning starters Mason Howard, Quincy Hughes, and Luke Moise. Clayton Hixon started the final three games last season at center and Chizara Alegbe will be at the other spot. The pro spread offense usually sees three receivers, one tight end and one running back in most formations. C.J. Adams, Ivory Aikens, and Isaiah Scott are set to start at receiver, with Scott the lone returning starter. Transfer Matt Flanders will start at tight end, while Kyle Parsons is the top returner at running back. At quarterback, Jayden Whitaker earned the starting spot after a competition in fall camp, but was replaced by Ethan Drumm against Richmond.

The defense remains a 3-4 base, with the defensive line led by returners Brandon Maina and Marion Smokes. They are joined by Seth Foster. The linebacker position has four new starters in Alijah Williams, Javario Tinch, Jalen Rambert, and Elijah Washington. In the secondary, safeties C.J. Coombes and Maximus Pulley return as starters at safety, with Darius Malcolm and R.J. Brunson taking over at the cornerback positions.

The special teams will see Sam Spence handling placekicking, Haven Maddox kicking off, Maddox Cowart at punter and holder, and Blake Shirley at long snapper.

INJURY REPORT

Running back Isaac Schimpf (knee), tight end Harry Newton (knee), linebacker Benny Radicia (quad), defensive lineman Trenton Kintigh (knee), and linebacker Aidan Morris (medical) will miss the season due to injury.

2025 PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL

In the 2025 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, the conference's nine head coaches picked Wofford to finish seventh in the preseason poll with 19 total points. Wofford ended seventh in the 2024 final standings. A SoCon preseason media poll was not conducted for the second straight season.

2025 PRESEASON ALL-SOCON

The Terriers had six players recognized by the league's coaches on the 2025 preseason all-conference first and second team. One player earned a spot on the first team, sophomore safety **C.J. Coombes**. Coombes started all 12 games last season and was second on the team with 88 total tackles.

Five players earned spots on the second team. Senior offensive lineman **Quincy Hughes** started all 12 games at left tackle last season. Senior defensive lineman **Brandon Maina** started four games in 2024 before an injury. In 2023, he started ten games and was named All-Southern Conference second team with a team-high 4.0 sacks. Senior safety **Maximus Pulley** started all 12 games last season and had 53 total tackles. Sophomore wide receiver **Isaiah Scott** played in all 12 games last season with eight starts and was second on the team in receiving with 28 catches for 350 yards. Sophomore defensive lineman **Marion Smokes**, played in seven games last season and led the team in sacks with 4.0 to be named to the SoCon All-Freshman Team.

ASSISTANT COACHING CHANGES

The Terriers had several coaching changes in the offseason. Joining the team on defense were outside linebackers/special teams coach Dustin Royston and cornerbacks coach Brandon Napoleon.

BUCK BUCHANAN WATCH LIST

Wofford defensive back C.J. Coombes was one of the 25 nominees on the 2025 Buck Buchanan

Award Watch List. The annual award is presented by Stats Perform to the most outstanding defensive player in the FCS following the regular season. Coombes is the first Terrier to earn a spot on the watch list since Miles Brown in 2018 and Alvin Scioneaux in 2013. The watch list will have updates during the season. This season's recipient will be announced at the Stats Perform National Awards Banquet on Jan. 3, 2026, in Nashville, Tennessee.

HITTING THE ROAD EARLY

Wofford is on the road for three of the first four games of the season for the fourth time in the last five seasons. The first three trips are a combined 1,108 miles round-trip with Mercer (436), South Carolina State (266), and Virginia Tech (478). The other three road trips are in the last five games of the season and 1,268 miles total to ETSU (254), VMI (610) and The Citadel (404).

PLAYING ON GRASS

The playing surface at Gibbs Stadium is natural grass, giving the Terriers six games on the surface. The only other road games this season that will see Wofford play on natural grass are at Virginia Tech and at VMI, as the other four road opponents have artificial turf.

WOFFORD'S LAST GAME

Facing Virginia Tech for the second time in four seasons, the Wofford College football team was defeated 38-6 at Lane Stadium. The Terriers held the Hokies to seven points in the first quarter, but the Wofford offense was limited to a pair of field goals in the game.

Wofford opens the season at 0-4, while Virginia Tech is 1-3. The Terriers were led on offense by Jayden Whitaker with 16-of-27 passing for 142 yards. Ivory Aikens had four catches for 42 yards. Quarterback Kyrone Drones led the Hokies with 27-of-32 passing and two touchdowns.

Hokie defense, led by former Wofford defensive coordinator Sam Siefkes, held Wofford to 141 total yards, with 142 passing yards. Virginia Tech had 461 total yards, with 307 of those passing yards. Wofford had eight first downs to 28 for the Hokies. Wofford was 5-of-15 on third down. Virginia Tech was 6-of-11 on third down and 0-of-1 on fourth down. Virginia Tech was called for eight penalties, while Wofford was called for seven. Virginia Tech had a 34:29 to 25:31 time of possession advantage.

WOFFORD VS. VIRGINIA TECH GAME NOTES

This was the second meeting between the two teams, with the Hokies winning both contests. It was the 28th time the Terriers have played an FBS team ... The defense was led by Eli Campbell with eight tackles. Alijah Williams had a fumble recovery and a sack ... Game captains were Quincy Hughes and Maximus Pulley ... Attendance at Lane Stadium was 57,229.

SOCON PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Wofford defensive back C.J. Coombes was named the Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Week on September 8. Coombes, a sophomore from Bellefonte, Delaware, had five tackles on Saturday in the loss to Richmond. At the end of the first quarter, he intercepted a pass by Kyle Wickersham and returned it 72 yards for a touchdown. It was the first interception returned for a touchdown by a Wofford player since 2018, and it was tied for the tenth longest return in school history.

IN THE 2024 NATIONAL RANKINGS

In the final 2024 NCAA rankings, Kyle Parsons was 35th in kick returns (22.2) ... Isaiah Wadsworth was sixth in blocked kicks with two ... Kyle Watkins was 53rd in receiving yards per game (67.8) and 48th in total receiving yards (814) ... Ryan Ingram was 95th in rushing yards per game (56.3) ... Jalen Marshall was 41st in total tackles (8.1), fifth in solo tackles (5.5), and 36th in tackles for loss (1.1) ... C.J. Coombes was 53rd in total tackles (7.9) and 10th in solo tackles (5.3) ... Sam Spence was 56th in punting (40.4) ... Overall as a team, the Terriers were fourth in punt returns (15.88), 27th in interceptions (13), 34th in passing efficiency defense (122.85), and 54th in scoring defense (24.9).

Wofford finished the 2024 season at 5-7 overall and 3-5 in the Southern Conference ... The Terriers posted victories over Gardner-Webb (21-20), #14 Richmond (26-19), VMI (31-16), Samford (17-13), and Furman (19-13), along with losses to #13 William & Mary (28-21), #12 Mercer (22-3), Western Carolina (21-17), #19 Chattanooga (37-5), #23 East Tennessee State (24-7), The Citadel (30-17) and South Carolina (56-12) ... In the Southern Conference, the Terriers were 3-5 on the season to finish tied for sixth place ... Wofford had five players named to the All-Southern Conference second team, including DB Amir Annoor, TE Jordan Davis, OL Anthony Garcia, DL Anthonie Lattany, and WR Kyle Watkins ... The Terriers had four players named to the All-Freshman team: DB C.J. Coombes, OL Luke Moise, QB Amari Odom, and DL Marion Smokes.

2024 JERRY RICE AWARD FINALIST

Defensive back C.J. Coombes was one of 25 players named as a finalist for the Stats Perform 2024 Jerry Rice Award, which honors the FCS freshman player of the year in college football's Division I subdivision. In the final voting, he was 11th overall (fourth amongst defensive players). Coombes, a second-year freshman from Bellefonte, Delaware, was second on the team in total tackles with 88. Among the SoCon leaders he was 11th in total tackles.

2024 ALL-SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

The Southern Conference announced the 2024 football postseason awards on Tuesday, November 26. Wofford had five players named to the All-Southern Conference second team, including defensive back Amir Annoor, tight end Jordan Davis, offensive lineman Anthony Garcia, defensive lineman Anthonie Lattany, and wide receiver Kyle Watkins. The Terriers had four players named to the All-Freshman team: defensive back C.J. Coombes, offensive lineman Luke Moise, quarterback Amari Odom, and defensive lineman Marion Smokes.

2024 FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICANS

Following the season, defensive back C.J. Coombes and offensive lineman Luke Moise were named to the Stats Perform FCS Freshman All-America Team. Coombes and Moise were joined by defensive lineman Marion Smokes on the FCS Central Freshman All-America team and Phil Steele's Freshman All-America team.

THE 0-4 START

Wofford has started the season 0-4 for the third time in the last four seasons (2022, 2023, 2025). Before this stretch, the last time the Terriers were 0-4 was in the 1987 season and then the 1967 season. This season, the first four games have included three conference champions from the 2024 season (S.C. State, Richmond, and Mercer) and an ACC opponent (Virginia Tech).

HOW THE 2025 OPPONENTS DID

The twelve opponents that Wofford face this season were a combined 74-72 in 2024 and two advanced to the NCAA FCS Playoffs. This year three were ranked in the FCS preseason polls, including non-conference foe Richmond. In 2024, South Carolina State (9-3, MEAC Champion), Richmond (10-3, CAA Champion), Virginia Tech (6-7), Mercer (11-3, SoCon Champion), Western Carolina (7-5), Norfolk State (4-8), VMI (1-11), Chattanooga (7-5), ETSU (7-5), Samford (4-7), Furman (3-8), and The Citadel (5-7) were a combined 74-72.

A 12 GAME SEASON AGAIN

Wofford played 12 games in a season in 2002 (9-3) and in 2016 (9-3). In 2024, the 12-game slate saw the Terriers post a 5-7 record. The Terriers will play 12 games again in 2025, with six home games. Moving forward, the NCAA will allow 12 games in every season.

TIES TO WATSON

With Watson taking over as head coach in December of 2022, he added several staff members from previous coaching stops. Running backs coach Seniorise Perry and wide receivers coach Michael Lee Harris were players at Louisville when Watson was offensive coordinator, while Jonathan Saxon was a graduate assistant on the defensive line on that staff.

2025 INCOMING CLASS

The Terriers welcomed an incoming class of 59 players in the fall of 2025, which included 14 transfers. There are 22 newcomers on defense, 31 on offense and six specialists.

TRUE FRESHMEN ON THE FIELD

With the NCAA redshirt rules, players can see action in up to four games and keep the redshirt. Wofford played a number of true freshmen last year, including WR Ivory Aikens, OL Luke Moise, LB Caleb Oliver, WR Isaiah Scott, and DL Marion Smokes.

THE 2025 RETURNERS

In looking ahead to the 2025 season, Wofford is returning ten total starters. On offense, linemen Quincy Hughes, Luke Moise, and Mason Howard return, along with receiver Isaiah Scott. On defense, linemen Marion Smokes and Seth Foster return, with safeties C.J. Coombes and Maximus Pulley also returning. On special teams, starters Devery Cagle and Sam Spence return. An additional ten players who started at least one game also return.

THE "OLD" GUYS

Staying for a fifth year at Wofford - a traditional residential liberal arts institution - is not something that is as common as at other schools. Since Wofford does not have a graduate program (VMI is the only other SoCon school not to have one), planning must go into spreading courses out so there is at least one class left for the fall semester. This year, there are five fifth-year players on the team - DL Seth Foster, OL Quincy Hughes, DL Brandon Maina, S Maximus Pulley, and LB Benny Radicia.

A LIMITED TRANSFER WINDOW

Due to the academic requirements at Wofford, transfers are not a common occurrence. Since a limited number of credits can transfer, only freshmen and sophomores can usually join the team. After having 15 transfers on the squad in 2024, there are now 23 transfers on the roster in 2025: WR C.J. Adams, OL Chizara Alegbe, DB CJ Coombes, QB Samuel Cornett, K Maddox Cowart, QB J.T. Fayard, TE Matt Flanders, OL Landon Harris, OL Mason Howard, RB Ihson Jackson-Anderson, DL Trenton Kintigh, RB Gerald Modest, LB Cade Moleodor, OL Dillon Porter, DB Maximus Pulley, LB Benny Radicia, QB Tanner Staton, DL Jude Tinor, WR Grant Tucker, OL Martin Ventour, QB Jayden Whitaker, LB Alijah Williams and OL Azrie Yeager.

NEW NUMBERS

With a large senior class graduating in 2024, over 30 players moved to new numbers for the 2025 season. A few changes made after the publication of the media guide are C.J. Coombes (0), Ivory Aikens (0), John Jaraczewski (13), Caleb Oliver (10), Wyatt Ward (44), Alijah Williams (11), and Kaden Brown (37).

FIRST CAREER STARTS

After 32 players had first career starts in the fall of 2021, Wofford had 18 players earn first career starts in 2022. Eleven players recorded first career starts in 2023 and in the 2024 season the Terriers had twelve players make their first career starts.

2025 FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the 2025 season opener at South Carolina State, eleven players made their first career starts in

a Terrier uniform. On offense, the five were OL Chizara Alegbe, WR C.J. Adams, WR Ivory Aikens, QB Jayden Whitaker and TE Matt Flanders. The defensive players were LB Alijah Williams, LB Jalen Rambert, LB Kade Moledor, LB Eli Campbell, CB Darius Malcolm and CB R.J. Brunson. Against Richmond, six more players recorded their first starts: QB Ethan Drumm, OL Reggie Houston, TE Jaden Fowler, RB Gerald Modest Jr., LB Elijah Washington, CB J'vion Luster. In the third game of the season at Mercer, OL Dillon Porter, RB Ihson Jackson-Anderson, WR Grant Tucker, DL Ramon McCollough, DL Jude Tinor started their first career games at Wofford. At Virginia Tech, DL Caleb Oliver and CB Cole Walker earned their first starts to bring the total to 24 players with first starts this season.

### **VETERAN CAREER GAMES PLAYED/STARTS**

The most veteran player on the team this year is defensive lineman Brandon Maina with 36 games played. He is followed by Quincy Hughes (32), Kyle Parsons (31), Seth Foster (29), Nick Morgan (27), Maximus Pulley (27), and Bridger Jones (24).

Brandon Maina also leads the team in career games started with 31, followed by Quincy Hughes (30) and Maximus Pulley (27).

### **WE KNOW WHAT YOU DID LAST SUMMER**

While a majority of the team was on campus during the summer taking classes, some had jobs as well ... TE Samuel Cornett interned with Nuveen in Chicago, where he worked in the same building as the fictional Tom Bueller ... RB Kyle Parsons observed a variety of court cases at the Spartanburg Courthouse, and also visited a session of the South Carolina Supreme Court with former chief justice Costa Pleicones '62 ... LB Aidan Morris worked with Dr. Carolyn Martberger, chair of the physics department, on data collection and interpretation of heart rate variability ... DL Brandon Maina studied for and took the MCAT.

### **BROTHER ACTS**

The Terriers have two sets of brothers on the team this season: WR Caleb and LS Corey Hodge and LB Nick and DB Tyler Morgan.

### **2025 CAREER FIRSTS**

In 2025, players with career firsts included first touchdowns by Colby Alexander and Perrin Ketchin at South Carolina State. Against Richmond Ethan Drumm had his first completion and at Mercer he threw his first career touchdown pass. C.J. Adams and Ivory Aikens both had first receiving touchdowns at Mercer. Matt Flanders had his first two Wofford catches at Virginia Tech.

### **2024 DEEP THOUGHTS...**

By quarter, Wofford led in the first quarter (+12) ... The team was outscored in the second (-26), third (-55) and fourth (-34) quarters ... Opponents averaged 5.1 yards per play on 842 plays, while the Terriers averaged 4.9 yards per play on 714 plays ... Ryan Ingram had 38 of his 156 carries go for a first down or touchdown ... Kyle Watkins had 49 receptions, with 34 for either a first down or touchdown ... Watkins led the team with 19 big plays of 20+ yards.

### **2025 DRIVING NOTES...**

Wofford had an average drive start of the 24.8 yard line, while opponents started from the 29.5 yard line ... On the opening drives of a game, Wofford has punted all four times. To begin the second half, Wofford has 2 punts, a touchdown and a field goal... Of the 10 scoring drives, 4 went for more than 70 yards, none lasted for more than five minutes (longest 3:57) and one lasted 10 or more plays.

## **THE TERRIER**

Wofford's nickname dates back to the early 1900's when Professor E.H. Shuler recalled seeing a terrier named Jack at Wofford baseball games. Jack made an appearance in the 1909 baseball team photo. A cartoon showing a Jack-like dog doing gymnastics appeared in a Wofford Journal in 1910. By 1914 when football resumed after an 11-year absence at Wofford, the nickname Terrier was firmly established for the college's athletic teams.

Wofford has had a number of real life mascots including Spike in the mid-50s and Jocko in the early 1960s. Most Wofford Terriers have been Boston Terriers which have a smooth black coat with white markings on the face, neck, chest, legs and feet. They usually pack a muscular 20 pounds on a foot-high frame. A sculpture of a Terrier was unveiled on March 25, 2008, outside of the Student Life Building as a gift to Wofford College from the Class of 1956. Among NCAA Division I schools, Wofford is joined by Boston University with a terrier as a mascot.



### **NO LONGER A WALK-ON**

Two walk-ons have earned scholarships heading into the season. WR Jack Purdy and LB Jonathan Schaffer were rewarded for their hard work and leadership with scholarships.

### **PLAYER SUPERLATIVES**

The tallest players are offensive linemen Ben Holmes, Mason Howard and tight end Samuel Cornett coming in at 6-7 ... The heaviest player this season is offensive lineman Kendrell Chambers at 311 pounds.

### **PLAYER INTEREST NOTES**

OL Griffin Reid's brother played football at The Citadel ... OL Clayton Hixon's twin brother Felix played football at South Carolina before transferring to Middle Tennessee State ... LS Blake Shirley's brother, Alex, was a long snapper at The Citadel and their father played football at Furman ... RB Kyle Parsons backed-up former Clemson and current Philadelphia Eagles running back Will Shipley at Weddington High School as a freshman and sophomore ... Parsons' father, Kevin, played football at Nebraska, while his brother, Colin, played football at The Citadel ... WR Gavin Batt's brother, Griffin, is a senior tight end at Clemson ... LB Aidan Morris' father, Rob, played football at Wisconsin-La Crosse ... LB Jalen Rambert's father, Bernard, played football at Clemson ... K Sam Spence's brothers both played football at Clemson (Austin, long snapper and Alex, kicker) ... RB Troy Timko's father played football at Duke ... QB J.T. Fayard's father played tight end at LSU and was team captain his senior season ... OL Nathanael Cole placed second nationally at the National Association of Teachers of Singing auditions held at Temple University in June - both of his parents are opera singers.

DL Bra'Lyn Smith Sapp's father, Ricky, played football at Clemson and was in the NFL for five seasons after being drafted in the fifth round by Philadelphia (2010), NY Jets (2011-13), Houston (2013-14) ... OL Clayton Hixon's uncle, Brad Baxter, played in the NFL for nine seasons (1989 Minnesota, 1990-1995 NY Jets) ... CB R. J. Harrison's father, Rodney, played for the Chargers (1994-2002) and Patriots (2003-2008) and is currently working for NBC Sports ... In addition, coaches Senorise Perry (Bears, Dolphins, Bills and Titans) and Corey Woods (Patriots) spent time playing in the NFL.



### **WOFFORD LEGACIES**

Wofford ties run deep on the team this season ... WR Jack Purdy's mother, Jennifer, is a Wofford graduate ... DB Will White's father, St. William, played football at Wofford ... TE Seabrook Kellett's father graduated from Wofford in 1992 ... DB Perrin Ketchin's father, Stewart, played baseball and ran track, while his mother, Nikki, played on the Wofford soccer team ... In addition, assistant coach Devin Watson (2019) is a Wofford graduate.

## **OFFENSIVE NOTES**

### **THE QUARTERBACKS**

With no returning quarterbacks from 2024, all six quarterbacks are new to the program. Jayden Whitaker and J.T. Fayard joined as transfers in the spring semester, while Tanner Staton transferred in during the summer. Ethan Drumm enrolled in the spring as a freshman, while freshmen Chalmers Ballard and George Rouse enrolled during the summer. In the open competition for the starting spot, Whitaker earned the nod late in camp. Drumm replaced him in the second game of the season against Richmond, but Whitaker was back under center at Virginia Tech.

### **THE RUNNING BACKS**

At running back, Kyle Parsons is the top returner after rushing for 131 yards on 23 carries in 2024. Isaiah Nell (one game played) and Kaden Brown also return, while Isaac Schimpf will miss the season due to injury. Ihson Jackson-Anderson and Gerald Modest join the program as transfers. Troy Timko is the lone freshman in the group.

### **THE OFFENSIVE LINE**

The position with the most returning starting this season is the offensive line. LT Quincy Hughes, LG, Luke Moise and RT Parson Howard are all back, while Clayton Hixon started the last three games of the season at center. Others returning include J'Von Lindsey, Chizaara Alegbe, Nathanael Cole, Gavin Major, and Ben Holmes. Joining the line as transfers are Dillon Porter, Martin Ventour, Landon Harris, and Azrie Yeager. Freshman in the group include Reggie Houston (who enrolled in January), Ben Diedrich, Carter Stephens, Kendrell Chambers, P.J. Miller, and Kam Wallace.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS

The top returning receiver from last year is Isaiah Scott, who had 28 catches for 350 yards. Also returning are Jack Purdy (7 for 85), Cam Smith (4 for 39) and Ivory Aikens (3-14). Grant Tucker and C.J. Adams have joined the team as transfers from Appalachian State and South Carolina, respectively. Additional returners are Gavin Batt, Cooper Stark, Caleb Hodge, Grayson Gregg, and Ryan Peacock. The seven freshmen include Terrance Honeywood, Anjuan "Ace" Coleman, Hudson Wamack, Tanner Macy, Cooper Williams, Connor Brown, and Colby Alexander.

THE TIGHT ENDS

The tight ends will be led by senior Samuel Cornett, who had a pair of catches for two-point conversions last season. Transfer Matt Flanders had 13 catches with two touchdowns last season at Wingate. Jaden Fowler, Isaiah Haithcock, Seabrook Kellett, and Harry Newton also return as redshirt freshmen. Joining the group are freshmen Will Maisenbacher and Jack Ewell.

STABILITY AT QUARTERBACK IS A KEY

In the 2018 and 2019 seasons in which Wofford won back-to-back SoCon Championships, Joe Newman started 25 consecutive games. In the fall of 2021 the Terriers used four different starting quarterbacks in the same season for the first time since moving to NCAA Division I in 1995. The stability at the position returned in 2022, with Weirick starting all eleven games in 2022. In 2023, the instability was back with three starting quarterbacks on the season. Last year Amari Odom started the first four games and Pauly Seeley started the next three games. Bryce Corriston then started against ETSU before Odom returned for the Samford, Furman and South Carolina games.

A FRESHMAN UNDER CENTER

Against Richmond, the Terriers started true freshman Ethan Drumm at quarterback. A true freshman at the position is rare at Wofford, with Pauly Seeley (5 starts) and Amari Odom (1 start) getting the nod in 2023. Before that, you have to go back to Travis Wilson in 1998 when he got a start against Appalachian State.

GOING LONG

Trailing 10-0 in the second quarter at Mercer, Ethan Drumm found Ivory Aikens for an 80-yard touchdown reception. The play was the fourth-longest passing play in school history. Here are the top six ...

THIRD DOWN WOES

On third down, Wofford only converted 43 of 156 attempts last season for a 27.6% success rate, which was the fourth-lowest percent in the nation. The Terriers were 0-5 on 3rd-and-one, but 10-of-22 on third-and-three. Over half (102) of the attempts were 3rd-and-long (6+ yards). So far this season, Wofford is 12-of-54 on third down for a 22.2% success rate that is the second-lowest in the nation.

A STABLE OFFENSIVE LINE

The offensive line had only three different starting combinations last season. A left tackle, Quincy Hughes started all eleven games and at left guard Luke Moise started all eleven games. At center, Anthony Garcia started the first nine games before an injury and Clayton Hixon took his place. Briggs Kearse started all eleven games at right guard, while right tackle saw Santana Haynes-Goodman (7) and Mason Howard (4) make starts.

FOURTH DOWN? GO FOR IT!

On fourth and short in plus territory, the Terriers could punt, go for it, or maybe even run a fake.

Wofford was 11-of-25 on fourth downs last season, with the 25 attempts ranked 30th in the nation. The 44.0% success rate was 89th in the nation. Defensively, opponents were only at 46.7% (7-of-15) on the season to be ranked 40th in the nation.

A LITTLE MORE PASSING

In 2016, Wofford ran the ball over 86% of the time. Since then, the Terriers have relied a little less on the run in the option offense. In the move to the pro spread in 2022, the run game was down to 51.5% of the offense and was right at 50% in 2024.

RUSHING LEGACY

Wofford had finished among the top ten schools in the nation in rushing in 22 straight years until the fall of 2022 when they were 13th overall. The Terriers' wingbone offense put a premium on ball control and keeping the opponent's offense on the boundary. Eight times the Terriers were second in the nation in rushing yards per game, while in 2010 and 2011 they finished first.

200+ PASSING YARDS

There have only been 38 games in Wofford history with 200 or more passing yards, and only four game with 300 or more passing yards (2022 at Kennesaw, vs. ETSU, at Furman, 1969 vs. Catawba, 309). Since the year 2000, here are the 16 games with 200 or more passing yards:

DEFENSIVE NOTES

THE DEFENSIVE LINE

The defensive line features four players that started games last season in Brandon Maina, Marion Smokes, Seth Foster and O'marion Brown. Smokes led the team in sacks with four for a loss of 32 yards. Additional returners include Ramon McCollough, Trenton Kintigh, Cooper Horton and John King. Newcomers to the group include transfer Jude Tinor and freshmen Tyce Donnelly, Dh'King Brown, Jordan Johnson, Nicholas Mathious, Zeb Taylor and Jacob Domengeaux.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) consistently to earn public recognition. In 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019, Wofford had the highest APR in the SoCon. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 176 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003.

Wofford has had at least one player named CoSIDA/CSC All-District in 22 of the last 23 seasons. In addition, safety James Zotto was named an Academic All-American in 2014.

THE LINEBACKERS

There will be four new starters at linebacker this season. Projected to start on the outside is transfer Alijah Williams and Elijah Washington. In the inside, Javario Tinch and Jalen Rambert get the starting nod. The returners include Caleb Oliver, Aiden Morris, Whit Blackburn, Bra'Lyan Smith-Sapp, Nick Morgan, Anderson Smith, Jonathan Schaffer, John Jaraczewski, and Corley Watson. In addition to transfer Kade Moledor, Logan McCloud, Wyatt Ward, Jake Thorne and Silas Parish join the group as freshmen.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKS

In the secondary, Maximus Pulley and C.J. Coombes are the returning starters at safety. There will be a pair of new starters at cornerback, with Darius Malcolm and R.J. Brunson stepping up into those positions. Other returners include J'Vion Luster, Eli Campbell, Jacobi Hatter, Perrin Ketchin and Will White. The defensive back group include nine true freshmen - R.J. Harrison, Wyatt Thompson, Cole Walker, Tyree Myrick, Zayd Rogan, Ben Horton, Kaden Gooden, Trace Gaynes and Tyler Morgan.

INTERCEPTION INCREASE

Wofford had only five interceptions in the 2022 season and then had nine interceptions in 2023. In 2024, the Terriers had 13 interceptions by eight different players. The 13 interceptions were ranked 27th in the nation.

TAKING THE BALL AWAY

In 2024, the Terriers came up with 21 turnovers - eight fumble recoveries and 13 interceptions. In the 2023 season, Wofford had 16 take-aways and in 2022 the number was 14. The 13 interceptions were four more than in 2024 (9). The team was +0.08 on the season in turnover margin which was 60th in the nation. In 2023 Wofford had a +0.09 turnover margin that was 57th in the nation.

DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense is a true team effort with contributions from numerous players in the 2024 season. Overall, seventeen players have 20 or more tackles. Twenty players had at least a share of a tackle for loss, while 13 recorded sacks. During the season, five different players have led the team in tackles in the twelve games.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

THE KICKERS

The special teams unit, also known as Black Ops, is a mix of returners and newcomers. Sam Spence handled punting last season with a 40.4 average and added 23 kickoffs. Cavan Craig kicked off for the last couple of games with a 59.4 average. Devery Cagle was 10-of-12 on field goals and was 13-of-14 on PATs. Bridger Jones was 4-of-5 on field goals before missing the rest of the season due to injury. The long snapping duties will be handled by Blake Shirley, along with newcomers Joshua Hodge and Sam Aschbrenner. Other newcomers are kickers Conner Deviney and Haven Maddox, along with punters Penn Morris and Maddox Cowart, with Cowart serving as the holder.

GOING LONG

Last season Bridger Jones made a 47-yard field goal at Gardner-Webb, which was matched by Sam Spence against Richmond this year. David Marvin has the school record with a pair of 57-yard field goals in 2016 against Furman and Western Carolina.

FINAL THOUGHTS

GOING OVERTIME

The Terriers lost the first two overtime games played, then won the next two. In 2012, a 24-17 double overtime loss at Samford was followed by a win over Chattanooga. There was a win over Mercer in 2015 and losses to The Citadel and Youngstown State (double overtime) in 2016. The Terriers had overtime wins against Western Carolina and Chattanooga in 2017, along with against Chattanooga in 2019. Wofford was defeated 45-44 in overtime in 2021 at The Citadel and is now 7-6 all-time in overtime games.

WOFFORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE FCS OPPONENTS

Since 2000, Wofford is 29-12 in non-conference regular season FCS games ... Wofford's loss to Coastal Carolina in 2006 snapped a streak of 10 straight regular season non-conference wins against FCS opponents ... The Terriers had not lost a non-conference regular season game to a FCS opponent since dropping the 2000 season opener to Lehigh 34-14 ... The loss to Gardner-Webb in 2013 ended a nine-game streak ... Wofford lost again to Gardner-Webb in 2014, along with a loss to S.C. State in 2019, losses to Kennesaw State in 2021 and 2022, plus a loss to Elon in 2022 ... Wofford added a loss at William & Mary and to Presbyterian in 2023 ... Wofford won in 2024

against Gardner-Webb and Richmond, but lost to William & Mary ... So far in 2025, Wofford has a loss to S.C. State and a loss to Richmond.

TERRIERS AGAINST RANKED FBS TEAMS

In the 27 games against FBS opponents, six of those have been when the opponent is ranked in the top 25. Two of the six have been against South Carolina (#17 in 2001 and #12 in 2012), while three have been against Clemson and one was at Ole Miss.

TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS

The 2025 season marks the 24th time in the last 25 fall seasons the Terriers play against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A). Overall, Wofford is 1-27 in those games. In 2011, Wofford had a lead at Clemson in the third quarter. At South Carolina in 2012, the game was tied at 7-7 at the start of the fourth quarter. Wofford was down five points to Georgia Tech in 2014 with ten minutes to go in the game. In 2017, Wofford trailed South Carolina 14-10 in the third quarter. Wyoming scored with 17 seconds left in the game in 2018. Wofford was scheduled to play South Carolina in 2020 but the game was canceled. Virginia Tech is back on the slate in 2025, while the Terriers visit Ole Miss and Ohio University in 2026. Clemson is scheduled again in 2027, while South Carolina returns in 2028 and there is a visit to Charlotte in 2029.

TERRIERS AT HOME

Wofford has won 84 of its last 122 games played in Gibbs Stadium, including going 5-0 in 2014 and 2018 ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 105-52 (.673) ... The Terriers have won 64 of 104 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium.

PRO TERRIERS

Several Terriers are currently playing professional football. Defensive lineman **Miles Brown '19** signed as a free agent with the Arizona Cardinals and played in three games in 2019. He also spent time with the Titans and Lions before playing three seasons with the Saskatchewan Roughriders in the CFL. In 2025 he was with the Calgary Stampeders. Safety **JoJo Tillery '19** signed as a rookie free agent with the Tennessee Titans. He then played for Birmingham Stallions, earning USFL titles in 2022 and 2023, along with a UFL title in 2024. Wide receiver **Landon Parker '22** was in training camp with the Indianapolis Colts in 2025 after playing at Troy University as a graduate student.

MR. RICHARDSON

Jerry Richardson came to Wofford in the mid- 1950s as an unheralded pass receiver from Fayetteville, N.C. By the time he left to begin his pro career with the Baltimore Colts, the passing combination of Charlie Bradshaw to Jerry Richardson had received nationwide fame. Richardson was an Associated

Press Little All-America selection in 1957 and '58. He still holds Wofford's single-game record with 241 receiving yards vs. Newberry in 1956 and is the record holder for touchdown receptions in a season (9 in 1958) and in a career (21). As a senior at Wofford, he scored 72 points on nine touchdowns, 12 extra points and two field goals. Drafted by the defending world champion Colts, Richardson played two seasons in the NFL, earning Colt Rookie of the Year honors in 1959 and finishing third in the balloting for top NFL rookie. He was the founder of the Carolina Panthers. In 2015, Wofford announced the construction of two new facilities on campus donated by Richardson. The Rosalind S. Richardson Center for the Arts opened in the spring of 2017 and is the home to academic programs in theatre arts, visual arts and art history. The Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium is a 123,000-square-foot facility opened in September of 2017 and includes a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 400-seat volleyball competition venue. Jerome Johnson Richardson Hall, a residence hall for approximately 150 students with athletic facilities for baseball, softball and golf, opened in the fall of 2020. On February 24, 2021, Wofford announced a \$150 million gift to the endowment from Richardson, putting his contributions to his alma mater at over \$262 million since his graduation. He passed away on March 1, 2023.

SOCON SUCCESS

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in 15 of the last 22 years, winning seven SoCon Championships. In the last 22 years, the Terriers have won 91 of 160 SoCon games played. Over that time, Wofford is the third-winningest program in the Southern Conference with a .569 win percentage.

The team took a step forward in 2024, posting a 5-7 overall record with a 3-4 mark in the Southern Conference. The team won the first two games of the season, including a victory over eventual CAA conference champion Richmond. A 17-13 win at Samford was the first for the Terriers over the Bulldogs since 2014. The team added a win at Furman, giving Wofford back-to-back wins over the Paladins. Five players were named to the All-Southern Conference second team, while four players earned SoCon All-Freshman Team honors.

In his first full season as head coach in 2023, the Terriers were 2-9 overall and 2-6 in the Southern Conference. Wofford won the last two games of the season as they earned an 11-3 win at The Citadel and then downed Southern Conference Champion Furman 19-13 at Gibbs Stadium as the Paladins were ranked #2 in the nation. Following the season, DL Brandon Maina and LB David Powers earned All-Southern Conference honors.

During his first season at Wofford in 2022, he helped lead the transition from the option to the pro spread as offensive coordinator. He was named interim head coach on October 6 and led the team to a 3-3 record. His first win with the Terriers was on October 16 against The Citadel. He followed that with wins over East Tennessee State and VMI. Quarterback Jimmy Weirick set school single season records for completions (187), attempts (323) and passing yards (2,479). Weirick holds four of the top marks for passing yards in a game, including the record of 428 at Furman. Wide receiver Landon Parker set the school record for receiving yards in a season with 804.

In his three seasons as head coach, the team was 11-22 overall and produced 20 all-conference players.

He earned a bachelor's degree in health education from SIU in 1982. Watson and his wife, Anita, have three children: Amber (Marcus Capone), Aaron (Victoria) and Adam (April) and four grandchildren, Caden, Maggie, Wyatt and Emma.

ORANGEBURG, S.C. — In the season opener, Wofford was defeated 16-15 by South Carolina State at Dawson Stadium. A touchdown with 1:29 left in the fourth quarter by the Bulldogs gave them the lead and a last-second field goal attempt by the Terriers came up short. With the Terrier offense unable to gain momentum, the defense and special teams unit came up with big plays. An 89-yard kick-off return and a blocked punt recovered for a touchdown, along with a safety on defense, were all the points the Terriers could muster.

Wofford opens the season at 0-1, while S.C. State is 1-0. The Terriers were led on offense by Gerald Modest, Jr. and Ihson Jackson-Anderson with seven carries each for 27 yards. The Bulldogs had 39 rushing yards by KZ Adams and William Atkins IV was 19-of-34 passing.

The Bulldogs had the ball first and kicked a 33-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead with 6:47 on the clock in the first quarter. Wofford had one first down before punting. With the ball back, the Bulldogs had a pair of first downs. The Terrier defense then had a pass break-up by Seth Foster and a sack by Marion Smokes to force a punt. Wofford had a first down before punting. The Bulldogs had one first down before going for it on fourth-and-five, with the run coming up short.

Wofford had a first down run before attempting a 52-yard field goal that was just short with 8:19 left in the second quarter. After the Bulldogs had one first down and punted, the Terriers had the ball at the 28-yard line. S.C. State forced a three-and-out and with the ball back they added a 41-yard field goal to take a 6-0 lead with 2:37 remaining in the half. After the field goal, freshman Colby Alexander had an 89-yard kick-off return for a touchdown to give Wofford a 7-6 lead with 2:25 left in the half. The Bulldogs had a late 48-yard field goal attempt that was wide right and the Terriers ran one play to end the first half.

On the opening drive of the second half, the Terriers went three-and-out. The Bulldogs added a 25-yard field goal to regain the lead at 9-7 with 8:33 on the clock in the third quarter. After the teams traded punts, a sack by Brandon Maina on third down forced a punt. Maximus Pulley was able to block the punt and it was recovered by Perrin Ketchin, who took it in for a touchdown. The two-point attempt failed and Wofford held a 13-9 lead with 12:22 remaining in the quarter.

With the ball back, the Bulldogs had two passing first downs and then faced a fourth-and-five. The pass was dropped and Wofford took over. The Bulldogs forced a three-and-out, but the punt was downed by the Terriers at the one-yard line. On the first play of the drive, Brandon Maina sacked the quarterback in the endzone for a safety with 9:11 on the clock as the Terriers took a 15-9 lead. Wofford had two first downs before attempting a 44-yard field goal that was wide left with 4:33 left in the game.

After a pair of big passing plays moved the ball to the 21-yard line, the Bulldogs faced fourth-and-two from the 13-yard line. A short pass was completed for a touchdown with 1:27 remaining in the game and the Bulldogs had a 16-15 lead. Wofford had two first downs and with ten seconds remaining, the Terriers attempted a 49-yard field goal that was short. The Bulldogs ran one play to end the game.

SPARTANBURG, S.C. — In the home opener on Saturday night, the Wofford College football team was defeated 14-10 by the University of Richmond at Gibbs Stadium. The start of the game was delayed by ninety minutes due to weather. Once the game got underway, the Spiders scored first and the Terriers answered with an interception returned 72-yards for a touchdown by C.J. Coombes for a 7-7 score at the half. In the second half, the Terriers took the lead on a field goal, but a touchdown in the fourth quarter by the Spiders wrapped up the win.

Wofford opens the season at 0-2, while Richmond is 1-1. The Terriers were led on offense by Ihson Jackson-Anderson with 45 yards on seven carries, while freshman quarterback Ethan Drumm was 12-of-25 for 111 yards. Kyle Wickersham was 20-of-29 passing for 153 yards, along with 78 rushing yards, to lead the Spiders.

Wofford opens the season at 0-4, while Virginia Tech is 1-3. The Terriers were led on offense by Jayden Whitaker with 16-of-27 passing for 142 yards. Ivory Aikens had four catches for 42 yards. Quarterback Kyron Drones led the Hokies with 27-of-32 passing and two touchdowns.

The Terriers won the toss and received the opening kickoff. After a three-and-out, the Hokies had a 26-yard run for a first down and then faced a fourth-and-two from the eight-yard line. Kade Moledor and O'marion Brown stopped the run and Wofford took over on downs. The Terriers went three-and-out and punted. With a pair of penalties, the Hokies were backed up to their 17-yard line, but a long run and a targeting penalty on the Terriers moved the ball across midfield. Another Wofford penalty and a first down pass moved Virginia Tech inside the five. A three-yard touchdown run gave the Hokies a 7-0 lead with 6:26 left in the first quarter.

Jayden Whitaker completed a 23-yard pass to Ivory Aikens to move into Hokie territory. After a first down run, a sack on third down forced a Wofford punt. The Hokies had a nine-play drive that covered 80 yards and was capped by a 19-yard touchdown pass for a 14-0 lead with 11:53 on the clock in the second quarter. After a three-and-out by Wofford, the ensuing Virginia Tech drive ended with a fumble forced by O'marion Brown that was recovered by Alijah Williams at the 32-yard line. However, on the first play for the Terriers, the Hokies intercepted Jayden Whitaker. Virginia Tech had a pair of first downs and extended the advantage to 21-0 with an 18-yard touchdown pass with 6:24 on the clock. The Terriers went three-and-out and then forced a Hokie three-and-out after a big sack by Alijah Williams. Ivory Aikens had a 17-yard reception to move across the 50. After a personal foul penalty for a first down, the Terriers were able to get on the board with a 43-yard field goal by Sam Spence for a 21-3 score with 43 seconds left in the first half. A 59-yard field goal try by the Hokies as time expired was short.

The Hokies began the second half with the ball and drove inside the five-yard line. A short touchdown pass was overturned on replay and they kicked a 20-yard field goal for a 24-3 lead with 9:00 on the clock. After Wofford gained one first down, they punted. With the ball back, Virginia Tech had three first downs and scored on a one-yard run to push the lead to 31-3. The Terriers had three first downs and added a 42-yard field goal by Sam Spence to make it a 31-6 game with 13:23 left. Virginia Tech took advantage of a kickoff out of bounds and needed just six plays to add to the lead with a two-yard touchdown run. With 10:52 remaining, the Hokies had a 38-6 advantage. Wofford went three-and-out and then Virginia Tech had a pair of first downs before punting. The Terriers took over with four minutes on the clock and had a first down reception by Jack Purdy before punting. The Hokies took a knee to end the game.
